BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH VS. BLUE HOSE

1	Notre Dame and Presbyterian College – located in Clinton, South Carolina, and a member of the Big South Conference – are meeting for the first time in men's basketball on Monday night.
2	After scoring a career-high 28 points with 16 rebounds against Marshall on Friday night, combined with his 18-point, 16-rebound effort earlier in the week against Howard, senior John Mooney becomes the first ACC player to post back-to-back games with 16 or more rebounds twice in a career since Tim Duncan in 1996-97. See page 2 for more details.
3	Notre Dame, in the midst of a six-game home stand at Purcell Pavilion has started 2019-20 with a 3-0 record at Purcell Pavilion with victories over Robert Morris, Howard and Marshall. The Irish will play eight of their first 10 games at home this season.
5	The Irish continue their tradition of 'defend without fouling' in 2019-20 - currently ranked fifth in the country in personal fouls per game (11.5). In the last decade, Notre Dame has finished the out of the top 10 in least amount of personal fouls per game just twice (11th in 2010-11, 15th in 2013-14) and led the country in the category in 2011-12, 2015-16 and 2018-19. 6	With nine of his 11 points in the second half against Marshall, sophomore Dane Goodwin has now scored in double figures in six of his last eight games played for the Irish dating back to late last season. That run includes the last three contests in 2019-20.
7	Presbyterian College represents the seventh time the Fighting Irish will take on a Big South opponent. Notre Dame is 4-2 all-time against the Big South, with three of those victories coming vs. Liberty.
12.5	Rebounds-per-game average for John Mooney , a mark that ranks him sixth in the country and leads the ACC as of November 17.
14	Notre Dame has won 14 of its last 15 in-season tournament games dating back to the 2016-17 season. That run of games includes the 2016 Legends Classic title and the 2017 Maui Invitational Championship. See page 5 and 6 for a complete history of Notre Dame for in-game tournaments. The Men Against Breast Cancer Invitational will conclude on Thursday against Toledo. Monday night's game with Presbyterian in not a part of the event.
24	With 28 points and 16 rebounds against Marshall, John Mooney recorded the 24th double-double of his career and first of the season. He is now tied at 19th all-time in Notre Dame history with current Phoenix Suns head coach Monty Williams – who also posted 24 in his career with the Irish from 1989-94.
200	Rex Pflueger and T.J. Gibbs have joined an exclusive Notre Dame men's basketball club. They are the 12th and 13th players since 1996-97 to post 200 assists and 100 steals in a career. Pflueger has 248 assists and 107 steals, while Gibbs has posted 293 assists and 107 steals.

NOTRE DAME VS. PRESBYTERIAN

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team (3-1) will play its first home game of the season outside of the Men Against Breast Cancer Invitational on Monday night when Presbyterian (1-2) makes its first visit to Purcell Pavilion (7 p.m. ET, ACC Network Extra).

- The Irish and Blue Hose will be meeting for the first time.
- A member of the Big South Conference, Presbyterian is 1-2 with a season-opening loss at Clemson (45-79), a victory at VMI in overtime (80-77) and a setback in the Blue Hose home opener against Morehead State (55-77).
- Presbyterian is coming off a historical season, as the Blue Hose earned a trip to the program's first Division I post season tournament, taking part in the CollegenInsider.com Postseason tournament in 2018-19. Presbyterian advanced to the quarterfinals of the tournament with wins over Seattle and Robert Morris.
- Presbyterian head coach Quinton Ferrell is in his first season – and first full season as a Division I head coach –after serving as an assistant at Presbyterian from 2007-12.
- Presbyterian College athletic teams are called the 'Blue Hose,' a reference that dates back to the early 1900s when local sportswriters referred to the team as the 'Blue Stockings' or 'Blue Hose' due to the distinctive blue socks they wore as part of their uniform. The school's official colors are garnet and blue and the school mascot is Scotty the Scotsman, a medieval Scottish warrior.

MOONEY REBOUNDING AT AN HISTORIC RATE

Senior John Mooney dominated on the front line during Notre Dame's two victories over Howard and Marshall last week, posting 18 points and 16 rebounds against the Bison, then following up with a career-high 28 points and 16 more rebounds against the Thundering Herd.

Coupled with his 16-rebound and 19-rebound efforts in back-to-back games last season against UNC (19 on 1/15/19) and NC State (16 on 1/19/19), Mooney becomes the first ACC player to post 16-or-more rebounds in back-to-back games multiple times in a career since Tim Duncan did it for Wake Forest in 1996-97 (Duncan did it three times that season).

