SATURDAY'S PREVIEW...

UNLV (4-3/2-2) closes out its 2022 non-conference schedule by making a historic trip to Notre Dame (3-3) for the first time Saturday afternoon ... It will also mark the Rebels' first game played in the state of Indiana, first trip to the Eastern Time Zone since 2017 (Ohio State) and their first contest vs. an independent opponent since hosting former Mountain West rival BYU in 2017 ... The game will be available to fans by subscribing to Peacock Premium streaming service (\$4.99 per month) ... Coincidentally, the Fighting Irish played in UNLV's home stadium two weeks ago vs. BYU at Allegiant Stadium as part of the school's Shamrock Series ... The Rebels, who already doubled their victory total from the last two seasons combined, are coming off a 42-7 home loss to Air Force while Notre Dame also lost at home, 16-14, to Stanford ... After starting 0-14 at UNLV, head coach **Marcus Arroyo** has won six of his last 12 games ... Despite leaving Saturday's game with a first-quarter injury, Louisville grad transfer RB **Aidan Robbins** is tied for 10th in the FBS with nine total scores (eight rushing, one receiving) ... UNLV is tied with four teams for third in the country with 11 interceptions this season.

REBELS vs. FIGHTING IRISH NOTES...

For the second time this fall, UNLV will be facing an opponent for the first time in history as the Rebels' trip to Cal on September 10 marked a first meeting with the Golden Bears ... In fact, UNLV and Notre Dame both faced Cal this season as the Pac-12 conference program played in South Bend just one week after hosting the Rebels in Berkeley ... Former UNLV quarterback and longtime ESPN personality **Kenny Mayne** is scheduled to be in South Bend as the Rebels' featured alumnus on the game's television broadcast, appearing on pregame, halftime and post-game segments ... Former UNLV CB **Marvin Robinson** lettered at Notre Dame in 1991 before eventually transferring to UNLV and helping the Rebels win the 1994 Big West Conference title and Las Vegas Bowl championship ... **Rudy Ruettiger** of the beloved Notre Dame-themed 1993 film "Rudy" is a longtime Las Vegas resident.

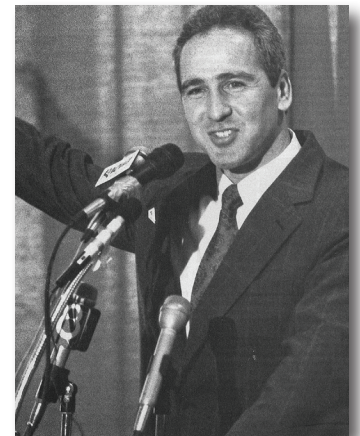

MORE REBELATIONS...

Last week vs. Air Force, UNLV did not have a penalty assessed in a game for the first time since 2016 (at SDSU) ... The Rebels have been outscored by 40 points in the first quarter this season (73-33) but have scored more points than their opponents in every other quarter (combined 170-121) ... UNLV, which totaled 22 sacks last season, already has 17 this fall, which ranks second in the MW. Those have come from an eye-popping 11 different players with at least 1.0 each ... Two Rebels lead the way with 3 sacks apiece (tied for ninth in the league): Las Vegas product DE **Adam Plant Jr.**, who is also the squad's career leader with 10.0 sacks since transferring home from TCU; and Super Senior LB **Austin Ajiake**, who currently leads the MW with 80 total tackles and leads the team with 8.0 TFL ... UNLV's 11 pass interceptions through seven games are already the most for an entire season since the Rebels finished with 13 in 2015 ... Three of those picks have come from **Cameron Oliver** who is tied for second in the MW and is the first Rebel to have more than one interception return for a touchdown (two) since All-American **Kevin Thomas** posted three pick-sixes in 2001 ... At USU, UNLV's defense picked off at least five passes in a game for the sixth time in history and for the first time since vs. now-defunct program Pacific in 1992 ... By scoring 52 vs. Idaho State and 58 vs. UNT, the Rebels reached the 50-point mark in back-to-back home games for the first time since 1974 (51 vs. Santa Clara and 63 vs. Prairie View A&M) ... UNLV's scoring output has been well-balanced as the Rebels are tied for the MW lead with 11 passing touchdowns and sit third with 13 rushing scores ... The six-point defeat at Cal marked the seventh one-score loss for the Rebels since the start of 2021 after dropping a school-record six such games last fall (previous record was five in 2012) ... Because the Raiders hosted the Patriots in a preseason game at Allegiant Stadium the previous night, UNLV and Idaho State played their season-opening affair on the NFL team's natural grass field instead of the Rebels' usual artificial turf field for the first time. In fact, the Rebels were on grass for a home game for the first time since former venue Sam Boyd Stadium featured the natural stuff from 1999-2002 ... When **Doug Brumfield** took the first snap against Idaho State, he became the 14th different quarterback to start a season-opener in the last 19 years at UNLV and ended up winning Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week honors despite only attempting one pass after halftime ... Brumfield was knocked out of Game Six at San Jose State during the first quarter and did not play vs. Air Force. Last year's Mountain West Freshman of the Year **Cameron Friel** came off the bench vs. the Spartans and completed 15-of-22 attempts for 153 yards and a touchdown pass. Friel made his ninth career start last week vs. AFA and added another scoring toss ... The Rebels, in fact, feature a trio of sophomore QBs who have all started FBS games: Brumfield started eight total after starting two outings in 2020 before suffering a season-ending injury; portal transfer addition **Harrison Bailey** started three games vs. SEC opponents for Tennessee in 2020 (vs. Florida, Vanderbilt and Texas A&M); and Friel started eight dates as a true freshman last fall ... UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 21 years -- the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... New WR **Ricky White III**, a transfer from Michigan State, is third in the MW with 33 receptions and ranks fourth with 63.4 YPG. White, who played on the same state champion Marietta (GA) High School team as **Harrison Bailey** has been joined in the starting lineup the last three weeks by McKie and **Nick Williams** after injuries suffered by both **Kyle Williams** (still ranks second with 18 receptions) and **Jeff Weimer** (third with 16) during the Utah State game.

