COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

516	Head coach Jeff Jackson has 516 career wins, which ranks second among active NCAA Division I head coaches, spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and 15+ seasons at Notre Dame. Jackson's win total also ranks 12th all-time (George Gwozdecky ranks 11th with 526 career wins).
119	Seniors Matt Hellickson and Colin Theisen have each played 119 consecutive games, dating back to their first game of their freshman season. The 119 games played are the most by any active Big Ten players.
16	A program-record 16 former Fighting Irish players played in the NHL during the 2019-20 season (team played with in 2019-20): Anders Bjork (Boston Bruins), Ian Cole (Colorado Avalanche), Thomas Di Pauli (Pittsburgh Penguins), Jake Evans (Montreal Canadiens), Steven Fogarty (New York Rangers), Dennis Gilbert (Chicago Blackhawks), Winnie Hinostroza (Arizona Coyotes), Stephen Johns (Dallas Stars), Anders Lee (New York Islanders), Jordan Gross (Arizona Coyotes), Kyle Palmieri (New Jersey Devils), Andrew Peeke (Columbus Blue Jackets), Cal Petersen (Los Angeles Kings), Bryan Rust (Pittsburgh Penguins), Riley Sheahan (Edmonton Oilers) and T.J. Tynan (Colorado Avalanche).
15	Fifteen sets of brothers have now suited up for the Irish, including current players Cam Burke (brother Cal graduated in 2020), Matt and Alex Steeves , Graham and Landon Slaggert and Brady Bjork (brother Anders played 2014-17).
10	Senior defenseman Matt Hellickson has 10 career points against the Wolverines, including four of his 12 career goals (33%). All told, he has played in 13 games against Michigan, totaling four goals and six assists.
8	With the most recent being the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history - each under Jeff Jackson (three regular-season).
8	Eight current Notre Dame players have been selected in the NHL draft, including four forwards and four defensemen (see page 6 for a detailed list).
4	Notre Dame has an active four-year NCAA tournament appearance streak, including Frozen Four appearances in 2017 and 2018, which is the longest streak in program history and is the fourth-longest active streak in the NCAA. The Irish have also appeared in seven of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments (due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 NCAA tournament did not take place and all appearance streaks remain intact).

NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- The Fighting Irish hit the road for the first time this season to play at No. 3/4 Michigan (Nov. 27-28), marking its only road contests of the first portion of the schedule as released by the Big Ten Conference.
- After opening the year with a pair of losses at home to Wisconsin (Nov. 13-14), Notre Dame had last weekend off following final exams.
- In game two against the Badgers, a 5-3 loss, senior forward Colin Theisen notched his first career hat trick and he now has 28 career goals (tops among active Notre Dame players).
- It marked the first Notre Dame hat trick since October 12, 2018 when Cal Burke scored three goals assistant Mercyhurst in an eventual 6-6 tie at the Ice Breaker Tournament.
- The Fighting Irish are in the early stages of the 52nd season of NCAA Division I hockey for Notre Dame and the 16th under head coach Jeff Jackson.
- Defensemen Spencer Stastney (Second Team) and Matt Hellickson (Honorable Mention) each earned preseason All-Big Ten honors.
- Junior forward Alex Steeves led the Fighting Irish with 28 points last season (11-17-28).
- Theisen and Hellickson enter the Michigan series with matching 119-consecutive games played streaks (each game of their Irish careers).
- With last season being cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Notre Dame remains the only team with multiple Big Ten Tournament Championships (2018 and 2019).
- Key departures from 2019-20 (all were graduating seniors): goaltender Cale Morris, defenseman Tory Dello, forwards Cam Morrison, Mike O'Leary and Cal Burke.

THE SCHEDULE

- With a delayed start to the season due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, each Big Ten team will play a 24-game conference schedule, plus an additional four games per school against Arizona State University hosted at Big Ten venues.
- After playing at Michigan this weekend, the Irish will then host Arizona State (Dec.

- 3-4), Ohio State (Dec 12-13) and Michigan State (Dec. 19-20) before the winter break.
- The remainder of the schedule will be announced by the conference at a later date.
- Outside of immediate family members of the participating student-athletes, there will be no spectators in attendance for Notre Dame home games.
- As the season progresses, the ability to host fans will be informed by the University's health and safety guidelines along with the guidance of local health officials and the Big Ten Conference.

