NOTRE DAME FIGHTING IRISH

CAL OPENS ROAD SLATE AT NOTRE DAME

ABOUT THE SERIES

- This will be the fifth all-time meeting between California and Notre Dame, but first since 1967.
- It will be the first game in 55 years between the two programs with the Fighting Irish having won all four of the previous matchups in 1959, 1960, 1965 and 1967

OTT-STANT IMPACT

- Freshman running back Jaydn Ott has immediately made his presence known in the first two games of the season, rushing for 156 yards on 17 carries while adding five receptions for 42 yards and his first career touchdown. Ott was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week for the second consecutive time on Monday, the first Bear to earn the honor in back-to-back weeks since its inception in 2019. Lu-Magia Hearns III is the only other Cal player to pick up the honor after the Golden Bears' 2021 Big Game victory at Stanford.
- Ott has proven to be a threat both running the ball and receiving out of the backfield, currently ranking eighth in the Pac-12 in all purpose yards through the first two weeks of the season. The Chino, California native is averaging 99 yards per game with 156 rushing and 42 receiving yards in two games. Ott is the only freshman to rank in the Top 10 of the conference in all purpose yards.
- With 156 yards rushing in the first two games of the season, Ott ranks fourth in the Pac-12 Conference. Ott is the top freshman rusher in the Pac-12 and sixth overall in the conference.

EASTERN TIME. NO PROBLEM

- Cal has played a pair of games in the eastern time zone under current head coach Justin Wilcox and has returned to the west coast victorious both times. The Bears opened the 2017 season with a 35-30 triumph at North Carolina in Wilcox's first game as head coach and won 28-20 at Ole Miss in 2019.

ROAD OPENERS

- The Bears have a 3-2 record in road openers under head coach Justin Wilcox.
- Cal won 35-30 at North Carolina in 2017, 21-18 at BYU in 2018 and earned a 20-19 victory at No. 12 Washington in 2019.
- The last two road openers have been defeats to UCLA in 2020 (34-10) and a back-and-forth loss at TCU to open last season (34-32).

DEFENSIVE MINDED

- California's defense has been strong in several areas through the first two games of the season, ranking third in the Pac-12 and No. 23 nationally in scoring defense. The Bears have held six of their last eight opponents to 14 points or less dating back to last season.
- The Bears are tied for second in the Pac-12 and tied for seventh in the country with one defensive touchdown.
- Cal is second in the Pac-12 and No. 18 in the nation with three interceptions through the first two weeks. Craig Woodson, Jeremiah Earby and Isaiah Young have each grabbed a pick, with Young's sealing the week two win over UNLV.
- Woodson returned from an injury that cost him the entire 2021 season and took an interception back 39 yards for a touchdown, the first score of his career in Cal's season-opening 34-13 win over UC Davis.
- Cal's starting inside linebacker duo of Jackson Sirmon (17) and Oluwafemi Oladejo (16) have been all over the field for the Bears, leading the team in tackles.

STARKEY'S FINAL PLAY

- Legendary Hall of Fame broadcaster Joe Starkey, best known for his "the band is out on the field" call of "The Play" in 1982, announced Thursday that he will retire as Cal's football radio play-by-play announcer following the 2022 campaign.
- In Starkey's 48th and final season on the mic, the 2022 Golden Bears will travel to Notre Dame to face the Fighting Irish for the first time in 55 years, celebrate the 125th Big Game and 40th anniversary of The Play in Berkeley, and host "Joe Starkey Day" for the regular-season finale in Strawberry Canyon against UCLA.
- Starkey has also had an array of broadcasting duties with professional sports organizations during his career that he mostly fulfilled in conjunction with his Cal duties, highlighted by a 22-year stint on the San Francisco 49ers' radio broadcast team (1987-2008) that included the final 20 campaigns as the play-by-play voice. The 49ers won their most recent three Super Bowls (XXIII, XXIV, XXIX) during Starkey's tenure with the team as he described plays for Pro Football Hall of Famers Joe Montana, Jerry Rice and Steve Young, among others.

JOHNSON LOST FOR THE YEAR

- Cal's Travers Family Head Football Coach announced Saturday that Brett Johnson will miss the 2022 season due to a lower-body injury sustained during a team practice on Thursday. The injury is unrelated to the broken hip that Johnson had surgically repaired after an automobile accident in March of 2021 that caused him to miss all of the 2021 campaign.
- "Brett is one of the toughest and most dedicated football players I have ever been around," Wilcox said. "Although this is a difficult situation for him, I am confident that he will return to the field in 2023. He has the unwavering support of all his coaches, teammates and everyone in our football program. It is important for us to rally around each other as a team and respond positively to this adversity."

PROMOS AND GIVEAWAYS

- Cal football fans will have plenty of exciting reasons to be in attendance at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium in 2022. The long list is highlighted by special giveaways, including a Cameron Jordan Bobblehead and Replica Axe for the first 10,000 fans through the gates at each of the Golden Bears' final two home contests against Stanford and UCLA.