PLUCK FROM THE IRISH

Former head coach **Jim Strong** was serving as Notre Dame's offensive coordinator when he was selected at the age of 35 to lead the UNLV program and went on to coach the Rebels from 1990-93. Strong was an assistant for **Lou Holtz** at both Arkansas and Minnesota and eventually joined him in South Bend to coach running backs in 1987 and helped the Irish win the 1988 national championship. Strong attempted to bring some of the Fighting Irish magic with him to the desert by taking the UNLV logo off the helmet completely and even having equipment staff purportedly spray the helmets with real silver flakes to mimic Notre Dame's famous golden methods. Strong's 1992 squad produced the school's first winning season (6-5) in six years and many of his recruits would go on to lead UNLV to a conference title and Las Vegas Bowl victory the season after he was replaced by **Jeff Horton**. Strong, who went into the real estate business after leaving the university, finished with a record of 17-27 as a head coach.

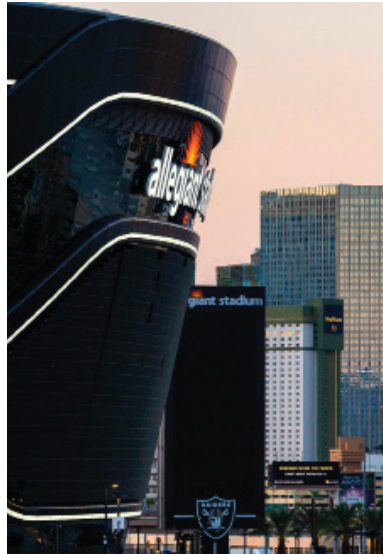

Marcus Arroyo was formally introduced Dec. 13, 2019, as the 12th head coach in the history of UNLV Football. Arroyo then used his next two months to hire a staff, win a Rose Bowl and then secure a record-setting recruiting haul of future Rebels.

Case in point: on Feb. 5, 2020, Arroyo announced his first UNLV recruiting class and the impressive group set multiple program records, including earning the No. 1 ranking in the Mountain West by Rivals and No. 2 by 247Sports. One year later, the 2021 class turned heads nationally, ranking eighth among all Group of 5 schools. Its standing of 67th overall was a stunning 36 spots higher than the average ranking for UNLV's classes in the decade previous to Arroyo's arrival on campus (averaged 103rd from 2010-19). In addition, the Class of 2021's average 247Sports per-player rating of .8324 shattered Year One's school-record mark of .8145. This also marked the first time since the introduction of the recruiting rankings that the Rebels finished in the top two of the Mountain West in consecutive years.

Arroyo, who turned 42 in January, took over the Rebels after most recently serving as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at the University of Oregon. Behind his play-calling, the Ducks won the 2019 Pac-12 Conference Championship and then defeated Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl, which marked the eighth bowl game of Arroyo's career. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks went 28-12 overall, including winning 15 of their last 17 outings.

Arroyo was instrumental in the development of quarterback **Justin Herbert**, the MVP of the Rose Bowl who became the No. 6 overall NFL draft pick and went on to be named the NFL Rookie of the Year after setting multiple league records for a first-year player. Another one of Arroyo's players, offensive lineman **Penei Sewell**, became the first Oregon player to win the Outland Trophy, which is awarded to the most outstanding interior lineman in college football.

