SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO SNOWY INDIANA FOR MATCHUP AT NOTRE DAME

Florida State, which has won five of its last six overall games and three consecutive ACC games, travels to play at Notre Dame on Saturday, January 13, 2024, at 2:15 p.m. The game will be televised on The CW Television Network and marks the Seminoles' first ever appearance on the newly minted ACC television partners air waves. Florida State arrives in South Bend on the heels of an 87-82 win over Wake Forest on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' game against the Fighting Irish marks their second true road game in AC play after opening their conference schedule at North Carolina on December 2. The game is also Florida State's first game away from Tallahassee since the Seminoles played USF in the Orange Bowl Classic in Sunrise, Fla., on December 9. Following Saturday's game at Notre Dame, the Seminoles played their second of two consecutive road games at Miami on January 17 at 7:00 p.m.

HAMILTON RANKS FIFTH IN ACC HISTORY FOR WINS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game at Notre Dame as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 413 wins. He is also the fifth winningest coach in ACC history for ACC regular season victories (184), ACC regular season and ACC Tournament wins combined (199), sixth in the ACC record book for ACC road wins (65), and eighth in ACC history for NCAA Tournament wins as an ACC Head Coach (18).

A STRONG START TO THE NEW YEAR

Florida State has won each of its three games since the calendar has turned over the 2024 with victories over Georgia Tech (82-71, January 3), Virginia Tech (77-74, January 6) and Wake Forest (January 9). It marks the first time since the 2020-21 season that the Seminoles have won their first three January games – they win their first five January games that season. Florida State's victories over Georgia Tech (8-4), Virginia Tech (9-4) and Wake Forest (11-3) came against three ACC teams that were a combined 28-11 at the time of their games against Florida State

WATKINS STEPS UP AND MAKES HIS FREE THROWS

Junior Jamir Watkins scored 19 points on a perfect 11 of 11 free throws in the Seminoles' 87-82 victory over Wake Forest on Tuesday night in Tallahassee. His 11 free throws made are tied for the eighth most in an ACC game in school history. He became just the third player in school history to finish perfect from the free throw line on at least 11 shots in an ACC game. Watkins has made 18 of 19 free throw attempts and is shooting .947 from the free throw line in his first four ACC games. He is shooting a career-high .797 from the free throw line for the season and is shooting .751 from the free throw line for his career.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

- ...Defeat Notre Dame and win its fourth consecutive ACC game for the first time since January of 2022 when it won five consecutive ACC games -- at home against Louisville (79-70, January 8), at home against Miami (65-64, January 11), at Syracuse (76-71, January 15), at home against Duke (79-78 in overtime, January 18), and at Miami (61-60, January 22);
- ...Defeat Notre Dame and gain its first true road win of the season. The Seminoles have played at Florida (November 17, 2023) and at North Carolina (December 2, 2023), with 10 home games, and three games played at neutral sites first 15 games of the 2023-24 season;
- ...Defeat Notre Dame at the Joyce Center and gain a win at the Joyce Center for the third time in their last four games in the arena on Notre Dame's campus;
- ...Defeat Notre Dame and win its fifth ACC road game in the last two seasons. The Seminoles won at Notre Dame, at Pittsburgh, at Louisville, and at Miami in ACC road games during the 2022-23 season.

SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS AT NOW AT 14 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Wake Forest having won an NCAA record 14 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 12 teams during its overtime streak, including Wake Forest on February 13, 2021, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles have defeated eight nationally ranked opponents in overtime during their streak, including No. 18/21 Colorado in the championship game of the 2023 Sunshine Slam.

SEMINOLES FROM THE BONUSPHERE AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Florida State made seven 3-point field goals (including six in the second half) in its 87-82 win over Wake Forest on Tuesday in Tallahassee. It marked the ninth time this season that Florida State has made seven or more 3-point field goals in a single game. Florida State made its season-high of 12 3-point field in a win over Central Michigan (November 13) and in its ACC season-opener against North Carolina (December 2).

FLORIDA STATE WITH 10 STEALS IN WIN OVER WAKE FOREST

Led by a career-high tying five steals in its victory over Wake Forest, the Seminoles totaled 10 steals and now lead the ACC with 138 total steals. The Seminoles have now earned double figure steals in six of their first 15 games of the season. Florida State earned an ACC-best 17 steals in its 77-71 win in overtime over No 18 Colorado in the championship game of the Sunshine Slam. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Notre Dame ranked second in the ACC with a 9.2 steals per game average.

NOTES FROM FLORIDA STATE'S VICTORY OVER WAKE FOREST ON TUESDAY IN TALLAHASSEE...