Some other superlatives for Mooney's back-to-back 16 rebound performances -

- First Notre Dame player to do it since Jack Cooley in 2012-13 (16 vs. Villanova on 1/30/13; 16 at DePaul on 2/2/13).
- First ACC player to do it since Tyler Hansbrough in 2007-08 (21 vs. Florida State on 2/3/2008; 18 vs. Duke on 2/6/08).

FOUR MORE FIRST-TIME OPPONENTS IN 2019-20

The 2019-20 schedule welcomes four first-time opponents to Notre Dame's men's basketball schedule (Robert Morris (W, 92-57), Howard (W, 79-50), Presbyterian, Alabama A&M) matching the same number from last season (UIC, Radford, Oklahoma and Jacksonville).

Under Mike Brey, the Irish are 47-5 (.904) in games featuring first-time program meetings.

MOONEY POSTS DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN THREE OF FIRST FOUR GAMES

Senior forward John Mooney, who led all major conference players in rebounds per game in league action last season and was one of seven major conference players to average a double-double, is off to an even better pace in 2019-20.

The Orlando, Florida, native has posted three double-doubles in four games played this season. He paced the ACC with 20 in 33 games played last year (and 13 in conference play - the most since Tim Duncan in 1996-97) and is up to 24 total in his career (good for 19th on the all-time Notre Dame double-double list).

PFLUEGER JOINS 300-200-100 CLUB

Graduate student Rex Pflueger is one of just 10 players since 1996-97 (the year Notre Dame joined a conference) to compile 300 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals in a career.

The list of players who have reached the 300-200-100 plateau: Chris Thomas, Tory Jackson, David Graves, Jerian Grant, Chris Quinn, Eric Atkins, Steve Vasturia, Matt Carroll, Demetrius Jackson and Pflueger.

GIBBS CLOSING IN ON 1,000-300-200-100 CLUB

Senior T.J. Gibbs, who reached the 1,000-point career mark last season, is poised to join an exclusive club later this year. With 293 assists, Gibbs is going to reach at least 300 assists in his career which will push him above 1,000 points, 300 assists, 200 rebounds and 100 steals in his time at Notre Dame.

Only Chris Thomas, Jerian Grant, Chris Quinn, Eric Atkins, Steve Vasturia, Tory Jackson and Demetrius Jackson all reached those milestones under Mike Brey at Notre Dame.

GOODWIN SURGING IN THE BOXSCORE

Scoring nine points in the second half of the victory over Marshall, Dane Goodwin recorded his third consecutive double-digit scoring game of the season with a total of 11 points. That marks the second time in his career the sophomore has hit double-digits in three straight games, dating back to late in the 2018-19 season when he hit for double figures against Clemson, Pittsburgh and Georgia Tech.

Expand the run to include last season, Goodwin has scored in double figures in six of his last eight games played for the Irish.

LASZEWSKI WORKING HARD ON THE BACKBOARD

Off to a slow shooting start, sophomore Nate Laszewski had not let it effect the development of the rest of his game. As a rookie, Laszewski connected on 44 three pointers (the sixth-best for a freshman in school history) and averaged 3.9 rebounds per contest. This year, the Jupiter, Florida, native has grabbed at least four rebounds in each game and is currently second on the team in rebounding with a 6.3 average.

IRISH TRADITIONALLY AMONG BEST IN THE COUNTRY AT TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

Notre Dame finished third in the NCAA last season in turnovers per game – posting the fifth consecutive season of ranking in the nation's top-10 for least amount of turnovers in a game.

The Irish have not averaged over 10.0 turnovers per game since a 10.3 mark in 2013-14 (which was still good enough for 26th nationally).

A DECADE OF 'NO FOUL' CONTINUES

One of the mantras of Notre Dame basketball under Mike Brey has been to keep the amount of opponent foul shots down. Defend without fouling is a way of life for Irish basketball and the statistics bear out that trend.

In the last 10 years, Notre Dame has failed to finish among the top 10 in least amount of personal fouls committed just twice. They have also led the country in least amount of personal fouls three times. So far, in 2019-20, the Irish are fifth in the NCAA in least amount of fouls committed (11.5).

IRISH CONTROLLING ANNUAL HOME-AND-HOME SERIES IN CONFERENCE PLAY

Notre Dame finished off its four-game run through its annual home-and-home opponents in ACC play 3-1 in 2019-20 (then adding an ACC tournament win over the Yellow Jackets), pushing its record against Boston College and Georgia Tech to 19-5 in league play since joining the league in 2013-14. That mark is the best in the conference.

