# 2023-24 SEASON

## SHREWSBERRY ERA

Micah Shrewsberry became the 18th head coach in Irish men's basketball history, returning to his home state of Indiana (grew up outside of Indianapolis).

He arrived to South Bend off of a historic turnaround at Penn State, where in year two, the Nittany Lions produced a 23-14 mark, just the 12th 20-win season in the 127-year history of the program.

How about this stat - Shrewsberry collected more Big Ten wins (17) in his first two seasons than any other Penn State head coach in program history.

It's also about ending the season playing your best basketball and Micah's Penn State squad did just that. The Nittany Lions became just the third double-digit seed to reach the Big Ten Tournament championship game. Then Penn State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2011 and later won its first Tourney game since 2001, defeating Texas A&M.

All-in-all, Shrews has coached in six NCAA Tournaments, two NCAA Final Fours, five NBA Playoffs and two NBA Conference

Finals.

When talking talent development, look no further than Jayston Tatum and Jaylen Brown when Shrews was with the Celtics. Not to mention he recruited Jaden Ivey while at Purdue.

## SEASON OPENER NOTABLES

Historically, the Irish are 99-21 (.825) in their season openers. In addition, the program is 109-11 (.908) in home openers.

The last time Notre Dame dropped a season opener at home - you'd have to go all the way back to the 1998-99 season, when the Irish fell 76-65 to Miami (Ohio).

## What TO WATCH FOR

Ironically enough about that Nov. 13, 1998, game against Miami (Ohio) - that was the last time Notre Dame started two freshmen in a season opener. Irish fans will most likely see that occurring for the first time in a quarter of a century with Markus Burton and Braeden Shrewsberry on Monday.

In terms of notable debuts:

- Laphonso Ellis holds the top spot with 27 points in his 1988 freshman debut
- Chris Thomas has the most historic freshman debut in program history, netting a triple-double with 24 points, 11 steals and 11 assists
- The only other 20+ point freshman debut in the past three decades - Blake Wesley, 21 points in 2021-22.
- Coaching wise - who had the biggest team point total in their debut --Mike Brey in his 104-58 win over Sacred Heart. The two behind him -- Clem F. Crowe (W, 89-28) and Edward 'Moose' Karuse (W, 86-38).

## FRESHMAN FOUNDATION

A little over a month into the job, Coach Shrewsberry had himself a top-25 ranked incoming freshmen class - Carey Booth, Logan Imes and Braeden Shrewsberry - all flipped from their Penn State commits. Then

add in Mr. Indiana Basketball Markus Burton, who kept his commitment to Notre Dame. That brought the 2023 class to four signees which ranked 23rd in the country according to 247Sports.com.

Furthermore, cementing the bond amongst the freshmen class, there was an Indiana connection amongst most of them:

-- Imes and Shrewsberry played together throughout all four of their high school years with the Indiana Elite.

-- Imes and Burton were teammates on the 2023 Indiana All-Stars squad

## CLEAN SLATE

Notre Dame only returns 35 points from a season ago, which equates to 1.6% of scoring returning. The table on the bottom of this page displays the Division I schools returning the least amount of points ahead of the 2023-24 season.

## MR INDIANA

On April 20, 2023, now freshman point guard Markus Burton, was named Mr. Indiana Basketball. It marked the third time in program history in which a future Notre Dame player took home the honor. The two former winners were Chris Thomas in 2001 and Luke Zeller in 2005.

Burton averaged a state-best 30.3 points per game, along with 5.7 rebounds, 5.1 assists and 3.6 steals. Burton also secured the school single season scoring record by pouring in 909 points as a senior.

