### Last Season

After being selected as the No. 4 team in the ACC last preseason, Notre Dame won the regular season with a 15-3 conference record. The Irish had four different players earn All-ACC honors, the only team to do so — Miles and Citron made the First Team, Westbeld notched a spot on the Second Team, and Bransford made the Freshman Team. Karen and Kevin Keyes Family Head Coach Niele Ivey was the ACC Coach of the Year, becoming the first Black head coach to bring home the honor. She was also the first Black head coach to win the ACC regular season title on the women's side.

Entering 2023-24, three Irish earned preseason honors: Miles (All-ACC), Citron (All-ACC) and Hidalgo (Newcomer Watch List).

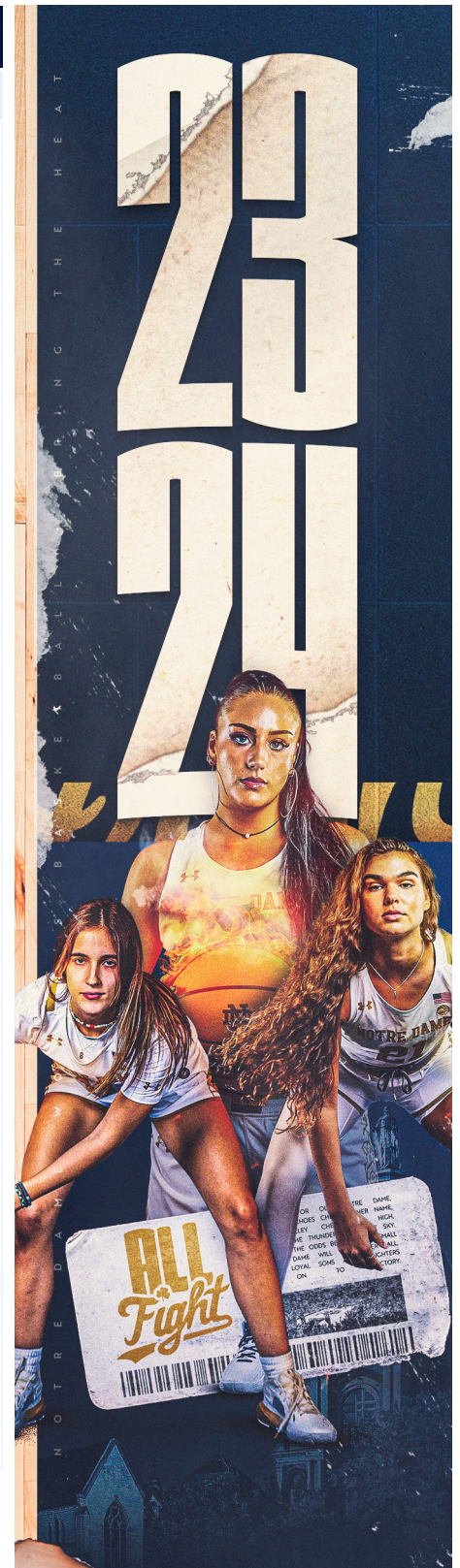

### **Black Friday Brawl**

The Irish and the Cardinals certainly are not strangers. Muncie is less than three hours from South Bend, and these regional foes played each other last year at Purcell Pavilion. Notre Dame topped Ball State, 95-60.

Five Irish scored in double figures that night, and Dara Mabrey led the team with 19 points. Bransford had 16. Everyone helped stuff the stat sheet otherwise. Lauren Ebo had 10 rebounds, and Miles had 11 assists. Notre Dame dropped 7 shots from deep. Mabrey had 5 of them.

### **Diaper Dandy**

Ivey hyped up Hidalgo all preseason, and to say she has delivered is an understatement.

On Monday, Hidalgo won her second consecutive ACC Rookie of the Week Award and was also named ACC Player of the Week. She is just the second Irish player to ever sweep the conference honors. Brianna Turner did it on Jan. 15, 2019. While it is an informal award, Hidalgo was also named the

Player of the Week by ESPN.

Hidalgo seemingly breaks or flirts with a record in every single game.