THE NOTRE DAME - MICHIGAN SERIES

- All-time, Michigan leads the series 80-63-5, however, since their final season in the CCHA (2012-13), the Irish hold the edge with a 12-7-0 record.
- Notre Dame recognizes the first official meeting as a 3-2 overtime win by the Fighting Irish on Jan. 17, 1922 at the Weinberg Coliseum in Ann Arbor, Michigan.
- The Irish and Wolverines met each season from 1991-92 to 2012-13.
- During the 2012-13 season, Notre Dame went 5-0-0 against the Wolverines, including a 3-1 victory in the championship game of the final CCHA tournament.
- In Notre Dame's inaugural season in the Big Ten (2017-18), the Irish and Wolverines met five times, with the Irish claiming three victories, including a last second win at the 2018 NCAA Frozen Four.
- As time ran down in the 2018 NCAA Frozen Four semifinal (April 5), Cam Morrison slid the puck back to Jake Evans in the slot, who shot it five-hole for the game-winner with five seconds remaining - sending Notre Dame to the national championship.
- Notre Dame and Michigan's other Frozen Four meeting came at the 2008 Frozen Four (Denver, Colorado) when the Irish posted a 5-4 overtime win to advance to the NCAA championship game for the first time in program history.
- Calle Ridderwall scored the game-winning goal in that contest at the 5:44 mark of overtime.
- Head Coach Jeff Jackson is 33-32-8 all-time against Michigan (including his time at Lake Superior State), while he is 12-6-0 all-time against the Wolverines in the playoffs.
- Jackson named current Michigan head coach Mel Pearson as one of his Team USA assistant coaches for the 1997 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Jackson and Pearson helped lead USA to the silver medal in that tournament in Switzerland.
- The current Notre Dame roster features four Michigan natives: Dylan St. Cyr (Northville, Michigan), Max Ellis (Canton, Michigan), Ryder Rolston (Birmingham, Michigan) and

AGAINST THE WOLVERINES

- Notre Dame leads the series 7-6-0 since joining the Big Ten.
- Last season, the teams split the series 2-2-0 with each team posting road sweeps.
- The Wolverines won the first meetings, 3-0 and 3-1 on Jan. 10-11 at the Compton Family Ice Arena.
- Strauss Mann stopped 57 of the 58 shots he faced in the series for the Wolverines.
- The Fighting Irish bounced back with 2-1 and 3-0 wins at Yost on Feb. 21-22.
- Cam Morrison had a pair of goals, Michael Graham had three assists and Cale Morris stopped 53 of the 54 shots he faced to lead Notre Dame to that series sweep.
- During the 2018-19 season, the teams split the season series, going 2-2-0 against each other (with each team earning a home and road win), including the January 5, 2019 outdoor game at Notre Dame Stadium, as the two teams utilized the same ice as the Chicago Blackhawks and Boston Bruins of the NHL for the 2019 Bridgestone NHL Winter Classic.
- The Let's Take This Outside game featured the largest crowd to attend a home hockey game for the Irish (23,422) but Michigan claimed the 4-2 win over the Irish.
- Notre Dame's active career offensive leaders against Michigan include Matt Hellickson (13 GP; 4-6-10), Alex Steeves (8 GP; 3-3-6), Jake Pivonka (8 GP; 1-4-5) and Michael Graham (8 GP; 1-3-4).
- In net, Dylan St. Cyr has played one game against the Wolverines, stopping 29 of the 31 shots he faced to lead Notre Dame to a 6-2 win at Yost Ice Arena on Nov. 10, 2018.

FAMILY TIES

- The 2020-21 Notre Dame roster features quite a few family connections to the program and hockey world.
- Two sets of brothers are currently on the roster, including Matt and Alex Steeves and Graham and Landon Slaggert.
- Cam Burke will play his first season without his older brother, Cal Burke, who signed with the Colorado organization following his senior season of 2019-20.
- Freshman forward Brady Bjork is the younger brother of former Irish All-American and current Boston Bruin's player Anders Bjork.
- The Slaggerts and Bjorks are the 14th and 15th sets of brothers to play for Notre Dame.
- The Slaggerts also are part of the fifth set of father-son combinations to suit up for the Irish, joining their father and associate head coach Andy Slaggert.
- Sophomore forward Trevor Janicke is the son of Curtis Janicke, who played for the Irish from 1989-93, appearing in 125 games while scoring 46 goals and adding 98 assists 144 points.
- Trevor and Curtis were the sixth father-son duo to play for the Irish.
- Senior goaltender Dylan St. Cyr's mother is Manon Rheume, who played goaltender for Canada at the 1998 Olympic Winter Games and in several world championships and

who was the first woman to appear in an NHL pre-season game when she skated for the Tampa Bay Lightning in 1992. St. Cyr's father, Gerry St. Cyr, played five seasons of professional hockey including with the AHL's New Haven Senators and

- Junior forward Jake Pivonka is the son of Czech Republic native and former NHL player Michael Pivonka, who played over 800 games with the Washington Capitals (1986-99).
- Sophomore forward Solag Bakich is the son of Huntley Bakich, who was a linebacker for the Fighting Irish football team during the Lou Holtz era.
- Freshman forward Ryder Rolston is the son of former NHLer and Stanley Cup Champion Brian Rolston.
- Brian helped Lake Superior State win the 1992 NCAA National Championship under current Irish head coach Jeff Jackson and it marks the first time Jackson will coach the son of a former player.
- Freshman forward Grant Silianoff is the cousin of former Irish captain Ryan Thang.

100% GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE

- The University of Notre Dame claimed the 2020 national championship for graduating student-athletes in all sports—in the process posting the top NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figure (98) for the 14th-straight year (released on Nov. 17, 2020 by the NCAA).
- The Fighting Irish hockey program posted a perfect 100 GSR in the latest rankings, tying for first among NCAA DI men's hockey teams.
- Notre Dame hockey also posted a 95% Federal Graduation Rate (t-5th).
- Former players Cal Petersen, Andrew Oglevie and Dennis Gilbert, who all left following their respective junior seasons, were working towards completing their degrees this past semester.

