STARTING FIVE

■ The Louisville Cardinals are in the middle of a stretch of games against ranked opponents. Based off the AP Top 25 poll on Feb. 5, the Cardinals will face four-straight ranked opponents and it started with last Thursday night's win over #21/23 Syracuse. They will play three ranked opponents in a stretch of six days and that started on Monday against No. 3/5 NC State. Up next for the Cards will be No. 12/14 Notre Dame on Thursday, Feb. 8 and No. 23 Syracuse on Sunday, Feb. 11. Including their Feb. 18 matchup against #16/18 Virginia Tech, the Cards will face five ranked opponents in a span of six games. So far this season, the Cardinals are 5-3 against teams that have been ranked or are currently ranked in the Top-25.

■ Since Louisville joined the ACC in the 2014-15 season, the Cardinals have been the most successful team in conference play. Over the last 10 seasons, the Cardinals are 134-26 (.843) in ACC play. The Cardinals are the only team to have a winning percentage at .800 or higher and have eight more wins than the school with the second-highest win total during that span. Louisville is just one of four schools to have 100 conference wins or more during that time.

■ Head coach Jeff Walz is among a select few coaches in all of college basketball to reach four or more Final Fours. In women's basketball, he is one of five active head coaches and one of eleven all-time to reach four or more Final Fours. Of those 11, he is one of nine to have all of his appearances at the same school. Combining men's college basketball, Walz is one nine active head coaches and one of 33 all-time to reach four or more Final Fours.

■ The Cardinals have been able to bounce back quickly following a loss during Jeff Walz's tenure as head coach. In his 17 years, the Cardinals are 88-24 all-time following a loss. The Cardinals are even better following a loss in ACC play. Louisville is 22-3 following a loss against ACC opponents and have only lost two-straight games in ACC play three times over the past 10 seasons.

■ Louisville's squad has scored a total of 9,129 career points in their Division I career, the highest amount of career points on any active roster in the ACC. The Cardinals have five players on their team with 1,000 or more career points (Jayda Curry, 1,101; Olivia Cochran, 1,157; Nina Rickards, 1,188; Sydney Taylor, 1,690) and Kiki Jefferson has eclipsed 2,000 points for her career (2,146).

ABOUT THE FIGHTING IRISH

Notre Dame comes into Thursday's matchup with a 17-4 record and are 7-3 in conference play. The Fighting Irish are currently ranked No. 12 in the AP poll and No. 14 in the Coaches poll and will be the third of four-straight ranked opponents the Cardinals will face. Notre Dame is on a hot streak and have won three-straight games and has won seven of its last eight games dating back to Jan. 11.

Thursday's matchup will pair two of the best shooting teams in the ACC and in the country. Notre Dame leads the league and ranks 15th nationally with a 47.4 field goal percentage. The Cardinals are second in the ACC and rank 24th nationally with a 46.4 field goal percentage. The Irish have some of the best marks in the conference in several. They lead the league and rank seventh nationally in scoring margin with +22.8. The Irish also lead the league and are 11th nationally in scoring offense with 83.1 points per game. Notre Dame also is tops in the league and 12th nationally in three point percentage defense as they hold opponents to 25.6 percent from behind the arc. Freshman guard Hannah Hidalgo leads the nation with 5.1 steals per game and 106 steals on the season. She is second nationally in points (521) and fourth nationally in points per game (24.8).

■ **Series History** - This will be the 32nd meeting between the two schools as they have been conference foes going back to the BIG EAST days. The Cardinals trail the all-time series 13-18 but have seen more success over the past few years. Louisville has won seven of the last nine matchups dating back to the 2018-19 season. The Cardinals trail the series 5-6 in games played in Louisville but have won four of the last five home matchups dating back to the 2017-18 season.

