

Fighting Irish



All About The Irish

More than 130 players have taken the field for the Notre Dame softball team since its inception in 1989. The Irish have posted a winning mark in 24 straight seasons and qualified for the NCAA Championship 14 consecutive times. Since joining the BIG EAST Conference in 1996, a total of 115 players have earned all-conference accolades.

All About The Irish

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Notre Dame's softball team has been well represented on the CoSIDA Academic All-America teams since 1993, when Casey McMurray became the first Irish honoree. Since that season, a Notre Dame player has earned Academic All-America honors on In 2002, Jarrah Myers was named college softball's Academic All-American of the Year.

Stephanie Brown earned second team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America honors following the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Christine Lux, the program's career home run leader, was also named to the second team in 2010. Lux was a member of Notre Dame's Rosenthal Leadership Academy and was a recipient of the Byron V. Kanaley Award, the most prestigious honor awarded to a Notre Dame student-athlete.

ALKIRE, MELANIE

One of the greatest Notre Dame sluggers set the previous single-season home run mark in 2000. That mark of 13 was later tied by Jarrah Myers during the 2002 campaign. Alkire also has the single-season mark for RBI (64) and slugging percentage (.665). The former shortstop still sits among the top-10 in virtually all of Notre Dame's career batting categories including hits (260), runs (129), batting average (.340), doubles (49), home runs (30), RBI (167) and walks (61).

ALL-AMERICANS

Notre Dame has seen 15 different players earn All-America honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) since 1994: Amy Buntin (2012), Dani Miller (2011), Heather Johnson (2011), Katie Fleury (2010), Christine Lux (2009), Stephanie Brown (2006), Melanie Alkire (2000), Megan Giolli (2004, 2005), Terri Kobata (1994, 1995), Jenny Kriech (2001), Andrea Loman (2002, 2003), Katie Marten (1995, 1996), Jarrah Myers (2001, 2002), Kristin Schmidt (2001) and Jennifer Sharron (2000, 2001).

ALL-TIME RECORD

Entering the 2013 season, Notre Dame softball has posted 977 wins in 24 seasons — just over 40

wins per year — and has never finished a campaign with a win total less than 30. The Irish have won over two-thirds of their games and have never had a losing record as the team enters its 25th season of competitive softball. The program boasts an overall record of 977-438-3 (690).

BIG EAST CONFERENCE

In Notre Dame's first season of BIG EAST Conference competition (1996) Liz Miller guided her team to the league's South Division title with a 19-1 record. When the Irish first joined the conference, they faced each divisional team in a pair of doubleheaders over the course of a two-day weekend. The formula changed in 1998, as the games were dropped to just a single doubleheader followed by a solo contest the next day. The conference adopted its current format in 1999, which pits each team in a single-day doubleheader.

Notre Dame is currently 278-50 (.848) in BIG EAST Conference regular-season competition. They finished the 1999 (16-0) and 2001 (20-0) conference schedules with perfect records and have claimed the regular-season title in 13 of the last 16 seasons.

Notre Dame broke through with its first BIG EAST Tournament title in 1999 led by the event's Most Outstanding Player, Jennifer Sharron. The Irish repeated in 2000, then fell to fourth in 2001 before claiming the title in 2002 and 2003. The 2003 team pounded out 21 runs during the tournament and earned the title on Andrea Loman's walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning against Villanova. Loman would go on to earn the tournament's Most Outstanding Player award. The 2006 season produced another championship, as the Irish saddled the strong pitching of Most Outstanding Player Heather Booth to hoist the hardware. It was Notre Dame's fifth BIG EAST Tournament crown, and was followed by a runner-up finish in 2007. Notre Dame brought home the league trophy once again in 2009. In all, Notre Dame has posted a record of 35-20 (.636) over the course of 16 league tournaments.

Notre Dame is one of only three BIG EAST teams that have won at least 18 league games in a single season. The Irish have accomplished the feat on five

occasions since 2001, after first reaching the 18-win mark in 1996. In 2009, both Notre Dame (19-4) and Louisville (19-5) reached the 19-win mark. Notre Dame went 19-1 in 2011

Notre Dame has seen a team member earn the BIG EAST Conference's top player award on nine occasions. Melanie Alkire won the award in 1999 and 2000, followed by Lizzy Lemire (2001), Jarrah Myers (2002), Andrea Loman (2003) and Megan Ciolli (2004). Meghan Murray also was a two-time honoree, winning the league's top award in 1996 and 1997. Heather Johnson (2011) was the most recent winner of the top award.

Nine players have earned the league's Pitcher of the Year award, five have garnered Rookie of the Year nods, and the coaching staff has been named the top in the conference on six occasions. All-BIG EAST accolades have been passed out to Irish players on 115 occasions since 1996.

BOOTH, HEATHER

One of the most durable pitchers to ever play at Notre Dame, Booth averaged 225.0 innings/season including a school-record 261.1 during the 2006 campaign. Booth finished her career ranked among the top-three pitchers on the all-time record list in six single-season categories (appearances, games started, wins, complete games, innings pitched and strikeouts) and topped the Notre Dame career record books in appearances, games started, wins, complete games and innings pitched.

CAPTAINS

In the 24-year history of Irish softball, a total of 50 different student-athletes have served as team captains. Among that group, six have served as multi-year captains. The two-time captains are Ruth Kmak (1990, 1992), Jennifer Sharron (2000-01), Danielle Klayman (2000-01), Katie Laing (2007-08), Brittney Bargar (2008-09), Linda Kohan (2008-09) and Heather Johnson (2010-11).

CIOLLI, MEGAN

One of the top players in program history, she concluded her career in 2005 with an NFCA All-America honor. She also was an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District member in her final season. Ciolli was a four-time first-team all-BIG EAST selection — making her one of only four Irish softball players to gain the honor as many times — and was named the BIG EAST Player of the Year in 2004. A two-time NFCA third-team All-American and 2005 captain, Ciolli finds her name atop the all-time leaders in both career hits (284) and stolen bases (76).

DRAMATIC HOME RUNS

Notre Dame has had its fair share of dramatic home runs in its 24-year history — shots late in contests that have tied the game or put the Irish ahead on the scoreboard.

Liz Hartmann has been at the plate for many of those moments, as she hit come-from-behind home runs at Nebraska (2002) and Louisiana-Lafayette (2003) and against Nebraska (2004) in the UNLY Classic.

Also noteworthy is Andrea Loman's ninth-inning blast against Villanova in the 2003 BIG EAST Tournament finale to clinch the championship title. In 2004, Stephanie Brown hit the game-tying moon shot to send the 2004 BIG EAST Tournament title

game into extra innings. Then two years later, she delivered again with a two-run blast in the bottom of the seventh inning that enabled the Irish to shock No. 10 Arizona State, 3-2, during the Judi Garman Classic.

Carissa Jaquish joined the group with a two-run home run at Syracuse in the 10th inning to give the Irish a 7-5 come-from-behind victory during the 2006 campaign.

Even pitcher Brittney Bargar got in on the action when her first career hit — a walk-off homer in the bottom of the seventh — proved to be the game winner during a 2007 matchup with Toledo.

In 2008, Linda Kohan and Christine Lux joined rookie Katie Fleury in the home run department during an Irish win over Kent State to open NCAA Regional action in Ann Arbor, Mich. Moreover, the three home runs came in the same inning. It was the second time in school history that the Irish hit three home runs in the same inning – a feat last accomplished exactly one month prior against Wisconsin by the same trio.

Earlier in the 2008 season, Kohan sent a two-run homer out of Louisville's Ulmer Stadium in the eighth inning of a BIG EAST matchup to complete a come-from-behind victory over the Cardinals. The contest was televised live to a national audience.

During a 2009 twinbill with DePaul at Melissa Cook Stadium, Christine Lux had five hits across the two games with a pair of home runs - including a game-one shot that cleared the right field fence and landed on Twyckenham Drive. The 334-foot shot would have cleared the right field fence at Frank Eck Stadium, the home of Notre Dame's basehall team

FIFTY FOUR

The 2001 Irish softball team posted a stellar 54-7 record, easily setting the mark for the most wins during one season in Notre Dame softball history. Liz Miller's last team posted a national-best 33-game win streak during the season and knocked off nine ranked teams along the way. The Irish stubbed their toe in the BIG EAST Tournament that year, but were awarded a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the program's history. During the year, Notre Dame achieved its highestever ranking, peaking at seventh in the USA Today/NFCA Top 25 poll.

FIGHTING IRISH

Exactly where and how Notre Dame's athletic nickname, "Fighting Irish," came to origination has never been perfectly explained. One story suggests the moniker was born in 1899 when with Notre Dame leading Northwestern 5-0 at halftime of a football game in Evanston, Ill., the Wildcat fans supposedly began to chant, "Kill the Fighting Irish, kill the Fighting Irish," as the second half opened. Another tale has the nickname originating at halftime of the Notre Dame-Michigan football game in 1909. With his team trailing, one Notre Dame player yelled to his teammates – who happened to have names like Dolan, Kelly, Glynn, Duffy, and Ryan - "What's the matter with you guys? You're all Irish and you're not fighting worth a lick." Notre Dame came back to win the game and the press. after overhearing the remark, reported the game as a victory for the "Fighting Irish." The most generallyaccepted explanation is that the press coined the nickname as a characterization of Notre Dame athletic teams, their never-say-die fighting spirit and the Irish qualities of grit, determination, and tenacity. The term likely began as an abusive expression tauntingly directed toward the athletes from the small, private, Catholic institution. Notre Dame alumnus Francis Wallace popularized it in his New York Daily News columns in the 1920s. The Notre Dame Scholastic, in a 1929 edition, printed its own version of the story: "The term 'Fighting Irish' has been applied to Notre Dame teams for years. It first attached itself years ago when the school, comparatively unknown, sent its athletic teams away to play in another city ... At that time the title Fighting Irish' held no glory or prestige . . . The years passed swiftly and the school began to take a place in the sports world ... 'Fighting Irish' took on a new meaning. The unknown of a few years past has boldly taken a place among the leaders. The unkind appellation became symbolic of the struggle for supremacy of the field ... the term, while given in irony, has become our heritage ... So truly does it represent us that we are unwilling to part with it." Notre Dame competed under the nickname "Catholics" during the 1800s and became more widely known as the "Ramblers" during the early 1920s in the days of the Four Horsemen. University president Rev. Matthew Walsh, C.S.C., officially adopted "Fighting Irish" as the Notre Dame nickname in 1927.

GAMES PLAYED

Notre Dame set the school record for games played in a single season during the 2004 campaign, taking the field 69 times and compiling a 49-20 record to set the mark for the second-most wins in a single season.

Teammates Stephanie Brown, Meagan Ruthrauff, Sara Schoonaert and Nicole deFau all share the school record for games played, as each player appeared and started in all of 2004's 69 contests.

The Irish have seen action in a total of 1,418 contests.

GOLD AND BLUE

The origin of Notre Dame's school colors can be traced back to the founding of the University in 1842. At that time, Notre Dame's original school colors were yellow and blue; yellow symbolized the light and blue represented the truth. However, sometime after the Dome and Statue of Mary atop the Main Building were gilded, gold and blue became the official colors of the University.

