» The Beavers pulled away in the fourth quarter, scoring 26 points despite All-American post Raegen Beers sitting with foul trouble (finished with 10 pts, 6 reb)

TEAM NOTES

FOR THE HER-STORY BOOKS

For the first time in OSU history, the Beavs claimed multiple victories over AP Top 5 opponents in the same season and beat a Top 5 team on the road after their victory against No. 4 Colorado. The Beavers swept the mountain road trip to capture their first 20-win season since 2019-20, earning their most consecutive conference wins in the same season since 2019 (also won 5 straight) and their longest conference winning streak since 2018-19.

LEARNING TO WIN

As its young team grows, Oregon State is playing fewer close games and winning more of them this season. Last year, OSU went 4-11 in conference play and 6-11 overall in single-digit contests. This year, the Beavers are 8-5 and 6-3 in Pac-12 play. The Beavs are playing in fewer close games in part due to maintaining focus through the second half. They are +186 in the final 20 minutes even after holding healthy leads at halftime.

- » After going 2-11 away from home last year (1-8 away/1-3 neutral site), the Beavs are 8-5 (5-4 away/3-1 neutral) outside the friendly confines of Gill Coliseum this year
- » The Beavers hold a 18-2 home record, the best record at home since 17-1 in 2018-19

ON LOCKDOWN

Once again demonstrating its dominant defense, Oregon State held 13 opponents at least 10 points below their season scoring average. Within the Pac-12, the Beavers limited seven teams to scores notably beneath their season averages: twice against Utah (-36/-14), USC (-16.3/-18.3), Stanford (-14.1/-11.7), and Colorado (-15.2/-18.9), and against Oregon (-20), Washington State (-18.8) and UCLA (-15.3). The Beavs held then-No. 20 Utah, No. 4 Colorado, No. 9 USC, and Oregon to season-low scoring outputs (44 at Utah, 59 at Colorado, 56 vs. USC, 41 vs. Oregon).

DOMINATING DEFENSE

The Beavers are known for their lockdown D under Scott Rueck. Oregon State has allowed 59.2 points per game over the course of his tenure and has held opponents under 65 points in 70% of its games. The Beavs are 253-67 (.789) when holding the opponent to 65 points or fewer and 213-37 (.850) when holding opponents under 60 in the Rueck Era.

DEFEND THE DAM

Oregon State's defensive prowess is on display again this season. The Beavs limit their opponents to 35.3% shooting, second in the Pac-12 and 12th nationally. The Beavers give no room for second chances, claiming 31 defensive rebounds per game, placing them eighth in the nation and second in the Pac-12.

- » Held the Pac-12's leading scorer, JuJu Watkins, to 18% shooting, forcing her to take an 32 shots to score 14 points (with her remaining 4 coming on free throws)
- » Moved Utah's offense, ranked 9th nationally coming into their second game, to 13th after limiting them to season lows in points (44), FG% (28.1%), 3PT% (18.2%), FGM (16) and assists (6)
- » While on the road, held then-No. 20 Utah and No. 4 Colorado to season-lows in scoring (44 at Utah, 59 at Colorado) and field goal percentage (28.1% and 36.9%, respectively)

OWNING THE BOARDS

Oregon State has been one of the top rebounding teams in the country over the last ten seasons. The Beavs have a rebounding margin of +8.3 during that time, best in the Pac-12 and ninth nationally.

EVERYONE DISHES, EVERYONE EATS

Oregon State's is at its best when players are sharing the ball. The Beavs average 17.5 assists per game and assist on 65.3 percent of their made baskets, third in the Pac 12. The result: 11 Oregon State players this season have scored in double-figures at least once. Talia von Oelhoffen is settling into a role as a distributor with 4.9 assists per game (ranks 4th in the conference). She also recorded OSU's first points-assists double-double with 20 points (11 assists) since 2004 (Leilani Estevan v. Gonzaga) against Texas Tech. von Oelhoffen and Donovanyn Hunter both have at least one 10-assist game this season and eight Beavers average at least one per game.

LEADING THE PAC PALE ALE

Raegan Beers was a force in the nation's best conference, dominating a league with nine teams in the NET ratings top 50, seven in the NET top 25 and five teams that ranked in the AP Top 5 at one point in the year. She earned two Pac-12 Player of the Week honors, one of three players in the league to earn the weekly honor twice.

Against Pac-12 teams...

