2021-22 FIGHTING IRISH - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team (8-5, 2-1) returns to the road in conference play on Saturday, January 8, making the trip to Georgia Tech (6-7, 0-3) for the first of the annual ACC home-and-home games with the Yellow Jackets. The series is dominated by which ever team is on its home court. The home team in this series, since Notre Dame joined the ACC for the 2013-14 season, is 13-2.

PROJECTED STARTING LINEUP

#23 DANE GOODWIN | Senior | 6-4 | 202 | Upper Arlington, OH

15.1 ppg, 5.5 rpg, .496 FG%, .468 3FG%, .931 FT%

Has stepped up his game at all levels and on both ends of the court this season • reached double figure scoring in all 13 games this season (a career-best streak) • ranked in ACC Top-15 in 3FG% (.496), FG% 12th (.468) and scoring 13th (15.1) • ACC Co-Player of the Week (12/27/21) • reached 1,000 points in a career vs. Western Michigan • one of the best free throw shooters on the team, boasting a .837 career average from the stripe (27-29 this season, which included two game sealing FTs vs. UNC on Wednesday night).

#20 | PAUL ATKINSON JR. | Graduate Student | 6-9 | 230 | West Palm Beach, FL

11.4 ppg, 6.5 rpg, .568 FG%, .769 FT%

A tone setter for the Irish in the post, has hit double-digit scoring in last five of the last six games • 2019-20 Ivy League Player of the Year at Yale • did not participate in 2020-21, as the Ivy League cancelled all intercollegiate athletics • ranked by ESPN+ as the fourth-best transfer prospect in 2020-21 • boasts a .649 career field goal percentage and led Ivy League in FG% all three seasons in which he competed.

#0 BLAKE WESLEY | Freshman | 6-5 | 185 | South Bend, IN

13.7 ppg, .446 FG%, .333 3FG%

One of the most dynamic playmaking freshmen in the ACC • has reached double figures in scoring in 11 of 13 career games, including the last nine straight • ACC Rookie of the Week (12/13/21) • in first career start at home in Purcell Pavilion, hit the game-winning jumper with :12 seconds remaining to upset No. 10/12 Kentucky • third in the ACC in freshman scoring (13.3 ppg) and eighth among all major conference true freshmen in ppg • exploded for 24 points, 18 in the second half at Illinois in the first true road game of his career • first Mike Brey freshman to score 20 points in a career debut (vs. CSUN) since Chris Thomas in 2001 • first South Bend, IN, public school MBB prospect to sign with Notre Dame since 1985.

#3 PRENTISS HUBB | Senior | 6-3 | 176 | Upper Marlboro, MD

7.7 ppg, 3.2 apg

Connected on the game-winning jumper with five seconds remaining at Pittsburgh (12/28/21), capping a 13-point second half where he finished 3-3 from three-point range • edging closer to becoming the ninth Notre Dame player to post 500 career assists (487) • preseason All-ACC Second Team • led the team with 15 points against Boston College, coming off the bench for the first time since the victory at Miami last season • led the Irish in scoring (14.6) and three-point field goals made (65) last season • one of five major conference players to reach 100 assists in league play last season.

#14 NATE LASZEWSKI | Senior | 6-10 | 235 | Jupiter, FL

8.5 ppg, 7.2 rpg, .453 3FG%

(pronounced La-SHEH-skee) • Had his break out game of the season Wednesday vs. North Carolina, leading the Irish with 20 points (6-7 from three point range) and eight rebounds • carries a string of six straight three pointers made into the game at Georgia Tech • improved FG% 19 percent, 3FG% 11% and RPG by 3.1 last season • scored over 20 points four times last season and has six 20-point games in his career.

OFF THE BENCH

#5 CORMAC RYAN | Senior | 6-5 | 195 | New York, NY

8.7 ppg, 4.2 rpg, .358 3FG%, .833 FT%

Has embraced new role off the bench in last three games • one of the team's better on-ball defenders • filled up the stat line against No. 10/12 Kentucky with seven points, five rebounds, four assists and a steal • started 16 of 25 games in his first year with the Irish last season • scored 21 points in the first half in the victory at Duke last year, eventually scoring career-best 28 points • shot .344 from 3FG range last season.

#2 TREY WERTZ | Senior | 6-5 | 192 | Charlotte, NC

5.0 ppg, 2.3 rpg, 3.0 apg

Provides ball handling and scoring a punch off the bench • hit double figures for the first time this season in the victory over No. 10/12 Kentucky with 12 points • planned to sit out 2020-21 season after transferring from Santa Clara until all underclassmen transfers were given immediate eligibility in December of 2020 • appeared in 21 games making 14 starts, shooting .429 from three-point range last season • hit the game-winning 3FG at the buzzer vs. WF in 2021 ACC tournament.

