### COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

<b>523</b>	Head coach <b>Jeff Jackson</b> has 523 career wins, which ranks second among active NCAA Division I head coaches, spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and 15+ seasons at Notre Dame. Jackson's win total also ranks 12th all-time (George Gwozdecky ranks 11th with 526 career wins).
<b>133</b>	Senior <b>Matt Hellickson</b> has played 133 consecutive games, dating back to the first game of his freshman season. The 133 games played are the most by any active Big Ten player.
<b>23</b>	Freshman forward <b>Landon Slaggert</b> became the 23rd Irish player to take part in the World Junior Championship and he went on to earn a gold medal with the 2021 U.S. National Junior Team as Team USA posted a 2-0 victory in the gold-medal game (Jan. 5).
<b>15</b>	Fifteen sets of brothers have now suited up for the Irish, including current players <b>Cam Burke</b> (brother <b>Cal</b> graduated in 2020), <b>Matt</b> and <b>Alex Steeves</b> , <b>Graham</b> and <b>Landon Slaggert</b> and <b>Brady Bjork</b> (brother <b>Anders</b> played 2014-17).
<b>10</b>	As of Jan. 25, ten former Fighting Irish players appeared in the NHL so far this season: <b>Anders Bjork</b> (Boston Bruins), <b>Ian Cole</b> (Colorado Avalanche/Minnesota), <b>Jake Evans</b> (Montreal Canadiens), <b>Dennis Gilbert</b> (Colorado Avalanche), <b>Vinnie Hinostroza</b> (Florida Panthers), <b>Anders Lee</b> (New York Islanders), <b>Kyle Palmieri</b> (New Jersey Devils), <b>Cal Petersen</b> (Los Angeles Kings), <b>Bryan Rust</b> (Pittsburgh Penguins), <b>Riley Sheahan</b> (Buffalo Sabres).
<b>9</b>	Nine current Notre Dame players have been selected in the NHL draft, including four forwards and five defensemen (see page 6 for a detailed list).
<b>8</b>	With the most recent being the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history - each under <b>Jeff Jackson</b> (three regular-season).
<b>4</b>	Notre Dame is the only undefeated road team in the country with at least four games played (4-0-0).
<b>4</b>	Notre Dame has an active four-year NCAA tournament appearance streak, including Frozen Four appearances in 2017 and 2018, which is the longest streak in program history and is the fourth-longest active streak in the NCAA. The Irish have also appeared in seven of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments (due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 NCAA tournament did not take place and all appearance streaks remain intact).

**FOR STARTERS**

- The Fighting Irish head back out on the road after suffering a home sweep against seventh-ranked Michigan (Jan. 21-22), just one week after sweeping then top-ranked Minnesota on the road (Jan. 15-16).
- Penn State is coming off a weekend split with Wisconsin, dropping game one 4-1 (Jan. 21) before rebounding to take game two 5-4 (Jan. 22).
- Notre Dame (18 points) and Penn State (17 points) sit in fourth and fifth, respectively in the Big Ten standings heading into this week's series.
- Notre Dame is 2-0-1 in the last three meetings with the Nittany Lions.
- Penn State is the only Big Ten team Notre Dame has yet to play at least twice this season thus far.
- The Irish are 4-0-0 on the road this season, posting series sweeps at Michigan (Nov. 27-28) and at Minnesota (Jan. 15-16).
- The Irish are the only team in the country with at least four road games played and an undefeated record (Lake Superior State is 3-0-0).
- Notre Dame's seven game-winning goals this season have been scored by six players: Jesse Lansdell, Alex Steeves, Grant Silianoff, Graham Slaggert (2), Nick Leivermann and Max Ellis.
- Landon Slaggert returned from winning gold with Team USA at the IIHF World Junior Championship (Jan. 5) to score a pair of goals in Notre Dame's 5-3 win over Arizona State (Jan. 9) in his first game back.
- Leading scorer Alex Steeves (7-6-13) has recorded at least one point in 11 of Notre Dame's 16 games.
- Matt Hellickson has played 133-consecutive games dating back to the first game of his freshman season.
- Freshman defenseman and Edina, Minnesota native Jake Boltmann joined the Irish for the second semester.
- The Fighting Irish are in the midst of the 52nd season of NCAA Division I hockey for Notre Dame and the 16th under head coach Jeff Jackson.
- With last season being cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Notre Dame remains the only team with multiple Big Ten Tournament Championships (2018 and 2019) and the Irish have an intact four-season NCAA tournament appearance.