## NEW ARRIVALS

Julian Roper II - Northwestern - junior from

Detroit. Played in 44 games for the Wildcats with 15 starts

Tae Davis - Seton Hall - sophomore from Indianapolis. Played in 32 games as a true freshman

Kebba Njie - Penn State - sophomore from Centerville, Ohio. Played in all 37 games for Shrewsberry last season, including 26 starts. He's also the only player on the current roster who has played under Coach Shrewsberry ahead of this season

## EXHIBITION WIN

Irish fans were treated to a dominant 96-62 win over D-III opponent Hanover College.

"I wanted to see our guys play hard and compete, just like in practice," Coach Shrewsberry said. "I wanted people to come here and see us compete like that and play like that and know it's going to be like that every single game. We might not come out on top, but we are going to compete every single game. I thought those guys poured their hearts out. I said empty your tank and let the next guy come in and do the same thing."

What's exciting about the Shrewsberry era is that three freshmen balled out tonight in their debut. Mr. Indiana Basketball, Markus Burton, led the way with 18 points. Then fellow freshmen Braeden Shrewsberry and Logan Imes followed suit with 14 points.

Other double-digit point scorers included J.R. Konieczny and Matt Zona with 12 points each.

Notre Dame recorded a 24-0 scoring spree which spanned from 13:06 to 7:46. Markus Burton tallied exactly the team's points in

said run with 12. Another first-half highlight was Braeden Shrewsberry knocking down three triples in less than a two-minute span. All-in-all, both Burton and Shrewsberry finished the half with 14 points each. Imes got his double-digit points early in the second half though, knocking down back-to-back triples around the 16-minute mark.

## INDIANA BASKETBALL JUST DIFFERENT

Over the first few months on the job, Coach Shrewsberry has echoed this sentiment a lot. Born and raised in Indiana and several coaching stints in the state as well, Coach Shrews has placed a new found emphasis on keeping the best home-grown talent in state. This year's roster reflects that with four players from the Hoosier State; not to mention two more from neighboring states in Michigan and Ohio.

It marks the most Indiana guys on the roster since the 2015-16 season, when the Irish had five

in Brooklyn from Nov. 16-17. A four-team, two-day tournament, the Irish have drawn Auburn on day one. The other side of the bracket is St. Bonaventure versus Oklahoma State.

In the first ACC/SEC Challenge, the Irish will head to South Carolina on Nov. 28. The two sides have not met on the hardwood since Feb. 4, 1984.

The Notre Dame - Georgetown rivalry gets renewed this non-conference season as well on Dec. 16. They'll meet for the 30th time with the series dating back to 1947-48 season

Notre Dame will make the trip to Milwaukee on Dec. 9 to return the home-and-home with Marquette.

### THREE THE KEY?

Last year at Penn State, Shrewsberry's team set both the school and Big Ten single-season record for three-pointers made with 385. The previous Big Ten record for three-pointers in a season was 365, which was set by Purdue in 2018-19. The 2022-23 Penn State squad ranked fifth in the nation in three-pointers made per game (10.4) and 3FG% (38.7%), all while draining double-digit treys in 21 games, including a program-record 18 triples in two games.

With that said, one of the first days on the job at Notre Dame, Coach Shrews asked, "What's the ACC record for made three-pointers in a season?"

For the record, the answer is 407 by Duke in 2001.

### THE ACC SLATE

The Irish start with six of its first nine ACC contests at home.

After opening ACC play at Miami on Dec. 2, they'll host three straight inside Purcell Pavilion over the holiday break - Virginia, NC

State and Duke.

The flipside of that - the Irish end the regular season with four of its last six on the road - Louisville, Syracuse, North Carolina, Virginia Tech

Interesting to note that Notre Dame will host Florida State on Jan. 13, then have an immediate turnaround at Boston College on Jan. 15 - a Saturday/Monday combo. The interesting part is that immediately leads into a bye week in which their mid-week contest the following week isn't until Wednesday, Jan. 24 vs. Miami. Thus, a rare eight-day break between games in the heart of the season.

