OPENING KICK

- Navy (0-0) and #13 Notre Dame (0-0) meet for the 96th time on the gridiron and for the third time in Dublin, Ireland when the two square off on Saturday, Aug. 26 at 7:30 pm (2:30 pm ET) at a sold-out Aviva Stadium (51,700). The game will be the debut for Navy head football coach Brian Newberry.
- The two teams previously played in Dublin in 1996 at Croke Park and in 2012 at Aviva Stadium. Notre Dame won the 1996 game 54-27 and the 2012 game 50-10.
- Navy will have the longest regular season in the country this fall, playing its first regular-season game of the year against Notre Dame and its final regular-season game on Dec. 9 vs. Army at Gillette Stadium in New England.
- The two programs are among the winningest FBS teams in college football history. Notre Dame ranks fourth all-time with 938 wins, while Navy ranks 25th with 733 wins.
- The two schools had played 93-consecutive times, which was the longest intersectional rivalry in college football, until 2020 when the COVID-19 pandemic caused the game to be canceled. Navy and Notre Dame were originally scheduled to open the 2020 season in Dublin, Ireland. Travel restrictions, however, forced the game to be moved to Annapolis for what would have been the first game in series history to be played at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium before the contest was ultimately canceled.
- Notre Dame leads the series 81-13-1 and has won five in a row over the Mids. Navy's last win over Notre Dame was in 2016, 28-27, in Jacksonville. The Mids lost by seven points to the Irish (24-17) in 2017 at Notre Dame and by three points (35-32) last year in Baltimore.
- Navy has defeated four Notre Dame teams ranked in the top 25 all-time: 1936 over #13 Notre Dame 3-0 (Municipal Stadium in Baltimore); 1944 over #2 Notre Dame 32-12 (Municipal Stadium in Baltimore); 1957 over #5 Notre Dame 20-6 (at Notre Dame) and in 2009 over #19 Notre Dame 23-21 (at Notre Dame).
- An upset by Navy would make Brian Newberry the first head coach in school history to beat a ranked opponent in his first game.
- August 26 will be the earliest start to a Navy football season. Prior to this year, the earliest date was August 30 (4x - 2001 at Temple, 2002 vs. VMI, 2008 vs. Towson, 2014 vs. Ohio State in Baltimore).

BROADCAST COVERAGE

- NBC will televise the game with Jac Collinsworth (play by play), Jason Garrett (analyst) and Zora Stephenson (sideline) on the call. The game will also be streamed on Peacock and will be televised by Sky Sports in Ireland and the UK.
- The Navy Insider Show will air from 12 noon-1:30 pm on WBAL Radio (1090 AM) with Pete Medhurst, Joe Miller, Keith Mills and Scott Wykoff.
- The Navy Football Pregame Show with Medhurst, Miller, Mills, Wykoff and special commentary from John Feinstein will get underway at 1:30 pm on the Navy Radio Network, followed by game action beginning at 2:30 pm with Medhurst, Miller and Mills on the call.
- NBC will also air pregame and halftime shows with coverage beginning at 2:00 pm. Host Maria Taylor, along with analysts Matt Cassel, Michael Robinson and Joshua Perry will count down to kickoff, previewing and setting the stage for the contest.
- Following the contest, Medhurst, Miller, Mills and Wykoff will recap the day's events in a 30-minute postgame show.

WHY WE PLAY

- Without Navy, Notre Dame may not still exist. Notre Dame fell on hard times in World War II. The school's population dwindled to a depression era number of 2,623 students in 1943 and a 20 percent reduction in 5 years led to stark financial problems for the school. Then the Navy came to Notre Dame's rescue.
- According to then Notre Dame president Hugh O'Donnell, the school "offered all of the facilities of this institution to the government. In April of 1943, the V-7 Indoctrination School was created and the first group of 900 men, all college graduates enlisted for one month as apprentice seamen."
- The late Notre Dame Vice President Father Edmund Joyce also shared the same sentiments of Navy's importance to the school. "All I can say is without the Navy during the war, this institution would have gotten down to a few hundred students. Instead of that, we were almost twice our normal size during the war, and we were able to contribute something to the Navy."
- The Navy signed a contract with the South Bend-based school at the time, guaranteeing \$487,711 for its infrastructure needs and administrative expenses.
- Notre Dame has never forgotten Navy's kindness and support in its time of dire need. In fact, in the 1950s and 60s when colleges across the country en masse were ending their ROTC programs, Notre Dame stood by Navy and allowed its University to serve as a base for college naval recruits.

SCOUTING NOTRE DAME

0-0 Overall

Head Coach: Marcus Freeman

- Notre Dame returns 11 starters and 31 letter winners off a team that finished 9-4 in 2022 and defeated South Carolina in the Gator Bowl 45-38.
- The Fighting Irish have just 6 players that transferred to Notre Dame from another school, but one of them is Heisman Trophy candidate Sam Hartman, who transferred to South Bend from Wake Forest.
- Hartman threw an ACC-record 110 touchdown passes for the Demon Deacons, while throwing for 12,967-career passing yards, which ranks second in ACC history. Hartman has topped the 300-yard passing mark 21 times in his career which is the most in ACC history. Additionally, he has either rushed for or thrown a touchdown pass in 34-consecutive games.
- Notre Dame returns leading rusher Audric Estime, who ran for 920 yards and 11 touchdowns on 156 carries last year.
- 6-8, 322-pound junior offensive tackle Joe Alt was an All-American last year and is expected to be one again in 2023. Both Hartman and Alt were selected to the Walter Camp Award Watch List, an award presented to the national player of the year.
- The Irish return their top-two tacklers on defense in graduate student linebackers JD Bertrand and Jack Kiser.
- Bertrand closed out last year with 82 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss and 2 sacks, while Kiser had 58 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.
- In last year's game, Navy outscored #20 Notre Dame 19-0 in the second half and outgained the Irish 166-20, but it

wasn't enough as the Irish hung on for dear life to beat Navy 35-32 in front of 62,124 fans at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

- Braden Lenzy reached around a defender with both arms to make a spectacular touchdown catch, one of four TD passes by Drew Pyne before halftime to give Notre Dame to a 35-13 lead at the intermission.
- Pyne also ran for a touchdown in the first half and Notre Dame blocked a punt for a fifth-straight game. Lenzy's catch, however, was the most impressive highlight. Navy's Mbiti Williams Jr. was positioned between Lenzy and the ball on Pyne's deep pass to the goal line, but Lenzy reached around with both hands and controlled the ball, appearing to pin it against Williams' back. Then he pulled it around the cornerback with his right hand to complete the catch.
- Navy had the ball down 21-13 in the second quarter, but an interception on a trick play gave the Irish possession at the Navy 41. Pyne ran for an 11-yard touchdown moments later, and then the blocked punt by Jack Kiser — Notre Dame's seventh of the season — set up Pyne's 37-yard TD toss to Jayden Thomas.
- Navy quarterback Xavier Arline threw a 23-yard touchdown pass to Mark Walker in the fourth, and a 2-point conversion made it 35-24. Then Maasai Maynor's 20-yard TD pass to Maquel Haywood late in the fourth, along with another 2-point conversion, cut the lead to a field goal.

BRIGADE OF MIDSHIPMEN MARCH-ON

- A pregame timeline was not available at the time of publication, however there will be a March-On by approximately 400 members of the Brigade of Midshipmen that made the trip to Dublin before the game as well as a fly-by.

