ABOUT NOTRE DAME

- The University of Notre Dame sits on 1,250 acres containing two lakes and has 137 buildings.
- The Basilica of the Sacred Heart, the 14-story Hesburgh Library with its 132-foot-high mural depicting Christ the Teacher, and the University's beautifully renovated 128-year-old Main Building with its famed 23.9 Karat Golden Dome are among the most widely known university landmarks in the world.
- Notre Dame has 8,332 undergraduate students and a total enrollment of 11,479 students.

RANKINGS

- Notre Dame is rated among the nation's top 25 institutions of higher learning in surveys conducted by *U.S. News and World Report*, *Princeton Review*, *Time*, *Kiplinger's*, and *Kaplan/Newsweek*.
- The *Wall Street Journal* has cited Notre Dame one of the "New Ivies" in American higher education, along with, among others, Duke, Northwestern and Johns Hopkins.
- Notre Dame is one of the few universities to rank in the top 25 in the *U.S. News & World Report* survey of America's best colleges and the U.S. Sports Academy Directors' Cup standings of the best overall athletic programs.

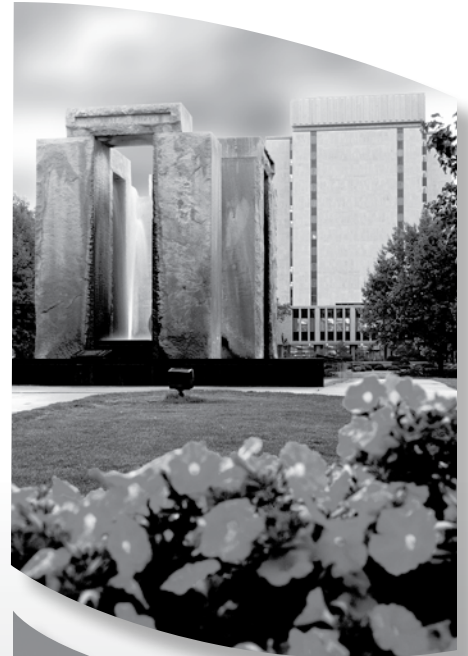
The University of Notre Dame, founded in 1842 by Rev. Edward F. Sorin, C.S.C., of the Congregation of Holy Cross, is an independent, national Catholic university located in Notre Dame, Ind., adjacent to the city of South Bend and approximately 90 miles east of Chicago.



- Notre Dame ranks fifth in a listing of “dream schools” in a survey of parents by the *Princeton Review*. The top seven are Stanford, Princeton, Harvard, Brown, Notre Dame, Duke, and Boston College.

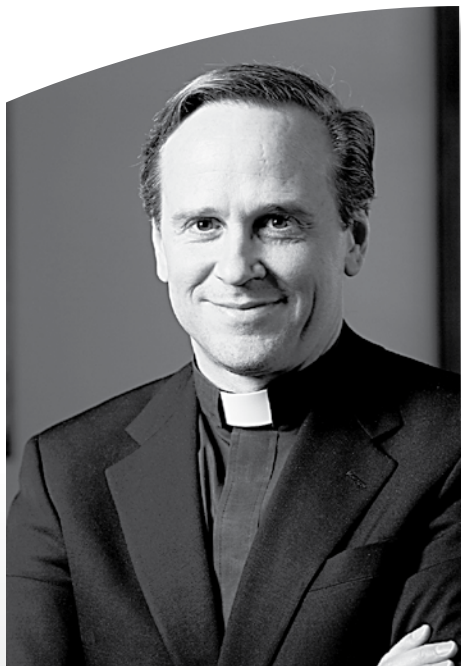
STUDENTS

- Notre Dame's graduation rate of 95 percent is exceeded by only Harvard and Princeton.
- Notre Dame's 98 percent retention rate between the freshman and sophomore years is among the highest in the country, thanks in large part to the University's unique First Year of Studies Program.
- Notre Dame has one of the highest undergraduate residential concentrations of any national university, with 80 percent of its students living in 27 residence halls. Some 40 Holy Cross religious leaders continue to live and provide a pastoral presence in the halls.
- Graduate and undergraduate students at the University come from all 50 states and more than 100 countries worldwide.





UNIVERSITY LEADERSHIP



Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., took office as the 17th president of the University of Notre Dame on July 1, 2005. He was elected by the University's Board of Trustees to a five-year term April 30, 2004.

An associate professor of philosophy and member of Notre Dame's faculty since 1990, Father Jenkins had served from 2000-2005 as a vice president and associate provost at the University.

Prior to his service in the provost's office, Father Jenkins had been religious superior of the Holy Cross priests and brothers at Notre Dame for three years. As religious superior, he was a Fellow and Trustee of the University, but he relinquished those posts to assume his duties in the provost's office.

Father Jenkins specializes in the areas of ancient philosophy, medieval philosophy and the philosophy of religion. He is the author of *Knowledge and Faith in Thomas Aquinas*, published by Cambridge University Press in 1997.

Father Jenkins earned degrees in philosophy from Oxford University in 1987 and 1989. He earned his master of divinity degree and licentiate in sacred theology from the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, Calif., in 1988.

Prior to entering the Congregation of Holy Cross, he earned bachelor's and master's degrees in philosophy from Notre Dame in 1976 and 1978, respectively. Father Jenkins was ordained a priest in Notre Dame's Basilica of the Sacred Heart in 1983. He served as director of the Old College program for Notre Dame undergraduate candidates for the Congregation of Holy Cross from 1991 to 1993.

A native of Omaha, Neb., Father Jenkins was born Dec. 17, 1953.



John B. “Jack” Swarbrick Jr., a Notre Dame graduate who has risen to national prominence as a lawyer, consultant and executive in the collegiate and Olympic sports industries, was appointed July 16, 2008 as the University’s 12th director of athletics.

Raised in Yonkers, N.Y., and Bloomington, Ind., Swarbrick is a 1976 magna cum laude graduate of Notre Dame with a bachelor’s degree in economics. Upon graduating from Stanford Law School in 1980, he returned to Indiana to accept a position as an associate in the Indianapolis law firm Baker & Daniels. He was made partner in 1987.

At the same time that Swarbrick began his career, the city of Indianapolis was beginning its effort to become a world-class center for amateur and professional athletics. An employment law specialist, Swarbrick soon shifted his focus to sports and quickly became active in the city’s initiatives.

As a member of the Indiana Sports Corp., including the chairmanship from 1992 to 2001, Swarbrick led many of the city’s successful proposals to a wide array of athletics organizations – from the NFL to the U.S. Olympic Committee to the Big Ten Conference. His leadership efforts have resulted in the city:

- Earning the bid to host the 2012 Super Bowl to Indianapolis
- Becoming the home of the NCAA national headquarters
- Hosting the 1987 Pan American Games
- Hosting the 1991 World Gymnastics Championships
- Hosting NCAA Final Fours and other college championship competitions and a wide array of national and world championships in the Olympic sports
- Securing rights to host the Big Ten Conference men’s and women’s basketball tournaments for five consecutive years beginning in 2008

Swarbrick’s work has focused on the representation of owners of sports teams and organizations which sanction or conduct athletic competitions. He has served as general counsel for numerous national governing bodies of Olympic sports, including USA Gymnastics and USRowing, and as a consultant to the 1996 Olympic Games. He also served as president and chief executive officer of LMiv, an Internet-based network of radio stations.

- In his work as an advisor to the NCAA, Swarbrick has:
- Coordinated the men’s College Basketball Partnership, an NCAA-led group that addresses the opportunities and challenges in the sport
- Worked with the NCAA’s Corporate Partners and Champions Program
- Served as a member of the NCAA Division I women’s Basketball Discussion Group
- Chaired the NCAA/USOC task force dedicated to developing proposals to expand sponsorship of Olympic sports among NCAA member institutions
- Developed the business plan for the new NBA/NCAA youth basketball enterprise

Before accepting the offer to lead his alma mater’s athletics department, Swarbrick had been a finalist for several high-profile positions in college athletics, including president of the NCAA and commissioner of the Big 12 Conference.

Swarbrick and his wife, Kimberly, are the parents of four children: Kate, a junior at St. Louis University; Connor, a sophomore at Wake Forest University; Cal, a junior in high school; and Christopher, a high school sophomore.





ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE



Notre Dame's Academic Services for Student-Athletes, housed in the Coleman-Morse Building, is designed to help Notre Dame fulfill its commitment to all student-athletes in their pursuit of a college degree and academic excellence.