■ **Last Meeting (Mar. 4, 2023)** - The No. 4 seed Louisville Cardinals defense was on full display in its 64-38 win over No. 1 seed Notre Dame on Saturday afternoon at the Greensboro Coliseum. After dropping the two regular season matchups with the Irish (25-5), the Cardinals (23-10) left no doubt as they held the Irish to their fewest points scored in a game this season and the fewest points allowed in a semifinal matchup in ACC Tournament history. The 38 points scored are the fewest for Notre Dame since they scored 38 on January 24, 2004. With the win, Louisville advances to the ACC Finals for the fourth time in its nine years in the ACC. Mykasa Robinson scored in double figures with 10 points, led the team with five assists and had a team-high eight rebounds in the win. It is the fifth-straight game she has had eight or more assists and the 10th-straight game she has led the team in assists. Olivia Cochran had 12 points and eight rebounds and Chrislyn Carr was the fourth Cardinal in double figures with 10 points.

APPROACHING MILESTONES

■ **Jefferson approaches 1,000 career rebounds** - Kiki Jefferson currently has 911 career rebounds and is 89 shy of 1,000.

QUICK HITTERS

■ **Strong ACC Shooting** - So far in conference play this season, Louisville has been the best shooting team in the ACC. In ACC games, the Cardinals lead the conference with a 48.7 field goal percentage and the second-best team in the league (Duke) is shooting 45.3 percent from the field. The Cardinals have shot 50 percent or better in six of their 10 ACC games this season.

■ **Stingy Defense** - The Cardinals have also been one of the best defensive teams in conference play this year. Louisville is second in conference play and has allowed just 62.9 points per game in ACC games. In their most recent home win over #21/23 Syracuse, the Cardinals held the Orange to below 70 points for just the third time this season. Louisville limited Syracuse to 69 points when they averaged 78.4 per game on the season.

YEAR 4 FOR OC

Olivia Cochran is set for a big role with the Cardinals in her fourth year with the team. She is the most experienced Cardinal returning from the 2022-23 squad.

- Through 23 games this season, Cochran leads the team in rebounds (6.3), steals (1.4) and blocks (0.6) per game and is second on the team in scoring (11.6).
- Cochran leads the team with 17 double-digit scoring games this season and she has been an efficient shooter from the field. She is third on the team with a .520 field goal shooting percentage and has shot 50 percent or better from the floor in 16 games this year.
- She led the team with 17 points and a season-high 12 rebounds for her third double-double of the year against No. 3/5 NC State.
- Cochran hit double figures for the 12th-straight game with 10 points on 5-for-10 shooting and had a team-best seven rebounds in the win over Boston College. It was also the 12th-straight game she has shot 50 percent or better from the floor.
- She scored 14 points on 6-for-9 shooting, team-best five rebounds and tied a season-best with four assists against #23/24 North Carolina.
- Cochran tallied a team-best 12 points to go with a season-best four assists and three rebounds in the win over Wake Forest.
- In the win over Duke on Jan. 4, she scored double-digit points (13) and had a team-best six rebounds and three steals.
- Cochran scored in double figures with 11 points, seven rebounds, two steals and two blocks in the road win over #RV/23 Miami.
- She led the Cards with 14 points and had seven rebounds in the win over #23 Washington.
- Cochran tallied her second double-double of the season with a team-best 16 points and tied a season high with 11 rebounds against Morehead State.
- She surpassed the 1,000-point mark for her career with 10 points in the home win over Kentucky while adding a team-best eight rebounds and three assists. She is the 33rd player in program history to score 1,000 points or more in their Louisville careers.
- Cochran tied her career high with 21 points and added 11 rebounds against Liberty for her 10th career double-double and the first of the season. She tied a career high when she made nine free throws against the Flames and tied a season high with three steals.
- She was named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List prior to the matchup with Bellarmine. The Cardinals have had at least one player on the Wooden Watch List in seven of the last eight seasons.
- Cochran tallied a career-high 21 points and led the team with three assists, three steals and added five rebounds in the win over DePaul.
- Ahead of the 2023-24 season, Cochran was named to the Naismith Women's Player of the Year Watch List, Katrina McClain Award Watch List and Preseason All-ACC team.
- She led the Cardinals with 6.5 rebounds per game last season and had one of her best career games in the Elite Eight against the national runners-up. Cochran had a career-high 20 points and added 14 points against Iowa. The 14 rebounds were tied for fifth-most in an NCAA Tournament game in program history.
- She was the only player to play and start all 38 games last season and led the team with four double-doubles.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JEFFERSON