AER LINGUS COLLEGE FOOTBALL CLASSIC SOLD-OUT

- The 2023 Aer Lingus College Football Classic featuring Notre Dame and Navy on August 26 at Aviva Stadium in Dublin, Ireland, is sold-out. Over 40,000 international fans are expected to make the trip for the event, including over 39,000 fans directly from the United States which represents a new world record for the largest number of Americans to travel internationally for a single sporting event.
- The 2023 College Football Classic has been valued in an independent report from Fáilte Ireland and Grant Thornton to be worth in excess of €147 million to the Irish economy. Based on previous college football events held in Ireland, data indicates that American visitors for the game will stay an average of seven nights in Ireland and visit three different destinations. The most popular of those destinations include Dublin, Galway, Belfast, Killarney and Cork.
- "The Aer Lingus College Football Classic Series is a really important event for the tourism and hospitality sector in Dublin and all across the island and I am pleased to support the series via funding from Fáilte Ireland and Tourism Ireland," said Minister for Tourism, Catherine Martin T.D.
- "The game in August will also provide opportunities for business, education and other sectoral exchanges between Ireland and US and will further strengthen the cultural, sporting and affinity links between our two countries."
- "The demand for tickets for the 2023 Aer Lingus College Football Classic proves that Ireland is the home of college football outside of the United States," said Padriac O'Kane, the Co-Founder and Director of the Aer Lingus College Football Classic.
- "This year's event in Dublin will see the largest movement of Americans into Europe in peace time with the game set to provide a huge boost to the Irish economy and hospitality sector."

STRONG IRELAND TIES FOR TWO NAVY PLAYERS

- **Colin O'Connor** (Sr, WR) and **D.J. Donovan** (JR, TE) both have strong family ties to Ireland.
- All four of O'Connor's great grandparents are immigrants from Ireland and were born near Dublin. Both of his great grandfathers, Patrick Joseph O'Connor and Patrick Joseph Murphy, came to the United States in the early 1900s and settled in the New York City area. Patrick Joseph O'Connor volunteered for the U.S. Army not long after settling in America and fought in Europe during World War I.
- Donovan's great grandfather, Daniel Donovan, was born in Ireland on April 24, 1910, in Castleisland in County Kerry and was one of 12 brothers and sisters. D.J. Donovan's great grandmother, Margaret Mohan, was born in Tipperary, Ireland in 1916. Donovan's great grandmother arrived in Boston when she was 7 years old, while his grandfather arrived in New York in 1929 at the age of 19 on the Cunard Liner, "Scythia." He did not arrive through Ellis Island as he was processed on the ship before arrival. While they immigrated to the United States at different times, they went on to meet in New York at an Irish dance.
- Donovan's great grandfather, Edward Maher, is also from Ireland.
- Approximately 20 members of Donovan's family will be traveling to Ireland to attend the game. His family is planning to visit the farm where his great grandfather grew up.

NEWBERRY WANTS TO END SLOW STARTS TO THE SEASON

- One of Brian Newberry's priorities after being named head coach was to end the trend of slow starts by Navy.
- The Mids had 750 live reps during spring ball and hit and tackled much more in fall camp than in previous years.
- Navy has lost three-straight season openers in embarrassing fashion, falling to BYU 55-3 at home in 2020 during COVID, to Marshall 49-7 at home in 2021 and to FCS foe Delaware 14-7 at home in 2022.
- The Mids have lost their first-two games in each of the last two seasons by a combined score of 123-30 (Marshall and Air Force in 2021; Delaware and Memphis in 2022).

MIDS TRYING TO REVERSE THE TREND OF SLOW STARTS IN GAMES AS WELL

- Navy was 4-1 in 2022 when the opposition did not score on its opening drive and 0-7 when it did.
- The first quarter was far and away the worst quarter for the Mids a year ago, as the opposition outscored Navy 81-43.
- Navy outscored the opposition 66-64 in the second quarter and 96-78 in the fourth quarter / overtime.
- Navy also started slow in the second half and was outscored 69-58 in the third quarter.

MURTEZI, HARBOUR, BUSIC AND UMBARGER NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

- Navy head football coach **Brian Newberry** announced at the annual Navy Football Senior Salute that seniors **Lirion Murtezi** and **Will Harbour** were voted team captains for the 2023 season by their teammates.
- "Our players have spoken and I couldn't be more pleased with the two captains they have chosen to lead and represent our program," said Newberry. "Player-led teams are the best teams and Will and Lirion will be exceptional in their roles both on the field and in Bancroft Hall. They personify everything the Naval Academy and Navy football are all about."
- Murtezi, a 6-3, 328-pound center from Pittsburgh, has played in 24-consecutive games for the Mids along the offensive line, making 9 starts. He started the final 6 games of the 2022 campaign.
- Murtezi, who moved to Pittsburgh from Pristina, Kosovo in 2006, was a team captain at North Hills High School his junior and senior years.
- Harbour, a 6-1, 230-pound linebacker from Frisco, Texas, has played in 17 games over his career, including 10 starts. Last year, he started 7 games and finished with 30 tackles, 3.5 tackles for a loss and 1 sack.
- In his career, Harbour has recorded 51 tackles, 5 tackles for a loss and 1.5 sacks. Harbour was team captain his senior year at Rick Reedy High School in Frisco.
- Newberry announced on July 29 that **Jacob Busic** and **Jayden Umbarger** would join Murtezi and Harbour as team captains for the 2023 season. It's just the third time (2019, 2021) in school history Navy has had four team captains.
- "Some years it's hard to pick captains," said Newberry. "Some years you pick captains and you aren't sure how it's going to go, but this year it was extremely easy. I could have told you at this point last year that these four guys would be captains this year and I couldn't be more excited about how they are going about their business right now. They are the most respected players on the team because they have done the work."
- Busic has started 24-consecutive games for the Mids at defensive end. Last year, he was named First-Team All-East by the ECAC and was an Honorable Mention All-American Athletic Conference selection. Busic finished the 2022 season second on the team in sacks (6) and tied for second in tackles for loss (8.5) to go along with his 38 total tackles on the year.
- Umbarger has started 15 games in his career, including 11 of 12 contests last year. He was named Academic All-District by the College Sports Communicators. Umbarger was Navy's leading receiver last fall, catching 16 passes for 265 yards (16.6 yds/catch).

NAVY LANDS MULTIPLE PLAYERS ON ATHLON SPORTS AND PHIL STEELE'S PRESEASON ALL-AAC TEAM

- Eight Navy football players have been named to the Athlon Sports Preseason All-American Athletic Conference Team.
- **Colin Ramos** (Jr / LB) was named to the first team, **Jacob Busic** (Sr / DE) and **Will Harbour** (Sr / LB) to the third team and **Donald Bernard Jr.** (Sr / NG) to the fourth team.
- **Daba Fofana** (Jr / FB) and **Josh Pena** (Sr / OG) were both named to the third team offense, while **Amin Hassan** (Sr / PR) was named to the second team and **Riley Riethman** (Jr / P) to the fourth team.
- Additionally, 8 Navy football players have been named to Phil Steele's Preseason All-American Athletic Conference Team.
- **Donald Bernard Jr.** (Sr / NG) and **Colin Ramos** (Jr / LB) were named to the second team, **Daba Fofana** (Jr / FB), **Rayuan Lane III** (Jr / S) and **Riley Riethman** (Jr / P) were named to the third team, while **Connor McMahon** (Jr / OT), **Jacob Busic** (Sr / DE) and **Amin Hassan** (Jr / PR) were named to the fourth team.
- Bernard Jr. has made an incredible 30-consecutive starts at nose guard for the Mids. He was named to Phil Steele's All-American Athletic Conference Third Team last year and finished the season with 35 tackles, including 4.5 for loss.
- Busic, who has started 24-consecutive games for Navy, was named First-Team All-East, Honorable Mention All-American Athletic Conference and Third-Team All-AAC by Phil Steele last fall. He finished the year second on the team in sacks (6) and tied for second in tackles for loss (8.5) to go along with his 38 total tackles.
- Fofana had a breakout campaign at fullback in 2022, leading Navy in rushing (769) and rushing touchdowns (6) on 186 carries. Fofana earned 7 starts a year ago and was named to Phil Steele's All-American Athletic Conference Fourth Team.
- Harbour was a starter in 7 of the 11 contests in which he played last year and finished with 30 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.
- Hassan, who also started 6 games at slot back, ranked 18th in the country in yards per punt return a year ago, averaging 8.8. He returned 15 punts on the year for 132 yards.
- Lane III has been a starter in all 24 games of his career and has made 18-consecutive starts. Lane finished third on the team in tackles (71) and pass breakups (4) last year and also contributed 2 forced fumbles, 2 fumble recoveries, 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack.
- McMahon, who is projected to start at left tackle for the Mids this year, started 10 games last year as a sophomore.
- Pena is a veteran member of Navy's offensive line, making 20 starts over the last 2 seasons, including 11 games last fall.
- Ramos, who was named to Phil Steele's 2022 All-American Athletic Conference Third Team, was a starter in 10 of the 12 games last year and was second on the team in tackles (79), tied for second in tackles for loss (8.6) and tied for third in sacks (4).
- Riethman, who is ranked #1 on the Navy career punting leader board with a 43.2 average over 2 seasons, punted 45 times last fall for a 43.8 average, which is tied for the third best single-season average in school history. He placed 11 of his 45 punts inside the 20 and had 13 punts go for 50 yards or more.