In order to achieve these goals, Academic Services has several major objectives:

1. Maintain the academic integrity of the University
2. Help student-athletes maximize their academic potential
3. Comply with University and NCAA rules and regulations
4. Assist every student-athlete as they work towards graduation in four years

Academic Services provides many services that begin when First Year students arrive on campus and continue through graduation. Services provided include but are not limited to:

- Consistent counseling and appropriate interventions regarding academic matters
- Refer student-athletes to campus offices where they can meet regularly with their professors and college advisors
- Monitoring the progress of student-athletes through regular communication with professors
- Provide tutorial assistance for the student-athletes

A new computer/study space was completed inside the Coleman-Morse Building for the start of the 2007-08 school year. This new 2,500 square-foot room can handle any combination of 80 student-athletes or tutors at once. There are also nine study rooms used for small group meetings or private sessions with tutors. The study space has approximately 20 desktop computers available for use and has wireless connections available for laptops.

The University of Notre Dame ranks number one in the country in terms of graduating its student-athletes, according to statistics released recently by the NCAA.



Whether measured by the federal government in its Department of Education report or by the NCAA through its newer Graduation Success Rate (GSR) numbers, graduation rates for Notre Dame student-athletes rank among the national leaders in most categories among major football-playing colleges and universities.

ATHLETIC FACILITIES

Eight years ago, the Notre Dame department of athletics and the University embarked on creating an ambitious athletics facility master plan so Irish student-athletes would have access to state-of-the-art venues for practice, training and competition.

That blueprint, which touched nearly every varsity sport, continues to come to life. By the time the plan is completed, the entire area just east of the Joyce Center and north of Edison Road will boast a comprehensive and impressive athletic quad.

NEW FACILITIES

ALUMNI SOCCER STADIUM

- The new \$5.7 million stadium had its groundbreaking April 26, 2008 and is expected to be completed in June 2009. The stadium will be a lighted facility that will feature a natural grass field, locker rooms, restrooms, concession areas and 2,000 seats.

ARLOTTA FAMILY LACROSSE STADIUM

- Groundbreaking for the \$5 million facility occurred April 17, 2008 and is expected to be completed in June 2009. Arlotta Stadium will feature 2,000 seats, lights, an artificial-turf field, locker rooms, restrooms and concession area.

MELISSA COOK STADIUM

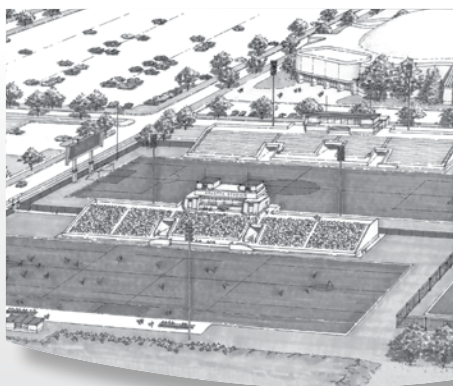
- Located on the southeast corner of campus, the new softball stadium opened April 12, 2008 and can accommodate up to 1,500 fans.

TRACK STADIUM

- Ground was broken for construction of the \$3 million outdoor track in June 2008. The new nine-lane facility will meet IAAF guidelines and completion is expected in late October 2008.

LABAR FOOTBALL PRACTICE FIELDS

- Three new practice fields adjacent to the Guglielmino Athletics Complex will be ready for the start of fall practice in August 2008. Two of the fields will be FieldTurf and the third will be natural grass.





RENOVATED FACILITIES

PURCELL PAVILION

- Home to the Irish men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad, construction on the \$26.3 million Joyce Center Arena addition and renovation will begin in September 2008.

CHARLES W. "LEFTY" SMITH, JR. ICE RINK

- Tentative plans for a \$30 million facility will create a new home for the Irish hockey team within the Joyce Center fieldhouse. The project would increase capacity to 4,000 while improving locker rooms, concessions and restrooms.

PROSPECTIVE NEW FACILITIES

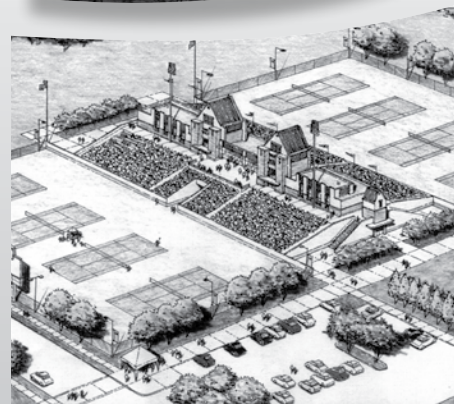
OUTDOOR TENNIS COMPLEX

- The \$4.9 million project will create a new outdoor playing and practice home with seating for 2,000 and will meet NCAA requirements to host national championships on the Notre Dame campus.

ROWING BOATHOUSE

- A new boathouse for the rowing team eventually will be constructed near the existing boathouse on the St. Joseph River.

Nearly \$70 million of the *Spirit of Notre Dame* development campaign has been earmarked for strategic athletics facilities renovation and construction designs.





SPORTS MEDICINE

SPORTS MEDICINE

- Head athletic trainer and physical therapist Jim Russ oversees a staff of three associate and eight assistant athletic trainers, plus two physical therapist/athletic trainers, all of whom are certified and boast nearly 200 years of collective experience.
- Irish athletes have access to three state-of-the-art sports medicine facilities in the Joyce Center, Notre Dame Stadium and the Guglielmino Athletics Complex.
- The Guglielmino facility encompasses more than 8,500 square-feet of cutting-edge sports medicine technology including the latest in physical therapy modalities and rehabilitation equipment, with two 3,500-gallon therapy pools, a full x-ray unit and an MRI machine.



STRENGTH & CONDITIONING



STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

- Director of strength and conditioning Ruben Mendoza is in charge of a department that has eight full-time coaches, an intern and a nutritionist.
- The 25,000 square foot Haggar Fitness Complex is located between the Loftus Sports Center and Guglielmino Athletics Complex.
- The Haggar Fitness Complex features a three-lane development track, a 45x18 yard Prestige Turf plyometric agility area, a Gatorade hydration station, six giant plasma screen televisions and a state-of-the-art sound system with 28 speakers and four subwoofers.

DIRECTORS' CUP STANDINGS

For the 10th straight year in 2007-08, Notre Dame posted a top-25 finish (21st) in the United States Sports Academy Division I Directors' Cup all-sports competition sponsored by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (formerly known as Sears Directors' Cup).

Notre Dame is among 14 schools to earn a top-25 finish in each of the past 10 years (1999-2008), as Irish programs finished 25th in '99, 21st in 2000, 11th in '01, 13th in '02 and '03, 19th in '04, 16th in '05, sixth in '06, 22nd in '07 and 21st in '08.

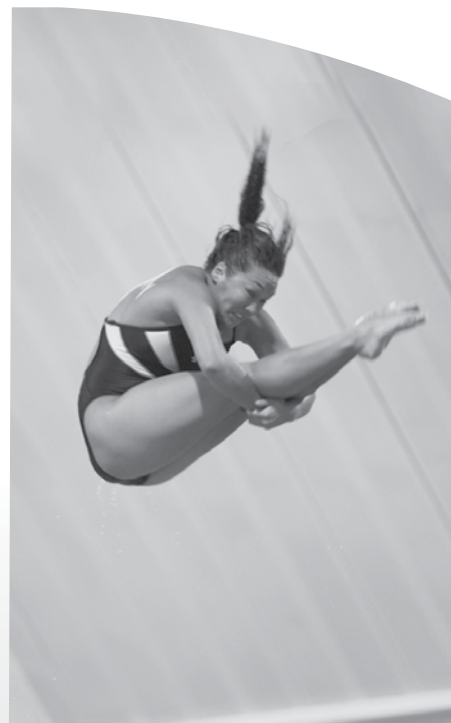

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

- Notre Dame has had 201 Academic All-Americans since 1952, second-most among all NCAA institutions
- From 2006-08, 32 student-athletes earned Academic All-America recognition, the most Academic All-Americans in a three-year stretch in school history
- Eight Irish student-athletes were named Academic All-Americans in 2007-08: Brittany Bock (women's soccer), John Carlson (football), Ashley Jones (women's soccer), Trevor Laws (football), Brett Lilley (baseball), Ryan Miller (men's soccer), Adrienne Nott (women's fencing), Jordan Pearce (hockey).

POST-GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS:

- Notre Dame has had 44 student-athletes receive a postgraduate scholarship from the NCAA since the program was founded in 1964. During the 2007-08 school year, John Carlson (football) and Brett Lilley (baseball) became the most recent recipients of the prestigious scholarship.