Graduate transfer guard Kiki Jefferson has been one of the most consistent scoring threats for the Cardinals this season.

- She leads the team with 13.4 points per game, has scored in double figures 17 times and has eight or more points scored in 22 of 23 games this season.
- Jefferson has been an efficient scorer this season and has shot 50 percent or better from the floor in 14 of 23 games this year.
- She is one of the best free throws in the country and is shooting 89.0 percent (89-for-100) from the line this season. That mark leads the ACC and ranks 18th nationally.
- She scored 16 points and brought in six rebounds against No. 3/5 NC State.
- Jefferson eclipsed the 20-point mark for the fourth time this season with 21

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach **Jeff Walz**, in his 17th season as a head coach, has compiled a 460-129 record as the Cardinals' leader. Walz and the Cardinals boast quite an astounding resumé that includes 12 trips to the NCAA Sweet 16, eight trips to the Elite Eight, four trips to the final four and two trips to the national title game. Overall, he has compiled a 40-14 record in NCAA Tournament games and ranks eighth all-time and fifth among active coaches with a 74.1 NCAA Tournament winning percentage. All of this for a program that had just four NCAA Tournament wins and had never reached a Sweet 16 prior to Walz being named head coach.



Walz is the all-time winningest coach in program history and averages 27.6 victories per season. He directed Louisville to a program-record 36 victories in 2017-18 en route to being named ACC Coach of the Year, 34 victories in 2008-09, 33 wins in 2013-14, 32 wins in 2018-19 and 29 wins in 2021-22.

The Cardinals have reached 20 wins 13 consecutive times and they have won at least 20 games in 15 of Walz's 16 seasons. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice, and UofL had just 10 20-win seasons in its 32 previous years.

Walz led Louisville to four consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021, and over that four-year span, the Cardinals went a combined 122-15, which marked the fewest losses and best winning percentage over a four-year period in program history.

From 2016-2021, he coached the ACC Player of the Year in five of six seasons as Myisha Hines-Allen won the award in 2016, Asia Durr in 2018 and 2019, and Dana Evans in 2020 and 2021. He also coached Angel McCoughtry to Big East Player of the Year honors in 2007.

After being hired as the Cardinals' head coach on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native used little time to make a splash. His first year featured the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent five seasons at Maryland, including his final season as the associate head coach in 2006-07. The season prior, he helped lead the Terrapins to a school-record 34 wins and the program's first national title.

Walz has four children: daughter Kaeley, son Jacob, and daughters Lola and Lucy. He married the former Lauren Lueders in September of 2012, and the couple resides in Louisville.

points on 6-for-12 shooting and 9-for-11 from the line in the win over #21/23 Syracuse.

■ She tallied her best scoring performance of the season with a season-best 27 points on 8-for-14 shooting, 2-for-2 from behind the arc and a season-best 9-for-11 from the line in the win over Boston College. Jefferson also added a team-best seven rebounds and four assists. The 27 points were the most by a Louisville player this season.

■ Prior to the Boston College game, Jefferson was named to the Cheryl Miller Award Top 10 List.

■ Jefferson recorded 17 points on 6-for-9 shooting and tallied a season-best eight assists in the road win over Clemson. It was the 12th time in her last 13 games with 10 points or more.

■ She was one of six Cardinals to score in double figures with 10 points against Wake Forest.

■ She eclipsed the 2,000-career point mark in the road win over Miami on Dec. 31 with 12 points on 4-for-8 shooting.

