IRISH ITEMS - BY THE NUMBERS

3	There are only three true freshman in the country who have scored 350 points with 85 rebounds, 60 assists and 25 steals - Duke's Paolo Banchemo, Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Lofton Jr. and South Bend's own Blake Wesley (356, 88, 64 and 29).
5	Notre Dame is the first team in the nation this season to have five 1,000 career point scorers on its roster - Paul Atkinson Jr., Dane Goodwin, Prentiss Hubb, Trey Wertz and Nate Laszewski.
5.7	Assist/turnover ratio for senior Prentiss Hubb in ACC play this year - the best for any player in the country in conference play.
7	Notre Dame has earned seven wins away from Purcell Pavilion this season which matches Arizona, Villanova, Southern Cal and Auburn as the most for any major conference team.
11	With 11 wins in their first 14 ACC games, the 2021-22 team has matched the 2014-15 squad for the best start to ACC competition in program history.
18	Points scored in the first 10 minutes of the victory at Clemson on Saturday by Blake Wesley , who started the game 6-for-6 from the field and 4-for-4 from the three point line.
38	Three-point shooting percentage by the Irish in ACC play this season, which is fourth in the league. Notre Dame also is holding its opponents to .295 from behind the arc in ACC play, the second-best in the league.
57	KenPom.com adjusted defensive efficiency ranking for Notre Dame, the best for the Irish since they finished the 2016-17 season 61st.
65	Notre Dame has held its last seven ACC opponents to 65 points or less - the best major conference current streak and the best of the ACC era (2013-14 - current). The Irish also have held a program-best eight conference teams to 65 points or less this season.

HUBB'S CLUTCH MOMENTS

Senior Prentiss Hubb has posted three game-winning moments this season to further enhance his legacy of stepping up in clutch situations throughout his Irish career.

2018-19 - thrust into the starting lineup due to an illness to T.J. Gibbs, Hubb scores 16 points and puts the Irish ahead 67-66 with two free throws with **2.8 seconds left** against Boston College. The Irish eventually won the game 69-66.

2019-20 - his three pointer with 1:20 left ties the game at Syracuse, then his two free throws with **:18 left** seal the 88-87 victory.

2019-20 - converts five of six free throws in the final minutes of the game as the Irish win 78-74 at Georgia Tech.

2019-20 - drives the length of the court **in the closing seconds** at Boston College, finding T.J. Gibbs for the game-winning jumper in the lane at the buzzer.

2020-21 - scores the final 11 points of the game against Kentucky, including **the game-winning drive** to the bucket for a 64-63 win.

2020-21 - his 28-foot three pointer with **:37 seconds left** puts Notre Dame up five in the 93-89 victory at Duke.

2021-22 - connects on the game-winning turnaround jump shot **with :05 left** in the 68-67 victory at Pittsburgh.

2021-22 - turns in a clutch drive to the hoop at Howard **with :19 remaining**, turning a one-point lead into the three-point winning margin (71-68). It was Hubb's first game back in the DMV after his prep hoops career at Gonzaga.

2021-22 - steps to the line **with :04 left** and sinks both free throws to secure a 69-65 victory over Virginia.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTED BY 1,000 POINT SCORERS

Notre Dame has produced 67 1,000 point scorers throughout the history of the program with 26 of those players having been recruited by Mike Brey and exhausted their eligibility (or turned professional early).

Just this season alone, Dane Goodwin, Trey Wertz (who scored 747 of his career points at Santa Clara) and Nate Laszewski have reached the 1,000-point plateau. Along with Paul Atkinson Jr. and Prentiss Hubb, Notre Dame is the first program in the nation this year to have five players with over 1,000 point scored in a career.

IN OVERTIME

In 22 seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to over 460 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 117-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

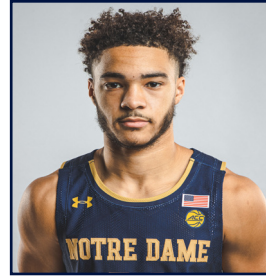

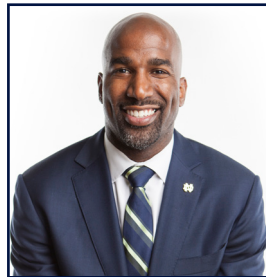
