COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

526	Head coach Jeff Jackson has 526 career wins, which ranks second among active NCAA Division I head coaches, spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and 15+ seasons at Notre Dame. Jackson's win total is tied for 11th all-time with George Gwozdecky (John MacInnes ranks 10th with 555 career wins).
139	Senior Matt Hellickson has played 139 consecutive games, dating back to the first game of his freshman season. The 1 games played are the most by any active Big Ten player.
23	Freshman forward Landon Slaggert became the 23rd Irish player to take part in the World Junior Championship and he went on to earn a gold medal with the 2021 U.S. National Junior Team as Team USA posted a 2-0 victory in the gold-medal game (Jan. 5).
15	Fifteen sets of brothers have now suited up for the Irish, including current players Cam Burke (brother Cal graduated in 2020), Matt and Alex Steeves , Graham and Landon Slaggert and Brady Bjork (brother Anders played 2014-17).
17	Notre Dame's penalty kill is a perfect 17-for-17 on the road this season, helping the Irish to a 7-1-0 away record in 2020-21.
13	As of Feb. 15, thirteen former Fighting Irish players have appeared in an NHL game this season: Anders Bjork (Boston Bruins), Ian Cole (Colorado Avalanche/Minnesota), Jake Evans (Montreal Canadiens), Steven Fogarty (Buffalo Sabres), Dennis Gilbert (Colorado Avalanche), Jordan Gross (Arizona), Vinnie Hinostroza (Florida Panthers), Anders Lee (New York Islanders), Kyle Palmieri (New Jersey Devils), Andrew Peeke (Columbus), Cal Petersen (Los Angeles Kings), Bryan Rust (Pittsburgh Penguins), Riley Sheahan (Buffalo Sabres).
9	Nine current Notre Dame players have been selected in the NHL draft, including four forwards and five defensemen (see page 6 for a detailed list).
8	With the most recent being the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history - each under Jeff Jackson (three regular-season).
4	Notre Dame has an active four-year NCAA tournament appearance streak, including Frozen Four appearances in 2017 and 2018, which is the longest streak in program history and is the fourth-longest active streak in the NCAA. The Irish have also appeared in seven of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments (due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 NCAA tournament did not take place and all appearance streaks remain intact).

NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- Notre Dame heads to Wisconsin for another road series, beginning on Friday, Feb. 19.
- The teams, who opened the season against each other at the Compton Family Ice Arena on Nov. 13-14, will meet LaBahn Arena for the first time in series history.
- Notre Dame is 7-1-0 on the road this season, including series sweeps at then third-ranked Michigan (Nov. 27-28) and at then first-ranked Minnesota (Jan. 15-16) and the Irish penalty kill is 17-for-17 away from home.
- Notre Dame's power play is also 7-for-20 on the road and that .350% leads the country in road games.
- Dating back to Notre Dame's game two, 2-1 win at Minnesota on Jan. 16, senior goaltender Dylan St. Cyr has started eight of nine games and posted a .931 save percentage to go along with a 2.12 goals against average and a 4-4-0 record.
- With 526 career wins, Head Coach Jeff Jackson (Lake Superior State and Notre Dame) enters the weekend tied with George Gwozdecky (Miami and Denver 1989-2013) for 11th all-time in wins, while John MacInnes of Michigan Tech (1956-81) ranks 10th with 555.
- Notre Dame's 10 game-winning goals this season have been scored by eight players: Jesse Lansdell, Alex Steeves, Grant Silianoff, Graham Slaggert (2), Nick Leivermann, Max Ellis, Spencer Stastney (2) and Matt Steeves.
- Matt Hellickson has played 139-consecutive games dating back to the first game of his freshman season.
- Freshman defenseman and Edina, Minnesota native Jake Boltmann joined the Irish for the second semester.
- The Fighting Irish are in the midst of the 52nd season of NCAA Division I hockey for Notre Dame and the 16th under head coach Jeff Jackson.
- With last season being cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Notre Dame remains the only team with multiple Big Ten Tournament Championships (2018 and 2019) and the Irish have an intact four-season NCAA tournament appearance.

SENIOR CLASS

- Forward Pierce Crawford and defenseman Matt Hellickson have been named Senior CLASS Award candidates, it was announced on Feb. 12.
- Crawford and Hellickson represent two of 15 candidates nationally, from which a

national committee will select 10 finalists for the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award later in February.

- Those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot for a nationwide vote. Fan balloting will be coupled with votes from coaches and media to determine the recipient of the award.