When she scored 23 points against Chicago State on Tuesday, Hidalgo joined an elite club. It was her fifth consecutive game with at least 10 points. Only five other Irish players have ever done that: Arike Ogunbowale (four times), Charel Allen, Jewell Loyd, Beth Morgan and Alicia Ratay. That's good company, especially considering Hidalgo has only played five collegiate games.

Heading back to the beginning of the year, in her freshman debut, Hidalgo went 10-24 from the floor, 8-12 from the charity stripe, and scored 31 points against a South Carolina team that rocketed to No. 1 in the AP Poll the week after they saw the Irish. That is the most points ever posted by an Irish freshman in his/her rookie debut, and it is tied for the third-most points ever scored by a rookie in Notre Dame women's basketball history.

In addition to her role putting up shots, Hidalgo had 4 rebounds and 3 assists. She

also made an impact on defense, notching her first collegiate steal just 14 seconds into the game.

"I'm so proud of her," Ivey said after the South Carolina game. "As a freshman being in the fire, to come out here and post that huge stat [line] is just phenomenal. She plays with a fearlessness that is unreal."

In addition to the Irish accolades, Hidalgo's performance was impressive on a national level. Just one other freshman had a better performance points-wise that week (JuJu Watkins, USC).

Hidalgo then took it up a notch at NJIT. She had 12 steals, which is tied for the most in school history. She was the first D-1 player to have 12 steals since February 2021. The rookie also had 26 points, 6 rebounds and 6 assists, notching her first career stat sheet stuffer. She had her second against Northwestern with 21 points, 6 rebounds, 5 assists and 6 steals. Hidalgo added a third against Illinois (24p/5r/8a/6s).

In total, Hidalgo had 27 steals this season through four games. That is the most by

any Division I player in her first four career games over the last 25 years. Ivey often compares Hidalgo to former Irish guard Skylar Diggins. For context, Diggins had 9 steals through her first four games at Notre Dame.

### Maddy the Maven

The sample size is small, but all signs point to that this could be the best year of Westbeld's career.

Through five games, the 6-3 shooting forward is posting her best statistics to date in multiple categories — field goal percentage (.492), 3-point field goal percentage (.429) and rebounds/game (10.0). She is leading the Irish in the rebounding category and averaging a double-double (14.3p/10.0r). She is one of three ACC player's currently averaging at least 10 and 10.

The stats this year are similar to or better than those from her freshman season when she was the ACC Rookie of the Year.

"Maddy has done a phenomenal job," Ivey said after the Illinois game. "She had two double-doubles [against NJIT and Northwestern] and then had 24 points and 8 rebounds against Illinois. She's been so solid."

The aforementioned back-to-back double-doubles happened for the first time since her freshman season. She has yet to post three in a row, but she came very close on Saturday.

### Starting to Come 'Nat'urally

Marshall has been with Ivey from the start. This is her fourth year on campus, seemingly a rarity in today's high-level college basketball. And for the 6-5 forward, it is all starting to come together.

On Tuesday, Marshall had a career-high 20 points against Chicago State. She went 8-10

from the floor over 29 minutes of play, also career-highs.

"Nat's just been getting better and better every game," Ivey said after the contest. "She's super efficient and active on the defensive end. She's such a spark for us off the bench."

It wasn't just Tuesday night that showed Marshall's hard work is paying off. She's been more consistent across the board this season, which is especially important given Notre Dame's lack of depth at the 5. Marshall is averaging career highs in multiple categories: points (7.0), rebounds (3.6), field goal percentage (62.5), free throw percentage (71.4) and minutes (19.2). She already has 3 steals after finishing last year with a total of 3.

"I just want to contribute," Marshall said after beating Chicago State. "I want to get a win at the end of the day, and whatever I can do to help our team win — if that's 20 points or 3 steals or 5 rebounds. Whatever that number is isn't really my focus. I just want to contribute, and I think we all did that tonight."

### Soni's Sprain

After going to the ground clutching her knee against Northwestern, Notre Dame's prayers that the injury was nothing long-term were answered.

Citron, who has taken on a more vocal leadership role in the absence of Miles, suffered a knee sprain. She will return in a few weeks, though the exact date is unknown.

Citron's name currently peppers the ACC stat rankings. She's tied for third in points (20.3), third in field goal percentage (.600) and 10th in free throw percentage (.889).

