BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH VS. KNIGHTS

1	Senior John Mooney , one of nine major conference players in the country to average a double-double, is the only Division I player averaging 14.0 points and 13.0 rebounds per game.
1.5	Seconds remaining when graduate student Rex Pflueger inbounded the ball to sophomore Nate Laszewski at the end of regulation against Toledo. Laszewski's three-point field goal as the buzzer sounded sent the game into overtime and the Irish eventually posted a 64-62 victory.
2	Notre Dame and Fairleigh Dickinson will be meeting for the second time on Tuesday evening. The Irish defeated the Knights 75-57 on December 6, 2014 at Purcell Pavilion.
3	John Mooney has pulled down 15 or more rebounds in three consecutive games played (he missed the game against Presbyterian with an illness). He joins Bryant's Patrick Harding as the only Division I players to have 15 or more rebounds in three games this season.
11.8	The Irish continue their tradition of 'defend without fouling' in 2019-20 - currently ranked third in the country in personal fouls per game (11.8). In the last decade, Notre Dame has finished out of the top 10 in least amount of personal fouls per game just twice (11th in 2010-11, 15th in 2013-14) and led the country in the category in 2011-12, 2015-16 and 2018-19. 13.0	Rebounds-per-game average for John Mooney , a mark that ranks him third in the country and leads the ACC as of November 25.
16	After scoring a career-high 28 points with 16 rebounds against Marshall on Friday night, combined with his 18-point, 16-rebound effort earlier in the week against Howard, senior John Mooney becomes the first ACC player to post back-to-back games with 16 or more rebounds twice in a career since Tim Duncan in 1996-97. See page 3 for more details.
21	Notre Dame forced 21 turnovers in the overtime victory over Toledo - the most for a Mike Brey-led Irish team since November 24, 2013 when Notre Dame forced Army into 22 turnovers. It was the first time Notre Dame has forced 20 or more turnovers since a victory over Seattle in November of 2016.
23	With Notre Dame's come-from-behind overtime victory over Toledo last Thursday, the Irish improved to 23-12 in overtime under Mike Brey . Notre Dame has claimed wins in 13 of its last 16 overtime games played.
29	The game against FDU on Tuesday evening will mark the 30th meeting between the Irish and a team from the Northeast Conference. Notre Dame is 29-0 against the NEC, with the most meetings coming against St. Peter's (PA) (13-0).
200	Rex Pflueger and T.J. Gibbs have joined an exclusive Notre Dame men's basketball club. They are the 12th and 13th players since 1996-97 to post 200 assists and 100 steals in a career. Pflueger has 259 assists and 115 steals, while Gibbs has posted 298 assists and 111 steals.
298	Senior T.J. Gibbs enters the game with Fairleigh Dickinson with 298 career assists. Gibbs will become the 21st Notre Dame player to reach 300 career assists in a career and the 13th player to reach the plateau during the Mike Brey era.
795	Glenn and Stacey Murphy Head Men's Basketball Coach Mike Brey is approaching another milestone in his career. When the Irish face traditional rival UCLA on December 14, Coach Brey will take the sidelines for his 800th career game. Santa Clara's Herb Sendek is scheduled to reach the 800 game mark on the same day as Brey and they will become the 24th and 25th active coaches to reach 800 career games.

NOTRE DAME VS. FAIRLEIGH DICKINSON

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team (5-1) caps off a six-game home stand against Fairleigh Dickinson (1-4) at Purcell Pavilion on Tuesday night (7 p.m., Regional Sports Network).

