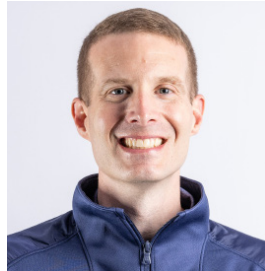

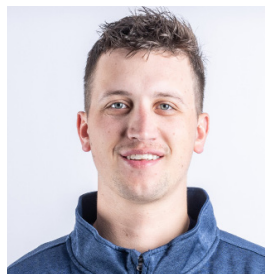

SOMETHING BREWING IN SOUTH BEND

Though we can't talk specifics until ink hits the paper, but it's hard not to notice the momentum that Coach Shrews is building in South Bend. He talked how in year one he was setting the foundation and the 'right culture.' Heading into year two, Coach Shrews is on an absolute heater on the recruiting trail.

As of Oct. 1, Notre Dame has four verbals from one five-star and three four-star players. The five-star recruit would be the highest signee in program history (in the modern era with rankings), ranked No. 10 from ESPN. The Irish recruiting class is ranked No. 1 by both 247 Sports and Rivals and No. 4 by ON3.

FROM LEAST TO MOST

When Coach Shrewsberry took over the Notre Dame job, he had to start at the ground-level. In fact, Notre Dame only returned 35 points at this point last year, which equated to 1.6% of scoring returning. That number ranked in the bottom five of Division-I schools. However, this summer is quite a different story.

The Irish return the most scoring in the ACC by a landslide. With a solid young core of seven returnees (Markus Burton, Braeden Shrewsberry, Tae Davis, Julian Roper II, J.R. Konieczny, Kebba Njie, Logan Imes), Notre Dame returns 85.6 percent of its scoring. The next highest is Wake Forest at 59.8 percent.

Burton leads the charge on returning points with his 17.5 ppg. That's the third highest returning scoring average in the ACC.

IRISH GO 3-0 IN SPAIN

Every four years at Notre Dame the basketball program is allowed to go on a Foreign Tour. That time had come for the Irish men's hoops squad, as they went on a 10-day trip to Spain. They made stops in Madrid, Valencia and Barcelona and played a game in each city vs. a semi-pro all-star squad. Notre Dame went 3-0 on the trip and here are some highlights:

- Burton recorded 58 points, 12 assists, 11 steals and 17 rebounds in three games
- Sundra - 18 points, 24 rebounds
- Davis - 20 points, 20 rebounds
- Shrewsberry - 32 points with eight made triples
- Njie - 24 points, 21 rebounds

NON-STOP SUMMER FOR SHREWS

There was no time off or time wasted for Coach Shrewsberry this summer. We've already broached his recruiting efforts, but he also found time to serve as an assistant coach on the U.S. U18 squad during their gold medal run at the 2024 FIBA U18 Americup. The U18 USA squad spent the first week in June competing in Buenos Aires, ultimately downing Brazil to take the top seed in Group B. The U.S. then cruised past Canada in the semifinals to soar right into the gold-medal game where they defeated Argentina 110-70.

A day after landing back in the States, Coach Shrews hopped on a plane to Boston to catch game five of the NBA Finals. Coach got to celebrate with his former players and staff in the locker room afterwards and has the championship goggles hanging in his office. SHREWSBERRY/STEVENS CONNECTION

Celebrating Boston's NBA Title is a great segue into the long-standing friendship between the Shrewsberry and Stevens family.

The connection with Brad Stevens and Micah Shrewsberry dates back to their days at Butler. Then again for six years together with the Boston Celtics. Braeden Shrewsberry states he's been friends with Brady Stevens (Brad's son and now freshman walk-on on the team) for as long as he can remember. Braeden also claimed to be Notre Dame's top recruiter when Brady was deciding on a college.

ACC ROOKIE OF THE YEAR RETURNS FOR MORE

The 2024 ACC Rookie of the Year Markus Burton has trained hard this summer to make year two even better. Last spring, Burton brought home the program's first ACC Rookie of the Year award and third ever Rookie of the Year award of any conference, joining Chris Thomas (2002) and Troy Murphy (1999) - who each won it in the Big East.

