TOP STORYLINES

► No. 21 Michigan (4-0) returns home to host Notre Dame (3-2) on Saturday (Nov. 23) in its lone contest of the week.

► U-M is out to a 4-0 start after knocking off Kent State (88-53) and Akron (80-71) last weekend. Michigan has won its first four games for the second straight season and for the fourth time in the last five years.

► Michigan has three players in double-figure scoring in **Naz Hillmon** (17.0 ppg, 8.3 rpg), **Kayla Robbins** (11.5 ppg) and **Amy Dilk** (10.5 ppg, 8.0 rpg, 5.3 apg). In addition, five other players are averaging at least 5.3 points per game.

► Michigan remained in the Associated Press Top 25, moving up to No. 21. In the first release of the USA Today Coaches poll since games started, U-M comes in at No. 19. Notre Dame is receiving votes in both polls.

► The Wolverines and the Fighting Irish are meeting for the first time since the 2017 edition of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.

► Notre Dame is the first of three ACC schools that Michigan will face during the non-conference portion of its schedule. U-M will also host Syracuse as part of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge (Dec. 5) and face Florida State in the Hall of Fame Showcase at Mohegan Sun in Uncasville, Connecticut (Dec. 22).

Last Time Out

Down three after 30 minutes, the No. 24-ranked University of Michigan women's basketball team outscored Akron 25-13 in the fourth quarter for an 80-71 win over the Zips Saturday afternoon (Nov. 16) at James A. Rhodes Arena.

The Wolverines used a 12-0 run that featured four points from sophomore **Naz Hillmon**, a three-point play from sophomore **Amy Dilk**, a three-pointer from junior **Hailey Brown**, and a pair of free throws from senior **Kayla Robbins** to turn a 61-57 deficit with 9:05 to go with into a 69-61 lead with 6:08 remaining. Michigan's lead never dipped below six the rest of the way as the Wolverines made their free throws and got timely stops to record the nine-point win.

Hillmon turned in a career-high 28 points on 9-for-12 shooting from the floor and a 10-for-11 showing at the free throw line to go with eight rebounds and three assists. Robbins went for 12 points, two boards and two steals, with Dilk chipping in 11 points, six rebounds and six helpers. Brown had eight points in the fourth quarter and rounded out Michigan's double-figure scorers with 10 points, including U-M's only three-pointers of the contest.

Akron opened the third quarter on a 7-2 run as Michigan turned it over three straight times, forcing a Michigan timeout with 7:58 remaining in the frame. The Wolverines switched up the defense out of the timeout, with Robbins swiping the ball at the top of the key and scoring in transition.

The Zips tied it up at 47 on a corner three with 4:51 on the third-quarter clock before Michigan went to work. The Wolverines responded with an 8-1 run to regain a 55-48 lead with 2:02 remaining in the quarter. Akron responded in kind, using a 10-0 run to enter the fourth quarter with a 58-55 lead.

Hillmon Named to Big Ten Honor Roll

Sophomore **Naz Hillmon** was named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll after putting together a pair of double-figure scoring games to help Michigan move to 4-0. Hillmon scored a career-best 28 points on 9-for-12 shooting from the floor and a 10-for-11 showing from the free throw line in Michigan's 80-71 win over Akron (Nov. 16). She also grabbed eight boards and tied her career high with three assists. This came on the heels of a 14-point, nine-board performance in the Wolverines' 88-53 win over Kent State (Nov. 15). Hillmon averaged 21.0 points per game on 76.2 percent shooting over Michigan's two games.

Balanced Attack

Michigan is averaging 80.3 points per game on 48.8 percent shooting from the floor through four games. U-M has had a different leading scorer in three of its four games, with each player turning in a career high in scoring. Senior **Kayla Robbins** scored 17 points in the first start of her career in Michigan's opener against Western Michigan (Nov. 8). Classmate **Akienreh Johnson** notched the first 20-point game of her career, going for 21 points in U-M's victory over Kent State (Nov. 15). Sophomore **Naz Hillmon** has led Michigan in scoring twice, the latter coming against Akron (Nov. 16) when she had a career-best 28 points.

