SERIES HISTORY

- Notre Dame and California are meeting for the fifth time and the first time in 55 years.
- The Irish lead the all-time series 4-0, winning two games at Notre Dame Stadium in 1960 and 1967, while also earning two wins at California in 1959 and 1965.

STORYLINES

- 'Irish Wear Green' is an annual game (created in 2018) when all Notre Dame fans are encouraged to wear green to support the Irish. Since the 'Irish Wear Green' initiative began in 2018 for the Notre Dame -Michigan game, the Irish have remained in their traditional blue uniforms for the contest.
- For this year's event Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Marcus Freeman has already announced that the Irish will be in green uniforms for the game with California. Saturday will make the first time the Irish will wear green jerseys since 2018, which ironically was not an 'Irish Wear Green' game but was Senior Day that year and Notre Dame earned a 42-13 victory over Florida State.
- Notre Dame has two traditional Pac-12 Conference rivals in Southern Cal and Stanford and are 41-18-1 against those to teams in Notre Dame Stadium. The Irish are 14-1 at home against all other Pac-12 teams, with the lone loss coming to Arizona in 1982.
- California is 2-0 this season with a 34-13 victory over UC Davis and a 20-14 win over future 2022 Notre Dame opponent UNLV last weekend. Saturday marks Cal's first road game of the season.
- The Irish will see a quarterback make a Notre Dame Stadium starting debut for the second consecutive week on Saturday. Sophomore Tyler Buchner made his first career start against Marshall last weekend, but was injured in the fourth quarter and will be out for the remainder of the season. Sophomore Drew Pyne will be making his first start in Notre Dame Stadium on Saturday against California.
- Notre Dame quarterbacks are 14-5 in their first career starts in Notre Dame Stadium since 1998.

NOTRE DAME GREEN JERSEY HISTORY

- With a nickname like 'The Fighting Irish,' the color green has always played a part in Notre Dame football uniforms dating back to the Knute Rockne era in the 1920s.
- The green jersey lore was enhanced in 1977, when Dan Devine warmed up in Notre Dame's traditional blue jersey, changed into green jerseys in the locker room and utilized the momentum of the sudden change to defeat No. 11 Southern Cal 49-19. Before that 1977 game, Notre Dame had not worn green jerseys since 1963.
- The 1977 team remained in those green jerseys for the rest of the season and earned the National Championship with a 38-10 victory over No. 1 Texas in the 1978 Cotton Bowl (the jersey worn in the Cotton Bowl was white with green numbers).
- Green remained the main color of the Notre Dame football uniform through the 1980 season.
- Since 1983, when Gerry Faust uniformed his team in green for a victory with Southern Cal, Notre Dame is 8-7 while wearing jerseys that prominently feature the color green and have wore green six times since 2010 (5-1 in those games, four wins in a row).

