### COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

512	With Notre Dame's 3-2 win over Penn State in last season's Big Ten Tournament championship game, head coach <b>Jeff Jackson</b> recorded his 500th career win. He now has 512 career wins, which ranks second among active NCAA DI head coaches (spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and 14+ seasons at Notre Dame).
58	Junior defenseman <b>Matt Hellickson</b> is leading the NCAA with 58 blocked shots this season, while senior defenseman <b>Tory Dello</b> ranks tied for second with 57.
14	A program-record 14 former Fighting Irish players have played in the NHL so far this season, including: <b>Anders Bjork</b> (Boston Bruins), <b>Ian Cole</b> (Colorado Avalanche), <b>Thomas Di Pauli</b> (Pittsburgh Penguins), <b>Steven Fogarty</b> (New York Rangers), <b>Dennis Gilbert</b> (Chicago Blackhawks), <b>Vinnie Hinostroza</b> (Arizona Coyotes), <b>Stephen Johns</b> (Dallas Stars), <b>Anders Lee</b> (New York Islanders), <b>Jordan Gross</b> (Arizona Coyotes), <b>Kyle Palmieri</b> (New Jersey Devils), <b>Andrew Peeke</b> (Columbus Blue Jackets), <b>Bryan Rust</b> (Pittsburgh Penguins) and <b>Riley Sheahan</b> (Edmonton Oilers) and <b>T.J. Tynan</b> (Colorado Avalanche).
13	Thirteen sets of brothers have suited up for the Irish, including current sets of brothers <b>Cal and Cam Burke</b> and <b>Matt and Alex Steeves</b> .
9	With a 37-save shutout against Penn State (Dec. 14) to close out the first semester, <b>Cale Morris</b> has nine career shutouts to rank fifth at Notre Dame behind <b>Steven Summerhays</b> (13), <b>David Brown</b> (12), <b>Jordan Pearce</b> (12) and <b>Cal Petersen</b> (11).
8	With the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history, each under <b>Jeff Jackson</b> (three regular-season).
6	With freshman <b>Trevor Janicke</b> joining the program, six father-son combinations have played for the Irish including Trevor and his father, <b>Curtis '93</b> , as well as sophomore <b>Graham Slaggert</b> and his father/Associate Head Coach <b>Andy Slaggert '89</b> .
4	Notre Dame has an active four-year NCAA tournament appearance streak, including Frozen Four appearances in 2017 and 2018, which is the longest streak in program history and is the fourth-longest active streak in the NCAA (the Irish have also appeared in seven of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments).
.937	In 12 career starts against Penn State, <b>Cale Morris</b> is 8-3-1 with a 2.67 goals against average and a .937 save percentage. Four of Morris' six highest single-game save totals have come against the Nittany Lions, including his career high total of 55 (at Penn State on Feb. 3, 2018).

**FOR STARTERS**

- The Irish enter the stretch run with a weekend road series at #8/9 Penn State (Jan. 31 & Feb. 1).
- Penn State (28 points) is tied with Michigan State for first in the league standings, while Notre Dame (23 points) sits in fourth entering the weekend.
- The top seed in the standings will receive a first round bye in the Big Ten Tournament, while seeds two, three and four will host best-of-three quarterfinal series.
- Last weekend, Notre Dame split a home series against Wisconsin, winning game two by the score of 5-2 (Jan. 25).
- Cale Morris made 35 saves in the win, while Alex Steeves led the offense, which went 3-for-7 seven on the power play, with a goal and three assists for a career-high four points.
- In eight games since Notre Dame returned from winter break with a Jan. 3 game against Western Michigan, Steeves has five goals and five assists for 10 points, which is tied for the fourth most points in the country over that span and ranks first among Big Ten skaters.
- Spencer Stastney had a pair of assists in both games versus the Badgers for a two-game point streak (0-4-4).
- Additional Irish skaters on point streaks (all two games) include Nate Clurman (0-2-2), Cal Burke (2-0-2) and Michael Graham (2-1-3).
- Freshman forward Max Ellis was the most recent Fighting Irish player to score a goal this season when he netted the game winner in Notre Dame's 3-0 victory over Penn State (Dec. 14), becoming Notre Dame's 17th goal scorer this season.
- The Fighting Irish have posted six comeback wins this season, including three third period comebacks (both wins over Ohio State and the overtime victory at Wisconsin)

and added a third period comeback tie (and shootout win) at Michigan State on Nov. 22.