GOLDEN DOME

The Main Building, surmounted by a statue of Our Lady atop the world-famous Golden Dome actually gold leaf periodically replaced, most recently in 2005 — at one time comprised the entire University infrastructure, and in 1879 was rebuilt in five months after a devastating fire. The twelve Columbus murals in the main corridor were painted by Luigi Gregori, an Italian artist who spent 17 years at Notre Dame in the latter part of the 1800s. The building now contains the primary administrative offices, including that of Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., who took over in June of 2005 as Notre Dame's 17th president. The exterior of the building was renovated and cleaned in 1996 and the interior of the building was renovated and reopened in August of 1999, after being closed the previous two academic

GUMPF, DEANNA

The third head coach in Notre Dame softball history, Deanna Gumpf served as the Irish pitching coach under Liz Miller for four seasons before taking over the program in the summer of 2001 after Miller's retirement. In her first season, Gumpf and her staff landed the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year and the NFCA Mideast Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards while helping the Irish win the BIG EAST Tournament and advance to the final day of competition in their respective NCAA Tournament regional bracket.

Through 11 seasons at the helm of the program, Gumpf has led the team to five BIG EAST regular season championships, four BIG EAST Tournament titles and 465 wins. She became the program's all-time winningest coach in 2010.

INDOOR FACILITY

Since the weather is not always conducive to outside practice during the winter months in northern Indiana, the Notre Dame softball team takes full advantage of the indoor batting and pitching facility adjacent to Frank Eck Stadium — the home of Notre Dame baseball. Donated by alumnus Frank Eck, the facility features wall-to-wall artificial turf, four full batting tunnels and a regulation clay pitching surface. To sharpen its defensive skills during the winter months, Notre Dame heads to the Loftus Sports Center, which features a full Prestige Turf football field that is also lined for softball drills.

IVY FIELD

Once the home of the Fighting Irish, Ivy Field was the place to be for every Notre Dame home game since the program began in 1989. It played host to the BIG EAST Tournament in 1998 and 2006, and Notre Dame posted a 288-48-2 (.855) mark within its friendly confines.

Facility-bests include 24 wins in 1996 and a perfect 18-0 mark at home in 2001.

lvy Field was retired after Notre Dame swept an April 9, 2008 doubleheader from Eastern Michigan. Christine Lux had nine RBI during the twinbill, tying a school record with seven RBI in the opening contest.

HOME RUN POWER

Notre Dame exploded for a team-record 54 home runs during the 2002 season, shattering the previous record of 36 in 2000. Jarrah Myers ended up with a then single-season-record 13 round trippers, followed by Andrea Loman (11), Andria Bledsoe (7) and Liz Hartmann (7). Hartmann's total was the most-ever by a freshman at Notre Dame until Stephanie Brown notched as many during her rookie campaign in 2004. In all, 10 different Irish players hit at least one home run during the 2002 season.

The Irish threatened the record once again in 2003, cranking 49 balls out of the park. Eight players hit three or more home runs, led by Loman and Hartmann with nine apiece.

Notre Dame also started on a torrid pace with the home run ball in 2004, ending up hitting 39 dingers in 69 games. The Irish again flexed their muscle in 2006 by hitting 44 home runs with Meagan Ruthrauff ending the season with 12 home runs.

However, the 2009 season saw 66 Irish home runs leave the yard, led by Christine Lux's 15 (Lux also had 15 as a sophomore in 2008). Linda Kohan belted 11 with Dani Miller posting a freshman-record 11 more. Lux, Kohan and Miller comprised the first threesome of the Irish teammates to post 10+home runs in program history. The record-setting 66 single-season home runs included four grand slams and 20 multi-home run contests.

Just one season later Notre Dame outdid itself with 75 home runs, as three players - Heather Johnson (17), Lux (17), and Miller (10) - reached double-digits. The team total set a school record while the Irish ranked 13th nationally with 1.27 home runs per game. Twelve Irish players hit at least one home run in 2010.

HAYES, SARA

The premier hitter for the Irish in the early 1990s, Sara Hayes' name appears all over the Notre Dame career offensive record book. She ranks in the top seven for doubles (44), triples (11), home runs (26), RBI (137), walks (66) and putouts (964). Hayes was named the Midwestern Collegiate Conference's Player of the Year in 1995 and was a three-time first-team all-conference pick.

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

The Notre Dame softball team has enjoyed three memorable international trips over the past several years. Prior the 2000 season, the team spent its fall break in Australia, while the 2004 team ended up in Ireland and England for several days in October of 2003.

While in Europe the Irish had a chance to develop softball at the grassroots level, as the team spent time in Dublin and London during its trip, offering clinics to local softball players.

Gumpf's 2008 squad trekked through Italy during fall break (2007), including stops in Rome, Florence, Venice and Forli. The Irish racked up the frequent flyer miles again in the fall of 2011 with another expedition to Australia.

JOHNSON, HEATHER

Sidelined with a knee injury which allowed her to return to the program for a fifth season, Heather Johnson made the most of her time in the Irish uniform by shelving third team All-American honors in 2011. Johnson put up huge offensive numbers in 2011 with a .383 batting average and .651 slugging percentage. Johnson accounted for 67 hits, 11 doubles, 12 home runs, 64 RBI and 114 total bases. She drew 17 walks and was fanned on just 10 occasions in 175 at-bats.

Johnson was the 2011 BIG EAST Player of the year, a first-team all-league choice and a second-team all-region selection.

Johnson ended her tenure as the program's single-season (68) and career (214) RBI leader and is the BIG EAST record holder with 82 career RBI in league play.

KOBATA, TERRI

One of the most dominant pitchers in all of college softball in the early 1990s, Terri Kobata became Notre Dame's first softball All-American by claiming the honor in 1994. She ended her career with 42 shutouts, an overall record of 79-15 (.840), 907 strikeouts, 285 hits allowed, and a miniscule 0.63 ERA. Kobata's legacy also is highlighted by 15 career no-hitters — 14 of which were solo — which helps make her one of the greatest hurlers in Notre Dame history. She posted a 10.09 strikeout ratio for her career, the 10th-best mark ever in NCAA history. Her single-season 10.90 strikeout ratio led all of college softball in 1993.

LOMAN, ANDREA

It would be a difficult challenge to proclaim who the greatest player in Notre Dame softball history may be, but 2003 graduate Andrea Loman would be one of the first players brought up in the conversation. Loman compiled one of the greatest careers in Irish history from 2000-03, claiming two All-America honors along with the BIG EAST Player of the Year, BIG EAST Championship's Most Outstanding Player and BIG EAST Rookie of the Year trophies.

Loman's presence in the Irish record book speaks for itself, as the Riverside, Calift, native stands second in career runs (164), third in walks (87) and home runs (31), fourth in RBI (148) and fifth in batting average (.347), and seventh in doubles (44) and fielding percentage (.977). In 2003, Loman led the Irish in batting average (.402), runs (43), hits (68), doubles (12), home runs (9), RBI (42), total bases (111), slugging percentage (.657), on-base percentage (.466) and stolen bases (18).

MELISSA COOK STADIUM

A 1993 Notre Dame graduate and softball letterwinner, Melissa Cook was the first former player to pass away when she left us in 2002 – but her legend and spirit continue to thrive at the University.

At Ivy Field, head coach Deanna Gumpf — along with the 2003 Irish team and Cook's family — dedicated a bench near the facility to the former second baseman and shortstop during the team's fall alumni came scrimmage.

In the summer of 2006 Cook's parents — Linda and Paul Demo — made a generous donation to the Notre Dame softball team to help defray the costs of construction for a new softball stadium in Melissa's memory. The Melissa Cook Stadium, a \$4.8 million facility, is located on the southeast corner of the Notre Dame campus near Eck Baseball Stadium. The stadium was dedicated in April 2008, and is considered one of the more remarkable softball facilities in the Midwest.

Raised in Merrillville, Ind., Cook played for the Fighting Irish softball team in 1991 and 1992, seeing time at second base, shortstop and catcher. She led the team in triples as a freshman and earned a monogram before opting to study abroad one year later. An accounting major, she earned her bachelor's degree and was the controller for Teamsters Union Local 786 prior to her death.

She was a standout athlete in high school, excelling in basketball, volleyball and softball. When Notre Dame offered her a scholarship to play softball, she had achieved a lifelong dream.

Notre Dame broke ground on the stadium in April 2007 on the weekend the University celebrated 35 years of women's athletics.

MIDWESTERN COLLEGIATE CONFERENCE

Notre Dame competed in the Midwestern Collegiate Conference — now called the Horizon League — from 1989 through 1995 before joining the BIG EAST Conference. The Irish racked up a record of 66-15 (.815) in MCC regular-season play and won the league tournament title in five of its seven years of membership. Notre Dames first coach, Brian Boulac, was named MCC Coach of the Year in 1989 while Liz Miller landed the same honor in 1994 and 1995.

MILLER, LIZ

The architect of Notre Dame softball's rise to prominence, Liz Miller coached the Irish for nine seasons (1993-2001) and led the tearn to six NCAA Tournament appearances. Miller posted an outstanding 377-156 (,707) record at Notre Dame, which was the final coaching stop of her stellar career. She was named to the NFCA Hall of Fame in the fall of 2005. Among her career highlights, Miller implemented the women's athletic program at Lake Michigan College and compiled a 1,047-331 overall combined record while coaching volleyball, basketball and softball at the school. After narrowing her focus solely on softball, she amassed 12 conference championships and 11 regional titles for Lake Michigan.

Miller received an honorary monogram from the University of Notre Dame upon her retirement at the end of the 2001 season. She and her husband, Lloyd, who also played a large part in the development of the Notre Dame program while Liz was head coach, are still very close to the program and to this day attend many of the team's games both at home and on the road.

Miller ended her softball coaching career with 918 career victories in 26 seasons, winning more than 75 percent of the games she coached.

MONOGRAM CLUB

The Notre Dame Monogram Club is comprised of some 4,000 due-paying individuals who have earned the University's varsity athletic insignia for their athletic or team support endeavors or have been honorary monogram recipients. The club supports the primary goal of the University: the spiritual, intellectual, and physical development of its students and alumni. By providing its members the opportunity to foster and maintain relationships across different sports, generations and geographical locations, the Monogram Club aspires to contribute - through the common bond of sport — to the social and professional enrichment of its members while providing a means for ongoing association with the University. As an integral part of the Notre Dame family, the Monogram Club endeavors to uphold and enrich the great tradition of Notre Dame athletics.

MYERS, JARRAH

Possibly the greatest power hitter to ever don the blue and gold, Myers completed her career in 2002 with a trunk full of awards. In 2002 alone, she was named the BIG EAST Player of the Year, the BIG EAST Scholar-Athlete of the Year, first-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, third-team NFCA/Louis-ville Slugger All-American, CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year for softball, and earned the Notre Dame Monogram Club Team MVP. Even more, she took home Notre Dame's Knute Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award and became the fourth Notre Dame softball player to land the school's prestigious Byron V. Kanaley Award.

Myers sits atop the Irish career lists in home runs (36), RBI (174) and putouts (1,337). Myers is also fourth in walks (76), seventh in stolen bases (43) and tenth (.976) in fielding percentage.

NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Notre Dame softball team has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 17 times overall including visits in each of the last 14 seasons. The Irish have reached the final day of regional competition nine times before being eliminated by Arizona (2012), Michigan (1995, 2003, 2009 and 2010), lowa (2001), Nebraska (2002) and Northwestern (2005 and 2006). Although Notre Dame has made 17 different trips to The Show, they have only visited five different post-season sites (Bloomington, Ind. — 1994; Ann Arbor, Mich. — 1995-96, 1999-2000, 2003-04, 2008-11; lowa City, lowa — 2001-02; Evanston, Ill. — 2006-07; Tucson, Ariz. — 2012).

The Irish served as a tournament host to regional competition in 2005, tacking on a 2-2 record during play at Ivy Field.

UNITED STATES NATIONAL TEAMS

Four Irish players have made their presence felt on the United States National Team over the past several years. Jarrah Myers, Lizzy Lemire and Jennifer Sharron became the first Notre Dame players to earn a spot on the U.S. National Team, doing so in the summer of 2001. Lemire played on the USA Red team, which competed in the 2001 U.S. Cup. Myers and Sharron landed on USA Blue, which traveled to Maracay, Venezuela, for the Pan Am Qualifier. USA Blue dominated the tournament, not allowing a single run to any of the competing teams. Sharron even tossed a perfect game for USA Blue in their battle with Brazil.

Mallorie Lenn earned a spot on the U.S. Junior National team in Hermasillo, Mexico, for the first Pan American championship team during the summer of 2002. Lenn was a key member of the gold-mend winning U.S. team, providing the game-winning Bli in its final round-robin game, and was behind the plate for the tournament's final contest, which the United States won against Canada.

Alexis Madrid competed as a member of the Puerto Rican National Fastpitch team during the summer of 2002.

In 2006, Linda Kohan earned an invitation to join the Israeli National team, but declined the offer.

NATIONAL PRO FASTPITCH

National Pro Fastpitch, a six-team professional softball league, began competition in the summer of 2005. Megan Ciolli, who played for the Chicago Bandits, represented Notre Dame during the league's inaugural season. She made her alma mater proud by batting .241, adding eight RBI, eight stolen bases, and a homer.

Stephanie Brown was drafted by the Chicago Bandits in 2007 and enjoyed a successful, but brief, playing career that was cut short due to injury.

NO-HITTERS

There have been 39 no-hitters thrown in Notre Dame softball history, including the most recent by (then) sophomore Laura Winter against DePaul in 2012. Winter's feat was the first in Melissa Cook

Brittney Bargar recorded the program's first nohitter in an NCAA Tournament game, a 9-1 decision over Kent State in 2008, which also gave Bargar the honor of becoming the first lrish pitcher to record 30 wins in a season. Bargar's first no-hitter of the season came at Syracuse to celebrate Notre Dame's 800th overall win.

Terri Kobata ended her career as the queen of nohitters at Notre Dame with 15 on her resume.

ONE OF THE BEST

The NFCA announced the USA Today/NFCA All-Time Top 50 during the fall of 2003 and Notre Dame ranks among the top softball programs in the nation. The Irish were tagged with the poll's 32nd spot.

Based on the weekly national rankings from 1995 until the end of the 2003 slate, the poll was led by Arizona, followed by UCLA and Washington.

RANKED TEAMS

The Irish have a tendency to pull off the upset and defeat a ranked opponent on an annual basis. In every season dating back to 1994 — with the exception of the 2003 campaign — Notre Dame has downed at least one team that was in the top-25. Overall, Notre Dame has 59 wins over 30 ranked opponents. Among some of the higher ranked programs the Irish have knocked off in recent years are: Washington (#4), Nebraska (#4), Michigan (#5), Frennessee (#5), Oklahoma (#6), Fresno State (#7), Florida State (#9), and Arizona State (#10).

RECORD BREAKERS

Since Deanna Gumpf assumed control of the program for the 2002 season, the Irish have continued to match or eclipse several single-season records.

The 2002 team set school records for home runs (54) and runs scored (318). The 2003 edition set the school mark (at the time) for fielding percentage (971). In 2004, the Irish established the record number of double plays (22), games played (69) and complete games pitched (52). One year later, Notre Dame set the school records for strikeouts thrown (527), strikeouts per seven innings (8.74) and attempted steals (134). The 2006 edition of the Blue and Gold holds the school record for single-season walks (144) and fielding percentage (977). The single-season walks record was rewritten in 2008 (148).

A number of top single-season team marks were set during 2009 including: runs (2nd-310), doubles (3rd-90), home runs (1st-66), RBI (1st-282), total bases (1st-748), slugging pct. (1st-501), walks (1st-152), on-base pct. (2nd-371) and complete games (3rd-46).

Notre Dame finished 2010 with renewed singleseason program records with a nation-leading batting average (.343), runs (369), doubles (103), home runs (75), RBI (337), total bases (878), slugging pct. (.590), on-base pct. (.409) and fielding pct. (.978). The Irish were second among NCAA teams with 1.75 doubles per game and fourth in slugging pct.

In regular season BIG EAST play, the Irish ranked first in slugging percentage (.635), runs scored (150), RBI (134), doubles (46), home runs (31) and total bases (330).

ROAD WARRIORS

During the program's second complete varsity season in 1990, Notre Dame began to hit the road and take part in what has become a stapled tradition in collegiate softball—the early season, warmweathered tournaments. The Irish are one of the many softball programs that annually seek the top competition in the top tournaments slated for the season's first several weeks.

Notre Dame has traveled to 51 destinations in 20 different states for early-season tournaments since 1990.

RUTHRAUFF, MEAGAN

Over a historical four-year career with the Irish, Meagan Ruthrauff established herself as one of the most productive hitters to play under the Golden Dome. Ruthrauff set a new standard for singlegame offensive production during a 2006 meeting with Pittsburgh as she clubbed a team-record three home runs on her way to knocking in a school-record seven runs against the Panthers. The former first baseman and designated player ranks second in Notre Dame single-season history in walks (36), RBI (54), and on-base percentage (477) and fifth in home runs (12). Ruthrauff is the career leader in games played (247) and walks (112).

SHARRON, JENNIFER

Jennifer Sharron graduated from Notre Dame in 2001 but left her mark in the circle as a storied pitcher. The only lefthander to ever pitch for Notre Dame, Sharron sits among the all-time leaders in wins (88), complete games (76) and innings pitched (772.1). She became the first BIG EAST player to win four consecutive conference pitcher-of-the-year awards (1998-2001) and earned first-team all-conference honors four consecutive times.

STENGLEIN, STEFFANY

One of the greatest strikeout pitchers the Irish has produced, Stenglein ranks among the best for single-season strikeouts (310), innings pitched (250.2) and wins (27). She also finished her career in 2005 ranking among the top-three in appearances (154), games started (132), wins (79) and innings pitched (744.0). Stenglein was also a three-time all-BIG EAST first-team selection and a two-time conference pitcher of the year.

SEVEN FIRST-TEAMERS

Notre Dame has improved its school record for first-team all-BIG EAST honorees three times in the last several seasons. The 2001, 2002 and 2004 teams included a record seven first-team award winners: 2004 – Steffany Stenglein, Heather Booth, Mallorie Lenn, Liz Hartmann, Stephanie Brown, Megan Ciolli and Nicole deFau; 2003 – Andria Bledsoe, Ciolli, Andrea Loman, Lisa Mattison, Stenglein, Jarrah Myers and Jenny Kriech; 2001 – Loman, Mattison, Kriech, Melanie Alkire, Lizzy Lemire, Jennifer Sharron and Kristin Schmidt.

VICTORY MARCH

The most recognizable collegiate fight song in the nation, the "Notre Dame Victory March" was written in the early 1900s by two brothers who were University of Notre Dame graduates. Michael Shea, a 1905 graduate, composed the music while his brother, John Shea, who earned degrees in 1906 and 1908, provided the corresponding lyrics. The song was copyrighted in 1908 and a piano version, complete with lyrics, was published that year. Michael, who became a priest in Ossining, N.Y., collaborated on the project with John, who lived in Holyoke, Mass., the song's public debut came in the winter of 1908 when Michael played it on the organ of the Second Congregational Church in Holyoke. The Shea brothers later presented the "Notre Dame Victory March" to the University, and it first appeared under the copyright of the University of Notre Dame in 1928. The copyright for the beginning of the song still is in effect. The more well-known second verse, which begins with the words "Cheer, cheer for Old Notre Dame," now is in the public domain in the United States (for both the music and lyrics) — but the second verse remains protected in all territories outside of the country. Notre Dame's fight song first was performed at Notre Dame on Easter Sunday, 1909, in the rotunda of the Main Building when the Notre Dame band performed the Victory March as part of its traditional Easter morning concert. It was first heard at a Notre Dame athletic event 10 years later. In 1969, as college football celebrated its centennial, the "Notre Dame Victory March" was honored as the "greatest of all fight songs." Michael Shea was pastor of St. Augustine's Church in Ossining until his death in 1938. John Shea, a baseball monogram winner at Notre Dame, became a Massachusetts state senator and lived in Holyoke until his death in 1965.

The original lyrics, written when all athletes at Notre Dame were male, refer to "sons," but in recognition of the fact that the Victory March is nowledged for athletic teams composed of men and women, many modify the words accordingly. The "Victory March" earned a number-one ranking in ratings compiled in 1998 in a book, "College Fight Songs: An Annotated Anthology." The "Victory March" was also the No. 1-ranked fight song in a 1990 survey conducted by Bill Studwell, a librarian at Northern Illinois University.

Season Preview

Notre Dame was tabbed to finish second in the conference according to the 2013 BIG EAST Softball Preseason Poll. The Irish also finished one spot out of the USA Today/NFCA Division I and ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 preseason rankings, leading the receiving votes category in each poll.

Irish Preparing To Make An Impact

Notre Dame starts drive toward seventh BIG EAST title.

The position that the Notre Dame softball team found itself in this offseason was considerably different from where the Irish were entering 2012. Replacing eight seniors, an extremely large class to lose, from a 46-10 campaign in 2011, Notre Dame was up to the task last season, finishing 40-16. A berth in the BIG EAST Conference Championship game against Lutip capped what has become the norm for the Irish. After saving goodbye to four seniors from the

2012 squad, including 2011 NFCA third team All-American Dani Miller and three-time all-BIG EAST first team selection Alexa Maldonado, Notre Dame finds itself in prime position to reload once again.

"When you lose players like Dani and Alexa, you can't really replace them," Irish head coach Deanna Gumpf says. "That's not to say players are irreplaceable, it's just a matter of someone being able to step into that position and get the job done at the highest level. No one will ever take Alexa's place in center field, for example, because she was unbelievable, but there are players who will find a way to be successful in a different way."

Notre Dame returns 13 monogram winners in 2013, including seven regular starters. The lack of unfamiliarity makes it easy to see Gumpf's enthusiasm regarding her seasoned roster.

"When players leave, you don't expect others to take their place, you expect the returnees to become the best at who they are, and that's what we're looking forward to this year," Gumpf says. "Who is going to make a name for themselves, who is going to be next? I think we definitely have players on this team capable of that."

One player who will directly assume a leadership role is senior catcher Amy Buntin, who along with outfielder Kelsey Thornton were selected as 2013 captains by their teammates. Buntin enjoyed a productive year at the plate last season, leading the Irish with a 360 batting average and pacing the BIG EAST with 60 RBI and 45 runs scored. The Franklin, Tenn., native was named to the NFCA All-America second team in recognition of her achievements, becoming the program's 21st All-America selection in the process.