- Special ticket offers for healthcare workers, scouts and teachers will be available, respectively, for the first three contests (UC Davis, UNLV, Arizona), while another one will be available to youth sports organizations for the regular-season finale against the Bruins.
- The home schedule also includes traditional events including Homecoming (Arizona), the Cal Athletics Hall of Fame Game (Washington), and the Joe Roth Game/Senior Day (UCLA).
- In addition, the Bears will celebrate the 40th anniversary of The Play and the 125th Big Game against Stanford as well "Joe Starkey Day" against UCLA honoring longtime radio broadcaster Joe Starkey, who will retire at the end of the season after 48 years calling Cal games.

BUILDING SUCCESS UNDER JUSTIN WILCOX

- Cal has a long list of achievements during the first five seasons under Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox including ...
 - Back-to-back winning seasons and bowl game appearances in 2018 and 2019 for the first time since 2008 and 2009
 - Two landmark victories over both Stanford and USC to end lengthy losing streaks to both schools
 - Back-to-back Big Game road victories at Stanford in 2019 and 2021 to make Wilcox only the fifth Cal head coach in history to accomplish the feat and only the second along with Jeff Tedford to do so in the last 70 seasons since Pappy Waldorf won three straight on The Farm from 1947-51
 - Four victories that knocked off a combination of five reigning or current Pac-12 champions with the Bears beating USC (2017 champion) and Washington (2018 champion) in 2018, defending champion Washington again in 2019, and in 2020 an Oregon squad that had captured the Pac-12 crown in both 2019 and 2020
 - A strong second half of the season in 2021 with a 4-2 record over the final six games with home victories over Colorado, Oregon State and USC with the win over the Trojans the first in Berkeley since 2003, as well as the second straight Big Game road triumph at Stanford
 - Victories over ranked teams during each of the first four campaigns of Wilcox's tenure (2017 vs. No. 8/9 Washington State; 2018 vs. No. 15/13 Washington; 2019 vs. No. 14/12 Washington; and 2020 vs. No. 23/21/20 Oregon)
 - An 11-3 record in non-conference games during Wilcox's tenure, including a 5-2 mark against Power 5 teams with home and away wins over North Carolina (ACC) and Ole Miss (SEC), as well as a 2019 Redbox Bowl win over Illinois (Big Ten)
 - Finished the 2019 season with an 8-5 record that equaled Cal's best since the Golden Bears were 9-4 in 2008 and tied for second place in the Pac-12 North for their highest finish in the division since the conference went to two divisions in 2011
 - Posted back-to-back seasons of .500 or better records on the road for first time since 2004 (5-1) and 2005 (3-2) when they went 4-2 in 2019 after going 3-2 in 2018
 - Reclaimed The Axe in both 2019 by defeating Stanford for the first time since 2009 and then got The Axe back in 2021 with a 41-11 victory over the Cardinal that was its largest in the series since 2004, both at Stanford Stadium
 - Won back-to-back road games in Los Angeles (USC in 2018 and UCLA in 2019) for the first time since 1970-71 (the Bears also won in 1999 at UCLA and 2000 at USC, but the 1999 victory at UCLA was later forfeited due to the use of ineligible players)
 - Won on the road in 2018 and 2019 at all three of its California rivals (Stanford, UCLA, USC) over a two-year span for the first time since 1949-50

PLUMMER THROWS THREE TD'S IN DEBUT

- Purdue transfer Jack Plummer has started each of Cal's first two games and is the Golden Bears' first new starter at quarterback since Chase Garbers assumed the role during the 2018 campaign and started every game he didn't miss due to injury or illness through the 2021 season.
- Plummer leads the Pac-12 and ranks eighth nationally in pass completions per game (25.5) while also ranking third in the conference in passing yards (546) and passing yards per game (273.0), and fourth in total offense per game (260.0).
- Plummer has completed 68.9% of his passes (51-of-74) and has a 143.3 guarterback rating that is ????th all-time at Cal
- Plummer was 23-of-35 for 268 yards with three touchdowns and one interception in his Cal debut against UC Davis (152.6 QBR) and 28-of-39 for 278 with one TD and one pick against UNLV (135.0 QBR).
- Plummer played in 21 games with 13 starts over his last three seasons during his four campaigns at Purdue (2018-21) and completed 319-of-492 passes (64.8%) for 3405 yards with 26 touchdowns and 10 interceptions for a 136.35 quarterback rating.
- Kai Millner is the only other quarterback of the six on the Cal roster to have taken a collegiate snap. Miller made his debut by playing the final series (six snaps) in the season-opener against UC Davis.