Balance Part Two

Michigan features a trio of double-figure scorers in **Naz Hillmon** (17.0 ppg), **Kayla Robbins** (11.5 ppg) and **Amy Dilk** (10.5 ppg). In addition, five other Wolverines are averaging at least 5.3 points per game in

Akienreh Johnson (9.8 ppg), **Hailey Brown** (7.0 ppg), **Izabel Varejão** (6.8 ppg), **Michelle Sidor** (6.8 ppg) and **Emily Kiser** (5.3 ppg).

4-0

Michigan remained unbeaten on the season after sweeping a pair of games at the Akron Classic last weekend. It is the second straight season that U-M is 4-0 and the fourth time in the last five years that the Maize and Blue has won its first four contests.

Scouting Notre Dame

Notre Dame (3-2) is coming off a 54-51 win over Toledo on Wednesday (Nov. 20) at home. The Irish feature four double-digit scorers in Katlyn Gilbert (16.0 ppg), Sam Brunelle (16.0 ppg), Destinee Walker (12.6 ppg) and Anaya Peoples (12.2 ppg). Notre Dame is averaging 66.0 points per game on 39.6 percent shooting while allowing 62.4 points per contest on 36.4 percent shooting. Notre Dame leads the all-time series, 12-7, and has won the last three meetings between the two teams.

On the Glass

Michigan has been effective on the glass in the early going, averaging 42.3 boards per game with a +10.5 margin to rank fourth in the Big Ten. U-M leads the Big Ten in rebounding defense, allowing just 31.8 rebounds per game to its opponents. **Naz Hillmon** is fifth in the conference in rebounding (8.3 rpg), with **Amy Dilk** coming in eighth at 8.0 rebounds per game. Dilk is second overall in the conference in defensive rebounding, grabbing 7.5 defensive caroms per game.

Simple Enough...Just Score

U-M is 62-6 under head coach **Kim Barnes Arico** when scoring at least 80 points. Michigan has reached the 80-point mark in each of its last two games.

Robbins Explodes for Career High

In the first start of her career in the season opener against Western Michigan (Nov. 8), senior **Kayla Robbins** responded with a career-best 17 points to go with eight rebounds in 34 minutes of action. Robbins was 6-for-14 from the floor in the game, en route to leading Michigan in scoring.

Getting Hot from Behind the Arc

Michigan hit 11 three-pointers in its 77-57 win over Bradley (Nov. 10), connecting on a 47.8 percent clip (11-for-23). The Wolverines had just one game last year with at least 10 triples, coming on March 9 against Maryland in the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament. It was the 27th time in program history that Michigan has hit at least 11 three-pointers in a game.

Wolverines Sign Quartet to NLI's

Head coach **Kim Barnes Arico** announced the signing of Meghan Fiso, Whitney Sollom, Elise Stuck and Cameron Williams to National Letters of Intent (Nov. 13) to join the Wolverines for the 2020-21 season. The class is ranked No. 12 by ESPN, the highest in the Big Ten, as well as No. 16 by Prospects Nation and No. 25 by the All-Star Girls Report.

Wolverines Ranked in the Preseason

For the second time in the last three years, Michigan has garnered a preseason ranking from the Associated Press. was ranked in the preseason in 2017 after capturing the 2017 WNIT title and in 2001.

Team Recognition

Michigan was picked to finish second in the conference by the media and fourth by the coaches after putting together a 22-12 record last season. Maryland was picked ahead of Michigan by the media, with the Terrapins, Michigan State and Indiana picked ahead of the Maize and Blue by the coaches.

Momentum to End 2018-19

Michigan is coming off a 22-12 season and an appearance in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2018-19. It marked the eighth straight 20-win campaign for the Wolverines, the longest streak in school history. U-M's 22 wins was the third-most in school history and the Wolverines won 11 Big Ten games last season, finishing fourth in the Big Ten. Michigan went 10-3 over the final 13 games last season, including a seven-game winning streak from Feb. 1-21.