"The key for Amy was that she was not going to let anyone beat her out," Gumpf says. "She

got to that point, as an athlete, where she was going to be the player that she knew she could be. Amy let her confidence take over, and as the season went on, she became comfortable as both a player and a leader on the field.

"Amy is not one to even think about awards, because being an All-American for Amy, that didn't even enter her mind. She just wanted to be good, and she wants to win."

Buntin and junior right-hander Laura Winter (29-11, 2.18 ERA in 2012) return this season for

their second full season as the primary Notre Dame battery. Winter shined during the BIG EAST schedule a year ago, logging a 13-2 mark with a sparkling 1.21 ERA and 102 strikeouts. The Irish ace also threw the first no-hitter in Melissa Cook Stadium history April 21 against DePaul, one of the many highlights that led to her receiving the BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year award.

"Amy and Laura have great pitcher-catcher chemistry, and they work really well together," Gumpf says. "As with last year, Laura and Brittany O'Donnell (11-5, 3.57 ERA in 2012) will be handling the bulk of the pitching. With freshman Allison Rhodes (Kirkland, Wash.), I am very excited to see her future on the mound."

Rhodes will become just the second lefthanded pitcher to play for the Irish, joining two-time All-American Jennifer Sharron ('01). Although the advantage of the "righty versus lefty" matchup has long been debated in softball, Gumpf believes that Rhodes can give opposing hitters a brand new, and in many ways unfamiliar look when entering during the

middle of a game.

"It certainly depends on the lineup we are facing, but a left-handed pitcher can be a huge asset on the mound, at times," Gumpf says. "If we're facing a pure left-handed lineup, the ball comes in completely different to what hitters are accustomed to."

Like last season, Buntin expects to see the majority of innings behind the plate as Notre Dame's starting catcher. Sophomore Cassidy Whidden (26 games, five starts last season) and freshman Casey Africano (Huntington Beach, Calif.) will compete with the senior captain for innings as the Irish backstop.

"Amy has certainly earned the starting job, but I love what Cassidy has been doing behind the plate during the offseason," Gumpf says. "I think she's a great receiver and communicator, so she will be getting innings. Also, Casey will be splitting time catching, playing in the outfield and being the designated player."

The most experienced corps on the field for Notre Dame will be its infield, as the Irish return a primary starter at every position with the exception of first base. Junior Chloe Saganowich (2012 all-BIG EAST second team; 56 starts at shortstop) and sophomore Katey Haus (55 starts at third base as a freshman)

were anchors on the left side of the infield a year ago, combining for 105 putouts and 176 assists. Sophomore Jenna Simon (48 starts as a freshman) is expected to remain at second base, with freshman Carly Piccinich (Wyckoff, N.J.) working in as the season moves along.

"Carly is a player that gives us a level of depth (up the middle)," Gumpf says. "If a starter happens to go down at any point, we are confident we can put Carly in and shift everyone else over."

A total of three players are battling for the starting job at first base, with seniors Jackie Bowe (28 career starts) and Kathryn Lux (13 career starts), and freshman Micaela Arizmendi (Huntington Beach, Calif.) in contention.

"With the infield more or less having an entire year together, we are farther ahead than we were a year ago," Gumpf says. "There were three new players in the infield last season, so in comparison, we are so much better fundamentally heading into the season. What's exciting is having an additional year in 2014 where we don't expect to see much change, either."

The Notre Dame outfield returns a number of familiar faces, including co-captain Thornton, a 2012 all-BIG EAST second team selection, in right field. Sophomore Emilee Koerner (45 starts in left field as a freshman) and junior Lauren Stuhr (10 starts as a sophomore)

are the other projected starters.

"They have all started a number of games, maybe not in center field, but they have started games for us in the past," Gumpf says. "With the addition of freshman Megan Sorlie (Wichita, Kan.), a player who brings great range and a phenomenal arm, Casey (Africano), who will split time at catcher and in the outfield, and the experience of Monica Torres (70 career games played), who has been with our program going three seasons, it just adds to the equation."

Notre Dame was the top team in the receiving votes category of both the USA Today/NFCA Division I and ESPN. com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 preseason polls. The Irish received 129 voting points and one first-place vote to finish second in the league standings in the 2013 BIG EAST Softball Preseason Poll, edging out defending conference champion Louisville (128 points, four first-place votes) for the runner-up position.

South Florida claimed seven firstplace votes as the preseason conference favorite, earning 134 voting points. DePaul copped the final firstplace vote to finish in fourth place with 117 points. Syracuse rounded out the top-five with 96 points.

Notre Dame opens its spring a week earlier than usual, with four games at the Charlotte Fast Pitch Classic. The Irish face Wisconsin and Charlotte Feb. 9 before taking on Wisconsin and Presbyterian Feb. 10.

"I think we are an experienced enough team to start a week earlier than we have before," Gumpf says. "You do have to prepare a bit differently to be ready for an earlier start, but a positive is all of the teams that we are playing will start at 0-0, too, which hasn't happened in the past."

The Fighting Irish travel to the Campbell/ Cartier Classic at San Diego State University (Feb. 15-17) for the second consecutive season. Opponents during the five-game showcase include 2009 NCAA champion Washington (Feb. 15) and 2012 NCAA runner-up Oklahoma (Feb. 17).

"If you look at our past, compiling a challenging schedule is something that we do every single year," Gumpf says. "I'm a big believer in knowing who we are going to play at the end of the year, and preparing for those opponents. Facing teams of World Series caliber will do nothing but prepare us for NCAA Regional play this year."

After returning to the East Coast, Notre Dame will play four games at the Pirate Invitational at East Carolina University Feb. 23-24 before making a third straight appearance in the Citrus Classic March 2-3 at the Disney Wide World of Sports complex in Buena Vista. Fla.

Notre Dame travels back out West for four games at the Arizona State University Diamond Devil Invitational March 9-10, with the final contest of the event pitting the Irish against 2011 NCAA champion Arizona State (March 10). The Irish are scheduled to face Cal State Fullerton March 13 and Arizona March 14 as part of

the prestigious Judi Garman Classic in Fullerton, Calif., before wrapping up tournament play at UC Riverside March 15-16.

"We always communicate to the team that our goal is to use the early part of the season to figure out what we're all about, and use it to gain knowledge about ourselves," Gumpf says. "While we learn about ourselves, we will do everything we can to win every single game, preparing to ultimately contend for the BIG EAST Championship.

"It's exciting to look at our schedule and see all of the great teams that will help us immensely in preparing for our ultimate goal, the NCAA Championship."

The Irish open BIG EAST play with a three-game series at Seton Hall March 23-24 before traveling to Western Michigan for a single non-conference game March 27.

Wisconsin-Green Bay will be the first visitor Notre Dame welcomes to Melissa Cook Stadium for the 2013 season March 28. After a league doubleheader April 3 at Georgetown, the Irish return to their home field for a set of BIG EAST games against Villanova April 6-7.

An April 9 non-conference tilt at Northwestern sets the stage for four straight games at Melissa Cook Stadium against Toledo (April 10) and Rutgers (April 13-14).

Non-league matchups at Michigan State (April 16) and home against Valparaiso (April 18) lead into a three-game BIG EAST road trip to Pittsburgh (April 20-21). Notre Dame heads home to host a doubleheader against Connecticut April 23 before the regular season's final road swing through Chicago at DePaul April 27-28.



Irish Athletes Again Ranked #1 In NCAA Graduation Ratings

The University of Notre Dame once again claimed the 2012 national championship for graduating its student-athletes in all sports -- in the process posting the top NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figure (99) for its student-athletes for the sixth straight year.

The GSR number for all Notre Dame student-athletes rated the Irish first among the 120 football-playing institutions in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I-A). The 2012 NCAA figures are based on entering classes from 2002 through 2005.

Whether measured by the federal government in its Department of Education report or by the NCAA through its GSR numbers, graduation rates for Notre Dame student-athletes once again ranked either number one or among the handful of national leaders in five major categories among all major football-playing colleges and universities.

Notre Dame's institutional research found that Irish student-athletes in 2012 ranked number one in five of 10

major categories -- ranking second in three others and third in another. That's based on the NCAA-issued GSR and federal figures.

For the fourth year in a row Notre Dame led the nation in four GSR categories--for all student-athletes (at 99), male student-athletes (98), female student-athletes (100) and football student-athletes (97). Notre Dame also ranked number one in the federal numbers for male student-athletes (89).

In calculations that include all student-athletes in all sports, Notre Dame ranked first among the FBS schools in the GSR figures, which were initiated in 2005 by the NCAA. The University's 99 percent GSR for all its student-athletes ranked just ahead of the 98 figure for Duke. Using the federal formula, Notre Dame graduated a four-year average of 91 percent of its student-athletes, just behind Stanford at 92.

In the GSR standings, the Irish led the way in four categories. In addition to its number-one ranking for all studentathletes (99), Notre Dame finished first among female student athletes at 100 (tied with Wake Forest), first among male student-athletes at 98 percent (ahead of Duke and Northwestern at 96), first among football players at 97 percent (tied with Northwestern), and second among black student-athletes at 98 percent (behind only Rice at 100).

Notre Dame graduated 94 percent of all women competing in varsity athletics to rank second among its peer institutions based on the federal calculations (behind Stanford at 96). Among men, Notre Dame's 89 percent federal rate also was first, tied with Stanford. Notre Dame graduated 82 percent of its black student-athletes, ranking third based on the federal rate, and Irish football players graduated at an 83 percent rate, to rank sixth.

Nineteen of 22 athletics programs at Notre Dame compiled graduation rates of 100 percent, and none were below 91 percent, according to the eighth year of GSR measurements developed by the NCAA.

None of the 120 Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly NCAA Division I-A) programs in the country had a higher percentage of 100 GSR scores than did Notre Dame with its .863 number (19 of 22).

In addition, Notre Dame ranked second among all FBS institutions with nine perfect scores among 22 sports (.409) in the federal graduation rate analysis.

Notre Dame Athletics Leads The Way In NCAA's APR

Twelve University of Notre Dame athletic teams earned perfect 1,000 scores — more perfect scores than any other Football Bowl Subdivision school registered — in the eighth annual set of Academic Progress Rate statistics issued by the NCAA.

All 26 Irish athletics programs again exceeded the NCAA's APR standards.

Notre Dame's 12 perfect scores of 1,000 led all FBS programs. Boston College and Duke tied for second with nine each, followed by Northwestern (eight), Vanderbilt (eight), Stanford (seven), North Carolina (five), Rice (five) and Texas (five).

The 2012 report released by the NCAA featured a four-year compilation



of APR data from the 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10 and 2010-11 academic years. The APR uses a series of formulas related to student-athlete retention and eligibility to measure the academic performances of all participants who receive grants-in-aid on every team at every NCAA Division I college and university.

Eight Notre Dame men's teams -basketball, cross country, golf, hockey, lacrosse, tennis, indoor track and field, and outdoor track and field -- registered perfect 1,000 scores. In addition, four lrish women's teams -- cross country, golf, softball, and swimming and diving -- also earned perfect scores.

Eleven other Notre Dame teams produced scores of 991 or better: women's rowing (998), men's swimming and diving (997), women's lacrosse (997), women's soccer (997), women's indoor track and field (997), women's outdoor track and field (997), baseball (995), women's volleyball (994), men's soccer (993), women's tennis (992) and men's fencing (991).

