MISCELLANEOUS:

- Coin Toss: Wide receiver Avery Davis, defensive lineman Kurt Hinish and linebacker Drew White represented the Irish for the coin toss. Purdue won the toss and elected to defer to the second half. Notre Dame received the kickoff and Purdue defended the north endzone.
- With the win, Brian Kelly tied Knute Rockne for most wins all-time in Notre Dame history with 105 ^
- Kelly awarded the game ball to defensive lineman Kurt Hinish. He finished the game with three tackles.

TEAM NOTES:

- The Irish won their 35th-consecutive game against an unranked opponent, a streak that dates back to the 2016 season.
- With the win, Notre Dame extends its home winning streak to 26 games, the longest of its modern era.
- The Irish held Purdue to 13 points on Saturday, the fewest points for the Boilermakers since Oct. 26, 2019 when they scored only six against Illinois.

OFFENSIVE NOTES:

- Running back Kyren Williams hauled in a 39-yard touchdown pass from Jack Coan in the second quarter. It is his second receiving touchdown of the year, doubling his total from last season.
- Wide receiver Avery Davis corralled a 62-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter, the longest reception of his career.
- ${f Davis}$ surpassed the 100-yard mark on the touchdown, the first 100-yard game of his career.
- Davis finished with a career-high five receptions for 120 yards.
- With the touchdown to Davis, Coan recorded his second touchdown pass of the game. It is
 the first time in his career that he has had three straight games with two or more passing
 touchdowns.
- Coan went over the 200-yard passing mark for the third-straight game for the second time in his career.
- **Kyren Williams** busted off a 51-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter, the longest rush this season by the Irish.
- Williams finished the game with 168 all-purpose yards, the most by an Irish player this season and the third highest of his career.

DEFENSIVE NOTES:

- Linebacker JD Bertrand tied a career high with 12 tackles against Purdue for his third straight game with double-digit tackles. He is the first Irish player to have double-figure tackles in three straight games since Alohi Gilman in 2018-19 (Southern Cal, Clemson and Louisville).
- · Safety **Kyle Hamilton** tied a career high with 10 tackles against Purdue.
- **Hamilton** also recorded an interception, the third of the season and eighth of his career.
- · Linebacker Isaiah Pryor set a career high with eight tackles.
- Safety ${f DJ}$ ${f Brown}$ corralled his first career interception in the fourth quarter.
- Brown finished the game with a career-high seven tackles.
- Defensive end Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa made a career-high five tackles.
- · Defensive end Nana Osafo-Mensah posted the first sack of his career.
