TERRIERS TREK TO NOTRE DAME FOR TWO

- The No. 6 Boston University men's ice hockey team will travel to Notre Dame for a two-game series with the Fighting Irish that begins Friday night at 7 p.m.
- Saturday's showdown is set for 6 p.m.
- Both games will be streamed live on Peacock.

SERIES HISTORY

- BU is 6-8-2 in 16 meetings against Notre Dame, though the Terriers have won the last two contests against the Irish.
- Both those victories were at Agganis Arena, including last season's 5-2 triumph; BU is 1-5-0 at Compton Family Ice Arena.
- The Terriers' last trip to South Bend was in 2016 when Notre Dame was still in Hockey East, with the teams splitting a weekend series.
- BU won the first-ever meeting between the two schools on Dec. 29, 1970, at Boston Arena.
- Terrier head coach Jay Pandolfo has never lost to Notre Dame as either a coach or a player, as in addition to guiding BU to last year's win he captained the 1995-96 squad that earned a 7-3 win over the Fighting Irish on Dec. 29, 1995.
- BU has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in five of the six seasons it has defeated the Irish.


SCOUTING THE FIGHTING IRISH

- Notre Dame dropped to 1-2-0 after a 3-0 loss at RIT on Saturday.
- The Fighting Irish began their season with a weekend split at home against Clarkson and have scored just four goals through three games.
- Senior Landon Slaggert leads Notre Dame with two goals and is the only Irish skater with multiple points.
- Freshmen Danny Nelson and Jayden Davis have also lit the lamp for Notre Dame this season.
- Five different Irish skaters have recorded an assist this season.
- Graduate student Ryan Bischel owns a 1.68 goals-against average and a .928 save percentage in three starts this season, including a 22-save shutout of Clarkson on Oct. 8.
- Bischel allowed five goals and made 38 saves against the Terriers last season.

FAST LANE TO FIFTY

- Sophomore defenseman Lane Hutson recorded his 50th career point with an assist on freshman Macklin Celebrini's second goal of the game at UNH on Oct. 13.
- Hutson reached 50 points in just 41 games, totaling 16 goals and 34 assists in that span.
- He is the fastest Terrier defenseman to reach that milestone since John Danby did it in 25 games across two seasons (1976-77 and 1977-78).

WILLANDER SHINES IN NCAA DEBUT

- Freshman defenseman Tom Willander made his collegiate debut at New Hampshire.
- He wasted no time picking up his first point when senior Luke Tuch redirected Willander's shot for the game's first goal.
- Willander then blasted a one-timer into the back of the net later in the first period for his first collegiate goal.
- The 11th-overall pick in the 2023 NHL Draft by Vancouver, Willander is tied for first with Celebrini among Hockey East defenders with two points.

ANOTHER GREAT DEBUT FOR A BU ROOKIE

- Tom Willander became the ninth Terrier freshman in the last five seasons to record multiple points in his collegiate debut, with Macklin Celebrini joining that list with a goal and an assist at Bentley.
- Ryan Greene, Lane and Quinn Hutson, Devin Kaplan and Jeremy Wilmer all secured multiple points in last year's opener against Bentley while Luke Tuch tallied a goal and an assist in his first game as a Terrier during the 2020-21 season.

THE MAC ATTACK IS BACK, JACK

- In the season opener at Bentley, graduate captain Case McCarthy made his return to the Terrier lineup for the first time since suffering a season-ending injury during the Hockey East semifinals in March.
- McCarthy made an immediate impact, as he scored the game's opening goal with a shot from the right point at 11:37 of the first.
- He finished with six shots on goal and one blocked shot.
- McCarthy recorded a career-high 15 points as a senior assistant captain last season on three goals and a career-best 12 assists.
- In 107 career games, McCarthy has recorded 44 points (12g, 32a).
- McCarthy is the 125th full-time captain in program history.

CARON SHARP IN TERRIER DEBUT

- Junior goaltender Mathieu Caron made 21 saves in his Terrier debut on Saturday at Bentley to backstop BU to a win.
- Selected as the team's player of the game, Caron made several crucial stops to send the game to overtime.
- Caron played the previous two seasons at Brown, earning Third Team All-ECAC and Second Team All-Ivy accolades last year.
- He was the first BU netminder to win in his Terrier debut since Vinny Duplessis made 40 saves in a 3-1 victory over No. 1 Boston College on Feb. 6, 2021.

LACHANCE GETS GOING RIGHT AWAY

- Freshman Shane Lachance provided the lone assist on graduate captain Case McCarthy's opening goal in the Oct. 7 victory at Bentley.
- Lachance also played a pivotal role in sophomore Lane Hutson's overtime-winner, as he screened the goalie as Hutson's shot sailed into the top left corner.
- He totaled two shots on goal in his BU debut and was a plus-1 on the night.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP

- In addition to Lane Hutson scoring the game-winning goal in overtime on Saturday, sophomores Ryan Greene, Quinn Hutson and Jeremy Wilmer all had an assist at Bentley.
- Wilmer and Quinn Hutson combined to set up freshman Macklin Celebrini's secondperiod strike while Greene won the faceoff that led to Lane Hutson's winner.
- Lane led the Terriers with 48 points last vear on 15 goals and a team-high 33 assists.
- Wilmer (9g, 23a), Greene (9g, 22a) and Quinn Hutson (15g, 13a) were 2-3-4 in returning points with 32, 31 and 28, respectively, last season.

