## SERIES HISTORY

- Notre Dame and Syracuse will be meeting for the 11th time with the Irish holding a 7-3 advantage in the series.
- Saturday will mark Notre Dame's first trip to the JMA Wireless Dome since a 38-12 loss to the Orange in 2003.
- The Notre Dame - Syracuse series has featured both teams taking traditional home games on the road. The Irish and Orange met in MetLife Stadium for Syracuse home games in 2014 and 2015, while Notre Dame played host to Syracuse for a Shamrock Series game in Yankee Stadium in 2018.
- Notre Dame boasts a four-game win streak against Syracuse, including a 45-21 victory in Notre Dame Stadium in 2020 – the season during which the Irish joined the ACC in football due to COVID-19 scheduling challenges.
- Notre Dame is 169-65-3 (.719) all-time against the Atlantic Coast Conference. See page 14 for more information.

## STORYLINES

- Notre Dame returns to the road this weekend at No. 16/16 Syracuse. The Irish are 2-1 away from Notre Dame Stadium this season with a victory at current No. 21/21 North Carolina, a win over No. 16/16 BYU in Las Vegas and a season-opening battle with No. 2/2 Ohio State in Ohio Stadium.
- Record watch – junior tight end **Michael Mayer** continues his assault on the Irish record books. Already the all-time leader in tight end receptions at Notre Dame (157), Mayer is looking to put his name alone atop the tight end career touchdown record (he is currently tied with Ken MacAfee, 1974-77 with 15) and the tight end career receiving yards list (he needs 25 yards against Syracuse to surpass Tyler Eifert's 1,840 from 2009-12).
- Record watch II - junior defensive end **Isaiah Foskey** broke out with three sacks against UNLV last weekend to push his career total to 21.5. He is now is just three sacks behind the Notre Dame's career record of 24.5 set by Justin Tuck from 2002-04.
- Notre Dame looks to continue its success against ACC opponents. As part of a football scheduling agreement with the ACC, the Irish face five opponents from the conference each season. Since the partnership began in 2014 Notre Dame is 37-7 (841) against ACC teams, has won 25 straight regular-season games against the Atlantic Coast Conference and seven straight overall against the ACC. See page 14 for more information.
- The Irish added four more sacks to their season total against UNLV and are currently 23rd in the country in sacks-per-game at 2.86. Syracuse is giving up 2.57 sacks per game (96th in the country).
- Saturday's game will match up one of the least penalized teams in the country against one of the most. Notre Dame has been whistled for just 30 penalties this season (6th in the country) while the Orange have drawn 67 yellow flags and are 127th in the country in total penalties.
- Sophomore quarterback **Drew Pyne** will look to continue his success on the road this season. In two victories away from Notre Dame Stadium (at North Carolina, vs. BYU in Las Vegas) Pyne is 46-62 passing (74.2%) for 551 yards and six touchdowns.
- Will sophomore **Logan Diggs** continue to be the hot hand out of the talented Irish backfield? Over the past three games, Diggs has rushed 54 times for 280 yards (5.2 average) with 93 yards against No. 16/16 BYU and 130 yards last weekend against UNLV.