Dilk Named to Big Ten Honor Roll

Sophomore **Amy Dilk** was named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll after putting together a pair of double-figure scoring games. Dilk tallied the first double-double of her career in Michigan's win over Western Michigan (Nov. 8), finishing with 12 points, 11 rebounds, five assists, a steal and a block in 30 minutes. She just missed another double-double in U-M's win over Bradley (Nov. 10), going for 13 points, nine rebounds, four assists, a steal and a block in 33 minutes.

Hillmon Wins Gold with USA Basketball

Sophomore **Naz Hillmon** helped the USA Basketball U19 team to the gold medal at the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup, held July 20-28. The Red, White and Blue went 7-0 at the event, capped by a come-from-behind 74-70 win in overtime over Australia in the gold medal game.

Hillmon served as captain for the team and started all seven games. She averaged 7.4 points and a team-high 7.6 rebounds in 25.3 minutes per game. Hillmon ranked 13th overall for the tournament in rebounds per game, recording three games with at least 10 rebounds. She also racked up a pair of double-figure scoring games.

Hillmon joins current head coach **Kim Barnes Arico** as members of the team to possess a pair of gold medals from USA Basketball. Barnes Arico was an assistant coach for the team that won at the same events in 2014 and 2015.

Seniors Back for More

Michigan's roster features two seniors in **Akienreh Johnson** and **Kayla Robbins**. Robbins has played in the most games of anyone on the roster, seeing time in 101 games off the bench. Johnson played in 31 games last season, starting five times, after missing the first three games with an injury. The duo had strikingly similar stat lines last year, each averaging 5.6 points per game and 3.3 rebounds per contest.

New Faces

During the offseason, former associate head coach Melanie Moore was named the head coach at Xavier, the second Michigan assistant coach in the last three seasons to get a head coaching job (Megan

Duffy, now at Marquette). **Toyelle Wilson**, who spent the last six years at Baylor, has joined the staff as an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator. In addition, **Harry Rafferty** has been named a graduate manager after spending time in the NBA G-League and Danielle Edwards, who played at Clemson, has been added as the Director of Player Personnel.

TV Time

Michigan will appear on national television at least 12 times during the 2019-20 season, including an appearance on ESPN against Syracuse on Dec. 5 at 9 p.m. as part of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.

KBA Keeps Winning

Head coach **Kim Barnes Arico** picked her up 400th career win last season, becoming the seventh active Big Ten head coach to reach 400. KBA is Michigan's all-time wins leader with 160 and is still the winningest coach at St. John's with 176 victories. Her .651 winning percentage is tops in program history.

The class is ranked No. 12 by ESPN, the highest in the Big Ten, as well as No. 16 by Prospects Nation and No. 25 by the All-Star Girls Report.

"I am really excited about our 2020 class," Barnes Arico said. "We were able to target next-level, versatile players from high-character families to continue the Michigan tradition. I was very excited to get two top players from the state of Michigan because that was really important to us, as well as getting two top players on the national scene because of the power of the block M.

"This group brings a lot of versatility to our program. That is something we have talked about with our team, which is positionless basketball. We talk about being able to do multiple things and contribute in multiple ways. That is the way our game is headed, and these players definitely do that. They are long, they are athletic, and they can do a combination of things from handling the ball to posting up to rebounding. Their versatility is tremendous, which is what we need with the graduation of someone like Kayla Robbins, who has that length and athleticism to impact the game on multiple levels. I think this group has a number of different positions and can help us take the next steps in Michigan women's basketball."

Meghan Fiso

Fiso, a 5-foot-11 guard from Seattle who attends Garfield, is ranked No. 40 by Prospects Nation. She helped West Seattle to the state opener game and an 18-6 record as a junior, averaging 12.9 points, 7.2 rebounds and 2.3 assists while playing out of position at the forward spot. Fiso earned a spot on the 3A all-metro first team following her junior campaign. She was named the 2018 Pacific Northwest Basketball Officials Association Female Player of the Year, given to the player who shows great sportsmanship and leadership while also being an outstanding player.