REED NAMED WINNER OF ADMIRAL MACK AWARD

- **Justin Reed** (Jr / DE) was named the winner of the 2023 Admiral Mack Award, which is awarded to the most improved player during spring football practice.
- Reed has played in all 24 games his first-two years, starting a pair of contests. He has recorded 19 tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss, 1 sack and 1 fumble recovery. He had a career-high 4 tackles last year against Notre Dame.
- The Vice Admiral Mack Award was established in 1976 and is named in honor of the Naval Academy Superintendent from 1972-75. Admiral Mack was a strong supporter of the school's intercollegiate athletic program.
- Reed is the fourth-consecutive defensive player to be chosen and the 27th overall over the past 46 years. He is the sixth defensive end to win the award and the first since Jackson Perkins in 2019. Reed's teammate, co-captain **Will Harbour** (Sr / LB), won the award last year.

BUSIC NAMED TO LOMBARDI AWARD WATCH LIST

- **Jacob Busic** (Sr / DE), a 2022 First-Team All-East selection, has been named to the 2023 Lombardi Award Watch List.
- The Lombardi Award is presented annually to the college football offensive or defensive lineman who exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Fame Head Coach Vince Lombardi in addition to outstanding performance and ability.
- Busic finished his junior campaign with 38 tackles, 8.5 tackles for a loss, 6 sacks, forced 2 fumbles and recovered a fumble.

NAVY EARNS AFCA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

- Navy, Air Force, Boston College, Northwestern, Stanford, Toledo and Vanderbilt shared the American Football Coaches Association's 2022 Academic Achievement Award, presented by the Memphis Touchdown Club.
- All seven schools recorded a 100 percent graduation rate for members of their 2015 freshman football classes.
- It marked the 11th time the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) formula was used to select the winner. From 1981 to 2007, the award was presented based on a formula used by the College Football Association (CFA) and the AFCA. From 2008-17, the criteria for the AFCA's Academic Achievement Award was based on the highest NCAA GSR, and a Federal Graduation Rate of 75 percent or better. For 2018 and 2019, the AFCA used the NCAA's single-year APR. The AFCA returned to the NCAA GSR for 2022.
- The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes and holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for mid-year enrollees and non-scholarship students at schools that do not offer athletics aid. Under GSR calculation, institutions are not penalized for outgoing transfer students who leave in good academic standing. These outgoing transfers are passed to the receiving institution's GSR cohort.

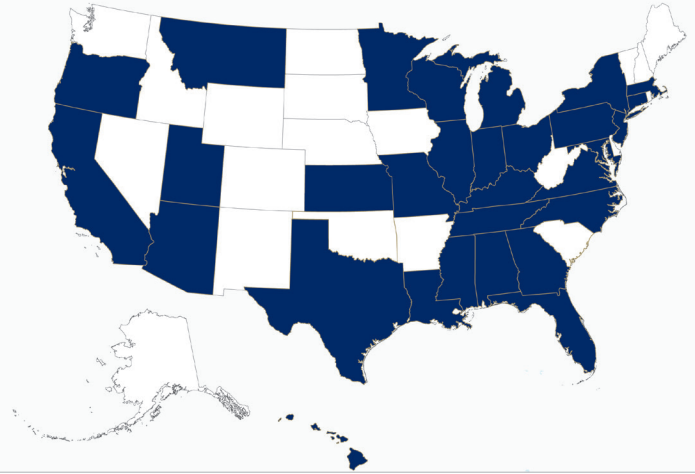

- The 34 sacks by the Mids are the most in school history. Sacks became an official NCAA stat in 2000.

- Navy sacked Notre Dame 5 times, all in the second half.

- Rayuan Lane III** (Jr / S) led the Mids with 2 fumble recoveries, while 8 other players recovered a fumble. The 2 fumble recoveries by Lane were tied for the 22nd most in the nation.

GET 6

- Since his arrival in 2019, **Brian Newberry** has challenged the defense to "Get 6" in every game.
- What does Get 6 mean? It's a combined total of 6 three-and-outs, fourth down stops and turnovers.
- If that turnover is returned for a score, it counts as an extra point towards the goal of 6.
- Newberry believes that if the defense can accomplish the challenge, the Mids will have a great chance to win.
- In Newberry's 4 years at Navy, the Mids are 14-3 (.824) when they "Get 6" (8-0 in 2019 / 2-0 in 2020 / 2-2 in 2021 / 2-1 in 2022).

NAVY DEFENSE TOUGH AGAINST THE RUN

- The Navy defense finished the 2022 season ranked third in the country against the run, giving up just 88.9 rushing yards per game. It is even more impressive when you take into account Navy played three of the top-nine rushing offenses in the country (#1 Air Force, #2 Army and #9 UCF).
- Navy gave up just 7 rushing touchdowns which was tied for the third fewest in the country.
- The Mids held their opponents to 3.0 yards per carry which ranked sixth nationally. Navy held the opposition to under 100 yards rushing in 7 games last year.
- Navy gave up 13 yards on 29 carries to Delaware, 91 yards on 32 carries to Memphis, 103 yards on 28 carries to East Carolina, 200 yards on 47 carries against Air Force (#1 rushing team / avg. 330.9 yds/gm), 25 yards on 18 carries against Tulsa, 105 yards on 21 carries against SMU, 180 yards on 34 carries against Houston, 20 yards on 20 carries against Temple, 55 yards on 20 carries against Cincinnati, 66 yards on 34 carries against Notre Dame, 84 yards on 24 carries to UCF (#7 rushing team / avg. 243.7 yds/gm) and 125 yards on 48 carries to Army (#2 rushing team / avg. 289.4 yds/gm).

NAVY TRYING TO REBOOT RUSHING TRADITION

- In 2003, Navy led the nation averaging a then school-record 323.2 yds/gm.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yds/gm.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids rushed for a then school-record 348.8 yds/gm in 2007, becoming the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years.
- In 2008, Navy led the country in rushing for a fourth-straight year, averaging 292.4 yds/gm.
- The Mids finished No. 2 in the country in 2013, averaging 325.4 yds/gm.
- Navy was second in the country in 2014, rushing for 338.1 yds/gm. It was the Mids' best rushing effort since 2007 when they set the school record.
- In 2015, Navy again finished No. 2 in the country, averaging 326.7 yds/gm.
- Navy averaged a then school-record 351.4 yds/gm in 2017, which was the second most in the country.
- In 2019, Navy once again led the nation in rushing with its school-record 360.5 yds/gm. The Mids outrushed second-place Air Force by 62 yds/gm.
- Since 2019, Navy has not come close to leading the nation in rushing, finishing 52nd in 2020 (177.6 yds/gm), 9th in 2021 (225.5 yds/gm) and 4th in 2022 (241.2 yds/gm).

- In 2021, Navy was a bit lucky when it came to fumbles, losing just 5 of its 21 fumbles on the year, while the opponents lost 7 of their 16.
- In 2022, the Mids were decidedly unlucky, losing 10 of their 15 fumbles, while the opponents lost 11 of 21 fumbles.

DABA DABA DO!

