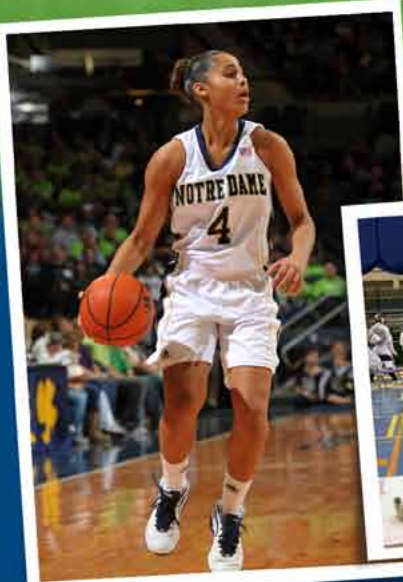
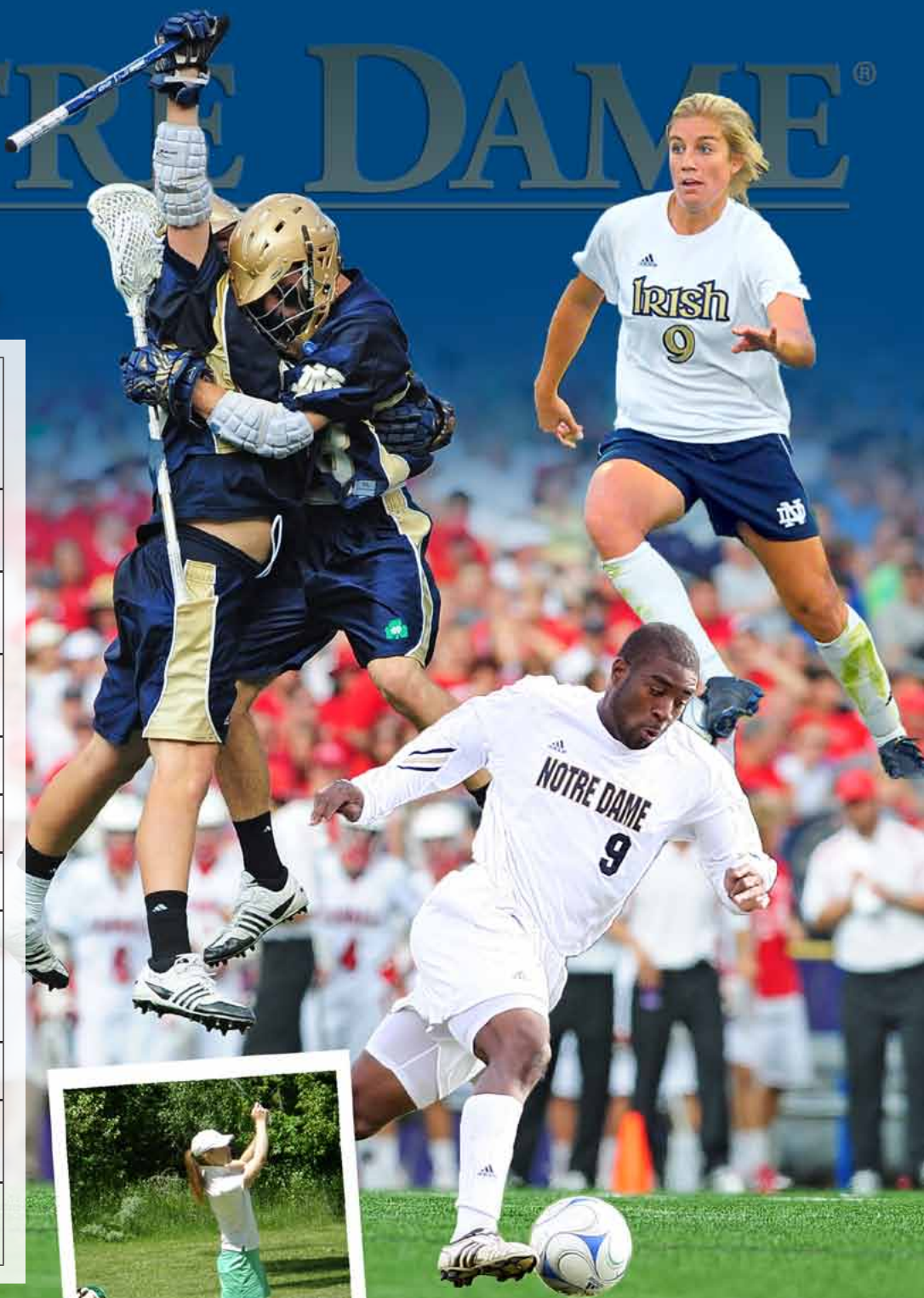

Featuring five undergraduate colleges (Arts and Letters, Science, Architecture, Engineering and Business), the First Year of Studies, the Graduate School and the Law School, the University finds itself attracting some of the top students and faculty in the country. Students also participate in cutting edge research and diverse study abroad opportunities, enabling Notre Dame to offer one of the top academic experiences in the world.

First Year of Studies

The First Year of Studies program provides all first-year students with the opportunity to gain a wide-ranging liberal arts background before choosing a specific major within Notre Dame's five undergraduate colleges. A progressive advising program for all student-athletes enables the University to follow the academic progress of all student-athletes on a regular basis. Key to the program is the fact that it is not run by the athletics department but by the University administration.

Student-Athlete Success

Notre Dame expects the best out of its student-athletes just as it does of every other student on campus. Notre Dame has had unprecedented academic success among its athletes, consistently ranking among the top NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision schools in graduation rates and academic progress. With more Academic All-Americans than any other school since 2000, Irish athletes have shown themselves capable of performing in the classroom while competing on the field at an elite level.

Sports Medicine

While no athlete plans on an injury, Notre Dame is prepared with one of the top sports medicine teams in the country to help keep its athletes fit and ready to compete. With training facilities in the Joyce Center, Notre Dame Stadium and the Guglielmino Athletics Complex, the training staff is always there to care for athletes. With approximately 225 years combined experience on the full-time staff, Notre Dame also boasts a partnership with the renowned South Bend Orthopaedics to provide first-class care.

Sports Nutrition

Notre Dame has incorporated Erika Whitman, a full-time sports dietitian, as a part of its Strength and Conditioning staff. Whitman continually provides accurate and up-to-date nutrition education to student-athletes and coaches. Including nutrition as an integral component of all training programs enables Irish athletes to achieve optimal health and maximize performance.

Strength and Conditioning

The task of keeping athletes in top physical condition is up to the strength & conditioning staff. The strength and conditioning staff knows the demands of competing on an elite level and is committed to ensuring Irish athletes are always in the best possible condition. From weight lifting to wind sprints and from warming up to cooling down, the strength and conditioning staff has every aspect covered.

The University of Notre Dame

When Father Edward F. Sorin started his school in the northern Indiana wilderness, he had only \$300, three log buildings badly in need of repair and a far-sighted vision of establishing a liberal arts school to meet the growing educational needs of the frontier. He dreamed of building a great university, and in 1842, he founded the University of Notre Dame du Lac.

Over the years, the University of Notre Dame du Lac would evolve into a preeminent place for Catholic thought. While becoming one of the top undergraduate institutions in the country, Notre Dame has also been at the cutting edge of research, including such innovations as the transmission of wireless messages and the development of synthetic rubber. The University also has stressed residential life, with four of five students living on campus. Students come to Notre Dame not only to learn how to think, but to learn how to live, keeping faith with the vision of Father Sorin.

Student Body

Notre Dame is one of a handful of universities with a truly international student body, coming from more than 100 nations and all 50 states. The most recent freshman class featured 89 percent of students in the top 10 percent of their high school class. In addition, there are no fraternities or sororities at Notre Dame, with the school's 28 residence halls housing more than 80 percent of the student body, serving as the focal point of social, religious and athletic activities.

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C. President

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., took office as the 17th president of the University of Notre Dame on July 1, 2005. He was elected by the University's Board of Trustees to a five-year term April 30, 2004.

An associate professor of philosophy and member of Notre Dame's faculty since 1990, Father Jenkins had served as a vice president and associate provost at the University from July 2000 until becoming president.

Prior to his service in the provost's office, Father Jenkins had been religious superior of the Holy Cross priests and brothers at Notre Dame for three years. As religious superior, he was a Fellow and Trustee of the University.

Father Jenkins specializes in the areas of ancient philosophy, medieval philosophy and the philosophy of religion. He is the author of *Knowledge and Faith in Thomas Aquinas*, published by Cambridge University Press in 1997.

Father Jenkins earned degrees in philosophy from Oxford University in 1987 and 1989. He earned his master of divinity degree and licentiate in sacred theology from the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, Calif., in 1988. Prior to entering the Congregation of Holy Cross, he earned bachelor's and master's degrees in philosophy from Notre Dame in 1976 and 1978, respectively.