IRISH ITEMS - BY THE NUMBERS

1	With the victory over North Carolina Wednesday, Notre Dame has chalked up a win over the Tar Heels and Kentucky in the same season for the first time in school history. The Irish also own wins over Duke, Kentucky and North Carolina in the most recent meetings between the Irish and the CBB blue bloods.
3.25	Average margin of victory for the winner of the Notre Dame - Georgia Tech game in McCamish Pavilion since 2013-14 (when ND joined the ACC). Georgia Tech is 6-2 in those contests.
6	Three point field goals in a row for senior Nate Laszewski entering the game with Georgia Tech. After his first miss against UNC on Wednesday, Laszewski hit six straight threes. It is the fourth time in his career that the Jupiter, Florida, native has hit six or more three pointers in a game - and second time vs. North Carolina.
7	Notre Dame has won seven straight games in Purcell Pavilion dating back to last season. In those six victories are wins over No. 11/11 Florida State last March, a 66-62 win over No. 10/12 Kentucky on December 11 and a five-point win over North Carolina Wednesday night.
7	Notre Dame will confer a NCAA Division I men's basketball - best seven degrees in the spring of 2022 - undergraduate degrees to R. Carmody, D. Goodwin, P. Hubb, N. Laszewski, C. Ryan and T. Wertz, along with a graduate degree to P. Atkinson Jr.
13	Career-best streak of double-digit scoring games for senior Dane Goodwin - all 13 games this season - who leads the Irish at 15.1 ppg.
13.7	Points-per-game average for Blake Wesley , which is the third-best average in the ACC and sixth-best among major conference true freshman (see page 4 for more details).
53	Three point field goals for the Irish during their four-game win streak. The Irish are 53-113 (.469) from behind the arc in the last four contests.
70	Assists for the Irish over the past four victories - an average of 17.5 per contest.
77	Team free throw percentage for the Irish this season (77.0), tops in the ACC and 29th in the nation.
922	Career points for senior Nate Laszewski , who seeks to become the 67th Notre Dame player and 26th recruited by Mike Brey to score 1,000 points in a career.
981	Career points of those points at Santa Clara from 2018-20.

WESLEY'S SOLID START AMONG THE BEST ROOKIES OF BREY ERA

Freshman Blake Wesley has started the last seven games and has reached double figures in scoring after 11 of his first 13 career games. He is now tied for fifth among Brey era true freshman in double-digit scoring games and joined Chris Thomas and Luke Harangody as the only rookies to reach that plateau in eight of their first 10 games.

Thomas eventually finished 2001-02 by scoring in double digits 24 of 33 games (and in 12 of his first 14 career games). His longest streak of double-digit scoring games that season was nine.

Harangody compiled 2006-07 by scoring double digits in 22 of 32 games (and in 14 of his first 18 games). His longest streak of double-digit scoring games was six. Torin Francis finished 2002-03 with 19 double digit scoring games in 34 total appearances – his longest double-digit scoring game streak was five games.

NOTRE DAME WILL MAKE TRIP TO HOWARD ON MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team will travel to Washington, D.C., on Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Monday, January 17, 2022, to face Howard University. The trip will mark the first road game for Notre Dame men's basketball against one of the countries Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

The game was previously scheduled for January 18, 2021, but was postponed due to the health and safety regulations put in place for the coronavirus pandemic. The game will be played at Howard's Burr Gymnasium and nationally broadcast on Fox at 2:30 p.m. ET.

"I am as excited about this trip than any game we have scheduled for next season," Glenn and Stacey Murphy Head Men's Basketball Coach Mike Brey said.

"We were so disappointed that we had to cancel last season's game due to the pandemic, but the delay gives us an opportunity to really do it right. This game deserves the kind of atmosphere that only a full house at Burr Gymnasium can deliver. Our program's first trip to an HBCU on Martin Luther King Jr. Day is another step in our commitment to remaining active participants in the push for social change in this country. This event will provide an amazing educational experience for our student-athletes, coaches, support staff and University."

Since 2019, Howard has honored Dr. King's Celebration of Excellence by hosting non conference contests with iconic, historical institutions. In the past two seasons, HU has greeted Ivy League perennials Harvard (2019) and Yale (2020) to The Burr.

"Dr. King's impact on our world is remarkable, and his influence continues to be both felt and needed," Howard head coach Kenny Blakeney said.

"It gives me chills to think that only a few miles from where Dr. King shifted the country with his infamous speeches, marches and meetings, our basketball programs will have a historic first by hosting Notre Dame at Howard University. We are pressing forward toward the beloved community Dr. King sought to achieve and I am honored to lead this program and work with my lifelong friend, Coach Mike Brey, to deepen the call for social justice with our players."

The connections between Notre Dame men's basketball, the Howard coaching staff and the Washington, DC, area run deep. Mike Brey graduated from DeMatha High School. Kenny Blakeney also is a DeMatha graduate, played at Duke (1992-95) while Mike Brey was an assistant with the Blue Devils and was the head assistant coach under Brey at Delaware (2002-05).

The game also marks the return to the D.C. area for Irish senior Prentiss Hubb (Upper Marlboro), who graduated from Gonzaga High School. Hubb is the latest Notre Dame standout to call the Washington, D.C., area home, as the 'D.C. Pipeline' has included Austin Carr, Adrian Dantley, Jerian Grant, Bob Whitmore, Don Williams, Monty Williams, Collis Jones, Tracy Jackson, Tom Sluby, Sid Catlett and Notre Dame President Emeritus Rev. Edward A. Malloy, C.S.C.

Notre Dame has welcomed 10 different HBCUs to campus for 12 men's basketball games throughout the program's history. The trip to Howard will be the first road trip for the Irish to an HBCU and the first for an Atlantic Coast Conference team since Miami (Florida) played at Savannah State on December 19, 2013.

The contest marks the first against a Power Five Conference team for Howard at home since Oregon State visited Burr Gymnasium on November 27, 2010.

MIKE BREY, GLENN AND STACEY MURPHY HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH

22nd Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 555-305 | ND Record: 456-253

In 22 seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to over 450 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 117-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.