- The Irish and Knights will be meeting for the second time. Notre Dame defeated FDU 75-57 on December 6, 2014 at Purcell Pavilion.
- Fairleigh Dickinson won the Northeast Conference Championship last season, the program's second title in four years, and advanced to the NCAA tournament. FDU defeated Prairie View A&M 82-76 in the First Four in Dayton before falling to No. 1 seed Gonzaga.
- The Knights are 1-4 in 2019-20, with a season-opening victory over FDU-Florham at home. The Knights are ending a five-game road trip at Notre Dame, with losses at DePaul, Fordham, Army and Lafayette.
- Fairleigh Dickinson was founded in 1942 as a junior college and was named after an early benefactor - Colonel Fairleigh S. Dickinson. The school has four campuses; two in New Jersey (Madison/Florham Park and Teaneck/Hackensack), one in Vancouver, British Columbia and one in South East England.

IRISH CLAIM MABC HONORS

The University of Notre Dame capped off a clean run through the 2019 Men Against Breast Cancer Invitational with a 64-62 overtime victory against Toledo on Thursday, November 21. Combined with a victory in the 2018 Gotham Classic Showcase Game, Notre Dame has won 15 of its last 16 in-season tournament contests – a run that includes the 2016 Legends Classic Championship and the 2017 Maui Invitational title.

John Mooney added to his personal trophy case by garnering MABC MVP honors (as voted on by media members attending each contest). Mooney follows up on his MVP honors in the Gotham Classic Showcase game from last season. Graduate student Rex Pflueger and sophomore Dane Goodwin were named to the MABC All-Tournament Team as well.

MOONEY REBOUNDING AT AN HISTORIC RATE

Senior John Mooney enters the game with Fairleigh Dickinson on a run of 15 or more rebounds in the last three games in which he as played (Mooney missed the Presbyterian game with an illness).

- Mooney is the first Notre Dame player to collect 15 or more rebounds in three straight games since Luke Harangody in 2008-09.
- He joins Bryant's Patrick Harding as the only Division I player to have three games with 15 or more rebounds.
- Mooney is the only Division I player averaging 14+ points and 13+ rebounds a game this season.

DURHAM POSTS NOTEWORTHY DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Senior Juwan Durham responded to the loss of John Mooney (illness) on the front line against Presbyterian with 11 points, 15 rebounds and four blocked shots to record his second career double-double. It was just the seventh time a Mike Brey era player has recorded 10+ points, 15+ rebounds and 4+ blocks - and the first time since John Mooney did it at North Carolina last season.

Others who have accomplished such a double-double include current Irish assistant coach Ryan Humphrey (2001), Torin Francis twice (2003, 2004), Luke Harangody (2008) and Bonzie Colson (2017).

PFLUEGER MAKES WINNING PLAYS

Graduate student Rex Pflueger, who missed the final 23 games of the 2018-19 season with a torn ACL in his left leg, returned to the lineup in the season opener this season and has quickly returned to form. Dating back to his freshman season when his last-second tip in in the second round of the NCAA tournament against Stephen F. Austin pushed Notre Dame to the Sweet 16, Pflueger has been making winning plays for the Irish – with the come-from-behind victory over Toledo the latest example.

DURHAM ALREADY AMONG TOP SHOT BLOCKERS IN NOTRE DAME HISTORY

Blocked shots are one of the youngest official NCAA official statistics, only becoming a part of the game boxscore for the 1985-86 season. With that in mind, it is still noteworthy that senior Juwan Durham (who still retains a year of eligibility after 2019-20) has already established himself as one of the top shot blockers in Notre Dame history.

In his first full season at Notre Dame in 2018-19, Durham swatted 63 shots which ranks fifth on the Notre Dame single-season blocked shots list.

With three more blocks against Presbyterian on Monday night, Durham pushed his career blocked-shot percentage to 2.30 and is one of just three Notre Dame players to average over 2.0 blocks per game:

Durham’s 76 total blocks at Notre Dame currently rank him 16th all-time. Jordan Cornette is the Notre Dame blocked shots record holder with 201 from 2001-05.