## IRISH ITEMS - BY THE NUMBERS

<b>1</b>	Sophomore tight end <b>Mitchell Evans</b> started his first career game against UNLV in just his second game back from an offseason injury. Evans recorded his first career carry against the Rebels, converting a third-and-one while taking a snap under center. On the same drive, Evans recorded his first career touchdown on another run from under center – this time a one-yard 'sneak.' Evans played quarterback in high school as recently as 2020, posting 2,132 passing yards and 23 touchdowns.
<b>3</b>	Junior defensive end <b>Isaiah Foskey</b> sacked the quarterback three times last weekend against UNLV. His career total for sacks stands at 21.5 – just three away from matching Justin Tuck's (2002-04) career mark of 24.5.
<b>4</b>	Notre Dame has blocked four punts this season, including back-to-back blocks against UNLV last weekend (both performed by <b>Isaiah Foskey</b> ). The four blocked punts are tied for second-best in the country this season with Central Michigan and Rutgers. South Carolina has blocked five punts in 2022. Foskey is one of 11 players in FBS this season with multiple blocked kicks.
<b>12</b>	Notre Dame will be playing at 12 p.m. ET for the first time in 16 games. The last time the Irish played at noon was a victory over No. 18 Wisconsin in the 2021 Shamrock Series game at Soldier Field on September 25, 2021.
<b>19</b>	Notre Dame will be playing for the 19th time on October 29th in its football history on Saturday afternoon. The Irish are 15-3 on the date, which includes nine meetings with the Naval Academy. Notre Dame has a seven-game win streak on October 29 dating back to the 1966 season.
<b>25</b>	Junior tight end <b>Michael Mayer</b> needs 25 yards receiving to set the Notre Dame record for career TE receiving yards. Mayer currently has 1,816 reception yards and hopes to surpass Tyler Eifert's (2009-12) 1,840 yard total.
<b>28</b>	Sophomore running back <b>Logan Diggs</b> is coming off a career-high 28 carries against UNLV. He posted his first career 100-yard rushing game against the Rebels, finishing the contest with 130 yards.
<b>31</b>	<b>Michael Mayer</b> has caught at least one pass in all 31 games in which he has played for the Irish. That 31-game streak is tied for the 14th-best among all FBS players.
<b>43.5</b>	Senior punter <b>Jon Sot</b> is currently 11th in the country in punting with a 43.5 average. That average currently ranks second on Notre Dame's single-season list.
<b>200</b>	Notre Dame rushed for 223 yards in the victory over UNLV which is the third time the Irish have surpassed 200 yards rushing this season. Notre Dame is 102-10 (.910) since 1996 when it rushes for 200 yards or more.

All credentials for print media are issued on the basis of circulation. Only local radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting a daily sports show receive consideration for credentials. Non-originating, out-of-town radio stations cannot be accommodated.

**CREDENTIAL DISTRIBUTION**

• Media credentials will neither be mailed nor will be available for early pickup. Credentials will ONLY be distributed on game day inside Gate 1 of the Joyce Center. A government-issued ID is required for pickup and each individual must claim only his/her own pass. All media members are be vaccinated to cover a Notre Dame home game this season.

**PARKING**

• Parking requests will be accommodated on a space-available basis. All parking passes for Notre Dame football are electronic and will be emailed to those who receive credentials for the game. They will be sent out during the week of the game and should be downloaded at least 24 hours prior to game time.

**THE OFFENSE**

**QB - DREW PYNE | STEVE ANGELI**

- Pyne has started the last five games for the Irish with victories over current No. 21/21 North Carolina and against No. 16/16 BYU in Las Vegas. Pyne is completing 64% of his passes for 1,077 yards and 12 touchdowns.
- Pyne and Tyler Buchner competed for the starting job throughout August, Buchner earned the nod against Ohio State and Marshall, but suffered a season-ending shoulder injury in the fourth quarter of the Marshall game.
- Angeli is the Irish back up for the remainder of the season and made the game-winning play in the 2022 Blue-Gold Game with a 10-yard touchdown scramble as time expired. Angeli saw his first career action in the UNLV game.

**RB - CHRIS TYREE | AUDRIC ESTIMÉ | LOGAN DIGGS**

- The Irish have three strong tailback options – Chris Tyree is a threat both in the run and pass game, Audric Estimé leads the Irish with a 5.5 yard-per-carry average and six rushing touchdowns while Logan Diggs is coming off a career-high 130 yards rushing against UNLV.
- Tyree posted back-to-back games with over 100 total yards from scrimmage (108 vs. California, 104 at North Carolina) and had a season-high 80 yards rushing at UNC.
- Estimé followed up his first career 100-yard rushing game at North Carolina (134) with a 14-carry, 97-yard rushing effort in the victory at BYU.
- Diggs has seen his workload increase since missing the California game with an illness. Over the past four games, Digg has rushed 64 times for 330 yards (5.2 yards per carry).
- Tyree, Estimé and Diggs all combined for 100 total yards from scrimmage at North Carolina, the first time that has occurred by three Irish running backs since Tony Brooks (109), Mark Green (113) and Tim Brown (140) against Navy in 1987.