"Meghan Fiso is one of the best combo guards from out west. She is a strong, talented guard. She really gives us much-needed help in that guard spot of being able to handle the ball, being a tremendous passer, being a great scorer and three-point shooter. She has a great feel for the game and is an exceptionally hard worker. She has an unbelievable work ethic, and that is something we really value in our program."

"I chose Michigan because I felt like I would be challenged not only as an athlete but also as a student," Fiso said. "When I came on my visit, it felt like a home away from home. That was really important to me and something I was looking for in a school."

Whitney Sollom

Sollom, a 6-4 forward from Hartland, Michigan, was the Livingston County Player of the Year as a junior after averaging 10.9 points and 8.8 rebounds per game. She also recorded 67 blocks, including a nine-block performance in the regional semifinals as Hartland reached the state quarterfinals for the second straight season. She is ranked as the No. 77 player in the 2020 class from Prospects Nation. Her father, Ken, was a quarterback at Michigan from 1987-91.

"I remember going to the first game of her high school career when she was a freshman and being the only college coach there," Barnes Arico said. "She is someone that we have had our eye on since middle school. I have watched her grow up and develop as a basketball player over the last few years. She is a tremendous athlete as a 6-4 post player. She is long and can do a little bit of everything. She can catch in transition, has great hands and great touch around the basket. She is really a great complement to the rest of the class."

"I chose Michigan because it is where I felt the best fit for me personally,"

Sollom said. "I loved everything about it, from the players to the coaches and the campus atmosphere. My dream was to play college basketball, and Coach Arico gave me that opportunity. I am very excited to join Michigan women's basketball!"

Elise Stuck

Stuck, a 6-1 wing from Charlevoix, Michigan, is already Charlevoix's all-time leading scorer with 1,494 points. As a junior for the Rayders, she averaged a double-double of 21 points and 10 rebounds per game. She led Charlevoix to an undefeated Lake Michigan Conference season last year while also helping the Rayders win their third straight district title. Stuck earned Division 3 all-state honors for the third consecutive season and was named to the ALL-USA Michigan Girls Basketball Second Team by USA Today High School Sports. She is a four-star recruit by Prospects Nation.

"Elise is a tremendous player who puts you in the mind frame of a Nicole Elmlad," Barnes Arico said. "She is a great leader, a high academic kid, someone who can come in and impact the game in so many different ways, whether that is defending, being your leading rebounder or scoring the basketball. I have seen her do so many things for her AAU and high school programs. She is going to be battling back from an ACL injury this season, which is a bummer because she was probably one of the best players to put on the Charlevoix uniform. She will be back 100 percent for the start of her freshman year."

"Michigan is the perfect fit for me because of the competitive and winning culture that Coach Arico, her staff and players have created, as well as the unique academic opportunities both during and after college," Stuck said.

Cameron Williams

Williams, a 6-2 forward from Chicago, is ranked No. 30 by ESPN HoopGurlz and is a five-star recruit. She attends Whitney Young High School and plays for the Mac Irvin Fire AAU program. She has helped Whitney Young to two straight sectional semifinals while anchoring her team's play down low. She turned in a 15-point, 13-rebound and five-block performance in Whitney Young's regional championship win over Kenwood this past February and helped the Dolphins to the city championship. She was named MVP of the Rose Classic during her sophomore season. Williams is listed as a candidate for the Illinois Ms. Basketball Award. Her dad, Aaron, played professionally in the NBA and overseas for 15 years.

"Cameron has been on our radar for years and years," Barnes Arico said. "I have been trying to get someone from her high school and AAU program because of how hard those teams play, how well they know the game, and the expectations that come from a coaching staff that I believe is one of the best in the country. She is an elite-level athlete who puts you in the mindset of a Naz Hillmon because she can impact the game in so many different ways, both offensively and defensively. She is a five-star player from a basketball family who will be able to impact our program immediately."