- The Irish are 2-0-4 in overtime this season, with game-winning goals from Pierce Crawford (vs. Ohio State on Nov. 8) and Alex Steeves (at Wisconsin on Nov. 16).

**THE NOTRE DAME - PENN STATE SERIES**

- Notre Dame enters the weekend with an 9-5-2 all-time record/series lead against Penn State in games played while both teams were at the NCAA DI level (12-5-3 including games against Penn State 1983-85).
- Earlier this season, the teams split a series at the Compton Family Ice Arena with Penn State taking game one 4-2 (Dec. 13) before the Irish answered with a 3-0 game two (Dec. 14) win.
- Cale Morris had 37 saves in the game two shutout (the ninth of his career and his second against Penn State), while Max Ellis, Alex Steeves and Graham Slaggert scored the goals.
- Last season the teams met five times, culminating in Notre Dame's 3-2 win in the Big Ten Championship game on March 24, 2019.
- Spencer Stastney, Cal Burke and Cam Morrison (game winner) scored for the Irish in the championship game, while Morris made 46 saves en route to earning Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors for the second consecutive season.
- For Morrison, it marked his second consecutive Big Ten Championship game-winning goal after scoring the overtime game winner against Ohio State in 2018.
- The championship game win over Penn State marked the 500th career victory for head coach Jeff Jackson.
- Aside from the championship game, the teams split the regular-season series 2-2-0 with each team winning once at home and once on the road.
- In 2017-18, Notre Dame was undefeated in five contests against Penn State (4-0-1 and dating back to their inaugural season in the conference, the Irish boast a 8-3-1 record against Penn State over the past three seasons while skating in the same conference.
- In the 2018 Big Ten Tournament semifinals at the Compton Family Ice Arena, Jack Jenkins netted the game winner with 31 seconds left in regulation for a 3-2 win, propelling the Irish to the championship and sparking their "cardiac kids" run where they won five straight games by scoring the game-winner in the final minute of regulation or in overtime.
- Notre Dame's career offensive leaders against Penn State include Matt Hellickson (12 GP, 2-9-11), Cal Burke (14 GP, 3-5-8), Mike O'Leary (14 GP, 3-5-8) and Cam Morrison (14 GP, 4-2-6).
- In net, Cale Morris is 8-3-1 in 12 career starts against Penn State with a 2.67 goals against average and a .937 save percentage.

- For the second consecutive season, Cal Burke has been named a nominee for the Hockey Humanitarian Award, which was announced by The Hockey Humanitarian Foundation (Jan. 13).
- The award is presented annually to college hockey's finest citizen — a student-athlete who makes significant contributions not only to his or her team but also to the community-at-large through leadership in volunteerism.
- Burke, a senior captain, is one of 13 nominees across all of college hockey (men's and women's).
- One of the leaders in regards to the team's involvement with the Fighting Irish Fight for Life program, Burke is also a member of Notre Dame's Student Athlete Advisory Council.
- The Boxborough, Massachusetts, native also serves on a mental health sub-group within the SAAC, working to reduce the stigma around mental health and help seeking and he helped develop and launch the Irish Strong Initiative.
- A season ago, Burke earned the Compton Family Leadership in Service Award and was Notre Dame's 2019 Big Ten Sportsmanship honoree.
- Finalists for the 2020 Hockey Humanitarian Award will be announced in February.
- The 2020 recipient will be honored in a ceremony on Friday, April 10th as part of the NCAA Men's Frozen Four weekend in Detroit, Michigan.
- The group of nominees includes nine seniors, three juniors and one sophomore, along with nine male (4 Div. I) and four female (1 Div. I) candidates.

