151	Seniors Matt Hellickson and Colin Theisen have each played 121 consecutive games, dating back to their first game of their freshman season. The 121 games played are the most by any active Big Ten players.

FOR STARTERS

- The Fighting Irish return home for a non-conference series against Arizona State (Dec. 3-4) and begin a six-game homsestand to close out the first portion of their 2020-21 schedule.
- Last weekend, Notre Dame earned a road sweep over #3/4 Michigan with 3-2 and 2-1 victories inside Yost Ice Arena.
- In game one against the Wolverines, captain Nate Clurman and freshman Grant Silianoff scored their first collegiate goals to help the Irish earn a 3-2 win.
- Spencer Stastney and Alex Steeves each netted late third-period markers in game two to give the Irish a 2-1 victory, and a program-best fifth consecutive win at Yost.
- Ryan Bischel stopped 55 of 58 shots last weekend against the Wolverines to earn the first two road victories of his Irish career.
- Bischel's efforts last weekend at Michigan earned him Big Ten First Star of the Week honors (Dec. 1).
- Prior to last weekend, Notre Dame's last sweep of a top-10 opponent was Nov. 8-9, 2019 vs. #8/9 Ohio State.
- Following last weekend's sweep of Michigan, the Irish jumped to #13 in the USA Today/ USA Hockey Magazine Coaches Poll and #16 in the USCHO poll.
- The Fighting Irish are in the early stages the 52nd season of NCAA Division I hockey for Notre Dame and the 16th under head coach Jeff Jackson.
- Defensemen Spencer Stastney (Second Team) and Matt Hellickson (Honorable Mention) each earned preseason All-Big Ten honors.
- Junior forward Alex Steeves led the Fighting Irish with 28 points last season (11-17-28).
- Theisen and Hellickson enter the Arizona State series with matching 121-consecutive games played streaks (each game of their Irish careers).
- With last season being cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Notre Dame remains the only team with multiple Big Ten Tournament Championships (2018 and 2019).
- Key departures from 2019–20 (all were graduating seniors): goaltender Cale Morris, defenseman Tory Dello, forwards Cam Morrison, Mike O'Leary and Cal Burke.

- The remainder of the schedule will be announced by the conference at a later date.
- Outside of immediate family members of the participating student-athletes, there will be no spectators in attendance for Notre Dame home games.
- As the season progresses, the ability to host fans will be informed by the University's health and safety guidelines along with the guidance of local health officials and the Big Ten Conference.

ABOUT LAST WEEKEND

- The Irish earned a road sweep over #3/4 Michigan with 3-2 and 2-1 victories over the Wolverines last weekend (Nov 27-28) at Yost Ice Arena.
- Behind goals from Nick Leivermann, Nate Clurman and Grant Silianoff, Notre Dame gave Michigan its first loss of the season, 3-2, last Friday night.
- The markers by Clurman and Silianoff were the first of their college careers.
- The following night, Spencer Stastney broke a stretch of over 57 minutes of scoreless
 play before Alex Steeves netted an empty-net goal that proved to be the game winner
 in a 2-1 Irish victory.
- For the weekend, Ryan Bischel stopped 55 of the 58 shots he faced for a .948 save percentage to go along with a 1.50 goals against average.
- Bischel also earned his first two road wins of his Irish career.
- Notre Dame's five goals in the series were scored by five different players, while 10 players had at least one point.
- Last weekend marked Notre Dame's first sweep of a top-10 opponent since Nov. 8-9, 2019 vs. #8/9 Ohio State.

- The Irish took both contests by scores of 9-2 and 4-2.
- In that 9-2 Irish victory, Notre Dame tallied six power-play markers as Arizona State racked up 116 penalty minutes in the contest.
- The 182 combined penalty minutes by the two teams in the October 7, 2016 game ranks 17th in single-game history (Men's NCAA DI).
- Former Irish All-American and Mike Richter Award recipient Cale Morris saw his first game action in a Notre Dame uniform in that victory when entered in relief of Cal Petersen in the third period.
- Another Irish All-American and Hobey Baker Finalist, Anders Bjork, netted two goals in each of those victories and collected seven points in the weekend sweep.

SLAGGERT EARNS TEAM USA CAMP SPOT

- Earlier this week, freshman forward Landon Slaggert was named to USA Hockey's roster for its upcoming camp ahead of the 2021 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship.
- 29 players have been invited to Team USA's camp, which will begin on Dec. 6 in Plymouth, Michigan.
- Twenty-five players will move on to comprise the final roster for the U.S. National Junior Team, which is tentatively scheduled to be announced on Dec. 13.
- The 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship will take place from Dec. 25, 2020, through Jan. 5, 2021, in Edmonton, Alberta.
- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the tournament will be played with all 10 teams in a competition bubble and no spectators allowed at Rogers Place. Team USA opens play on Dec. 25 versus Russia.
- Slaggert, who earlier this fall was invited to Team USA's National Junior Team Evaluation Camp on Oct. 8-13, has played in all four of Notre Dame's games this season.
- He registered his first career point with an assist on Nate Clurman's goal in Notre Dame's 3-2 win at third-ranked Michigan on Nov. 27.