- » Led the league in FG% (63.6%), while scoring 16.7 points per game (5th)
- » Finished fifth in defensive (6.8), offensive (2.9) and total rebounds per game (9.8)
- » Ranked 3rd in the conference in Player Efficiency Rating (32.8) 4th in Her Hoop Stats Defensive Rating (83.6) and 7th in offensive rating (117.1)
- » One of just five Pac-12 players to average at least one block and one steal per game
- » One of only five players in the Pac-12 averaging a double-double

THE PAC-12'S BEST OFF THE BENCH

Timea Gardiner earned Pac-12 6th Player of the Year honors after leading the league's non-starters in scoring and rebounding with 10.2 points and 6.5 boards per game. The sophomore is also shooting an efficient 43.7% from the field and 40.5% from downtown. Her 89.8% free-throw percentage makes her a strong option to close games. Over her last 14 games Gardiner has broken out, hitting double figures in all 14 while shooting 46.1% from the floor and 44.6% for three.

- » The only Beaver to consistently score in double figures in the last 14 games of the 2023-24 campaign
- » Leads the team in three pointers made per game, sinking 1.9 from behind the arc
- » Leads the league's bench players with 189 total rebounds, leading second place by 76
- » The third Beaver in six years to be named 6th Player of the Year, following Raegan Beers (2023) and now-coach, Aleah Goodman (2019)

BEAVS GOT DEPTH

The prowess of Oregon State's bench is a theme in the 2023-24 campaign. The Beavers rank first in the Pac-12 in bench points with 25.0 per game with players deeper in the rotation keying victories like the comeback win over Arizona, 25-point domination of Utah, and a victory over #9 UCLA without Raegan Beers for 3/4 quarters. OSU's bench scored 30+ points in nearly half of its games this year with 11 players boasting at least one double-figure game.

DOMI DONO-NATING

Starting at point guard as a freshman is a rarity in major college basketball, but Donovan Hunter owns the floor general role for Oregon State. The Medford, Ore. native consistently showcased her playmaking abilities for the Beavs, delivering 3.6 assists per game. The freshman averaged 27.4 minutes per game, putting her second behind teammate Raegan Beers who averaged 27.7 minutes per game.

- » Earned her first double-double against Utah (17 pts, 10 ast) becoming the first OSU freshman to record a points-assists double-double since Boky Vidic in 1993-94.
- » Ranks first nationally in ast/to among freshmen (2.5 a/to)
- » One of just 10 major conference freshmen averaging at least three assists per game (currently at 3.6).

CZECH HER OUT

Dominika Paurova made an instant impact for Oregon State: sparking comeback wins against Arkansas-Pine Bluff (13 pts in the season-opener) and at Cal (16 points, all second-half). The Czech came to Corvallis after playing with the senior national team at Eurobasket and making the U19 World Cup All-Tournament team.

TOO REES-Y

Kelsey Rees joined Oregon State as a grad transfer with two years remaining. The Australian brought 60 games of experience, including last season's Pac-12 Championship year, to Corvallis. She has been an impact player with her floor spacing (37.7% 3PT) and shot-blocking (1.0 blocks/game), filling two crucial needs for the Beavers and pairing well with Timea Gardiner (playing the five) and Raegan Beers (playing the four).

DOUBLE-DOUBLE IPA

Raegan Beers is a double-double machine, racking up 15 this season in 29 opportunities.

- » Ranks third in the Pac-12 with 15 double-doubles this season (23rd nationally)
- » One of 26 players nationally averaging a double-double (17.7 ppg, 10.2 rpg)
- » Locked down the #4 spot at OSU in career double-doubles with her 29th against Cal. Beers is now chasing down Ruth Hamblin (30) for third all-time.
- » Recorded six straight double-doubles to open the season and has not gone more than two games without one this year

SMOOTH FINISH LAGER

Raegan is the hub of Oregon State's offense, but she isn't just a volume scorer. The sophomore ranks third in the nation in field goal percentage (66.3%), doing so in the conference with the highest defensive rating by a sizable margin per Massey. She is one of four players in the country shooting 60% or better from the field while scoring 17+ points per game.

- » Ranks fifth in the country in Player Efficiency Rating (41.2) per Her Hoop Stats
- » Among the nation's best in Her Hoop Stats' points per possession (13th - 1.14) and points per scoring attempt (16th - 1.34)

NOTES

GOTTA BE THREE

The Pac-12 three-point percentage leader (45.2% 3PT), Lily Hansford has 47 made baskets this year, 42 of them from behind the arc. It took 21 games for Hansford to get a 2-pointer before she put two in from backdoor cuts against Colorado. Unable to score fewer than three twice in a row, Hansford's second layup was an and-one.

T TIME

Talia von Oelhoffen reached three career milestones in 2023-24, officially hitting 1,000 points, 300 assists and 75 steals. TVO is the 3rd active Pac-12 player to reach those career milestones, joining Jaylyn Sherrrod (Colorado) and Charisma Osborne (UCLA).