■ Scored a team-best 19 points, tied a season high with five assists and three steals and hit a season-best eight field goals on the road against #17/18 UConn.

■ Jefferson tallied a season-high 21 points on 7-for-10 shooting and 6-for-6 from the line in the win that clinched the Betty Chancellor Classic over Gonzaga on Nov. 26. She was named to the Chancellor Classic All-Tournament Team following the win over Gonzaga.

■ Eclipsed the 20-point mark for the first time this season with a team-high 20 points and was 8-for-8 from the line in the win over Liberty on Nov. 25.

NO STOPPING NINA

Graduate transfer guard Nina Rickards has played well for the Cardinals this season, impacting the game in a number of categories.

■ Through 23 games this season, Rickards leads the team in assists per game (2.8), tied for the team lead in steals per game (1.4), second in field goal percentage (.533), fourth in rebounds per game (3.4) and is one of six players to average at least six points per game (6.4).

■ She has tallied two or more assists in 19 of 23 games and scored six or more points in 13 of the 23 games this season. She has led the team in assists in 12 games this year and has had a season-high five assists three separate times.

■ She tallied double-digit points for the fifth time this season with 14 points on 6-for-9 shooting with four rebounds, three assists and two steals in the win over #21/23 Syracuse.

■ Rickards tied a career high with five steals and added six points, four rebounds and a team-best two assists in the win over #23 Washington.

■ She scored in double figures in her fourth-straight game with 15 points and a team-best three assists and three steals in the road win over #19/20 Ole Miss.

■ At the Betty Chancellor Classic in Texas, she scored in double-figures in all three games, including a season-high 16 against Gonzaga with a season-best five assists. She also tallied her first double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds against Alabama.

■ Rickards was one of two Cardinals (Kiki Jefferson) to be named to the Chancellor Classic All-Tournament team.

NEW YEAR'S EVE PARTY IN SOUTH BEACH FOR THE CARDS

Louisville closed the year out with a bang in its 77-72 road win over #RV/23 Miami in the ACC opener on New Year's Eve.

■ The Cardinals snapped a 17-game home winning streak for the Hurricanes. Heading into the game, Miami had not lost a home game since Dec. 29, 2022.

■ The 77 points scored by the Cardinals were the most points the Hurricanes had allowed all season. Heading into the contest, Miami led the ACC in scoring defense and allowed just 53.5 points per game.

■ Kiki Jefferson and Jayda Curry both hit milestones in the win. Jefferson eclipsed the 2,000-point mark for her career and Curry eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for her career.

■ Curry led the team with a season-high 19 points in the win. She scored 11 of her 19 points in the third quarter.

■ Merissah Russell was perfect from the floor in the fourth quarter as she was 3-for-3 from behind the arc and scored 11-straight points as the Cardinals regained the lead for good. She scored a season-high 12 points in the win.

■ Louisville improved to 10-0 in ACC openers with the road win over the Hurricanes.

LOUISVILLE COLLECTS SECOND TOURNAMENT TITLE THIS SEASON AT BETTY CHANCELLOR CLASSIC

The 2023-24 Louisville women's basketball team won their second tournament this season when they defeated Gonzaga to clinch the Betty Chancellor Tournament Championship on Nov. 26 in Katy, Texas.