TRUE FRESHMAN JAYDN OTT MAKING INSTANT IMPACT

- Jaydn Ott ranks third in the Pac-12 in rush yards per carry (6.5) while he is fourth in rushing yards (156) and rushing yards per game (78.0), which leads all Pac-12 freshmen and is fourth in the country.
- Ott rushed for 104 yards on 17 carries while adding two receptions for 26 yards and his first career touchdown in the season opening 34-13 win over UC Davis. Ott's 130 yards from scrimmage (rushing and receiving) against were the most by a Cal player in his debut since Keenan Allen had 158 yards (120 receiving, 38 rushing) his first time on the field also against UC Davis on Sept. 4, 2010, while Ott's 104 yards rushing marked the first time a player had 100 or more yards rushing in his debut since Shane Vereen against Michigan State on Aug. 30, 2018. Ott was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week.
- In his second game against UNLV, Ott became the first Cal player to have both a rushing and receiving touchdown in a contest since Christopher Brown Jr. against Washington State on Nov. 9, 2019. Ott had one of each in the first quarter before finishing with seven rushes for 52 yards and a career-high three receptions for 16 yards.
- Cal's top returning rusher is 2022 preseason Doak Walker Award candidate Damien Moore, who has played in 17 career games with 10 starts over the last two-plus campaigns including both contests in 2022 and totaled 744 yards rushing and six touchdowns on the ground on 147 carries.
- DeCarlos Brooks has toted the rock 18 times in the first two games of 2022 for 57 yards after coming into the season with total of 10 carries for 96 yards.

A NEW ERA IS UNDERWAY

- With a trio of fifth-year senior tight ends from 2021 having moved on (Collin Moore, Gavin Reinwald Jake Tonges), sophomore Jermaine Terry II and Keleki Latu have taken the top two spots on the depth chart after making their debuts a year ago. Latu is coming off the most productive game of his career in his most recent outing against UNLV when he had career highs of four receptions and 45 yards receiving, while Terry has made both starts at the position in 2022.
- Cal also returns Nick Alftin and Elijah Mojarro with Alftin having seen action at the position in each of the last five seasons while also briefly spending time at outside linebacker in 2019. Alftin is also one of the team's top special teams' players and recorded a pair of blocked punts in 2021, while Mojarro has played both tight end and on special teams each of the past three campaigns since making his debut in 2020.
- Jake Muller is also back after redshirting without seeing any action as a 2021 true freshman, while the Bears have two players who made the switch from linebacker to the tight end in the spring of 2022 in ILB Andy Alfieri and OLB Jeffrey Johnson with Alfieri appearing in both 2022 games and making his first career reception for five yards against UNLV.
- The lone true freshman tight end is Jack Endries, a first-team All-East Bay Athletic League Mountain Division selection in each of his final two seasons at Monte Vista HS who combined for career prep totals of 77 receptions, 1055 yards receiving and 15 touchdown catches. Endries has yet to play,

YOUNG RECEIVER GROUP IMPRESSIVE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- Cal's seven returning receivers had made just a single start between them prior to the 2022 season but that previous inexperience hasn't proven to be an issue in the first two games of the campaign with the position having combined to haul in 33 receptions and 416 yards of the team's 51 catches for 546 yards overall.
- The trio of Jeremiah Hunter (11-157, 1 TD), J.Michael Sturdivant (10-104) and Mavin Anderson (7-60, 1 TD) have led the way and rank as the team's top three receivers in both receptions and yards receiving in 2022. Hunter is also fifth in the Pac-12 in receiving yards (157) and receiving yards per game (78.5), as well as seventh in receptions per game (5.5) Sturdivant is ninth (5.0).
- Hunter equaled his previous career highs with six receptions, 78 receiving yards and one touchdown catch in the season opener against UC Davis then bettered his career high by a single receiving yard with 79 against UNLV on five catches.
- The receiving numbers for the redshirt freshmen Sturdivant and Anderson are the first of their careers with Sturdivant seeing limited action in four games mostly on special teams and Anderson not playing in 2021.
- Fifth-year senior Monroe Young (3-47) has seen the next most action among the wide outs. Mason Mangum had a career-long 31-yard catch against UNLV, while Tommy Christakos' 17-yard reception against UC Davis was the first of his career.
- The 2022 group is being tasked with replacing the departed trio of Kekoa Crawford (40-513), Nikko Remigio (38-238, 2 TD) and Trevon Clark (33-658, 4 TD), who combined for 111 catches, 1409 yards receiving and six touchdowns catch in 2021.