MICROWAVE SCORER

In AJ Marotte's three years at OSU, she's developed a reputation as a scorer who doesn't need long to heat up. The junior scored 17 points in the first half at Arizona last season, opened this season's UC Davis game with 10 points in the first quarter and scored a career-best 23 points in a win over WKU. Marotte is deadly from mid-range and excels at getting to the basket.

CERTIFIED BUCKET-GETTER

Talia Von Oelhoffen joined an exclusive list of Rueck-era Beavers when she scored 31 points against USC as a freshman. Only six other Beavs have scored 30+ over the last 13 seasons: Jamie Weisner, Marie Gulich, Aleah Goodman, Ruth Hamblin, Kat Tudor and Destiny Slocum. Even among that highly-touted group, von Oelhoffen now stands alone as the first Beaver under Rueck to score 30+ multiple times in her career after dropping 32 on Eastern Washington and 41 on Nevada last season. She is the 10th Beaver to score 30+ points 3-or-more times in her career and the first since Kim Butler ('04-'06)

CAN'T MISS, WON'T MISS

Against then-#16 Utah, OSU couldn't miss. The Beavs shot 69.4 percent from the field and made 65% of their triples. The field goal percentage was the second-best of the last 25 years against a ranked foe (Vanderbilt -72.5% vs. #8 Arkansas; 1/23/03). The last time Oregon State shot 60 percent or better in a conference game was in 2021 against Washington (65.3%). Oregon State's season field goal percentage of 46.3% would rank fifth in school history and is the best since 2019-20.

TOP OF THE PAC

Oregon State has been one of the top teams in the Pac-12 since 2014-15 with a 113-57 record in league play. Beaver players have earned 14 All-Pac-12 First-Team nods over the last seven seasons and head coach Scott Rueck is one of five coaches in Pac-12 history to win the Coach of the Year Award multiple times.



Oregon State's playmaking duo of Talia von Oelhoffen and Donovanyn Hunter both average at least three assists per game with an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.15 or better, the only such duo in the Pac-12 Conference

HOME SWEET HOME

Beaver Nation has long been among the best women's basketball fan bases in the Pac-12. Oregon State is the only Pac-12 team to finish in the top-three in the conference in average attendance over the last five non-Covid seasons. This year, Beaver Nation set several new attendance records in support of the 2023-24 Beavs as the team went 18-2 at home (18-0 with Raegan Beers in action).

- » Back-to-back postseason Gill Coliseum attendance records with 6,923 and 7,227 fans at last weekend's first and second round games
- » New single-season attendance record with 103,110 fans, despite a game played in a near-empty Gill due to an ice storm
- » Student attendance record of 2,369, surpassing the previous record by more than 1,000 students
- » Five straight crowds of 6,000+ to end the season and three with 8,000+ against UCLA/USC/Stanford

HEAD COACH SCOTT RUECK (14TH SEASON)



It was a homecoming of sorts for OSU alumnus Scott Rueck, who was named the fifth head coach in the history of the Oregon State women's basketball program on June 30, 2010.

Rueck has been the architect of an accelerated turnaround of the women's basketball program at Oregon State, bringing the team onto the national stage.

Rueck has led the Beavers to seven NCAA Tournaments, including the 2021 event. OSU was poised to earn a top-4 seed prior to the cancellation of the 2019-20 Tournament due to the COVID-19 outbreak. Oregon State won three-straight Pac-12 titles from 2015-17, and has made four Sweet-16's, two Elite Eight's and a Final Four.

The two-time OSU graduate will enter the Oregon State Hall of Fame for the first time with his 2016 Final Four Team on November 10, 2023. Rueck led the Beavers to a sweep of the Pac-12 regular season and conference titles, as well as the trip to

The now-14th-year coach has led the Beavers to 42 wins over AP Top 25 programs during his time at Oregon State, including 12 over top-10 teams. Squaring off against some of the best players in the nation, the Beavers have often at least held their own. OSU went 4-4 against Oregon during Sabrina Ionescu's time in Eugene and recorded an 7-1 mark against Washington while Pac-12 all-time leading scorer Kelsey Plum played for the Huskies.

Of course, Oregon State also developed its own superstars under Rueck. Five players earned All-America honors in six years between 2015-2020, the first time in school history. Jamie Weisner and Ruth Hamblin won back-to-back Pac-12 Player of the Year honors in 2015-16 and Hamblin, Gabby Hansen and Marie Gulich won Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in four straight seasons between 2015-18. Sydney Weise was another of the All-Americans and also won the Senior Class Award in 2017 after earning All-Pac-12 recognition for four straight seasons
