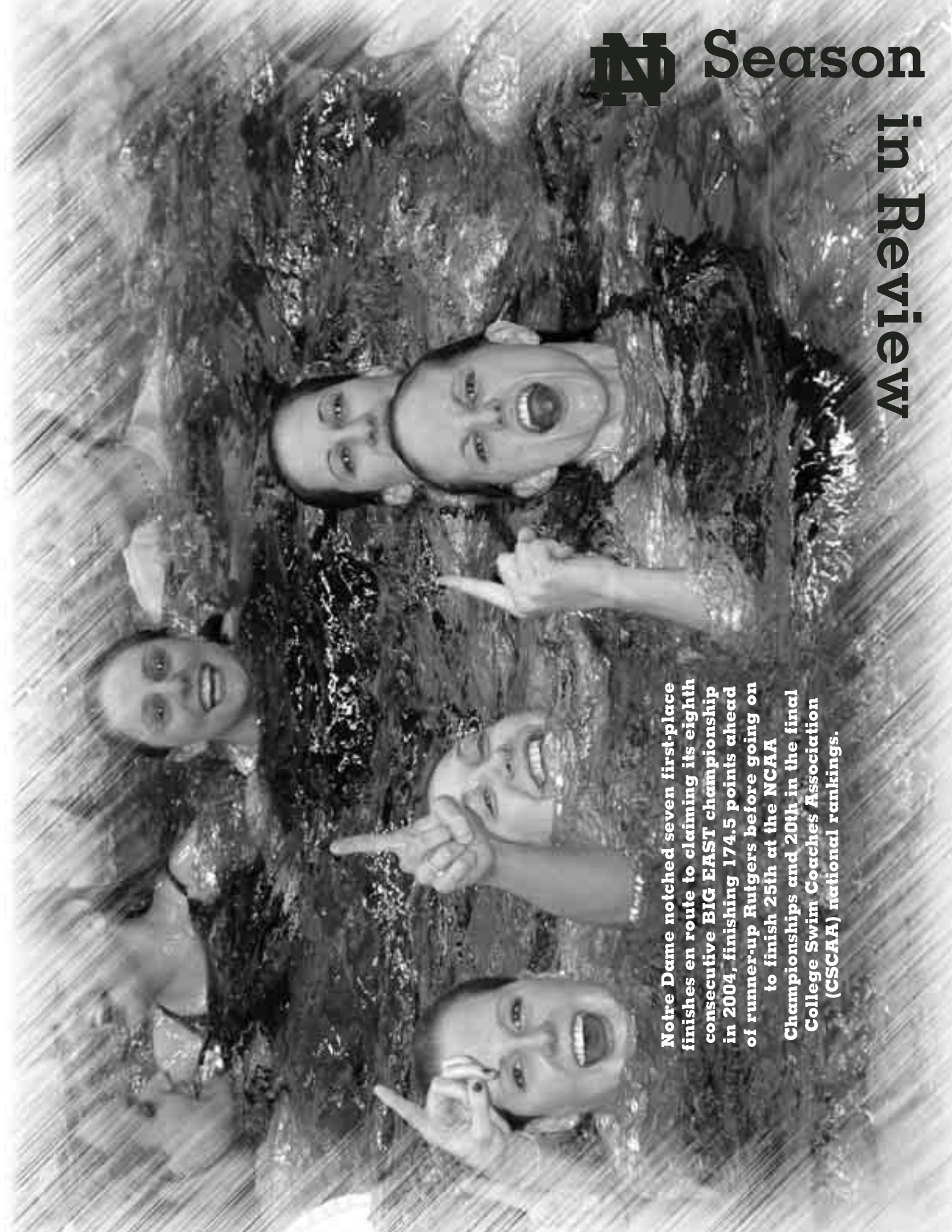




Season in Review

Notre Dame notched seven first-place finishes en route to claiming its eighth consecutive BIG EAST championship in 2004, finishing 174.5 points ahead of runner-up Rutgers before going on to finish 25th at the NCAA Championships and 20th in the final College Swim Coaches Association (CSCAA) national rankings.