- **Daba Fofana** (Jr / FB), who entered last year's Tulsa game with 116-career yards rushing and no touchdowns, ran for a 159 yards on 21 carries and scored 3 touchdowns (all career highs).
- Fofana was the first Navy player to rush for over 100 yards since slot back Carlinos Acie rushed for 155 yards in 2021 against East Carolina (Lavatai rushed for 120 yards the next week against SMU).
- He was the first Navy fullback to rush for over 100 yards since Jamale Carothers ran for 188 yards against Houston in 2019.
- Fofana was the first Navy player to score 3 touchdowns in a game since Carothers scored 5 in that same Houston game.
- Fofana rushed for 61 yards on 21 carries the next week against SMU and had 89 yards on 20 carries against Houston. He carried the ball 24 times for 63 yards and a touchdown against Temple.
- Fofana hit the century mark for a second time in 2022, rushing for 133 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries against Notre Dame.
- He followed up the Notre Dame game with another 100-yard day, rushing for 114 yards on 20 carries against UCF.
- Fofana was the team's leading rusher with 769 yards and 6 touchdowns on 186 carries in 2022.
- He was the first fullback in the triple-option era to have 20 or more carries in four-consecutive games (21 vs. Tulsa, 21 vs. SMU, 20 vs. Houston, 24 vs. Temple).
- Fofana carries a 3.69 grade-point average as a physics major and plays the cello.

HALL SETS ARMY-NAVY GAME RECORD

- **Anton Hall's** (Jr / SB) 77-yard touchdown run against Army was the longest run by a Navy player in the history of the Army-Navy game.
- Hall, who played fullback his first two seasons, finished the day with 99 yards rushing on 7 carries.

A TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE

- Navy dominates the NCAA record book when it comes to single-season rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Keenan Reynolds ran for 31 touchdowns in 2013, which is the most by a quarterback in FBS history.
- Reynolds is also the NCAA record holder for career rushing touchdowns (by any player) with 88.
- Ricky Dobbs ran for 27 touchdowns in 2009, which is tied with Collin Klein of Kansas State for the second most in FBS history among quarterbacks.
- Will Worth ran for 25 touchdowns in 2016, which is the fourth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 24 touchdowns in 2015, which is the fifth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 23 touchdowns in 2014, which is tied as the sixth most by a quarterback.
- Malcolm Perry's 21 rushing touchdowns in 2019 are the 11th-most single-season TDs by a QB in FBS history.

MEMORIAL STADIUM

- **Nathan Kent** (So / WR) scored on a 70-yard reverse on just his second-career play and first-career touch in Navy's 53-21 win over Tulsa last fall. Kent made a Tulsa player miss in the backfield and then took it to the house untouched.
- Kent is a two-sport athlete for the Mids, as he was also recruited to run track. He set the school record at Rocklin High School in Rocklin, Calif. in the 100, 200 and 400-yard dash. Both of his parents were track standouts at Azusa Pacific, including his dad, Roosevelt Jr., who was a three-time All-American triple jumper.

RIETHMAN ON PACE TO SET SCHOOL RECORDS; NAMED TO RAY GUY WATCH LIST

- **Riley Riethman** (Jr / P) averaged 42.7 yards per punt as a freshman which is the sixth-best single-season punting average in school history.
- He followed up by averaging 43.8 yards per punt in 2022 which is tied for the third-best average in school history.
- Riethman's 43.2 career average (89 punts, 3848 yards) is the best average in school history (min. 50 attempts).
- He has had two of the five-best single-game performances in Navy history (min. of 5 punts), averaging 50.6 yards per punt against Notre Dame in 2021 and 50.2 yards per punt against UCF in 2022.
- Riethman is on the watch list for the Ray Guy Award which honors the nation's top collegiate punter in the FBS.

- **Amin Hassan** (Jr) had a career-long 57-yard punt return in Navy's 53-21 victory over Tulsa.
- The return was the longest punt return by a Navy player since 1996 when Ross Scott returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown in Navy's 1996 Homecoming win over Duke (64-27).
- Hassan averaged 8.8 yards per punt return in 2022 which was the 18th-best average in the country.

MCDONALD NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR 2022 JASON

WITTEN COLLEGIATE MAN OF THE YEAR; NAMED TO

PRESEASON WATCH LIST FOR 2023 WUERFFEL TROPHY

- Last year, **Xavier McDonald** (Sr / LB) was among the semifinalists for the sixth annual Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year, a group that included 20 of the nation's top leaders in college football.
- Compiled by a subset of the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Selection Committee, the semifinalists demonstrated a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field.
- Sixteen seniors and 4 juniors made up the list. Among conferences, the Big Ten led the way with 6 selections, while the ACC had 5. The SEC and Pac-12 had 3 each. The American had 2 semifinalists and the Big 12 had 1.
- McDonald overcame an enormously challenging childhood to become a high achiever in both academics and athletics in high school, while working 30 to 35 hours a week and taking care of four younger siblings. McDonald took on that heavy responsibility as a freshman in high school after both his parents were incarcerated simultaneously. To help support himself and his siblings, McDonald got a job as a cashier at Winn-Dixie. Despite the dire situation, McDonald made it to the United States Naval Academy where he is an operations major. He has played in 19 of Navy's last 22 games and is an assistant tutor for a Thermodynamics class while also completing over 50 hours of community service over the last year.
- McDonald appears on this year's Wuerffel Trophy Watch List, college football's premier award for community service.

NAVY AMONG TOP 10 IN GRADUATING STUDENT-ATHLETES

- Navy is once again one of the top-10 schools in the country in graduating NCAA student-athletes.
- Navy's graduation success rate of 95 percent is tied for ninth in the country among schools that sponsor FBS football and is the best among the Service Academies.

JOHNSON SELECTED TO NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION AND COLLEGE HALL OF FAME

- Former Navy football head coach Paul Johnson is the 25th person that either played or coached at the Naval Academy to be selected to the College Football Hall of Fame and the fifth coach joining Gil Dobie (1917-19), William Ingram (1916-18), Wayne Hardin (1959-64) and George Welsh (1973-81).
- Capitalizing on his patented spread option offense – one of the most innovative offensive schemes in all of college football – Paul Johnson took three programs to the top of their respective conferences and the national rankings, winning two national titles, five conference championships and making 18 bowl appearances. The Newland, North Carolina, native now becomes the first coach from Georgia Southern, the fourth coach from Georgia Tech, and the fifth coach from Navy to enter the College Football Hall of Fame.
- In his last stop at Georgia Tech, Johnson went 82-60 during 11 seasons, and the Yellow Jackets appeared in the final national rankings in 2008 (No. 22), 2009 (No. 13), and 2014 (No. 8). He led Georgia Tech to nine bowl games, including two New Year's Six bowls (Orange 2009, 2014). The Yellow Jackets appeared in three ACC Championship games during his tenure and won the ACC Coastal Division four times. His Georgia Tech teams led the ACC in rushing offense every year, and he was named ACC Coach of the Year three times (2008, 2009, 2014). He is the fourth-winningest coach at Georgia Tech behind John Heisman, William Alexander, and Bobby Dodd, who are all in College Football Hall of Fame. He coached two of nine total 10-win seasons and one of five 11-win seasons in Georgia Tech history.
- At Navy, he inherited a program that had gone 1-20 in the previous two seasons. Johnson transformed the program, and during his six seasons in Annapolis, the Midshipmen went 45-29, landing at No. 24 in the Associated Press poll in 2004. He coached Navy to five bowl berths. Johnson went 11-1 in Commander-in-Chief's trophy games, winning five CIC trophies, which represents the annual winner of the Air Force-Army-Navy round-robin. He never lost to Army, going 6-0 against the Black Knights, and in 2007 he led Navy to a victory over Notre Dame for the first time in 43 years.
- In his five seasons at Georgia Southern, the Eagles notched a 62-10 record, making five FCS playoff appearances and winning the FCS championship twice (1999 and 2000). He won the Southern Conference with Georgia Southern every year. He was twice named Southern Conference Coach of the Year (1997 and 1998) while heading the Eagles program. The 1999 team led the nation in scoring, rushing and total offense, and set the NCAA single-season record for average rushing yards per game (419.0) while breaking 197 schools records. Johnson was inducted into the Georgia Southern Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010.
- Johnson coached 11 First-Team All-Americans and one First-Team Academic All-American. He coached 1999 Walter Payton Award winner and 2017 College Football Hall of Fame inductee Adrian Peterson at Georgia Southern and 2010 Burlsworth Trophy recipient Sean Bedford at Georgia Tech.
- Johnson was recognized as the CBS National Coach of the Year in 2008, the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in 2004, and the Eddie Robinson Award winner as the I-AA National Coach of the Year in 1998. He was twice named the AFCA NCAA Division I-AA National Coach of the Year (1999, 2000).
- Before becoming a head coach, Johnson served as offensive coordinator at Navy (1995-96), Hawaii (1987-94), Georgia Southern (1985-86) and as defensive line coach at Georgia Southern (1983-84). During his first stint at Georgia Southern, he was part of the coaching team that won consecutive FCS National Championships (1985-86) with the Eagles, and as the offensive coordinator at Georgia Southern, he mentored College Football Hall of Fame inductee Tracy Ham. His coaching career began with roles as an offensive coordinator at Avery County (N.C.) High School from 1979-80 and at nearby Lees-McRae College from 1981-82.
- He has participated in a wide variety of charitable endeavors at each of his schools over the years, including his annual participation in the Bobby Dodd and Chick-fil-A charity

