Looks to bounce back after her abbreviated junior campaign was hindered by an injury ... handles pressure well ...capable of playing on the outside or at the opposite ... strong allaround player with good skills in the back row and on the front line ... has adapted well to her roles with the Irish ... smart player and steady performer ... plays with tremendous poise.

As a Junior (2007): Saw limited action while recovering from off-season surgery ... appeared in six matches while playing in 11 games ... stepped in to log her first action of the season against No. 11 California (Sept. 15) ... registered one kill on three attempts for a .333 average against the Golden Bears ... in the BIG EAST Conference opener at Pittsburgh (Sept. 22), shot down a season-high eight kills and tacked on one assist ... also finished with four digs and 8.0 total points in that match ... broke a sweat in matches versus No. 22 Santa Clara (Sept. 16), Marquette (Oct. 12). UConn (Oct. 27) and made her home debut against South Florida (Nov. 4) ... posted perfect serve and reception percentages (1.000) in each match played.

As a Sophomore (2006): Led the team in kills on 10 occasions ... appeared in 105 games ... played in all 32 matches while picking up



21 starts ... finished third on the squad with 315 kills and was fourth with 211 digs ... picked up a total of 76 blocks (0.72/game) ... second on the team with nine double-doubles and 377 points (3.59/game) ... a first-team all-BIG EAST selection ... BIG EAST Player of the Week (Nov. 6) ... named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll (Nov. 25) ... her run of seven consecutive double-doubles to end the season was the second longest streak ever in the Irish record books ... stepped up her play in the BIG EAST Tournament by notching double-doubles in each of the squad's three games ... threw down a seasonbest 25 kills at Cincinnati (Nov. 17) in the tournament's first round ... registered 16 kills and 19 digs vs. No. 24 St. John's (Nov. 18) and 12 kills with 14 digs vs. Louisville (Nov. 19)

... also pitched in a double-double at Wisconsin (Dec. 1) in the NCAA Tournament with 10 kills and 10 digs ... recorded doublefigure kills in each of her last 12 matches and double-figure digs in eight of the last nine matches ... had 14 kills against No. 13 Missouri (Sept. 2) ... tied a career-best with six block assists at Cincinnati (Oct. 28) ... had 15 kills on a .462 hitting percentage and 14 digs at Villanova (Sept. 24) ... at Georgetown (Oct. 3) she had 13 kills on a .417 hitting percentage ... visited South Florida (Nov. 5) and tallied 15 kills and .560 hitting percentage ... had 13 kills and 17 digs against both Pittsburgh (Nov. 11) and West Virginia (Nov. 12).


Talented athlete who gives the Irish a strong presence in the middle ... has a great natural understanding of the game ... good height and good lateral mobility ... incredibly bright and coachable ... strongest blocker on the squad.

As a Junior (2007): Anchored the front line for the Irish ... established herself as one of the league's top shot blockers ... showed the ability to light up the scoreboard with her efficient hitting ... second team all-BIG EAST choice ... a 3.76 grade point average earned her a spot on the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District V second team ... carried a .369 hitting percentage in conference play while registering 1.58 blocks/game against league opponents ... both marks ranked fourth in BIG EAST action ... twice listed on the BIG EAST Honor Roll (Oct. 8 and Nov. 5) ... her .706 clip against Rutgers (Oct. 6) was the sixthhighest of any league player in any match throughout the season and the fourth-best in league play ... that average ranks 13th all-time in Irish history ... she notched an average that ranks 23rd on Notre Dame's all-time list with a .684 clip against Georgetown (Nov. 2), the fifth-highest average in league play on the season ... finished five matches with a hitting average greater than .500 ... had 13 matches in which she recorded double figure kills ... led Notre Dame in blocks in 19 matches, includ-

North Dakota Class-B Outstanding Senior Volleyball co-Player of the Year, along with her twin sister, Briana ... the pair was known as the "Twin Towers" ... three-time all-state and all-North Dakota state tournament pick ... helped Langdon Area to an undefeated record and state title in 2003 ... led the prep squad to an 88-match winning streak ... led team to five consecutive top-seven finishes in the state tournament and a 194-20 overall four-year record ... did not play club volleyball until 2005 ... set Langdon Area single season records for kills (546), kill efficiency (.454), kill percentage (.558), blocks (125), and attack attempts (1,000) ... also broke school records for digs (23) and kills (19) in a two-game match and kills in a three-game match (26) ... accumulated 1,790 kills, 951 digs, 266 aces, 400 blocks in 456 career games ... three-time captain and all-conference pick ... in 2004, finished with 429 kills, 221 digs, 125 blocks, and 121 service aces ... also a three-year letter winner as a center in basketball, helping the Cardinals win the 2005 state championship while being named the tournament's MVP ... two-time all-state honoree in hoops, team's captain and MVP in 2005 ... averaged 5.6 blocked shots per game over final two seasons and averaged 14.4 points as a senior ... a fivetime letter winner in track and field as a jumper and hurdler ... three-time top-eight finisher at state meet in the high jump ... won one cross country letter ... student council president ... just the second North Dakota native to sport an Irish volleyball jersey ... Hardest hitter on the Irish squad ... good all-around skills ... has shown the ability to carry a heavy offensive load ... great hustler and gritty player.