### SHREWS QUOTABLES

Shrewsberry said the focus has been installing a system and forming an identity which will be what he called a defensive DNA and heavy in fundamentals. "I told them I don't coach effort. Effort is non-negotiable. But I don't have to coach effort with these guys. They're competing and getting after it. That groundwork of who and what we want to be has been laid."

"Everybody's a little more comfortable in our system and what we're doing. So now we're playing off more instincts where we are a little bit behind because we're thinking (in the first year). That changes for everybody. That time period is different for everybody. Some guys pick it up after a month, some guys pick it up after five months. For us, we're trying to win. We're going to prepare to win every single time, we're going to come in and fight you every single time. Like I said, this will be the easiest time for you to get us, but we don't bow down to anybody and there is no tomorrow. Everything we're doing is for right now."

### NEW ERA RISES

In the tradition-rich history of the storied Fighting Irish basketball program, nine

different coaches have patrolled the Shamrock sidelines for five or more years; George Keogan, John Jordan, Digger Phelps and Mike Brey combined for 76 of Notre Dame's 120 seasons.

For the first time since the average cost for a gallon of gas was \$1.51 and the price for a gallon of milk was \$2.78, Notre Dame is poised for an exhilarating new era in men's basketball.

Micah Shrewsberry officially opens his first chapter of his Notre Dame book Nov. 6 when Niagara visits Purcell Pavilion - 8,388 days since Brey's decorated run initiated in 2000.

Basketball in his DNA from growing up in Indiana. Shrewsberry has been on a fast and successful trajectory toward Notre Dame - he cultivated his coaching acumen inside the Butler Bulldogs program and with the globally renowned Boston Celtics franchise; then he turned around Penn State to the tune of an NCAA Tournament Round of 32 team last season.

But judge not the Fighting Irish on Shrewsberry's past or any preconceived notions regarding this year's roster; instead, Shrewsberry has an invitation.

"Come and watch us. Just come and watch us," Shrewsberry, a 47-year-old Indianapolis native who augmented his preparation to be a head coach with two stints at Purdue and a run atop the Indiana University-South Bend program. "Don't come in with any preconceived notions of what this team is like, what this team may be, what people say this team is. Come and make your own judgements about us.

"You might not know it. You might come in and be like, 'Man, I don't know what Notre Dame basketball is going to be.' But you sit and watch us for 40 minutes, you're going to be like, 'If that's Notre Dame basketball, I'm going to be proud of that group. I can come back to the next game, because I want to watch that group play, man.'"

Watching the group play will be perhaps the only method to learning this roster – not just playing style but simply the composition of the team.

Since becoming outgoing athletics director Jack Swarbrick's final major hire at the conclusion of last season, Shrewsberry and his staff – assistant coaches Kyle Getter, Mike Farrelly, Ryan Owens – have ushered in seven new players on the Irish's 11-man roster.

Shrewsberry's son, Braeden, along with 6-foot-10 Corey Booth, 6-4 Logan Imes and local sensation, Markus Burton, an athletic, energetic guard from nearby Penn High School have been brought in as the freshman foundation for what Shrewsberry has envisioned for the future of Notre Dame basketball.

Julian Roper transferred in from Northwestern and Tae Davis did the same from Seton Hall; sophomore Kebba Njie followed Shrewsberry from Penn State to Notre Dame.

Returning for the Irish are seniors Tony Sanders Jr. and Matt Zona, as well as third-year sophomore J.R. Konieczny and former walk-on turned scholarship player Alex Wade.

The quartet has a combined 82 career appearances and just two starts, one apiece for Sanders and Zona.

Even with less than a full complement of scholarship players, Shrewsberry demands a "non-negotiable" daily standard of effort, defense, discipline and competition as fabric of his program.

"You are what you emphasize," Shrewsberry said. "I say I don't coach effort, but effort's a huge part of it, especially defensively, especially how hard we have to play on that end, how detailed we need to be.