Strong NCAA Performances Highlight 2003-04 Season*Irish win eighth straight BIG EAST title, finish 25th at NAAs.*

The Notre Dame women's swimming and diving team overcame adversity during the 2003-04 season, managing to win its eighth consecutive BIG EAST title, while also finishing 25th at the NCAA Championships, the fifth top-25 result for the Irish in the last eight years. Notre Dame finished the dual-meet season with an 8-2 record – with both of the defeats coming against top-15 teams – and ranked 20th in the College Swim Coaches Association (CSCAA) national rankings.

The defining factor of the Irish season was that various members of the team were struck by a viral infection during the first semester, which caused a majority of the squad to miss more than two weeks of training and 11 student-athletes to skip the Texas A&M Invitational, the most-competitive meet on Notre Dame's schedule. Many of the Irish swimmers were never able to completely make up for that period of missed training.

Despite nine other swimmers and four relays achieving 22 different NCAA "B" cuts, Notre Dame qualified only a single swimmer – freshman Katie Carroll – and one diver – senior Meghan Perry-Eaton – to the NCAA Championships. Those two came through with outstanding performances at the national championships, combining to score 28 points and give Notre Dame a 25th-place finish.

"We had a good NCAA meet," said Irish head coach Bailey Weathers. "In general, there were various things during the season that hampered us and made it so we did not have the background to be extremely successful at the end of the season. But we had some really good swims when it counted. It was probably the best NCAA Championships we have ever had, in terms of performing at a lifetime-best level and moving up from seeding."

The highlight of the meet was Perry-Eaton's one-meter performance. The Brandon, Fla., native, who was ninth at the 2003 NAAs in the event, finished third with a score of 303.90 that was just 3.30 points behind national champion Allison Brennan of South Carolina. The Irish senior was in second place until the final dive of the competition, when Alabama's Lane Bassham passed her for runner-up honors. It was the highest-ever finish for a Notre Dame student-athlete in the NCAA Championships.

It capped off a near-perfect season for Perry-Eaton, who was beaten only one time during the regular season. She went undefeated in three-meter action, taking first at the Texas A&M Invitational, Notre Dame Invitational, and Michigan Invitational, as well as against 11 teams in dual competition. Perry-Eaton's lone blemish on her one-meter ledger came at the Michigan Invitational, where she took second to Tealin Keleman of the host institution by 8.10 points (303.30-295.20). The Irish senior then got revenge on Keleman three times, beating her by 38.63 points (302.63-264.00) in a dual meet at Notre Dame two weeks later and then by 28.95 points (564.30-535.35) in the NCAA zone meet, and finally by 50.5 (290.40-239.90) in prelims at the NAAs. Perry-Eaton qualified for her second consecutive NCAA meet by becoming the first Irish diver ever to finish first at the NCAA Zone C Diving Championships. She won the one-meter competition against a talented field of area divers, including Keleman and Big Ten Diver of the Year Carrie

McCambridge from Purdue.

In three-meter action, Perry-Eaton could not capitalize on an outstanding regular season. After she had not been beaten heading into the NCAA zone meet, she finished sixth there and then 28th in the NCAA Championships.

Carroll became the first Notre Dame freshman ever to earn All-America accolades in multiple individual

events, gaining honorable mention in both individual medleys. Her top performance came in the 200-meter IM, which saw her win the consolation final to take ninth and be tabbed honorable mention All-America. Carroll, who improved 13 spots on her seeding and notched the highest-ever finish for an Irish rookie in the NAAs, would have been sixth in the championship final with her time of 2:12.28, which converts to a school-record yards time of 1:58.52. In the 400 IM, she

Katie Carroll became just the fourth freshman ever to win three individual events in the BIG EAST Championships – en route to being named the meet’s Most Outstanding Swimmer – and she then was the first Notre Dame rookie to earn All-America accolades in multiple individual events under the current system, being tabbed honorable mention in both individual medleys.

also broke the Notre Dame record, taking 14th with a mark of 4:42.51 (converts to 4:13.12). Carroll ended the meet by tying for 32nd in the 100-meter freestyle.