NEW LOOK OFFENSIVE LINE HAS BEEN SIMILAR FIRST TWO CONTESTS

- Cal has started the same five players in each of its first two games of 2022 with the starting lineup consisting of LT Ben Coleman, LG Brian Driscoll, C Matthew Cindric, RG Spencer Lovell and RT Brayden Rohme. Coleman, Driscoll, Cindric and Lovell have each played all but one series and 143 of the team's 149 offensive snaps, while Rohme has played 84 snaps with T.J. Session getting 65 at the same position.
- Four other offensive lineman (LT Everett Johnson, LG Sioape Vatikani, C Bastian Swinney, RG Ender Aguilar) have played in a single series and six snaps against UC Davis.
- Cal has eight players on its 2022 roster who have started at least one game on the offensive line for the Golden Bears in Cindric (29), Coleman (13), Rohme (8), Driscoll (2), Lovell (2), Johnson (1) and Swinney (1).
- Cindric was recognized with numerous 2022 preseason honors as an All-Pac-12 third-team (Athlon). fourth-team (Phil Steele) and honorable mention (Pac-12 Media) selection who is also on the Rimington Trophy and Wuerffel Trophy watch lists, is Cal's nominee for the prestigious Campbell Trophy also known as the "academic Heisman" and was one of two Cal representatives at Pac-12 Football Media Day.
- Coleman was also honored in the 2022 preseason as an All-Pac-12 third-team (Athlon, Phil Steele) and honorable mention (Pac-12 Media) pick.
- Cal bolstered its 2022 group up front with the additions of transfers Lovell (Arizona State) and Session (Montana State) with Lovell having played in 27 games with three starts for the Sun Devils from 2018-21 and Session starting each of the 10 games he played as a redshirt freshman for the Bobcats in 2021.
- Cal is looking to build on a 2021 offensive line that helped the Golden Bears roll up over 500 yards of total offense in three contests (636 at Stanford, 534 vs. Sacramento State, 517 vs. Oregon State) and more than 200 yards rushing on four occasions (352 at Stanford, 255 vs. Oregon State, 246 vs. Sacramento State, 213 vs. Colorado), while also breaking a Big Game record with 636 total yards of offense in a 41-11 win at Stanford that were its most since also compiling 636 in a double overtime home victory over Oregon in 2016, while the Golden Bears' 352 rushing yards against the Cardinal were their most since rushing for 431 against Washington in 2008

- A talented 2022 defensive line group has been forced to battle through the loss of three players for the 2022 season due to season-ending injuries to DL Brett Johnson (traning camp) and DE Derek Wilkins (spring game) as well as the absence of NG Stanley McKenzie, who is not with the Golden Bears for the 2022 season
- Ricky Correia and Ethan Saunders have each started the first two games at an official defensive line designation in 2022 with Correia contributing six tackles and Saunders three stops for a Cal defense that often plays nickel with two outside linebackers essentially serving as hybrid outside linebackers/ defensive ends
- Correia garnered a 2022 preseason All-Pac-12 fourth-team selection from Phil Steele
- Nate Burrell, Darius Long Jr. and Jaedon Roberts have each played in both games off the bench while Gunnar Rask got in the UC Davis contest
- Calhoun is back at defensive end after spending time at outside linebacker this past spring, while Burrell and Elijah Diaz have joined the roster in 2022
- 2021 starters Luc Bequette and JH Tevis departed with Bequette having played in 64 collegiate games and making 60 starts over seven seasons with Cal (2015-21) and Boston College (2020)

INSIDE LINEBACKERS PRODUCTIVE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- The starting linebacker duo of Jackson Sirmon (17) and Oluwafemi Oladejo (16) rank first and second in tackles over the first two contests. Sirmon also has 1.0 sack (-1 yard), 1.0 tackle for loss (-1 yard) and one forced fumble, while Oladejo has added 0.5 tackles for loss (-1 yard), one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry. Sirmon's eight tackles against UC Davis were a team-high and tied for a game-high while Oladejo's career-high 10 stops against UNLV were a game-high followed by Sirmon's Cal career-high nine.
- The inside linebacker position group is Cal's most experienced with five different players having made collegiate starts and combining for totals of 83 games played and 41 starts including Sirmon (35/18), Muelu losefa (14/12), Trey Paster (14/5), Nate Rutchena (9/3) and Oladejo (11/3).
- Sirmon, the son of Cal defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach Peter Sirmon and a graudate transfer from Washington, earned consensus 2022 preseason first-team All-Pac-12 honors (Athlon, Pac-12 Media, Phil Steele) and was the second-leading returning tackler in the Pac-12. Sirmon earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 honors as a 2021 junior when he started all 12 games and finished tied for fifth in the Pac-12 with a career-high 92 tackles while adding one forced fumble.
- losefa was Cal's third-leading tackler in 2021 with 59 stops while three others had 25 tackles or more (Oladejo 36, Rutchena 35, Paster 25), while Paster also had two fumble recoveries including a memorable 55-yard return for a touchdown against USC and Rutchena a team-high-tying three picks.

CARLTON PROVIDING IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- Utah transfer Xavier Carlton has made an immediate impact in his first two games at Cal by leading the Golden Bears in both tackles for loss and sacks (2.5, -11 yards for each) among his six tackles. Carlton registered 1.5 tackles for loss and sacks (-6 yards) against UC Davis and then picked up another 1.0 of each vs. UNLV. He had three tackles in both contests.
- Myles Jernigan has contributed nine tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss (-4 yards), 0.5 sacks (-4 yards) and one quarterback hurry. He had a career-high five tackles against UC Davis as well as 0.5 tackles for loss and sacks (-4 yards) against UC Davis and then made his first career start against UNLV and picked up four more tackles and another 0.5 tackles for loss (-0 yards).
- UCLA transfer Udoa Isibor has started each of Cal's first two games and contributed four tackles. The sixth-year senior has played in 44 collegiate games overall with 16 starts while spending much of his time with the Bruins playing on the defensive line.
- Only two of the four players with collegiate experience had ever played for the Golden Bears at the outside linebacker position prior to 2022 in Braxten Croteau and Orin Patu. After playing in both of the first two games and starting the opener, Croteau has now played in 29 games at Cal with 10 starts. Patu has played in each of the first two contests off the bench and 18 in his career with one start. Croteau has four tackles in the first two games including a key tackle for loss (-6 yards) against UNLV while Patu has yet to record any statistics other than participation in 2022.
- Henry Ikahihifo and Myles Williams have both made their Cal debuts in 2022 with Ikahihifo picking up a key 13-yard sack late in the fourth quarter to help secure Cal's win over UNLV after Williams had a four-vard sack earlier in the contest in his first game at Cal.