Father Jenkins was ordained a priest in Notre Dame's Basilica of the Sacred Heart in 1983. He served as director of the Old College program for Notre Dame undergraduate candidates for the Congregation of Holy Cross from 1991 to 1993.

A native of Omaha, Neb., Father Jenkins was born Dec. 17, 1953.

Director of Athletics

John B. "Jack" Swarbrick Jr., a University of Notre Dame graduate who rose to national prominence as a lawyer, consultant and executive in the collegiate and Olympic sports industries, is in his third year in 2010-11 as director of athletics at his alma mater.

Among Swarbrick's athletics initiatives are meeting the performance needs of Notre Dame student-athletes through establishment of a new sports performance division, reaching out to more former Irish student-athletes via the Notre Dame Monogram Club and other programs, utilizing emerging digital technologies to deliver better information on and access to Notre Dame athletic programs via expanded production and distribution of programming, and restructuring Notre Dame's approach to sport administration through assignment of a unique administrator to each of the 26 Irish sports.

The past two years combined in Notre Dame athletics have featured 68 All-Americans, 14 Academic All-America selections and four NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship winners; record involvement in community service hours by Irish student-athletes; NCAA runner-up team finishes in 2010 men's lacrosse,

2009 fencing and 2008 women's soccer; NCAA semifinal appearances in 2009 and 2010 women's tennis and 2009 women's soccer, plus a 2010 third-place fencing finish; the hiring of new Irish head football coach Brian Kelly to start the 2010 season; the decision to build a new, freestanding ice hockey arena, scheduled to open for the 2011-12 season, plus the 2009-10 dedications of new facilities for soccer and lacrosse – as well as opening of the new Purcell Pavilion within the south dome of the Joyce Center, and 15 BIG EAST Conference titles along with four other league crowns in hockey, men's lacrosse and fencing.

Notre Dame ranked number one in the country (among Football Bowl Subdivision schools) in the two most recent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) surveys -- in 2009 with a 99 (including a 97 score in football that also ranked number one).

Born in Yonkers, N.Y., and raised in Yonkers and Bloomington, Ind., Swarbrick is a 1976 magna cum laude graduate of Notre Dame with a bachelor's degree in economics. Upon graduating from Stanford University Law School in 1980, he returned to Indiana to accept a position as an associate in the Indianapolis law firm Baker & Daniels. He made partner in 1987 and spent 28 years overall with the firm.

As a member of the Indiana Sports Corporation, including the chairmanship from 1992 to 2001, Swarbrick led most of the city's successful proposals to a wide array of athletics organizations – from the National Football League to the United States Olympic Committee to the Big Ten Conference. His leadership efforts resulted in the city earning the right to play host to the 2012 Super Bowl in Indianapolis at Lucas Oil Stadium; becoming the home of the National Collegiate Athletic Association national headquarters in 1999; hosting the 1987 Pan American Games, 1991 World Gymnastics Championships, NCAA Men's Basketball Final Fours and other college championship competitions and an array of national and world championships in Olympic sports.

Swarbrick's practice at Baker & Daniels focused on the representation of owners of sports teams and organizations that sanction or conduct athletic competitions. He served as general counsel for numerous national governing bodies of Olympic sports, including USA Gymnastics and USRowing, and as a consultant to the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta.

In his work as an advisor to the NCAA, Swarbrick coordinated the men's College Basketball Partnership, an NCAA-led group that addresses the opportunities and challenges in the sport, and developed the business plan for the new NBA/NCAA youth basketball enterprise, iHoops. In 2000 Swarbrick received one of the NCAA's highest honors, The Flying Wedge Award, for his work in establishing Indianapolis as the new home of the NCAA. In 2001 the State of Indiana presented him with the Sagamore of the Wabash Award.

Born March 19, 1954, Swarbrick was named Notre Dame's 12th athletics director on July 16, 2008. He and his wife, Kimberly, are the parents of four children: Kate, a 2010 graduate of St. Louis University; Connor, a senior at Wake Forest University; Cal, a freshman at TCU; and Christopher, a high school senior.



Homes of the Fighting Irish

In the midst of a master plan that will touch nearly every varsity team, Notre Dame has shown its commitment to providing athletes with the best possible facilities to help them compete on a national level. From new facilities to the extensive renovation of existing ones, Notre Dame is committed to giving Irish athletes every edge imaginable. The plan will result in a drastically altered footprint on the south-east corner of campus, creating an athletics quad that will give every Irish athlete a place they will be proud to call home.

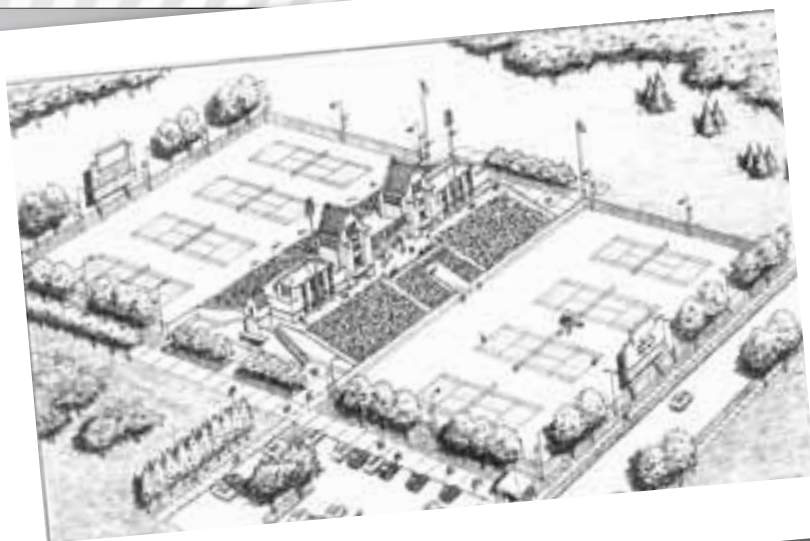

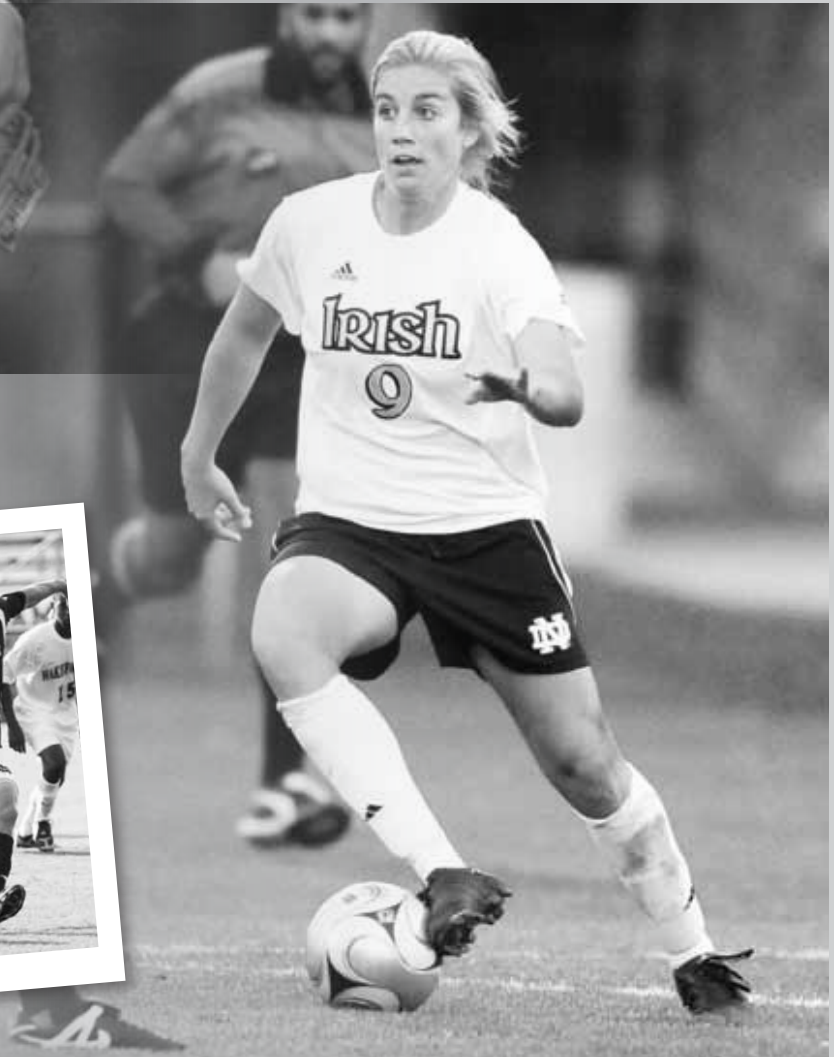

The Notre Dame Monogram Club was founded by athletics director Jesse Harper in 1916 to bring together varsity letterwinners to promote spirit, unity, leadership and sportsmanship. Today's active members help keep past athletes connected to Notre Dame and the current student-athletes. In addition to helping contribute to scholarships, the Monogram Club has helped contribute to new facilities, especially the renovation of Heritage Hall and the Monogram Room, located in the Joyce Center.