THE NOTRE DAME - WISCONSIN SERIES

- Former opponents in the WCHA, Notre Dame and Wisconsin have met 78 times in program history with Wisconsin leading the all-time series 45-25-8.
- The first meeting between the two teams came during the 1921-22 season when the Irish skated away with a 3-0 victory at Badin Rink (outdoors at Notre Dame).
- The teams met once more, in 1925-26, before taking a 40 year hiatus and returning to competition when Notre Dame earned varsity status.
- The teams have never met at LaBahn Arena.
- As a head coach, Jeff Jackson is 8-7-1 all-time against the Badgers (1-1-0 at Lake Superior State).
- The one win Jackson had over the Badgers at Lake Superior State came on April 4, 1992, in Albany, New York, as the Lakers defeated Wisconsin 5-3 to win the NCAA Championship (the first of Jackson's two NCAA Championships at Lake State).

VERSUS THE BADGERS

- Since joining the Big Ten, Notre Dame leads the series 7-6-1.
- The teams opened the 2020-21 season back on Nov. 13-14 at the Compton Family Ice Arena, with the Badgers posting a 2-0 win and a 5-3 victory.
- Colin Theisen had a hat trick in that game two loss.
- The teams split last season's series 2-2-0, including a split at the Kohl Center on Nov. 15-16.
- Wisconsin took game one, 3-0, and Notre Dame took a back-and-forth game two, 5-4 in overtime.
- Alex Steeves had the OT game winner (just moments after Nate Clurman cleared a puck off the Notre Dame goal line) and Trevor Janicke, Cam Burke and Colin Theisen also scored for the Irish.
- Later in the season at home (Jan. 24-25), Notre Dame dropped game one, 6-4, before bouncing back to take game two, 5-2.
- With a career-high four points on a goal and three assists, Alex Steeves helped the Irish to that 5-2 win.
- During the 2017-18 season, then-freshman forward Michael Graham had a breakout weekend against the Badgers during their January series as he posted five points on four goals and an assist.
- Eight of Graham's 18 career goals have come against the Badgers in just eight games played (8-3-11 points).
- Notre Dame's additional active career offensive leaders against the Badgers include Colin Theisen (14 GP, 6-7-13), Alex Steeves (10 GP, 2-7-9), Spencer Stastney (10 GP, 0-5-5), Matt Hellickson (14 GP, 0-4-4) and Nate Clurman (10 GP, 0-4-4).
- In net, Dylan St. Cyr is 1-2-0 in three career starts against the Badgers (3.18 GAA, .885

STEEVES ON HOBEY WATCH

- Junior forward Alex Steeves has been selected to Phase One of the Hobey Baker Award's fan ballot (www.hobeybaker.com).
- Steeves has scored 10 goals and added 12 assists for 22 points in 22 contests this season for the Irish.
- The Eden Prairie, Minnesota, native has posted at least one point in 15 of 20 games in the 2020-21 campaign.
- The Fan Balloting (Phase I) of the Hobey Baker award calendar will continue until March 7. On March 17, the Top 10 Finalists will be announced, at which time Phase II Fan Balloting will begin and run through March 28, 2021.
- The Hobey Hat Trick Finalist Announcement will be made on April 1.
- The 2021 Hobey Baker Award winner will be announced from a field of three Hobey Hat Trick finalists on Friday, April 9, 2021 during the NCAA Frozen Four Championship in Pittsburgh.

SLAGGERT GOLDEN WITH TEAM USA

- Freshman forward Landon Slaggert and Team USA won the gold medal with a 2-0 victory over Canada at the 2021 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship on Tuesday night (Jan. 5) in the gold-medal game at Rogers Place.
- Slaggert skated in all seven games for the U.S. and became the first Fighting Irish player to medal at the event since 2018 when current Columbus Blue Jackets defenseman Andrew Peeke helped the U.S. secure the bronze in Buffalo in 2018.
- Notre Dame's other World Junior Championship medalists include Anders Bjork (bronze in 2016), Mario Lucia (gold in 2013), Kyle Palmieri (gold in 2010 and bronze in 2011), Kyle Lawson (bronze in 2007) and Ben Simon (silver in 1997).
- Including Slaggert, 23 Notre Dame players have now taken part in the IIHF World Junior Championships.

FAMILY TIES

- The 2020-21 Notre Dame roster features quite a few family connections to the program and hockey world.
- Two sets of brothers are currently on the roster, including Matt and Alex Steeves and Graham and Landon Slaggert.
- Cam Burke will play his first season without his older brother, Cal Burke, who signed with the Colorado organization following his senior season of 2019-20.
- Freshman forward Brady Bjork is the younger brother of former Irish All-American and current Boston Bruin's player Anders Bjork.