### Miles on the Mend

After suffering a knee injury against Louisville on Feb. 28, Notre Dame's All-American point guard Olivia Miles missed the remainder of the season and had surgery this spring. She is largely done

with the rehab process, and she is in the strengthening phase of her recovery. There is no official timetable for her return.

"I'm in a good place," Miles said on Oct. 10. "Obviously, the goal is to play, but I'm not going to rush it. I have years in this game that I want to be able to produce. So, I'm going to take my time."

"I'm learning to love different parts of myself. That's why my hair is out. I'm kind of being free and expressing myself like that."

### Taking 'Next Level Pros' to the Next Level

Notre Dame already has plenty of American professional basketball experience on its staff. Ivey and Allen played in the WNBA, and Ivey spent a year as an assistant coach for the Memphis Grizzlies.

But the Irish took it up a notch this offseason, adding Carlos Knox as the new player development program director.

"He came in, and he has put me outside of my comfort zone," Westbeld told the "They've Got Now" podcast in early November. "When I think I'm talking as much as I can, he's like 'OK, what else can you say?' He's never satisfied, and I'm so thankful for it and for everything he's done since he stepped on campus."

He spent nearly a decade working with the Indiana Fever as an interim head coach, assistant coach and player development coach. During his tenure in Indianapolis, Knox helped lead the team to eight consecutive WNBA playoff appearances and was a 2012 WNBA champion. He wore many hats for the team throughout his time, helping with everything from scouting to rehabilitation training to practice preparation. He has worked with many notable players, including former Irish guard and Olympic gold medalist Skylar Diggins-

Smith, four-time Olympic gold medalist Tamika Catchings and five-time WNBA All-Star Katie Douglas.

Knox has also had stints as an assistant coach at the University of Cincinnati (2020-21), University of North Texas (2017-20) and San Diego State University (2010-11). Finally, Knox spent time from 2015-16 as the director of training at the Jonathan Byrd Grand Park Fieldhouse, Indiana's state-of-the-art basketball facility.

### Irish Abroad

With COVID-19 restrictions lifted and a window of time prior to preseason play, the Irish headed overseas for a 12-day foreign tour to Greece and Croatia this summer. The trip allowed the team, one with four newcomers, to bond on and off the court.

While in Croatia, Notre Dame played a pair of scrimmages against local club teams. In Game 1, the Irish won 119-65, and Hidalgo and Citron led the way with 28 and 26 points, respectively. Their defense was also stiffling, as the rookie had 9 steals and the All-ACC First Teamer had 5.

The bigs also played extremely well. Both Westbeld and Watson had double-doubles.

In Game 2, Obinma had 22 points and 22 rebounds. Risch stuffed the stat sheet with 20 points, 9 rebounds and 5 assists. She went 4-5 in the first half from behind the arc.

In total, seven players finished in double-figures and the Irish tallied 18 steals. Notre Dame won, 137-46.

Off the court, the team journeyed around Athens, Split and Dubrovnik. Highlights included a boat cruise around the Athenian Riviera, a visit to the Acropolis and Parthenon, tours of multiple UNESCO World Heritage Sites and a Game of Thrones walking tour.

But the year's international travel didn't stop there.

To open the 2023-24 season, Notre Dame headed back over the pond to face South Carolina in the first ever NCAA basketball game played in Paris. The outcome favored the Gamecocks, but the game was bigger than basketball. Both teams had the opportunity to visit the Eiffel Tower and the Louvre, and the groups came together to host around 100 young girls for a basketball clinic sponsored by Under Armour.

One of the finest point guards ever to wear the Notre Dame uniform, Niele Ivey (first name pronounced knee-elle) was announced as the fourth Karen & Kevin Keyes Family Head Women's Basketball Coach on April 22, 2020, just mere minutes after Muffet McGraw stepped down from her post after a Hall of Fame career.

Ivey is the common link to all nine of the program's Final Four appearances, two as a player and seven as an assistant coach, logging a combined 21 years on Notre Dame's campus (16 as a coach and five as a player).