...The Seminoles outscored the Demon Deacons in both the first and second halves – it marked the first time in an ACC game that they had their outscored their opponent since topping Notre Dame in the first (39-29) and second halves (45-42) of their 84-71 win over the Fighting Irish in Notre Dame, Ind., on January 17, 2023;

...The Seminoles shot .509 from the field (28-55) – the second time in their last three ACC games that they shot 50 percent or better from the field in a single game. Florida State shot .517 from the field (31-60) in defeating Georgia Tech on January 3, 2024, in Tallahassee;

...The Seminoles forced Wake Forest into 20 turnovers – the most by the Deacons this season. Wake Forest averages 10.9 turnovers per game in its first 15 games of the season;

SEMINOLES SHOOTING WELL FROM THE FIELD

During its current three game winning streak, Florida State is shooting .494 from the field and averaging 82.0 points scored per game. The Seminoles are shooting nearly seven percentage points better and averaging nearly six points scored per game more than it has for the first 12 games of the season. Florida State shot .509 from the field (28 of 55) in scoring 87 points and defeating Wake Forest on Tuesday night in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NOTRE DAME - THE LAST MEETING

Darin Green Jr. scored a game-high 20 points on six made field goals, four 3-pointers, and four free throws to lead Florida State to an 84-71 victory over Notre Dame on January 17, 2023 at the Joyce Center in Notre Dame, Ind. Green Jr. led five Seminoles in double figure scoring, Green, Jalen Warley (17 points), Matthew Cleveland (14 points), Caleb Mills (11 points), and Cameron Corhen (10 points). Cleveland also pulled down 16 - tied for the second highest rebounding total in an ACC game by a Seminole - tied with Al Thornton against Virginia on February 7, 2007. The school record for rebounds by a Seminole in an ACC game is 17 by Michael Joiner against Wake Forest on January 9, 2001. Cleveland's 16 defensive rebounds established a school record by a Florida State player in an ACC game.

FLORIDA STATE'S BENCH BUNCH - NOTE II

Florida State's bench bunch outscored the Seminoles' starters 41-36 in its 77-74 win over Virgina Tech on January 6 in Tallahassee. It marked the second consecutive game -- the Seminoles bench bunch outscored the Seminoles' starters by a 42-40 margin in their 82-71 win over Georgia Tech – that the Seminoles' group of accomplished reserves had outscored the Seminoles' starting five. Florida State's received three double digit scoring performances (Cameron Corhen, 11; Jaylan Gainey, 11; Primo Spear, 11) from its bench players in its 70-74 win over Virginia Tech. It marked the first time this season (against Georgia Tech), and first time since December 28, 2019, in an 88-71 win over North Alabama, that three Seminoles had scored in double-figure points coming off the bench (Anthony Polite, 11; Partick Williams, 12; Balsa Koprivica, 13). Taylor Bol Bowen: sNOw Problem for Seminole Freshman

NOTRE DAME, Ind. — For the Florida State men's basketball team, this weekend's trip to play at Notre Dame in their fifth conference game of the season will be different from most. It will be different because the weather forecast in the upper Midwest is calling for more than a foot of snow and sub-freezing temperatures while the Seminoles are in to play the Fighting Irish at the Joyce Center at 2:15 p.m. on Saturday. The game will be televised by The CW.

Different for most of the Seminoles.

But not for freshman Taylor Bol Bowen who grew up in the village of Jericho which is located at the base of Mount Mansfield and just 45 miles south of the Canadian border in the very much northern state of Vermont.

Jericho is in the Snowbelt where the annual snow fall is about 120 inches.

Jericho is also where Wilson A. Bentley (aka known as The Snowflake Man) photographed thousands of individual snowflakes and developed the equipment and techniques which continue to be used today to provide valuable records and images of individual snowflakes both photographically and scientifically. More than 500 of his snowflake photos are stored in the Archives in the Smithsonian Institution.

"Our trip this weekend isn't going to bother me one bit," said Bol Bowen as Florida State continued their preparations for the Fighting Irish before traveling to Indiana. "I'm used to the cold."

Bol Bowen is also getting used to playing basketball at the high-major college basketball level at Florida State. He's played a significant role in the Seminoles' current three-game ACC winning streak which has vaulted the Seminoles into the upper third of the conference standings.

Bol Bowen is averaging nearly 13 minutes played and has scored 15 points in the Seminoles' consecutive victories over Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, and Wake Forest. It was his step-back 3-point shot in the first half that gave the Seminoles a seven-point lead and allowed the Seminoles to go into the locker room with a confidence-boosting 42-41 lead against Wake Forest. The Deacons had won nine consecutive games before falling to the Seminoles, 87-82 on Tuesday night in Tallahassee.

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is certainly taking notice of his fabulous freshman whose game continues to improve as the Seminoles continue to move upwards in the ACC standings.

"Taylor is improving to the point where every game he goes in he gives us something positive," said Hamilton. "His effort is good; his attitude is outstanding, and you know what you are going to get from him every time he steps on the floor. Taylor is definitely all in with all of his heart and his soul.

"He represents the Seminole spirit. His future is very bright, and he's only scratched the surface with his potential. I think you are going to see him grow and grow with each game."