FOUR MORE FIRST-TIME OPPONENTS IN 2019-20

The 2019-20 schedule welcomes four first-time opponents to Notre Dame’s men’s basketball schedule (Robert Morris (W, 92-57), Howard (W, 79-50), Presbyterian (W, 63-53) and Alabama A&M) matching the same number from last season (UIC, Radford, Oklahoma and Jacksonville).

Under Mike Brey, the Irish are 48-5 (.906) in games featuring first-time program meetings.

MOONEY POSTS DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN THREE OF FIRST FIVE GAMES

Senior forward John Mooney, who led all major conference players in rebounds per game in league action last season and was one of seven major conference players to average a double-double, is off to an even better pace in 2019-20.

The Orlando, Florida, native has posted three double-doubles in five games played this season. He paced the ACC with 20 in 33 games played last year (and 13 in conference play – the most since Tim Duncan in 1996-97) and is up to 24 total in his career (good for 19th on the all-time Notre Dame double-double list).

Mooney missed the Presbyterian game with an illness.

PFLUEGER JOINS 300-200-100 CLUB

Graduate student Rex Pflueger is one of just 10 players since 1996-97 (the year Notre Dame joined a conference) to compile 300 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals in a career.

The list of players who have reached the 300-200-100 plateau: Chris Thomas, Tory Jackson, David Graves, Jerian Grant, Chris Quinn, Eric Atkins, Steve Vasturia, Matt Carroll, Demetrius Jackson, T.J. Gibbs and Pflueger.

GIBBS CLOSING IN ON 1,000-300-200-100 CLUB

Senior T.J. Gibbs, who reached the 1,000-point career mark last season, is poised to join an exclusive club later this year. With 298 assists, Gibbs is going to reach at least 300 assists in his career which will push him above 1,000 points, 300 assists, 200 rebounds and 100 steals in his time at Notre Dame.

Only Chris Thomas, Jerian Grant, Chris Quinn, Eric Atkins, Steve Vasturia, Tory Jackson and Demetrius Jackson all reached those milestones under Mike Brey at Notre Dame.

LASZEWSKI WORKING HARD ON THE BACKBOARD

Off to a slow shooting start, sophomore Nate Laszewski has not let it affect the development of the rest of his game. As a rookie, Laszewski connected on 44 three pointers (the sixth-best for a freshman in school history) and averaged 3.9 rebounds per contest. This year, the Jupiter, Florida, native has grabbed at least four rebounds in each game and is currently third on the team in rebounding with a 6.2 average.

IRISH TRADITIONALLY AMONG BEST IN THE COUNTRY AT TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

Notre Dame finished third in the NCAA last season in turnovers per game — posting the fifth consecutive season of ranking in the nation's top-10 for least amount of turnovers in a game.

The Irish have not averaged over 10.0 turnovers per game since a 10.3 mark in 2013-14 (which was still good enough for 26th nationally).

A DECADE OF 'NO FOUL' CONTINUES

One of the mantras of Notre Dame basketball under Mike Brey has been to keep the amount of opponent foul shots down. Defend without fouling is a way of life for Irish basketball and the statistics bear out that trend.

In the last 10 years, Notre Dame has failed to finish among the top 10 in least amount of personal fouls committed just twice. They have also led the country in least amount of personal fouls three times. So far, in 2019-20, the Irish are tied for third in the NCAA in least amount of fouls committed (11.0).

KELLY TRIPUCKA TO ENTER THE PURCELL PAVILION RING OF HONOR

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball program has announced that Kelly Tripucka (1977-81) will be inducted into the Purcell Pavilion Ring of Honor on February 1, 2020. A three-time All-American and 12th-leading scorer in school history, Tripucka will be the ninth men's basketball addition to the Ring of Honor, which is the highest honor the program can bestow on a former student-athlete or coach.

Tripucka was an energizing force during one of the most successful periods of men's basketball at the University of Notre Dame. A Notre Dame legacy, Tripucka's father, Frank, was a standout quarterback for the Fighting Irish football team and an NFL first-round draft pick in 1949. After a remarkable prep career at Bloomfield High School, Tripucka helped the Irish compile a 92-26 four-year record with each of Tripucka's teams appearing in the NCAA tournament.