STUDENT WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT

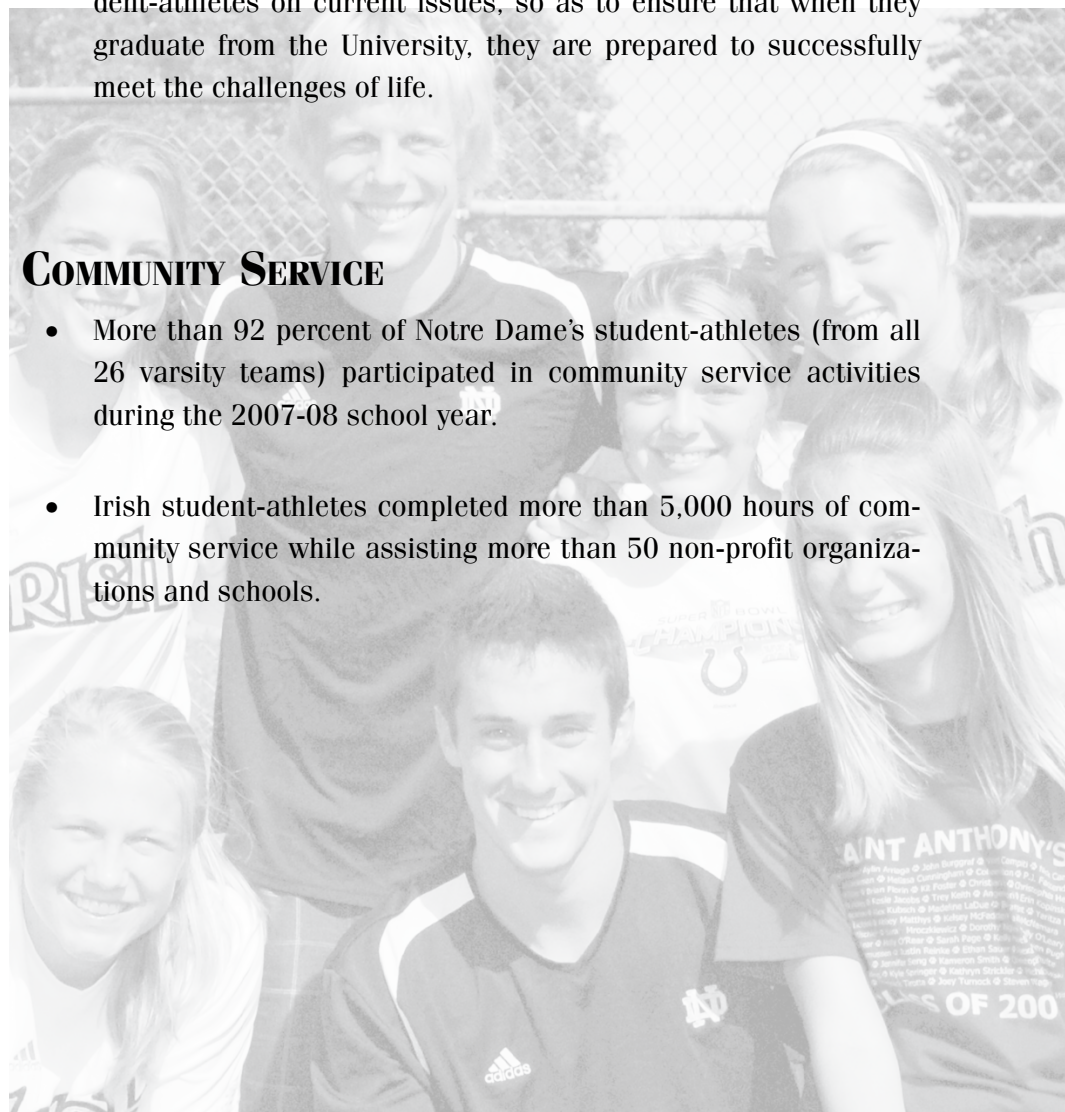


STUDENT WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT

- The Student Welfare and Development Program implements events and activities that are designed to facilitate learning within five key areas: academic excellence, athletic success, career preparation, community involvement and personal development.
- The program has three components: elective services (community service, leadership, social events); complementary services (encourages administrators and coaches to request coordination of workshops, events and activities); and essential services (student-athletes participate in a series of required skill-building and developmental workshops and activities).
- The Student Welfare and Developmental Program, founded in 1996, continuously seeks to develop programs that educate student-athletes on current issues, so as to ensure that when they graduate from the University, they are prepared to successfully meet the challenges of life.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

- More than 92 percent of Notre Dame's student-athletes (from all 26 varsity teams) participated in community service activities during the 2007-08 school year.
- Irish student-athletes completed more than 5,000 hours of community service while assisting more than 50 non-profit organizations and schools.



CITY OF SOUTH BEND



South Bend and Mishawaka are the two largest cities in St. Joseph County and help boost the population of the area to 266,431.

- The College Football Hall of Fame is located in downtown South Bend.
- The Studebaker National Museum is located in South Bend and displays carriages of four U.S. Presidents, prototypes and industrial treasures.
- The community's version of "Willy Wonka" can be found at The South Bend Chocolate Company and Chocolate Museum.
- Adventurers can enjoy both rafting and kayaking on the East Race Waterway, the first artificial whitewater course in North America.
- During the summer, the South Bend Silver Hawks (the Class A minor league affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks) plays at Coveleski Stadium.
- On Friday's prior to an Irish home football game, downtown South Bend features a Football Friday Tent Party with live music, food and drink on the grounds of the College Football Hall of Fame.

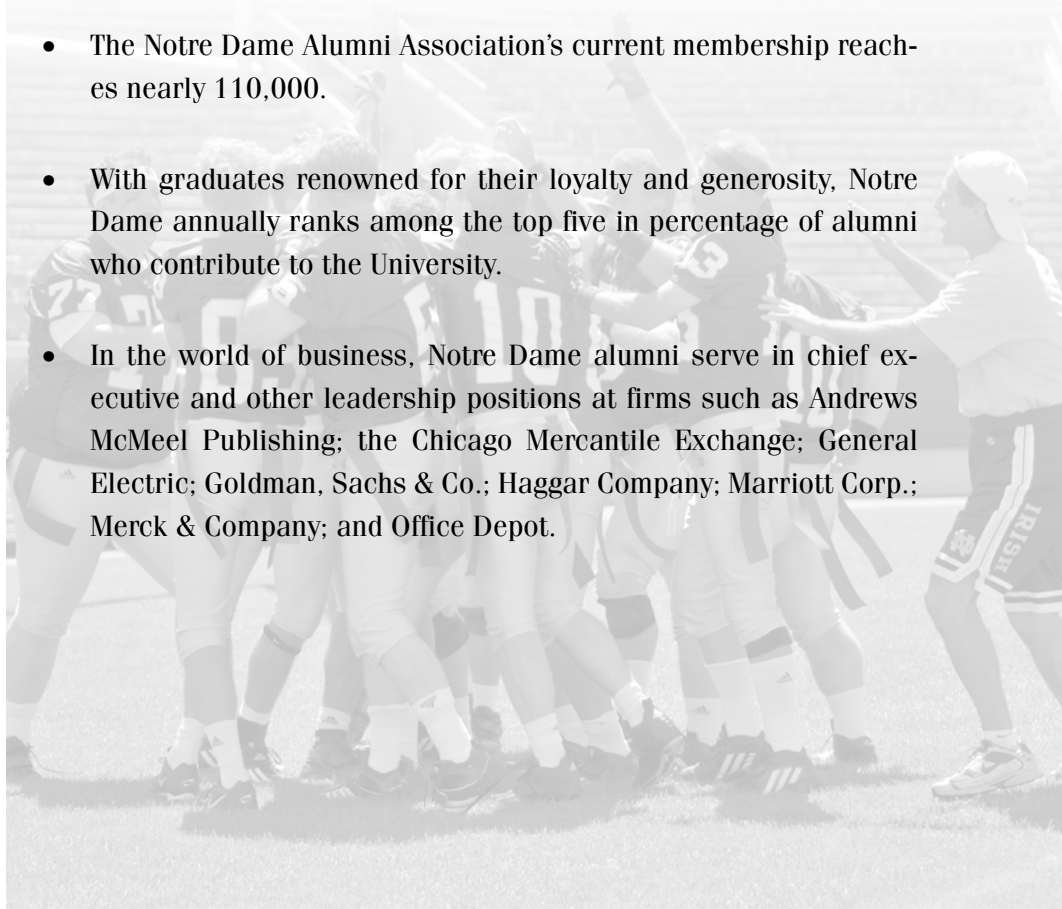

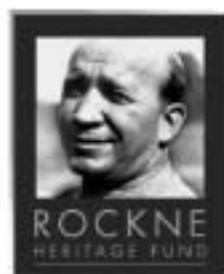
Notre Dame Monogram Club: Bridging the Gap Between Legend and Legacy

Notre Dame seeks its 13th consecutive BIG EAST Conference title in 2008-09, and a stacked roster with championship experience, NCAA Championships participants and U.S. Olympic Trials qualifiers could vault the Irish back into the national scene.