**WR - BRADEN LENZY | LORENZO STYLES | MATT SALERNO | JAYDEN THOMAS**

- Styles leads all the Irish wideouts with 23 catches for 287 yards (12.5 per reception) this season.
- Thomas, who started his first career game against California, had a break out performance in the BYU victory with three catches for 74 yards and his first touchdown.
- Salerno nabbed a 31-yard reception in the season opener at Ohio State.

**TE - MICHAEL MAYER | MITCHELL EVANS | HOLDEN STAES**

- Mayer leads the team with 44 receptions and six touchdown receptions as he sets his sights on becoming the best statistical tight end – and one of the top overall receivers – in Notre Dame history (see page 8 for more).
- Mitchell Evans, who missed the first five games of the season after recovering from a foot injury suffered in the summer of 2022, has returned to full action and scored his first career touchdown, taking a snap under center on a one-yard plunge against UNLV.
- Raridon and Staes are both talented true freshman who have seen action this season – Staes nabbed his first career reception against BYU.
- Kevin Bauman and Eli Raridon, who both saw significant action this season, have been lost for the season with knee injuries.

**OL - JOE ALT | JARRETT PATTERSON | ZEKE CORRELL | JOSH LUGG |**

**BLAKE FISHER | ANDREW KRISTOFIC**

- The Irish offensive line was among the units chosen for the Midseason Joe Moore Award honors list.
- The OL helped the Irish pile up an amazing 35 first downs in the victory over North Carolina – the most for the program since 36 against Army in 1974.
- Jarrett Patterson who started much of his career at center, missed the game at Ohio State but has started the last three games at left guard.
- Kristofic is the first offensive lineman off the bench at either guard spot for the Irish.

**THE DEFENSE**

**DE - ISAIAH FOSKEY | RYLIE MILLS | JUSTIN ADEMILOLA | ALEXANDER EHRENSBERGER**

- Foskey is one of the top pass rushers in the nation and is third on the all-time Notre Dame career sacks list with 21.5. He is coming off a three-sack performance against UNLV.
- Mills played the opposite DE position from Foskey and broke out in the victory at North Carolina with five tackles and two sacks. He earned the Notre Dame Defensive Player of the Game Award for the effort.
- Justin Ademilola started the Marshall game and delivered with four tackles, he also had a sack against California and recovered a fumble at North Carolina.

**DT - JAYSON ADEMILOLA | CHRIS SMITH**

- Jayson Ademilola is one of the most experienced defensive lineman on the team and has eight tackles, two TFL and 1.5 sacks this season. He was the key contributor on a fourth-down stop in the fourth quarter against BYU – a play that ended BYU’s final scoring opportunity in the 28-20 victory.
- Smith graduate transferred from Harvard and has established himself as one of the strongest players on the team. He has started on the interior defensive line in the last two games.

**NG - HOWARD CROSS III | GABRIEL RUBIO**

- Cross is sixth on the team in tackles with 26, including an 11-tackle performance against Marshall. It was the first 10-tackle game by an Irish defensive lineman since Kurt Hinich had 10 against Navy last season.
- Rubio had a career-best performance in the Stanford game, seeing the most action of his young career and posting seven tackles.

**LB - JD BERTRAND | JACK KISER | MARIST LIUFAU | JUNIOR TUIHALAMAKA | PRINCE KOLLIE**

- The Irish linebacker group is experienced, talented and interchangeable.
- Bertrand leads the Irish with 43 tackles, including a career-high 13 against Stanford.
- Kiser is second on the team with 34 tackles, which includes a career-high nine against Marshall and at North Carolina, respectively.
- Liufau has 29 tackles so far this season and showed his across-the-field capability with six tackles against North Carolina.