**THE NOTRE DAME - PENN STATE SERIES**

- Notre Dame has a 10-4-4 all-time record/series lead against Penn State in games played while both teams were at the NCAA DI level (ND leads 13-5-4 including games against Penn State from 1983-85).
- Last season, the Fighting Irish went 3-1-0 against Penn State as the teams split a series at the Compton Family Ice Arena as Penn State won game one 4-2 (Dec. 13) and a 4-2 Notre Dame win on Dec. 13.
- Then at Penn State, the teams skated to a 3-3 tie in game one (Jan. 31), with Cam Burke's shootout winner securing the extra point, and Notre Dame posted a 4-2 win in game two (Feb. 1).
- In 2018-19, the teams met five times, culminating in Notre Dame's 3-2 win in the Big Ten Championship game on March 24, 2019.
- Spencer Stastney, Cal Burke and Cam Morrison (game winner) scored for the Irish in the championship game, while Cale Morris made 46 saves en route to earning Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors for the second consecutive season.
- That championship game win over Penn State marked the 500th career victory for head coach Jeff Jackson.
- In 2017-18, Notre Dame was undefeated in five contests against Penn State (4-0-1) including a Big Ten Tournament semifinal victory..
- In the 2018 Big Ten Tournament semifinals at the Compton Family Ice Arena, Jack Jenkins netted the game winner with 31 seconds left in regulation for a 3-2 win, propelling the Irish to the championship and sparking their "cardiac kids" run where they won five straight games by scoring the game-winner in the final minute of regulation or in overtime.
- Notre Dame's career offensive leaders against Penn State include Matt Hellickson (14 GP, 3-9-12) and Michael Graham (9 GP, 1-3-4).
- In net, neither senior Dylan St. Cyr nor sophomore Ryan Bischel has started against the Nittany Lions as 2020 graduate Cale Morris went 9-3-2 in 14 career starts against Penn State over the previous three seasons.

**SLAGGERT GOLDEN WITH TEAM USA**

- Freshman forward Landon Slaggert and Team USA won the gold medal with a 2-0 victory over Canada at the 2021 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship on Tuesday night (Jan. 5) in the gold-medal game at Rogers Place.
- Slaggert skated in all seven games for the U.S. and became the first Fighting Irish player to medal at the event since 2018 when current Columbus Blue Jackets defenseman Andrew Peeke helped the U.S. secure the bronze in Buffalo in 2018.
- Notre Dame's other World Junior Championship medalists include Anders Bjork (bronze in 2016), Mario Lucia (gold in 2013), Kyle Palmieri (gold in 2010 and bronze in 2011), Kyle Lawson (bronze in 2007) and Ben Simon (silver in 1997).
- Including Slaggert, 23 Notre Dame players have now taken part in the IIHF World Junior Championships.
- Slaggert played in six games for the Irish during the first semester before joining up with Team USA.

**FAMILY TIES**

- The 2020-21 Notre Dame roster features quite a few family connections to the program and hockey world.
- Two sets of brothers are currently on the roster, including Matt and Alex Steeves and Graham and Landon Slaggert.
- Cam Burke will play his first season without his older brother, Cal Burke, who signed with the Colorado organization following his senior season of 2019-20.
- Freshman forward Brady Bjork is the younger brother of former Irish All-American and current Boston Bruin's player Anders Bjork.
- The Slaggerts and Bjorks are the 14th and 15th sets of brothers to play for Notre Dame.
- The Slaggerts also are part of the fifth set of father-son combinations to suit up for the Irish, joining their father and associate head coach Andy Slaggert.
- Sophomore forward Trevor Janicke is the son of Curtis Janicke, who played for the Irish from 1989-93, appearing in 125 games while scoring 46 goals and adding 98 assists 144 points.
- Trevor and Curtis were the sixth father-son duo to play for the Irish.
- Senior goaltender Dylan St. Cyr's mother is Manon Rheume, who played goaltender for Canada at the 1998 Olympic Winter Games and in several world championships and who was the first woman to appear in an NHL pre-season game when she skated for the Tampa Bay Lightning in 1992. St. Cyr's father, Gerry St. Cyr, played five seasons of professional hockey including with the AHL's New Haven Senators.
- Junior forward Jake Pivonka is the son of Czech Republic native and former NHL player Michael Pivonka, who played over 800 games with the Washington Capitals (1986-99).
- Sophomore forward Solag Bakich is the son of Huntley Bakich, who was a linebacker for the Fighting Irish football team during the Lou Holtz era.
- Freshman forward Ryder Rolston is the son of former NHLer and Stanley Cup Champion Brian Rolston.