Faster Than Ever

Notre Dame's 2008-09 team poised for great things this season with first-year head coach Brian Barnes

Thirteen may be the luckiest number of all for the 2008-09 edition of the Notre Dame women's swimming and diving team.

Winners of each of the last 12 BIG EAST Conference Championships, the Irish seek a 13th title this season and could very possibly do so with a roster laden with experience talent.

First-year head coach Brian Barnes, who takes over the Irish program after winning multiple national championships as an assistant at Auburn, is nothing but optimistic about his first go-around with Notre Dame. "We believe we can be a force not only in the BIG EAST Conference, but on the national level," Barnes said.

Notre Dame graduated seven seniors but returns 25 monograms winners from a 2007-08 team that set eight school records. Ten U.S. Olympic Trials qualifiers will also suit up for at least one more season.

The four-person senior class consisting of Christa Riggins, Casey Wagner, Lucy Hirt and Claire Hutchinson has combined for 26 all-BIG EAST honors. Wagner and Hutchinson will lead the distance freestyle corps with Hutchinson dabbling into the medley events as well. Hirt should be expected to be solid contributor off the boards and says she feels great after battling injuries for the past few seasons. As a school record-holder and co-captain, Riggins is one of the most seasoned freestyle swimmers on the roster. She had a hand in setting four school records last year but expects her senior campaign to be her best yet.

Junior Colleen Bauza is back in the water after an injury sidelined her for the bulk of the 2007-08 season and Maggie Behrens hopes to parlay her U.S. Olympic Trials experience into success on all levels for the Irish. Lexie Shue and Zeina Shanata, both solid distance

freestylers, join the multi-dimensional Ashlee Edgell, Pat Duret, Keri Masterson, and breast-stroker Gina Mancini to round out a class that is high on performance on potential. Divers Natalie Stitt and Tiffany Robak are projected to finish towards the top of the pack at the BIG EAST meet, with Stitt turning in and unbelievable finals performance at last year's league event.

Last year's freshman class turned heads across the nation leading to high expectations for the next three seasons. Amywren Miller dominated the sprint relays and set a pair of school records in the 50 and 100 Free. In each of the breast-stroke events, Samantha Maxwell established new program bests and teamed for a school record in the 200 Medley Relay with Miller. Both advanced to the NAAs and participated

in the Olympic Trials. Just as solid in 2007-08 was Lauren Parisi, one of the team's top returning back/individual medley swimmers. Also an accomplished freestyler, Parisi helped set a pair of school records last year as well. Also in the mix are Olympic Trials participants Katie Casey, Kellyn Kuhlke and Lauren Sylvester and the forceful breaststroke efforts of an emerging Lizzie Gormley. Meg Reynolds continues to progress in the freestyle events as does Heidi Grossman in all phases of her development as a diver.

A talented freshman class consisting of the versatile Emily Barton, Gwen Blythe, Colleen Fotsch and Amy Prestinario was considered one of the nation's best groups last spring. With the addition of classmate Theresa Hall on the diving end, this may very well be one of Notre Dame's most well-rounded classes in recent history.

Breaking Down the Irish with Head Coach Brian Barnes ...



Inheriting a program that has won 12 consecutive BIG EAST titles, what were your initial impressions on the team when you arrived in August?

"I'm still learning about the team. I am excited about the team from what I've seen in the first several weeks of workouts and I think there's definitely talent in this team and quite a bit of depth. I think this is going to be a great conference team and I think we have the potential to spring onto the NCAA scene this year."

Can you talk about your first few weeks on the job at Notre Dame?

"It happened so quickly. I'm not moved in yet and working very long hours, but I'm not going to complain about that. It's part of the fun."

How much homework have you done on this year's team?

"I didn't look at anything from last season. Yes, I'm aware of how they performed, but in terms of how they trained and what they did in all aspects from the meet schedule to the dry-land routine and what they did daily in the water – that will change. Even next season, I'll learn from this year. But with each new year, I won't do a lot of examining of what the team did in the previous season."

What strikes you most about the team?

"I will tell you this – this team is becoming a better team. Everyday someone does something that amazes me. They work hard and take a lot of pride in representing the University. My approach is to go right through the team and stand behind Notre Dame. That makes it easier to get them to commit together and to pay the price to be a champion."

With so much success on the conference level, what does the program need to do to get over the hump and make an impact on the national scene?

"I think it just comes down to the belief. We need to believe and get comfortable and live a certain lifestyle to be successful at the NCAA level. My attitude is that we are going to be ready to go in February, and exceptional in March. That happens now with what we're doing in the water in September, October, and November. Those are critical months in the process of winning."

What are some of your long-term goals for the program?

"I look at goals as a process. I think we would have a hollow experience here if I just said that I want to win the NCAA championships. My goals are along the lines of living and teaching a championship attitude and philosophy and providing a safe, healthy and competitive environment for women to come to Notre Dame and excel. If a lot of those things come together then we're going to be successful. If we're competing like champions, acting like champions, living like champions and we are engaged in one another and this program does what is best for Notre Dame than we're going to be successful. Here at Notre Dame, taking a program that is very successful at the conference level and not as successful at the NCAA level, you have to teach belief. You have to teach that belief is an everyday thing: it's how you act, how you walk, how you talk, it's who you are. Our athletes must get comfortable with higher goals and seeing themselves at the NCAAs."

Qualifying for the NCAA Championships

The NCAA Women's Swimming and Diving Championships have a fixed field of 320 swimmers, including 35 divers. The swimming field consists first of all student-athletes who have achieved an "A" qualifying standard in any event. Beyond that, entry is given to student-athletes with the best "B" qualifying standards in events with the fewest "A" qualifiers until all the events have an equal number of entrants. From there, additional "B" qualifiers are added in order, one per event at a time, until the field size of 320 is

reached. If a complete additional round of next-best qualifiers will put the field over 320, the times that are closest in percentage terms to the national record are given the final spots in the field. Any student-athlete in the field may enter and compete in a maximum of three events.

For instance, if there are four "A" qualifiers in the 100 backstroke, 10 in the 100 butterfly, and between four and 10 in every other event, then the top "B" qualifying times will be given entrance until every event has 10 participants in it.

From there, the next best "B" time is added in each event, one by one, until the field is full. If not enough spaces remain to take the next entire round of "B" qualifiers, those swimmers' times are compared in percentage terms to NCAA records in the events and taken in order until the field is full.

In relay competition, teams with the top 13 times in each relay earn invitations to the meet. In addition, a team with four qualifiers also may compete in any relay in which it posted a "B" qualifying time at some point throughout the year, even if the NCAA qualifiers did not participate in the "B" time.

The diving field is determined by performance at five NCAA zone meets, which take place two weeks prior to the NCAA Championships. A student-athlete qualifies for the zone diving meet by registering a performance in which she scores points equal or better than the qualifying standard. Each zone sends a minimum of four divers to the NCAA meet, with the zones that had better performances at the previous year's NAAs getting additional entries. In 2008, Zone C, in which Notre Dame competes, will send seven divers to the NCAA Championships. Once in the 35-diver field, a student-athlete may compete in both the one- and three-meter springboard events, but can only take part in the platform competition if she participated in it at the zone meet.