The BIG EAST Championships had an air of “business as usual” about them, as the Irish cruised to their eighth consecutive conference title. On the strength of seven victories and eight runner-up results, Notre Dame finished with 725.5 points, defeating second-place Rutgers by 174.5 points. Carroll and Perry-Eaton also were the stars of the league meet, as they were tabbed its Most Outstanding Swimmer and Most Outstanding Diver, respectively. For his work with the senior, Caiming Xie was tabbed the conference’s Women’s Diving Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

Carroll became just the fourth swimmer ever to win three individual BIG EAST titles as a freshman, taking first place in the 200-yard individual medley, the 100 butterfly, and the 100 freestyle. She broke the meet record in the 200 IM, finishing in a time of

2:00.65 that was more than a second ahead of her teammate, defending conference champion and former recordholder Lisa Garcia. The mark also was good for automatic entry to the NCAA meet. Carroll earned all-BIG EAST honors in all seven of the events in which she participated, including helping the 200 free relay to a first-place finish. That quartet – which also featured junior Katie Eckholt, senior Danielle Hulick, and freshman Rebecca Grove – set the stage for Notre Dame’s team triumph by leading off the meet with a first-place finish.

Perry-Eaton, who was victorious in one-meter competition and the runner-up off the higher board in 2003, cruised to a pair of easy victories in the springboard events. She beat runner-up Emily Sychala of Miami by 49.25 points in three-meter action and by 41.80 points in one-meter. Perry-Eaton remains the only non-University of Miami diver since 1996 to win a BIG EAST diving title.

The other Irish victory at the conference championships came from senior Marie Labosky, who won the 400 IM for the second year in a row with a time of 4:21.08.

Additionally, Notre Dame’s 800 free relay squad of freshman Ellen Johnson, Carroll, Garcia, and fresh-

man Ann Barton was the runner-up in the meet, but still broke the Irish record, finishing in a time of 7:20.12.

In all, a total of 14 Irish student-athletes gained all-BIG EAST accolades for top-three finishes. In addition to Carroll, a pair of seniors, Hulick and Garcia, capped off their vaunted careers with various all-conference accolades. Hulick was a four-time honoree in ‘04 to bring her career total to 13, while Garcia added three all-BIG EAST mentions to finish with 11. Grove was a three-time all-league honoree, while Labosky, Perry-Eaton, Eckholt, and sophomore Courtney Choura gained mention in two events each.

The championship made the Irish one of only two teams – in any sport – to have won eight BIG EAST titles since 1995-96, when Notre Dame became a member of the conference. The Irish also became only the sixth team, in any sport, to win eight consecutive BIG EAST championships.

The Irish posted an 8-2 record in dual-meet competition, with their lone losses coming against #12 Indiana and #16 Michigan. Notre Dame finished 20th in the CSCAA dual-meet national rankings, and continued a stretch of success which has seen it compile a 47-4-1 (.913) dual record over the last five years. The Irish, who entered only a limited roster, also rallied on the final day to win the Notre Dame Invitational for the fourth time in five years.

The 2003-04 season marked the finale of a class that made quite a mark on Notre Dame’s record books. Labosky is one of five Irish swimmers ever to earn three invitations to the NCAA Championships, and she just missed a berth in 2004, being named as an alternate instead. In 2001, Labosky was tabbed honorable mention All-America in the 400 individual medley. She stood clearly as the most prolific 400 IM swimmer in Irish history until the arrival of Carroll on campus. But Labosky still holds the school record in yards in the event, and she claims seven of the top 10 times (including converted marks) ever. A three-time BIG EAST champion (200 IM in ‘01, 400 IM in ‘03 and ‘04), she finished her career among the top five Irish swimmers ever in six different events.

Garcia, one of the team’s co-captains, leaves with the 200 butterfly Irish record, including the top three times in school history in that race. She also held both the school and BIG EAST Championships record in the 200 IM until Carroll’s 2004 heroics. Garcia qualified for the NCAA meet in both 2002 and ‘03, earning honorable mention All-America accolades on both occasions. A two-time BIG EAST champ, she also ranks third all-time in the 100 butterfly and is part of the record 800 free relay.

Hulick was one of the top backstrokers and sprinters ever to don an Irish suit and cap. She holds the 100 backstroke school record and swam the leadoff leg on the two fastest medley relays in Notre Dame history. Hulick, a seven-time BIG EAST champion and 2003 NCAA qualifier, also is the second-fastest in school history in the 50 free.

Lisa D’Olier, a five-time BIG EAST champion and 2002 NCAA participant, is part of two record relays, and she was honorable mention All-America in ‘02. The other 2003-04 co-captain, Laurie Musgrave, also was part of a BIG EAST champion relay team.