**THE SCHEDULE**

- With a delayed start to the season due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, each Big Ten team will play a 24-game conference schedule, plus an additional four games per school against Arizona State University hosted at Big Ten venues.
- This series vs. Arizona State opens the second half for Notre Dame.
- The Big Ten Conference announced the league's post-winter break schedule on Friday (Dec. 18), which includes nine Notre Dame series.
- In the second half, the Irish will host Arizona State (Jan. 9-10), Michigan (Jan. 21-22), Minnesota (Feb. 12-13) and Penn State (March 5-6) and have road series at Minnesota (Jan. 15-16), Penn State (Jan. 28-29), Ohio State (Feb. 5-6), Wisconsin (Feb. 19-20) and Michigan State (Feb. 26-27).
- As the season progresses, the ability to host fans will be informed by the University's health and safety guidelines along with the guidance of local health officials and the Big Ten Conference.

**100% GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE**

- The University of Notre Dame claimed the 2020 national championship for graduating student-athletes in all sports—in the process posting the top NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figure (98) for the 14th-straight year (released on Nov. 17, 2020 by the NCAA).
- The Fighting Irish hockey program posted a perfect 100 GSR in the latest rankings, tying for first among NCAA DI men's hockey teams.
- Notre Dame hockey also posted a 95% Federal Graduation Rate (t-5th).
- Former players Cal Petersen, Andrew Oglevie and Dennis Gilbert, who all left following their respective junior seasons, were working towards completing their degrees this past semester.

**CLURMAN WEARS THE "C"**

- Junior defenseman Nate Clurman is serving as the team captain for the 2020-21 season.
- A 2016 Colorado Avalanche draft pick, Clurman is the second junior defenseman in the last three seasons to captain the Irish following current Columbus blue liner Andrew Peeke, who was the captain for the 2018-19 season.
- Seniors Pierce Crawford, Matt Hellickson and Colin Theisen will serve as alternate captains.
- Each of the four players are wearing a letter for the first time in their Irish careers.

**OVERTIME/BIG STANDINGS IN 2020-21**

- The overtime format for the 2020-21 season has changed to align more closely with most North American professional leagues.
- At the conclusion of the third period, if the game remains tied the teams will play a five minute, sudden victory 3-on-3 overtime period.
- If the game remains tied, there will be a three-round shootout.
- Big Ten Standings will be listed as: W-L-T-OTW-OTL-SOW
- Notre Dame's active players with overtime game-winning goals include Pierce Crawford (vs. Ohio State on Nov. 8, 2019) and Alex Steeves (at Wisconsin on Nov. 16, 2019).

**NOTRE DAME IN THE 2020 NHL DRAFT**

- A pair of Notre Dame freshman forwards were selected on the second day of the 2020 National Hockey League Draft, with Chicago taking Landon Slaggert in the third round (79th overall) and Colorado trading up to pick Ryder Rolston in the fifth round (139th overall).
- Freshman defenseman Jake Boltmann, who has joined the Irish in the midst of the 2020-21 season was also selected in the third round (80th overall) by the Calgary Flames in the 2020 NHL Draft.
- Including Boltmann, Slaggert and Rolston, 88 Notre Dame players have been selected in the NHL Draft with 41 of them being drafted during the Jeff Jackson era.
- Slaggert became Notre Dame's highest selection since Andrew Peeke and Cam Morrison were chosen with the 34th and 40th picks in 2016.
- Rolston, the son of former NHLer and Stanley Cup Champion Brian Rolston joins a pair of current Irish defensemen in Nate Clurman (161st in 2016) and Nick Leivermann (187th in 2017) as Colorado draftees.
- Brian Rolston played 50 games for the Avalanche during the 1999-00 season.
- Ryder Rolston joins an Avalanche organization that saw a pair of former Irish players suit up during the 2019-20 season, including former All-American Ian Cole and former NCAA Div. I Rookie of the Year T.J. Tynan. Recent graduate
- Last season's captain, Cal Burke, signed with the Colorado organization following Notre Dame's 2019-20 season as well.