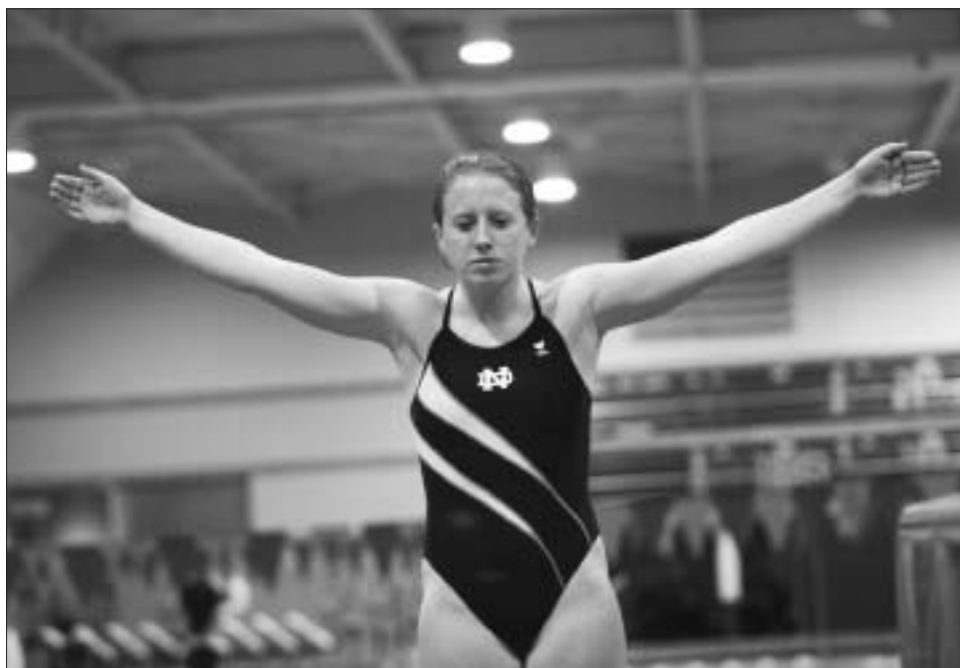

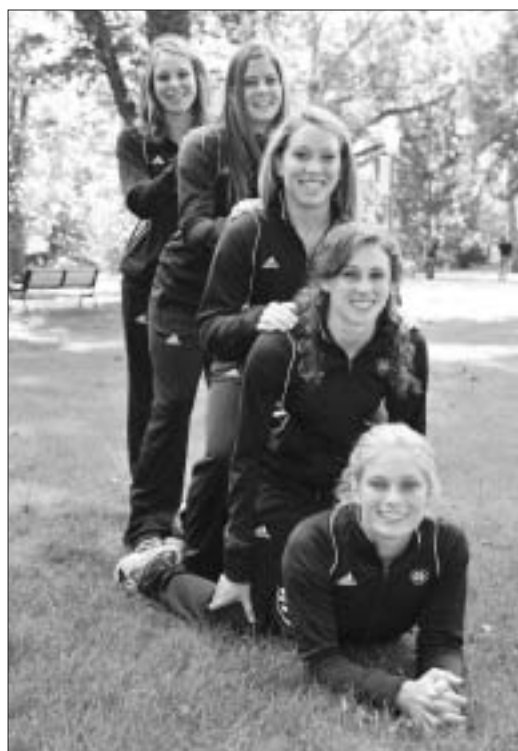

Brian Barnes, highly-regarded assistant coach the last three years for an Auburn University swimming program that produced multiple NCAA men's and women's swimming team championships, was named the University of Notre Dame's head women's swimming coach in August 2008.

Barnes becomes the fifth head coach in the program's 25-year history after serving as an assistant coach at Auburn since 2005.

"We're thrilled that Brian has come to lead our women's swimming program," said Notre Dame athletics director Jack Swarbrick.

"He has worked with world-class swimmers at Auburn, and he competed as part of a program at Indiana that has as much tradition as any. He absolutely understands what it takes to be successful in the environment of women's swimming at the intercollegiate level."

"It's an absolute honor to be here at Notre Dame," Barnes said. "My coaching career has now gone full circle, beginning as a club coach for 10-year-olds and practicing at (Notre Dame's) Rolfs Aquatic Center to being the head coach here.

"I'm fired up and honored to be able to represent Notre Dame. This school is one of the finest academic institutions in the world, and I certainly believe that you also can have high levels of success here at Notre Dame in women's swimming and diving."

An Osceola, Ind., native, Barnes helped guide both the Auburn men's and women's swimming teams to NCAA Championships in 2006 and 2007. The men won the Southeastern Conference meet three times from 2006 through '08, while the women picked up a pair of league titles during that span. In 2008, Auburn's men

placed fifth at the NCAA meet, with the women posting a runner-up performance.

Barnes spent the bulk of his time working with Auburn's middle-distance performers. The Auburn student-athletes earned 84 All-America honors from 30 different athletes and six NCAA individual championships in Barnes' final season with the program in '08 — as the women finished their season as one of the top two teams in the country for the seventh year in a row. The Tiger women have won five of the last seven NCAA team titles with the only other second-place finish coming in 2005.

Barnes spent three seasons (2002-05) as the assistant men's swimming coach at his alma mater, Indiana University. He helped coach the 2005 Hoosiers to their highest finish at the NCAA Championships since 1991 and their first 10-win dual meet season since 1985. In 2005, Indiana garnered 29 All-America honors, most since 1976, and finished second at the Big Ten Conference Championships. In 2004, the Hoosiers had five All-Americans and finished 17th at the NCAA Men's Championships.

Prior to his coaching stint at Indiana, Barnes served as the head coach of the Lawrence (Kan.) Aquahawks from 1998-02. With the Aquahawks, he was responsible for the general management of a 200-member, parent-run swim club. He created a program for swimmers ages five to 22, planning practices and meet schedules for swimmers of all ages and abilities. During his tenure, Barnes produced a number of collegiate swimmers who went on to swim at the NCAA Division I level and was recognized as the Region VIII Coach of the Year in 2000.

Before joining the Aquahawks, Barnes served as the assistant coach at the University of

Kansas from 1997-98. He developed daily workouts and was involved in every aspect of recruiting. Barnes began his coaching career with the Michiana Marlins, a USA Swimming club team in South Bend, Ind., that held practices in the Rolfs Aquatic Center at Notre Dame.

At his club stops, Barnes coached a 2002 National Junior Team swimmer, a 2001 Central Zone record-holder, a 1998 World Championship finalist, two of the top eight finalists at the Senior Nationals in 1996, and a Missouri Valley swimming record-holder. He also coached several national age-group top-16 qualifiers (including one champion), several Missouri Valley age-group champions, numerous Indiana State Champions and record-holders, and several national championship qualifiers.

Barnes was a highly accomplished swimmer during his career at Indiana from 1992-95. He was a two-time All-American and a five-time honorable mention All-American. His school record in the 400 Individual Medley stood for more than 15 years from 1992 until 2007. A two-time team most valuable swimmer, he served as team captain during his senior campaign.

The two-time Indiana Swimming Male Swimmer of the Year (1989, 1995) was also a member of the USA Swimming National Team in 1989 and 1992. Barnes was a U.S. Olympic Trials qualifier in 1992 and 1996.

A 1995 graduate of Indiana, Barnes earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology and is a level-4 certified member of the American Swimming Coaches Association.

In July 2004, Barnes married the former Alyssa Winter of Surry, N.H. They are parents of a son, Jack, born in October 2006.

Getting To Know Irish Head Coach Brian Barnes

On being born and raised in the South Bend area ...

I was born in Mishawaka (Ind.) and was the fourth of five children. When I was one, we moved to Osceola and I lived in the same house for 18 years. I grew up swimming for the Michiana Marlins who practiced in various pools in the South Bend school district and here at Notre Dame. My big ties to Notre Dame were definitely through football. We were big Notre Dame fans and took a particular liking to (former head football coach) Lou Holtz. I remember my father pulling for Notre Dame when they won the national championship in 1977.

When you grow up in Osceola and close to Notre Dame, you dream of playing football for the Irish. That was common at my middle school and my high school. Of course I thought about that when I was younger, but it was my goal to swim collegiately.

On how he began his career as a swim coach ...

I graduated from Penn High School and went off to Indiana University. After I graduated there, I came back to the area knowing that I wanted to coach but I didn't know how to get into the profession. I was presented with a great opportunity with the Michiana Marlins and I started off coaching the 10-and-under swimmers here at the Rolf's Aquatic Center.

The head coaching position with the Michiana Marlins freed up. I have to be honest – I didn't really know what I was doing as a 23-year-old head coach. I coached the Marlins for one year and was then presented with the opportunity to coach collegiately at Kansas. I moved to Lawrence and coached at KU for one year.

There was a local club team that showed a lot of potential and a lot of promise. I applied and accepted a position with the Lawrence AquaHawks and I knew that with taking the job I would stay put for a while. I was there for four years coaching the program. It was a great program, as we started out with 85 swimmers. Over the course of my time there we built a beautiful 10-lane indoor swimming pool. The program was exploding! By the time I left the Lawrence I had eight assistants and over 200 families involved within the program.