Arroyo joined Oregon after spending two years as the running backs coach at Oklahoma State, and brought experience as a coach for every offensive position except the offensive line. Prior to going to Stillwater, Arroyo spent the 2014-15 season in the NFL as interim offensive coordinator and play-caller for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Before making the move to the NFL, Arroyo spent the 2013 college football season as the offensive coordinator and outside receivers coach at Southern Mississippi. Arroyo's first stint in the Pac-12 saw him spend 2011 and 2012 as the passing-game coordinator and play-caller at California. He spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns at Wyoming as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, developing quarterback **Austyn Carta-Samuels** into the Mountain West Freshman of the Year in 2009. In fact, with UNLV QB **Cameron Friel** earning 2021 MW Freshman of the Year after rookie receiver **Kyle Williams** earned Freshman All-America and MW Freshman of the Year honors in 2020, Arroyo has now coached five freshman honorees in the last decade alone: WR Williams (UNLV), QB Carta-Samuels (Wyoming), QB **Nick Mullens** (C-USA All-Freshman Team at Southern Miss) and RB **Justice Hill** (Freshman All-America and nation's top rookie rusher at Oklahoma State).

Prior to his time in Laramie, Arroyo was the co-offensive coordinator for two seasons and quarterbacks coach for three campaigns at his alma mater, San Jose State. He was the quarterbacks coach and play-caller for the Spartans in 2006, and added co-offensive coordinator duties from 2007-08 under head coach **Dick Tomey**.

Arroyo began his coaching career with the Spartans in 2003 as an undergraduate assistant coach. He was the offensive coordinator at Prairie View A&M in 2004 before returning to SJSU as a graduate assistant in 2005.

A native of Colfax, California, Arroyo was a three-year letterman at San Jose State, where he played quarterback from 1998-2002. In 2000, he passed for 2,334 yards and 15 touchdowns while leading the Spartans to seven wins, their most in eight seasons. Arroyo graduated from San Jose State in 2003 with a degree in kinesiology. He is married to the former **Kelly Thoni** and the couple has one daughter and a son.

DANIEL BOOM!



Back for his sixth and final year with the Rebels, PK **Daniel Gutierrez** set the school record by making his 15th and then 16th consecutive field goal vs. SJSU last fall, besting **Jim Cook**'s long-standing mark of 14 straight set in 1987, before his fourth-quarter attempt was blocked to end the historic streak. The former walk-on turned Lou Groza Award Semifinalist was surprised with a full scholarship during a scrimmage at Allegiant Stadium on August 11, 2021. The final play was a field-goal attempt and as expected, the senior nailed it with ease but then something unexpected happened as he was surprised with a highlight video on the stadium's big screen that closed with a special message that he was being put on full scholarship. Gutierrez responded by turning in a career night in the opener vs. EWU, nailing all four of his field-goal attempts, including a then-personal-best 51-yarder and earning a spot as a Lou Groza Star of the Week. A 2022 Groza Award Watch List member and Preseason Honorable Mention All-America selection by Pro Football Network, Gutierrez

is famous for his consistency, heading into this week an eye-popping 31-of-32 all-time from 39 yards or closer. Currently ranking 10th in the nation among active players with an 84.3% make rate, he needs five more field goals to move into a tie for second place at the school for a career, and 10 more three-pointers would tie him with UNLV Athletics Hall of Famer **Nick Garritano** atop the career list.

DOS BOOT



Super Senior placekicker **Daniel Gutierrez** became UNLV's first Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week in five years, the league announced October 3. The Los Angeles native was perfect during his team's come-from-behind win over New Mexico, scoring 11 of his team's points in the 31-20 final. After the Lobos built a 17-0 lead, Gutierrez nailed three consecutive field goals to bring his team to within eight points at halftime. All three boots were longer than 40 yards, including his fourth career three-pointer from at least 50 yards and he also added two extra points and kicked off for the Rebels. The most accurate kicker in school history, Gutierrez is an All-America candidate who is 6-for-6 in field goals and 23-for-23 in extra points this fall. Gutierrez was actually the most recent MW Special Teams honoree from UNLV when as a freshman he was honored for his kicking heroics in an upset victory at Fresno State in 2017. This marked the fourth time already in 2022 that a Rebel was recognized by the league, which is the most in a

season since 2013 when four players won a total of five nods. With quarterback **Doug Brumfield** (Aug. 29), running back **Aidan Robbins** (Sept. 19) winning the offensive award and linebacker Austin Ajiake earning on the defensive side of the ball (Sept. 26), Gutierrez's honor marks the first time that UNLV won at least one from offense, defense and special teams since 2008 (QB **Omar Clayton**, LB **Jason Beauchamp** and PK **Kyle Watson**, KR **Deante' Purvis** and DL **Malo Taumua** who won a game with a blocked field goal).

2016 season. The list includes five from former Rebel **Armani Rogers**. Rogers and **Jason Thomas** (three) are the only Rebel signal-callers to reach the mark more than two times in a career.