The report followed the summer announcement by the NCAA of teams

that posted multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports. The public recognition awards were part of the broad Division I academic reform effort.

Notre Dame had 17 of its programs honored for the multi-year achievement -- baseball, men's basketball, men's cross country, men's golf, men's ice hockey, men's lacrosse, men's swimming and diving, men's tennis, men's indoor track and field, men's outdoor track and field, women's cross country, women's golf, women's soccer, softball, women's swimming and diving, women's indoor track and field, and women's outdoor track and field.

Notre Dame also had 17 programs honored in 2011 and 14 programs honored in both 2010 and 2009. Eleven Irish programs were honored each of the previous two years, in both 2007 and 2008.

Notre Dame this year led all FBS schools in number of programs honored, with Duke second with 13. Next in line were Boston College, Northwestern and Stanford with 10 each.

Irish Softball Succeeds In The Classroom

A total of nine Notre Dame players received BIG EAST Academic All-Star recognition for the 2011-12 academic year. Jackie Bowe, Katey Haus, Kathryn Lux, Dani Miller, Brittany O'Donnell, Chloe Saganowich, Jenna Simon, Lauren Stuhr and Monica Torres were Irish softball representatives on the conference's academic honor roll.

In total, 10 Notre Dame softball players have been named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America team during their career, with Joy Battersby (1995-97), Stephanie Brown (06-07), Katie Marten (1995-97), Meghan Murray (1996-97) and Jarrah Myers (2000-02) achieving Academic All-America status in multiple seasons. Myers was also tabbed as the 2002 Verizon Softball Academic All-American of the Year

An additional 12 Irish team members have been chosen for CoSIDA Academic All-District squads, the most recent being first-teamers Christine Lux and Dani Miller in 2010.

Now in her 12th season as leader of the Notre Dame softball program, Deanna Gumpf has firmly cemented herself as one of the premiere college coaches in the nation.

Under her tutelage, the Irish have made 11 trips to CAAC Anampionship, while claiming four BIG FAST Conference Tournament titles. Even more, Notre Dame staked the BIG FAST's regular season championship during her first four seasons on the bench to extend its dominance over league opponents. The Irish hoisted the regular season hardware again in 2010 and 2011.

The Notre Dame coaching staff has received five prominent honors during Gumpf's tenure, being tabbed as the NFCA Mideast Region Coaching Staff of the Year in 2002 and 2004, as well as the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2011.

In fact, Gumpf enters her 12th season as the Irish head coach with a record of 465-192-1 (.707) for the highest victory average of any BIG EAST skipper.

Gumpf became the program's all-time winningset coach with her 378th victory at Notre Dame when the Irish posted a 1-0 victory over Illinois State in the 2010 NCAA Tournament. Win No. 400 came in the form of a 9-0 five-inning win over Providence in April of 2011. Gumpfs milestone win came behind a combined shutout from the cirde by pitchers Laura Winter and Jody Valdivia.

The 2012 version of the Fighting Irish posted a 40-16 (.714) record, surpassing the 40-win plateau for the eighth time during Gumpf's tenure, ultimately reaching the final game of the BIG EAST Championship at Melissa Cook Stadium. The team was selected as an at-large NCAA Championship participant, ensuring the program's 14th straight NCAA Regional appearance.

Last season junior catcher Amy Buntin flourished in the role of every day catcher, becoming the 21st All-America selection in Notre Dame history. Buntin led the Irish with a .360 batting average, while pacing the BIG EAST Conference with 60 RBI and 45 runs scored.

Sophomore pitcher Laura Winter posted a 29-11 record in her second collegiate season, including a 13-2 mark and 1.21 ERA in conference play. Winter was rewarded for her efforts by being named BIG EAST Last

season Conference Pitcher of the Year and to the NFCA Great Lakes all-region second team.

A historic start to the season gave light to great things to come for Gumpf's 2011 squad. Notre Dame began the season with a 9-0 record - the best opening to a campaign in program history - and went on to win 46 games, the sixth-highest total in 23 seasons. The Irish went on to win the BIG EAST regular season title for the second straight time - and 13th overall - since joining the league in 1996. Notre Dame's 19 league wins matched the second-highest total in program history.

Last season six Irish players were named to the NFCA all-Great Lakes Region squad in 2011, which marked the most players ever by Notre Dame. First team honors went to Dani Miller, Sadie Pitzenberger, Alexia Clay and Alexa Maldonado. Heather Johnson and Laura Winter were part of the second team.

Last season Johnson and Miller would go on to earn third-team All-America accolades from the NFCA.

Holding court at the BIG EAST softball banquet, Notre Dame racked up the hardware with eight players earning all-league honors. Gumpf and her assistants were tabbed the 2011 Coaching Staff of the Year and Johnson became Notre Dame's seventh BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Johnson, the program's career and single-season RBI leader, led the nation with 245 consecutive career starts. The fifth-year senior was also the first player in BIG EAST inistory to be named Player of the Week on three consecutive occasions and tied for second on the program's chart with a 21-qame hitting streak.

Gumpf tutored Winter during her first year in the circle to post the program's second-highest single-season win total with 25 victories. Winter garmered national attention after a near-perfect no-hitter at USF in which she walked and beaned the first two batters while retiring the rest of the Bulls for the remainder of the game.

The Irish strutted their stuff throughout the 20-game BIG EAST slate by finishing among the top in the following team categories: batting average (.385), slugging pct. (.636), on-base pct. (.459), runs scored (162), hits (204), RBI (145), doubles (39), total bases (.337), sacrifice bunts (20) and stolen bases (37).

Gumpf also authored one of the most dominating seasons in school history while directing her 2010 Irish outfit to a number of accolades. Notre Dame finished 2010 with a 47-12 mark and set single-season program records with a nation-leading batting average (.343), runs (369), doubles (103), home runs (75), RBI (337), total bases (878), slugging pct. (.590), on-base pct. (.409) and fielding pct. (.978). The Irish were second among NCAA teams with 1.75 doubles/game and fourth in slugging pct.

In regular season BIG EAST play, the Irish ranked first in slugging percentage (.635), runs scored (150), RBI (134), doubles (46), home runs (31) and total bases (330)

Not only did Gumpf aid in the development of All-American Katie Fleury and BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year Jody Valdivia, but she also oversaw the final season of one of the program's most dominant and adorned players in Christine Lux. Lux finished her four years as the program's career leader in home runs (50), RBI (174), slugging pct. (.654) and putous (1,544) and set or tied single-season records during her final campaign with 17 home runs (28th nationally), 17 doubles and an. 801 slugging pct. (20th nationally). Lux also became the noul player in BIG EAST history to record 60+ runs, 80+ hits and 60+ RBI in a career while making a splash in the BIG EAST record book for career RBI (1st - 66), home runs (t-1st - 24), runs scored (3rd - 61), walks (t-7th - 33) and doubles (t-8th - 17).

The 2009 season was also a landmark campaign in which Notre Dame posted a 43-17 record. It was the 11th 40-win campaign in program history and fifth under

Gumpf. Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament and was ranked 25th in the final regular season NFCA Top 25 poll. The ranking was a first since 2004 and the first to end the season since 2002.

A number of top single-season team marks - many of which would fall just one year later - were set during 2009 including: runs (2nd - 310), doubles (3rd - 90), home runs (1st - 66), RBI (1st - 282), total bases (1st - 748), slugging pct. (1st - 501), walks (1st - 152), on-base pct. (2nd - 371) and complete games (3rd - 46).

That season also saw Lux earn third-team NFCA All-America accolades.

Pitcher Brittney Bargar thrived under Gumpf's guidance and earned her second NFCA All-Region honor in as many seasons as she was one of five Notre Dame players to receive the distinction in 2009. She was joined in the award column by classmate Beth Northway, sophomore Erin Marrone, Miller and Lux. The five honorees comprised the largest group of all-region selections since Notre Dame placed six on the team in 2001.

Notre Dame beat three teams - St. John's, No. 17 Louisville and No. 19 DePaul - without allowing an earned run en route to claiming the program's sixth BIG EAST Tournament title. And not only did Notre Dame hand Louisville just its second home loss of the season, but the lirish became the only team to blank the Cardinals on the year. It was the first time Notre Dame beat ranked opponents in two consecutive contests since 2005 and the first time the Irish beat a pair of top-20 teams on consecutive tries since 2000. Bargar, who was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player, earned two shutout wins while giving up eight hits.

And for the second season in a row the Irish placed seven players on respective all-BIG EAST Conference squads. Northway, Lux and Miller were each named to the first team and but Irish pitchers - Valdivia and Bargar - sat on the second team with Linda Kohan. Marrone was voted to the third team.

Gumpf also aided in the development of Valdivia from the circle, as the pitcher was victorious in each of her last 17 decisions, including all of her 10 BIG EAST contests. Valdivia went over two months after a March 14 loss to No. 12 Arizona without a defeat.

When assuming control of the Irish program in July of 2001 from her mentor and close friend, Liz Miller, Gumpf inherited a team that one season prior had finished with a school-best 54-7 record. Without missing a beat, the Irish once again advanced to the final day of competition at the NCAA Regional Tournament and in the process smashed the school record for home runs in a season. Notre Dame also came through with a dramatic run in the 2002 BIG EAST Championship, rallying from a first-day loss to hand Virginia Tech a pair of defeats on the final day to claim the leaque title.

The second year of the Gumpf era began with a 10-11 start to the season before Notte Dame ripped off a 20-game win streak from April 1-26 to assume control of the BIG EAST Conference standings. The team then swept through the BIG EAST Championship by scoring 21 runs in three games and won the title on a walk-off home run from conference player of the year Andrea Loman in the bottom of the ninth inning against Villanova.



The Irish rode their momentum into the start of the 2004 slate, upsetting No. 8 Nebraska during the first weekend of the season to claim the program's first-ever bracket championship at the NFCA Leadoff Classic. The team also won the Hoosier Invitational title and the BIG EAST regular-season crown while taking part in a record 90 contests. Notre Dame was victorious in 49 of those games - the second-best win total in school history aided by an 18-2 mark in conference play.

By claiming her 100th victory at Notre Dame in record time in 2004, (sumpf was able to reach the 100-win plateau faster than any previous Irish head coach. She reached the 200-win plateau, again in record time, with a victory in the second game of an April 9 double-header against Pittsburgh in 2006. The Irish ensured the victory would be a memorable one, as they pounded out 21 hits to tie the school record. Two Irish players - Stephanie Brown and Meagan Ruthrauff - both finished with four hits apiece, as Ruthrauff would also set school records with three home runs and seven RBI.

Yet another landmark season came about in 2005 as the Irish hosted their first NCAA Championship competition at hy Field. Bolstered by a 20-game win streak - the second 20-game run of the Gumpf era which included tournament titles at the GRU Classic and Hawaii'S Spring Filing - the Irish won the BIG EAST Conference regularseason title and advanced to the BIG EAST Championship final game.

Över the next two seasons, the Irish posted a 74-45 mark including 22 contests against 16 different top-25 opponents. The early stage of the 2006 slate was highlighted by a 3-2 comeback victory over No. 10 Arizona State, which came at the hands of Stephanie Brown's two-run game-winning homer. After dropping a pair of games to No. 4 Texas and No. 7 Alabama, the Irish proceeded to post a nine-game winning streak including four wins in conference play. Notre Dame kept themselves among the top teams in BIG EAST play with the only five conference losses heading into the league tournament. The Irish entered the post-season showdown as the third-seeded squad and rolled through the competition with wins over Providence, Pittsburgh, and No. 18 Louisville to claim Gumpf's third conference crown in only five seasons.