MIKE BREY, GLENN AND STACEY MURPHY HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH

20th Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 519-274 | ND Record: 420-222

In 19 full seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to 417 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 114-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over three million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance and is midway through his one-year term as the president of the NABC. He has been inducted into the Delaware and George Washington Halls of Fame.

Glenn and Stacey Murphy Head Men's Basketball Coach Mike Brey has announced the addition of Cormac Ryan to the 2019-20 University of Notre Dame men's basketball roster. A 6-5 guard out of New York, New York, who spent his prep career at Milton Academy (Massachusetts), Ryan will sit out the 2019-20 season after transferring from Stanford.

"Cormac is the consummate all-around guard," Brey said. "He is the total package you look for in a player in terms of skills, basketball IQ and competitiveness. I am very excited to have him in our program and he will play a key role in our team's development as a practice player this season."

Ryan appeared in 24 games for Stanford in 2018-19, starting 17 contests (including the season opener) and finished with an 8.7 points-per-game average while leading the team with 49 three-point field goals. He also posted 83 rebounds (3.5 per game) and 45 assists (1.8 per game) while shooting .737 at the free throw line. Ryan scored 10 or more points 10 times during his freshman season, including 19 points against UCLA and 18 against Southern Cal.

"I'm fired up to be joining the Notre Dame family," Ryan said. "From the coaching staff to the guys on the team, I feel at home here and I can't wait to see what the future holds for us."

A consensus four-star prospect out of Milton Academy in Milton, Massachusetts, Ryan was a two-time New England Prep School Athletic Conference (NEP-SAC) Class A Player of the Year (2017, 2018). He scored 1,423 in three seasons at Milton, joining the team as a sophomore after playing his freshman season at Collegiate Prep in New York City.

Ryan will arrive on campus in August of 2019 for the start of the 2019-20 academic year at Notre Dame.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS

- Throughout the season, Notre Dame student-athletes and coaches will be available at least one time per week before a designated practice time.
- Those opportunities will be communicated through Associate Athletics Communications Director Alan Wasielewski's media e-mail list serve. To be added to that list, or for special interview requests, you can contact Wasielewski at awasiele@nd.edu.
- All interviews with Notre Dame student-athlete or coaches must be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office.

GAME NOTES/STATISTICS/TEAM INFORMATION

- Updated team statistics, game notes, head shots and additional team information are available at und.com/pressbox.

GAME DAY PARKING

- Parking for all Notre Dame men's basketball games is free and open on a first-come first-served basis. Parking south of Notre Dame Stadium is recommended for easy access to the media entrance.

MEDIA ENTRANCE/CREDENTIAL WILL CALL

- Media Will Call will open two hours before the public game tip time.
- The University of Notre Dame has instituted a clear bag policy for fans attending events at men's and women's basketball games in 2018-19. This policy does not apply to credentialed media members covering the game.
- All credentialed media members must pick up credentials at Door 4 of Corbett Hall (the eastern-most building attached to Notre Dame Stadium. This is the same place at the media entrance for Notre Dame football games).
- All credentialed media will be required to enter Gate 1 of Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center.
- Media members attempting to enter any other gate of the Joyce Center will be redirected to Gate 1 for entrance.

MEDIA SEATING

- All non-live-broadcast media seating is located in the press box of Purcell Pavilion. For access to the press box, enter Gate 1, take the stairs, then enter the arena through the double doors leading to Section 109.
- The entrance to the press box is to the left (see map for further details).

PHOTOGRAPHER SEATING/WORK AREA

- Purcell Pavilion offers two areas for photographers and videographers to shoot the game from the baseline. Please check for your assigned photo position at Media Will Call (Gate 1) and in the Photo Work Room.
- Due to the relocation of working media to the upper press box, photographers are asked to utilize the Photo Work Room, located between the Gate 10 and Gate 1 entrances, for equipment storage and post game uploading.
- To access the Photo Work Room from Gate 1, enter Purcell

Pavilion through the doors on the first level, take the first right and the Photo Work Room will be on your left just past the tunnel access to courtside.

- A complimentary pre-game meal will be available for all credentialed media members starting 90 minutes before tip time.
- The meal will be located in Corbett Hall, in the Academic Commons Room, accessible through Door 4. This is the same location as media will call.
- The meal is only available before the game begins. Additional refreshments will be available in the press box during the game.