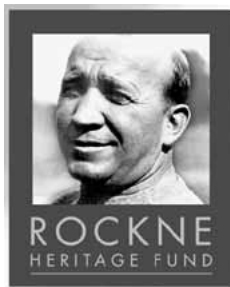
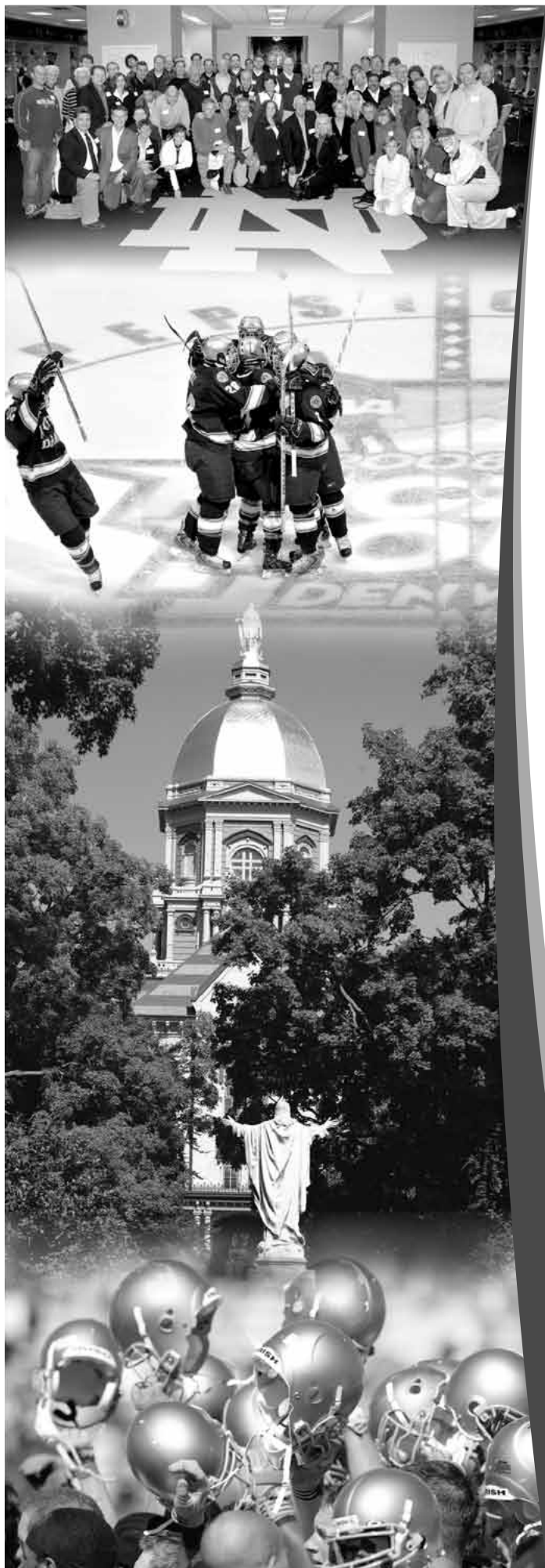

Reaching for Number 15

Irish expect to continue BIG EAST Conference Championships winning streak.

Brian Barnes feels like he is in the right place at the right time.

"Being here at Notre Dame has been a dream come true for me," said the Osceola, Ind., native and third-year head coach of the Irish swimming and diving program. "I'm at the best university in the world. I'm back home with my friends and family, and blessed to be able to lead an incredible swimming and diving program."

Since stepping on campus prior to the 2008-09 season Barnes has since won a pair of BIG EAST titles, two BIG EAST Coach of the Year awards and has sent his student-athletes to the NCAA Championships to bring home three All-American accolades.

He feels like his team is also in the right place at the time.

"Our program has won 14 consecutive BIG EAST titles, and I've been lucky enough to have a hand in two of those," Barnes said. "But that stat, is just a stat. While winning the BIG EAST is quite an accomplishment, I want our program to be more dialed in to an NCAA Championship effort. We should excel towards bigger things than just a BIG EAST championship here at Notre Dame.

"We had two All-Americans in Amywren Miller and Samantha Maxwell last year, and in all due respect to their efforts, that's just a small testament of what we, as a team, can do here at Notre Dame. I'm watching that belief development in our current program – the belief that we can send even more swimmers and divers to the NCAAAs. We can get a relay or two into the NCAAAs, I believe we can creep into the top 15."

Senior team captains Katie Casey, Kellyn Kuhlke and Heidi Grossman will help steer the ship for the Irish throughout the 2010-11 season.

Casey and Kuhlke each excel in the butterfly, as Casey was third in the 200-yard version of the event in 2010 at the league meet after setting a BIG EAST record and winning the crown in 2009. Kuhlke turned in season-best times in both the 100 and 200 fly at the BIG EAST meet, finishing in third place in the 100 fly with a time of 54.25.

Grossman hopes to improve upon her 2010 BIG EAST fourth-place finishes in both the 1- and 3-meter events as the lone senior diver on the roster.

Senior Lauren Parisi is coming off a season in which she set several personal-best times and swam to a season-best performance at the 2010 BIG EAST event as an exhibition swimmer. Meg

Reynolds also had two season-best times at the BIG EAST meet, and fellow senior Lauren Sylvester swam in a myriad of events for the Irish over the course of last season, ranging from the 100 free to the 1,650 free, and will be one of the top distance swimmers in the league in 2010-11.

Maxwell, the reigning BIG EAST Swimmer of the Year, won all but one breaststroke event prior to the 2010 NCAA meet. After earning a 14th-place

finish in the 100 breast at the NCAA Championships with a time of 1:01.09, she was named an honorable mention All-American for her performance. Miller earned an All-America accolade for the first time in her Notre Dame career in 2010, finishing eighth in the 50 free at the NAAs while breaking her own school record. She is slated to be one of the league's – and nation's – top sprinters this season.

The three-person junior class of Emily Barton, Gwen Blythe and Amy Prestinario certainly makes its presence felt year in and year out. Barton hopes to once again swim in the final races of the 400 IM and 100 fly at the BIG EAST meet, just as she did in 2010. Blythe was sixth in the 100 breast and tied for ninth in the 200 breast last season, and should continue to develop under the wing of Maxwell in those events. Prestinario amassed two BIG EAST honors as a sophomore – two relays (200 free, 400 free) and one individual (100 free) – and has bettered her times in all freestyle events in each of the last two seasons.

Second-year student-athletes in Jenny Chiang (BIG EAST 3-meter champion), Gracie Fredlake (fourth in the 500 free and 1,650 free), Jaime Malandra (12th in the 1,650 free), Lauren Scott (all-BIG EAST in 200 free relay), Kimmie Lisiak (career-day came at Shamrock Invitational) and Kim Holden (four BIG EAST titles in 2010) will be expected to parlay outstanding freshmen performances with an even better sophomore year. Additionally, Holden enters her sophomore season with six all-BIG EAST accolades and a pair of school records in the 100 and 200 backstroke. She also recorded Notre Dame's fastest time in the 100 fly (54.12) last season.

The swimming and diving program hits the water for the first time in 2010-11 with the 27th annual Dennis Stark Relays (Oct. 8) at the Rolfs Aquatic Center. Stark was the first women's swimming and diving head coach at Notre Dame and retired in 1985.

"The Stark Relays are very special to this program," Barnes said. "This meet is all about honoring Dennis, and everything he has done for swimming and diving within this program and community."

"This schedule will challenge us from the opening dual meet all the way to the postseason," Barnes said. "I'm excited for our team to compete against some great programs, and we'll be presented with some fine challenges and I expect our ladies to raise their performances for those meets."

Next is a tri-meet at Auburn with LSU on Oct. 22. The meet will mark the first occasion that Barnes brings his own squad to Auburn – where he served as an assistant – since becoming head coach of the Fighting Irish.

Notre Dame will stay on the road when it matches up against Big Ten foe Michigan State (Oct. 29). The Irish will enter the meet with a 6-0 record against the Spartans.

Purdue (Nov. 6) and Utah (Nov. 12) visit Notre Dame on consecutive weekends, and the first half of the swimming campaign concludes with the three-day U.S. Nationals meet in Columbus, Ohio (Dec. 2-4). The Irish diving squad will travel Dec. 3-5 to take part in the Iowa Invitational in Iowa City, Iowa.

Notre Dame visits Honolulu, Hawaii, for its annual winter training trip and hits the water against Hawaii on Jan. 4.

"The value that this trips gives to the program in terms of bonding, hard work and sunshine will be very useful for us as we hit our business portion of the season, which will be February and March," Barnes said.

Notre Dame travels to Evanston, Ill., on Jan. 15 for its second tri-meet of the season against Northwestern and Michigan.