- The Cardinals needed to defeat Gonzaga by eight points or more to win the tiebreaker for the tournament championship.
- Louisville led by three heading into the final quarter and hit each of their first nine shots of the quarter to grow the lead to the largest of the game at 17 points.
- The Cardinals closed the game out at the line and outscored Gonzaga 22-14 in the fourth to clinch the title with a 81-70 win.
- Louisville was 34-for-58 (58.6 percent) from the floor in the win over Gonzaga and hit a season-best seven three-pointers.
- Jefferson scored 20-plus points for the second-straight game with a season-best 21 and tied for the team lead with five assists. Nina Rickards scored in double figures for the third-straight game with a season-high 16 points and tied for the team lead with five assists. The pair were both named to the Betty Chancellor Classic All-Tournament Team.
- The Cardinals also defeated Liberty, 72-63, on Saturday en route to the tournament championship. The Cardinals outscored the Flames 26-11 in the fourth quarter to get the win.
- Olivia Cochran tallied a double-double (21 pts., 11 rebs.) and Kiki Jefferson scored 20 points and was 8-for-8 from the line in the win over the Flames.
- This is the second tournament championship for the Cardinals after they won the 2023 GLOBL JAM tournament in Toronto this past July.

CARDINALS HIT PROGRAM-BEST MARKS IN WIN OVER BELLARMINI

The Cardinals put together one of the best games of the Jeff Walz era and made some history in their 111-33 win over Bellarmine on Nov. 16.

- The Cardinals set a program record with eight players scoring in double figures (Taylor, 15; Harris, 14; Mobley, 12; Russell, 11; Jefferson, 11; Curry, 11; Cochran, 10 and Istanbuluoglu, 10).
- The 78-point margin of victory was the largest in a game during the Jeff Walz era and the second largest in program history.
- The 111 points scored were the third most in a game in program history.
- Louisville limited Bellarmine to nine points in the first half, the third-fewest points allowed in the first half in program history and the most in a game since 2020.
- The Cardinals tallied 62 points in the paint against Bellarmine. It is the most points in the paint since Dec. 4, 2020, when Louisville recorded 74 against DePaul.
- Freshman Elif Istanbuluoglu recorded a double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds. She is the first Louisville freshman to record a double-double since Olivia Cochran had 13 points and 15 rebounds against Northwestern in the second round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament.

LOUISVILLE PICKED FOURTH IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

Louisville was selected to finish fourth overall in the ACC Preseason Poll ahead of the 2023-24 season. Since the Cardinals joined the league in 2014-15, they have finished fourth or higher in the league in every season. The Cardinals are the only team in the ACC to finish fourth or higher in each of the last nine seasons.

CARDS AMONG ACC BEST IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

Since Louisville joined the ACC back in the 2014-15 season, they have been one of the most successful teams in the conference when it comes to winning and advancing in the NCAA Tournament.

- Over the last three tournaments (2021, 2022, 2023), Louisville leads the ACC with 10 total wins in the NCAA Tournament. The 10 wins are double the number of wins from the programs that are tied for second-most during that span (Virginia Tech, Miami - 5).
- In two of those three years (2021, 2022), the Cardinals were the farthest ACC team to advance in the bracket.
- Overall since the 2014-15 season, Louisville is second in the conference in

IN RARE AIR

Jeff Walz is among a select few coaches in all of college basketball when it comes to making four or more Final Fours.

- In Women's Basketball, he is one of just five active head coaches and one of 11 all-time to make four or more Final Fours.
- Of those 11, Walz is one of nine to have all of his appearances come at the same school.
- Including Men's Basketball, Walz is one of nine active and one of 33 all-time to make four or more Final Fours.
- Of those 33, he is one of 25 to make all of his appearances at the same school.

ALLOWING 59 POINTS OR LESS

The Cardinals have great success when allowing 59 points or less in a game over the past few seasons. Louisville has won 43-straight games when allowing 59 points or less in a game after the 77-58 win over Pitt on Jan. 28. The 43-straight wins dates back to the 2020-21 season. Over the past nine seasons, the Cardinals are 150-4 when allowing 59 points or less in a game.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Cardinals are 5-3 on the road this season. Last season, the Cardinals were 10-5 in true road games. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, the Cardinals are 67-15 in true road games. Louisville is fourth in the NCAA in road wins and fifth in winning percentage (.817) during that span. The 10 road wins last season were tied for the most in the ACC.