- Hearns made a strong impression during his 2021 true freshman season when he earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 honors and honorable mention recognition for Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year presented by Nextiva honors, both from the league's coaches. Hearns played in 11 games with eight starts in 2021 and posted stats that were highlighted by 28 tackles, one interception in the Big Game against Stanford, one fumble recovery and team highs of 10 pass breakups that ranked tied for second in the Pac-12 and 11 passes defended that were third.

SAFETY ROOM BOLSTERED BY DEPTH

- The seven players listed as safeties on Cal's 2022 roster have combined to play in 135 collegiate games with 37 starts with sixth-year senior Daniel Scott the most experienced of the group having played in 39 games with 18 starts. Scott is Cal's only current player who was on the roster when Justin Wilcox became head coach in 2017. He has career totals of 131 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss (-39 yards) and four picks he has returned for six yards and one touchdown.
- Scott has nine tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss (-2 yards), one pass breakup and a team-high two quarterbacks hurries in 2022 with both of the hurries coming back-to-back on key fourth-quarter plays to thwart UNLV's comeback attempt.
- Craig Woodson has returned from an injury that cost him the entire 2021 season and started each of the two games at the other safety position opposite Scott, Woodson has eight tackles, one pass breakup and took an interception back 39 yards for a touchdown against UC Davis for the first score of his career. Woodson also tallied three tackles in the season-opening win.
- Returnees Miles Williams and Raymond Woodie III have each played in all 14 games since the beginning of the 2021 campaign. Williams is also listed as the backup nickelback behind Collin Gamble in 2022.
- Hunter Barth and Chattanooga transfer sixth-year senior Demetric Jackson Jr. have played primarily on special teams.

- Sheahan is a former Australian Rules Football player has partcipated in all 18 of his career games over the last three seasons after starting his career in 2020 having never punted in an American football game. He is the Pac-12's leading punter over the first two games of 2022 with a 48.3 yard average.
- Zellers has played in each of the past 31 Cal games over the last three campaigns after redshirting as a 2018 true freshman and was a member of the Patrick Mannelly Long Snapper Award Preseason Watch List in 2022 for the first time in his career and the No. 1 draft-eligible long snapper for the 2023 NFL Draft according to Phil Steele.
- Michael Luckhurst has played in each of Cal's first two games in 2022, kicking off once in each contest.
- Nick Lopez also returns after playing two games in 2021 including his Cal debut when he filled in for Longhetto at Arizona and made his lone field goal attempt while kicking off three times (61.0 avg).

Justin Wilcox is in his sixth season as the Travers Family Head Football Coach at Cal in 2022. Wilcox signed a contract extension through the 2027 campaign this past January.

"I appreciate the opportunity to be the head football coach at Cal and am excited about the future of our program," Wilcox said in the announcement of his extension. "I have thoroughly enjoyed every minute I have spent with the extraordinary young men who have been in our program. We are in a great position and strongly aligned with our university thanks to the leadership of Chancellor Carol Christ and our Director of Athletics Jim Knowlton. I thank both of them for their continued trust and confidence in me to lead a football program that will make the entire Cal community proud. We have very high expectations. I think we've earned the right to expect more, and that's exactly what we're going to do."

Wilcox has already compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins in his first five-plus seasons as the head coach at Cal including landmark victories over Stanford and USC in the final month of his most recent full campaign in 2021. The victory over the Trojans in Cal's 2021 season finale was the Golden Bears' first home win over USC since 2003 but its' second in the last four seasons against the Trojans under Wilcox, who also led Cal to a road victory at USC in 2018. The back-to-back road wins in the Big Game at Stanford in 2019 and 2021 made Wilcox only the fifth Cal head coach to be victorious at least twice in a row on The Farm and, along with Jeff Tedford, one of only two in the last 70 years since Pappy Waldorf won three straight from 1947-51.

Cal has started the 2022 season with a pair of victories over UC Davis and UNLV to mark the fourth time in Wilcox's six seasons that the Bears have won at least their first two games with the 2019 squad's 4-0 start the best. The Bears have also now won five straight home games at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium dating back to the final three home contests of 2021 to match thier longest home win streak since also taking five in a row in Berkeley from Nov. 14, 2015 – Oct. 21, 2016. The last time Cal has won more than five in a row in Berkeley came during a nine-game home win streak from Aug. 30, 2008 – Sept. 12, 2009 when Cal followed up a 7-0 home record in 2008 by winning its first two games in Berkeley in 2009. Cal's 2022 squad is one of the least experienced in the nation with 21 playing for the Bears for the first time and 11 making their first start.