On his progress within the college coaching ranks ...

I was presented with the opportunity to coach at Indiana University and of course I had trouble turning that down. I got back into collegiate coaching and recruiting student-athletes at IU and that was an awesome experience because I had some meaningful years under my belt and I knew what I was doing. I had become a better coach; you never really learn how to coach, you just try to improve. I had confidence on deck and learned the recruiting system, the NCAA and the university structure. After being at Indiana for three years, Auburn was looking for an assistant and they called upon me.

On developing as a coach at Auburn ...

Having the chance to coach at Auburn was an unbelievable opportunity. I knew that going down there and being around those people was going to be an extremely valuable experience. Being a part of a championship program, I viewed it as a career investment. With the expectations of winning conference and national championships each season, there is a certain attitude and belief within the program that the student-athletes thrive on. I will always be grateful for my time spent at Auburn.

On what he's like outside of coaching ...

I'm a garage guy. I like to build things. Home improvement and carpentry are definitely hobbies. When I was at Auburn I'd routinely make recruiting calls from my garage because I always had a project going on in there. I've also been to over 200 concerts and still go to shows when I have the chance.

My three-year-old son, Jack, is going to play nose guard for a football team. I think he's going to be good at pushing people around – he's rough and a tumbler. I met my wonderful wife, Alyssa, in Bloomington. She's a certified athletic trainer and she's phenomenal at decorating cakes. I'm very blessed to have such a loving and supportive family.

Now in 31st year of his career as a diving coach, Caiming Xie has helped his protégés win BIG EAST titles, All-America honors and gold medals. A proven winner, Caiming's experience reaches all over the world and he is in his 14th season as head women's and men's diving coach at Notre Dame.

During his tenure, he has molded the top two divers ever to compete for the Irish - Heather Mattingly and Meghan Perry-Eaton - who combined for five BIG EAST titles, seven appearances in the NCAA Championships, and eight All-America citations. The duo also holds all six of the Notre Dame diving records, as well as four Rolf's Aquatic Center records. He also has coached the top two men's divers in school history.

For his efforts, Caiming, the first full-time diving coach in Notre Dame history, has been named his conference's top diving coach on five occasions, claiming the BIG EAST's top honor in 1999, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007. The last six seasons have been the most successful in Irish women's diving history, featuring six BIG EAST titles, five All-America honors and three BIG EAST Championships Most Outstanding Diver awards.

In 2006, Caiming molded two women's divers into all-BIG EAST performers in the 3-meter dive as Lucy Hirt was the runner up while her teammate, Tara Hyer, placed third in the same event at the BIG EAST Championships. For his efforts, Caiming captured his fourth BIG EAST Coach of the Year Award. Just two seasons later, Hyer was third off the 3-meter board at the league meet while Natalie Stitt claimed the title in that event and placed third off the 1-meter board.

From 2003-05, Perry-Eaton turned in the most impressive two-year stretch ever by an Irish diver, as she was beaten just one time during the regular season before sweeping the springboard events at the 2004 and 2005 BIG EAST Championships en route to being tabbed the meet's top diver. Perry-Eaton was the first Notre Dame diver ever to win a title at the NCAA Zone C Championships in 2004, taking first off the 1-meter board. At the NCAA Championships, she delivered the highest-ever finish for a Notre Dame swimmer or diver, taking third in that event, ending up just 3.30 points behind the national champion to become an All-American. She followed up with a fifth-place finish in 1-meter diving at the 2005 NCAA meet.

In 2002-03, Perry-Eaton became the first Notre Dame diver - and first non-University of Miami diver since 1996 - to win a BIG EAST championship, placing first in the 1-meter competition. She also was second on the 3-meter board and was named the BIG EAST's top diver - her first of three consecutive diver-of-the-year awards. Perry-Eaton then qualified for the NCAA Championships, where she placed ninth in the 1-meter event and 20th on the 3-meter board to earn honorable mention All-America honors.

Perry-Eaton finished her career holding four of the six Notre Dame diving records: six-dive 1-meter in both dual (322.64) and championship (331.58) action, as well as 11-dive, 3-meter championship competition (586.43) and 10-meter platform championship action (336.60). Additionally, she boasts Rolf's Aquatic Center records in both six-dive 1-meter formats (322.64 dual, 315.25 championship), as well as for dual-meet 3-meter action (333.82). Her score of 309.20 in 1-meter diving in 2003 en route to winning her first BIG EAST title stands as the highest since the switch to a six-dive format in championship meets in 2000-01.

Heather Mattingly was the first Irish diver to earn All-America honors, as she was a four-time honorable mention selection before being named an All-American in 3-meter action in 2002 with an eighth-place finish. Mattingly was the first Notre Dame diver to qualify for the NCAA Division I Championships, and she earned bids to the meet in each of her four collegiate campaigns. Mattingly also had a great deal of success in the NCAA zone



meet, taking second in 1-meter action in 1999, in addition to third-place results in 3-meter competition in both 1999 and 2002. She still maintains two Notre Dame records: for 10 dives in a championship meet off the 1-meter board (425.40) and for six-dive, 3-meter action (351.15). Her score of 550.55 in winning the 3-meter competition in the 2000 Notre Dame Invitational also is the best in the history of Notre Dame's home facility.

Before coming to Notre Dame, Caiming was the head diving coach for three

years at Toledo, earning Mid-American Conference diving-coach-of-the-year laurels in each of his last two seasons. Prior to his stint with the Rockets, Caiming was an assistant coach for the 1991-92 season at Pittsburgh.

Boasting a wealth of international experience on his résumé, Caiming served as the 1980 Chinese Olympic diving coach. He also was a technical consultant for United States Diving since 1994 and has held clinics and presentations for the United States Diving national team.

The Chinese national team coach from 1977-90, Caiming coached Sun Shu-Wei, a gold medalist in the men's platform competition at the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona, Spain, and Zhu Jin-Hong, who finished fourth in the women's platform in Barcelona. Caiming's divers also have earned medals at the Asian Games, World Cup, World University Games, and World Championships.

A competitive diver in his own right, Caiming won the springboard competition at the Asian Games in 1974 and earned first place in the platform and second in the springboard competition at the National Games of China in 1975. A 1985 graduate of the Beijing Institute of Physical Education, he also won numerous Chinese diving championships on the national level.

Caiming and his wife, Ping Tong, have one son, Tong, who graduated from Notre Dame in 2003 after a successful career as an Irish diver.

Joel White is in his fourth season as an assistant coach with the Notre Dame women's swimming and diving team.

White has worked closely with each of the last three Notre Dame teams that claimed BIG EAST Championship titles. By winning the league crown in 2008 Notre Dame earned its 12th consecutive BIG EAST title, setting a new BIG EAST record for the longest string in conference history in any sport. That Irish squad consisted of six first-place finishes at the league meet and broke or tied eight school records.

In 2008, he helped train three Irish swimmers that advanced to the NCAA's and sent 11 student-athletes to the U.S. Olympic Trials.

He assisted in the grooming of Katie Carroll as she earned her second All-America honor in the 400 Individual Medley with a seventh-place finish at the 2007 NCAA Championships. Also at the 2007 national meet, White helped guide the team to a 27th-place finish. The Irish sent eight individuals to the competition, the second largest total in school history.

In his first season with the Irish, White aided Notre Dame in winning its 10th consecutive

BIG EAST Championship. He helped coach two BIG EAST champions (Katie Carroll - 400 IM and Julia Quinn - 200 Breast) and 12 Irish swimmers and divers that were all-BIG EAST in 37 events.

Previous to the working with Notre Dame, White worked as an assistant at Utah. The Utes enjoyed a banner year in 2004-05 on the women's side, finishing the dual meet season 9-0 and 7-0 in Mountain West Conference competition. The team also claimed its first MWC regular-season title and finished third at the conference championship meet, setting nine school records at the conference competition. Combined, the Utah men's and women's team earned 39 all-conference individual honors and six relays also earned all-conference accolades from the Mountain West. Utah also was solid outside of the pool, earning 26 academic all-conference certificates in 2004-05.

A native of Austin, Texas, White has been highly active in the University of Texas swimming program, working the program's summer camp from 2000-2005. White also was the head swimming coach at Homestead High School in

Mequon, Wis., from 2001-03, leading the team to nine All-America honors, five individual state championships and two relay state titles.

White graduated from Wisconsin-Milwaukee in December 2002 with a degree in mechanical engineering. He swam all four years in college and was a nine-time conference finalist and team co-captain in 1999-200 and 2000-01. He specialized in the 400 Individual Medley, 500 Free and 200 Back during his collegiate career. White finished eighth at the 2001 Horizon League Championship in the 200 Back and ninth in both the 500 Free and 400 Individual Medley.

