- Coin Toss: Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa, Kurt Hinish and Jarrett Patterson represented the Irish for the coin toss. Stanford won the toss and elected to receive. Notre Dame defended the north endzone.
- Brian Kelly awarded the game ball to tight end Michael Mayer. He set the program record for most receptions by a tight end in a single season and tied the program record for most receptions in a single game by a tight end.

TEAM NOTES:

- Notre Dame reached 11-wins for the ninth time in program history. It is the fourth time under **Brian Kelly** [2012^, 2018, 2019], which is the most by any Notre Dame head coach in school history.
- The Irish set a program record for wins over a five-year span (54) with the win over Stanford. It surpassed the previous record of 53 from 1988-92.
- The Irish finished the season undefeated on the road [4-0]. It is the fourth time under Kelly that the Irish finished the season undefeated on the road (2012[^], 2018 and 2020).
- He is the first coach since Lou Holtz to have back-to-back seasons with undefeated road records (1992 and 1993)
- The Irish have won 42-straight games against unranked opponents. It is the longest active streak in the FBS
- The Irish have won 16-straight games in the month of November dating back to the 2017 season.
- Notre Dame has won 27-consecutive games when they have scored 40 or more points. The Irish are 41-2 all-time under Kelly when they score 40 or more points.
- Notre Dame has won 36-straight games when allowing less than 20 points dating back to 2016.
- It is the first time since at least 1996 that the Irish have held opponents to no points in the first half in three-consecutive games.
- Notre Dame has won 10-straight road games dating back to 2019.
- With the win, it is Notre Dame's fourth-straight win in the state of California. It is the longest-streak in the state of California since they won eight-in-a-row between 1984 and 1993.
- ^Includes 21 wins vacated under discretionary NCAA penalty.

OFFENSIVE NOTES:

- Tight end Michael Mayer set the school record for most receptions [64] by a tight end in a single season with his 34-yard reception in the fourth quarter. He surpassed Tyler Eifert's record of 63 from the 2011
- **Mayer** finished the game with nine receptions for 105 yards, tying the record for most receptions by a tight end in a single game in school history. He tied his mark against Florida State and **Cole Kmet** (2019 at Georgial
- It was Mayer's second-career 100-yard receiving game and the eighth game in his career he has had seven or more catches
- Running back Kyren Williams eclipsed the 1,000 yard mark with his second rushing touchdown of the game in the fourth quarter. He is the first Irish running back to have back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons since **Darius Walker** in 2005 and 2006.
- Williams is the fifth Notre Dame running back in school history to have back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons [Walker, Autry Denson, Allen Pinkett and Vagas Ferguson].
- Williams finished the game with two rushing touchdowns for the third straight game and fifth time this season. It was the eighth-straight game with a rushing touchdown for Williams.
- Williams set his career high with 14 rushing touchdowns on the season. He is tied for seventh all-time for most rushing touchdowns in a single season (Brandon Wimbush, 2017 and Bob Gladieux, 1968).
- Williams also moved into a tie for eighth in program history with Jerome Bettis for most rushing touchdowns for a career (27).
- Quarterback Jack Coan connected with Braden Lenzy for a 16-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter. It was **Coan's** 19th touchdown of the season, setting a career high for him in a single season. **Coan** finished with 345 yards and tied a career high with 26 completions. It is his third-career 300-yard
- game and second with the Irish. Wide receiver **Kevin Austin Jr.** led the Irish with 125 receiving yards and tied a career high with six receptions. It is the second time in his last four games he has eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark.
- **Lenzy** set a career high with four receptions.

- Defensive lineman **Justin Ademilola** forced and recovered his first fumble in the second quarter. He finished the game with two fumble recoveries, the first Irish player to have two in a game since **Daelin** Hayes against Georgia Tech in 2020.
- Linebacker JD Bertrand tied for the team lead in tackles with five. It is the eighth game this season he has led the team in tackles.
- Cornerback Cam Hart set a career high with 2.0 tackles-for-loss.
- The Irish defense allowed just 55 rushing yards to the Cardinal. It was the fewest in a game since they allowed 33 to Clemson in 2020.