The first home meet of 2011 will be the Shamrock Invitational (Jan 28-29), and the season wraps up on Feb. 5 versus Ball State

The 2011 BIG EAST Conference Diving Championships will take place Feb. 11-13 in Louisville, Ky., and will be followed by the swimming events, which are slated for Feb. 16-20.

The NCAA Zone Diving Championships will take place March 11-13 on the campus of Ohio State University at the McCorkle Aquatic Pavilion while the NCAA Championships will be held in Austin, Texas, from March 17-19.



Samantha Maxwell, who earned All-American honors in 2008 and 2009, will be counted on once again to lead the Irish into the 2011 NCAA Championships.

Brian Barnes was named the University of Notre Dame's head women's swimming coach in August 2008 after serving as an assistant coach at Auburn since 2005.

"It's an absolute honor to be here at Notre Dame," Barnes said. "My coaching career has now gone full circle, beginning as a club coach for 10-year-olds and practicing at (Notre Dame's) Rolfs Aquatic Center to being the head coach here.

"This school is one of the finest academic institutions in the world, and I certainly believe that you also can have high levels of success here at Notre Dame in women's swimming and diving."

Barnes wasted no time in placing the Irish back

at the forefront of the BIG EAST Conference by leading the team to its 13th consecutive league title in 2009, the longest streak by any team (and in sport) in conference history. Notre Dame won 10 events at the BIG EAST Championships while earning 40 all-league accolades and teamed to reset 12 program records. Furthermore, the Irish sent three student-athletes to the NCAA Championships with Samantha Maxwell coming home with a pair of All-America honors as Notre Dame finished 31st overall. Six swimmers also participated in the 2009 World Championship Trials.

For his efforts, Barnes was named the 2009 BIG EAST Women's Coach of the Year.

Year two of the Barnes era was just as successful as the inaugural campaign. Notre Dame totaled 14 points behind the efforts of Maxwell and Amywren Miller to finish 38th out of 47 teams at the NCAA Championships. Maxwell earned an All-American accolade in the 100 breast for the second straight year after finishing 14th overall and Miller set a school record in the 50 free and finished eighth overall. She went 22.30 from the far lane to win her preliminary race before going 22.49 in the finals to earn the first All-American accolade of her career.

Maxwell also had a hand in four titles at the BIG EAST Championships (100 breast, 200 breast, 200 medley relay, 400 medley relay) to earn the BIG EAST Women's Most Outstanding Swimmer award, as Barnes was named the BIG EAST Women's Coach of the Year for the second straight season. Notre Dame (773.5) withstood second-

place Louisville (718) and West Virginia (525) to top the 11-team field.

In fact, Maxwell crushed the BIG EAST Conference, Notre Dame and Pittsburgh's Trees Pool record after winning the 100 breast in 59.64, the nation's fastest performance in the event (at the time of the swim).

An Osceola, Ind., native, Barnes helped guide both the Auburn men's and women's swimming teams to NCAA Championships in 2006 and 2007. The men won the Southeastern Conference meet three times from 2006 through '08, while the women picked up a pair of league titles during that span. In 2008, Auburn's men placed fifth at the NCAA meet, with the women posting a runner-up performance.

Barnes spent the bulk of his time working with Auburn's middle-distance performers. The Auburn student-athletes earned 84 All-America honors from 30 different athletes and six NCAA individual champion-

ships in Barnes' final season with the program in '08 -- as the women finished their season as one of the top two teams in the country for the seventh year in a row. The Tiger women have won five of the last seven NCAA team titles with the only other second-place finish coming in 2005.

Barnes spent three seasons (2002-05) as the assistant men's swimming coach at his alma mater, Indiana University. He helped coach the 2005 Hoosiers to their highest finish at the NCAA Championships since 1991 and their first 10-win dual meet season since 1985. In 2005, Indiana garnered 29 All-America honors, the most since 1976, and finished second at the Big Ten Conference Championships. In 2004, the Hoosiers had five All-Americans and finished 17th at the NCAA Men's Championships.

Prior to his coaching stint at Indiana, Barnes served as the head coach of the Lawrence (Kan.) Aquahawks from 1998-02. With the Aquahawks, he was responsible for the general management of a 200-member, parent-run swim club. He created a program for swimmers ages five to 22, planning practices and meet schedules for swimmers of all ages and abilities. During his tenure, Barnes produced a number of collegiate swimmers who went on to swim at the NCAA Division I level and was recognized as the Region VIII Coach of the Year in 2000.

Before joining the Aquahawks, Barnes served as the assistant coach at the University of Kansas from 1997-98. He developed daily workouts and was involved in every aspect of recruiting. Barnes began his coaching career with the Michiana Marlins, a USA Swimming club team in South Bend, Ind., that held practices in the Rolfs Aquatic Center at Notre Dame.

At his club stops, Barnes coached a 2002 National Junior Team swimmer, a 2001 Central Zone record-holder, a 1998 World Championship finalist, two of the top eight finalists at the Senior Nationals in 1996, and a Missouri Valley swimming record-holder. He also coached several national age-group top-16 qualifiers (including one champion), several Missouri Valley age-group champions, numerous Indiana State Champions and record-holders, and several national championship qualifiers.

Barnes was a highly accomplished swimmer during his career at Indiana from 1992-95. He was a two-time All-American and a five-time honorable mention All-American. His school record in the 400 Individual Medley stood for more than 15 years from 1992 until 2007. A two-time team most valuable swimmer, he served as team captain during his senior campaign.

The two-time Indiana Swimming Male Swimmer of the Year (1989, 1995) was also a member of the USA Swimming National Team in 1989 and 1992. Barnes was a U.S. Olympic Trials qualifier in 1992 and 1996.

A 1995 graduate of Indiana, Barnes earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology and is a level-4 certified member of the American Swimming Coaches Association.

In July 2004, Barnes married the former Alyssa Winter of Surry, N.H. They are the parents of Jack and Caroline.

Getting To Know Irish Head Coach Brian Barnes

On being born and raised in the South Bend area ...

I was born in Mishawaka (Ind.) and was the fourth of five children. When I was one, we moved to Osceola and I lived in the same house for 18 years. I grew up swimming for the Michiana Marlins who practiced in various pools in the South Bend school district and here at Notre Dame. My big ties to Notre Dame were definitely through football. We were big Notre Dame fans and took a particular liking to (former head football coach) Lou Holtz. I remember my father pulling for Notre Dame when they won the national championship in 1977.

When you grow up in Osceola and close to Notre Dame, you dream of playing football for the Irish. That was common at my middle school and my high school. Of course I thought about that when I was younger, but it was my goal to swim collegiately.

On how he began his career as a swim coach ...

I graduated from Penn High School and went off to Indiana University. After I graduated there, I came back to the area knowing that I wanted to coach but I didn't know how to get into the profession. I was presented with a great opportunity with the Michiana Marlins and I started off coaching the 10-and-under swimmers here at the Rolfs Aquatic Center.

The head coaching position with the Michiana Marlins freed up. I have to be honest – I didn't really know what I was doing as a 23-year-old head coach. I coached the Marlins for one year and was then presented with the opportunity to coach collegiately at Kansas. I moved to Lawrence and coached at KU for one year.

There was a local club team that showed a lot of potential and a lot of promise. I applied and accepted a position with the Lawrence AquaHawks and I knew that with taking the job I would stay put for a while. I was there for four years coaching the program. It was a great program, as we started out with 85 swimmers. Over the course of my time there we built a beautiful 10-lane indoor swimming pool. The program was exploding! By the time I left the Lawrence I had eight assistants and over 200 families involved within the program.

On his progress within the college coaching ranks ...

I was presented with the opportunity to coach at Indiana University and of course I had trouble turning that down. I got back into collegiate coaching and recruiting student-athletes at IU and that was an awesome experience because I had some meaningful years under my belt and I knew what I was doing. I had become a better coach; you never really learn how to coach, you just try to improve. I had confidence on deck and learned the recruiting system, the NCAA and the university structure. After being at Indiana for three years, Auburn was looking for an assistant and they called upon me.

On developing as a coach at Auburn ...

Having the chance to coach at Auburn was an unbelievable opportunity. I knew that going down there and being around those people was going to be an extremely valuable experience. Being a part of a championship program, I viewed it as a career investment. With the expectations of winning conference and national championships each season, there is a certain attitude and belief within the program that the student-athletes thrive on. I will always be grateful for my time spent at Auburn.

On what he's like outside of coaching ...

I'm a garage guy. I like to build things. Home improvement and carpentry are definitely hobbies. When I was at Auburn I'd routinely make recruiting calls from my garage because I always had a project going on in there. I've also been to over 200 concerts and still go to shows when I have the chance.

My son, Jack, is going to play nose guard for a football team. I think he's going to be good at pushing people around – he's rough and a tumbler. I met my wonderful wife, Alyssa, in Bloomington. She's a certified athletic trainer and she's phenomenal at decorating cakes. I'm very blessed to have such a loving and supportive family.