"I emphasize ball movement. I don't want anyone questioning what kind of shots they're taking. I want them to have the freedom to take shots, but also know that we're looking for great shots. Not average. Not just OK. We are hunting for a great shot

at every possession."

Rotation for the coming season? Players dictate that via their approach to Shrewsberry's aforementioned tenets.

"You have to earn your spot every single day with me," Shrewsberry said. "There is nobody sitting there being happy and getting satisfied. If you don't come and perform, the next dude is taking your spot if you don't play the right way.

"You have to have that competition and that's what we've been about, really, this whole fall, this whole preseason. We've switched teams from day to day. We've thrown different combinations together, we've played with different combinations."

Shrewsberry finds this approach yields multiple benefits.

"One, so they're comfortable with each other. They're comfortable with each other and what they like to do," he said. "Also, on the whim (if) one guy's not playing the way he's supposed to play, I've got no problem sitting him down next to me and putting somebody else in there that's just as capable.

"If you're not getting the job done, you're going to come have a seat. I'm big on discipline. I'm big on how we play. I'm big on accountability. You've got to be able to do your job. You're going to make mistakes. They're going to make mistakes, but if one guy isn't capable of doing his job and somebody else is, that guy's going to play."

"We're going to work our butts off no matter what's going on," said the versatile Konieczny, who starred locally at St. Joseph, played sparingly his freshman campaign and sat out last year. "Every guy on our team has that dog in him. I think that really stands to what we're trying to do

"No one has any expectations for us, so everyone is going out with a chip on our shoulders saying, 'Why not us? Why can't we be a good team, one of the best in the ACC?' The main difference between this year and last, I think, is there's a sense of urgency to

get better every single day. We feel we really got something accomplished out of every practice. It's been a grind; a lot of blood, sweat and tears, but it's been rewarding and I think that grind will pay off in the end to make some noise this year."

### HOMETOWN HOMAGE

There had been the youth camps at Notre Dame, myriad Fighting Irish men's basketball games and a blossoming relationship with Demetrius Jackson – a name synonymous with Irish hoops success a decade ago.

And, then, there had been the fandom of another national college basketball power – about the only time the local kid from La Porte, Indiana, had found his way inside Purcell Pavilion for Notre Dame basketball.

Today, freshman point guard Markus Burton and redshirt-sophomore J.R. Konieczny are homegrown products at the foundational stage of first-year Notre Dame Glenn & Stacey Murphy head coach Micah Shrewsberry's program rebuild.

Though different in their paths to play beneath the fabled Golden Dome, both Burton and Konieczny embrace this moment to help reassert Irish basketball and fashion an example for area youth who may also foster dreams of wearing Irish green.

"It was sort of unreal for me, because I liked Notre Dame a lot, and it was basically a dream school for me, my hometown and a no-brainer," said Burton, who capped his record-shattering prep career at Penn High School with the coveted Indiana Mr. Basketball award – just the third Irish signee all-time to procure the accolade. "Blake Wesley and J.R. Konieczny, I was a really big fan of theirs too."

Initially, the rangy, 6-foot-7 Konieczny – a second-team Indiana All-State selection who had finished fifth in Mr. Basketball balloting in 2021 – had not envisioned a gilded path to Notre Dame.

"It just all felt super surreal," Konieczny, who sat out the 2022-23 season to hone his all-

around game and ensure his overall health, said. "The whole recruitment process was super stressful for me, and then when I committed to Notre Dame, it was a huge weight off my shoulders. I had never really expected myself to be at Notre Dame, but then the stars aligned."

As Burton transitions through the early months of his collegiate career and Konieczny begins in earnest the hardwood portion of his Notre Dame journey, they are mindful of this moment together – in their own career arcs and in a historic dawn of a new era of Irish basketball under Shrewsbury, also a Hoosier State native with basketball bona fides spanning the NCAA to the NBA.