Notre Dame then headed to Evanston (III.) for the NCAA Tournament and defeated UC Santa Barbara and Southern Illinois before falling to Northwestern - who would go on to earn seeat in that season's World Series to finish the year with over 40 wins for the third consecutive season.

Gumpf and the Irish rallied to a runner-up finish in the 2007 edition of the BIGEAST Tournament upon entering the event as the fourth-seeded team. Behind the solid play and leadership of senior Brown, Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth consecutive season before bowing out to Illinois State in regional action. Brown would later be named a second-team Academic All-American, finishing her career ranked among the program's all-time leaders in eight career offensive categories (including hits, runs, stolen bases, home runs and batting average).

As an assistant coach at Notre Dame (1998-2001), Gumpf worked primarily with the Irish pitchers and hitters. In each of those four seasons, Notre Dame lowered its team earned run average and eventually posted a spectacular 0.89 ERA in 2001, which ranked seventh-best in the nation. And as the team ERA dropped, its batting average steadily rose as the team set single-season program records for home runs, batting average, runs scored and strikeouts thrown with Gumpf on the staff.

Irish players have mirrored their coach's competitive fire over the past eight seasons and continue to show a flair for the ability to make clutch plays at key times. This became apparent in Gumpf's first season, when she led

the team to face No. 4 Nebraska for the dedication game of the Comhusker's Bowlin Stadium. Facing her alma mater for the first time as a head coadh, Gumpf and the irish left Lincoln with a 3-2 win after Liz Hartmann drilled a three-run homer in the top of the sixth inning for the upset victory.

The La Palma, Calif., native played at Nebraska from 1989-92 while earning a degree in business management. Gumpf was an all-Big Eight Conference second-team selection in 1991 and an honorable mention pick in both 1989 and 1990.

Prior to her collegiate success in Lincoln, Gumpf enjoyed an outstanding prep career with Gordon's Panthers, one of the most dominating Amateur Softball Association teams in Southern California.

Gumpf pursued a professional position with Delta Airlines after graduating from Nebraska but did not stay too detached from softball. She started to give private pitching lessons in the Southern California area and what began as a small side job turned into a major venture. After earning her master's degree from Azusa Pacific Iniversity in physical education and coaching in 1997, Gumpf entertained countless offers from college coaches hoping to entice her with the opportunity to get back into the college game. Perhaps not too surprisingly, one of the first coaches to call Gumpf was Liz Miller.

Miller discussed the possibility of having Gumpf join the Irish staff, but a position was never established and Gumpf would opt to become the pitching coach at Long Beach State.

Two years later, Miller phoned Gumpf again to offer a position and the future Irish head coach jumped at the chance. The rest is history.

During the dedication of the Charles and Marie Doherty Batting Cages at Melissa Cook Stadium in the fall of 2011, the Notre Dame athletics department bestowed Gumpf with an honorary Monogram.

"There are some things the Monogram Club can do and some things it can't do," Monogram Club president lick Nussbaum said. "One thing we can certainly do is honor a head coach, and the leadership and the love that Coach Gumpf has shown to her players and to her family is just extraordinary. With that in mind, we're proud to welcome Deanna as the newest member of the Monogram Club."

Regarded as the best all-around catcher in Irish history, Kris Ganeff is now in her 12th year of work with the Notre Dame softball program and returns to the dugout in 2013 as an associate coach.

Ganeff, elevated to her current position in August 2012, spearheads the recruiting efforts for the Irish, which annually attracts the top players from across the nation. In addition to being the program's recruiting coordinator, she also runs and directs Notre Dame's camps and clinics.

A key member of the 2002, 2004 and 2011 BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year, Ganeff works closely with each player on hitting and defense, specializing in the development of the Irish infield and catchers.

Under Ganeff's tutelage, catcher Amy Buntin was named to the 2012 National Fastpitch Coaches Association's All-America second team, the 21st NFCA All-America honor in program history. Buntin led the Irish with a 360 batting average and 60 RBI, and posted a .990 fielding percentage behind the dish as a junior.

Ganeff has been a pivotal cog in aiding the development of the Irish bats and batteries as Notre Dame has posted numerous school records since her first season on staff. The 2002 team set a school mark for runs (318) and home runs (54); the 2003 team posted the highest fielding percentage in school history (974); the 2004 group logged a program-best 52 completes games and 22 double plays, and the 2005 squad set marks for strikeouts (547) and strikeouts per seven innings (8.74).

The Irish went on to rewrite the record books during their 2009 BIG EAST Championship-winning campaign: runs (2nd -310), doubles (3rd - 90), home runs (1st - 66), BBI (1st - 282), total bases (1st - 748), slugging pct. (1st -501), walks (1st - 152), on-base pct. (2nd - 371) and complete games (3rd - 46).

Yet again in 2010, Notre Dame posted another landmark season with the help of Ganeff aiding the Irish sluggers. Notre Dame finished 2010 with a 47-12 mark and set single-season program records with a nation-leading batting average (.343), runs (369), doubles (103), home runs (75), RBI (337), total bases (878), slugging pct. (.590) and on-base pct. (.409). The Irish were second among NCAA teams with 1.75 doubles/

game and fourth in slugging pct. In regular season BIG EAST play, the Irish ranked first in slugging percentage (.635), runs scored (150), RBI (134), doubles (46), home runs (31) and total bases (330).

Ganeff helped mold catcher Mallorie Lenn into an all-BIG EAST performer in 2004 – a season in which the irish also finished with a 49-20 record and took home the conference championship. Then in 2008, the Irish were without a catcher when starter Sadie Pitzenberger's season was cut short due to injury. Ganeff took (then) freshman utility player Erin Marrone – who had never played catcher before in her career – under her wing to call the shots for all-region pitcher Brittney Bargar. Marrone saw action in 55 contests for Notre Dame that season and did not commit a single error in the field or behind the plate.

What's more, defenders under Ganeff's watch produced a .978 fielding pct. in 2010, the nation's fifth-best mark which was also good for a school record.

Ganeff also mentored catcher Alexia Clay, who in 2011 was named to the NFCA Great Lakes Region and BIG EAST first team. Clay made the most of her senior campaign and carried a big stick with a .482 batting average in league play. Clay led the league with a .571 on-base pct. and 23 runs scored. Clay was a constant threat behind the plate with 295 putouts, 40 assists and two errors for a sterling .994 fielding pct. and ended her career ranked among the top fielders in program history.

The Irish strutted their stuff throughout the 20-game BIG EAST slate in 2011 by finishing among the top in the following team categories: batting average (385), slugging pct. (636), on-base pct. (459), runs scored (162), hits (204), BBI (145), doubles (39), total bases (.337), sacrifice bunts (20) and stolen bases (37).

Prior to the 2006 season, Ganeff was promoted to the first assistant position with the Irish. The shift paid off well for all parties involved - Ganeff would assume full control of the team during the first three weeks of the season and led the team to a 7-6 record while head coach Deanna Gumpf was on maternity leave.

"Kris and I complement each other well," Gumpf said. "We see things from different angles and have the ability to find a common ground. She has a strong desire to help our program get to the highest level possible."

Ganeff completed her Notre Dame career by earning all-BIG EAST and all-NFCA Mideast Region honors in 1999. She hit a career-high seven home runs in her final eason while snagging out 16 attempted steals from behind the plate.

The Virginia Roadsters of the Women's Professional Softball League drafted Ganeff after she graduated from Notre Dame in 1999, though the former Irish team captain and MVP instead chose to head into the coaching ranks by taking an assistant position at UNLV.

A native of Westerville, Ohio, Ganeff earned a bachelor's degree in history from Notre Dame and completed her master's degree in physical education from Ball State in 2009. The former Kris McCleary has been married to John Ganeff since 2002, and the couple resides in South Bend with their daughters, Deven and Hayden.

A former member of the U.S. National Softball Team and 2001 BIG EAST Player of the Year, Lizzy Lemire returned to her alma mater as an assistant coach for the Irish softball team in the fall of 2005.

Lemire, elevated to her current position as associate coach in August 2012, works closely with the Irish outfield corps and is also a polished hitting instructor. She has helped Notre Dame advance to the NCAA Tournament in each of her seven seasons as part of the coaching staff, including BIG EAST Conference tournament titles in 2006 and 2009.

Her tutelage was on full display last season, as Northe Dame surpassed the .300 batting average plateau for the third consecutive season, and just the eighth time in program history, logging a .306 clip as a team in 2012. The Irish also averaged five or more runs per game (5.23) for the fourth consecutive season.

Lemire's influence was extremely evident throughout the Irish batting order in 2009, helping produce five all-region and seven all-conference performers. Additionally, Christine Lux was named an NFCA third-team All-American after turning in one of the most outstanding single-seasons at the plate for the Irish. Over the course of the 60-game season, Lux amassed a .329 batting average while also tallying 15 home runs, a number that ties the program's single-season mark for home runs that she herself set in 2008.

Batters under Lemire's tutelage posted a number of program single-season bests in 2009 including: runs (2nd - 310), doubles (3rd - 90), home runs (1st - 66), RBI (1st - 282), total bases (1st - 748), slugging pct. (1st - 501) and walks (1st - 152),

Lemire also developed (then) freshman Dani Miller in 2009, converting the athlete into an outfielder as Miller went on to post a 21-game hit streak, the longest of any BIG EAST player that season. Heather Johnson matched that streak in 2011 en route to being named the BIG EAST Player of the Year and Notre Dame's single-season and career RBI leader.

Both Miller and Johnson were named to the NFCA All-America third team in 2011, the same season in which each of Notre Dame's three outfielders - Sadie Pitzenberger, Brianna Jorgensborg and Alexa Maldonado - earned all-BIG EAST accolades

Notre Dame crushed a number of blue and gold benchmarks under the watchful eye of Lemire in 2010 with single-season program records in the form of a nation-leading batting average (.343),

runs (369), doubles (103), home runs (75), RBI (337), total bases (878), slugging pct. (590), on-base pct. (.409) and fielding pct. (.978). The Irish were second among NCAA teams with 1.75 doubles/game and fourth in slugging pct. In regular season BIG EAST play, the Irish ranked first in slugging percentage (.635), runs scored (150), RBI (134), doubles (46), home runs (31) and total bases (330).

Lemire's outfielders did not commit a single error during the regular season in 2010 while shortstop Katie Fleury went on to earn NFCA All-American honors.

It was under the guidance of Lemire that outfielder Sarah Smith posted one of the greatest single-season improvements in program history during the 2008 campaign. Smith saw limited action for the Irish in her first three seasons, then broke out as a senior as the lefty slapper went on to earn first-team all-BIG EAST and all-NFCA regional honors. Furthermore, Smith was one of three Notre Dame outfielders to claim all-league recognition that season. Smith's .370 batting average and 60 hits in 2008 ranked among the best single-season performances ever by an Irish outfielder.

Lemire trekked from coast to coast after earning a pair of degrees from Notre Dame in 2001 before landing back in South Bend. Upon graduation, she earned a spot on a U.S. National team that steamolled the competition with four consecutive victories and a tournament title during the 2001 U.S. Cup in Hawaii.