Her length of accolades since Year 1 is lengthy, including winning 2023 ACC Coach of the Year and leading her team to the ACC regular season title. Ivey has posted back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances, last season's despite losing two starters. Notre Dame was the only ACC team to have four women earn individual ACC honors at the end of the season. Ivey was also the only coach in the country to sign three five-star recruits in the 2023 cycle as well — Cassandre Prosper, Hannah Hidalgo and Emma Risch.

In her first year at the helm, Ivey not only had to balance settling into her new role with a young roster but also navigating the waters of a national pandemic. In a shortened season due to Covid-19, Ivey's squad went 10-10 (8-7). In her first week on the job, Coach Ivey received verbalbs from now-juniors Sonia Citron and Olivia Miles, who made up a top-five nationally ranked recruiting class.

As an assistant, the Irish went 386-55 (.875) during Ivey's time patrolling the sidelines. Notre Dame's recent decade of dominance (2010-19) had Ivey's handprints all over it — no other program had produced more trips to the national title game (six), and the Irish posted the third-most wins in that span as well (339).

That decade also consisted of 14 conference championships (eight regular-season plus six tournament titles split between the BIG EAST and ACC), seven Final Fours and a 2018 national championship.

Ivey expanded her basketball prowess when she stepped away from Notre Dame to accept an assistant coaching position with the Memphis Grizzlies for the 2019-20 season. Ivey proved to be a true trailblazer, becoming the ninth active female coach in the NBA.

Over that year, Ivey helped develop a young team, with a new coaching staff, into a playoff contender. Ivey worked with several different position groups with the Grizzlies, but primarily with standout guards Jarien Jackson and Ja Morant, as the latter won 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year honors.

Ivey originally joined the Fighting Irish women's basketball coaching staff in May 2007 (she added the title of recruiting coordinator in 2012 and was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015). Ivey went on to spend 12 seasons under Coach McGraw before departing for the Memphis Grizzlies.

Over her last eight years as an assistant, Notre Dame ranked in the top-12 in field goal percentage (led the country in 2013-14 season), scoring offense and assists. In fact, Notre Dame's offense over its back-to-back title game runs in 2018 and 2019 was one for the record books. The 2018 championship squad ranked in the top five in all the aforementioned categories. Meanwhile, the 2019 Irish took home the statistical championship for top-scoring offense in the country, averaging a program-record 88.6 points per game. In addition, they broke the program record for assists (804) while finishing second in shooting percentage (50.8 percent). The stat that is the icing on the cake to all of this — the 2019 starting five of Ogunbowale, Mabrey, Shepard, Turner and Young went down as the most prolific scoring fivesome in the history of NCAA Division I basketball (men's or women's), amassing an astonishing 10,230 combined career points.

In addition to her achievements in player development, Ivey emerged as a rising star on the recruiting trail, with a sharp eye for young up-and-coming talent. In fact, she helped Notre Dame attract top-12 incoming classes in nine of her last 10 years. In her last class, Coach Ivey nabbed No. 6 Samantha Brunelle and No. 18 Anaya Peoples.

What's more, Ivey displayed brilliant prowess when it

came to scouting and in-game strategy. In her last six years as an assistant, she was directly responsible for creating the game plans that led to victories over Duke (12 times), Tennessee (8 times), Florida State (7 times), Connecticut (5 times), Maryland (three times), Louisville (8 times), Syracuse (7 times), UCLA (three times), Baylor (twice), Texas A&M (3 times) and South Carolina, among many others.

In fact, Notre Dame is 5-3 all-time against UConn in the NCAA Tournament, which more than doubles the next best team's win total. Overall, over her last 12 years, the Irish knocked off the Huskies nine times, while all other Division I teams combined for 10 wins.

Most notable players under Ivey's tutelage: Arike Ogunbowale, Jewell Loyd and Skylar Diggins-Smith. Ogunbowale was a two-time All-American, two-time Ann Meyers Drysdale Award finalist and the 2018 Final Four MVP after her famous Ice Twice. Ogunbowale graduated as the program's all-time leading scorer.

Ivey helped mold Loyd into one of the country's top players from 2012-15. Loyd finished with 1,909 points and a 17.0 career points-per-game average. Loyd's best performances came against Top 25 teams, in which she averaged 22.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game, including a school record-tying 41 at DePaul.