- Seniors Pierce Crawford, Matt Hellickson and Colin Theisen will serve as alternate captains.
- Each of the four players are wearing a letter for the first time in their Irish careers.

NOTRE DAME IN THE 2020 NHL DRAFT

- A pair of Notre Dame freshman forwards were selected on the second day of the 2020 National Hockey League Draft, with Chicago taking Landon Slaggert in the third round (79th overall) and Colorado trading up to pick Ryder Rolston in the fifth round (139th overall).
- Freshman defenseman Jake Boltmann, who has joined the Irish in the midst of the 2020-21 season was also selected in the third round (80th overall) by the Calgary Flames in the 2020 NHL Draft.
- Including Boltmann, Slaggert and Rolston, 88 Notre Dame players have been selected in the NHL Draft with 41 of them being drafted during the Jeff Jackson era.
- Slaggert became Notre Dame's highest selection since Andrew Peeke and Cam Morrison were chosen with the 34th and 40th picks in 2016.
- Rolston, the son of former NHLer and Stanley Cup Champion Brian Rolston joins a pair of current Irish defensemen in Nate Clurman (161st in 2016) and Nick Leivermann (187th in 2017) as Colorado draftees.
- Brian Rolston played 50 games for the Avalanche during the 1999-00 season.
- Ryder Rolston joins an Avalanche organization that saw a pair of former Irish players suit up during the 2019-20 season, including former All-American Ian Cole and former NCAA Div. I Rookie of the Year T.J. Tynan. Recent graduate
- Last season's captain, Cal Burke, signed with the Colorado organization following Notre Dame's 2019-20 season as well.
- Slaggert joins a Blackhawks organization that features Notre Dame alum Stan Bowman as the president and general manager, while this past season recent Irish defenseman Dennis Gilbert played 21 games on the Chicago blue line (he was traded to Colorado in the offseason).
- Recent graduate Cam Morrison also signed a two-year entry-level contract with the Blackhawks in August.
- The Irish have seen at least one player selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft every year since 2004, and in 21 of the last 22 years.

OF NCAA NOTE

- With last season being cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Notre Dame still has a program-best streak of four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in tact.
- It is also the fourth-longest active NCAA appearance streak.
- The Fighting Irish advanced to a regional final for the third consecutive season in 2019, having won regional final games in 2017 and 2018 to advance to back-to-back Frozen Fours.
- Notre Dame is one of three teams to make it to the NCAA Regional Finals in each of the last three NCAA Tournaments, joining Denver and Minnesota Duluth.
- The Fighting Irish have made seven of the last 10 NCAA tournaments, tied for the third most in the NCAA.

THREE GOALS A KEY TO VICTORY

- Over the past four seasons, the Fighting Irish are 55-8-3 when scoring at least three goals (8-4-0 in 2020-21).
- In 2019-20, the Irish were 10-1-2 when scoring at least three times, with the ties coming at Ohio State (Jan. 17) and versus Minnesota (Feb. 14) and the loss coming at home against Wisconsin (Jan. 24).
- In 2018-19, Notre Dame went 17-0-1 when scoring three or more goals.
- The lone tie in 2018-19 came when Notre Dame opened the season on Oct. 12 against Mercyhurst in the Ice Breaker –a game that ended knotted at 6-6 before Notre Dame won the shootout to advance to the championship game.
- The Irish were 20-3-0 when scoring at least three goals in 2017-18.

HEAD COACH JEFF JACKSON



- The 2020–21 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson's 16th season behind the Irish bench. During his first 15 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success, including four trips to the Frozen Four and eight conference championships.
- Jackson has over 30 years of coaching experience and led Notre Dame to back-to-back Big Ten tournament championship seasons in 2018 and 2019 while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 14 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is the only coach to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 16 seasons.
- Jackson's Notre Dame teams have made 10 trips to the NCAA Championship (2007–09, 2011, 2013–14, 2016–19), advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 15-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation's top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006–07 and 2008–09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team's first season in the Big Ten (2017–18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018–19).
- Jackson's success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson's arrival, the Irish have had 35 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft (leading into the 2020 NHL Draft), including three first round selections. In that same span, 26 players from USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program

- During Jackson's tenure, the Irish have had eight players garner All-America honors — Bobby Nardella in 2019, Cale Morris in 2018, Anders Bjork in 2017, Robbie Russo in 2015, Anders Lee in 2013, Ian Cole and Erik Condra in 2009 and David Brown in 2007. In addition, 24 of Jackson's Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2020–21 season with a 20-year collegiate record of 516–258–89 for a .649 winning percentage, the third-highest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2020–21). His 516 career wins rank tied for 12th all-time in Division I and second among active coaches (entering 2020–21).