WHAT DO THE COACHES THINK?

- BU was picked to repeat as Hockey East regular-season champion by the league's head coaches.
- The Terriers earned 109 points and nine first-place votes in the league poll.
- Boston College received the other two first-place votes and finished second with 99 points.
- Merrimack, runner-up to the Terriers in the 2023 Hockey East Tournament, was picked third (81 points), followed by Northeastern (75), UConn (68), Providence (65), UMass Lowell (62), UMass (54), Maine (52), New Hampshire (30) and Vermont (20).

THESE ARE YOUNG GUYS

- BU is the fourth youngest team in the country this season with an average age of 21.1 years.
- 17-year-old freshman Macklin Celebrini is the youngest player in all of college hockey.
- BU boasts nine freshmen in total.

RECAPPING A BUSY 2023 NHL DRAFT

- Four current Terrier freshmen and one future Terrier were selected at the 2023 NHL Draft this June in Nashville.
- Defenseman Tom Willander was the first BU skaters off the board, as he went 11th overall to the Vancouver Canucks.
- Day two of the draft began with former Terrier standout and current San Jose GM Mike Grier trading up to select future Terrier forward Brandon Svoboda at 71st overall.
- Defenseman Gavin McCarthy also came off the board in the third round at 86th overall to his hometown Buffalo Sabres
- Defenseman Aiden Celebrini got drafted by his hometown team, as the Vancouver native went in the sixth round to the Canucks.
- Tampa Bay then opened the seventh round by picking forward Jack Harvey, who became the 195th Terrier taken in the NHL Draft.
- The five Terriers taken marks the most BU players picked in one draft since eight Terriers were chosen in 2019: it also ranked second in the NCAA this summer.
- No other league school has had more players chosen in the last two years than BU and its eight draft picks.

YEAR TWO OF THE PANDOLFO ERA

- Jay Pandolfo is entering his second season as the Terriers' head coach.
- In his first year in charge, Pandolfo was named Hockey East Coach of the Year, New England Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award as the national coach of the year.
- He guided BU to the program's 11th Hockey East regular-season title and its first since 2016-17 thanks to an 18-6-0 league record.
- He then followed that with the program's 10th league tournament championship and first since 2018.
- Pandolfo became the third BU coach to win his NCAA Tournament debut, joining Harry Cleverly and David Quinn, as he guided BU to its first Frozen Four appearance since 2015.
- The Terriers went 29-11-0, including a 6-1-0 mark against top-10 foes, last year.
- Five freshmen all recorded at least 20 points, including three 30-point producers, while 10 other Terriers improved upon their point total from the previous season.
- Pandolfo coached four Hockey East All-Stars, including three first-team selections, as well as two All-Rookie Team honorees.
- He became the first head coach in program history to win 20 games in his first season.
- Pandolfo had matched Jack Parker's 19-6-0 record in 1973-74 as the best start by a BU head coach in program history.
- Parker began the next season 2-0-0 to go 21-6-0 (.778) before his next loss, finishing his first two seasons at 45-11-1 (.798).

THE PANDOLFO FILE

- Jay Pandolfo was hired in May 2022 as the program's 13th head coach after spending the 2021-22 season as the team's associate head coach.
- Prior to returning to BU, Pandolfo spent five years as an assistant coach with the Boston Bruins and helped them reach the second round of the Stanley Cup playoffs in four straight seasons.
- A two-time Stanley Cup champion with New Jersey (2000, 2003), Pandolfo played 899 NHL games with the Devils, the New York Islanders and Boston, totaling 226 points (100q, 126a).
- A member of the 1995 NCAA champions, Pandolfo is the first Division I men's hockey coach to have won an NCAA championship and two Stanley Cups as a player.
- At BU, he totaled 169 points (79g, 90a) and was runner-up for the 1996 Hobey Baker Award as a senior after recording 67 points (38g, 29a).
- He helped lead BU to four straight Frozen Fours, two Beanpot titles and two Hockey East championships as a player.
- A 1996 First-Team All-American, Pandolfo was a first-ballot inductee into the BU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001.

IT'S BETWEEN THE BROTHERS, KAY

- BU boasts three sets of brothers on this year's team.
- Graduate student Case McCarthy will get to play with his younger brother, freshman Gavin McCarthy, this season.
- Case, who wore number two during his first four years at BU, will wear number seven this year while Gavin wears number two.
- Sophomore Quinn Hutson will once again play with his younger brother and classmate Lane, while freshman Aiden Celebrini will skate with his younger brother and classmate Macklin.
- No other school in the NCAA has more sets of brothers on the same team as BU; Notre Dame also has three sets of brothers.
- The Terriers and the Fighting Irish will meet on Oct. 20-21 in South Bend.

FAMILY TIES

- The significant family ties go beyond the three sets of brothers on the squad.
- Junior Tristan Amonte's dad, Tony, skated two seasons at BU before playing 1,174 regular-season games in the NHL.
- Freshman Shane Lachance's father, Scott, was teammates with Tony Amonte on the 1990-91 Terrier squad and went on to a 13-year NHL career.
- Lachance's grandfather is legendary Terrier head coach Jack Parker.

NHL HOPEFULS

- Fourteen of the Terriers on this year's roster have been chosen by in the National Hockey League Entry Draft.
- No other school in the NCAA boasts more draft picks on its roster than BU.
