The OSU Outlook

- OSU isn't abandoning its principles, but seventhyear head coach Mike Boynton Jr. hopes an offseason overhaul will create a little more balance to a program that has ranked among KenPom's top-20 defenses in each of the last three seasons but, at times, struggled to score.
- Boynton put a premium on finding better shooters and ball-handlers and largely succeeded with a freshman class that has been ranked as high as seventh nationally, supplemented by a crop of experienced transfers.
- OSU will lean on backcourt veterans Bryce Thompson (6-6, Sr., Wing) and John-Michael Wright (6-1, Gr., CG) while working to get a group of nine newcomers (six of them freshmen) up to speed. Thompson was OSU's leading scorer last year (11.2 ppg) and Wright hit a team-high 69 threes.
- Quion Williams (6-5, So., G) was a valuable bench piece and energy guy who played some of his best basketball during the team's NIT run.
- OSU added a potential difference-maker in Javon Small (6-3, Jr., G) a dynamic point guard who averaged 15.8 points and 5.6 assists last year at East Carolina.
- Graduate transfer Jarius Hicklen (6-4, Gr., G) was a deadly sharp-shooter the las two years at North Florida, connecting 169 times.
- Four of the five members of OSU's front court are freshmen, which makes Jacksonville transfer Mike Marsh (6-10, Gr., C) the wise elder.
- What the others lack in experience, they make up for in raw talent. Brandon Garrison (6-11, Fr., C) was a McDonald's OKC's All-American and Isaiah Miranda (7-1, R-Fr.,) is a former top-30 recruit who redshirted last season at NC State.
- Eric Dailey Jr. (6-8, Fr., PF) a standout on this summer's Team USA FIBA U19 World Cup squad can do a little of everything.
- The youngest player on what will be Boynton's youngest team, Justin McBride (6-9, Fr., F) may also be its most talented with his size, athleticism and skill.
- Freshman guards Connor Dow and Jamyron Keller provide further depth, albeit in different ways. Dow is a three-point sharp-shooter. Keller is a physical guard gets down hill in a hurry.
- The Cowboys are picked 10th out of 14 teams in the super-sized Big 12.

Scouting St. Bonaventure:

- This will be OSU's first-ever meeting with St. Bonaventure, a perennial Atlantic 10 contender under head coach **Mark Schmidt.** The Bonnies are picked third out of 15 teams in the league's preseason poll.
- St. Bonaventure secured the A-10 title and an NCAA tournament berth in 2021 and advanced to the 2022 NIT semifinals.
- The Bonnies (14-18, 8-10 last year) spent the 2022-23 season in rebuilding mode but now reap the benefits with all five starters back, including preseason all-conference selections Daryl Banks III (15.4 ppg, 3rd Team All-A10) and Chad Venning (12.7 ppg), along with some additional help from the transfer portal.
- Charles Pride a 1,500-point scorer in four seasons at Bryant has been the Bonnies' top scorer (18.5) and rebounder (8.0) through two games.
- Former Cincinnati guard Mika Adams-Woods (10.5 ppg) is averaging team-best 3.5 assists.
- St. Bonaventure opened with a 73-69 home win over Longwood but fell 70-67 to Canisius on Sunday.
- The Bonnies are the only team in the field that hasn't appeared in a Legends Classic but are plenty familiar with the Barclays Center, which serves as a regular host of the A-10 tournament.

Matchup Mashup:

 OSU's John-Michael Wright and St. Bonaventure's Charles Pride are two of 16 active players who have scored 1,500 points and grabbed 500 rebounds at the Division I level.

Scouting Auburn

- Auburn (21-13) reached the second round of last year's NCAA tournament as a No. 9 seed.
- The Tigers (2-1) are receiving votes in this week's AP and Coaches Polls. They bounced back from an 88-82 neutral court loss to 15th-ranked Baylor with an 86-71 victory over Southeastern Louisiana on Friday.
- 6-10 junior Johni Broome -- a preseason first

team All-SEC selection -- comes in averaging 14.3 points and 8.5 rebounds.