**CB - CAM HART | TARIQ BRACY | JADEN MICKEY | BENJAMIN MORRISON | CLARENCE LEWIS**

- Bracy has been the most consistent and reliable defensive backs on the roster this season, with numerous key plays that include 4.5 tackles for loss this season. He missed the Stanford game with an injury, but returned to the lineup at full strenght against UNLV.
- Morrison, a true freshman, has started four games and owns 13 tackles with two break ups.
- Hart was one of three Irish players listed on *The Athletic’s* Freaks List this season and leads the team with three pass break ups.
- Lewis forced his third career fumble against UNLV and has seen more action at the nickle position as Jaden Mickey works his way back from an injury.

**S - BRANDON JOSEPH | DJ BROWN | RAMON HENDERSON | HOUSTON GRIFFITH**

- Joseph has 25 tackles so far this season and forced his first career fumble against BYU. He was a two-time All-American at Northwestern before transferring to Notre Dame during the offseason.
- Brown leads all defensive backs with 32 tackles this season.
- Henderson contributed a career-best four tackles against California before missing the UNC game with an injury, then starting the Stanford game at nickle.
- Griffith is among the most experience players on the roster and is a key contributor on the Irish special teams. With Brown coming back from a minor injury, Griffith started the game at safety against BYU and Stanford.

**SPECIALISTS**

**K - BLAKE GRUPE | ZAC YOAKAM**

- A graduate transfer from Arkansas State, Grupe is 8-10 on field goals this season including a 3-for-4 performance in the victory over UNLV last weekend.
- Yoakam, a true freshman, stepped in to kick off at Ohio State after a pregame injury suffered by Bryce McFerson. Yoakam and has responded with consistent depth and height on his kickoffs. He has 25 touchbacks on 37 kickoffs this season.

**P - JON SOT**

- A graduate transfer from Harvard, Sot boasts a solid 45.3 average so far this season with 13 punts downed inside the 20-yard line. He enters the weekend 11th in the country in punting average at 45.3 and has helped the Irish rank 11th in net punting (42.37).
- Sot also serves as the holder for Irish place kicks.

**MAYER MAKING HISTORY**

- Junior tight end Michael Mayer continues to rewrite the Notre Dame record books. His 11-catch performance against BYU earned him the all-time receptions record for Notre Dame tight ends and he is quickly approaching a number of other school records.
- Mayer has played 31 career games with the Irish and has logged at least one catch in all 31 of those contests. His 31-game catch streak is tied for 14th among active FBS players.
- In 2021, Mayer joined Virginia's Heath Miller (2003) and Rice's James Casey (2008) as the only FBS underclassman tight ends (freshman or sophomore) in the last 25 years to have at least 70 receptions for 700 yards in a season.
- Mayer collected his 120th career reception against Marshall on September 10 and is one of 11 Notre Dame players to reach that mark this century. The only other one to reach that mark in the last five years was Chase Claypool.
- Mayer is first among all active FBS tight ends with 151 career catches:

**BERTRAND ON AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM**

Junior linebacker JD Bertrand was selected as one of 22 players across the country to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for outstanding contributions to their communities.

Bertrand and others were nominated by their schools for this prestigious award based on their work off the field. This current list of 22 was narrowed down after the initial announcement of 114 nominees were selected in July. This final 22-player roster was chosen by a selection panel, which includes former Good Works Team players, journalists and officials from Allstate and the AFCA. The panel looks for players that demonstrate exceptional leadership on and off the football field.

Bertrand works with Uplifting Athletes, providing experiences for children with rare diseases and their families. He currently serves as Notre Dame's chapter president for the organization. In an effort to support its mission, Bertrand has organized fundraising events at Notre Dame, including a Lift for Life event with his teammates and an Uplifting Bowling Experience. Led by Bertrand, Notre Dame raised \$80,385 over the past year. Bertrand, having previously served as the chapter's vice president, made his mark in more than just fundraising. He set out to directly connect with and build a relationship with a child with a rare disease. He made an instant connection with a young football fan and his family and the two are in constant communication. Bertrand sees up close and personal the impact all of his fundraising efforts can have on those who benefit from the work of Uplifting Athletes.