A versatile and athletic player who could drive by slower defenders, post up smaller defenders and shoot over any player, Tripucka saved his more noteworthy performances for Notre Dame's top-ranked opponents. As a rookie he secured his spot in a talented starting lineup with a 15-point second half against defending national champion and top-ranked Marquette (Feb. 26, 1978) as the Irish erased a 14-point lead for a 65-59 victory.

Later that year Tripucka was named the Most Valuable Player of the Midwest Regional that propelled Notre Dame to the 1978 Final Four by scoring 20 points against Utah in the Sweet 16, then putting up 18 points and 11 rebounds in the Elite Eight victory over rival DePaul.

He also led Notre Dame by scoring 28 points in the legendary double overtime victory over top-ranked and undefeated DePaul (25-0) on February 27, 1980 - a contest considered to this day as one of the most thrilling in the history of Purcell Pavilion.

Upon the completion of his four years at Notre Dame, Tripucka was fourth on the all-time scoring list (1,719), fifth in field goal percentage (.548), third in free throw percentage (.798) and third in free throws made (461). He owns the Notre Dame single-game record for free throws attempted and made, connecting on 23 of 26 attempts against Dayton on February 3, 1979. Tripucka's teams at Notre Dame claimed 11 wins over top-10 teams including three victories over a top-ranked team (Marquette, DePaul and Virginia).

Tripucka was selected 12th overall by the Detroit Pistons in the 1981 NBA Draft. He earned an all-star berth in his rookie season and spent five successful seasons in Detroit before being traded to the Utah Jazz for Purcell Pavilion Ring of Honor inductee and former teammate Adrian Dantley. After two seasons with the Jazz, Tripucka helped launch the expansion Charlotte Hornets franchise, leading the team with 22.6 points per game during the franchise's inaugural season.

Over his 10 seasons in the NBA, Tripucka scored 12,142 points (17.2 per game) with 2,703 rebounds and 2,090 assists while earning two All-Star game selections.

Inducted into the National Polish-American Hall of Fame in 2000, Tripucka also has been named the New Jersey Star-Ledger "New Jersey Boys' Basketball Player of the Century" and in 2008 was named to the "50 Greatest Pistons" team.

Tripucka will be honored at halftime of the Notre Dame - Georgia Tech game on February 1, 2020. The game is scheduled to tip off at 12 noon ET.

MIKE BREY, GLENN AND STACEY MURPHY HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH

20th Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 521-274 | ND Record: 422-222

In 19 full seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to over 400 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 114-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over three million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance and is midway through his one-year term as the president of the NABC. He has been inducted into the Delaware and George Washington Halls of Fame.

Glenn and Stacey Murphy Head Men's Basketball Coach Mike Brey has announced the addition of Cormac Ryan to the 2019-20 University of Notre Dame men's basketball roster. A 6-5 guard out of New York, New York, who spent his prep career at Milton Academy (Massachusetts), Ryan will sit out the 2019-20 season after transferring from Stanford.

"Cormac is the consummate all-around guard," Brey said. "He is the total package you look for in a player in terms of skills, basketball IQ and competitiveness. I am very excited to have him in our program and he will play a key role in our team's development as a practice player this season."

Ryan appeared in 24 games for Stanford in 2018-19, starting 17 contests (including the season opener) and finished with an 8.7 points-per-game average while leading the team with 49 three-point field goals. He also posted 83 rebounds (3.5 per game) and 45 assists (1.8 per game) while shooting .737 at the free throw line. Ryan scored 10 or more points 10 times during his freshman season, including 19 points against UCLA and 18 against Southern Cal.

"I'm fired up to be joining the Notre Dame family," Ryan said. "From the coaching staff to the guys on the team, I feel at home here and I can't wait to see what the future holds for us."