FAMILY TIES

- The 2020-21 Notre Dame roster features quite a few family connections to the program and hockey world.
- Two sets of brothers are currently on the roster, including Matt and Alex Steeves and Graham and Landon Slaggert.
- Cam Burke will play his first season without his older brother, Cal Burke, who signed with the Colorado organization following his senior season of 2019–20.
- Freshman forward Brady Bjork is the younger brother of former Irish All-American and current Boston Bruin's player Anders Bjork.
- The Slaggerts and Bjorks are the 14th and 15th sets of brothers to play for Notre Dame.
- The Slaggerts also are part of the fifth set of father-son combinations to suit up for the lrish, joining their father and associate head coach Andy Slaggert.

NOTRE DAME IN THE 2020 NHL DRAFT

- A pair of Notre Dame freshman forwards were selected on the second day of the 2020 National Hockey League Draft, with Chicago taking Landon Slaggert in the third round (79th overall) and Colorado trading up to pick Ryder Rolston in the fifth round (139th overall).
- Slaggert and Rolston became the 86th and 87th Notre Dame players selected in the NHL Draft and the 39th and 40th of the Jeff Jackson era.
- Slaggert became Notre Dame's highest selection since Andrew Peeke and Cam Morrison were chosen with the 34th and 40th picks in 2016.
- Rolston, the son of former NHLer and Stanley Cup Champion Brian Rolston joins a pair of current Irish defensemen in Nate Clurman (161st in 2016) and Nick Leivermann (187th in 2017) as Colorado draftees.
- Brian Rolston played 50 games for the Avalanche during the 1999-00 season.
- Ryder Rolston joins an Avalanche organization that saw a pair of former Irish players suit up during the 2019-20 season, including former All-American Ian Cole and former NCAA Div. I Rookie of the Year T.J. Tynan. Recent graduate
- Last season's captain, Cal Burke, signed with the Colorado organization following Notre Dame's 2019-20 season as well.
- Slaggert joins a Blackhawks organization that features Notre Dame alum Stan Bowman as the president and general manager, while this past season recent Irish defenseman Dennis Gilbert played 21 games on the Chicago blue line (he was traded to Colorado in the offseason).
- Recent graduate Cam Morrison also signed a two-year entry-level contract with the Blackhawks in August.
- The Irish have seen at least one player selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft every year since 2004, and in 21 of the last 22 years.

THREE GOALS THE KEY TO VICTORY

- Over the past four seasons, the Fighting Irish are 49-5-3 when scoring at least three goals.
- In 2019-20, the Irish were 10-1-2 when scoring at least three times, with the ties coming at Ohio State (Jan. 17) and versus Minnesota (Feb. 14) and the loss coming at home against Wisconsin (Jan. 24).
- In 2018-19, Notre Dame went 17-0-1 when scoring three or more goals.
- The lone tie in 2018–19 came when Notre Dame opened the season on Oct. 12 against Mercyhurst in the Ice Breaker –a game that ended knotted at 6–6 before Notre Dame won the shootout to advance to the championship game.
- The Irish were 20-3-0 when scoring at least three goals in 2017-18.

- The 2021 Big Ten Hockey Tournament will return to the one-weekend, singleelimination format used during the first four years of Big Ten hockey and will feature all seven conference teams — Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Penn State and Wisconsin.
- The tournament will be held March 18-20 and will consist of six games (three games on Thursday; two games on Friday; and the championship game on Saturday).

HEAD COACH JEFF JACKSON



- The 2020–21 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson's 16th season behind the Irish bench. During his first 15 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success, including four trips to the Frozen Four and eight conference championships.
- Jackson has over 30 years of coaching experience and led Notre Dame to back-to-back Big Ten tournament championship seasons in 2018 and 2019 while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 14 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is the only coach to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 16 seasons.
- Jackson's Notre Dame teams have made 10 trips to the NCAA Championship (2007–09, 2011, 2013–14, 2016–19), advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 15-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation's top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006–07 and 2008–09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team's first season in the Big Ten (2017-18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018-19).
- Jackson's success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family lce Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson's arrival, the Irish have had 35 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft (leading into the 2020 NHL Draft), including three first round selections. In that same span, 26 players from USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program

have matriculated to Notre Dame.

- During Jackson's tenure, the Irish have had eight players garner All-America honors — Bobby Nardella in 2019, Cale Morris in 2018, Anders Bjork in 2017, Robbie Russo in 2015, Anders Lee in 2013, Ian Cole and Erik Condra in 2009 and David Brown in 2007. In addition, 24 of Jackson's Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2020-21 season with a 20-year collegiate record of 516-258-89 for a .649 winning percentage, the thirdhighest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2020-21). His 516 career wins rank tied for 12th all-time in Division I and second among active coaches (entering 2020-21).