- Slaggert joins a Blackhawks organization that features Notre Dame alum Stan Bowman as the president and general manager, while this past season recent Irish defenseman Dennis Gilbert played 21 games on the Chicago blue line (he was traded to Colorado in the offseason).
- Recent graduate Cam Morrison also signed a two-year entry-level contract with the Blackhawks in August.
- The Irish have seen at least one player selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft every year since 2004, and in 21 of the last 22 years.

## THREE GOALS THE KEY TO VICTORY

- Over the past four seasons, the Fighting Irish are 53-8-3 when scoring at least three goals.
- In 2019-20, the Irish were 10-1-2 when scoring at least three times, with the ties coming at Ohio State (Jan. 17) and versus Minnesota (Feb. 14) and the loss coming at home against Wisconsin (Jan. 24).
- In 2018-19, Notre Dame went 17-0-1 when scoring three or more goals.
- The lone tie in 2018-19 came when Notre Dame opened the season on Oct. 12 against Mercyhurst in the Ice Breaker—a game that ended knotted at 6-6 before Notre Dame won the shootout to advance to the championship game.
- The Irish were 20-3-0 when scoring at least three goals in 2017-18.

## 2021 BIG TEN TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- The 2021 Big Ten Hockey Tournament will return to the one-weekend, single-elimination format and will feature all seven conference teams.
- The tournament will be held March 18-20 and will consist of six games (three games on Thursday; two games on Friday; and the championship game on Saturday).
- The site will be predetermined and announced by the conference at a later date.

## OF NCAA NOTE

- With last season being cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Notre Dame still has a program-best streak of four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in tact.
- It is also the fourth-longest active NCAA appearance streak.
- The Fighting Irish advanced to a regional final for the third consecutive season in 2019, having won regional final games in 2017 and 2018 to advance to back-to-back Frozen Fours.
- Notre Dame is one of three teams to make it to the NCAA Regional Finals in each of the last three NCAA Tournaments, joining Denver and Minnesota Duluth.
- The Fighting Irish have made seven of the last 10 NCAA tournaments, tied for the third most in the NCAA.

**HEAD COACH**  
**JEFF JACKSON**



- The 2020–21 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson’s 16th season behind the Irish bench. During his first 15 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success, including four trips to the Frozen Four and eight conference championships.
- Jackson has over 30 years of coaching experience and led Notre Dame to back-to-back Big Ten tournament championship seasons in 2018 and 2019 while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 14 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is the only coach to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 16 seasons.
- Jackson’s Notre Dame teams have made 10 trips to the NCAA Championship (2007–09, 2011, 2013–14, 2016–19), advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 15-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation’s top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006–07 and 2008–09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team’s first season in the Big Ten (2017–18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018–19).
- Jackson’s success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson’s arrival, the Irish have had 35 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft (leading into the 2020 NHL Draft), including three first round selections. In that same span, 26 players from USA Hockey’s National Team Developmental Program

have matriculated to Notre Dame.

- During Jackson’s tenure, the Irish have had eight players garner All-America honors — Bobby Nardella in 2019, Cale Morris in 2018, Anders Bjork in 2017, Robbie Russo in 2015, Anders Lee in 2013, Ian Cole and Erik Condra in 2009 and David Brown in 2007. In addition, 24 of Jackson’s Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2020–21 season with a 20-year collegiate record of 516–258–89 for a .649 winning percentage, the third-highest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2020–21). His 516 career wins rank tied for 12th all-time in Division I and second among active coaches (entering 2020–21).
