| .767 | Junior forward Nate Laszewski's NCAA-leading effective field goal percentage in 2020-21. The statistic accounts for the fact that a three-point field goal is more worth more than a two-point field goal – the formula is (FGM + 0.5 * 3PM) / FGA |
| .641 | Nate Laszewski's field goal percentage in 2020-21, which leads the ACC, is third among major conference players and 11th in the NCAA (min 5 FGM/G, 5 GP). |
| .553 | Nate Laszewski's three-point field goal percentage in 2020-21, which is first in the ACC, is first among major conference players and fourth in the NCAA (min 1.5 3PM/G, 5 GP). |
| .561 | Notre Dame career field goal percentage for graduate forward Juwan Durham , which would rank him fifth on the Irish career charts since 1996-97 for a player with at least 200 FGM. See page 4 for more. |
| 3 | Florida natives that return to their home state this weekend including freshman Tony Sanders Jr. who hails from Miami and attended Gulliver Prep. Nate Laszewski (Jupiter) and Juwan Durham (Tampa) also return to the Sunshine State, which marks the state that developed the most Irish players on this season's roster (New York, 2; Pennsylvania 2). |
| 7 | The Irish will return to action Sunday night after a full seven days off after their previous contest against Boston College. With this unusual season due to COVID-19 safety precautions, it marks the third seven-day lay off for Notre Dame in 2020-21. There also were seven days between the season opener at Michigan State (Nov. 28) and the home opener with Detroit Mercy (Dec. 6) and seven days between trips to North Carolina (Jan. 2) and Virginia Tech (Jan. 10). The rest is welcome, for if the rest of the Irish schedule remains intact, the longest break between games the rest of the season will be four between a trip to Duke on Feb. 9 and a home game with Miami (Feb. 14). |
| 11 | The Irish are 11th in the country and 2nd in the ACC in free throw percentage at .791. Trim that national list to teams that have played at least 10 games and Notre Dame is eighth in the country. |
| 12.3 | Notre Dame's NCAA-leading fouls per game number, as the Irish continue their tradition of not fouling the opponent to allow easy points late in a contest. The Irish are ahead of Appalachian State (13.0) and Virginia (13.3) for the national lead. |
| 23 | A recent project by CBSsports.com ranked the 'Greatest College Basketball Programs Ever' with Notre Dame placing 23rd on the list and sixth in the ACC. Notre Dame will face eight of the teams ranked above them this year a total of nine times: No. 19 NC State, No. 14 Michigan State (0-1), No. 12 Ohio State (0-1), No. 11 Syracuse, No. 6 Louisville, No. 3 Duke (0-1, twice), No. 2 North Carolina (0-1), No. 1 Kentucky (1-0). |
| 151 | Career blocked shots for Juwan Durham , the sixth Notre Dame player to compile over 150 blocks in a career. Durham is one of just three Irish players to average over 2.0 blocks per game in a career (LaPhonso Ellis, current Irish assistant coach Ryan Humphrey). |
| 112.6 | The offensive efficiency rating for the Irish this season according to kenpom.com, 25th in the country and the highest ranking for the rating since the end of the 2018 season (32nd). |
| 353 | Career assists for Prentiss Hubb , becoming the 17th Irish player to reach 350 career assists. Hubb's 4.58 career assists per game average would place him in 10th place on the Notre Dame career list. |

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTED BY 1,000 POINT SCORERS

Notre Dame has produced 64 1,000 point scorers throughout the history of the program with 23 of those players reaching that statistical milestone during the Mike Brey era (2000-01 – current). Of the 85 players who have suited up for Notre Dame under Mike Brey, 36 of them were recruited by the staff and exhausted their eligibility with the Irish – 20 of those players have scored more than 1,000 points in a career.

Since 2000-01, Notre Dame leads all ACC teams in 1,000 point scorers (23) and is second in the country over that time frame to Villanova.

A DECADE OF 'NO FOUL' CONTINUES

One of the mantras of Notre Dame basketball under Mike Brey has been to keep the amount of opponent foul shots down. Defend without fouling is a way of life for Irish basketball and the statistics bear out that trend.

In the last 11 years, Notre Dame has failed to finish among the top 10 in least amount of personal fouls committed just twice. They have also led the country in least amount of personal fouls three times.

The NCAA has been tracking the least amount of fouls committed in a season since 1993. Notre Dame is the only team since 1993 to lead the country in least amount of fouls more than twice (four times) and could be on pace to make it six times this season.

Glenn and Stacey Head Men's Basketball Coach Mike Brey has announced four student-athletes to serve as team captains for the University of Notre Dame men's basketball team.

Graduate students Nikola Djogo and Juwan Durham, along with juniors Prentiss Hubb and Cormac Ryan, will make up a four-player group of captains in 2020-21.

All four Irish players will be serving as team captains for the first time in their careers.

IRISH RECEIVE COMMITMENTS FROM TWO AREA PROSPECTS

Rising high school seniors **J.R. Konieczny** (Ko-nez-nee) and **Blake Wesley**, both from South Bend, Indiana, have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball at the University of Notre Dame.

Rated among the top 150 high school players in the 2020-21 class, Konieczny (Kah-nez-nee) is a four-star recruit according to ESPN.com and earned third-team all-state honors as a junior in 2019-20. He averaged over 24 points a game last season, including a 42-point outburst in the 2020 sectional semifinal – a performance that earned him the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association Player of the Week honors.

A consensus four-star recruit, Wesley is ranked 96th nationally by Rivals and 113th by 247Sports. An honorable mention all-state selection as a junior in 2019-20, Wesley led all local area players with a 26.0 points-per-game average last season.

MIKE BREY, GLENN AND STACEY MURPHY HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH

21st Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 540-293 | ND Record: 441-241

In 20 full seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to over 440 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 115-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over three million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance and is midway through his one-year term as the president of the NABC. He has been inducted into the Delaware and George Washington Halls of Fame.