In 1998-99, White finished fifth in the 400 IM at the Horizon League meet (then known as the Mid-Continent Conference) and also competed in the 500 Free (ninth) and 1,650 Free (12th). He earned the team's Captain's Award at the conclusion of both his freshman and sophomore seasons.

White earned a master's degree from Utah in exercise and sport science with an emphasis in psychosocial aspects of sport in May 2005.

He was Notre Dame's interim head coach during the summer of 2008.

Season in Review



The Irish defeated Louisville by 239.5 points to take the 2008 BIG EAST title. The string of 12 consecutive championship titles is the most by any program in conference history.



Still On Top

Notre Dame ran its winning streak of consecutive BIG EAST Conference titles to 12 with a record-breaking effort at the 2008 league meet



Christa Riggins, Amywren Miller, Caroline Johnson and Lauren Parisi teamed to set a new school in the 200 Free Relay after winning the event at the 2008 BIG EAST Championships.

Another season, another BIG EAST title for the Notre Dame women's swimming and diving team.

Eleven consecutive titles were not enough for the Irish, as they added a 12th conference victory to their resume in dominating fashion at the Nassau County Aquatics Center in East Meadow, N.Y. By winning the title, Notre Dame extended its streak as the BIG EAST program to win the most consecutive titles in any conference-sponsored sport. The four-day event saw seven events go the way of the Irish as eight school records fell at the meet.

Notre Dame totaled 767 points to better second-place Louisville by 239.5 points. Fourteen different Irish student-athletes earned all-BIG EAST honors.

But the successful season did not end in New York. Three Irish swimmers headed to Columbus, Ohio, for the 2008 NCAA Championships. Junior Christa Riggins and freshmen Samantha Maxwell and Amywren Miller represented the Irish at the national meet.

Riggins earned automatic bids into the NCAAAs with a 22.89 in the 50 Free, 49.39 in the 100 Free, and the fifth-seed in the 200 Free with a mark of 1:44.39.

With an A-cut time of 22.39 in the 50 Free, Miller registered the nation's 17th-fastest time

of the season in that event. She was invited to compete in the 100 Fly with a provisional time of 54.88. The first-year member of the Irish squad turned in one of the top-20 times in the nation in the 100 Free (49.10) to join the final field.

Maxwell's 1:01.68 in the 100 Breast gave the freshman an automatic bid, and her 2:12.76 in the 200 Breast ranked 14th among collegiate swimmers heading into the NCAAAs.

After the trio completed solid swims across the board at the NCAAAs, 11 members of the team traveled to Omaha, Neb., for the 2008 United States Olympic Team Trials. The Olympic Trial qualifiers included: Ashlee Edgell (400 Individual Medley), Riggins (200 Free, 400 Free), Maxwell (100 Breast, 200 Breast), Miller (50 Free), Katie Caesy (200 Fly), Lauren Sylvester (400 Free), Casey Wagner (400 Free), Kellyn Kuhlke (100 Fly), Megan Farrell (200 IM) Maggie Behrens (100 Back) and Caroline Johnson (100 Fly).

Season Opens By Capturing Dennis Stark Relays ...

Notre Dame scored 226 of 822 points at the Dennis Stark Relays, the opening meet of the season, taking first place by 60 points. Five teams from nearby universities joined the women in the waters of Notre Dame. The Irish

engaged in many close races with Illinois State and Ball State University swimmers and consequently, the two latter teams finished in a tie for second with 166 points. Oakland University finished 4th (142), Valparaiso University placed 5th (104), and Marquette University was 6th (18).

Notre Dame finished the meet with a tremendous display during the final event – the 400 Free Relay. Illinois State led off during the beginning of the race, but by the time the first swimmers had exited the water, Notre Dame was in a three-way tie for second place. During the third leg, Valparaiso took the lead. However, the gap started to fade as Riggins charged through the waves and chased down the leader. By the time Riggins finished, Notre Dame had a slight lead. After Miller entered the water, the Irish broke away in a record-breaking finish of 3:31.01, over two seconds faster than the previous record.

First Dual-Meet Win Comes at Purdue ...

No. 22 Notre Dame earned its first dual-meet win of the season over the Purdue, 158.5-131.5 at the Boilermaker Aquatic Center in West Lafayette, Ind. Out of 16 total events, the Irish had 11 victories during the competition and six runner-up performances.

Head-to-Head With Pittsburgh ...

The Irish fell to Pittsburgh in a heartbreaker that came down to the final event at Trees Pool in Pittsburgh, Pa. The Panthers prevailed over Notre Dame, 150-148, despite the Irish capturing nine individual victories.

Johnson and Maxwell each swam home two individual titles for Notre Dame. Johnson clocked in first in the 100 and 200 Back with Maxwell earning top finishes in the 100 and 200 Breast.

The Irish also found a level of success in two events, commanding both the 1,000 Free and the 3-meter diving. In each event, the top three spots were swept by Notre Dame athletes.

Hustling at the Husky Invite ...

Notre Dame wrapped up competition with a third-place finish out of 12 teams at the Husky Invitational in Federal Way, Wash. The Irish finished the three-day competition with 972 points while the host school, Washington, took the title with 1,439 points and USC placed second with 1,290 points.



On the final day of swimming, 16 Irish swimmers made it past the prelims during the morning session to compete in the evening session of finals. The highlight of the night for Notre Dame was the first-place finish by Miller in the 100 Free. Miller cut her season best time of 51.69 by over a second, swimming a new best of 50.37.

Conquering the Cardinals ...

Notre Dame dominated Louisville, 188-111 for a January that bumped the Irish up to 3-5 in dual meet action. The night was filled with fast times, exciting races and victories for Notre Dame as they soon began preparations for the BIG EAST Championships. Riggins was a key component in the Irish win, tacking on four wins throughout the competition.

Dennis Stark Honored at Alumni Meet ...

Over 100 former student-athletes, coaches, managers, chaplains, and staff were in attendance with family members and friends at the Rolfs Aquatic Center in April, taking part in the Notre Dame swimming and diving program's inaugural alumni meet.

The occasion commemorated the 50th anniversary of the men's team and the 25th year of women's swimming and diving at Notre Dame.

The programs unveiled a state-of-the-art video board that was made possible largely through the help of gracious contributions from a number of alumni. The Colorado Time Systems board is mounted on the south wall of Rolfs and measures 11 feet tall and nearly 20 feet in width. It is a full matrix LED scoreboard with computer controller, channel-mounting hardware and galvanized steel channel with data fiber cables. Its display is capable of 1.07 billion shades of color with full matrix graphics and animation.

The board was dedicated to former Irish head coach Dennis Stark.

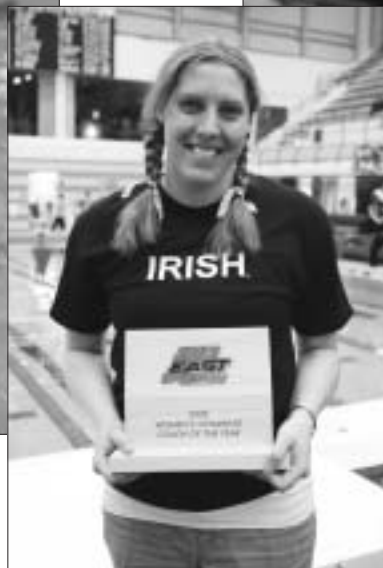

Notes: Three Irish swimmers (Christa Riggins, Sam Maxwell and Amywren Miller) competed in the 2008 NCAA Women's Swimming and Diving Championships held at McCorkle Aquatics Pavilion in Columbus, Ohio.

Miller clocked in at 22.73 in the preliminary session of the 2008 NCAA's Swimming and Diving Championships. That time gave the Irish sprinter a 24th-place finish in the event. Riggins (23.16) was 50th in the same event.

Riggins also represented Notre Dame in the 2007 championships, competing in the 50 Free, 100 Free, 200 Free, 200 Free Relay, 400 Free Relay, 800 Free Relay, and 400 Medley Relay. Her highest finish was a 13th setting in the 800 Free Relay (7:14.91), as she teamed with Katie Carroll, Megan Farrell and Ellen Johnson. She earned automatic bids into the 2008 meet with a 22.89 in the 50 Free, 49.39 in the 100 Free, and the fifth-seed in the 200 Free with a mark of 1:44.39.