• Aden Holloway was the SEC's Freshman of the Week after averaging 15.0 points in his first two collegiate games.

The Series with Auburn

- Auburn is the only team in the field that OSU has faced. The schools have split four meetings all-time.
- The Cowboys have won the last two meetings. The most-recent (a 74-63 OSU victory in Auburn) came during the 2015-16 season as part of the Big 12-SEC Challenge.
- OSU's 2006 South Padre Island Invitational title run included a 66-65 semifinal win over the Tigers.
- Auburn won a second-round clash in the 1999 NCAA tournament and defeated the Cowboys in the championship game of the 1977 Marshall Invitational.

Matchup Mashup:

- Former Cowboy Corey Williams is in his first season as an Auburn assistant. He played for the Cowboys from 1988-92. After a short NBA career he joined Scott Sutton's ORU staff from 2000-07 and later became head coach at Stetson (2013-19). He was an assistant at Texas Tech from 2021-23.
- Auburn freshman guard Aden Holloway and OSU freshman center Brandon Garrison both played in the 2023 McDonald's All-American game. Garrison suited up for the West and Holloway was on the East roster.

Scouting Notre Dame:

- Notre Dame is seeking its second Legends Classic title after winning in 2016.
- Micah Shrewsberry, the architect behind Penn State's basketball renaissance, is in his first season at Notre Dame, replacing longtime head coach Mike Brey who stepped aside last spring after 23 years.
- Shrewsberry must replace all five starters and

97.6% of the minutes from last year's team, which finished 11-21 (3-17 ACC).

- The Irish (1-1 this year) rallied from a 12-point deficit to defeat Niagara in their season opener and nearly pulled off another comeback on Sunday against Western Carolina, cutting a 17-point margin to three late in the second half before falling, 71-61.
- Notre Dame's top two scorers are true freshmen.
- Point guard **Markus Burton**, Indiana's 2023 Mr. Basketball, broke **Laphonso Ellis**' program record for most points in a freshman debut when he went for 29 in the season opener.
- 6-10 forward **Carey Booth** (15.0 ppg, teamhigh 7.0 rpg) scored 20 off the bench against Canisius.
- The Irish have also gotten a team-high 36.5 minutes out of the coach's son, freshman guard Braeden Shrewsberry.

Matchup Mashup

- Notre Dame is the only one of ACC's 15 active men's basketball members that OSU has never faced.
- OSU junior point guard **Javon Small** is a South Bend, Ind. native.
- OSU assistant David Cason served as Director of Basketball Operations at Notre Dame during the 1999-00 season before following head coach Matt Dougherty to North Carolina.

Next Home Action:

- The Cowboys are back at Gallagher-Iba Arena for a pair of Thanksgiving Week home games against New Orleans (Monday, Nov. 20, 7 p.m. CT) and Houston Christian (Friday, Nov. 24, 7 p.m. CT).
- Both games will air on ESPN+.
- Tickets are available online at okstate.com/ tickets.

Sam Houston Leftovers

- In Bryce Thompson's 21 minutes, OSU outscored Sam Houston 54-36 (+18). The Cowboys were outscored 34-31 (-3) in the other 19 minutes.
- Javon Small had a similar on-off split. OSU led 61-45 (+16) in his 29 minutes but was outscored 25-24 (-1) in the other 11.
- Thompson came off the bench on Sunday ending a streak of 55 consecutive starts. John-Michael Wright now owns the longest active streak at 38. He's started all 124 games off his collegiate career going back to his days at High Point.
- Jacksonville grad transfer Mike Marsh has grabbed 33.7% of opponent misses while on the floor. Per KenPom, his defensive rebound percentage ranks among the top-40 nationally.

Abilene Christian Leftovers

- Quion Williams earned his first career start in Monday's opener and played all but 94 seconds. He smashed his previous career-high for minutes (29 vs. Baylor on Feb. 27, 2023) and recorded double-figure rebounds (10) for the second time in his Cowboy career.
- OSU's free throw percentage (8-of-20, .400) was its lowest since a 2-for-5 (.400) effort against Kansas on Mar. 2, 2019.
- Due to injuries, the Cowboys faced ACU without starting point guard Javon Small and freshman backup Jamyron Keller, as well as redshirt freshman big man Isaiah Miranda.
- OSU forced five of the 15 ACU turnovers in the final 60 seconds to win that battle (15-13) but the Cowboys were unable to capitalize on those late opportunities. ACU outscored them 15-6 in point off turnovers.

