IRISH ITEMS - BY THE NUMBERS

1	Freshman Blake Wesley is poised to become the first rookie in the country this season to reach 400 points, 100 rebounds, 50 3FGM, 70 assists and 30 steals. See page 4 for more details.
5	Notre Dame is the first team in the nation this season to have five 1,000 career point scorers on its roster - Paul Atkinson Jr., Dane Goodwin, Prentiss Hubb, Trey Wertz and Nate Laszewski.
4.85	Assist/turnover ratio for senior Prentiss Hubb in ACC play this year - the best for any player in the country in conference play. Hubb has dished out 63 assists in league play this season and given the ball away just 13 times.
11.0	Points per game average for senior Cormac Ryan since stepping into the starting lineup against Louisville on Feb. 9. In four games, Ryan is shooting .483 from the field, .500 from three-point range (7-for-14) with 4.5 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game.
12	Notre Dame has 12 wins in ACC play this season, earning a 13th would match the 2011-12 BIG EAST team for the second-most league wins in a single season. The high mark is 14 league wins for the program in 2014-14 (ACC) and 2007-08/2010-11 (BIG EAST).
17.6	Points per game average over the last four games for Blake Wesley . In that stretch he has shot .500 from the field (32-64), .481 from three-point range (13-27), with 4.4 rebounds per game, 2.2 assists and 2.2 steals.
46	At .464 senior Dane Goodwin continues to lead the ACC in three-point field goal shooting in all games. That mark is good for 17th in the country.
58	Or .582 to be precise - graduate student Paul Atkinson Jr.'s field goal percentage in ACC play this season - second in the league behind Duke's Mark Williams.

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team is back in Purcell Pavilion for a two-game stretch, starting with Wednesday's game with Syracuse at 7 p.m. ET on ESPNNews. The Irish and Orange were originally schedule to meet on Feb. 22, but a COVID-19 delay pushed the Orange to play a game Monday night at home - a contest in which Syracuse defeated Georgia Tech in overtime.

The ACC then pushed the game a day to provide rest of Syracuse after Monday night's contest.

HUBB'S CLUTCH MOMENTS

Senior Prentiss Hubb has posted four game-winning moments this season to further enhance his legacy of stepping up in clutch situations throughout his Irish career.

2018-19 - thrust into the starting lineup due to an illness to T.J. Gibbs, Hubb scores 16 points and puts the Irish ahead 67-66 with two free throws with **2.8 seconds left** against Boston College. The Irish eventually won the game 69-66.

2019-20 - his three pointer with 1:20 left ties the game at Syracuse, then his two free throws with **:18 left** seal the 88-87 victory.

2019-20 - converts five of six free throws in the final minutes of the game as the Irish win 78-74 at Georgia Tech.

2019-20 - drives the length of the court **in the closing seconds** at Boston College, finding T.J. Gibbs for the game-winning jumper in the lane at the buzzer.

2020-21 - scores the final 11 points of the game against Kentucky, including **the game-winning drive** to the bucket for a 64-63 win.

2020-21 - his 28-foot three pointer with **:37 seconds left** puts Notre Dame up five in the 93-89 victory at Duke.

2021-22 - connects on the game-winning turnaround jump shot **with :05 left** in the 68-67 victory at Pittsburgh.

2021-22 - turns in a clutch drive to the hoop at Howard **with :19 remaining**, turning a one-point lead into the three-point winning margin (71-68). It was Hubb's first game back in the DMV after his prep hoops career at Gonzaga.

2021-22 - steps to the line **with :04 left** and sinks both free throws to secure a 69-65 victory over Virginia.

2021-22 - in overtime against Boston College, hits a turnaround jumper **with :10 left** to put the Irish up three, then steals the next inbound pass, is fouled and hits two free throws to put the Irish up five. After a BC desperation three pointer is scored, calmly hits two more free throws to seal the game. Ended up scoring six points in 10 seconds to secure the victory.

A DECADE OF 'NO FOUL' CONTINUES

One of the mantras of Notre Dame basketball under Mike Brey has been to keep the amount of opponent foul shots down. Defend without fouling is a way of life for Irish basketball and the statistics bear out that trend.

In the last 13 years, Notre Dame has failed to finish among the top 10 in least amount of personal fouls committed just twice. They have also led the country in least amount of personal fouls three times.

The NCAA has been tracking the least amount of fouls committed in a season since 1993. Notre Dame is the only team since 1993 to lead the country in least amount of fouls more than twice and the Irish finished the 2020-21 season second in the NCAA.

IN OVERTIME

In 22 seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to over 460 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 117-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

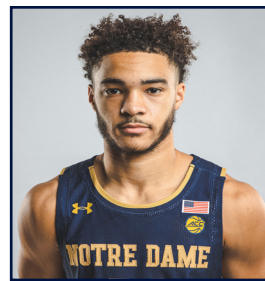