With an A-cut time of 22.39 in the 50 Free, Miller registered the nation's 17th-fastest time of the 2007-08 season in that event. She was invited to compete in the 100 Fly with a provisional time of 54.88. She turned in one of the top-20 times in the nation in the 100 Free (49.10) to join the final field. Maxwell's 1:01.68 in the 100 Breast gave her an automatic bid, and her 2:12.76 in the 200 Breast ranked 14th among collegiate swimmers this season.

Since the inception of the women's program at Notre Dame, 21 individuals representing the Irish have earned All-American honors at the NCAA's, with Carroll being the most recent with a seventh-place finish in 2007 with a time of 4:12.37 in the 400 IM. At least one Irish swimmer has garnered All-American recognition in every season since 1996, with Carrie Nixon leading the pack by becoming a 12-time honoree from 1999-2002. She posted the highest finish of any Irish swimmer to compete in the NCAA's by placing fourth in the 50 Free in 2000.

Jeanine Blatt and Betsy Shadley were the program's first All-Americans, claiming the honor in 1979 when the Irish competed at the Division III level.

The most prestigious honor awarded to a Notre Dame student-athlete, the Byron V. Kanaley Award has been presented each year since 1927 to the senior monogram athletes who have been most exemplary as both students and leaders. The awards, presented by the Faculty Board on Athletics, are named in honor of a 1904 Notre Dame graduate who was a member of the Irish baseball team as an undergraduate. Kanaley went on to a successful banking career in Chicago and served the University as a lay trustee from 1915 until his death in 1960.

National & International Competition

Irish in National and International Competition

In addition to their many accomplishments in collegiate action, Notre Dame women's swimmers and divers have a history of also competing in various prestigious national and international meets, including three of the last four Olympics.

In 1996, Jilen Siroky ('04), then just 15 years of age, represented the United States in the Atlanta games, finishing 15th in the 200m Breast. Siroky also was the 1996 U.S. champion in the 100 Breast.

In 2000, Christel Bouvron represented her native Singapore in the Sydney games, finishing 32nd in the 200m Fly and 36th in the 400 Free. Four years later, she became just the second current Notre Dame student-athlete ever – and first in 84 years – to take part

in the Olympics, matching her 32nd-place finish in the 200 Fly.

In addition to that pair of Olympians, 39 Irish student-athletes have competed in U.S. Olympic Trials and four more have swum in their native country's trials. Backstroker Erin Brooks, a 1997 graduate, represented the U.S. in the '97 World University Games and came home with a bronze medal in the 200 Back. Notre Dame also has a long history of swimmers and divers who have qualified or competed in the USA Swimming Senior National Championships, as nearly 60 future, current, or former Irish competitors have done so.

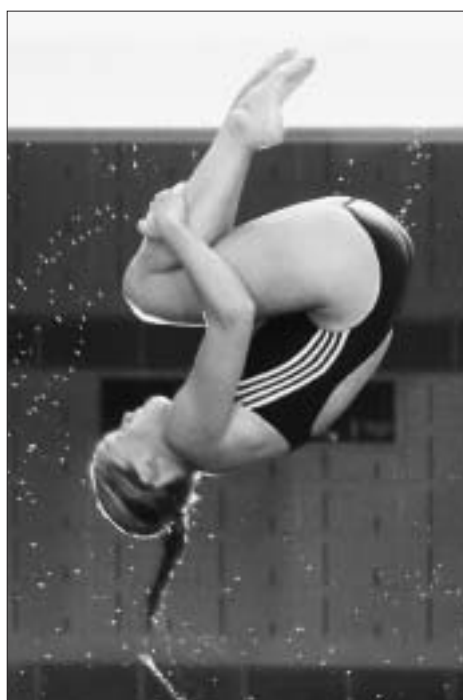

After four years of varsity intercollegiate swimming competition in the Rockne Memorial Pool, the Notre Dame women's swimming and diving program entered a new era in 1985, as they moved to the \$4.5-million natatorium located in the Joyce Center.

Donated by brothers Thomas and Robert Rolf of West Bend, Wis., the Rolfs Aquatic Center provides Notre Dame with a modern, innovative facility on par with any other in the country. Ellerbe Architects and Engineers of Bloomington, Minn., the architects used in the planning of the Joyce Center, also were com-

missioned to design the 45,000-square-foot facility which houses a 50-meter Olympic pool (25 yards in width), spectator seating for 400 and support facilities.

The facility features two movable bulkheads to allow sections of the pool to be blocked off, allowing swimming competition and warm-up swimming to occur simultaneously. The design also allows recreational swimming, water polo, instructional swimming and other aquatic activities. Diving is accommodated with two one-meter boards and two three-meter boards.

Support functions housed in the center of the facility just below the spectator seating include men's

and women's locker rooms, men's and women's varsity locker rooms, and men's and women's staff locker rooms. Offices for the Notre Dame swimming staff, aquatics directors, and lifeguards are deckside and glass-fronted with a view of the pool.

Several deckside instructional areas are located around the pool and feature infrared heat lamps, designed to keep wet swimmers warm between events. The pool features a stainless steel racing gutter which is designed to absorb the bow waves of a swimmer, allowing faster swimming times.

Another instructional feature is the presence of two underwater windows which allow critiquing of a diver's or swimmer's underwater technique. The unique structural system consists of three trusses which span 120 feet, with the roof suspended below the trusses. In addition, the white exterior trusses provide an interesting and athletic character to the building. The lighting system is designed to be adjusted

from maximum brightness for television to nearly dark for dramatic synchronized swimming presentations.

The center was officially dedicated on November 13, 1985.

BIG EAST Conference

The 2008-09 academic year will be the 30th for The BIG EAST Conference. While the league has gone through membership changes since its birth, it has never been stronger. This academic year will mark the conference's fourth year as the nation's largest Division I-A conference.

The goals of the BIG EAST have never changed. The league aims and expects to compete at the highest level and does so with integrity and sportsmanship. The student-athletes of the member schools continue to maintain the league's proud tradition of success.

BIG EAST teams earned their share of recognition at the highest levels in 2007-08. Four women's teams advanced to their respective NCAA Final Fours: Connecticut field hockey and women's basketball, Notre Dame soccer and Syracuse lacrosse.

Individually in men's sports, Villanova's Bobby Curtis was the NCAA outdoor track champion in the 5,000 meters. Connecticut's O'Brian White won the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy, the highest individual honor in soccer. Two years ago, BIG EAST male and female student-athletes were Hermann Trophy winners.

In men's basketball, the BIG EAST tied its own record set in 2006 by earning eight NCAA Championship bids. BIG EAST women's teams have received eight NCAA invitations in each of the past two years. The combined 16 men's and women's berths in 2008 was an NCAA first.

The quality of BIG EAST football has never been more balanced. Six of the league's eight squads were nationally ranked in 2007. For the third straight year, the BIG EAST representative in the Bowl Championship Series won its BCS bowl game.

The BIG EAST continued to produce student-athletes who were at the forefront of athletic and academic achievement. Nineteen BIG EAST players were chosen to their respective ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Teams, including eight first-team selections.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A group in 2005-06 when five new members began competing. The new schools were: University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top 34 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Milwaukee and Cincinnati. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain almost one fourth of all television households in the U.S.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 25 national championships in six different sports and 125 student-athletes have won individual national titles.

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. More than 370 student-athletes have earned academic all-America honors. Last year in football, Louisville quarterback Brian Brohm, who finished his career as the BIG EAST's career passing leader, was one of the league's eight first-team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America team picks.

Also, Connecticut's Rebecca Lobo, one of the most heralded women's basketball players in the history of the sport, was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 2008. Lobo, a two-time BIG EAST Player of the Year, led the Huskies to the 1995 NCAA national championship.

The BIG EAST has enjoyed tremendous basketball success, especially in this decade. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. In men's basketball, BIG EAST squads have won three of the last 10 NCAA championships. BIG EAST women's teams have taken five of the last nine NCAA titles.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger.

In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse and rowing to its growing list of sports. The first women's golf championship was held in the spring of 2003. In 2007, the league conducted its first women's lacrosse championship tournament. In 2009-10, the BIG EAST will begin sponsorship of men's lacrosse, its 24th sport.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based

programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student-athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably shows a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization needs outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Dave Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

For 2009-10, the BIG EAST will undergo one significant change. Tranghese has announced that he will step down from his position on June 30, 2009.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed longstanding relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant in soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

More than 550 BIG EAST student-athletes have earned all America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams. Several athletes earned gold medals in each of the last six summer Olympiads.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 athletes.