"I chose the University of Michigan because I felt it was a place I could significantly grow on and off the court to take my talents to the next level," Williams said. "I immediately felt a welcoming, family atmosphere by just being around the team and coaching staff. That is something I value as a player and a person."

Kim Barnes Arico enters her eighth season as the head coach in 2019-20, guiding the Wolverines to at least 20 wins in each of her seven seasons, three NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2017 WNIT Championship. She was announced as the ninth head coach in the history of the program on April 20, 2012.

Barnes Arico is the winningest coach in program history, amassing 156 wins through just seven seasons. The only coach in program history to have seven 20-win seasons, she is first all-time in winning percentage (.647) with a 156-85 record in Ann Arbor. Barnes Arico holds an 97-27 (.782) record at Crisler Center during her tenure after a 13-1 mark during the 2018-19 season. U-M has won at least 13 games at Crisler in six of her seven seasons, including a record-setting 19 wins in 2016-17. Barnes Arico also eclipsed 400 wins for her career during the 2017-18 season, making her the seventh active Big Ten coach to reach the mark.

Barnes Arico was named the 2017 Big Ten Coach of the Year by the coaches and media, becoming the first consensus winner in school history. She has coached 11 players to 20 All-Big Ten citations, highlighted by U-M's all-time leading scorer and three-time All-Big Ten first-teamer, Katelynn Flaherty. The 2017-18 Michigan Female Athlete of the Year, Flaherty also earned three consecutive WBCA All-America honorable mentions (2016, 2017, 2018) as the only player in school history with three honors. Nicole Elmlad also earned back-to-back Academic All-America honors (2014, 2015) and was the recipient of the 2015 Big Ten Medal of Honor. This past season (2018-19), Naz Hillmon was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year and became the first freshman in school history to earn All-Big Ten first-team honors.

Barnes Arico also completed a two-year stint with USA Basketball (2014-15), serving as an assistant coach alongside Dawn Staley (South Carolina) and Jeff Walz (Louisville) for the U18 (2014) and U19 (2015) teams. She won a pair of gold medals at the FIBA U19 World Championships in 2015 and at the FIBA U18 America's Championship in 2014.

Michigan has made the postseason in each of Barnes Arico's seven seasons, advancing to the NCAA Tournament second round three times (2013, 2018, 2019). U-M has found itself back in the national spotlight as well during KBA's tenure, returning to the Associated Press poll in January 2013 for the first time in 10 years. Michigan has been ranked 21 times in the AP poll and 19 times in the coaches' poll over the last six years.

The Wolverines made their second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018-19, advancing to the second round after an 84-54 win over Kansas State in the first round. Hillmon racked up the postseason honors, earning Big Ten Freshman of the Year (media), Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year and was a consensus All-Big Ten first teamer, while Hallie Thome grabbed her third straight All-Big Ten first-team nod. With the Wolverines sitting at 12-9 and 10th in the Big Ten at 3-6 on Jan. 27, Michigan ripped off seven straight games in the month of February to vault into a fourth-place finish in the conference (11-7). Michigan reached the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2001 en route to wrapping up an NCAA Tournament bid.

The 2017-18 season saw U-M return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 2012-13 season, where the Wolverines picked up a win in the first round. Michigan compiled a 23-10 record during the season, the second-most wins in a season in school history. Flaherty set a new Michigan record by hitting 118 three-pointers on the season en route to earning her third straight consensus Big Ten honor. Thome was a first-teamer for the second straight season and Jillian Dunston was named to the Big Ten All-Defensive Team. U-M spent the majority of the season ranked in both polls, peaking at No. 13 in the Associated Press poll at the beginning of February. Michigan's 15-week run in the AP poll was the longest in program history.