After her time with the U.S. National team, Lemire returned to Notre Dame as an athletic department intern through the summer of 2002. It was then that she was accepted into the sport management program at the University of Massachusetts as she went on to earn a master's degree in that field. While pursuing her degree, Lemire also served as an intern in the athletic department compliance office. In addition, Lemire was also a volunteer assistant coach for the softball squad, coordinating team travel and developing the play of the Minutewomen outfield.

In 2003, Lemire shifted gears by landing a position at Boston College within the athletic department's development office, and was hired one year later as an annual giving associate at Stanford University.

During her first season back in the blue and gold as a coach, Lemire steered the 2006 Irish squad to a collective batting average of .291 while the sluggers sent 44 homers out of the park. Lemire mentored outfielder Stephanie Brown to a pair of All-America honors, as Brown also became one of only a handful of Irish players - including Lemire - to earn all-BIG EAST honors on four occasions.

Lemire captained the most successful team in the history of the Notre Dame program, powering the Irish to an overall record of 54-7 along with an all-time best No. 7 national ranking and the first number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament. As a senior, Lemire hit. 324 (including a .383 mark in BIG EAST play) with 38 RBI, 10 stolen bases and three home runs. She shares the single-season record for doubles with Katie Laing, logging 17 two-baggers in 1999. Lemire's career numbers included a .332 average, 28 stolen bases, 126 RBI, nine home runs and 43 doubles. Lemire is regarded as one of the most fearless and skilled defensive outfielders in Notre Dame history.

Her personal efforts were reflected in her team's success, as Lemire was part of a senior class that complied an overall record of 177-63 (,738), earned two BIG EAST Tournament championships, four regular-season conference titles, and made three consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Lemire prepped at Woodbridge High School after growing up in Irvine, Calif., where she was the city and high school's scholar-athlete of the year in 1997. The Irvine World News also recognized her as its female athlete of the year following her senior campaign. Lemire led Woodbridge to a No. 2 national ranking and was an ASA All-American in 1997.

The daughter of Kathi and Tom Lemire, this Irish coach's love for Notre Dame began at an early age aided by her mother's passion and respect for the University.



Season In Review

The 2012 Irish finished with a 40-16 record, the 14th 40-win performance in program history. Notre Dame has cleared the 40-win plateau eight times in 11 seasons under head coach Deanna Gumpf.

Season In Review

Notre Dame Caps 2012 With 14th Straight NCAA Appearance

Buntin earns All-America honors from NFCA, Winter named BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year.

- Notre Dame shook off an uncharacteristic 1-4 start, at one point winning 17 straight games, to finish the season with a 40-16 record (714). It was the 14th 40-win campaign in Irish program history, and the eighth such season under head coach Deanna Gumpf.
- Notre Dame finished second in the BIG EAST regular season standings behind Louisville, setting the stage for an eventual battle with the Cardinals in the BIG EAST
- Championship game at Melissa Cook Stadium. Louisville claimed the league title on a walkoff home run from Taner Fowler to stun the Irish 4-3 in eight innings.
- Catcher Amy Buntin enjoyed a banner season in 2012, receiving NFCA All-America second team, NFCA all-Region first team and all-BIG EAST second team recognition as a junior. She batted .360 with 62 base hits, 12 home runs, 60 RBI and 45 runs scored in 55 starts, primarily as the Fighting Irish catcher. Buntin's statistics remained strong during BIG EAST Confer-
- ence play, as her 24 hits, 20 RBI and 18 runs scored all ranked in the top three in the league. Buntin leads all active Notre Dame players with 17 home runs, 84 RBI and 79 runs scored during her career.
- Three other Irish players joined Buntin on the NFCA Great Lakes all-region squad.
 Seniors Dani Miller and Alexa Maldonado, and sophomore pitcher Laura Winter were each named second team all-region.
- Notre Dame closed the BIG EAST regular season schedule with a 16-3 record (.842). It was the 13th time in 17 years as a conference member that the Irish won at least 15 league games in a single season. Winter was named BIG EAST Pitcher of the Year after logging a 29-11 record, including

a sparkling 13-2 mark with a 1.21 ERA in league play. Winter, Miller (BIG EAST leading 16 home runs) and Maldonado (.420 OBP) were selected to the all-BIG EAST first team. Buntin, Kelsey Thornton (.348 batting average, team-high 19 stolen bases) and Chloe Saganowich (.321 average) were tabbed as second team honorees.

• The 2012 season was the last for Notre Dame standouts Miller and Maldonado, two players who left an indelible mark on

the Irish program. Both players finished their careers ranked in the top 15 all-time in batting average, hits, doubles, total bases, and slugging percentage. Miller, a 2011 third team All-American, is second on the Irish home run list after clearing the fence 48 times at Notre Dame, and also drove in the second-most runs in Irish history (176 RBI).

 Winter followed an impressive 25-4 effort as a freshman by taking home the league's top pitching award. Winter ranked third in the NCAA in walks allowed per seven innings, issuing a free pass to only 26 batters in 263.1 innings pitched (0.69 per 7). The Irish righty also cracked the national top-50 with 29 wins (15th), 288 strikeouts (16th) and 7.6 strikeouts per seven innings played (56th).

- The second-team all-league citation was the first in Thornton's career. The junior outfielder paced the Notre Dame lineup with 56 singles and scored 33 runs. Thornton's 16-game hitting streak that lasted from the middle of April until the NCAA Regional round was a team-best. Thornton struck out only 16 times in 164 at-bats.
- · Saganowich joined Thornton as a first-

time all-conference performer. The sophomore shortstop started all 56 games for Notre Dame in 2012, and led the squad with 93 assists in the field. Saganowich tied teammate Jenna Simon for the Irish triples lead (2).

• While Miller and Maldonado were winding their Notre Dame careers to a close, a trio of freshmen standouts emerged in the Irish lineup during the season. Infielders Katey Haus and Jenna Simon, along with outfielder Emilee Koerner, combined to create a formidable, youthful core

among Notre Dame's every day players.

- Haus finished third on the Irish with eight home runs in her first season, slugging at a .514 clip in the process. The Oceanside, Calif. native added seven doubles and 29 RBI in 55 starts (all but one at third base).
- Simon emerged as the regular starter at second base early in the year, finishing with a .286 batting average in 56 games (48 starts). Simon tied Saganowich for the Notre Dame lead with two triples, and was second on the Irish with 10 stolen bases in 13 attempts. The Granger, Ind. product paced all Notre Dame newcomers with 29 runs.

- Koerner added to the offensive production from the freshman class, leading all Irish newcomers with a .320 batting average (.393 OBP), 48 hits and 12 doubles. The Tustin, Calif. native made 45 starts in left field, shifting to right field on six occasions.
- Fresh off an all-BIG EAST second team citation in 2011, junior Brittany O'Donnell provided the Irish with a 1-2 punch in the circle alongside Winter. O'Donnell posted an 11-5 record in 26 appearances, including 16 starts, finishing the season with a 3.57 ERA. Opponents batted just .250 against O'Donnell in 94 innings.
- Notre Dame surpassed the .300 batting average plateau for the third consecutive season, and just the eighth time in program history, logging a .306 clip as a team in 2012. The Irish also averaged five

or more runs per game (5.23) for the fourth consecutive season, and stole more than one base per contest (1.04) for the third straight campaign.

• A strong finish on the league stat sheet powered Notre Dame's 16-3 conference record. The Irish led the league in on-base percentage (.367) and walks allowed (87), and finished second in team batting average (.306),


slugging percentage (.466), runs (293), hits (457), RBI (266), home runs (54) and total bases (696).

- In her 11th season at the helm of the Irish program, Gumpf extended her program-best win total to 465, with only 192 losses and one tie. Gumpf previously became the first coach in Notre Dame history to surpass the 400-win mark with a 9-0 victory over Providence April 3, 2011.
- Miller brought home BIG EAST Player of the Week honors on Feb. 27 in recognition of her performance at the Carolina Clas-

- sic (Feb. 25-26). The senior power hitter batted a perfect .500 (7-for-14) with two home runs and eight RBI against Penn State, North Carolina and Minnesota.
- The bats came out in full effect for Notre Dame at Cal State Fullerton (March 14) in game one of the Judi Garman Classic. The Irish scored 16 runs on 17 hits, blanking the host Titans 16-0 in five innings. Thornton, Miller and Haus each led Notre Dame with three hits apiece. The Irish smashed a season-high five home runs, which included a pinch-hit grand slam from freshman catcher Cassidy Whidden. Notre Dame pitchers Winter, O'Donnell and Jackie Bowe scattered two hits over five innings.
- Notre Dame posted season-highs in runs scored (16), hits (17), RBI (16), home runs (5) and total bases (34) against Cal

to the day after her first no-no at South Florida April 27, 2011. On that day the Irish right-hander surrendered only one walk, striking out nine Bulls in a 1-0 Notre Dame win. Winter is one of four pitchers in program history to throw multiple solo no-hitters (Missy Linn, Terri Kobata and Brittney Bargar).

- The second half of Notre Dame's season was highlighted by a 17-game win streak that spanned nearly one month (April 18-May 11). The Irish scored five or more runs in 13 games during the surge, and downed opponents by three or more runs on 12 occasions.
- The Irish made their first-ever trip to Tucson, Ariz. for the regional round of the 2012 NCAA Softball Championship at Hillenbrand Stadium. Notre Dame made
 - its 17th all-time appearance at the NCAA Championship — and 14th consecutive — with each of the last 11 trips coming under the direction of Gumpf.
 - With its two victories in NCAA Regional play, Notre Dame has now won multiple NCAA Championship games in the same season nine times. The 2001 Irish squad, which won a program-best 54 games in longtime



• A season-high 40 at-bats were needed for the Irish to advance past Hawai'i 7-3 in nine innings in the first game of the Tucson Regional. Five Notre Dame starters finished with five official at-bats, with Thornton and Miller leading the offensive charge with three hits each. Winter allowed seven hits in a complete game effort, walking two and striking out eight Rainbow Wahine hitters.



Laura Winter threw the first no-hitter in Melissa Cook Stadium history April 21, 2012 in a 3-0 win over DePaul.

- State Fullerton. The 16-run margin of victory was the largest for the Irish since an 18-0 triumph against No. 24 Robert Morris on March 11. 1994.
- Winter etched her name in the Melissa Cook Stadium record books on April 21 against DePaul, tossing the first no-hitter in stadium history. Winter was nearly perfect in Notre Dame's 3-0 series opening win, striking out eight hitters with one walk. Winter was recognized as the BIG EAST Pitcher of the Week on April 23.
- The no-hitter was the second of Winter's Notre Dame career, nearly occurring a year

Notre Dame Again Leads Nation In NFCA's StrikeOut Cancer Collaboration

Notre Dame softball head coach Deanna Gumpf and her six-year old daughter, Tatum, presented a check for \$25,355.62 to South Bend Memorial Children's Hospital pediatric hematology and oncology clinic in June of 2012. The donation was made possible through Notre Dame's efforts during this past season's NFCA StrikeOut Cancer initiative, as the Irish raised more money than any other school in the nation for the second straight year.

Notre Dame held the nation's previous record by raising \$12,046 in 2011, shattering that mark by more than double in 2012.

Tatum was diagnosed with leukemia in the summer of 2010 and is now on her way to a full recovery. Tatum continues to make regular visits to Memorial Hospital for treatments and checkups.