golf tournaments, which raises money for the Bobby Dodd Foundation, WinShape Homes and the schools' scholarship funds. Johnson earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Western Carolina in 1979 and his master's in health and physical education from Appalachian State in 1982.

THE AMERICAN WELCOMES SIX DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITIES

- As the American Athletic Conference celebrates its 10th anniversary, it enters its second decade poised to continue its remarkable ascension to national prominence.
- As of July 1, The American will consist of 15 prestigious institutions: Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), Charlotte, East Carolina, Florida Atlantic (FAU), Memphis, Navy (football only), North Texas, Rice, South Florida (USF), Southern Methodist (SMU), Temple, Texas at San Antonio (UTSA), Tulane, Tulsa and Wichita State (basketball, Olympic sports).
- "I want to issue a warm welcome to our six distinguished schools as they officially enter our conference," said Commissioner Mike Aresco. "UAB, Florida Atlantic, Charlotte, North Texas, Rice and UTSA are going to be great additions to our powerful conference. Together with our nine outstanding incumbent universities, we will continue to elevate our brand and to make our mark on college athletics at the highest level. The 15 schools of our reinvented American Athletic Conference join together to celebrate our remarkable first decade and to look forward to the next decade with renewed determination and commitment. The future is bright."
- In the 2023-24 season, The American will be the only Division I conference to have a New Year's Six bowl winner (Tulane) and an NCAA Men's Final Four participant (Florida Atlantic) in its ranks. In football, The American will be one of four FBS conferences (along with the Big Ten, Pac-12 and SEC) to have at least two 11-win teams from last year (Tulane, UTSA).
- The six incoming schools combined to win 14 championships in their previous conference last year, while the nine incumbent members from the American won 13 conference titles in the 2022-23 season.
- The American's new configuration will contribute to a legacy that includes four NCAA championship teams, a College Football Playoff semifinalist, four New Year's Six bowl champions, two NCAA Men's Final Four participants, six Women's Final Four Teams, a College World Series team, an NIT champion and 15 NCAA individual champions - all since the start of the 2013-14 season.
- Individually, student-athletes from the incumbent schools in The American have won the National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy as the top scholar-athlete in college football, the Bednarik Award and the Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player, a fifth-place finish in the Heisman Trophy race, a Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete, two Academic All-America of the Year selections and a Rhodes Scholarship.
- The reconfiguration of The American further concentrates the league in major metropolitan areas and recruiting strongholds. The league has four teams in the state of Texas, two each in Florida and North Carolina and one each in Pennsylvania, Maryland, Louisiana, Tennessee, Alabama, Oklahoma and Kansas. That results in a presence in four of the top 10, six of the top 25 and 12 of the top 52 Nielsen media markets.
- It also allows for The American to enjoy a lucrative and comprehensive media rights partnership with ESPN, giving the conference a significant presence on the Worldwide Leader's primary television networks (ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU) and an all-sports presence on ESPN+, the industry's leading streaming service with more than 25.3 million subscribers.

NAVY PICKED NINTH IN THE AAC PRESEASON POLL

- The Tulane Green Wave, which won its first American Athletic Conference title as part of a history-marking 2022 season, was chosen as the 2023 favorite as the conference unveiled its preseason media poll as part of The American's Football Media Days at the Live! by Loews resort.
- Tulane received 20 of a possible 34 first-place votes to finish with 457 points in the poll, while UTSA, the 2022 Conference USA champion, was second at 440 points. The Roadrunners, who are among the six new members of The American as of the 2023 season, had nine first-place votes.
- Tulane enters the season as the favorite in The American after the Green Wave completed the greatest single-season turnaround in college football history last year, improving by 9.5 wins from 2021 (2-10) to 2022 (12-2). Tulane returns 14 starters from last year's squad, which finished the season ranked No. 9 in the national polls on the heels of a thrilling 46-45 win against USC in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.
- Among the returning starters for Tulane is quarterback Michael Pratt, a junior who passed for 3,009 yards and 27 touchdowns while adding 10 rushing TDs a year ago. Head Coach Willie Fritz will have four returning starters on the offensive line and eight starters back from a defense that ranked third in the conference in total defense (360.4 ypg) and second in scoring defense (22.2 ppg).
- UTSA was tabbed for second in the preseason poll after the Roadrunners went 11-3 and claimed its second-consecutive Conference USA title. Jeff Traylor's squad has gone 23-5 in the last two seasons and has been ranked in the top 25 six times during that stretch. The 23 wins trails only Georgia (29), Michigan (25) and Alabama (24) among FBS teams in the last two seasons. UTSA will have 18 starters and 50 letterwinners back in 2023, including veteran quarterback Frank Harris, who was the 2022 Conference USA Most Valuable Player.
- SMU was picked third by the media as the Mustangs had three first-place votes. The Mustangs return 16 starters and 40 letter winners from last year's 7-6 squad and bolstered the roster with a number of established FBS transfers in the offseason. Head Coach Rhett Lashlee's offense averaged 37.2 points and 472.9 yards per game last season.
- Memphis, which has had nine consecutive seasons at .500 or better, was fourth in the preseason poll. The Tigers, who went 7-6 last year, will be led by junior quarterback Seth Henigan, who has turned in back-to-back 3,000-yard seasons.
- Florida Atlantic was fifth in the poll as Tom Herman begins his tenure as the Owls' head coach. Herman returns to The American as the conference's career winning percentage leader after he went 22-4 in two seasons at Houston (2015-16). He has a 2023 squad with 18 returning starters, including running back Larry McCammon, who had 1,004 yards and seven touchdowns last season.
- The American continued to live up to its status as one of the top FBS conferences in 2022. Tulane's top-10 finish was the sixth by an American Athletic Conference team in the league's first 10 seasons, while the Green Wave gave the conference its fourth New Year's Six bowl win. The American has sent a team to either the New Year's Six or the College Football Playoff seven times in nine seasons of the CFP era and eight times in the 10-year history of the conference.

GLADCHUK A MEMBER OF THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF COMMITTEE

- The College Football Playoff (CFP) Management Committee appointed NC State Athletics Director Boo Corrigan as selection committee chair for the 2022 football season, replacing Gary Barta (Iowa).
- Hancock also announced the Management Committee has appointed **Chet Gladchuk**, athletics director at the Naval Academy; Jim Grobe, longtime head coach at Ohio, Wake Forest and Baylor; Warde Manuel, athletics director at Michigan; and Kelly Whiteside, longtime sportswriter for USA Today, Sports Illustrated and Newsday, to the CFP Selection Committee.
- Gladchuk is in his 22nd year as Director of Athletics at the Naval Academy. He arrived in Annapolis in 2001 from Houston, where he had been the Director of Athletics for four years.
- Before Houston, Gladchuk led his alma mater, Boston College, as its the Director of Athletics, Intramurals and Recreation for 7 years. Prior to rejoining Boston College, he served as Director of Athletics at Tulane from 1987-90 after a 1985-87 stint as an Associate AD at Syracuse.
- Gladchuk lettered in football at Boston College and after graduating went on to earn a master's degree from Massachusetts-Amherst, where he began his career in intercollegiate athletics. He also had served as Director of Athletics and head football coach for the New Hampton (Prep) School in New Hampshire prior to leaving for UMass.