IRISH ITEMS - BY THE NUMBERS

2	Two Irish freshmen made their debut for Notre Dame against Marshall - tight ends Eli Raridon and Holden Staes .
3	Last year Michael Mayer joined Virginia's Heath Miller (2003) and Rice's James Casey (2008) as the only FBS underclassman tight ends (freshman or sophomore) in the last 25 years to have at least 70 receptions for 700 yards in a season..
6	Six completions in eight attempts by Drew Pyne , helping the Irish rally against Wisconsin in Soldier Field last season in his first significant action for Notre Dame (he appeared briefly in two games in the 2020 season). The Irish trailed 10-13 when Pyne entered the contest and eventually won the game 41-13, boosted by a Pyne touchdown pass and two interception returns for a touchdown.
7	Notre Dame has played seven times in its football history on September 17, with six of those meetings coming against Michigan State. The Irish are 3-4 all-time on September 17th and have not played on the date since 2016.
11	Howard Cross III led the Irish with 11 tackles against Marshall last weekend, far surpassing his previous career-high of five and becoming the first Notre Dame defensive lineman to post double-digit tackles in a game since Kurt Hinish against Navy last season.
14	Notre Dame is 14-1 all-time in Notre Dame Stadium against Pac-12 teams not named Southern Cal or Stanford. Arizona claims the lone victory of those 15 contests in 1982.
15	Since Notre Dame moved away from green jerseys in 1980, the team has appeared 15 times in games where green was a central element of the team's game day uniform. Notre Dame is 8-7 in those games and has won four in a row.
44.9	With a 44.9 yards-per-punt average, senior Jon Sot is 24th in the country in punt average. His efforts have allowed the Irish to rank 11th in the country in net punting (44.83).
53	Career games played for graduate student linebacker Bo Bauer which is eight games away from matching Kurt Hinish (now in his rookie season with the Houston Texans) for the most games played in Notre Dame history.
120	Michael Mayer collected his 120th career reception against Marshall (he now has 126) and is one of 11 Notre Dame players to reach that mark this century. The only other one to reach that mark in the last five years was Chase Claypool.
213	Since 1980, Notre Dame is 213-24 (.899) when it scores 30 or more points.

Only local radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting a daily sports show receive consideration for credentials. Non-originating, out-of-town radio stations cannot be accommodated.

CREDENTIAL DISTRIBUTION

Media credentials will neither be mailed nor will be available for early pickup. Credentials will ONLY be distributed on game day at the Hammes Auditorium (in the Joyce Center, located between Gates 1 and 2). A government-issued ID is required for pickup and each individual must claim only his/her own pass. All media members are vaccinated to cover a Notre Dame home game this season. If you have not attended a Notre Dame event before the game, you must show your vaccine card at credential distribution in order to gain entrance to the event.

PARKING

Parking requests will be accommodated on a space-available basis. All parking passes for Notre Dame football are electronic and will be emailed to those who receive credentials for the game. They will be sent out during the week of the game and should be downloaded at least 24 hours prior to game time.

MAYER MAKING HISTORY

Tight end Michael Mayer already owns the school records for tight end receptions in a season (71) and tight end touchdowns in a campaign (7) and has his eyes set on more season and career records as one of the top weapons in the Irish offensive arsenal this season.

Last year Michael Mayer joined Virginia's Heath Miller (2003) and Rice's James Casey (2008) as the only FBS underclassman tight ends (freshman or sophomore) in the last 25 years to have at least 70 receptions for 700 yards in a season.

Mayer collected his 120th career reception against Marshall on September 10 and is one of 11 Notre Dame players to reach that mark this century. The only other one to reach that mark in the last five years was Chase Claypool.

NOTRE DAME, IN – Terrance Hugh Hanratty and Kevin Thomas Hardy, - names to warm the cockles of even pseudo Irishmen, provided the dominant theatrics today as Notre Dame opened its football season with a 41-8 victory over the University of California.

Not quite justifying its role as a 35-point favorite, the nation's No. 1 team in the pre-season rankings somehow did not appear to be as powerful as last year's squad that trounced nine opponents and struggled to the famous 10-10 tie with Michigan State. Hanratty and his pet pass receiver, Jim Seymour, each made careless errors that might have proved costly against a team with more firepower than California. Hanratty, squirming loose on a scrambling run around the right side, simply dropped the ball as he held it in his left hand. The fumble was recovered by California. Seymour, alone in the end zone, mishandled an easy pass from Dec. 8, 1967 Hanratty, erasing another touchdown.

Against California, however, such mistakes were easily rectified as Notre Dame extended its unbeaten streak to 12 games, to the delight of the 59,075 customers, many of whom were chanting "We're No. 1." Hanratty, completing 15 of 30 passes for 208 yards, also ran for some important yardage. Usually scrambling, but sometimes employing a quarterback draw play, he rushed seven times for a net total of 53 yards.

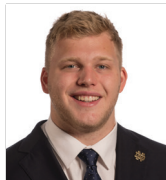
