

#### Miscellaneous:

Coin Toss: Defensive lineman Ade Ogundeji represented the Irish in the coin toss. Georgia Tech won the toss and elected to defer to the second half. The Irish received the opening kick and Georgia Tech defended the north end zone.

#### **TEAM NOTES:**

- WITH THE WIN...
- The Irish have the longest-active winning streak in the FBS at 12 games.
- Notre Dame improved to 29-6-1 in the all-time series with Georgia Tech.
- Notre Dame has started the season 6-0 for the fourth time under head coach Brian Kelly.
- With just 13 points allowed today, the defense has yielded just 10.3 points per game through the first six games of the season [62 total].
- Notre Dame has now held 31-of-32 opponents to 30 or fewer points in the Clark Lea era.
- Entering the game, Notre Dame was averaging 34:11 time of possession, a figure which led the ACC. Today, the Irish posted 36:54 minutes, controlling the ball for 12:13 in the first quarter alone.
- Through Saturday, the Irish have only trailed for 19:47 total minutes this season out of a total 360:00 minutes.
- At Georgia Tech, Notre Dame was 10-of-15 on third downs. Entering Saturday, the Irish led the  $\bar{A}CC$  in third-down conversion rate at 52.2.
- Saturday, the Irish sacked Georgia Tech a total of 5.0 times. Entering the game, Georgia Tech had allowed just 1.67 sacks per game (10 total).
- Georgia Tech returned a Notre Dame fumble 93 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. The last time an opposing team returned an Irish fumble for a touchdown was in 2019 (vs. Virginia Tech, 98 yards).

### **OFFENSIVE NOTES:**

- Quarterback Ian Book hit wide receiver Joe Wilkins Jr., on an eight-yard dart for a touchdown on Notre Dame's opening drive, which ate up 8:38 on the clock and took 15 plays for 81 yards. The scoring drive was Notre Dame's most time-consuming scoring drive of the season thus far.
- The opening drive also marked the Irish's third 15-play scoring drive of the year.
- The touchdown for Wilkins Jr. was the first of his career.
- Book was 7-for-7 on the opening drive, completing passes to five different receivers.
- Running back Kyren Williams rushed for Notre Dame's second score of the day, pushing two yards into the end zone in the second quarter. He also scored Notre Dame's third TD of the game, a four-yard rush, on the Irish's opening drive of the second half. It marked Williams' third multi-TD game of the season (previously vs. Duke, vs. Florida State).
- Running back C'Bo Flemister posted Notre Dame's fourth touchdown of the day on a three-yard rush in the fourth quarter. It marked Flemister's third touchdown of the season and eighth of his career.

#### **DEFENSIVE NOTES:**

- The Irish defense went eight total quarters without giving up a touchdown, beginning with the fourth quarter vs. Louisville, and ending in the fourth quarter at Georgia Tech.
- Defensive lineman Daelin Hayes totaled two sacks and two forced fumbles at Georgia Tech, both career-high single-game marks for the graduate student.
- With Georgia Tech at Notre Dame's 27-yard line in the third quarter, Hayes strip-sacked QB Jeff Sims, Hayes' first forced fumble since 2016 (NC State).

- Senior DL Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa recovered the fumble, the second fumble recovery of his career. (first came in 2019 vs. Virginia).
  Safety Shaun Crawford posted his first sack of the season on a third down in the third quarter to force a field goal attempt, which Georgia Tech missed. The sack brings Crawford's career total to 2.5.