FUTURE ARMY-NAVY SITES ANNOUNCED

- The Army-Navy Football Game presented by USAA, "America's Game," will be played in 5 different cities over the next 5 years it was announced by Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk and Army West Point Director of Athletics Mike Buddie.
- Boston / Foxborough will serve as the 2023 host (Dec. 9), Washington, DC / Landover, Md. will host the 2024 game on Dec. 14, Baltimore will host the 2025 game on Dec. 13, New York City / East Rutherford, N.J. will host the 2026 game on Dec. 12 and Philadelphia will host the 2027 game on Dec. 11. All five games will be televised nationally by CBS.
- The 2023 game will be hosted in the Boston region in conjunction with the 250th anniversary of the Boston Tea Party and the 225th anniversary of the USS Constitution's maiden voyage. This will be the first time the Army-Navy game has been played in the New England region and Navy will serve as the home team.
- The nation's capital will be the backdrop for the 2024 game, which will also be the 125th playing of the Army-Navy game. This will be just the second time the game has been played in the D.C. region and the first since 2011, a game in which Navy won 27-21. Army will serve as the home team.
- The game will return to Baltimore in 2025 with Fort McHenry, the site where Francis Scott Key penned the lyrics to the national anthem, serving as the backdrop. It will be the seventh time Baltimore has hosted the game and the first time since 2016. The two teams are 3-3 in games played in Baltimore. Navy will serve as the home team.
- New York / New Jersey will host the 2026 game as part of the 25th anniversary of 9/11. It will be the 19th time the game has been played in New York or New Jersey and the sixth time it has been played at the Meadowlands Complex. Navy is 4-1 against Army in games played in East Rutherford, including a 17-13 win in 2021. Army will serve as the home team.
- Philadelphia will host the annual Army-Navy game for the 91st time in 2027. Navy leads the all-time series 45-42-4 in games played in Philadelphia. Navy will be the home team in 2027.

NAVY SPORTS INFORMATION NAMED ONE OF THE TOP SID OFFICES IN THE COUNTRY FOR A SIXTH TIME

- Two first-time winners and nine previous ones comprise the 14th Super 11 Awards, which the Football Writers Association of America presents annually to the best performing College Sports Communicators departments in the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision.
- As for the 2022 CSC department awards, Clemson and Colorado each collected a 10th award and Nebraska a ninth. Navy won for the sixth time, Kansas State and Pitt each a fifth time and South Carolina, UAB and West Virginia each a second time.
- Navy has now won the award in four of the last five years. It was also honored in 2010, 2016, 2018, 2019 and 2021.
- The first-time recipients in the 2022 Super 11 award, which dates back to the 2009 season, are BYU and TCU. Seven of the 10 FBS Conferences and one Independent are represented among the 11 winners this season.
- Last year, with the pandemic a lesser concern, in-person press access to college football teams improved dramatically. But work for access still remains.
- The 2022 winners were deemed to have had excellent accessibility during the week of the game and after the game--with a program's players, coaches and assistant coaches -- along with other listed criteria.
- FWAA members provided input during the season when press boxes were judged on how well they were run and maintained in terms of neutrality, pool reporters, noise level and accessibility to the press box that could affect a media person's ability to his or her job.
- In addition, Virginia has been awarded a special commendation for its media access after the tragic shooting deaths last fall on campus of three Cavalier football players and the injuries of two others.
- In January 2009, the FWAA formed the first Super 11 Committee. The concept is supported by the College Sports Communicators (formerly CoSIDA).
- Founded in 1941, the Football Writers Association of America consists of journalists, broadcasters, publicists, photographers and key executives in all areas of college football. The FWAA works to govern media access and game-day operations while presenting awards and honors, including an annual FWAA All-America Team. NAVY HEAD COACH BRIAN NEWBERRY

FIFTH SEASON AT NAVY | FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH



On Dec. 19, 2022, Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk introduced **Brian Newberry** as the program's 39th head football coach. Newberry had served as the defensive coordinator at Navy the previous four seasons.

Navy closed out the 2022 campaign ranked third in the

nation against the run which is even more impressive when you consider it was the only defense ranked in the top 25 that faced 3 of the top-10 rushing offenses in the country. Navy also finished third in fewest first downs allowed, 23rd in sacks, 22nd in fumbles recovered and 32nd in total defense.

Striker John Marshall ('23) finished third in the nation in sacks and tackles for loss per game while setting school records for single-season and single-game sacks. Marshall was the only unanimous First-Team All-American Athletic Conference selection in 2022.

In 2021, the Navy defense acquitted itself well by finishing #32 in the nation in rushing defense, #34 in total defense and #34 in red zone defense. Linebacker Diego Fagot was distinguished with All-America honors, First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and was named All-East. He was also named MVP of the East-West Shrine All-Star Game.

In 2020, after a slow start due to COVID, the defense finished the year with a flurry, holding Memphis, Tulsa and Army to under 300 yards of total offense. It was the first time a Navy defense had achieved that feat since 1997.

In 2019, Newberry's first year on the job, Navy made massive improvements on the defense.

Navy ranked 20th in third down defense (121st in 2018), 10th in rushing defense (90th in 2018), 39th in passing defense (75th in 2018), 16th in total defense (86th in 2018) and 34th in scoring defense (103rd in 2018).

Newberry, a semifinalist for the Broyles Award, presented annually to the best assistant coach in college football, and his defensive staff installed a "Get 6" culture within the Navy defense that took off. Newberry told the defensive players if they got a combination of six three-and-outs, fourth down stops, turnovers and defensive touchdowns in a game, the Mids would win. In 2019, Navy was 8-0 when it managed to "Get 6."

The Mids finished 10th in the nation against the run despite facing the #2, #3 and #11 rushing offenses in the country. Navy forced the opposing offense off the field in 3 plays or less in 36 percent of its drives, which was the nation's 10th-best average. Navy also gave up just 15.2 first downs per game, which was tied for third best.

Prior to his arrival in Annapolis, Newberry served as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kennesaw State from 2015-18, leading the Owls to the FCS quarterfinals in each of his last two seasons.

Newberry joined the Kennesaw State coaching staff after spending the 2012 season as defensive coordinator at Northern Michigan. Prior to his one season at Northern Michigan, Newberry served as defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at the University of the South in 2011 where the Tigers improved their scoring defense by 16 points per game and total defense by 85 yards a contest.

Newberry's coaching experience also includes 4 seasons (2007-10) as defensive backs coach at Elon and 5 years (2004-06, 2001 and 2002) as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach at Washington & Lee. He also served as a graduate assistant/defensive line coach at Rice during the spring of 2004, spent one season (2003) as an assistant defensive backs coach at Lehigh and began his coaching career at Southern Arkansas where he was a graduate assistant coaching the defensive backs and wide receivers in 1999 and 2000.

In 2004, Newberry's Washington & Lee defense produced a school-record 43 sacks and ranked among the Division III leaders in rushing defense. The Generals' defense led the Old Dominion Athletic Conference in pass defense, rush defense and scoring defense in 2005 and in 2006, Washington & Lee forced 30 turnovers and ranked among the nation's leaders in pass defense.

Newberry played collegiately at Baylor and graduated in 1998 with a Bachelor of Science in education. He helped lead the Bears to the Southwest Conference Co-Championship and an appearance in the 1994 Alamo Bowl. In 1995, Baylor was ranked #5 in total defense.