"CHUCK WAGON" RODE INTO HISTORY

Now-departed Rebel runner **Charles Billy Dee Williams Jr.** was the 2019 regular-season rushing champion of the Mountain West and went on to break multiple school records on the ground. UNLV had to replace the first Rebel to rush for at least 700 yards in three different seasons and the second player to lead UNLV in rushing four different seasons (**Tim Cornett** 2010-13). The first Rebel football player ever named a CoSIDA Academic All-America Team, Williams' 4,201 career rushing yards rank fourth in Mountain West history. Williams also finished fourth among all Rebels with 15 career 100-yard rushing games and led the league as a Super Senior with 15 rushing scores.

FERTITTA FOOTBALL COMPLEX: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

On October 3, 2019, UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex. Just over three years ago the department announced the largest single gift in its history as the Fertitta Family pledged an initial \$10 million toward the construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park. The FFC is now the day-to-day home of the program and includes an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center, player lounge and even a barbershop.

AJIAKE HONORED



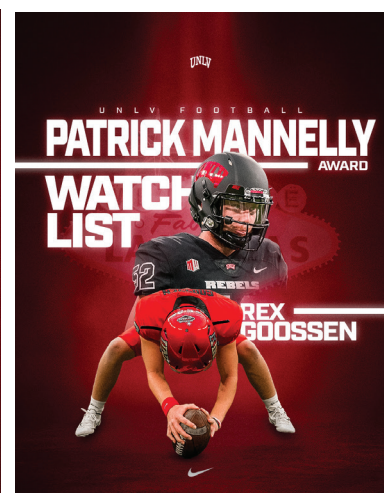
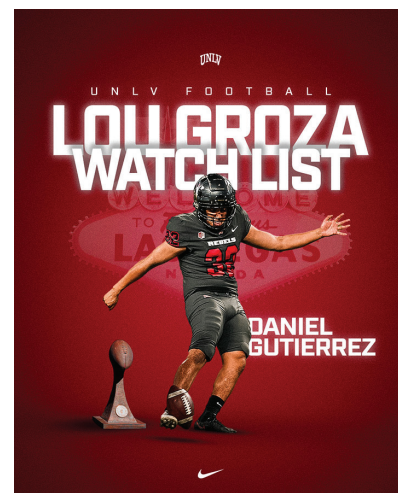
Super Senior linebacker **Austin Ajiake** (“AH-g-kay”) became the first defensive player from UNLV to be named Mountain West Player of the Week since 2019, the league announced Sept. 26. Ajiake helped UNLV earn a 34-24 victory at Utah State in Game Four by leading all players with 11 total tackles, including seven solo stops and one tackle-for-loss. The Fremont, CA, (Bellarmine Prep) product also hauled in his second interception of the season and returned it nine yards to set up a score. It was one of five picks on the night by the Rebels, who are now tied for fourth in the nation for turnover margin at plus-eight. For the season, Ajiake ranks fourth in the nation with 80 total tackles going into Saturday.

WATCHING THE REBELS

A trio of Rebels made official Watch Lists during the preseason for their on-field talents. UNLV junior center **Leif Fautanu** (LEEF faw-TAH-new) is back on the official preseason 2022 Watch List for the Polynesian



College Football Player of the Year Award. UNLV Super Senior **Daniel Gutierrez** is one of 30 members of the 2022 Preseason Lou Groza Award Watch List after being a semi-finalist a year ago. Finally, UNLV senior long snapper **Rex Goossen** is one of 25 players on the 2022 Patrick Mannelly Award Watch List, which was named after former Duke University and longtime Chicago Bears long snapper **Patrick Mannelly**. 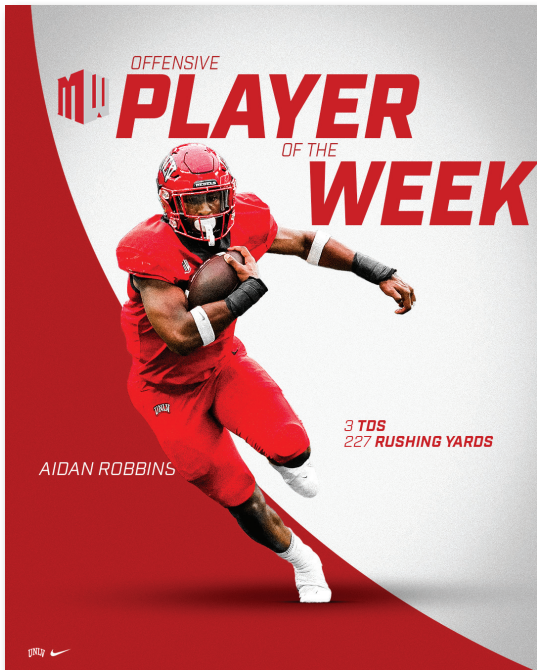
to college football's top player at the special teams position each year and Goossen, who recovered from a serious injury suffered last season, is on the list for the second straight year.