Bol Bowen's potential was on display in the first game of his career as he scored four points, pulled down five rebounds and blocked two shots in 12 minutes of playing time in the Seminoles' season-opening victory over Kennesaw State. His best game of the first two months of his freshman season came as a nine-point and six-rebound performance in Florida State's 91-75 victory over North Florida.

"I've been playing basketball my whole life," said Bol Bowen. "I get myself ready to play and really love having the opportunity to play as well as I can play within our system. We are all bought in on defense, and we have to compete on the defensive end of the floor to win. The more we compete on defensive, the better our offense will be."

Bol Bowen averaged 9.1 points and 5.1 rebounds in two seasons at the acclaimed Brewster Academy in New Hampshire and committed to the Seminoles and Hamilton in June 2022 after receiving more than 20 scholarship offers. He played in the Nike Hoop Summit and was nominated to play in the McDonald's All-American game in 2023.

Though he played at a very high level throughout his high school and prep career, Bol Bowen has realized the incredible jump in talent and athleticism of the players he goes up against each night in ACC Play.

"There are better players in the ACC which I think is the best basketball conference in the country. It shows every night," said Bol Bowen. There are so many different guys with so many different skill sets. We are learning how to improve and grow every night.

Bol Bowen had a built-in advantage while making his transition from high school basketball to the rigors of not only college basketball, but to life as a college student – a relationship with Seminole forward Jaylan Gainey.

Bol Bowen has a unique bond with Gainey as the pair knew other before they became Seminoles. The two met in Providence, R.I. while Gainey was a student at Brown University and Bol Bowen was a student at Saint George School which is located in nearby Middletown.

"Taylor has been my guy since I arrived at Florida State," said Gainey. "I knew him before he came to Florida State because I used to see him all the time walking around Providence. He was a tall guy, and I was a tall guy, so it was almost natural that we became friends. When he got to Florida State everything just clicked.

"Our relationship encompasses a little bit of everything. We talk about a lot of stuff both on and off the court. I'd like to think I am a mentor for him as one of the older guys on the team. Taylor has big goals and aspirations, and we talk about keeping things in perspective. I'm very excited for him; the sky is the limit for him if he continues to work hard and do the right things."

Bol Bowen says that he is an okay skier who prefers sledding to the slopes.

"I only used to ski on the beginner slopes but stopped skiing last year so I wouldn't get hurt and not be able to play basketball."

Don't expect Bol Bowen to spend much time in the snow and freezing temperatures this weekend as the ACC schedule continues to heat up for the Seminoles.

Game 10 -- Florida State 91, North Florida 75

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Darin Green Jr. made a season-high six 3-point shots, and scored his season-high of 24 points - including the 1,500th point of his career - to lead Florida State to a 91-75 victory at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The win was the Seminoles' eighth consecutive victory over the Ospreys. Florida State is now 8-0 all-time against their neighbors from Jacksonville. Green has now scored 1,515 career points and made 331 career 3-point shots in his five-year career at UCF and Florida State. Green Jr. led four Seminoles in double-digit scoring with Jalen Warley (12 points), Primo Spears (12 points) and Baba Miller (10 points) putting the Seminoles over the 90-point plateau for the third time this season. The Seminoles showed their chemistry as they played unselfishly and shared the ball throughout the game as they totaled 17 assists on 34 field goals. They used their size to their advantage against the Ospreys on the defensive side of the ball and only trailed for 26 seconds during the contest. Florida State held its biggest lead of the game (27 points, 76-49) with 7:08 remaining in the second half. It only seemed right for Green Jr. that his 1,500th career point would come as a three-pointer, which he made in the first half of the game. He was tonight's leader for the Seminoles, scoring 24 points and adding two rebounds, one assist, and one steal.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Florida State's Primo Spears made two free throws and Taylor Bol Bowen added a third as the Seminoles scored the final three points of the game from the line and held off Virginia Tech. 77-74, to gain their second consecutive ACC home win on Saturday at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Spears hit two free throws with 1.2 seconds remaining in regulation to give the Seminoles a 76-74 lead. On the ensuing in-bounds pass, Virginia Tech attempted a full court pass that went untouched by the Hokies, giving the Seminoles possession under their own basket. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - - Junior Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 19 points on a perfect 11 of 11 shooting from the free throw line and sophomore Baba Miller scored a careerhigh 14 points to lead Florida State to an 87-82 win over Wake Forest at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The victory over the Deacons was their third consecutive ACC victory and raised the Seminoles to 3-1 in ACC play. Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton rotated through 11 players with each of them scoring and three players scoring in double digits with Watkins (19 points), Darin Green Jr. (17 points) and Miller (14 points) all in double figures. The Seminoles outscored Wake Forest in both halves, shot .509 from the field (28 of 55), .538 from the 3-point line (seven of 13) and 80 percent from the free throw line (24 of 30). Florida State totaled 15 assists, 10 steals and five blocked shots as it handed Wake Forest their first loss since November 24 - a span of nine consecutive wins. It was also the first loss in conference play for the Deacons who entered the game at 3-0 in league play.
