BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH VS HOKIES

<b>1</b>	Notre Dame leads the country in least amount of fouls committed per game (12.5).
<b>1</b>	Notre Dame leads the country in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.70. The Irish are ahead of BYU (1.60) and Belmont (1.55). Notre Dame has 495 assists this season compared to just 291 turnovers.
<b>1</b>	Senior <b>John Mooney</b> leads the nation with 25 double-doubles this season (in 29 games) ahead of William & Mary's Nathan Knight (22 in 31 games) as of Friday, March 6.
<b>2</b>	Notre Dame is second in the country in least amount of turnovers committed per game (9.7), behind Liberty (9.5) and ahead of St. Mary's (CA) (9.8).
<b>2</b>	<b>John Mooney</b> is second in the nation and leads all major conference players in rebounds-per-game with a 12.8 average. Mooney has recorded double-doubles in 25 of 29 games played this season. He is the only player in Division I averaging 16-plus points and 12-plus rebounds per game this season.
<b>10</b>	A victory on Senior Day against Virginia Tech on Saturday would push the Irish to .500 in the ACC and provide the 10th conference victory of the season. Finishing 10-10 would mark the fourth time in seven ACC seasons the Irish will finish the conference slate with 10 or more wins, joining Duke, UNC, Virginia, Syracuse, Louisville, Miami and Virginia Tech as the only ACC teams with four seasons of 10 or more wins since 2013-14.
<b>13</b>	Notre Dame and Virginia Tech will be meeting for the 13th time, with the Irish holding an 8-4 advantage in the series. Notre Dame is 3-2 against Virginia Tech in Purcell Pavilion and 4-3 against the Hokies as ACC regular-season opponents.
<b>16</b>	Since 1997-98 <b>John Mooney</b> is the only ACC player with 13 or more double-doubles in league play in consecutive seasons (or over any two seasons). Mooney had 13 double-doubles in the ACC last season and has followed up with an ACC record 16 so far in 2019-20.
<b>16.5</b>	Notre Dame is currently ninth in the country and first in the ACC for assists per game with a 16.5 average. The Irish have posted seven games this season with over 20 team assists (22 vs. Howard, 24 vs. FDU, school-record tying 33 vs. Detroit Mercy, 23 vs. Alabama A&M, 26 at Syracuse, 23 vs. Syracuse, 21 vs. Miami).
<b>20</b>	With 25 double-doubles so far this season – and finishing 2018-19 with 20 total – <b>John Mooney</b> joins Tim Duncan and Sheldon Williams as the only ACC players to post consecutive seasons with 20 or more double-doubles in the past 25 years. Since 1996-97, Mooney joins Angel Delgado, Jordan Murphy, Emeka Okafor, Josh Hawkinson and Williams as the only major conference players with multiple seasons of 20 or more double-doubles.
<b>56%</b>	Shooting percentage in ACC competition this season for <b>Juwan Durham</b> (.568), which would place him second on the Notre Dame single-season list (minimum of 50 attempts). Currently he is behind of Zach Auguste (.570 in 2014-15) and tied with Martinas Geben (.568 in 2017-18).
<b>86%</b>	Percentage of double-doubles in games played this season for <b>John Mooney</b> (25 of 29, .862). That percentage is the best in the country and threatens Blake Griffin from Oklahoma (30 of 35, .857) and Kenny Adeleke (Hartford, 24 of 28, .857) for the highest percentage in Division I over the past 20 years.
<b>139</b>	Career games played by graduate student <b>Rex Pflueger</b> , matching the school-record held by <b>Pat Connaughton</b> (2011-15) Pflueger is tied for seventh in the country for active players in games played. The Dana Point, California, will set a new mark for games played at Notre Dame on Senior Day Saturday afternoon against Virginia Tech.
<b>1898</b>	Total victories in the history of Notre Dame men's basketball, as the Irish close in on becoming the eighth program to reach 1,900 victories (Kentucky, Kansas, North Carolina, Duke, Temple, Syracuse and UCLA have all reached that plateau). The Irish were 12th all-time in college basketball victories when <b>Mike Brey</b> took over the program in 2000-01 – they have since passed Oregon State, Pennsylvania, St. John's and Indiana on the all-time wins list into eighth place.
<b>4084</b>	Career minutes played by <b>T.J. Gibbs</b> , becoming the seventh player in Notre Dame men's basketball history to reach 4,000 minutes played.

