DEFENSIVE NOTES:

Hamilton is the first Irish defender with two interceptions in a game since Alohi Gilman against Syracuse in 2018.

Defensive lineman Isaiah Foskey set career-best marks in tackles, tackles-for-loss and sacks all by halftime. He finished the game with eight tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks.

In his first career start, linebacker JD Bertrand led the team with a career-high 11 tackles.

Safety **Houston Griffith** set a career high with eight tackles.

Defensive lineman Rylie Mills set a career high with 1.0 sacks.

Miscellaneous:

- Coin Toss: Avery Davis, Kurt Hinish, Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa and Drew White represented the Irish for the coin toss. Notre Dame won the toss and elected to receive. The Seminoles defended the south-east endzone.
- Brian Kelly awarded the game ball to graduate student Jonathan Doerer. He hit the 41-yard field goal to win the game in overtime.

TEAM NOTES:

- The Irish claimed their 20th-consecutive regular season win over an ACC opponent dating back to the 2017 season.
- The Irish won their 33rd-consecutive game against an unranked opponent, a streak that dates back to the 2016 season.
- Notre Dame improves to 26-5-2 all-time in true road games to open the season.
- The Irish improved to 10-2 in season openers under Brian Kelly.
- The Irish are 4-3 all-time under **Kelly** in overtime games.
- Notre Dame had three interceptions against the Seminoles. It is the most interceptions in a game since last season against Pittsburgh.

OFFENSIVE NOTES:

- Quarterback Jack Coan is the eighth straight Notre Dame starting quarterback to win his debut dating back to the 2007 season.
- **Coan** set a Notre Dame record for most passing yards in a season opening game with 366.
- Coan also tied a Notre Dame season opening record with four passing touchdowns on the night. He tied the record with Jimmy Clausen (2009) and Ron Powlus (1994).
- Tight end Michael Mayer hauled in a career-long 41-yard reception for a touchdown on the opening drive of the game for the Irish.
- Mayer also set a career best mark for receiving yards and receptions. He finished the evening
- with nine receptions for 120 yards. He is the first Irish tight end to surpass the 100-yard plateau since Cole Kmet against Georgia in 2019.
- Wide receiver Joe Wilkins Jr. brought in a career-long 23-yard touchdown reception late in the second quarter.
- Wide receiver Kevin Austin Jr. brought in his first career touchdown reception in the third quarter. He finished the game with career highs in receptions (4) and receiving yards (91).

- Safety Kyle Hamilton finished the night with two interceptions. It is the first game of his career with multiple interceptions.

- Cornerback Clarence Lewis recorded his first career interception in the third quarter.