Then there's Skylar Diggins-Smith. Under Ivey's guidance, Diggins-Smith made a seamless transition from shooting guard to point guard during her final three seasons, emerging as one of the nation's elite players to become one of just three two-time recipients of the Lieberman Award and a two-time consensus first-team All-America and BIG EAST Player of the Year selection. Diggins-Smith graduated in 2013 as the holder (or co-holder) of no fewer than 32 game, season or career records at Notre Dame, and ranks among the top five on an astounding 105 of the program's game, season or career charts.

Ivey sat out most of her freshman season at Notre Dame (1996-97 Final Four campaign) after suffering a season-ending knee injury five games in. However, she was awarded a fifth year of eligibility in 2000-01 and made the most of it, earning third-team AP All-America honors, the first Fighting Irish point guard to be so recognized. She also was the recipient of the 2001 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award (nation's top senior player standing 5-foot-8 or under) and was a finalist for the 2001 Lieberman Award. In addition, Ivey made the 2001 NCAA Women's Final Four All-Tournament Team after averaging 16.5 points and 5.5 steals per game as the Fighting Irish defeated Connecticut and Purdue to win their first national title.

All told, Notre Dame went 109-22 (.832) during Ivey's last four seasons, reaching the NCAA Sweet 16 three times (1998, 2000, 2001) and rolling up a (then) school-record 34 wins in 2000-01. The Fighting Irish also won a share of their first BIG EAST regular-season championship in 2000-01 and were ranked in the top 10 of either or both the Associated Press and WBCA/USA Today polls for all but two weeks during her final three campaigns. While at Notre Dame, Ivey was a three-time all-BIG EAST selection (1999-2001), collecting first-team honors in 2001, and was tapped as the BIG EAST Player of the Week five times. She also led the Fighting Irish in steals in each of her final four seasons (1997-98 to 2000-01) and was the team's assist leader in her last three years, setting school records with 95 steals in 1999-2000 (since topped by Diggins) and 247 assists in 2000-01, along with a school-standard 2.67 assist/turnover ratio the latter season.

Ivey went on to play five seasons in the WNBA, beginning with her selection by the Indiana Fever in the second round (17th overall pick) of the 2001 WNBA Draft. She spent four seasons with the Fever, helping them to the first playoff berth in franchise history in 2002. Ivey signed with the Detroit Shock as a restricted free agent in 2005, and subsequently was acquired by the Phoenix Mercury later that season.

A native of St. Louis, Ivey graduated from Notre Dame's College of Arts and Letters in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in history.

24th Year at Notre Dame

One of the nation's premier post coaches, Carol Owens enters her 24th year on the Notre Dame women's basketball coaching staff for the 2023-24 season, and her 15th as associate head coach for the Fighting Irish, having originally been elevated to that position by

Muffet McGraw prior to the 2002-03 season (holding that role through the 2004-05 campaign), and then again in the summer of 2012.

Throughout her tenure at Notre Dame, Owens has focused on working with the Fighting Irish post players, while also assisting with the program's nationally-ranked recruiting efforts. She has been a part of two national championship teams while in South Bend.

Owens was named the 2019 WBCA Division I Assistant Coach of the Year along with being inducted into the inaugural STEP UP Assistant Coach Hall of Fame. In 2014, she was chosen as the inaugural recipient of the A Step Up Assistant Coach of the Year Award, presented by Felicia Hall Allen & Associates. In 2001, she was named one of the top five assistant coaches in the country by Women's Basketball Journal, and in 2011, Collegelinsider.com named her as one of the top 15 active assistants in the nation.

Owens has had the magic touch when it comes to developing elite post players over the years, with no fewer than seven of her pupils (Natalie Achonwa, Jacqueline Batteast, Katryna Gaither, Ruth Riley, Devereaux Peters, Jessica Shepard and Brianna Turner) earning a combined 34 All-America honors during their college careers.

Between her lengthy coaching runs at Notre Dame, Owens spent five seasons (2005-10) as head coach at her alma mater, Northern Illinois University. Owens

originally came to Notre Dame in 1995 following two seasons as an assistant at Michigan, where she began her coaching career after enjoying a three-year professional playing stint in Japan, Spain and Italy.