CLURMAN EARNS THE C

- Junior defenseman Nate Clurman will serve as the team captain for the 2020-21 season.
- A 2016 Colorado Avalanche draft pick, Clurman will be the second junior defenseman in the last three seasons to captain the Irish following current Columbus blue liner Andrew Peeke, who was the captain for the 2018-19 season.
- Seniors Pierce Crawford, Matt Hellickson and Colin Theisen will serve as alternate captains.
- Each of the four players will be wearing a letter for the first times in their Irish careers.

OVERTIME/BIG STANDINGS IN 2020-21

- The overtime format for the 2020-21 season has changed to align more closely with most North American professional leagues.
- At the conclusion of the third period, if the game remains tied the teams will play a five minute, sudden victory 3-on-3 overtime period.
- If the game remains tied, there will be a three-round shootout.
- Big Ten Standings will be listed as such: W-L-T-OTW-OTL-SOW
- Last season, the Irish were 2-0-7 in overtime, with game-winning goals from Pierce Crawford (vs. Ohio State on Nov. 8) and Alex Steeves (at Wisconsin on Nov. 16).

NOTRE DAME IN THE 2020 NHL DRAFT

- A pair of Notre Dame freshman forwards were selected on the second day of the 2020 National Hockey League Draft, with Chicago taking Landon Slaggert in the third round (79th overall) and Colorado trading up to pick Ryder Rolston in the fifth round (139th overall).
- Slaggert and Rolston became the 86th and 87th Notre Dame players selected in the NHL Draft and the 39th and 40th of the Jeff Jackson era.
- Slaggert became Notre Dame's highest selection since Andrew Peeke and Cam Morrison were chosen with the 34th and 40th picks in 2016.
- Rolston, the son of former NHLer and Stanley Cup Champion Brian Rolston joins a pair of current Irish defensemen in Nate Clurman (161st in 2016) and Nick Leivermann (187th in 2017) as Colorado draftees.
- Brian Rolston played 50 games for the Avalanche during the 1999-00 season.
- Ryder Rolston joins an Avalanche organization that saw a pair of former Irish players suit up during the 2019-20 season, including former All-American Ian Cole and former NCAA Div. I Rookie of the Year T.J. Tynan. Recent graduate
- Last season's captain, Cal Burke, signed with the Colorado organization following Notre Dame's 2019-20 season as well.
- Slaggert joins a Blackhawks organization that features Notre Dame alum Stan Bowman as the president and general manager, while this past season recent Irish defenseman Dennis Gilbert played 21 games on the Chicago blue line (he was traded to Colorado in the offseason).
- Recent graduate Cam Morrison also signed a two-year entry-level contract with the Blackhawks in August.
- The Irish have seen at least one player selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft every year since 2004, and in 21 of the last 22 years.

THREE GOALS THE KEY TO VICTORY

- Over the past four seasons, the Fighting Irish are 48-5-3 when scoring at least three goals.
- In 2019-20, the Irish were 10-1-2 when scoring at least three times, with the ties coming at Ohio State (Jan. 17) and versus Minnesota (Feb. 14) and the loss coming at home against Wisconsin (Jan. 24).
- In 2018-19, Notre Dame went 17-0-1 when scoring three or more goals.
- The lone tie in 2018-19 came when Notre Dame opened the season on Oct. 12 against Mercyhurst in the Ice Breaker—a game that ended knotted at 6-6 before Notre Dame won the shootout to advance to the championship game.
- The Irish were 20-3-0 when scoring at least three goals in 2017-18.

2021 BIG TEN TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- The 2021 Big Ten Hockey Tournament will return to the one-weekend, single-elimination format used during the first four years of Big Ten hockey and will feature all seven conference teams – Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Penn State and Wisconsin.
- The tournament will be held March 18-20 and will consist of six games (three games on Thursday; two games on Friday; and the championship game on Saturday).
- The site will be predetermined and announced by the conference at a later date.

OF NCAA NOTE

- With last season being cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Notre Dame still has a program-best streak of four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in tact.
- It is also the fourth-longest active NCAA appearance streak.
- The Fighting Irish advanced to a regional final for the third consecutive season in

HEAD COACH
JEFF JACKSON



- The 2020–21 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson’s 16th season behind the Irish bench. During his first 15 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success, including four trips to the Frozen Four and eight conference championships.
- Jackson has over 30 years of coaching experience and led Notre Dame to back-to-back Big Ten tournament championship seasons in 2018 and 2019 while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 14 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is the only coach to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 16 seasons.
- Jackson’s Notre Dame teams have made 10 trips to the NCAA Championship (2007–09, 2011, 2013–14, 2016–19), advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 15-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation’s top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006–07 and 2008–09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team’s first season in the Big Ten (2017–18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018–19).
- Jackson’s success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson’s arrival, the Irish have had 35 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft (leading into the 2020 NHL Draft), including three first round selections. In that same span, 26 players from USA Hockey’s National Team Developmental Program