NEXT STOP FOR THE A-TRAIN: THE END ZONE



UNLV running back **Aidan Robbins**, who is tied for 10th in the nation in total touchdowns with nine (eight rushing), rolled his way to Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week honors on Sept. 19. A graduate transfer from the University of Louisville, Robbins (Louisville, KY) ran 29 times for a nation-leading 227 yards and three touchdowns to help UNLV rout North Texas 58-27 in Week Three. The rushing total ranked eighth in Rebel single-game history. Robbins joined **Charles Williams** (Nov. 15, 2021) as the only two Rebel running backs to earn the honor since **Tim Cornett** did it in 2010 and the only two to win it outright since “**Jersey**” **Joe Haro** way back in October 2001. Cornett, **Frank “The Tank” Summers** (2007) and **Larry Croom** (2002) all won Co-Offensive Player of the Week awards since Haro’s outright win more two decades ago. Since the beginning of the 2020 Mountain West season, there have been three 200-yard rushing performances in the conference, all by UNLV running backs -- Williams twice in 2021 and Robbins in 2022. Robbins left Saturday’s game vs. Air Force with an injury in the first quarter but with 591 yards through seven games, he remains on pace to become the program’s 10th player to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season.

UNLV saw its two-game win streak in overtime snapped with a double-OT loss in the 2021 opener to Eastern Washington. It also dropped the program’s home record in OT to 4-9. In 2016, the Rebels broke a two-game losing streak in overtime games with its historic 69-66 victory over Wyoming. It marked the only time that the Rebels won a game that went longer than one overtime period and set a school record for points in extra time with 17. In 2008, the Rebels won back-to-back OT games at No. 13 Arizona State and then at home vs. Big 12 team Iowa State.

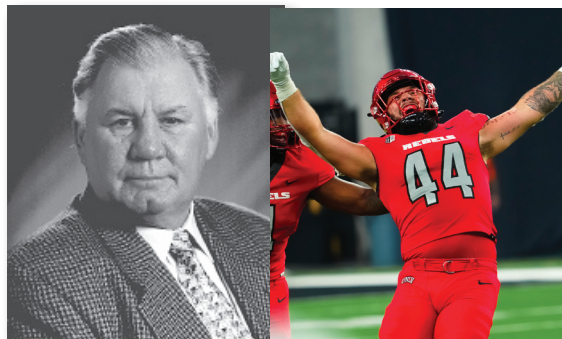

BEAUDRY EARNS WIESNER AWARD

Before UNLV's home-opening football game vs. Idaho State, senior linebacker **Kyle Beaudry** ("BOE-dree") was recognized as this year's recipient of the Tom Wiesner Award (pronounced "WEEZE-ner"). For the 21st consecutive year, coaches selected the player who best exemplifies the courage, enthusiasm, dedication and toughness of the late Mr. **Tom Wiesner**. Beaudry, who is a local product from powerhouse Liberty High School, is the starter at the WILL position and became the third linebacker to earn the Wiesner, which is designated with special stitching on the front of his jersey. A Wisconsin native and three-time letterman on the Badger football team, Mr. Wiesner sought his fortune out West and became one of the Las Vegas' leading businessmen, philanthropists, politicians and ambassadors. The founder of the successful restaurants that are part of Big Dog's Hospitality Group, Mr. Wiesner helped guide Rebel Athletics from their infancy and was inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Contributor in 1994. Also a member of the Nevada Board of Regents, he died in 2002 at the age of 63 after a battle with Leukemia.

BRUMFIELD TAKES CONFERENCE KUDOS

Doug Brumfield became the first UNLV quarterback in three years to be named Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week, the league announced August 29. Brumfield led the Rebels to a season-opening 52-21 victory over Idaho State by turning in the second-most efficient passing game in school history. Despite taking the second half off, the sophomore from Inglewood, California, completed 21-of-25 pass attempts for a career-high and nation-leading 356 yards and four touchdowns – nearly all of which came in the first half. The 84.0 completion percentage ranked only behind **Caleb Herring's** school-record 85.7 (24-28) clip posted vs. Central Michigan in 2013.



IT'S SLOTS-OF-FUN: FAMED REBEL ROLLER RETURNS!

College football's most exciting sideline celebration prop debuted October 16, 2021, vs. Utah State when the Rebel Roller giant slot machine got plenty of use during UNLV's game that evening at Allegiant Stadium. Standing eight feet tall, weighing 700 pounds and worth approximately \$60,000, the machine was custom-built specifically for UNLV player sideline celebrations by local gaming giant and longtime university supporter IGT. Ready to roll for players at least 18 years of age who both score or secure turnovers at home games. Video clips from the 2022 season-opener featuring the uniquely Vegas celebration went viral and earned more than eight million views on social media. While not awarding actual prizes, possibilities on the reels include the UNLV arch, the Southern Nevada area code of 702 and the iconic "Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas" sign.



COME READY TO PLAY!