Wilcox's team came on strong at the end of the 2021 campaign with four victories in its final six contests including arguably its most impressive performance of the season in a 41-11 Big Game win that marked Cal's largest margin of victory against Stanford since 2004. Cal had a Big Game-record 636 total yards in the contest including 352 on the ground that were the most rushing yards in a game by the Bears since 2008. The 2021 Cal offense was capable of producing big numbers that included over 500 yards of total offense three times and more than 200 yards rushing on four occasions. The Bears' 2021 offense also took tremendous care of the football with its 10 turnovers the fewest ever by a Cal team playing a full schedule with the previous low 13 by Wilcox's 2019 squad. Cal lost only two fumbles in 2021 to rank tied for second nationally and lead the Pac-12 for fewest fumbles. The Bears were also second in the Pac-12 and 11th nationally in turnover margin (+10, 0.83), while their 10 total turnovers lost were second in the Pac-12 and tied for seventh nationally. Wilcox's defense shone in the second half of the 2021 season by holding four of its final six opponents to 14 points or less. The Bears finished the campaign second in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (22.2 ppg), fourth in total defense (366.7 ypg) and fourth in rushing defense (137.2 ypg).

Wilcox's 2020 team was just getting on track when the COVID-19 pandemic ended the often-delayed season after four games with its final performance a second-half shutout of eventual Pac-12 champion Oregon in an inspiring 21-17 home victory over the Ducks.

Wilcox began the 2019 season with four straight victories to move the Bears into the No. 15 spot in the AP Top 25 and No. 16 in the Coaches Poll. The victories included road wins at then-No. 14/12 Washington and Ole Miss, with the latter the first road triumph by a Pac-12 school at an SEC foe since 2010. The two signature victories helped the Bears to a 4-2 mark in true road games to give Cal back-to-back winning seasons on the road for the first time since 2004.

Wilcox guided the Bears to the Cheez-It Bowl and a 7-6 overall record in his second campaign in 2018 with the bowl appearance Cal's first in three seasons and first in a Pac-12 affiliated bowl since 2011. Cal reached a high point of 7-4 after winning four of five Pac-12 games during one stretch highlighted by signature victories over eventual Pac-12 champion and then-No. 15/13 Washington, as well as at USC with the victory over the Trojans clinching bowl eligibility. Cal also started the season with a 3-0 mark and in Week 5 made its first appearance since 2015 in the AP Top 25 at No. 24.

The highlights of Wilcox's first season as the head coach in Berkeley in 2017 included a 3-0 start and non-conference wins over Power 5 programs North Carolina and Ole Miss, as well as a 37-3 victory over then No. 8/9 Washington State in an ESPN nationally-televised Friday night home game. The victory against the Cougars snapped Cal's 17-game losing streak to top-10 teams, was the Bears' first victory against a top-10 team since 2003 and only its second top-10 win dating back to 1977. Cal finished 5-7 overall by adding a Pac-12 victory over Oregon State.

Bill Musgrave (OC/QB)

Musgrave is in his third season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Cal in 2022, as well as his 16th campaign as an offensive coordinator and 25th in coaching at the NFL or



collegiate ranks. Cal's offense had several strong moments during Musgrave's first full season at Cal in 2021 (his first campaign in 2020 was shortened to four games by COVID-19). The offense played a key role in the Golden Bears' second-half surge in 2021 when Cal won four times in its final six contests including arguably its most impressive performance of the season in a 41-11 Big Game win. Cal had a Big Game-record 636 total yards in the contest including 352 on the ground that were the most rushing yards in a game by the Bears since 2008. Cal also took tremendous care of the football in 2021 with its 10 turnovers the fewest ever by a Cal team playing a full schedule. Musgrave has first-year Cal starters throughout most of the offensive in 2022 including the quarterback position where Purdue graduate transfer fifth-year senior Jack Plummer earned the starting nod.

Peter Sirmon (DC/ILB)

Sirmon is in his fifth season at Cal and his third campaign as the team's defensive coordinator in 2022, while he also continues to work with the inside linebackers for the fifth consecutive campaign.



Sirmon started at Cal in 2018 as the Golden Bears' inside linebackers coach before adding codefensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator duties to his role in 2019. He also served as the team's recruiting coordinator for three seasons from 2019-21. Sirmon's 2021 defense improved throughout the season in his first full campaign as the team's defensive coordinator (his first season in the role in 2020 was shortened to four games by COVID-19) and has picked back up where it left off in 2022, allowing just six of its last eight opponents to 14 points or less while also winning six of its last eight contests. Cal finished the campaign second in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (22.2 ppg) and thru the first two games in 2022 is third (13.5 ppg).

Terrence Brown (DB)

Brown is in his first season at Cal in 2022 and shares duties with Tre Watson coaching the Golden Bears' defensive backs. Brown was among a group of 30 coaches on 247Sports' 30Under30 list in both 2019 and 2020.

Andrew Browning (DL)

Browning is in his fourth season as the defensive line coach at Cal in 2022 and his fifth campaign with the program having also served in a quality control role on the defensive side of the ball in his first season with the Golden Bears in 2018.



