Notes: Three Irish swimmers (Christa Riggins, Sam Maxwell and Amywren Miller) competed in the 2008 NCAA Women's Swimming and Diving Championships held at McCorkle Aquatics Pavilion in Columbus, Ohio.

Miller clocked in at 22.73 in the preliminary session of the 2008 NCAAs Swimming and Diving Championships. That time gave the Irish sprinter a 24th-place finish in the event. Riggins (23.16) was 50th in the same event.

Riggins also represented Notre Dame in the 2007 championships, competing in the 50 Free, 100 Free, 200 Free, 200 Free Relay, 400 Free Relay, 800 Free Relay, and 400 Medley Relay. Her highest finish was a 13th setting in the 800 Free Relay (7:14.91), as she teamed with Katie Carroll, Megan Farrell and Ellen Johnson. She earned automatic bids into the 2008 meet with a 22.89 in the 50 Free, 49.39 in the 100 Free, and the fifth-seed in the 200 Free with a mark of 1:44.39.

With an A-cut time of 22.39 in the 50 Free, Miller registered the nation's 17th-fastest time of the 2007-08 season in that event. She was invited to compete in the 100 Fly with a provisional time of 54.88. She turned in one of the top-20 times in the nation in the 100 Free (49.10) to join the final field. Maxwell's 1:01.68 in the 100 Breast gave her an automatic bid, and her 2:12.76 in the 200 Breast ranked 14th among collegiate swimmers this season.

Since the inception of the women's program at Notre Dame, 21 individuals representing the Irish have earned All-American honors at the NCAAs, with Carroll being the most recent with a seventh-place finish in 2007 with a time of 4:12.37 in the 400 IM. At least one Irish swimmer has garnered All-American recognition in every season since 1996, with Carrie Nixon leading the pack by becoming a 12-time honoree from 1999-2002. She posted the highest finish of any Irish swimmer to compete in the NCAAs by placing fourth in the 50 Free in 2000.

Jeanine Blatt and Betsy Shadley were the program's first All-Americans, claiming the honor in 1979 when the Irish competed at the Division III level.



### On the Road With the Irish

Since 1981-82, the Notre Dame women's swimming and diving team has traveled to 30 states, the District of Columbia, Mexico, Ontario, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and Saint Lucia. Notre Dame's widespread travel is befitting of a student body and swimming and diving roster that draw from all corners of the United States, as the program has included studentathletes from 35 states and six foreign countries.