UNLV became the first football program in history to boast back-to-back Mountain West Freshman of the Year honorees as quarterback **Cameron Friel** earned the 2021 edition just one year after wide receiver **Kyle Williams** took home the 2020 honor along with a Second Team Freshman All-America nod. Friel broke the school record for completion percentage in a season by a freshman with a 62.4 clip, which also tied Hall of Famer **Randall Cunningham** (1984) for third overall by any Rebel. Friel, who came off the bench to lead the team in passing yards and touchdown passes, was named the MW Freshman of the Week after leading his team to a win at New Mexico. Also, his 307 yards on 25 completions at undefeated UTSA marked the most yards thrown by a UNLV true freshman QB. The season award means UNLV head coach **Marcus Arroyo** has now coached five freshman honorees in the last decade alone: QB Friel (UNLV), WR Williams (UNLV), QB **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (2009 MW Freshman of the Year at Wyoming), QB **Nick Mullens** (C-USA All-Freshman Team at Southern Miss) and RB **Justice Hill** (Freshman All-America and nation's top rookie rusher at Oklahoma State).

Even with the graduation of longtime Rebel star **Charles Williams**, the UNLV roster remains Williams-heavy in 2022 with no less than five players sharing that same last name, including three who began the year as starters. In fact, all five of the quintet, who are no relation to each other, are members of the team's current two-deep. That means a full 11 percent of the UNLV depth chart is filled by a Williams.

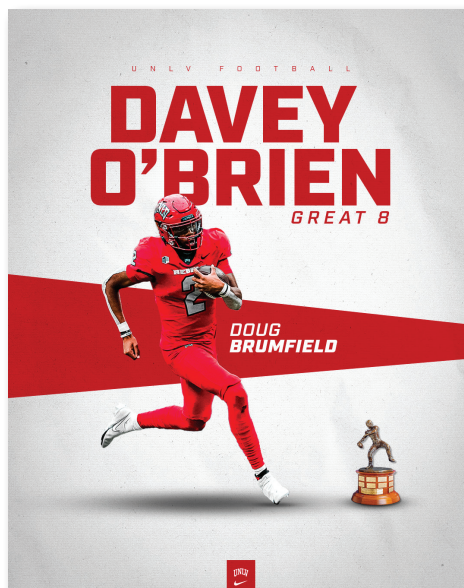

BRUMFIELD EARNS NATIONAL NODS



UNLV quarterback **Doug Brumfield** was named to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 list following Week Three. Brumfield ("BRUM-field"), who with this honor automatically earned a spot on the Davey O'Brien Award Midseason Watch List, helped UNLV post a 58-27 win over North Texas on Sept. 17 by completing 21-of-27 pass attempts for 211 yards and two touchdowns in addition to rushing 12 times for exactly 100 yards and two more scores. Despite being knocked out in during the first quarter of last week's game at San Jose State, Brumfield leads the Mountain West in pass efficiency, pass completions (155) and touchdowns responsible for with 13 (8 passing and 5 rushing). The sophomore from Inglewood, CA (J Serra HS) was also honored as one of eight Manning Award Stars of the Week by the Allstate Sugar Bowl after the UNT game.

GIANT FIRST HALF LEADS TO OPENING-WEEK WIN

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (1-0) used a dominating early offensive performance to earn an opening-week win for only the third time in the last 13 seasons, 52-21, over Idaho State (0-1) in front of 19,579 fans at Allegiant Stadium Saturday afternoon.

In what was the earliest game in school history by two days, the Rebels celebrated kicking off their 55th year of football by scoring on all seven first-half drives to run up a 45-7 halftime lead and then resting nearly every one of their starting skill players for the remainder of the day. The explosion, which came on

the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders' natural grass turf, included tying the school record for most points in a quarter with 35 in the second (tying the same number vs. Idaho State in 2015). It was the most second-quarter points ever scored by UNLV, besting the 31 scored vs. North Texas in 2000.

Sophomore quarterback Doug Brumfield turned in the second-most efficient passing game in school history, completing 21-of-25 attempts for 356 yards and four touchdowns – with all but one, five-yard completion coming in the first half. The 84-percent completion rate ranked just behind Caleb Herring's school-record 85.7-clip vs. Central Michigan in 2013 (minimum 20 attempts).

Brumfield's main target was newcomer Ricky White as the Michigan State transfer wide receiver was scintillating in his Rebel debut, catching all eight passes thrown his way for 182 yards and two touchdowns – all coming in the first two quarters before getting the second half off.

The Rebel defense turned in five quarterback sacks and won the turnover battle 1-0 thanks to Super Senior Austin Ajiake's first career interception, which he returned 47 yards to set up a UNLV score. New linebacker Fred Thompson led all tacklers with 10.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Doug Brumfield, who was the 14th different starting QB for UNLV in the last 19 openers, turned in a career day as his 356 yards tied for the 21st-most in a game by a Rebel. That included a personal-best four scores and represented the most yards in a game for the program since Max Gilliam's 387 vs. San Jose State in 2018.