Stacking Up with the Best

- OSU guards John-Michael Wright and Jarius Hicklen rank among the NCAA's active career leaders in several categories. Both players are in their fifth seasons of eligibility, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Wright who played his first three years at High Point - has 1,868 career points. Only Texas' Max Abmas (2,593) and Maryland's Jahmir Young (2,018) have scored more total points at the Division I level.
- Hicklen who played his first two years at Division II Oklahoma Baptist and the last two in the ASUN at North Florida -- is one of just 32 players across all levels with 250+ career three-pointers.

Climbing the List:

- The Nov. 12 win over Sam Houston was Mike Boynton Jr.'s 108th at OSU, moving him into sole possession of fourth place on the school's career wins list ahead of Paul Hansen (1979-86).
- Henry Iba (654 from 1934-70), Eddie Sutton (368 from 1990-2006) and Travis Ford (155 from 2008-16) occupy the top-3 spots.

Staying Up with the Trends:

- Going back to the start of last season, the Cowboys are 20-3 when shooting the same or better percentage than their opponents with 14 consecutive wins (compared to 1-14 when out-shot).
- OSU has blocked at least two shots in **48** consecutive games going back to early Feb. 2, 2022.
- OSU has made at least one three-pointer in 765 consecutive games dating back to Jan. 13, 2001.

OSU Mourns "Trailblazer" L.C. Gordon:

• On Nov. 4, OSU lost one of the most impactful men in program history, Lavalius Cyrone (L.C.) Gordon, who in 1958 became the school's first Black men's basketball player. He was 86 years old. The Memphis native played three seasons for Coach Henry Iba and earned a reputation as a staunch defender. He graduated from OSU in 1961 and went on to become a successful high school and college coach. From 1969-73, he led the program at Texas Southern to a 63-43 record, highlighted by a berth in the 1971 NAIA national tournament. Gordon stayed connected to his alma mater, helping organize the Memphis chapter of OSU's Alumni Association. In 2013 he served as Homecoming grand marshal and received the OSU Black Alumni Society's Trailblazer Award.

OKC Native is OSU's First 2024 Signee:

- Another of Oklahoma's own will suit up for the Cowboys next fall.
- 6-foot-4 playmaker Jeremiah Johnson made his Oklahoma State commitment official on Wednesday by signing a National Letter of Intent.
- Originally from Oklahoma City, Johnson played for Utah-based Wasatch Academy last spring in the National Interscholastic Basketball League

and will further test himself this year in the Overtime Elite League while competing for Phoenix (AZ) Prep.

- Johnson is a four-star recruit, per ESPN, and 247Sports rates him the No. 141 prospect in the Class of 2024. He chose the Cowboys over finalists LSU, SMU, Saint Louis and TCU.
- Johnson is the first official member of OSU's 2024 signing class and continues a theme of the state's best basketball prospects electing to stay home. Current OSU freshmen Brandon Garrison (a McDonald's All-American last year at Del City) and Connor Dow (Broken Arrow) were both Oklahoman Super-5 selections last spring, and senior Bryce Thompson was a twotime Oklahoma Gatorade Player of the Year and McDonald's All-American at Tulsa's Booker T. Washington.

Boynton on Johnson:

"We're excited for another homegrown Oklahoma athlete to decide Stillwater is the place to be. Jeremiah Johnson has had a heck of a journey. He's endured setbacks but shown tremendous resiliency. We look forward to his continued growth once he gets to campus. Jeremiah is a high-level athlete and competitor. He's driven to be his best and wants to win above anything else. His versatility will be a great asset. He can function as a both scorer and as a playmaker and shot creator for his teammates."