Caiming Xie

Head Diving Coach
16th Season
Beijing Institute of Physical Education '85



Now in the 33rd year of his career as a diving coach, Caiming Xie has helped his protégés win BIG EAST titles, All-America honors and gold medals. A proven winner, Caiming's experience reaches all over the world and he is in his 16th season as head women's and men's diving coach at Notre Dame.

During his tenure, he has molded the top two divers ever to compete for the Irish - Heather Mattingly and Meghan Perry-Eaton - who combined for five BIG EAST titles, seven appearances in the NCAA Championships, and eight All-America citations. The duo once held all six of the Notre Dame diving records, as well as four Rolfs Aquatic Center records.

For his efforts, Caiming, the first full-time diving coach in Notre Dame history, has been named his conference's top diving coach on six occasions, claiming the BIG EAST's top honor in 1999, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009. The last eight seasons have been the most successful in Irish women's diving history, featuring nine BIG EAST titles, five All-America honors and four BIG EAST Championships Most Outstanding Diver awards.

Most recently, Caiming coached Natalie Stitt to the 2009 BIG EAST Championships Most Outstanding Diver honor as Stitt swept the 1- and 3-meter events at the league meet. She went on to finish 32nd at the NCAA Championships in both events.

During the 2009-10 campaign, Jenny Chiang took the top spot in the BIG EAST's 3-meter diving final, holding off 1-meter diving champion, Louisville's Hannah Gadd, to win by a margin of 12.7 points. It was in the finals where Chiang shined, improving her score by over 50 points to finish with a mark of 313.35.

Stitt set a University and Rolfs Aquatic Center record off the 3-meter board with a score of 376.20, leading the Notre Dame women's swimming and diving team to a pair of dual meet wins to wrap up the Shamrock Invitational. Stitt bettered Mattingly's school record (351.15) set on Jan. 26, 2001. Furthermore, she bumped ahead of the pool record (333.82) established by Meghan Perry-Eaton on Jan. 12, 2002.

Caiming also helped coach a United States squad that claimed six medals at the 2009 World University Games in Belgrade, Serbia.

In 2006, Caiming molded two women's divers into all-BIG EAST performers in the 3-meter event as Lucy Hirt was the runner up while her teammate, Tara Hyer, placed third in the same event at the BIG EAST Championships. For his efforts, Caiming captured his fourth BIG EAST Coach of the Year Award. Just two seasons later, Hyer was third off the 3-meter board at the league meet while Natalie Stitt claimed the title in that event and placed third off the 1-meter board.

From 2003-05, Perry-Eaton turned in the most impressive two-year stretch ever by an Irish diver, as she was beaten just one time during the regular season before sweeping the springboard events at the 2004 and 2005 BIG EAST Championships en route to being tabbed the meet's top diver. Perry-Eaton was the first Notre Dame diver ever to win a title at the NCAA Zone C Championships in 2004, taking first off the 1-meter board. At the NCAA Championships, she delivered the highest-ever finish for a Notre Dame swimmer or diver, taking third in that event, ending up just 3.30 points behind the national champion to become an All-American. She followed up with a fifth-place finish in 1-meter diving at the 2005 NCAA meet.

In 2002-03, Perry-Eaton became the first Notre Dame diver - and first non-University of Miami diver since 1996 - to win a BIG EAST championship, placing first in the 1-meter competition. She also was second on the 3-meter board and was named the BIG EAST's top diver - her first of three consecutive diver-of-the-year awards. Perry-Eaton then qualified for the NCAA Championships, where she placed ninth in the 1-meter event and 20th on the 3-meter board to earn honorable mention All-America honors.



Perry-Eaton finished her career holding four of the six Notre Dame diving records: six-dive 1-meter in both dual (322.64) and championship (331.58) action, as well as 11-dive, 3-meter championship competition (586.43) and 10-meter platform championship action (336.60). Additionally, she boasts Rolfs Aquatic Center records in both six-dive 1-meter formats (322.64 dual, 315.25 championship), as well as for dual-meet 3-meter action (333.82). Her score of 309.20 in 1-meter diving in 2003 en route to winning her first BIG EAST title stands as the highest since the switch to a six-dive format in championship meets in 2000-01.

Mattingly was the first Irish diver to earn All-America honors, as she was a four-time honorable mention selection before being named an All-American in 3-meter action in 2002 with an eighth-place finish. Mattingly was the first Notre Dame diver to qualify for the NCAA Division I Championships, and she earned bids to the meet in each of her four collegiate campaigns. Mattingly also had a great deal of success in the NCAA zone meet, taking second in 1-meter action in 1999, in addition to third-place results in 3-meter competition in both 1999 and 2002. She still maintains two Notre Dame records: for 10 dives in a championship meet off the 1-meter board (425.40) and for six-dive, 3-meter action (351.15). Her score of 550.55 in winning the 3-meter competition in the 2000 Notre Dame Invitational also is the best in the history of Notre Dame's home facility.

Before coming to Notre Dame, Caiming was the head diving coach for three years at Toledo, earning Mid-American Conference diving-coach-of-the-year laurels in each of his last two seasons. Prior to his stint with the Rockets, Caiming was an assistant coach for the 1991-92 season at Pittsburgh.

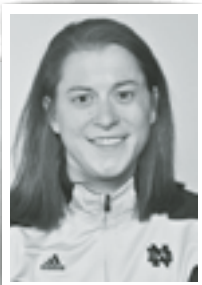
Boasting a wealth of international experience on his résumé, Caiming served as the 1980 Chinese Olympic diving coach. He also was a technical consultant for United States Diving since 1994 and has held clinics and presentations for the United States Diving national team.

The Chinese national team coach from 1977-90, Caiming coached Sun Shu-Wei, a gold medalist in the men's platform competition at the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona, Spain, and Zhu Jin-Hong, who finished fourth in the women's platform in Barcelona. Caiming's divers also have earned medals at the Asian Games, World Cup, World University Games, and World Championships.

A competitive diver in his own right, Caiming won the springboard competition at the Asian Games in 1974 and earned first place in the platform and second in the springboard competition at the National Games of China in 1975. A 1985 graduate of the Beijing Institute of Physical Education, he also won numerous Chinese diving championships on the national level.

Caiming and his wife, Ping Tong, have one son, Tong, who graduated from Notre Dame in 2003 after a successful career as an Irish diver.

Kate Kovenock, who spent four seasons as assistant coach for both the men's and women's swimming programs at Division III powerhouse Kenyon College, was named assistant women's swimming coach at the University of Notre Dame in May 2009. An 11-time All-American at Connecticut College, she helped Kenyon College to seven (four men's and three women's) NCAA men's and women's team championships during her four-year tenure at the school.

"Kate has a comprehensive understanding of athletics and swimming that will help build Notre Dame into a highly-successful program," head coach Brian Barnes said. "Kate is very bright and understands the effort that it takes to compete at a championship level. Her coaching experience at Kenyon has given her great insight into the pace you need to work at to be competitive from year-to-year."

An assistant on the Kenyon staff, the women's team won national titles from 2007-09 after recording a runner-up finish in 2006. During Kovenock's tenure, a total of 32 women's swimmers earned 247 All-America citations, including 11 who earned 10 or more All-America accolades from 2005-09.

She coordinated recruiting efforts for the women's program and was responsible for coaching all training groups. In addition, she designed and implemented Power Rack programs for

sprint and stroke groups. Kovenock also served as a liaison with academic services at the College and handled many administrative duties with regards to travel, training trips, budgets and scheduling relative to the program.

From 2003-08, she also served as a coach for the Total Performance Elite Sprint Camp at Kenyon College.

Kovenock graduated from Connecticut College with honors and distinction earning her bachelor's degree in philosophy in '05. A four-year member of the women's swimming program from 2001-05, she was the NCAA champion in the 50-yard freestyle at the Division III national championships as a junior in 2004. She garnered 11 All-America accolades in the 50, 100 and 200-yard freestyle events and won 11 New England Small

College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) championships in those races. Kovenock also held NESCAC records in those events. A two-time co-captain of the teams, she finished her career as the school record holder in the 50, 100, 200-yard freestyle and 50 and 100-yard butterfly events.

A member of the Dean's List throughout her four years at Connecticut College, she was a two-time ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-American and twice earned NESCAC All-Academic Team honors. In '04, she was the recipient of the Connecticut College Social Sciences, Humanities and Arts research grant. In her senior year, she also served as a senior admission fellow for the school's Department of Admission and was a four-year member of the Athletic Advisory Board for Student-Athletes.

Notre Dame won the BIG EAST Conference league meet for the 14th straight season as Amywren Miller and Samantha Maxwell went on to earn All-American status at the NCAA Championships.

Notre Dame Claims 14th Consecutive BIG EAST Title

Irish sweep BIG EAST Most Outstanding Swimmer, Coach of the Year awards at league meet.