70-PLUS POINTS

The Cardinals are 98-5 in their last 103 games when they have scored 70 points or more, dating back to the 2018-19 season. UofL is 327-28 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz.

50/50

The Cardinals shot 50.0 percent (28-56) from the floor in the home win over #21/23 Syracuse, their eighth game shooting over 50 percent this season and they are 8-0 in those games. Overall, they boast a 151-3 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz.

ONE OF THE BEST IN THE COUNTRY

Louisville has been one of the best teams in the country since the start of the 2017-18 season. The Cardinals have totaled 196 wins and an .845 winning percentage. The wins rank third and the winning percentage ranks sixth in the NCAA during that span.

SUCCESS AGAINST UNRANKED TEAMS

Louisville is 199-10 in their last 209 games against unranked opponents. From 2015 to 2019, Louisville won 102 consecutive games against teams not ranked in the AP Top 25.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

All-time, Walz is 185-35 (.841) against nonconference foes in regular season play. They are 88-12 in non-conference play over the past eight seasons.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

Louisville returns four players that played for last year's team, brings in eight newcomers and had 11 departures.

■ **Returnees** - The Cardinals return two starters from last year's team in senior forward Olivia Cochran and sophomore forward Nyla Harris. Both Harris and Cochran played in all 38 games last season. Joining the two starters are senior guard Merissah Russell and redshirt-sophomore forward Alexia Mobley. Russell played in 37 games last season off the bench and scored six or more points 11 times. She scored eight

points on 3-for-6 shooting in the Sweet 16 win over Ole Miss. Mobley made her collegiate debut on the road against Pitt last season. She scored her first collegiate points in the ACC Tournament against Wake Forest.

■ **Newcomers** - Louisville brings in a slew of transfers along with two international freshmen products for the 2023-24 squad.

■ Senior Eylia Love transferred to Louisville this past January and was with the Cardinals during their Elite Eight run but was not eligible to play. She comes to the Cardinals from Georgia Tech where she played 71 games and made 41 starts over two and a half seasons.

■ Junior guard Jayda Curry joins the Cards after transferring from Cal in April. She was the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2021-22 and was selected to the All-Pac-12 team last season by the media. She has averaged 16.9 points per game over 53 games during her two seasons at Cal.

■ Junior forward Hennie van Schaik joins the Cardinals after transferring from CSU-Bakersfield this past April. van Schaik led Bakersfield in points per game (11.6) and rebounds (7.2) this past season. Over the summer, she competed with Netherlands at the FIBA U20 European Women's Championship.

■ Graduate guard Kiki Jefferson comes to the Cards after playing her first four collegiate seasons at James Madison. She was the 2023 Sun Belt Player of the Year and was the 2023 Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding player this past season. She has scored 1,838 points in her 116 career games played and hauled in 815 rebounds.

■ Graduate guard Sydney Taylor played her first four seasons at UMass before transferring to the Cards this past spring. She was an Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team honoree last season and was one of the best three-point shooters in the country. She made 107 threes, which led the A-10 and ranked seventh nationally.

■ Graduate guard Nina Rickards came to the Cardinals in April after playing her first four years at Florida. She has played 120 collegiate games, the most of any player on the Cardinals roster, and eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau last season with the Gators. In her final year at Florida, she finished second on the team in scoring with a career-best 12.1 points per game and was third in rebounding (4.9) and steals (1.4) per game.

■ Forward Elif Istanbuluoglu comes to the Cardinals from Turkey and signed with Louisville in August. She has played with the Turkish National Team at the U18 and U20 Championships this past summer. Her older sister, Seval, played collegiately at Siena.

■ Center Eseosa Imafidon comes to the Cardinals after playing for Proctor Academy last season. She will redshirt this upcoming season but is originally from Nigeria. She came to the United States to play high school and prep basketball through the Access2Success Program.

EXPERIENCE AND SCORING NOT A PROBLEM FOR THE CARDS

The Cardinals have an influx of new players to the 2023-24 squad as eight newcomers have joined the squad but the team does not have an issue with experience or scoring. Of the 12 players on the roster, three are graduate students and five are juniors or older.

