No. 17/18 Notre Dame (3-1) 28, Miami OH (0-3) 3

TEAM NOTES

- Notre Dame won the toss and deferred its choice to the second half. Miami received the opening kick off and started the game defending the south end zone.
- Attendance capacity crowd of 77,622, the eighth consecutive sellout in Notre Dame Stadium.
- Notre Dame improves to 3–0 all-time against Miami OH and 11–1 against teams from the MAC.
- Notre Dame's eight passes defended in today's game are the most since the team had eight at NC State in 2023. The last time the Irish had nine PBU since the win over Vanderbilt in 2018.
- Notre Dame held Miami OH to 2–12 on third down, following up on their 1–12 third-down performance against Purdue last weekend.

NOTABLE

- James Rendell recorded a career-best 53-yard punt at the conclusion of Notre Dame's first offensive drive of the game, then improved his career-best by one yard in the second quarter with a 54-yard effort.
- Jeremiyah Love rushed for his fourth touchdown of the season in the third quarter. He scored just once on the ground as a true freshman in 2023.
- Riley Leonard finished with 143 yards rushing today and is the first Irish quarterback with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games for an ND quarterback since Carlyle Holiday vs. Pittsburgh (122 yards, 10-6-2001) and West Virginia (130 yards, 10-13-2001).