The 2010 senior class became the latest in a long line to graduate from Notre Dame with four BIG EAST rings.

- Notre Dame totaled 14 points behind the efforts of Samantha Maxwell and Amywren Miller to finish 38th out of 47 teams at the NCAA Championships. Miller qualified for the 50 free (22.47) and ranked 20th nationally in the event heading into the season's final week. She also swam the 100 free (49.33) with the 31st-best qualifying mark. Maxwell was seeded fourth overall in the 100 breast (59.64) and 19th in the 200 breast (2:11.37). The pair joined Marie Labosky and Meghan Perry-Eaton as the other two Notre Dame student-athletes to qualify for three NCAA Championships (there have been six four-time NCAA qualifiers in the Irish annals).

- Maxwell earned an All-American accolade in the 100 breast for the second straight year after finishing 14th overall. Maxwell went 1:01.09 in the finals after going through the prelims in 1:00.69. The performances put her in position to take home an Honorable Mention All-America accolade, after earning All-American status as a sophomore.

- Miller set a school record in the 50 free and finished eighth overall on the first day of the NCAA Championships. Miller went 22.30 from the far lane to win her preliminary race before going 22.49 in the finals to earn the first All-American accolade of her career. Carrie Nixon is the only other Irish All-American in the 50 free (1999, 2000 and 2002).

- Natalie Stitt led Notre Dame off the 3-meter board at the NCAA Zone Diving Championships. Stitt finished sixth overall with 603.10 points. Stitt and Jenny Chiang each finished in the top 10 of

the 1-meter event. Chiang scored 534.65 points for ninth place and Stitt scored 533.25 points to finish 10th overall.

- Maxwell and Kim Holden each tacked on a second individual league title to their 2010 BIG EAST Conference Championships resume on the final evening of the event at Pittsburgh's Trees Pool while leading Notre Dame to earn its 14th consecutive BIG EAST team trophy. The win extended Notre Dame's streak - which started in 1997 - as the longest of any team in any league sport.

- Maxwell had a hand in four titles at the meet (100 breast, 200 breast, 200 medley relay, 400 medley relay) to earn the BIG EAST Women's Most Outstanding Swimmer award, as Brian Barnes was named the BIG EAST Women's Coach of the Year for the second straight season. Notre Dame (773.5) withstood second-place Louisville (718) and West Virginia (525) to top the 11-team field.

- Maxwell (2:11.87) won her 200 breast prelim race at the league meet with a pool record and NCAA B-cut, an automatic qualifying time for last year's NCAA Championships. She then went 2:11.37 to win the title later in the evening, becoming the fifth Irish swimmer in program history to win three titles in the same event at the BIG EAST meet.

- Holden (1:56.22) broke Kelly Hecking's school record of 1:57.45 in the 200 back to also set a Trees Pool record. Holden went on to take first-place in 1:55.79 to better each of those marks during the finals.

- On day three of the league meet, Maxwell

crushed the BIG EAST Conference, Notre Dame and Trees Pool record after winning the 100 breast in 59.64, the nation's fastest performance in the event (at the time of the swim). The win was the fourth career individual title for Maxwell at the BIG EAST meet, and the second straight in the event for the Irish standout. Maxwell, whose performance earned her an automatic berth into the NCAA Championships, was second in the 100 breast as a freshman in 2008. Maxwell led the rally as Notre Dame regained the overall lead by opening the evening session with a 3:36.45 to win the 400 medley relay title. The relay was the nation's third-fastest time of the season. Also getting a piece of Friday's spotlight was Holden (53.88), who shelved her first BIG EAST individual title with a win in the 100 back to set a school and pool record.

- Miller won the 50 freestyle in 22.47 at the BIG EAST meet and became the fastest female swimmer ever within the walls of Trees Pool.

- Notre Dame set a school and league record in the 200 medley relay on day one of the BIG EAST Championships. Holden, Maxwell, Scott and Miller went 1:39.31 for the new benchmark. The mark bettered the previous school record (1:39.29) set by the Irish at the league meet in 2009, as first-year swimmers Holden and Scott joined juniors Maxwell and Miller to post the NCAA B-cut performance.

- Chiang took the top spot in the BIG EAST's 3-meter diving final, holding off 1-meter diving champion, Louisville's Hannah Gadd, to win by a margin of 12.7 points. Her win wrapped up a stellar weekend of diving efforts for the Irish at the 2010 BIG EAST Championships. Stitt held the lead after the trials with a mark of 299.10. Gadd anchored second at 285.70 while Heidi Grossman came in third with a score of 276.65. Chiang found herself in fifth after qualifying at 259.60. It was in the finals where Chiang shined, improving

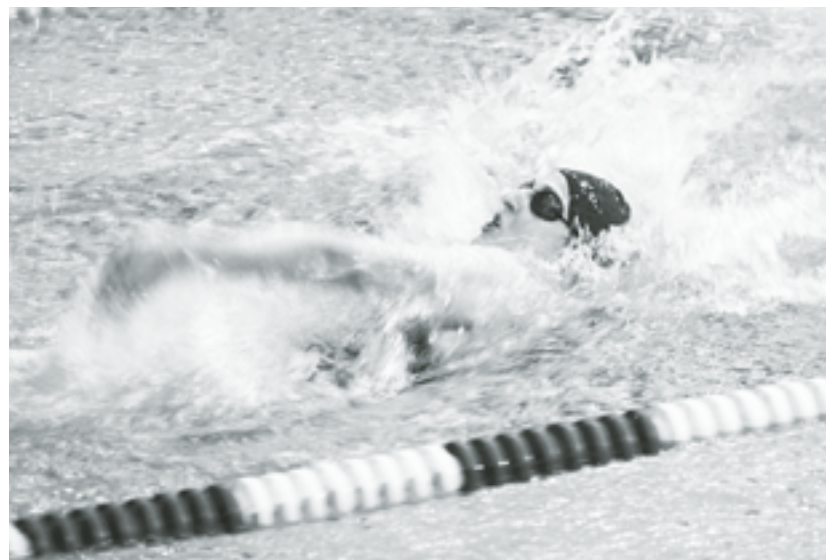

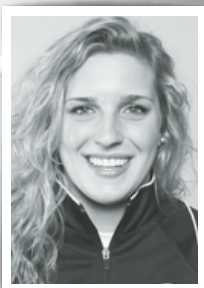

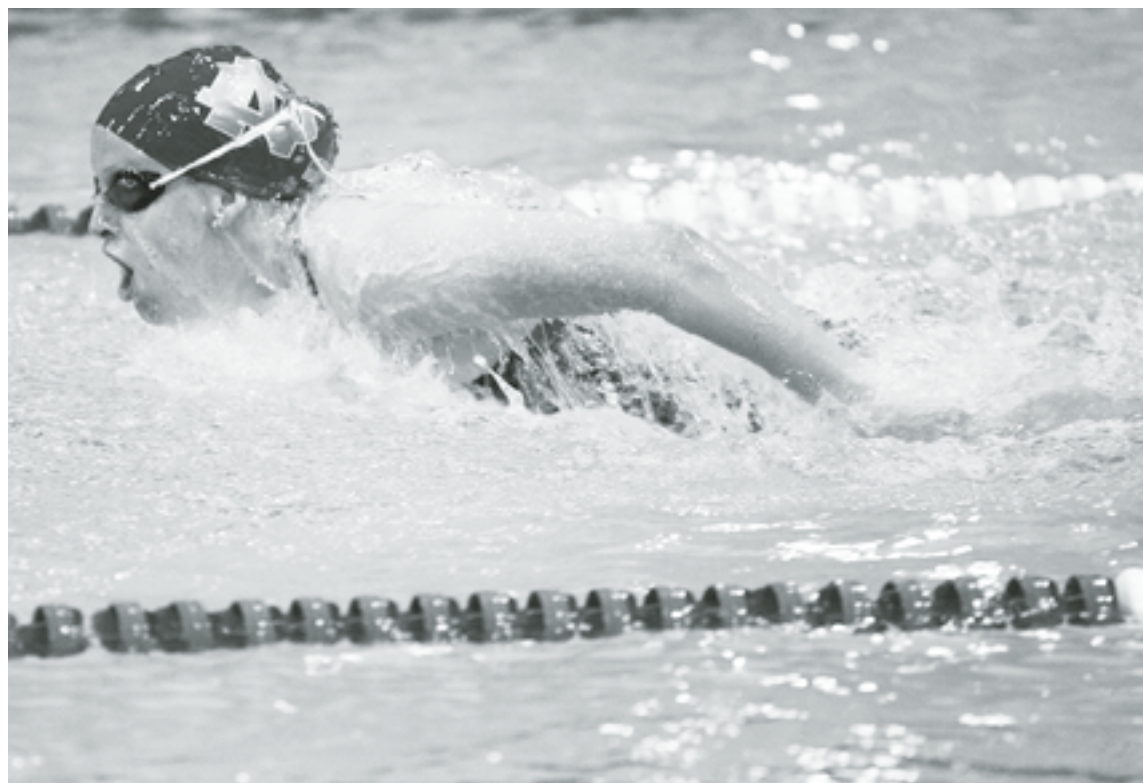

The creator of the relay meet in 1964, Stark has coached and officiated at every Notre Dame Relay meet since (except for 2008 when he attended his granddaughter's wedding. However, he did send off the swimmers by writing a few words of encouragement that was read prior to the opening race). Stark was the first coach of both the men's and women's swimming and diving teams at Notre Dame and coached for 27 years before moving into an administrative position as director of the Rolfs Aquatic Center in 1985. In his honor, the name of the Notre Dame Relays was officially changed to the Dennis Stark Relays on Nov. 22, 2003.