The Irish played host to Syracuse in April during their StrikeOut Cancer weekend, donning orange-clad uniforms and ac-

cessories auctioned off after the game. Syracuse sported all-orange attire and auctioned off its uniforms while donating the money towards Notre Dame's efforts.

The program held a trivia night at Juday Creek Golf Course in Granger, Ind., on the eve of its StrikeOut Cancer weekend and netted nearly \$14,000 at the event. The Irish also auctioned off football tickets and a variety of Notre Dame memorabilia to help the cause.

Irish Softball's Service Trip To The Riley Hospital For Children

The Notre Dame softball team added an additional game to its fall schedule at IUPUI Sept. 16. Although the game served as an additional opportunity to take the field during the offseason, the trip was just as important for what the Irish did off the field.



Byron V. Kanaley Award

The most prestigious honor awarded to a Notre Dame student-athlete, the Byron V. Kanaley Award has been presented each year since 1927 to the senior monogram athletes who have been most exemplary as both students and leaders. The awards, presented by the Faculty Board on Athletics, are named in honor of the 1904 Notre Dame graduate who was a member of the Irish baseball team as an undergraduate. Kanaley went on to a successful banking career in Chicago and served the University as a lay trustee from 1915 until his death in 1960. Notre Dame's softball team has had seven winners of the award in its 24-year history. Terry Proksch claimed the honor in the first season of varsity softball at Notre Dame in 1989, followed by Kathy Vernetti 1991 and Katie Marten in 1997. Jarrah Myers became the fourth Irish softball player to win the award in 2002 with Katie Laing earning the honor in 2008. Christine Lux won the award in 2010 and Erin Marrone copped the award in 2011.

Irish in the NCAA Tournament



Notre Dame has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 17 times overall, making its 14th consecutive appearance following the 2012 regular season. The Irish have advanced to the final day of regional action seven times. They were eliminated on the final day by lowa in 2001, Northwestern in 2005 and 2006, Michigan in 1995, 2009 and 2010 and Arizona in 2012

Liz Miller guided the Irish to their first NCAA appearance and returned five more times. Deanna Gumpf has steered her Irish squads to 11 NCAA trips in as many seasons.

Notre Dame has an overall record of 26-34 (.433) in the NCAA Tournament through 17 trips. The program registered three of those wins in one of the more memorable showdowns at the NCAAs in 2001.

- The Irish traveled exclusively to Big Ten regional sites for 15 of the team's 17 appearances (Arizona, Pac-12, in 2012) in NCAA regional play . . . Indiana (1994), Iowa (2001-02), Michigan (1995-96, 1999-2000, 2003-04, 2008-11) and Northwestern (2006-07) have hosted the Irish in regional competition . . . Notre Dame played host to its first regional at Ivy Field in 2005.
- First appearance (1994 Bloomington, Ind.): The Irish faced top-seeded Indiana in the first game of the tournament and dealt the Hoosiers a 3-0 defeat in eight innings ... the host team avenged the loss one day later with an 8-0 victory.
- First pitching victory (1994 Terri Kobata): Arquably the greatest pitcher in Notre Dame

- softball history, Kobata won the first NCAA Tournament game for the Irish with a two-hit, nine strikeout performance against Indiana in 1994.
- First No. 1 seed (2001) Notre Dame was ranked as high as seventh in the nation during the 2001 campaign and earned the team's first NCAA Tournament number-one seed ... the team could not host the event that season, however, and would bow out on the final day of the tournament to No. 2 lows on the Hawkeye's home field.
- First no-hitter (2008) Nine runs on seven hits by the Irish offense and pitcher Brittney Bargar's second no-hitter in as many weeks gave the second-seeded lrish a victory over third-seeded Kent State in six innings to open the 2008 tournament in Ann Arbor ... the 9-1 decision marked the fourth no-hitter of Bargar's career but the second in which the hurler allowed a run ... it was the 36th no-hitter in school history and the first for Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament, also giving Bargar the honor of becoming the first Irish pitcher to record 30 wins in a season.
- Three-In-One (2008) In the 2008 opener against Kent State, Linda Kohan and Katie Fleury were joined in the home run department by Christine Lux, with each of the three bombs coming in the game's third inning ... it was the second time in school history the Irish hit three home runs in the same inning a feat last accomplished exactly one month prior against Wisconsin (April 16) by the same trio.

- The BIG EAST Conference has sponsored a softball championship tournament since 1990.
- The top eight teams in the final regular-season conference standings advance to the championship, and the winner of the now single-elimination tournament receives the conference's automatic bid to the 2013 NCAA
- Notre Dame has won the league championship title six times, with each of the six victories coming in the last 14 seasons ... the Irish joined the BIG EAST in 1996.
- Two of Notre Dame's most notable tournament runs occurred at Salem, Va., ... in 2002, the Irish rallied from a first-day loss to win four straight games to claim the tournament title in Deanna Gumpf's first season ... the next season the Irish utilized a walk-off home run by Andrea Loman in the bottom of the ninth inning to capture their second straight league title ... bolstered by that home run, Loman became the third BIG EAST player to earn the tournament's Most Outstanding Player trophy two times (UConn's Bridgett McCaffery and Janna Venice also earned the award twice) and joined McCaffery as just the second BIG EAST player to claim the award in back-toback tournaments.
- In 2006, behind the strong pitching of senior hurler Heather Booth, the Irish won their three tournament games over Providence, Pittsburgh and No. 18 Louisville by the combined score of 10-1 ... Booth started and threw complete games in all three games of the tournament, including a one-hit shutout of No. 18 Louisville in the championship game ... for her efforts, Booth was named the 2006 Most Outstanding Player.
- The 2007 BIG EAST Championship was hosted in South Bend, Ind., for the third time in as many seasons ... the tournament was played at the Belleville Softball Complex.
- Notre Dame beat three teams St. John's, No. 17 Louisville and No. 19 DePaul without allowing an earned run en route to claiming the program's sixth BIG EAST Tournament title in 2009 ... not only did Notre Dame hand Louisville just its second home loss of the season, but the Irish became the only team to blank the Cardinals on the year ... it was the first time Notre Dame beat ranked opponents in two consecutive contests since 2005 and the first time the Irish beat a pair of top-20 teams on consecutive tries since 2000 ... Brittney Bargar, who was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player, earned two shutout wins while giving up eight hits.
- Notre Dame hosted the 2012 BIG EAST Championship at Melissa Cook Stadium.

Melissa Cook Stadium



The Notre Dame family celebrates the life of one of its own each time the softball team steps foot into Melissa Cook Stadium.

The Irish unveiled their new playing facility during a ceremony on April 12, 2008. University president Rev. John Jenkins, C.S.C., blessed the site which will house the Irish softball program for years to come, and remarks were given by former athletics director Dr. Kevin White, head softball coach Deanna Gumpf, (then) senior captain Katie Laing, Lisa Hoffman and Paul and Linda Demo. The Demos, parents of Melissa Cook, also helped bless a bronze relief of the former Irish player that sits just inside the main entrance of the stadium.

Cook, a 1994 Notre Dame graduate, was one of four people involved in a March 2002 construction accident at the John Hancock Building in Chicago that claimed their lives. The families of the departed reached a settlement with the skyscraper's owners and other companies named in a joint lawsuit.

Paul and Linda Demo contributed a considerable amount of their portion of the settlement as a gift to Notre Dame and to the Melissa Cook Memorial Foundation, established to provide scholarship assistance to students in Northwest Indiana.

Raised in Merrillville, Ind., Cook played for the Fighting Irish softball team in 1991 and 1992, seeing time at second base, shortstop and catcher. She led the team in triples as a freshman and earned a monogram before opting to study abroad one year later. An accounting major, she earned her bachelor's degree and was the controller for Teamsters Union Local 786 prior to her death.

She was a standout athlete in high school, excelling in basketball, volleyball and softball. When Notre Dame offered her a scholarship to play softball, she had achieved a lifelong dream.

Melissa Cook Stadium, a \$4.9 million state-of-the-art facility, sits on the southeast corner of the Notre Dame campus near Eck Baseball Stadium.

More than 100 members of the Irish softball family attended the dedication of the Charles and Marie Doherty Batting Cages in the fall of 2011.

The batting cages are named after Linda Demo's parents – Charles and Marie Doherty – who attended numerous Notre Dame softball games during Cook's career with the Irish in 1991 and 1992.

The BIG EAST has gone through membership changes since its birth and continues to make strides in improving the quality and depth of the storied leaque.

The BIG EAST Conference has been always been driven by lofty goals. The outstanding performances of the student-athletes at BIG EAST schools are evidence of the league's proud tradition of success. The league has always been able to boast that many of its best students are also its best athletes. The 2011-12 year was no different.

In the athletic arena, BIG EAST studentathletes again enjoyed success on the national stage. The Georgetown women's cross country team captured its first NCAA Championship. The win by the Hoyas marked the third-straight year a BIG EAST team has won the women's cross country championship, with Villanova winning the past two. The Louisville men's basketball team advanced to the Final Four in New Orleans. Connecticut field hockey reached the NCAA semifinals, as did the Notre Dame men's lacrosse team. The Irish women's basketball team and Syracuse women's lacrosse team each reached the NCAA finals. USF softball reached the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla., for the first time in program history.

The BIG EAST placed two teams in the NCAA Women's Final Four for the third time in the last four years as Connecticut joined Notre Dame in Denver, with the Fighting Irish advancing to the national title game for the second-straight year.

BIG EAST student-athletes won five NCAA championships. Sheila Reid won her second-straight NCAA Women's Cross Country title. Syracuse hurdler Jarret Eaton won the 60-meter hurdle championship in the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship. Notre Dame won the distance medley relay at the same championship. Georgetown's Emily Infeld won the 3,000-meter run. Carlos Almeida of Louisville won the 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships.

BIG EAST football maintained its national profile as a competitively balanced group. Three BIG EAST teams won bowl games, while the BIG EAST representative in the Bowl Championship Series won its bowl game for the fourth time in the last seven years- a streak that includes wins against the ACC, Big 12 and SEC champions.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A conference in 2005-06 when five new members began competing — the University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, the University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in 18 of the nation's top 50 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Cincinnati and Milwaukee. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain more than one-fourth of all television households in the U.S. The BIG EAST will welcome UCF, Houston, Memphis, SMU and Temple in all sports in 2013-14. Temple football will join the league in 2012, with Boise State and San Diego State joining the following year and Navy in 2015.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 32 national championships in six different sports and 137 student-athletes have won individual national titles through 2011-12.

BIG EAST basketball squads have captured 11 titles in the last 13 years. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA basketball titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. The BIG EAST placed three men's basketball teams in the Final Four in 1985, the only time this has occurred in NCAA history.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger. The conference currently crowns champions in 24 sports.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of

broad-based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably show a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization has had the good fortune to have outstanding leadership. The BIG EAST primarily was the brainchild of Dave Gavitt, who was the conference's first Commissioner Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference. John Marinatto was the third commissioner of the BIG EAST, serving from 2009-2012, after seven years as the conference's senior associate commissioner.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed longstanding relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

BIG EAST men's basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden. The women's basketball championship has led all conferences in attendance for the past nine years. Attendance figures also are significant in soccer and baseball.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5.500 student-athletes.