## NOTRE DAME VS VIRGINIA TECH

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team completes the 2019-20 regular season on Saturday afternoon (2 p.m., ACC Network) against Virginia Tech (16-14, 7-12) as the Irish honor the senior class of T.J. Gibbs, John Mooney and Rex Pflueger.

- Notre Dame and Virginia Tech are meeting for the 13th time on Saturday afternoon with the Irish leading the all-time series 8-4. The Hokies won the last two meetings between the two teams last season, including a victory in Purcell Pavilion.
- The Irish are 3-2 in Purcell Pavilion against Virginia Tech and 5-3 against the Hokies in ACC play.
- The Notre Dame - Virginia Tech series has two noteworthy Irish victories as part of its history. On Feb. 24, 2001, an 85-61 victory for the Irish earned the program's first-ever conference regular-season title, as No. 18/18 Notre Dame claimed the BIG EAST West Division title. In the 2018 ACC Championship, Notre Dame recorded its greatest second-half comeback ever (down 21 points) to defeat Virginia Tech 71-65 behind 22 points from Matt Farrell.
- The first meeting between Notre Dame and Virginia Tech occurred in the 1973 NIT Championship game in Madison Square Garden. In a time when the NCAA tournament only featured 25 teams, the NIT Championship was earned by the Hokies over Digger Phelps' second Notre Dame team on a last-second shot in overtime by VT's Bobby Stevens.

**SENIOR SUPERLATIVES**

The 2019-20 Senior Class will be honored before Saturday's game with Virginia Tech. Rex Pflueger, T.J. Gibbs and John Mooney will be playing their final regular-season home game in Purcell Pavilion.

**PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTED BY 1,000 POINT SCORERS**

Notre Dame has produced 64 1,000 point scorers throughout the history of the program with 23 of those players reaching that statistical milestone during the Mike Brey era (2000-01 - current). Of the 85 players who have suited up for Notre Dame under Mike Brey, 36 of them were recruited by the staff and exhausted their eligibility with the Irish – 20 of those players have scored more than 1,000 points in a career.

Since 2000-01, Notre Dame leads all ACC teams in 1,000 point scorers (23) and is second in the country over that time frame to Villanova.

**MOONEY, PFLUEGER EARN ALL-ACC ACADEMIC HONORS**

Senior John Mooney and graduate student Rex Pflueger were named to the 2020 All-ACC Academic Team, as announced by the conference earlier this week.

Minimum academic requirements for selection to the All-ACC Academic Team are a 3.0 grade point average for the previous semester and a 3.0 cumulative average during one's academic career. Athletic achievements during the most recent season are also considered in selecting the All-ACC Academic Team.

Pflueger earns the honor for the third time in his career. The 2019 Notre Dame graduate is earning an accelerated MBA from the Mendoza College of Business this season with a focus in business leadership strategy. Mooney has been named to the team for the first time in his Notre Dame career and will graduate in May with a management consulting degree from the Mendoza College of Business.