"We talk about it a lot, but I mean right now, we kind of just have fun with it," said Burton of his conversations with Konieczny about the chance to be a hometown beacon of Notre Dame basketball. "We talk about how blessed we are to be able to go to Notre Dame and play basketball here, to have this opportunity.

"It's really fun. Coach Shrewsbury is a really good coach, loves his players and teaches us what need to do. A lot of us adapted really well, and I feel like once we get playing and people see how hard we play, we're going to show people how hard we work and take pride in everyday practice. It's going to be really fun."

A new era of Notre Dame basketball; a foundation formed in its community.

"We always have a good sense of what it means to rep the city and the area and rep Notre Dame and our hometown," Konieczny said. "We've been doing it for quite some years,; Markus being Mr. Basketball, had a great high school career that let people know who he was. I think it means a lot to both of us. We're going to do everything we can to win and see Notre Dame fans happy and South Bend fans happy and just everyone in this community.

"We're going to work our butts off no matter what's going on; every guy on our team has that dog in him. And I think that really stands to what we're trying to do."

An Indiana native has come home to kick start a new era of Notre Dame men's basketball. Vice President and James E. Rohr Notre Dame Director of Athletics Jack Swarbrick announced Micah Shrewsberry as the 18th head coach in Fighting Irish men's basketball history on March 23, 2023.

"We are so excited to have Coach (Shrewsberry) join the Notre Dame family," Swarbrick said. "Throughout this process, it reaffirmed for me that this job was among the best in the country as we had many great candidates express interest."

"During our two month process, we weekly reviewed our candidate pool and each week he (Micah) stayed at the top of our list due to his fit at the University and his commitment to the student-athlete experience. Not only do his personal & family values align with the University, but his dedication to the development of each member of his program as well."

Shrewsberry is fresh off a historic turnaround as the head coach at Penn State. After a 14-17 first season, Shrewsberry produced a 23-14 mark in 2022-23, just the 12th 20-win season in the 127-year history of Penn State basketball. Furthermore, he collected more Big Ten wins (17) in his first two seasons than any other Penn State head coach.

Shrewsberry brings a wealth of experience and success to the helm of the Notre Dame program. All-in-all he's coached in six NCAA Tournaments, two NCAA Final Fours, five NBA Playoffs and two NBA Conference Finals – in addition to coaching all-NBA honorees Jayson Tatum and Jaylen Brown.

"I'm very excited to be joining the University of Notre Dame family," Shrewsberry said. "The combination of top notch academics, plus a long storied history of success on the basketball court, made this a very attractive job for me. The power of the Notre Dame brand, and the passionate alumni family, will allow us to recruit the brightest student-athletes from coast to coast. I can't wait to get to campus and begin connecting with the students, faculty and staff which make this place special."

Shrewsberry and Penn State captured the nation's attention in late February and into March, going 9-3 over their last 12 games, which included six Quad 1 wins. Shrewsberry then made plenty of noise in the 2023 Big Ten Tournament in Chicago, defeating No. 7 Illinois, No. 2 Northwestern and No. 3 Indiana to reach the championship game as the No. 10 seed.

It marked the program's second-ever Big Ten title game appearance. Penn State was just the third double-digit seed to reach the Big Ten Tournament championship game and the first since 2008.

The Nittany Lions then made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2011. In the first round, Shrewsberry and the Nittany Lions knocked off No. 7 seed and SEC Tournament runner-up Texas A&M, winning the program's first NCAA Tournament game since 2001.

In year one at Penn State, Shrewsberry engineered the Big Ten's best scoring defense and guided the squad to their best defensive season (65.0 points allowed per game) in 11 years. The Nittany Lions advanced to the quarterfinal round of the Big Ten Tournament after winning two postseason games, making Shrewsberry one of just two first-year Big Ten coaches since 2008 to win two Big Ten Tournament games.