STAT OF THE GAME: The 45 points scored in the first two quarters were the second-most in any half by a Rebel team (52 vs. ISU in 2015).

QUOTABLE: "I really enjoyed the efficiency of the first half, the way we moved the ball around and the way we moved. Did a nice job on defense stopping the run game...I thought we did a good job of taking care of football. – zero turnovers. I think that is a big deal, especially for week one." **UNLV head coach Marcus Arroyo**

REBEL NOTES

- Because the Raiders hosted the Patriots the night before, Saturday's game was played on natural grass, marking the first time UNLV played a home game on the natural stuff since 2002, which was the final season Sam Boyd Stadium featured grass
- The Rebels won on grass for the first time since 2018 at San Diego State
- UNLV improved its record in the month of August to 4-6
- New starting running back Aidan Robbins, who transferred in from Louisville, scored three touchdowns in his Rebel debut (two rushing and one receiving) as he totaled 35 yards on 10 carries overall
- With his 39-yard boot, Daniel Gutierrez moved into fifth place on the school's career list with his 38th field goal, tying Jim Cook (1986-88)
- Gutierrez also improved to 29-of-30 all-time in field goal attempts from 39 yards or shorter
- UNLV improved to 25-30 all-time in season-openers and 20-10 when they happened at home
- UNLV improved to 7-2 all-time vs. the Bengals as the home team has won all nine meetings
- New punter Marshall Nichols, who transferred to UNLV from Mississippi State, had to wait until the second half to make his collegiate debut but ended up with a net average of 42.3 yards on three attempts
- Coming in during the final minutes, Stetson transfer running back Jordan Younge-Humphrey ended up leading the team in rushing yards with 71 on just six carries
- UNLV played four quarterbacks in the game – Brumfield, sophomore transfer Harrison Bailey, true sophomore Cameron Friel and walk-on Matthew Geeting, who enjoyed the victory formation kneel-down
- After the hosts were shut out in the third quarter, Friel found Zyeell Griffin for a 14-yard score with just over two

LATE UNLV RALLY TURNED BACK AT CAL

BERKELEY, Calif. (UNLVRebels.com) – The UNLV (1-1) football team was not able to convert a first-and-goal to take a late lead and fell, 20-14, in its first-ever meeting with California (2-0) of the Pac-12 Conference in front of 38,180 fans at Memorial Stadium Saturday afternoon.

Following an early season bye week, the Rebels took the field for the first time in September and quickly fell behind 14-0 but would not surrender another touchdown to the Golden Bears. UNLV got into the game with an impressive second-quarter drive

capped by a Doug Brumfield to Kyle Williams 11-yard touchdown play.

The Rebels trailed 17-7 at halftime after racking up 70 yards in penalties. After Cal made another field goal, UNLV pulled to within six after a 31-yard rushing score by Aidan Robbins. The Rebels would eventually have four shots at the end zone, getting as close as the eight-yard line, with just under three minutes remaining but were ultimately turned away. UNLV also forced another punt and had one last shot before Cal closed things out.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Louisville graduate transfer Aidan Robbins rushed 14 times for a career-high 84 yards and his 31-yard touchdown scamper was the fourth overall of the young season (three rushing and one receiving).

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV was just 1-of-12 on third down vs. Cal.

QUOTABLE: "We let that one get away. We have a locker room full of guys right now that are disappointed because they wanted to finish that game, but we've got to capitalize versus quality opponents. We had some things in this game we didn't do in the opener that put us in a situation where we had to make up a lot of ground and we're going to go back and look at that. We've also showed we'll fight. Our guys will fight, there's no doubt about it." **UNLV head coach Marcus Arroyo**

Brumfield also completed 21-of-27 pass attempts for 211 yards and a pair of touchdowns, including a 23-yarder to Kyle Williams on the game's opening drive. After UNT returned the kickoff 99 yards for a score, the Rebels eventually blocked a UNT punt that went out of the end zone and resulted in a safety. After the Mean Green kicked a go-ahead field goal, UNLV went back up on Robbins' first touchdown run and never lost the lead again.

Brumfield became the first Rebel to pass for at least 200 yards and rush for at least 100 in the same game since Armani Rogers (211 & 193) did it at New Mexico in 2017.

Senior linebacker Austin Ajiake led all tacklers with 12 total while UNLV won the turnover battle 2-0 with a pair of interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown to put the finishing touches on the victory.

REBEL OF THE GAME:

Louisville graduate transfer Aidan Robbins posted career highs in rushing attempts with 29 and yards with 227 to go with three touchdowns and give him seven overall TDs in just three games (six rushing, one receiving).

UNLV's defense picked off five passes thanks to four different players (two by Nohl Williams, one by Austin Ajiake, Cameron Oliver and Jerrae Williams). It marked the first five-INT game for the Rebels since 1992 vs. Pacific.