#27: HONORING A LEGEND - JOE BELLINO

- In August of 2019, Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk announced that Joe Bellino's #27 would be placed on the turf at the 27-yard line at both ends of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium facing Navy's sideline as a tribute and in memory of the 1960 Heisman Trophy winner, who passed away on March 27, 2019.
- Additionally, Navy wore a helmet sticker in Bellino's memory during the 2019 season.
- He was the first Navy player to win the Heisman Trophy and the first to have his number retired.
- Bellino, a native of Winchester, Mass., was known as the player who was never caught from behind. In just three seasons, he scored 31 touchdowns, rushed for 1,664 yards on 330 carries, returned 37 kicks for 833 yards and set 15 school records.
- Bellino was a unanimous All-America selection at halfback in 1960 and was also the winner of the Maxwell Award. His end zone interception preserved Navy's 17-12 win over Army that season. The Midshipmen were ranked as high as fourth in the country and went on to play in the Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1961.
- He was also an outstanding catcher and outfielder on the Navy baseball team. He hit .428 in 22 games in 1959 and led the Eastern Intercollegiate League in stolen bases. He had a .320 average in 1960 and was the baseball team captain in 1961.
- Army partisans can hardly forget the 1959-60 academic year for what Bellino did to the Cadets. In addition to his three-touchdown performance in the 1959 Army-Navy football game, he was equally sensational in the Army-Navy baseball game in 1960. Bellino went 4-for-4 at the plate, drove in three runs, stole two bases and threw out two Army runners attempting to steal as Navy carved out a 9-1 win.
- Bellino capped off his senior year (1960-61) by winning the school's top two athletic awards, the Thompson Trophy and the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword. It marked the first time in 41 years that one midshipman received both of these awards.
- Bellino's #27 football jersey was retired after the 1960 season. He had a three-year stint with the Boston Patriots after he had completed his four-year service obligation. He stayed in the Navy Reserves for 24 more years and reached the rank of Captain.
- He was a 1977 inductee into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. In 2009, he was named to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial All-Stadium Team. During its annual season-ending football banquet, Navy presents the Joe Bellino Award to the varsity football player whose inspiring on-field performance made a significant impact on the team and contributed to its overall success during the season.

SIGNIFICANT MOMENTS IN NAVY-MARINE CORPS MEMORIAL STADIUM HISTORY

- Sept. 26, 1959** – Navy defeats William & Mary 29-2 in the first game played at the stadium.
- Sept. 24, 1960** – President Eisenhower watches as the Midshipmen defeat Villanova 41-7.
- Nov. 12, 1960** – Heisman Trophy winner Joe Bellino of Navy sets a school record by scoring four touchdowns in a 41-6 win over Virginia.
- Oct. 26, 1963** – Heisman Trophy winner Roger Staubach leads the Mids to a 24-12 win over unbeaten Pittsburgh by completing 14-of-19 passes, seven to Jim Campbell.
- Sept. 23, 1967** – Navy receiver Rob Taylor sets school records for most catches (10) and most yards receiving (140) in a game, as Navy beats Penn State 23-22 when Taylor catches a 16-yard TD pass with 57 seconds left.
- Nov. 12, 1977** – Navy beats Georgia Tech 20-12 as Naval Academy alumnus President Jimmy Carter watches.
- Sept. 12, 1981** – Navy defeats The Citadel for its 500th all-time win.
- Nov. 7, 1981** – Eddie Meyers sets a Navy record for most rushing yardage in a game with 298 yards and four touchdowns in the Mids' 35-23 win over Syracuse.
- Nov. 17, 1984** – Navy defeats second-ranked South Carolina 38-21 in one of the biggest upsets ever for the Mids. It marks only the third time Navy has beaten an opponent ranked this high.
- Sept. 22, 1990** – Alton Grizzard becomes Navy's all-time career total offense leader in a 23-21 win over Villanova.
- Oct. 5, 1996** – The Mids explode for 64 points to top Duke 64-27 on Homecoming.
- Nov. 9, 1996** – Navy clinches its first winning season since 1982 with a 30-14 victory over Delaware.
- Sept. 13, 1997** – Chris McCoy ties an NCAA record by rushing for three touchdowns on consecutive carries, as Navy defeated Rutgers 36-7.
- Oct. 18, 1997** – Gerald Wilson returns an interception 95 yards for a touchdown, as Navy defeats VMI 42-7. The 95-yard interception return is a stadium record and second longest in school history.
- Nov. 22, 1997** – Pat McGrew had a 91-yard touchdown run, second longest in school history and longest in stadium history, as Navy rolls over Kent State 62-29.
- Nov. 22, 2003** – Quarterback Craig Candeto directed touchdown drives on all eight possessions he played as Navy destroyed Central Michigan 63-34 in front of a Senior Day crowd of 29,527. The win made Navy bowl eligible for the first time since 1996.
- Nov. 20, 2004** – Kyle Eckel, Aaron Polanco and Eric Roberts rushed for two touchdowns apiece as Navy routed Rutgers 54-21, in front of a Senior Day crowd of 33,615. Navy, which scored 47-consecutive points in the game, rushed for 476 yards and 613 yards of total offense. The victory gave Navy an undefeated record at home for the first time since 1996.
- Oct. 8, 2005** – On a day that was already special because of the rededication of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium, Joey Bullen made it even more memorable by drilling a 46-yard field goal with four-tenths of a second remaining to give Navy a thrilling 27-24 comeback victory over Air Force.
- Aug. 30, 2008** – Shun White rushed for a school-record 348 yards and 3 touchdowns on just 19 carries to lead Navy to a season-opening 41-13 victory over Towson.
- Nov. 1, 2008** – Clint Sovie's 42-yard fumble return for a touchdown with 37 seconds left in regulation capped a 20-point rally in the final 9:16 to send the game into overtime. Quarterback Ricky Dobbs' 1-yard run in OT gave Navy a miraculous 33-27 victory over Temple.
- Oct. 3, 2009** – Navy shut down the nation's top rushing offense, while Joe Buckley drilled 3 field goals, including a 38-yarder in overtime, to lead Navy to a 16-13 victory over Air Force in front of a sellout crowd of 37,820.
- Oct. 20, 2012** – Navy scored 10 points in the final 5:30 to come from behind and shock Indiana, 31-30, on Homecoming. Keenan Reynolds hit Matt Aiken with a touchdown pass with 2:02 remaining to give Navy the lead and a Parrish Gaines interception clinched the Mids' first win over a BIG TEN opponent at home since 1926.
- Oct. 26, 2013** – One week after missing an extra-point against Toledo in the second overtime, Nick Sloan booted a 30-yard field goal against Pitt as time expired to give Navy a thrilling 24-21 come-from-behind victory.
- Nov. 15, 2014** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for a career-high 277 yards and a stadium-record 6 touchdowns to lead Navy to a 52-19 victory over Georgia Southern.
- Sept. 19, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds ran for 5 touchdowns and 142 yards as the Midshipmen dominated East Carolina in their American Athletic Conference debut, 45-21.
- Oct. 3, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for 183 yards to lead Navy to a 33-11 rout of Air Force. It was Navy's largest margin of victory in the series since 1978.
- Nov. 14, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds shattered the FBS career rushing touchdown record scoring 4 rushing touchdowns against SMU in Navy's 55-14 rout of SMU. The 4 rushing touchdowns gave Reynolds 81 in his career, surpassing Montee Ball's record of 77.
- Dec. 28, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds wrapped up his record-setting career by rushing for 3 scores and passing for another to lead Navy to a 44-28 win over Pitt in the Military Bowl. Reynolds' final touchdown clinched the win and gave him 88 total touchdowns for his career, breaking the tie with La. Tech's Kenneth Dixon for most touchdowns in FBS history. The win was the 11th on the year for Navy, setting a school record (at the time).
- Oct. 8, 2016** – Will Worth ran for a touchdown and threw for 2 more, while Josiah Powell picked off a pass and returned it 34-yards for a touchdown to lead Navy to a 46-40 upset of #6 Houston. It was Navy's first win over a top 10 opponent since beat #2 South Carolina in 1984.
- Oct. 7, 2017** – Zach Abey fired a 16-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Carmona with 15 seconds remaining to give Navy a thrilling 48-45 victory over Air Force in front of a stadium-record crowd of 38,792. It was the highest scoring game in the history of the Navy-Air Force series.
- Nov. 11, 2017** – Making his first career start at quarterback, Malcolm Perry rushed for 282 yards and 4 touchdowns on 33 carries to lead Navy to a 43-40 victory over SMU. Perry had a stadium-record 92-yard touchdown run in the game.
- Oct. 5, 2019** – Malcolm Perry scored on a 3-yard touchdown run with 23 seconds left to give Navy a 28-25 lead, and Tony Brown recovered an Air Force fumble on the ensuing possession and ran 8 yards for a touchdown to give Navy a stunning 34-25 victory over Air Force.
- Oct. 26, 2019** – Bijan Nichols kicked a 48-yard field goal as time expired to give Navy a 41-38 victory over Tulane. The Nichols field goal is believed to be the longest to win a game in Navy history (final 1:00 of regulation or overtime).
- Nov. 23, 2019** – Malcolm Perry rushed for 195 yards and 2 touchdowns on 38 carries, while completing 9 of his 15 pass attempts for 162 yards and a touchdown as Navy upset No. 21 SMU, 35-28. Perry's 70-yard touchdown run on third-and-10 with 6:11 left put Navy up for good.