Good Signs for the Future

- Mike Boynton has a promising young core of players to build around with a five-man freshman class has been ranked as high as seventh nationally by Rivals and tenth per 247Sports.
- It's Boynton's highest-rated class, edging out the 2020 group, which was listed 10th and anchored by the nation's No. 1 recruit, Cade Cunningham.
- The front court trio of Brandon Garrison (Rivals No. 30), Eric Dailey Jr. (No. 33 per 247Sports) and Justin McBride (Rivals No. 79) all earned four-star grades, while guards Jamyron Keller (Rivals No. 134) and Connor Dow were threestar prospects.
- Not included in that class ranking was redshirt freshman Isaiah Miranda, who graded out as high as 29th in the Class of 2023 before reclassifying.

Going Back to Give Back:

- Mike Boynton Jr. was among a select group of Big 12 men's and women's basketball coaches who traveled to Rucker Park last July to lead youth clinics as part of the conference's inaugural Big 12 Hoops in the Park program.
- Despite a busy summer travel schedule that included overseas trips to Hungary and Spain, the choice to participate was an easy one for Boynton. The Brooklyn native grew up watching games at the world-famous venue and embraced the opportunity to give back to his home city.
- Boynton was joined by Big 12 men's coaches Scott Drew (Baylor), Mark Pope (BYU), Wes Miller (Cincinnati), Jerome Tang (Kansas State) and Jamie Dixon (TCU) and five others from the women's side.

Pro Pokes:

- Three former Cowboys are on NBA rosters to start the 2023-24 season.
- Cade Cunningham the 2021 Big 12 Player of the Year and No. 1 overall draft pick – has become the face of the Detroit Pistons franchise. The third-year pro missed most of last year due to injury but is averaging 23.7 points and 7.1 assists through the first 10 games of the 2023-24 season.
- New uniform. Same Marcus Smart. An offseason trade sent the ninth-year veteran from Boston to Memphis, but the 2022 NBA Defensive Player of the Year continues to lock down opponents. A month into the season his 2.3 steals-per-game ranks second on the league leaderboard.
- Lindy Waters III has carved out a niche as a sharp-shooter. He's spent parts of the last three seasons with the Oklahoma City Thunder.

Battling the Best

- Oklahoma State's non-conference calendar includes a visit from consensus preseason top-10 Creighton, a neutral court clash with Tulsa at Oklahoma City's Paycom Center and a trip to Brooklyn, N.Y. for the Legends Classic, featuring Auburn, Notre Dame and St. Bonaventure.
- The Big 12 has been KenPom's highest-rated in eight of the last 10 seasons and is on track to do it again in 2023-24 with all 14 teams ranked among the site's preseason top-75.
- The Cowboys open league play Jan. 6 against Baylor at GIA and finish at BYU on Mar. 9.
- OU and OSU will play the last Big 12 era installments of the Bedlam Series: Feb. 10 in Norman and Feb. 24 in Stillwater.
- Bedlam one of five home-and-homes that the Cowboys will play in conference, along with BYU, Kansas, Kansas State and Texas Tech.
- With the addition of four new members, the league will keep its 18-game schedule but shift to an unbalanced format for the first time since the 2010-11 season. The Cowboys face Baylor, TCU, UCF and West Virginia at home only and will only see Baylor, Cincinnati, Houston and Texas on the road.

Trip of a Lifetime:

- An August foreign tour gave head coach Mike Boynton and staff a head start in their race to get nine new-comers up to speed.
- The Cowboys played three exhibition games against seasoned professionals during a 10day jaunt through the Spanish cities of Madrid, Valencia and Barcelona and took advantage of 10 extra practice sessions in the days leading up to their departure.
- OSU opened the tour with an 86-79 win over the Cape Verde national team, which was tuning up for its first appearance in the FIBA World Cup, and a young Cowboy front court got a strong test against one of Europe's preeminent big men, 7-foot-3 Walter Tavares of Real Madrid.
- The trio of Eric Dailey Jr. (11.8 ppg, 5.3 rpg), Quion Williams (11.3 ppg, team-high 7.3 rpg) and Justin McBride (11.3 ppg, 6/12 3pt) all averaged in double-figures over three games. Six other Cowboys averaged at least six points. Other stat leaders included Javon Small (15 assists, 4 turnovers), Isaiah Miranda (5 blocks) and Jamyron Keller (4 steals).
- In between games, players enjoyed a wide range of cultural experiences, including a visit to a bull ring, a bull-fighting skills demonstration, a tour of Spanish premier league soccer club Atletico's home field, a catamaran cruise, beach time, a visit to Barcelona's famed Sagrada de Familia, and more.