Geep Chryst (TE)

Chryst is in his second season as the tight ends coach at Cal in 2022 after having spent the majority of the previous three decades coaching in the NFL most recently as the tight ends coach with Denver (2017-



18). The tight end room has developed nicely under Chryst's guidance and has a pair of talented sophomores leading the way in 2022 in Jermaine Terry II and Keleki Latu after both got their feet wet behind a veteran group of tight ends in 2021.

Angus McClure (OL)

McClure is in his third season as the offensive line coach at Cal in 2022, as well as in his 26th campaign of collegiate coaching and 31st year in the coaching profession. McClure began at Cal in 2020 after previous



experience in the collegiate ranks at UCLA, Nebraska, Nevada, Buffalo and Sacramento State. Center Matthew Cindric and left tackle Ben Coleman are back after earning Pac-12 honorable mention selections in 2021.

Vic So'oto (OLB)

So'oto in his first season as the outside linebackers coach at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous two seasons in 2020 and 2021 on the USC coaching staff following a prior four-year stint at Virginia (2016-19).



Aristotle Thompson (RB)

Thompson is in his third season as the running backs coach at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous 11 campaigns in the same role at Cal Poly. Cal's run game has shown moments of brilliance under the



guidance of Thompson highlighted by a 352yard rushing game to a key a 41-11 blowout at Stanford in 2021 that were the most rushing yards in a game by the Bears since 2008. In 2022, the Bears have added two true frehshmen who ranked among the nation's top 30 at the position in the 2021 recruiting class in Jaydn Ott (Rivals, No. 14) and Ashton Hayes (No. 30 Rivals). Ott had 104 rushing yards in his Cal debut against UC Davis to become the first Cal player to rush for more than 100 yards in his first game for the Golden Bears since Shane Vereen against Michigan State in 2008.

Burl Toler III (WR/RC)

Toler III is in his eighth season on the coaching or football staff at his alma mater Cal in 2022, as well as his fifth as a full-time assistant coach and fourth working with the wide receivers. He is also in his



first campaign as the team's recruiting coordinator in 2022. Toler is working with a talented wide receiver group in 2022 led by the trio of Jeremiah Hunter, J.Michael Sturdivant and Mavin Anderson, who have combined for 28 receptions, 321 yards receiving and two touchdown catches in the first two games.

Tre Watson (DB)

Tre Watson is in his second season as a defensive backs coach at Cal in 2022 and shares the duties with firstyear defensive backs coach Terrence Brown. In 2020, Watson was among a group of 30 coaches listed in 247Sports' "30Under30".



Brian Johnson (AP)

Johnson is in his second season at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous 11 campaigns on staffs at FBS schools and in the NFL. Johnson has coached 76 players that have been selected in the NFL Draft including 11 first rounders.

GAME 1: CAL PUTS AWAY UC DAVIS FOR SEASON-OPENING WIN

BERKELEY – AJack Plummer threw three touchdown passes in his debut for California and Craig Woodson returned an interception for a score to lead California to a 34-13 victory over UC Davis on Saturday.

The Golden Bears (1-0) shook off a rough start on offense with minus-1 yard in the first quarter to improve to 11-0 all-time against the Aggies (0-1).

"Getting out there on the field the first time, I'm sure there was a little bit of nerves going on," Cal coach Justin Wilcox said. "A good thing was, as we talked about on the sideline after the first quarter was over, it was like, 'Guys, it probably couldn't have gone too much worse. ... We got that out of us and then settled down and moved the ball down the field."

Plummer threw TD passes of 3 yards to Jeremiah Hunter and 8 yards Jaydn Ott in the second quarter, and a 14-yarder to Mavin Anderson in the fourth quarter of his first appearance since transferring from Purdue.

Plummer finished 23 for 35 for 268 yards.

"I think we just got into a little bit of rhythm, did a little tempo," Plummer said. "I think once we started to kind of see ourselves move that kind of gave us a little confidence and got them on their heels a little bit."

Woodson helped take control of the game when he intercepted Miles Hastings on the opening drive of the second half and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown that made it 24-7.

Hastings threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to Chaz Davis in the first quarter Ulonzo Gilliam Jr. scored on a 60-yard run in the third quarter for the Aggies.

Hastings finished 32 for 50 for 242 yards with two interceptions.

"It's not about being perfect, it's about being excellent," coach Dan Hawkins said. "But we played hard. Guys battled. Thought we had a good camp. But it's a tough road so we got to learn from it, flush it and move on."

GAME 2: LATE STAND LEADS BEARS PAST UNLY

BERKELEY – Jaydn Ott scored two touchdowns, one on the ground and one through the air, and California's defense stiffened late to lead the Bears to a 20-14 victory over UNLV on Saturday.

Cal (2-0) made three fourth-down stops in the second half, including a fourth and goal opportunity for the Rebels from the Cal 8 with 2:46 remaining that preserved Cal's six-point lead.

UNLV got the ball back one more time with 1:03 remaining, but Isaiah Young intercepted UNLV quarterback Doug Brumfield deep in Cal territory on the game's final play. That clinched the Bears' first 2-0 start since 2019 as they turn their attention to next week's game at Notre Dame, the marquee opponent on Cal's schedule.