A consensus four-star prospect out of Milton Academy in Milton, Massachusetts, Ryan was a two-time New England Prep School Athletic Conference (NEP-SAC) Class A Player of the Year (2017, 2018). He scored 1,423 in three seasons at Milton, joining the team as a sophomore after playing his freshman season at Collegiate Prep in New York City.

Ryan will arrived on campus in August of 2019 for the start of the 2019-20 academic year at Notre Dame.

CREDENTIALS

- Media and NBA scouts wishing to cover Notre Dame home games in 2019-20 should apply for credentials at und.com/credentials.
- Credential requests are due **48 hours** before the posted tip time.
- Credentials will be issued on a game-by-game basis.
- Media space is limited and subject to availability.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS

- Throughout the season, Notre Dame student-athletes and coaches will be available at least one time per week before a designated practice time.
- Those opportunities will be communicated through Associate Athletics Communications Director Alan Wasielewski's media e-mail list serve. To be added to that list, or for special interview requests, you can contact Wasielewski at awasiele@nd.edu.
- All interviews with Notre Dame student-athlete or coaches must be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office.

GAME NOTES/STATISTICS/TEAM INFORMATION

- Updated team statistics, game notes, head shots and additional team information are available at und.com/pressbox.

GAME DAY PARKING

- Parking for all Notre Dame men's basketball games is free and open on a first-come first-served basis. Parking south of Notre Dame Stadium is recommended for easy access to the media entrance.

MEDIA ENTRANCE/CREDENTIAL WILL CALL

- Media Will Call will open two hours before the public game tip time.
- The University of Notre Dame has instituted a clear bag policy for fans attending events at men's and women's basketball games in 2018-19. This policy does not apply to credentialed media members covering the game.
- All credentialed media members must pick up credentials at Door 4 of Corbett Hall (the eastern-most building attached to Notre Dame Stadium. This is the same place at the media entrance for Notre Dame football games).
- All credentialed media will be required to enter Gate 1 of Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center.
- Media members attempting to enter any other gate of the Joyce Center will be redirected to Gate 1 for entrance.

MEDIA SEATING

- All non-live-broadcast media seating is located in the press box of Purcell Pavilion. For access to the press box, enter Gate 1, take the stairs, then enter the arena through the double doors leading to Section 109.
- The entrance to the press box is to the left (see map for further details).

PHOTOGRAPHER SEATING/WORK AREA

- Purcell Pavilion offers two areas for photographers and videographers to shoot the game from the baseline. Please check for your assigned photo position at Media Will Call (Gate 1) and in the Photo Work Room.
- Due to the relocation of working media to the upper press box, photographers are asked to utilize the Photo Work Room, located between the Gate 10 and Gate 1 entrances, for equipment storage and post game uploading.
- To access the Photo Work Room from Gate 1, enter Purcell

Pavilion through the doors on the first level, take the first right and the Photo Work Room will be on your left just past the tunnel access to courtside.

MEDIA MEAL

- A complimentary pre-game meal will be available for all credentialed media members starting 90 minutes before tip time.
- The meal will be located in Corbett Hall, in the Academic Commons Room, accessible through Door 4. This is the same location as media will call.
- The meal is only available before the game begins. Additional refreshments will be available in the press box during the game.

MEDIA WI-FI ACCESS

- Wi-Fi internet access is free throughout Purcell Pavilion. Sign on to the ND-guest network.

MEDIA LIVE STATISTICS

- The University of Notre Dame offers StatBroadcast for all of its men's basketball home games.
- The live statistics feed is accessible at und.com/mediastats (there is no password required).

POST GAME INTERVIEW POLICY

- Selected Notre Dame student-athletes will be brought to the Hammes Basketball Auditorium immediately following the completion of the game.
- The visiting head coach will follow the Notre Dame student-athletes, followed by Glenn and Stacey Murphy head men's basketball coach Mike Brey.