'Orange & Black' --> 'Red, White & Blue'

- Head coach Mike Boynton, video coordinator Kris Quintana and freshman Eric Dailey Jr. logged some serious frequent flyer miles this summer. Prior to the Cowboys' foreign tour of Spain, the trio were in Hungary with USA Basketball for the FIBA U19 World Cup.
- Boynton served as an assistant coach for the U.S. while Quintana handled the team's film scouting.
- Dailey averaged 9.7 points on 50% in seven tournament games, along with 4.3 rebounds, 1.0 block and 1.0 steal in 17.9 minutes. On a per-40-minute basis, he put up 21.8 points and 9.6 rebounds.
- The U.S. team won its first five games by an average of 38 points before losing a heartbreaker to France in the semifinal round.
- OSU has sent a steady pipeline of players and coaches into USA Basketball. Last summer Boynton, Dailey and Brandon Garrison teamed up to win gold at the FIBA U19 Americas. In 2019, Cade Cunningham and Isaac Likekele won gold at the FIBA U19 World Cup, as did Marcus Smart and Jawun Evans in 2013 and 2015 respectively.

2022-23 in Review

- OSU was the last team out on Selection Sunday 2023 but regrouped to reach the NIT quarterfinals and se-cure the program's third 20-win season under Mike Boynton.
- The Cowboys (20-16, 8-10 Big 12) played the nation's 10th toughest schedule, per NCAA NET, and defeated three nationally ranked opponents. They also swept three games from rival Oklahoma for the first time since 1965.
- Statistically, the Cowboys ranked among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense (11th, .395) and posted the Big 12's top rebounding margin (+3.7).
- OSU held 25 of its 36 opponents below 40% from the field last year and pinned 10 different foes under 60 points.

- Cowboy Basketball enjoys a rich history with two national championships (1945 & 1946) and five representatives in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
- OSU was the first Division I men's basketball program to win back-to-back national titles. Then known as the Aggies of Oklahoma A&M, they defeated NYU, 49-45, in the 1945 NCAA tournament title game and downed North Carolina, 43-40, for the 1946 crown. Both games were played at Madison Square Garden.
- Gallagher-Iba Arena is often referred to as The Madison Square Garden of the Plains. The historic venue enters its 85th season of use in 2023-24. Cowboy teams are 850-256 all-time. A 2000 renovation doubled the building's capacity of the while perserving its history and sightlines.

- Mr. Henry Iba was one of college basketball first great head coaches, responsible for pioneering modern concepts such as a patterned, motion offense. He was also the first to incorporate the help principles of zone defense with man-to-man defense. Iba won 752 games over his 40-year career -- the last 36 of which came in Stillwater.
- A three-time All-American from 1943-46 and the Most Outstanding Player on each of OSU's national title winners, **Bob Kurland**'s not only left his mark in college basketball's record book but also its rule book. One of the game's first 7-footer was known to routinely leap up and grab opponent shots before they hit the rim, leading the creation of the goaltending rule.
- Eddie Sutton played and coached under Iba int he 1950s and returned in 1990 to lead OSU back to national prominance with Final Fours in 1994 and 2005. The court at Gallagher-Iba Arena is named in his honor.
- coached OSU to two Final Fours (1994 and 2005)
- Before he coached Texas Western to the 1967 national title and inspired the motion picture Glory Road, **Don Haskins** played for Iba at OSU. The 1952 graduate lettered three years for the Aggies and played on two NCAA semifinalists.
- Kansas head coach Bill Self played four years at OSU (1981-85) and spent seven years as an OSU assistant under Eddie Sutton (1986-93) before landing his first head coaching job at ORU.