### BY THE NUMBERS: JOHN MOONEY

<b>1</b>	Mooney leads the nation in double-doubles (25 in 29 games).
<b>1</b>	Mooney is the only ACC player averaging a double-double (16.8 ppg, 12.8 rpg) and is one of just eight major conference Division I players to average a double-double.
<b>2</b>	With 30 double-doubles in ACC play in his career, Mooney needs just one more to match Travis Watson (UVA) for the most in a career since Tim Duncan's 39 from 1993-97.
<b>4</b>	Only four Notre Dame players have pulled down 700 rebounds in their final two seasons with the Irish – Tom Hawkins (1957-59, 834), Collis Jones (1969-71, 741), Mooney (208-20, 729) and Walt Sahn (1963-65, 708).
<b>5</b>	With 543 rebounds in ACC action, Mooney ranks fifth among all ACC players since 1996-97 in total rebounds. See page 6 for more details.
<b>10</b>	With 900 career rebounds, Mooney is 10th on the Notre Dame career list and is the ninth Irish player to reach the 900-rebound statistical plateau.
<b>12</b>	From Nov. 26, 2019 through Jan. 22, 2020, Mooney posted 12 consecutive double-doubles to set the school mark. With his fifth consecutive double-double against FSU on Wednesday, he matches Walt Sahn as the only Notre Dame player to win four double-double streaks running five or more games.
<b>12.3</b>	Mooney's rebound average in ACC games this season, which would rank as the third-best since 1988. Tim Duncan averaged 14.9 rebounds per ACC game in 1996-97, while Mooney's average in 2018-19 was 12.6.
<b>12.8</b>	Mooney is second in the nation in rebounds-per-game with a 12.8 average. The closest major conference player to Mooney's average is Minnesota's Daniel Orturu (11.6).
<b>14.2</b>	Mooney's rebounds-per-40-minute career average is the best for a Notre Dame player since 1996-97. He is ahead of Jack Cooley (13.0), Luke Harangody (13.0), current Irish assistant coach Ryan Humphrey (12.1) and Zach Auguste (12.1).
<b>16</b>	Mooney's single-season ACC record for double-double in league play, besting the 15 by Tim Duncan in 1995-96. He joins Duncan, Shelden Williams (Duke) and Travis Watson (UVA) as the only ACC players to have multiple seasons with 10 or more double-doubles in conference play since 1995-96.
<b>20</b>	With 20 double-doubles last season and 25 this season, Mooney is the first Notre Dame player to boast two seasons with 20 or more double-doubles in a career.
<b>25</b>	With 25 double-doubles so far this season – and finishing 2018-19 with 20 total – Mooney joins Tim Duncan and Sheldon Williams as the only ACC players to post consecutive seasons with 20 or more double-doubles in the past 25 years. Since 1996-97, Mooney joins Angel Delgado, Jordan Murphy, Emeka Okafor, Josh Hawkins and Williams as the only major conference players with multiple seasons of 20 or more double-doubles.
<b>29</b>	Mooney is the first ACC player to post consecutive seasons with 13 or more double-doubles in league play. His 29 double-doubles in two seasons are the most for an ACC player over a two-year stretch since Tim Duncan had 26 combined in 1995-96 and 1996-97.
<b>45</b>	Double-doubles in the past two years – the most in Division I over that stretch. Bethune Cookman's Cletrell Pope is the closest player with 39, while Xavier's Tyrique Jones is the closest major conference player with 30.
<b>46</b>	Double-doubles in his career, fourth on the Notre Dame career list (see sidebar, page 4).
<b>67%</b>	Mooney has posted a double-double in 46 of his 69 career starts – a .667 average that is the best in the history of Notre Dame basketball. Of active Division I players, only Cletrell Pope (39 double-doubles in 49 career games, .796 average) boasts a higher average of double-doubles/starts. Since 1996-97, Mooney is second only to Drew Gooden (Kansas, 1999-2002, .688) of major conference players double-double/starts percentage (see more on page 5).
<b>86%</b>	Percentage of double-doubles in games played this season for <b>John Mooney</b> (25 of 29, .862). That percentage is the best in the country and threatens Blake Griffin from Oklahoma (30 of 35, .857) and Kenny Adeleke (Hartford, 24 of 28, .857) for the highest percentage in Division I over the past 20 years.
<b>200</b>	Mooney reached the 200-rebound plateau this season in just 15 games, the quickest major conference player to reach 200 rebounds in a season since Tim Duncan in 1996-97 (14 games) and Blake Griffin in 2008-09 (15 games)
<b>237</b>	With 237 rebounds in ACC play this season, Mooney needs two more rebounds to move past Tim Duncan's ACC record for total rebounds in a season from the 1996-97 season.
<b>740</b>	Mooney has pulled down 740 rebounds over the past two seasons, the most of any major conference player and over 100 rebounds more than the second-ranked player (Colorado's Tyler Bey with 618).

Senior forward John Mooney is second in the nation in rebounds per game with a 12.8 average. Mooney is the only Division I player in the country averaging 16-plus points and 12-plus rebounds per game (as of March 2, 2020).

### HUBB POSTS EIGHT 20-POINT GAMES IN 2019-20

Sophomore Prentiss Hubb has logged a team-high eight 20-point games this season for the Irish. His eight 20-point performances are the tied for the fourth-most for a sophomore during the Mike Brey era behind Luke Harangody (18), Chris Thomas (15), T.J. Gibbs (9) and Tim Abromaitis (8).

Seven of Hubb's eight 20-point games have come against ACC opponents. Of the 14 players with multiple 20-point games against the ACC, Hubb ranks fifth behind T.J. Gibbs (11), Bonzie Colson (10), V.J. Beachem (8) and John Mooney (8).

### DURHAM POSTS TWO NOTEWORTHY DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Senior Juwan Durham responded to the loss of John Mooney (illness) on the front line against Presbyterian with 11 points, 15 rebounds and four blocked shots to record his second career double-double. He followed up with 12 points, 11 rebounds and four more blocks against Fairleigh Dickinson. It was just the seventh and eighth time a Mike Brey era player has recorded 10+ points, 10+ rebounds and 4+ blocks - and the first time since John Mooney did it at North Carolina last season.