■ **Games on games on games** - Louisville has nine players on the roster that have played in 50 or more collegiate games. Four of those players have tallied over 100 career games with Nina Rickards leading the way with 143, followed by Kiki Jefferson at 139, Sydney Taylor at 130 and Olivia Cochran at 123.

■ **Scoring Touch** - Several Cardinals players have the ability to light it up from the floor. Six different players have tallied at least one 20-point game in their careers and three players have had 10 or more 20-point games. In total, there have been 98 20-point games by Cardinals players in their careers. Kiki Jefferson leads the way with 45, Sydney Taylor is second with 28, Jayda Curry has 16, Nina Rickards has four, Olivia Cochran has three and Eylia Love has two.

CARDS WIN GOLD AT 2023 GLOBL JAM

The 2023-24 Cardinals have already hit the floor together this year as they competed in the 2023 GLOBL JAM Tournament in Toronto back in July. The Cardinals were the representatives from the United States and were joined by national U23 teams from Canada, Puerto Rico and BAL Select.

■ The Cardinals went 2-1 in the pool play games with wins over Puerto Rico (78-55) and BAL Select (72-39) and dropped a close game against Canada (71-74). The Cardinals still advanced to the gold medal game where they had a rematch against Team Canada.

■ Trailing by one with under a minute left, Sydney Taylor knocked down the game-winning three to clinch the win for the Cardinals and claimed the Gold Medal over

■ Merissah Russell won the event for the second-straight year. She won gold back in 2022 with Team Canada and she competed with the Cards for this year's tournament.

PRESEASON HONORS FOR COCHRAN, JEFFERSON AND CURRY

Olivia Cochran, Jayda Curry and Kiki Jefferson all earned preseason honors ahead of the 2023-24 season.

■ Cochran has been named to a few national Player of the Year Watch Lists as the season has gotten underway. Cochran was named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List on Nov. 14. She was one of two Cardinals to be selected for the Naismith Women's Player of the Year Watch List. She was named to the Preseason All-ACC team for the first time in her career. The Cardinals have had at least one player named to the Preseason All-ACC team since they joined the league in the 2014-15 season. Cochran was also named to the Katrina McClain Award Watch List for the third-straight season. She was one of five players that has been on each of the last three McClain Award Watch Lists.

■ Curry joined Cochran on the Naismith Women's Player of the Year Watch List. She was one of two Cardinals (Kiki Jefferson) that were named to the ACC Newcomer Watch List. She joins the Cardinals from Cal where she was the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2021-22 and was named to the First Team All Pac-12 last season by the media.

■ Jefferson was the second Cardinal with Curry to be named to the ACC Newcomer Watch List. It is the first time since the Cardinals joined the ACC that they had multiple players on the Newcomer Watch List. Jefferson was also named to the Cheryl Miller Award Watch List, that recognizes the best small forward in college basketball. It is the first time Jefferson has made the Miller Award Watch List in her career and the fourth-straight season the Cardinals have had a representative on the list.

PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS

The Cardinals were ranked 17th in the 2023-24 Associated Press preseason poll and were picked 15th in the USA Today poll. They were one of five ACC teams in the AP poll and were one of seven ACC teams in the USA Today Poll.

■ **Preseason Top-20** - It marks the 13th-consecutive season that Louisville has been ranked in the Top-20 of the AP preseason poll and the 14th time in Walz's 17-year tenure. The 13-year streak in the preseason Top-20 is the longest active streak of any ACC team. The second-longest active streak among ACC teams is just two years.

RETURNING STARTERS

The Cards return only two players that have made a start in a Louisville uniform but the pair have combined for 110 starts during their time at Louisville heading into the 2023-24 season. (Cochran - 95, Harris - 15).