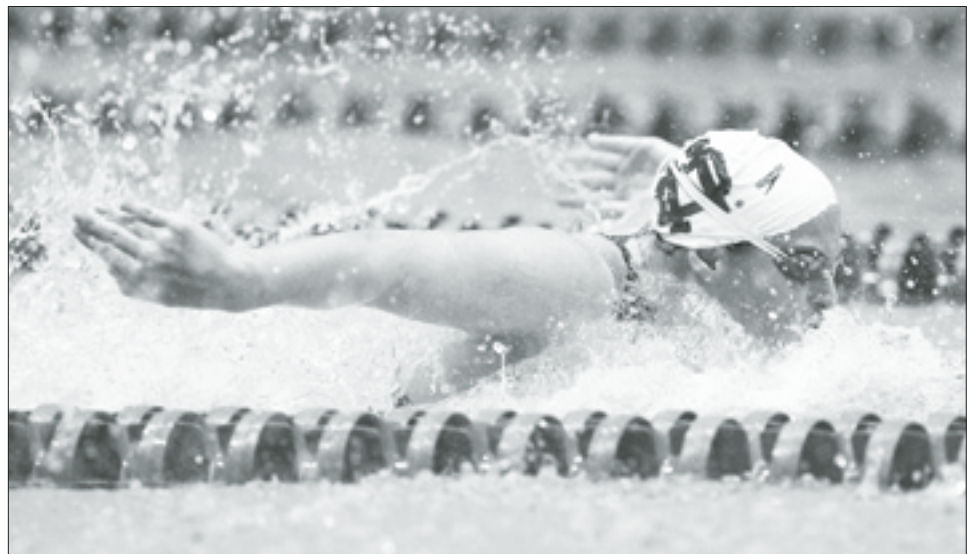

The most prestigious honor awarded to a Notre Dame student-athlete, the Byron V. Kanaley Award has been presented each year since 1927 to the senior monogram athletes who have been most exemplary as both students and leaders. The awards, presented by the Faculty Board on Athletics, are named in honor of a 1904 Notre Dame graduate who was a member of the Irish baseball team as an undergraduate. Kanaley went on to a successful banking career in Chicago and served the University as a lay trustee from 1915 until his death in 1960.

National & International Competition

Irish in National and International Competition

In addition to their many accomplishments in collegiate action, Notre Dame women's swimmers and divers have a history of also competing in various prestigious national and international meets, including three of the last four Olympics.

In 1996, Jilen Siroky ('04), then just 15 years of age, represented the United States in the Atlanta games, finishing 15th in the 200m Breast. Siroky also was the 1996 U.S. champion in the 100 Breast.

In 2000, Christel Bouvron represented her native Singapore in the Sydney games, finishing 32nd in the 200m Fly and 36th in the 400 Free. Four years later, she became just the second cur-

rent Notre Dame student-athlete ever – and first in 84 years – to take part in the Olympics, matching her 32nd-place finish in the 200 Fly.

In addition to that pair of Olympians, 39 Irish student-athletes have competed in U.S. Olympic Trials and four more have swum in their native country's trials. Backstroker Erin Brooks, a 1997 graduate, represented the U.S. in the '97 World University Games and came home with a bronze medal in the 200 Back. Notre Dame also has a long history of swimmers and divers who have qualified or competed in the USA Swimming Senior National Championships, as nearly 60 future, current or former Irish competitors have done so.

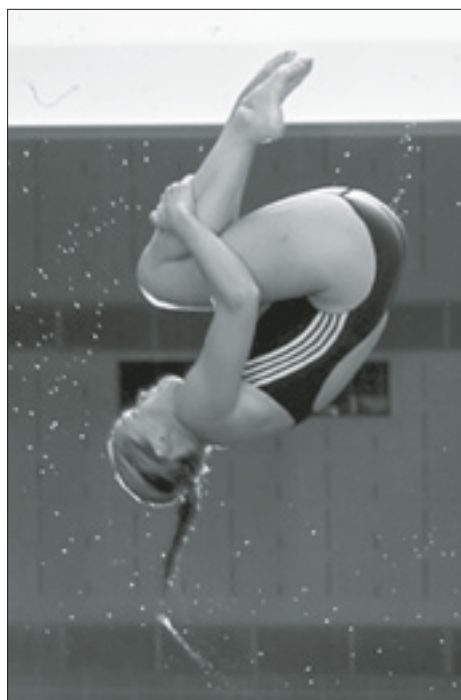

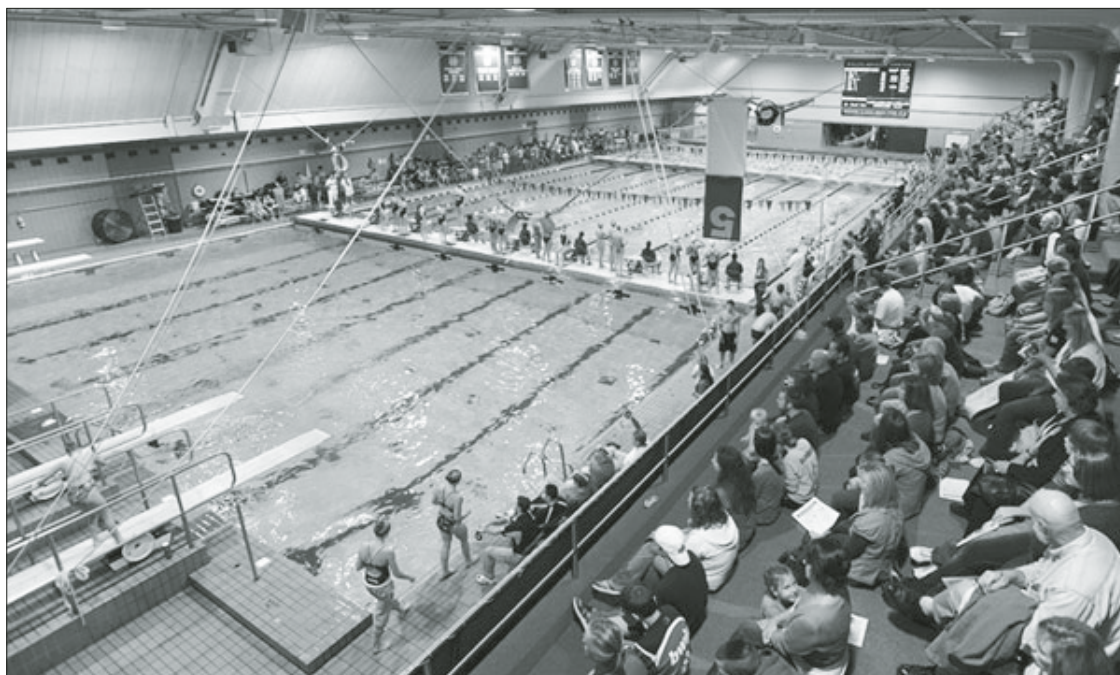

Rolfs Aquatic Center

The Irish swimming and diving teams compete in the state-of-the-art Rolfs Aquatic Center. After four years of varsity intercollegiate swimming competition in the Rockne Memorial Pool, the Notre Dame women's swimming and diving program entered a new era in 1985, as they moved to the \$4.5-million natatorium located in the Joyce Center.

Donated by brothers Thomas and Robert Rolf of West Bend, Wis., the Rolfs Aquatic Center provides Notre Dame with a modern, innovative facility on par with any other in the country. Ellerbe Architects and Engineers of Bloomington, Minn., the architects used in the planning of the

Joyce Center, also were commissioned to design the 45,000-square-foot facility which houses a 50-meter Olympic pool (25 yards in width), spectator seating for 400 and support facilities.

The facility features two movable bulkheads to allow sections of the pool to be blocked off, allowing swimming competition and warm-up swimming to occur simultaneously. The design also allows recreational swimming, water polo, instructional swimming and other aquatic activities. Diving is accommodated with two one-meter boards and two three-meter boards.

Support functions housed in the center of the facility just below the spectator seating include

men's and women's locker rooms, men's and women's varsity locker rooms, and men's and women's staff locker rooms. Offices for the Notre Dame swimming staff, aquatics directors, and lifeguards are deckside and glass-fronted with a view of the pool.