As a standout player at Northern Illinois from 1985-90, Owens compiled a very impressive resume. A two-time Kodak (now WBCA) Coaches' All-District IV Team selection (1989 and 1990), Owens scored 2,102 points and averaged 18.0 points per game over four campaigns, covering 117 games. She also captained the Huskies for four seasons and, in her final collegiate campaign (1989-90), she guided Northern Illinois to the best record in school history (26-5), as the Huskies went undefeated in North Star Conference play (12-0) and earned the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament bid.

Owens finished her NIU career with 13 school records, most notably standing as Northern Illinois' all-time leader in scoring, blocked shots, free throws made, free throw attempts and field-goal percentage scoring games. In addition, she was the first player (male or female) in school history to score 2,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds.

A native of Chicago, Owens received her bachelor of arts degree in communications from Northern Illinois in 1990. She was selected by the faculty of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences to serve as Commencement Marshal of her graduating class and was named Northern Illinois' Outstanding Woman. In addition, Owens was the recipient of the Student Leadership Award.

Fifth Year at Notre Dame

On August 26, 2019, Michaela Mabrey came home, joining then Muffet McGraw's staff as assistant coach. Now under Karen & Kevin Keyes Family Head Coach Niele Ivey, Michaela will be in

her fifth season for the 2023-24 campaign. She also added the title of recruiting coordinator in 2022.

Years three and four have been extremely successful for Mabrey after bringing in Olivia Miles and Sonia Citron. Last season, Mabrey and the Irish won the regular season ACC title and advanced to the program's second consecutive Sweet 16. Miles was the ACC Player of the Year runner-up, and Citron made the All-ACC First Team.

In 2021-22, Notre Dame was the only program with two freshmen on ESPN's top-10 freshman list (Miles No. 2 / Citron No. 6). Additionally, the Irish were just one of two programs in all of Division I who had two freshmen both average double-digit points.

As a freshman, Miles ranked 2nd in the entire nation in assists per game (7.4), led the team in scoring (13.7 ppg), posted nine double-doubles, including two triple-doubles, and was a Nancy Lieberman Award Top-5 Finalist. Not to mention, she was First-Team All-ACC. Citron was the 2022 ACC Freshman of the Year after averaging 11.8 points, 6.6 rebounds. In fact, she was one of two freshmen in the entire country who averaged at least 11 points, 6 rebounds, 2 assists and 1.5 steals.

In her first year with the Irish, Mabrey was instantly recognized by the WBCA, landing on their Thirty Under 30 honoree list. Each honoree has exemplified their involvement in community service, mentorship and impact on others, professional manner, and attitude and professional association involvement.

Part of the winningest class in Notre Dame women's basketball history (2012-16), Mabrey's squads advanced to three Final

Fours, including two title game appearances (2014 & 2015). The Irish also swept regular season and conference tournament titles all four years in which Mabrey was on campus (one Big East + three ACC). In addition, Mabrey served as a team captain in her final two seasons.

Over her time at Notre Dame, Mabrey emerged as one of the elite three-point shooters in the country. The New Jersey native finished her career with 228 made three-pointers (fifth all-time), a .396 three-point shooting percentage (sixth all-time) and played in 142 total games (ninth all-time). Michaela and her sister Marina were the only two Fighting Irish players to make at least 60 three-pointers in three seasons.

After graduation, Mabrey became the coordinator of program and player development at the University of Miami for the 2016-17 season, aiding the staff in preparing scouting material and conducting on-campus recruiting visits. The following year, Mabrey moved to Miami (Ohio) as an assistant, where the Redhawks went on to produce a 21-11 record and recorded the biggest turn-around that year in NCAA Division I by a first-year coaching staff.

For the 2018-19 season, Mabrey accepted a Director of Recruiting position at LSU. There she coordinated the daily recruiting operational and logistical processes for the women's basketball program.

Allen is in her second season as an assistant coach at Notre Dame. During her inaugural year back on campus, the former Irish guard helped lead Notre Dame to a regular season ACC title using elite guard play. Allen helped coach All-American Olivia Miles

and All-ACC shooter Sonia Citron, leading Notre Dame to a second straight Sweet 16 berth.