Recruiting-wise, Shrewsberry made an instant splash in Happy Valley. In his first year, Shrewsberry signed the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history, a consensus top-30 class. A year later, he signed his second-straight top-30 recruiting class, marking the first time in program history that the Nittany Lions had signed back-to-back top-30 recruiting classes.

Statistically speaking, the 2022-23 squad set the B1G and Penn State single-season team record for three-pointers made in a season with 385. The Nittany Lions compiled a total of five top-15 national

statistical rankings. In addition, Shrewsberry tutored an Associated Press All-American in Jalen Pickett and a total of three All-Big Ten players during the 2022-23 season.

Prior to his time with Penn State, Shrewsberry experienced two separate stints at Purdue – one as assistant coach from 2011-13 and another as associate head coach from 2019-21. Highlights include the 2020-21 season, in which Shrewsberry helped lead the Boilermakers to a 13-6 fourth-place finish in the Big Ten and an 18-10 overall mark, culminating in an NCAA Tournament at-large bid. Trevion Williams claimed first-team All-Big Ten honors, while Zach Edey and Jaden Ivey were All-Freshman Team selections. Shrewsberry played a major role in recruiting Ivey, who grew up in South Bend and is the son of Karen and Kevin Keyes Family Head Women's Basketball Coach Niele Ivey.

Another highlight from his time in West Lafayette includes the 2011-12 squad that produced a 22-13 record and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Under Shrewsberry, Terone Johnson was one of the most improved players in the B1G, netting accolades from conference and national entities.

In-between his Purdue stints, Shrewsberry spent six seasons (2013-19) with the NBA's Boston Celtics as an assistant coach under Brad Stevens. During his tenure, the Celtics reached the playoffs in five consecutive seasons, including back-to-back appearances in the Eastern Conference Finals in 2017 and 2018.

Shrewsberry played a key role in the development of current NBA stars Brown and Tatum, who were the No. 3 picks in the 2016 and 2017 NBA Drafts, respectively. Tatum was an NBA All-Rookie Team first-team selection, while Brown earned second-team All-Rookie honors.

The Brad Stevens connection was previously made at Butler University, where Shrewsberry spent one year as the director of operations then three as an assistant coach. With Shrewsberry on the sidelines, the Bulldogs compiled an 87-21 record, won two Horizon League regular-season championships and two Horizon League Tournament titles and made three NCAA Tournament appearances – which included back-to-back runs to the national championship game in 2010 and 2011.

Also at Butler, he aided in the development of Gordon Hayward, who was the 2009 Horizon League Newcomer of the Year, the 2010 Horizon League Player of the Year and a 2010 Final Four All-Tournament Team selection. Hayward was the ninth overall pick in the 2010 NBA Draft by the Utah Jazz.

Continuing on Shrewsberry's basketball journey, he spent time as the director of basketball operations at Marshall University (2003-05) and an assistant coach at DePauw University (2001-03) and Wabash College (2000-01). At DePauw, Shrewsberry led the Tigers to a 42-12 record with a pair of conference championships.

Shrewsberry was also the first men's basketball head coach at Indiana University South Bend. Shrewsberry started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Indianapolis in 1999-2000.

An Indianapolis area native, Shrewsberry earned his bachelor's degree from Hanover College in 1999 and a master's degree from Indiana State in 2003. As a player at Hanover, Shrewsberry was a three-year starting guard and team tri-captain.

He and his wife, Molly, have four children, Braeden, Nicholas, Caitlin and Grace.

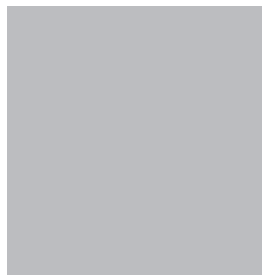

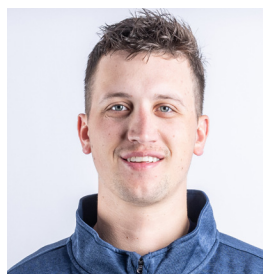