**PIVONKA & STASTNEY ON TEAM USA**

- Sophomore center Jake Pivonka and sophomore defenseman Spencer Stastney skated with Team USA at the 2020 IIHF World Junior Hockey Championship in Ostrava and Trinec, Czech Republic (Dec. 26, 2019 - Jan. 5, 2020).
- Each Irish player appeared in all four preliminary games as Team USA went 2-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) to advance to the quarterfinals.
- Both players also played in Team USA's quarterfinal loss to Finland (Jan. 2).
- Pivonka finished with an assist, while Stastney has been skating with Wisconsin's K'Andre Miller as one of Team USA's top defenseman pairings.
- In addition, Notre Dame's Director of Hockey Operations, Nick Siergiej, served in a similar role for Team USA at this season's tournament.
- Dating back to 1997, twenty-two Notre Dame players have now taken part in the IIHF World Junior Championships.
- Current Columbus Blue Jackets defenseman Andrew Peeke was the most recent Irish player to make Team USA's World Junior Championship roster (2018).
- Current Boston Bruins forward Anders Bjork was the most recent Irish player to earn a medal at the event when Team USA secured the bronze in Helsinki (2016).
- Notre Dame's other medalists include Mario Lucia (gold in 2013), Kyle Palmieri (gold in 2010 and bronze in 2011), Kyle Lawson (bronze in 2007) and Ben Simon (silver in 1997).

**THREE GOALS THE KEY TO VICTORY**

- Over the past two seasons, the Irish are 27-1-2 when scoring at least three goals.
- In 2019-20, the Irish are 9-1-1 when scoring at least three times, with the tie coming at Ohio State (Jan. 17) and the loss coming at home against Wisconsin (Jan. 24).

- In 2018-19, Notre Dame went 17-0-1 when scoring three or more goals.
- The lone tie in 2018-19 came when Notre Dame opened the season on Oct. 12 against Mercyhurst in the Ice Breaker – a game that ended knotted at 6-6 before Notre Dame won the shootout to advance to the championship game.

## FAST START

- Notre Dame's unbeaten streak to open the 2019-20 season was snapped at eight games (7-0-1), which marked the best unbeaten streak to start a season in program history.
- The subsequent 8-1-1 start by the Irish was the best start since also opening with an 8-1-1 record in 2006-07 (finished 32-7-3).
- On Nov. 8-9, the Irish swept a pair of tightly contested games with Ohio State by erasing one-goal, third period deficits in both games: winning game one 3-2 in overtime and game two 2-1.
- It marked Notre Dame's first sweep of a top-10 opponent since Nov. 24-25, 2017 when the Irish topped sixth-ranked Minnesota 1-0 and 5-2.

## OF NCAA NOTE

- Notre Dame is coming off a program-best fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA tournament in 2018-19, which is also the fourth-longest active NCAA appearance streak.
- The Fighting Irish advanced to a regional final for the third consecutive season in 2019, having won regional final games in 2017 and 2018 to advance to back-to-back Frozen Fours.
- Notre Dame is one of three teams to make it to the NCAA Regional Finals in each of the last three seasons, joining Denver and Minnesota Duluth.
- The Fighting Irish have made seven of the last 10 NCAA tournaments, tied for the third most in the NCAA.

## FAMILY TIES

- The 2019-20 Notre Dame roster features two sets of brothers, Cal and Cam Burke and Matt and Alex Steeves.
- They are the 12th and 13th sets of brothers to skate together at Notre Dame and the first since Ben (2008-11) and Andy Ryan (2012-16).
- Junior goaltender Dylan St. Cyr is the son of Son of Gerry St. Cyr, who played five seasons of professional hockey including the AHL's New Haven Senators and Manon Rheaume, who played goaltender for Canada at the 1998 Olympic Winter Games and in several world championships and who was the first woman to appear in an NHL pre-season game when she skated for the Tampa Bay Lightning in 1992.
- Sophomore forward and South Bend native, Graham Slaggert, joins his father Andy Slaggert who serves as Associate Head Coach and former star for the Irish.
- The Slaggerts were the fifth father-son duo to suit up for Notre Dame.
- Sophomore forward Jake Pivonka is the son of Czech Republic native and former NHL player Michael Pivonka who played over 800 games with the Washington Capitals (1986-99).
- Freshman forward Trevor Janicke is the son of Curtis Janicke, who played for the Irish from 1989-93, appearing in 125 games while scoring 46 goals and adding 98 assists 144 points.
- Trevor and Curtis are now the sixth father-son duo to play for the Irish.
- Freshman forward Solag Bakich is the son of Huntley Bakich, who was a linebacker for the Fighting Irish football team during the Lou Holtz era.