Karen & Kevin Keyes Family Notre Dame women's basketball head coach Niele Ivey announced Charel Allen as the new assistant coach on July 20, 2022. Allen graduated from Notre Dame in 2008, becoming one of three current Irish coaches to have graduated from the school.

"Excited to welcome Charel back to the Notre Dame family," Coach Ivey said. "Charel brings a high-level mentality that results in great player development. She possesses experience at every level – collegiately, professionally and internationally. She's a rising star in this industry. She's extremely passionate and loyal and understands what it takes to excel as a student-athlete at Notre Dame."

Allen was a two-time All-American, two-time First Team All-Big East selection and served as team captain over her final two seasons at Notre Dame. Allen averaged team bests 17.0 points and 6.2 rebounds as a junior then led the Irish to a Sweet 16 berth during her senior year, scoring a career-high 35 points in a second-round overtime win over Oklahoma – which still stands as the second-best Irish scoring performance in the NCAA Tournament.

She was the first player in school history to amass 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 200 steals in her career. In fact, she still ranks 15th on the all-time

scoring list with 1,566 career points.

Allen was selected in the third round of the 2008 WNBA Draft by the then Sacramento Monarchs, helping the team advance to the '08 WNBA Playoffs.

In 2009, Allen made the leap overseas and played professionally in Bulgaria for eight seasons. Allen was a five-time Bulgarian League champion in addition to being named a four-time All-Bulgarian League First Team selection, with Player of the Year honors in 2014.

In the summer of 2017, Allen made the shift to the coaching ranks and joined the staff at Cal State Fullerton. She was then promoted to associate head coach in May of 2021.

At Fullerton, Allen helped with recruiting along with coaching the wings for the Titans. In her first year, Allen saw her shooting guard Hannah Thompson average 12.4 points per game and convert 72 three-pointers – fifth most for a single season. A year later, freshman Amiee Book went on to win the Big West Sixth Player of the Year award and now ranks third in program history for three-point shooting percentage. Ranks all-time among ND sophomores: sixth in points (484), eighth in scoring average (14.7), tied for 6th in total 3s (48), sixth in 3FG% (.400), tied for sixth in total FTM (94) and second in minutes/game (33.5).

Carlos Knox joined the Irish as the new player development program director on June 12, 2023. He spent nearly a decade working with the Indiana Fever as an interim head coach, assistant coach and player development coach. During his tenure in

Indianapolis, Knox helped lead the team to eight consecutive WNBA playoff appearances and was a 2012 WNBA champion. He wore many hats for the program throughout his time, helping with everything from scouting to rehabilitation training to practice preparation. He has worked with many notable players, including Olympic gold medalist and former Irish guard Skylar Diggins, four-time Olympic gold medalist Tamika Catchings and five-time WNBA All-Star Katie Douglas.

"I'm super excited to add Carlos Knox to our coaching staff," Ivey said. "He has been instrumental in the development of some of the best players in both the WNBA and NBA, and he brings a wealth of knowledge and expertise to our team. My vision for our program is to continue developing NEXT LEVEL pros, and I believe Carlos will help continue and elevate that mission!"

Knox has also had stints as an assistant coach at the University of Cincinnati (2020-21), University of North Texas (2017-20) and San Diego State University (2010-11). Finally, Knox spent time from 2015-16 as the director of training at the Jonathan Byrd Grand Park Fieldhouse, Indiana's state-of-the-art basketball facility.

The former point guard had a lengthy and decorated career as a collegiate player after attending high school outside of Dayton, Ohio. While earning a degree in communications from IUPUI from 1994-98,

he was a two-time NCAA scoring champion, NCAA All-American and NCAA Player of the Year. His jersey has been retired at IUPUI, and the team became a Division I program just after his graduation due in part to Knox's contributions. He was inducted into the IUPUI Hall of Fame in 2004.

Knox went on to play for the Indiana Pacers from 1998-99 and played overseas in Croatia, Germany, Venezuela and Italy. He has also served as a head coach in the International Basketball League, Continental Basketball Association and American Basketball Association.

The newest member of the Notre Dame staff comes to South Bend from Dallas.
