#### MISCELLANEOUS:

- Coin Toss: Running back Kyren Williams, offensive lineman Jarrett Patterson and safety Kyle Hamilton represented the Irish for the coin toss. Notre Dame won the toss and elected to receive. Wisconsin defended the south endzone.
- With the win, Brian Kelly surpassed Knute Rockne for the most wins all-time in Notre Dame history with 106
- Kelly was awarded the game ball by cornerback Cam Hart, quarterback Drew Pyne and James E. Rohr Director of Athletics Jack Swarbrick
- Includes 20 regular-season wins and two postseason appearances vacated under discretionary NCAA penalty.

#### TEAM NOTES:

- Notre Dame improved to 11-0-2 all-time at Soldier Field with the 27-13 win over the Badgers. The Irish hold a 10-0 record in Shamrock Series games after the win.
- Notre Dame tallied four interceptions against Wisconsin. It is the first time they had four in a game since 2013
- in the Pinstripe Bowl against Rutgers. It is the first time since 2002 against Stanford that the Irish returned two interceptions for a touchdown in the same game. (Shane Walton and Courtney Watson).
- The Irish finished with five takeaways in the game, their first game with five takeaways since 2019 against Virginia.
- Notre Dame has won its last seven games in September dating back to the 2019 season.
- The Irish are 4-0 to open the season for the third time in the last four years and the sixth time overall under Kelly
- The 41 points were the most points given up by Wisconsin in a game that ended in regulation since December 6, 2014 against Ohio State (59).

#### **OFFENSIVE NOTES:**

- Junior wide receiver Kevin Austin Jr., set a career high with six receptions against the Badgers. He finished the game with 76 yards and two touchdowns.
- It was the first multiple-touchdown game of Austin's career and he is tied for the team lead with three on the season.
- Freshman quarterback Drew Pyne came in during the third quarter and had a career-long 17-yard pass to Avery Davis.
- He hit **Austin Jr.**, for a 16-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter, his first career touchdown pass. Pyne finished the game with 81 yards on six completions and a touchdown, which were all career-best numbers.
- Sophomore tight end Michael Mayer led the team with seven receptions. It is the third game this season he has had seven or more receptions.

#### **DEFENSIVE NOTES:**

- Linebacker Jack Kiser returned an interception 66-yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. It was his second-career interception and first career touchdown.
- On the ensuing drive in the fourth quarter, linebacker **Drew White** corralled his first-career interception and returned it for a touchdown.
- Sophomore cornerback **Cam Hart** recorded his first-career interception in the second quarter.
- Hart hauled in his second interception in the fourth quarter and is the second Irish player to have two interceptions in the same game this season (**Kyle Hamilton** at Florida State). Senior defensive lineman **Jayson Ademilola** forced a fumble from Wisconsin QB Graham Mertz in the third
- quarter that was recovered by Isaiah Foskey. It was Ademilola's first career forced fumble and Foskey's first career fumble recovery.
- Ademilola set a career high with 2.0 tackles-for-loss, 1.0 sack and tied a career high with five tackles.

## SPECIAL TEAM NOTES:

- Sophomore running back Chris Tyree broke off a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. It is the first Irish kickoff return for a touchdown since CJ Sanders went 92 yards for a touchdown against Armv in 2016
- Junior Jay Bramblett launched a career-long 72-yard punt in the second quarter. It is the longest punt by an Irish player since Hunter Smith had a 79-yard punt against Arizona State in 1998.