- **2023 (Lacrosse):** Played in 11 games, starting nine ... finished second on the team with 31 points, scoring 15 goals and handing out a team-high 16 assists.
- **2022:** Played in 9 games on the year, starting each of the last 4 ... finished the season with 96 carries for 376 yards (3.9 yds/carry, 41.8 yds/gm) and scored 3 rushing TDs ... completed 4 of his 11 passes for 85 yards, 2 touchdowns and 1 interception ... carried the ball a career-high 28 times for a team-best and season-high 102 yards against Army ... completed his only pass in the game, a 25-yard touchdown to Maquel Haywood in the first overtime period ... helped lead the Mids to a 17-14 upset victory over nationally-ranked UCF and directed an offense that accounted for all 248 yards on the ground ... carried the ball 18 times for 24 yards, including a 1-yard touchdown run to give the Mids a 7-0 lead ... started the Notre Dame game where he recorded 59 yards rushing and a touchdown on 12 carries, while completing 2 of his 4 passes for 57 yards and a TD ... threw a 23-yard touchdown to Mark Walker, marking just his second-career passing touchdown ... following the touchdown throw, he ran in the 2-point conversion for the Mids ... threw a season-long 34-yard pass that set up Daba Fofana's 36-yard touchdown run late in the opening quarter against the Irish ... part of an offensive unit that rattled off 363 yards of total offense, the most against the Irish since its 368 yards on Nov. 5, 2016 ... Navy's 108 yards passing were the most against Notre Dame since its 118 on Nov. 1, 2014 ... Navy's 32 points were the most it has scored in the series since dropping a 49-39 contest to Notre Dame on Nov. 1, 2014 ... made the start at Cincinnati where he led the Mids in rushing with 87 yards on 12 carries, including a season-long 32-yard run ... completed his only pass attempt, a 3-yarder to Jayden Umbarger ... assumed the QB duties with 3:07 remaining in the first quarter of the Temple game after Tai Lavatai went down with a season-ending injury ... carried the ball 16 times for 54 yards, including a 23-yard game-winning touchdown run in overtime ... ran the ball 3 times for 31 yards, including a season-long 22-yard carry against Houston where he lined up in the slot ... carried the ball 3 times for 10 yards against Air Force ... made his season debut against Memphis where he carried the ball twice for 8 yards and was unable to complete his 3 pass attempts ... also threw his first-career interception.
- **2022 (Lacrosse):** Scored 5 goals and handed out 3 assists while battling injuries most of the year ... a starter in 5 of the 6 games in which he saw action, including each of the last 5 ... recorded a point in 5 of the 6 contests, including each of the last 5 ... produced a career-high 4 points on 2 goals and 2 assists in Navy's Star Game victory over Army ... it was the first multi-point game of his career and the first assists of his career ... scored the game's first goal (13:25) on his lone shot of the game in Navy's 11-10 victory over #18 Johns Hopkins at Homewood Field ... made his first start in the Mids' win over Colgate where he scored his first-collegiate goal.
- **2021:** A starter in 2 of the 7 games in which he played (Air Force, Houston) ... closed out the year rushing for 176 yards on 67 attempts (6.0 yds/carry, 25.1 yds/gm), while also completing 7 of his 18 passes for 142 yards, a touchdown and no interceptions ... injured on his only carry of the Army game, a 10-yard gain, in what was just Navy's third offensive play of the contest ... threw his first-career touchdown pass, a 15-yarder, to Chance Warren at Temple ... entered the Notre Dame game with 2:07 left in the second quarter for an injured Tai Lavatai and played the remainder of the game ... carried the ball 8 times for 8 yards and completed 1 of his 2 passes for 18 yards against the Irish ... spelled starter Tai Lavatai at Memphis ... carried the ball 19 times for 64 yards, including a 40-yard touchdown in his start at Houston ... it was the longest run by a Navy player at that point in the season ... also completed 3 of his 6 passes for 83 yards, including a career-long 37-yard pass to Mychal Cooper that set up Isaac Ruoss' 1-yard touchdown run 2 play later ... made the start against Air Force, carrying the ball 16 times for 31 yards, including a long run of 26 yards ... was 0 for 5 through the air ... Navy's backup QB in the opener against Marshall ... closed out the day with 76 yards rushing on 16 carries and scored the Mids' lone touchdown which also was the first of his career (1 yd) ... completed 2 of his 3 passes for 26 yards, including a 22-yarder to Mychal Cooper.
- **2020:** A starter in 3 (Tulane, Tulsa, Army) of the 5 games in which he played ... finished as the Mids' third-leading rusher with 210 yards on 59 carries and completed 4 of his 12 passes for 27 yards ... became just the fifth freshman in program history to start at quarterback in the annual Army-Navy game, joining Mike Roban (1974), Alton Grizzard (1987), Jim Kubiak (1991) and Keenan Reynolds (2012) ... paced the Mids in rushing against the Black Knights with a career-high 109 yards (team finished with 108) that was highlighted by the team's longest run from scrimmage this year, a 52-yarder ... earned his second start of the year, leading the Mids with 60 yards rushing on 27 carries against Tulsa ... completed 4 of his 8 passes for 27 yards, including a 14-yard pass to Mark Walker ... had not attempted a pass prior to the Tulsa contest ... made his third appearance of the season, entering the game with just under 4 minutes to play against Memphis ... carried the ball 3 times for 12 yards, including a long run of 8 yards ... carried the ball 5 times for 16 yards at Air Force ... made his collegiate debut in the Mids' win at Tulane where he became just the fifth freshman quarterback to start for the Mids in career history - Keenan Reynolds (2012, 6th gm), Jim Kubiak (1991, 5th gm), Alton Grizzard (1987, 5th gm), Mike Roban (1974, 10th gm) - and the earliest to start a game ... carried the ball 7 times for 13 yards and a long run of 9 yards against the Green Wave.
- **High School / Personal:** A 2020 graduate of Shoreham-Wading River High School, Arline

was a three-sport athlete who earned letters in basketball (2), football (4) and lacrosse (5) ... a three-time All-State (N.Y.) and all-county football standout who played both quarterback and cornerback ... First-Team All-State football selection his senior year ... four-time all-county attackman for Shoreham-Wading River's lacrosse team ... earned All-America, First-Team All-State and First-Team All-Long Island honors in lacrosse his senior year ... member of two Long Island Championship football teams - 2016 (10-2) and 2019 (11-1) ... also led the lacrosse team to the 2019 New York State Championship with an 18-3 record ... also received offers (football and/or lacrosse) from Air Force, Army, Duke, Johns Hopkins, Maryland, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Ohio State and Stony Brook ... originally committed to play at North Carolina before a change in football coaching staff ... sister, Jesse, played lacrosse at Stony Brook ... father, John, played lacrosse at Delaware (1993-95) ... son of John and Jennifer Arline ... majoring in general science.