Barnes Arico led Michigan to its first postseason championship in 2016-2017, as the Wolverines captured the WNIT Championship after being left out of the NCAA Tournament despite a third place finish in the Big Ten. Michigan went 11-5 in conference play to finish alone in third place, its highest finish since 2011

and the second-most Big Ten wins in program history. Flaherty and Thome each earned All-Big Ten first-team honors to mark the first time U-M had multiple first teamers. The Wolverines regrouped during the WNIT, reeling off six straight wins for the title. U-M held off Georgia Tech in three overtimes in the championship game to hang its first banner in Crisler.

During KBA's first five seasons in the Maize and Blue, the Wolverines racked up at least 20 wins in each year and advanced to the postseason each time. In 2013-14, U-M weathered losing 88 percent of its scoring from the season before to still reach 20 wins and the third round of the WNIT with four new starters.

Prior to joining the Maize and Blue, she spent 10 seasons at the helm of the St. John's women's hoops program, building the Red Storm into a national power. She guided St. John's to four NCAA Tournament appearances, with the Red Storm advancing to the Sweet 16 in 2012.

Barnes Arico compiled a 176-133 overall record and five 20-win campaigns at St. John's. She was twice named Big East Coach of the Year (2006, 2012) and had 11 of her players earn All-Big East honors and six receive all-rookie team selection.

In 2011-12, St. John's posted a 24-10 overall record and finished second (13-3) in the Big East standings. Barnes Arico was named the 2012 Big East Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the USBWA National Coach of the Year award. St. John's finished No. 15 in the final USA Today Coaches poll and reached its highest-ever ranking of No. 13 by the Associated Press.

The highlight of the 2011-12 season was when Barnes Arico and her Red Storm ended Connecticut's 99-game home winning streak with a 57-56 win on Feb. 19, 2012, at Gampel Pavilion. It was also the UConn's first home loss to an unranked opponent in nearly 19 years.

Prior to accepting her position at St. John's, Barnes Arico was extremely successful at NCAA Division II Adelphi (1999-2002). She led the Panthers to three consecutive postseason appearances, posting a 65-24 overall record and a 51-13 league mark.

In 2001-02, Adelphi won its first New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC) championship and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Panthers finished with a 28-3 record and earned the school's first national ranking in school history, finishing No. 12. Barnes Arico was named the NYCAC, NIT/Metropolitan Basketball Writers Division II and Nassau County Sports Commission Outstanding Female Coach of the Year.

Barnes Arico started her head coaching career at Fairleigh Dickinson-Madison, a Division III university in New Jersey. She led the Devils to a 13-11 record during the 1996-97 season before accepting the head coaching post at New Jersey Institute of Technology for two seasons (1997-99). Helping the program transition from Division III to Division II, Barnes Arico was named the New Jersey Coach of the Year after taking the program from the five-win total in her first season to 11 victories in year two.

A native of Mastic Beach, N.Y., Barnes Arico helped lead Stony Brook University to the 1989 NCAA Division III Tournament as a freshman. She spent her final three seasons at Montclair State University, serving as captain during her junior and senior seasons. Barnes Arico led the team to back-to-back ECAC Tournament appearances in 1991 and 1992 and was the team's leading scorer both seasons. A scholar-athlete award recipient, Barnes Arico graduated from Montclair State in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and health.

Barnes Arico went into teaching after graduation, accepting a position as a physical education and health teacher at the Academy of Saint Aloysius in Jersey City, N.J., during the 1993-94 academic year. She left Saint Aloysius and moved into an identical position at Chatham High School from 1994-96 in Chatham, N.J.

Barnes Arico and her husband, Larry Arico, are the parents of a son, Trevor, and daughters Emma and Cecelia.

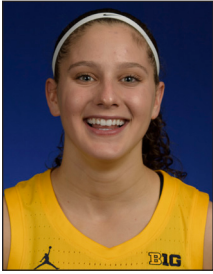

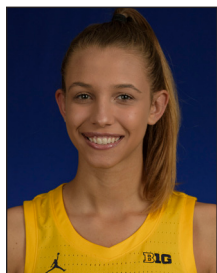