Prior to the start of the 2022 season, Bertrand was voted a team captain by his peers. He's started all three games this season at linebacker, recording 17 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss (TFL). As a sophomore in 2021, Bertrand played and started in all 13 games, leading the team in tackles and was the only Irish player to record over 100 tackles (101). He became the first Irish player with triple digit tackles in a season since 2018, and 63 of his 101 stops were solo, more than double the next best Irish defender. He added 7.0 TFLs, 1.5 sacks, forced a fumble, recovered another, added a pass breakup and four quarterback hurries while being named to the Phil Steel Magazine All-Independent First Team and was a 2022 preseason candidate for the LOTT Impact trophy. Off the field, Bertrand is a member of the Alpha Mu Alpha National Marketing Honor Society. He is the 2022 Paul D. Gilbert Award for Leadership winner, an award given at the discretion of the faculty to the marketing student who has excelled in various extracurricular activities. He also earned a spot on the Notre Dame Mendoza School of Business Dean's List in 2020. The final roster features 11 players from the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS); 11 players from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), Divisions II, III and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA); and one honorary head coach.

Javon McKinley made his presence known against the Orange, finishing with 111 yards on seven receptions and three touchdowns. It was a career high in receptions and touchdowns for the graduate student.

- In a partnership that began in 2014, the University of Notre Dame and the Atlantic Coast Conference agreed to schedule the Irish to play, on average, five ACC opponents each season. Originally scheduled through the 2025 season, the games have now been scheduled through the 2037 campaign.
- Notre Dame is 37-7 (.841) against ACC opponents since the scheduling agreement began during the 2014 season

- The Irish completed their fourth-straight undefeated regular season against the ACC in 2021 (5-0). They have won 25-straight games against the ACC in the regular season dating back to 2017.
- In 2020, the Irish went 9-0 in ACC play, with wins over Duke, Florida State, Louisville, Pitt, Georgia Tech, Clemson, Boston College, North Carolina and Syracuse.
- In 2019, the Irish went undefeated against the ACC, beating Louisville, Virginia, Virginia Tech, Duke and Boston College as part of the scheduling agreement.
- The Irish improved to 29-1 in regular-season games against Atlantic Coast Conference opponents over the last five seasons (2017-22) after the win at North Carolina.
- Notre Dame has won 12-straight ACC road games and 14-consecutive ACC home games.
- There have been, and in the future there will be, seasons when the Irish face just four ACC opponents but will eventually even out the agreement by facing six ACC teams in another year (this occurred in 2014 and 2015 and is set to occur in 2021-22 and 2022-23).

**NOTRE DAME ROAD GAME ATTENDANCE NOTES**

- Since Notre Dame began to establish its national brand in the 1920s, the Fighting Irish have been a sure-fire ticket selling game where ever their football schedule takes the team. Notre Dame owns attendance records at 10 opponent home venues across the country – by far the most of any FBS team (Florida State and Miami each have four such record games).
- The Irish also own nine attendance records at active neutral site venues, which includes Allegiant Stadium, Soldier Field, Hard Rock Stadium, Aviva Stadium in Dublin, Ireland and Sun Bowl Stadium.
- Notre Dame also owns several top-10 attendance numbers at stadiums across the country, which includes some of the top attendance marks at the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Sugar Bowl and other notable venues.
- On page 13 there is a complete list of Notre Dame’s appearances in NFL Stadiums. The Irish will knock another NFL venue off the list on October 8th when they play their first game in Allegiant Stadium (Las Vegas Raiders) – which is one of two NFL stadium appearances this season (also M&T Bank Stadium against Navy on Nov. 12).
- Last weekend Allegiant Stadium became the 15th active NFL Stadium the Irish have competed in and the program plans to visit Mercedes-Benz Stadium (vs. Georgia Tech, 2024) and Lambeau Field (vs. Wisconsin, 2026) in the future.
- Notre Dame is 22-15 in current NFL Stadiums and 71-30-3 all-time in a facility that was home to an NFL team the year the Irish competed in the stadium.

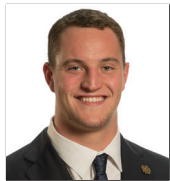