"I think it's huge for us, giving us a little bit of confidence and momentum going into a tough game," Cal safety Daniel Scott said.
"We've got to keep building. At the end of the day, we're 2-0 and that's the best part about it."

Jack Plummer threw for 278 yards and a touchdown as the Golden Bears got off to a fast start on offense. But after taking a 20-7 lead on a Dario Longhetto field goal midway through the third quarter, Cal's offense stalled and UNLV (1-1) grabbed momentum.

Aidan Robbins rushed for 84 yards for UNLV, including a 31-yard score in the third that brought the Rebels to within 20-14.

Three times Cal drove to UNLV's 10-yard line or deeper and didn't get touchdowns. The Bears settled for two field goals and Plummer was intercepted on the third drive.

"The goal, No. 1, is to win the game, and it carries more weight than any other goal," California coach Justin Wilcox said. "We also recognize where we need to be better."

After being held to minus-1 yard of offense in the first quarter last week against UC Davis, the Bears led 14-0 after the first on Saturday. Plummer completed his first eight passes and found open receivers against a UNLV secondary that also was called for pass interference three times in the game.

Ott scored on a 2-yard run and added a 12-yard touchdown catch later in the first, taking a short pass in the flat and making a leaping dive into the end zone on fourth-and-2 to give Cal a 14-0 lead.

Kyle Williams got UNLV on the board with an 11-yard touchdown catch on the first play of the second quarter, but Dario Longhetto's 20-yard field goal gave Cal a 17-7 lead at halftime.

For GPS purposes, use 2227 Piedmont Avenue in Berkeley for the address. Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting and there are multiple options. Visit bart.gov, actransit.org and 511.org for more information.

All credentials for 2022 Cal football home games must be requested online through sportssystems.com/CalFootball. Only media who cover the Golden Bears on a regular basis will be considered for season credentials. Note that it is not always possible to accommodate all requests, and no one under 18 years of age will be issued a credential without prior approval. All single-game requests should be made as far in advance as possible to help ensure space availability both in the press box and on the field. Credentials requested within seven days of a game, as well as all field photo passes, will be held for pick up at Media Will Call. Any questions about Cal football credentials can be directed to Kyle McRae.

INTERNET ACCESS

Both wireless and wired ethernet connections are available in the press box and field-level photographer work room. Wireless service is available through the Cal Visitor wireless network (no password required).

MEDIA GROUP TEXT AND EMAIL LISTS

Contact Kyle McRae to be placed on the Cal football media group text and email lists to receive relevant and updated Cal football information.

MEDIA PARKING (GAMEDAY)

The Underhill Garage located near the corner of Channing Way and College Avenue serves as the football gameday media parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about four blocks from FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to Media Will Call near Gate 5 or use a media shuttle that begins three hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available postgame from the corner of Bancroft Way and Warring Street (south end of Warring Alley near Gate 5) to the Underhill Garage. Parking passes must be requested in advance through sportssystems.com/CalFootball and can be emailed directly. They are not available for pick up on gamedays. Television broadcast crews should order parking passes in advance by sending the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the University of California website (pt.berkeley.edu). Request the Underhill Garage for football gamedays and the Witter Lot (just east of FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium) for set days.

MEDIA PARKING (NON-GAMEDAY)

For media covering Cal football on non-gamedays, see the parking/public transportation options listed below. Parking in the vicinity is limited and available on a firstcome, first-served basis. Please be sure to read all signs at each parking location for further information.

Stadium Parking Garage – Paid parking near the corner of Gayley Road (where Piedmont Avenue becomes Gayley Road) and Stadium Rim Way just north of the stadium

Street Parking – Paid and two-hour free parking may be available on streets near the stadium

Witter Lot – Paid parking near the corner of Centennial Drive and Stadium Rim Way just east of the stadium

Underhill Garage – Paid parking on corner of Channing Way and College Avenue

Public Transportation – Public transportation (BART, AC Transit) is detailed earlier in this section.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Media Will Call is located adjacent to Gate 5 at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium. It opens four hours before kickoff and remains open through the end of the first quarter. Identification is required to pick up credentials or tickets. Media who arrive after the end of the first quarter should contact Kyle McRae or Keeler McJunkin.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Field photographers/videographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on the day of the game at Media Will Call. Photo vests are also distributed at Media Will Call and should be returned following use to the receptacle on the field behind the visitor (west) bench and near the entrance to the photographers work room in front of Section EE.

NCAA rules limit photographers/videographers to shooting outside the restraining line surrounding the playing field and restrict photographers from entering the team areas inside the 20-yard lines.

In addition, photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the Peter E. Haas Press Box and work from the main press area on level seven.

PHOTOGRAPHERS WORK ROOM

A photographers work room is available on the field level at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium (entrance on west side at approximately the 20-yard line on the north end of the field). Power and ethernet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional photographer work stations are available on level seven of the press box. Pregame meals and drinks for photographers and videographers are available on the south end of level seven in the press box.

PHOTOS

All other telephone lines, both in the press box and inside the television compound, must be requested at least one week in advance through Kyle McRae.
