






2018 TOURNAMENT IN REVIEW

Tournament, Warren Golf Course and Notre Dame men's golf program records all fell when the final round concluded at the 2018 Fighting Irish Classic. Notre Dame's John Felitto carded a 54-hole program best 200 (-13) to finish in third place in the home tournament. Meanwhile, Notre Dame shot an 838 (-14) in a fifth place showing in a strong 15-team field.

Speaking of which, the University of Illinois took home the top prize at 44-under par, which shattered the previous Fighting Irish Classic record. In addition, Georgia Southern's Steven Fisk took home the individual championship and set a tournament record by finishing 15-under par.

Felitto entered the clubhouse as the tournament leader at 13-under par and was only passed by North Carolina's Ryan Gerard and individual champion Steven Fisk on the final few holes. In fact, it took a Warren Golf Course record-setting day by Gerard with his 10-under par round to surge into second place. Then he was only outdone by the fact that Fisk sunk a 30-foot tournament-clinching putt on the 18th green.

THE WARREN GOLF COURSE



May 1, 2000, marked the beginning of a new era in the history of Notre Dame golf as the University unveiled the championship-caliber William K. and Natalie O. Warren Golf Course at Notre Dame.

Since its opening, the course has been hailed as one of the best courses in America by *Golf Digest* and has been featured in *Links Magazine* and *Golf Digest* as a must-play venue. In addition, *Golfweek* has tabbed the Warren Golf Course as one of the nation's top 15 on-campus collegiate layouts.

Through the generous donation of Notre Dame alumnus and Tulsa, Okla., resident Bill Warren ('56), the University features an impressive 18-hole golf course, designed by the Austin, Texas-based architectural firm of Coore and Crenshaw, headed by Bill Coore and PGA Tour veteran (and victorious 1999 U.S. Ryder Cup captain) Ben Crenshaw.

The design of the Warren Golf Course is reminiscent of the classic, "walkable" Irish and American courses built in the late 19th and early 20th century, with short distances between the greens and tees. Winding its way through 250 wooded acres on the northeast edge of the Notre Dame campus, the course incorporates traditional elements of the great golf courses of the early 20th century and — unlike many modern layouts — is built on subtleties rather than special effects.

Distinguishing features include: rectangular tee boxes that provide a classic start to each hole; undulating greens of varying shapes constructed in a push-up style that slopes from back to front; false fronts to greens that allow the golfer to run the ball or fly it to the flag; and strategically-placed bunkers that visually enhance each hole while challenging players to proceed with caution.

The course runs 7,020 yards from the championship tees, and includes more than 88 reshaped and enhanced bunkers, scattered among the 18 holes, while water comes into play on six holes. The course has bent grass fairways and fescue grass rough, playing surfaces found at some of today's top facilities.

Since its opening in 1999, the Warren Golf Course has hosted dozens of high profile USGA, NCAA and Western Golf Association tournaments, including the 2010 Women's Amateur Public Links Championship, the 2009 & 2010 Men's U.S. Open Qualifier and six U.S. Men's Amateur Championship Qualifiers ('01, '02, '04, '08, '11, '12, '14).

Most recently and notably, the Warren hosted the 2019 U.S. Senior Open, becoming the first collegiate course to host the prestigious event.

"What struck me is how mature the golf course is for being a fairly new golf course," said David Toms. "It looks like a historic golf course to me. The whole place in general looks like it's been here for quite a while. I've always enjoyed playing historic venues and old-style golf courses."

TOURNAMENT HISTORY

A tradition began in 2006 when the University of Notre Dame played host to the inaugural Fighting Irish Classic at the Warren Golf Course on campus with Lamar taking the first crown with an 860 (+20).

In 2007, Michigan State took the tournament championship with an 847 (+7), easing past Arkansas and defending champion Lamar by 14 strokes.

In 2008, Arkansas and Michigan State were tied for the lead heading into the final round, but in the end, Arkansas prevailed with an 863 (+23), while UC Davis finished in second with an 867 (+27). Michigan State's Randy Hutchison earned medalist honors with a 210 (E).

For the first time of the events existence, the Irish took the podium at their event in 2009, posting a score of 870 (+30). In addition, Josh Sandman made it a sweep for the Irish with his mark of 212 (+2) individually.

In 2010, lowa took home tournament honors with an 853 (+13), while a pair of San Francisco golfers (Ji Hwan Park and Taylor Travis) shared medalist honors at 208 (-2).

The 2011 classic saw St. Mary's (CA) and the University of Houston finish as co-champions with an 870 (+30). Paul Mc-Connell of UT-Arlington won individually at 210 (E).

Michigan State became the first repeat winner in tournament history in 2012, firing a three-round score of 869 (+17). UNC Wilmington's Thomas Bass was the overall medalist at 211 (-2).

Houston won its second Fighting Irish Classic crown in 2013, tying the then tournament record with a final team score of five-under-par, which equated to an 847 total. Houston's Kyle Pilgrim was the event medalist at 208 (-5)

Michigan State became a three-time event champion in 2014 as the Spartans topped the field over a challenging weekend of play. Only medalist McCormick Clouser of Ball State (-4) and Notre Dame's Cory Sciupider (-2) finished the event under par.

For just the second time, the 2015 leaderboard saw a tie at the top, fittingly between universities dedicated to the same person, as Notre Dame and St. Mary's (CA) each finished with an 850 (-2). The Gaels' Jonathan De Los Reyes claimed medalist honors with a 207 (-6).

2016 marked a historic year for the tournament - Notre Dame's Blake Barens set a then 54-hole record of 201 (-9) on his way to individual medalist honors. In addition, the Irish's 268 (-12) final round, marked a then tournament best. Yet, Texas El Paso claimed the title with an 835 (-5).

In 2017 - Notre Dame went on to tie Michigan State's three-time event champion mark, setting a then tournament team low with an 18-under par, 822. Individually, William & Mary's David Hicks and Georgia Southern's Steven Fisk tied atop the leaderboard with a 204 (-6).

In 2018 - history was made and records were shattered. Eight of the tournament history's top-10 team totals (to par) came in 2018, with the University of Illinois taking the crown with an 808 (-44). Georgia Southern's Steven Fisk took home medalist honors and set a new individual tournament record with a 198 (-15). Lastly, Ryan Gerard of North Carolina tied the Warren Golf Course record with a round of 61 (-10).