QUOTABLE:

"These guys are excited. To win on the road in conference play against the defending Mountain West champions after a (USU) bye week is a big deal. We were sloppy on some things, we did some things we haven't done all season, but that's going to happen when we play on the road versus a quality opponent. The program has come a long way to win a game like that while playing imperfect and that's exciting."

FOOTBALL COMPLETES COMEBACK TO IMPROVE TO 4-1

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – After falling behind 17-0 in the first half, first-place UNLV (4-1/2-0) football scored the next 24 and held on for a thrilling 31-20 victory over New Mexico (2-3/0-2) Friday night before 21,605 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

The Rebels won for the fourth time in their first five games of a season for the first time since 2003 and improved to 2-0 in Mountain West play for just the second time since the league was formed in 1999 (2013).

The 17-point comeback tied for the fifth-largest in school history and was buoyed by Super Senior All-America candidate kicker Daniel Gutierrez who connected on three straight field-goal attempts – including from 47 and 50 yards – to help UNLV pull to within 17-9 at halftime.

Quarterback Doug Brumfield ran for the team's first touchdown and then threw a two-point conversion to Ricky White that tied the game at 17 midway through the third quarter. Early in the fourth period, the Rebels took their first lead on Aidan Robbins' three-yard rush that was his ninth total score of the season. Cameron Oliver's 21-yard pick-six put the final touches on the 17-point win.

REBEL OF THE GAME:

Super Senior LB Austin Ajiaka, who came in leading the team in tackles, again led the way with a game-high dozen total takedowns, including two TFL, as the Rebel defense stiffened in time to turn the game around.

STAT OF THE GAME:

After no defensive scores since 2017, UNLV now has two in the last three games and both came from the same player. Cameron Oliver's interception return was his second taken to the end zone at the end of the game this season (North Texas).

QUOTABLE:

"How about the Rebels? I'm still fired up! That's such a huge deal for our group, it's just a character building win and that's the bottom line. It was ugly and there were a lot of things against us early on, and to rally like that, to play like that in the second half, to play complimentary football in a situation like that, I mean our crowd and our stadium ... we can feel that. We handled adversity (and) this is a huge step forward in resilience."

SPARTANS SNAP UNLV WIN STREAK IN SAN JOSE

SAN JOSE, Calif. (UNLVRebels.com) – The UNLV (4-2/2-1) football team saw its three-game win streak snapped, 40-7, at San Jose State (4-1/2-0) Friday night before 16,669 fans at CEFCU Stadium.

The Rebels, who have not won in this city since 1993 when both teams were members of the Big West Conference, lost starting quarterback Doug Brumfield to injury near the end of the first quarter. Cameron Friel, last year's Mountain West Freshman of the Year, came off the bench and completed his first seven pass attempts but could not rally the Rebels

as the Spartans took a 23-0 halftime lead and never looked back.

In the third quarter, Friel found Senika McKie from 14 yards out to mark the wide receiver's first touchdown as a Rebel and get their team on the board. Friel ended up completing 15-of-22 attempts for 153 yards.

REBEL OF THE GAME:

Super Senior LB Austin Ajiaka, who is from nearby Fremont and came in leading the team in tackles, again led the way with a game-high 13 takedowns, including two sacks.

STAT OF THE GAME:

UNLV was 0-5 on third down and 0-1 on fourth down in the first half while the Spartans built a lead. The Rebs finished 4-of-12 on third down.

REBELS TURN OVER GAME TO AIR FORCE

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – The UNLV (4-3/2-2) football team fumbled on its opening two drives to allow Air Force (5-2/2-2) to build a quick 14-0 lead en route to a 42-7 win before a season-high Homecoming crowd of 23,847 at Allegiant Stadium Saturday night.

Playing without starting quarterback Doug Brumfield because of injury, the Rebels fell to the Falcons for the fifth straight time. Making his first start since last season, Cameron Friel

accounted for two of UNLV's three first-half fumbles – all of which were converted into touchdowns as the Rebels fell to 3-1 at Allegiant Stadium this fall.

The Rebels, who also lost starting running back Aidan Robbins to injury in the opening quarter, got on the board before halftime with a 31-yard touchdown pass from Friel to Ricky White, who finished with four catches for a game-high 58 receiving yards.

REBEL OF THE GAME:

Super Senior LB Austin Ajjake, who came in leading the Mountain West in total tackles, finished with a career-high 20 takedowns vs. the Falcons, which was just two off the school single-game record posted by Quincy Sanders vs. Air Force in 1999.

STAT OF THE GAME:

With its back-to-back fumbles lost, UNLV allowed more points off turnovers (14) in the first 10 minutes of the game than the rest of the season combined (13 in six games).

QUOTABLE:

"Disappointed in the way we took care of the ball offensively and put ourselves behind the stakes, that's the bottom line. I'm disappointed in the way we started the game, moved the ball and didn't take care of it. We've done a good job this season, for the most part, but you can't put yourself behind the eight ball versus a team that is that effective."