## IRISH IN THE NHL

- A program-record 14 former Notre Dame players have played in the NHL so far this season, including: Anders Bjork (Boston Bruins), Ian Cole (Colorado Avalanche), Thomas Di Pauli (Pittsburgh Penguins), Steven Fogarty (New York Rangers), Dennis Gilbert (Chicago Blackhawks), Jordan Gross (Arizona Coyotes), Vinnie Hinostroza (Arizona Coyotes), Stephen Johns (Dallas Stars), Anders Lee (New York Islanders), Kyle Palmieri (New Jersey Devils), Andrew Peeke (Columbus Blue Jackets), Bryan Rust (Pittsburgh Penguins), Riley Sheahan (Edmonton Oilers) and T.J. Tynan (Colorado Avalanche).
- Peeke made his NHL debut on Dec. 5 to become head coach Jeff Jackson's 21st Notre Dame player to reach the NHL and the program's 35th overall NHLer.
- Then on Dec. 22 Gross made his NHL debut against the Red Wings and recorded an assist as he pushed Jackson's total to 22 and the program total to 36.
- Di Pauli became the third former Irish player to make his NHL debut on Jan. 5 when Pittsburgh played at Montreal -- Jackson's 23rd ND player to reach the NHL and the program's 37th.
- Johns returned to the Stars lineup On Jan. 18 after missing almost two years with an injury.
- Lee signed a seven-year, \$49 million contract to stay in New York this past summer and is in his second season serving at the Islanders' captain.
- A 2019 and now 2020 NHL All-Star, Palmieri has notched a hat trick for the Devils this season.
- Palmieri is one of three Notre Dame hockey players to be selected in the first round of the NHL Draft, joining Cole and Sheahan.
- Rust, a two-time Stanley Cup Champion with the Pittsburgh Penguins, has a career-high 21 goals and 22 assists for a career-high 43 points in 35 games at the All-Star break (as of Jan. 21).
- Cole is in the midst of his second season with the Colorado Avalanche after posting 15 points (2G, 13A) in 71 games last season he is ahead of that pace this season with four goals and 19 assists for 23 points in 44 games (as of Jan. 21).
- Hinostroza is in his second season with the Arizona Coyotes after posting career-highs in goals (16), assists (23) and points (39) a season ago.
- Sheahan is playing his first season with the Edmonton Oilers in what is his ninth NHL season and he posted his first career four-point game on Jan. 18 with a goal and three assists.
- After battling back from two injury plagued seasons, Bjork was recalled by Boston in the middle of October and has seen extensive time on the Bruins' second and third lines.
- Gilbert has worked his way into the Blackhawks lineup, playing in 20 games while scoring his first career goal and adding three assists (as of Jan. 21).
- Tynan was recalled and made his Avalanche debut on Nov. 7 and played 14 games before being returned to the AHL.
- In total, 36 former Irish players have seen ice time in the NHL, 22 of whom played at Notre Dame under current head coach Jeff Jackson.

## PRO IRISH WEARING THE "C"

- While Cal Burke has been named the captain for Notre Dame this season, Irish alums in the professional ranks are also picking up the honor and responsibility of wearing the "C" in 2019-20.
- Anders Lee, who captained the Irish in 2012-13, is in his second season serving as captain of the New York Islanders.
- Steven Fogarty, who was a two-year captain at Notre Dame in 2014-15 and 2015-16, was named the captain of the Hartford Wolfpack AHL to start the 2019-20 season.
- Sam Herr, an alternate captain with the Irish in 2015-16, was named the Nottingham Panthers' (EHL) for the 2019-20 season.
- Bo Brauer, a 2018 Notre Dame graduate, was named captain of the Worcester Railers (ECHL) to start the 2019-20 season as well.

**HEAD COACH  
JEFF JACKSON**



- The 2019-20 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson's 15th season behind the Irish bench.
- The highly regarded Jackson now has over 30 years of coaching experience and is coming off back-to-back Big Ten championship seasons while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 14 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is the only coach to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 15 seasons.
- Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson era began in 2005 when the University searched for a coach who could move the program among the elite hockey schools in the country.
- Jackson's Notre Dame teams have made 10 trips to the NCAA Championship (2007-09, 2011, 2013-14, 2016-19), advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- Under Jackson, Notre Dame has become one of the nation's top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- The Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006-07 and 2008-09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team's first season in the Big Ten (2017-18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018-19).
- Jackson's success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson's arrival, the Irish have had 35 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft, including three first round selections. In that same span, 24 players from USA Hockey's National Team

- In addition, 21 of Jackson's Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2019-20 season with a 20-year collegiate record of 501-243-82 for a .656 winning percentage, the second-highest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2019-20).
- Entering the 2019-20 season, Jackson's 501 career wins ranked tied for 12th all-time in Division I and second among active coaches.