MOST UOFL VICTORIES

The Cardinals won 26 games last season and it tied for 11th-most in a single season in program history. The top eight and 13 of the 14 top win totals have come under Walz.

ANOTHER 20/25-WIN SEASON

UofL defeated Boston College 62-52 on Feb. 19 to reach 20 wins for the 13th-straight season last year and extend the program record. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice. The Cards have won at least 20 games in 15 of Walz's 16 seasons. Prior to Walz's arrival, Louisville had just 10 20-win seasons in its history. The Cardinals picked up their 25th win of the season after the NCAA Tournament second round win over Texas on March 20. It was the 11th-straight season the Cardinals have won 25 games or more and the 13th time overall under Walz.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Since the KFC Yum! Center opened its doors for the 2010-11 season, the Cardinals have had one of the best home court advantages in the country. Louisville is 203-31 all-time at the KFC Yum! Center over the past 14 seasons. During that span, the Cardinals have won at least 11 home games every season. In six of those seasons, the Cardinals lost one home game or less. The Cardinals program record for consecutive home wins is 21 games, a streak that spanned over three seasons. Over the past seven seasons, Louisville is 98-7 at home.

BEST FANS IN THE COUNTRY

Last season, Louisville averaged 8,779 fans at the KFC Yum! Center, which topped the ACC and ranked fifth in the country. The 8,779 fans per game would have rank seventh in ACC men's basketball last season. For 13 straight-seasons, they have led the ACC and ranked in the top five in the country in attendance. They had a season-high 12,015 fans vs. Notre Dame last year.

REPRESENTING THEIR COUNTRIES

The Cardinals had a number of players represent their countries at international competitions this past summer.

■ **USA** - Following her MVP performance at the 2023 GLOBE JAM Tournament in Toronto, Sydney Taylor was added to the USA 3x3 U23 Nations League Team for multiple stops throughout the summer. She made her debut with Team USA in Chile as the team won five of the six single-day tournaments during that stop. Later on, she played with Team USA in Quebec before being named to the USA Nations League Final team that competed in Mongolia back in September.

■ **Netherlands** - Hennie van Schaik competed with Team Netherlands in the 2023 FIBA U20 European Championships in late July and August. She played in four total games as the Netherlands finished third overall at the event.

■ **Turkey** - Elif Istanbuluoglu played with Turkey at the 2023 FIBA U18 and U20 Championships this past summer before ultimately committing to the Cards. At the U18 Championships, she averaged 11.0 points and 10.7 rebounds per game as Turkey reached the quarterfinals.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

Louisville has been one of the most consistent teams in the NCAA Tournament during Jeff Walz's tenure.

■ They are the only team in the country that have been to each of the last five Elite Eights.

■ They are just one of three teams (UConn, South Carolina) with an active Sweet 16 streak of six years or longer.

■ Louisville is one of five programs (UConn, Stanford, South Carolina, Notre Dame) to make four or more Final Fours in the last 15 seasons.

WALZ IN THE BIG DANCE

Walz boasts a 40-14 record in NCAA Tournament games. He is eighth all-time in winning percentage and fifth among active coaches. He has directed UofL to a pair of national runner-up finishes (2009, 2013), four Final Fours (2009, 2013, 2018, 2022), eight Elite Eights (2009, 2013, 2014, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2022, 2023), 12 trips to the Sweet 16 and 14 NCAA Tournaments. Walz is one of five active head coaches to make four or more Final Fours.

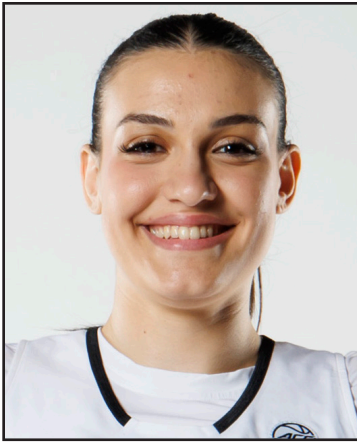