Others who have accomplished such a double-double include current Irish assistant coach Ryan Humphrey (2001), Torin Francis twice (2003, 2004), Luke Harangody (2008) and Bonzie Colson (2017).



**DURHAM ALREADY AMONG TOP SHOT BLOCKERS IN NOTRE DAME HISTORY**

Blocked shots are one of the youngest official NCAA official statistics, only becoming a part of the game boxscore for the 1985-86 season. With that in mind, it is still noteworthy that senior Juwan Durham (who still retains a year of eligibility after 2019-20) has already established himself as one of the top shot blockers in Notre Dame history.

In his first full season at Notre Dame in 2018-19, Durham swatted 63 shots which ranks fifth on the Notre Dame single-season blocked shots list.

This season, Durham pushed his career blocked-shot average to 2.2 and is one of just three Notre Dame players to average over 2.0 blocks per game in their career:

Durham's 127 total blocks at Notre Dame currently rank him sixth all-time (see sidebar, page 8). Jordan Cornette is the Notre Dame blocked shots record holder with 201 from 2001-05.

**A DECADE OF 'NO FOUL' CONTINUES**

One of the mantras of Notre Dame basketball under Mike Brey has been to keep the amount of opponent foul shots down. Defend without fouling is a way of life for Irish basketball and the statistics bear out that trend.

In the last 10 years, Notre Dame has failed to finish among the top 10 in least amount of personal fouls committed just twice. They have also led the country in least amount of personal fouls three times.

The NCAA has been tracking the least amount of fouls committed in a season since 1993. Notre Dame is the only team since 1993 to lead the country in least amount of fouls more than twice (four times) and are on pace to make it five times this season.

## MIKE BREY, GLENN AND STACEY MURPHY HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH

20th Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 534-285 | ND Record: 435-233

In 19 full seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to over 430 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 114-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over three million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance and is midway through his one-year term as the president of the NABC. He has been inducted into the Delaware and George Washington Halls of Fame.

### 2018-19

- Battled against the athletic front court at UCLA (12/8/18) to post his fifth double-double of the season with 12 points and 11 rebounds in 29 minutes.

Started the game by pulling down the first defensive rebound of the game, then grabbing four offensive rebounds on Notre Dame's first offensive possession. - Keyed Notre Dame's late game run to seize the victory over Duquesne, ending up scoring 14 of his game-high 16 points in the final 20 minutes and recording his third consecutive double-double (10 rebounds). Performance earned him the 2018 Gotham Classic Showcase Game Most Outstanding Player Award.
- Kept Notre Dame in the game with Radford (11/14/18) by turning in a career-best performance scoring 24 points with 12 rebounds (both career-highs) and logging the second double-double of his career. Also connected on six three pointers (hitting his first five of the game).
- Became the 11th Mike Brey era player to connect on six or more 3FGs in a single game multiple times against Radford (11/14/18) - and the tallest of the 11 players to do so.

Glenn and Stacey Murphy Head Men's Basketball Coach Mike Brey has announced the addition of Cormac Ryan to the 2019-20 University of Notre Dame men's basketball roster. A 6-5 guard out of New York, New York, who spent his prep career at Milton Academy (Massachusetts), Ryan will sit out the 2019-20 season after transferring from Stanford.

"Cormac is the consummate all-around guard," Brey said. "He is the total package you look for in a player in terms of skills, basketball IQ and competitiveness. I am very excited to have him in our program and he will play a key role in our team's development as a practice player this season."

Ryan appeared in 24 games for Stanford in 2018-19, starting 17 contests (including the season opener) and finished with an 8.7 points-per-game average while leading the team with 49 three-point field goals. He also posted 83 rebounds (3.5 per game) and 45 assists (1.8 per game) while shooting .737 at the free throw line. Ryan scored 10 or more points 10 times during his freshman season, including 19 points against UCLA and 18 against Southern Cal.

"I'm fired up to be joining the Notre Dame family," Ryan said. "From the coaching staff to the guys on the team, I feel at home here and I can't wait to see what the future holds for us."

A consensus four-star prospect out of Milton Academy in Milton, Massachusetts, Ryan was a two-time New England Prep School Athletic Conference (NEP-SAC) Class A Player of the Year (2017, 2018). He scored 1,423 in three seasons at Milton, joining the team as a sophomore after playing his freshman season at Collegiate Prep in New York City.

Ryan will arrive on campus in August of 2019 for the start of the 2019-20 academic year at Notre Dame and has enrolled in the Mendoza College of Business.