Several deckside instructional areas are located around the pool and feature infrared heat lamps, designed to keep wet swimmers warm between events. The pool features a stainless steel racing gutter which is designed to absorb the bow waves of a swimmer, allowing faster swimming times.

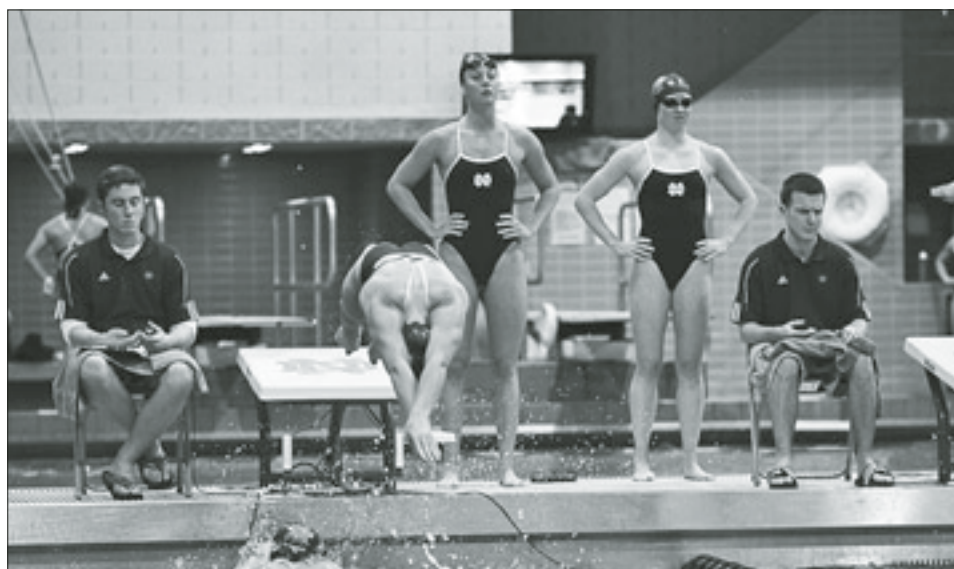
Another instructional feature is the presence of two underwater windows which allow critiquing of a diver's or swimmer's underwater technique. The unique structural system consists of three trusses which span 120 feet, with the roof suspended below the trusses. In addition, the

white exterior trusses provide an interesting and athletic character to the building. The lighting system is designed to be adjusted from maximum brightness for television to nearly dark for dramatic synchronized swimming presentations.

The center was officially dedicated on November 13, 1985.

With 30 years under its belt, The BIG EAST Conference continues on a path of success in and out of the athletic arena. The goals have always been the same. The league wants and expects to compete at the highest level and does so with integrity and sportsmanship. The commendable performances of the student-athletes at BIG EAST schools are the indicators of the league's proud tradition of success.

The BIG EAST has gone through membership changes since its birth, but the 2009-10 academic year will mark the conference's fifth straight with the same 16-member group, the nation's largest Division I-A conference.

In 2008-09, BIG EAST student-athletes again succeeded on the national stage. The Connecticut women's basketball team won its sixth national championship by defeating conference-foe Louisville in an all-BIG EAST NCAA title game. The Notre Dame women's soccer team reached the NCAA championship game and the Syracuse field hockey squad advanced to the NCAA Final Four. Three BIG EAST women's cross country teams finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships. West Virginia was fourth followed by Villanova in sixth place and Georgetown in ninth.

Individually in women's sports, Providence's Dannette Doetzel won the 10,000 meters at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships. Connecticut's Maya Moore was the conference's sixth winner of the Wade Trophy as the top player in women's basketball. Notre Dame's Kerri Hanks won the Hermann Trophy, the top award in women's soccer.

On the men's side, Connecticut and Villanova advanced to the Final Four in basketball. The 2008-09 campaign was arguably the best men's basketball season in the history of the BIG EAST with the league setting NCAA standards with three No. 1 tournament seeds, four teams in the round of the Elite Eight and five in the Sweet 16.

The St. John's men's soccer team reached the NCAA College Cup before losing in the national semifinals.

BIG EAST football has maintained its high profile and its reputation as a balanced group. Seven of the league's eight squads were nationally ranked or received votes in the national polls in 2008. Cincinnati was the league champion. The BIG EAST, a charter member of the Bowl Championship Series, has won three of its last four BCS bowl games. West Virginia, Louisville and Connecticut also have won or shared league crowns over the past four seasons.

The BIG EAST has continued to produce student-athletes who were at the forefront of athletic and academic achievement. In 2008-09, 19 BIG EAST players were chosen to their respective ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Teams, including eight first-team selections. Nearly 400 student-athletes have earned academic all-America honors.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A conference in 2005-06 when five new members began competing. The new schools were: University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top-34 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Milwaukee and Cincinnati. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain almost one-fourth of all television households in the U.S.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won

26 national championships in six different sports and 126 student-athletes have won individual national titles.

The BIG EAST has enjoyed tremendous basketball success, especially in this decade. In 2008-09, the BIG EAST produced four of the eight Final Four teams in men's and women's basketball. It was only the second time in NCAA history that one conference placed that many Final Four teams in the same season.

In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA basketball titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. In men's basketball, BIG EAST squads have won three of the last 11 NCAA championships. BIG EAST women's teams have taken six of the last 10 NCAA titles.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger.

In 2009-10, the BIG EAST will add men's lacrosse to its growing list of sports, which will increase its total to 24 sport championships. The first women's golf championship was held in the spring of 2003. Women's lacrosse and rowing were added in 2001.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student

athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably shows a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization has been fortunate to have outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Dave Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

For 2009-10, the BIG EAST will undergo one significant change. Tranghese stepped down from his position on June 30, 2009. John Marinatto, who has served as senior associate commissioner, has moved into the Commissioner's chair.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student-athletes. The conference has enjoyed long-standing relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

BIG EAST men's basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden. The women's basketball championship has led all conferences in attendance for the past six years. Attendance figures also are significant in soccer and baseball.

More than 550 BIG EAST student-athletes have earned All-America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams. Several athletes earned gold medals in each of the last six summer Olympiads.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 athletes.

UNIVERSITY OF NOTRE DAME



History

- The University of Notre Dame du Lac was founded in 1842 by Father Edward Sorin. Adjacent to South Bend, Ind., and nestled next to St. Mary's and Saint Joseph's Lakes, the University was started with \$310 in cash and three log buildings in disrepair.
- Notre Dame would establish many firsts for Catholic institutions of higher learning, including the first Catholic law school, the first Catholic engineering school and the first student residence with private rooms, Sorin Hall.

Academics

- The University is organized into four colleges — Arts and Letters, Science, Engineering and the Mendoza College of Business — the School of Architecture, the Law School, the Graduate School, six major research institutes, more than 40 centers and special programs and the University library system.
- Notre Dame is rated among the nation's top-25 institutions of higher learning in surveys conducted by *U.S. News and World Report*, *Princeton Review*, *Time*, *Kiplinger's* and *Kaplan/Newsweek*.
- The Mendoza College of Business is ranked #1 among the nation's top undergraduate business schools by *Bloomberg BusinessWeek*.
- Notre Dame is among a select group of schools that ranks in the top 30 on the *U.S. News & World Report* survey of the nation's top colleges and in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics Directors' Cup for overall success in athletics.

Students

- Graduate and undergraduate students at the University come from all 50 states 100 countries worldwide.
- Notre Dame's graduation rate of 95 percent is exceeded by only Harvard and Princeton.
- Notre Dame's 98 percent retention rate between the freshman and sophomore years is among the highest in the country, thanks in large part to the University's unique First Year of Studies Program.
- Notre Dame has one of the highest undergraduate residential concentrations of any national university, with 80 percent of its students living in 29 residence halls.



- The medical school acceptance rate of the University's preprofessional studies graduates is 80 percent, almost twice the national average.
- Notre Dame ranks first among Catholic universities in the number of doctorates earned by its undergraduate alumni — a record compiled over some 85 years.

Service

- Community service is a hallmark of Notre Dame. About 80 percent of Notre Dame students engage in some form of voluntary community service during their years at the University, and at least 10 percent devote a year or more after graduation to service in the United States and around the world.
- The University's Alliance for Catholic Education (ACE) annually sends 180 recent graduates to teach in some 100 understaffed Catholic schools in the southern, southeastern and southwestern United States and in South Bend. A national model, ACE has received the Higher Education Award from the Corporation for National Service for leadership in using national service resources through AmeriCorps.

Alumni

- The University's network of nearly 270 alumni clubs — including 60 international clubs — is the most extensive in higher education.
- With graduates renowned for their loyalty and generosity, Notre Dame annually ranks among the top-five in percentage of alumni who contribute to the University.
- In recent years, Notre Dame alumni have won a Nobel Prize in medicine, a Pulitzer Prize in journalism and an Emmy Award for contributions to television technology.