Below is a short recap of Burton's stellar and historic rookie campaign:

- His 17.5 ppg led all ACC freshmen
- He ranked 3rd nationally amongst DI freshmen in scoring
- His 577 points set a new ND freshman scoring record, surpassing the previous holder Troy Murphy and his 519 points (1998-99).
- Burton's 17.5 ppg ranked 3rd all-time for a freshman behind Troy Murphy (19.2) and Adrian Dantley (18.3)
- His 63 steals tied Jerian Grant for third most in a single season
- ACC play only rankings: 17.5 points (6th), 2.2 steals (1st), 4.8 assists (3rd).

- Dished out 95 assists in ACC play - ranked as the 4th most by an ND player
- Produced two games with 15+ point, 5+ assists, 5+ steals. Since 1996, only one other Irish player (Chris Thomas) had produced two games in the same regular season with at least 15-5-5.
- Burton averaged the 2nd most points in the ACC from Feb. 24 on aka to the end of the season, averaging 22.1 ppg in that span (over five games). Burton produced a whopping 6 20+ point games in that span, with one of 30+.
- Four-time ACC Rookie of the Week - set a new ND record.

BEST YOUNG BACKCOURT IN THE ACC

Freshman guards Markus Burton and Braeden Shrewsberry showed no fear in the first year in the ACC. Burton averaged 17.5 points both on the season and in league play, leading the Irish. Shrewsberry was the lone other Irish to finish in double figures, averaging 10.2 points on the year and 11.3 points in ACC play.

With that said, Burton and Shrewsberry became the 9th ACC freshmen duo in league history to rank No. 1 and No. 2 for their team in scoring, proving the future is bright in South Bend.

There is only scoring duo in the ACC that returns a higher combined number than Burton's and Shrewsberry's 27.7 ppg and that's Wake Forest's Hunter Sallis and Cameron Hildreth. That duo return a combined 31.8 ppg.

Burton and Shrewsberry also proved they aren't afraid of a hostile environment. In true road games, Burton and Shrewsberry averaged 16.3 points and 12.8 points, respectively.

Lastly, don't forget that this duo went off in the nation's capital for the first round of the ACC Tournament in the win over Georgia Tech. Shrewsberry scored a team-high 23 points, shooting 8-of-12 from the field, including 5-of-8 from three-point range. Four of Shrewsberry's threes came in the second half. It marked his third game of 20+ that season. Next, Burton followed right behind with 21 points on 8-of-15 shooting. Burton also tied his season high in assists with eight.

SHARPSHOOTER SHREWS

Speaking of Braeden Shrewsberry, he joined Burton in the Notre Dame record book after lighting it up from three in ACC play last year.

Shrewsberry knocked down 55 three-pointers in ACC play, breaking the Notre Dame ACC record. The previous record was 51 held by Prentiss Hubb, Matt Farrell and V.J. Beachem.

Those 55 threes in ACC play also tied for the fourth most amongst league players for the 2023-24 season.

Shrews ultimately converted 78 made threes on the year which were the 2nd most nationally by a freshman. His 2.4 made threes/game were 2nd nationally by a freshman as well.

As far as individual games - Shrewsberry tied the program record for made three-pointers by a freshman after draining seven against the Louisville Cardinals. He tied the likes of Pat Connaughton, Chris Thomas and Ryan Hoover.

Lastly, Shrewsberry shot 41.4 percent from deep in ACC play - that number ranked 6th amongst ACC players and ranked 7th all-time in Notre Dame ACC program history.

COACH SHREWS CULTURE TAKES SHAPE

Coach Shrewsberry achieved two of his priorities in the 2023-24 season: establish the right culture at Notre Dame and have the team playing its best basketball at the end of the year.

It was a program that was projected to finish dead last in the conference. This young team came together and emptied their tanks for their head coach and the Fighting Irish fans. As a result, Notre Dame doubled its ACC win total from the year prior, finishing 7-13 in league play. Coach Shrewsberry even received several votes for ACC Coach of the Year. Notre Dame earned the No. 12 seed in the ACC Tournament, where they advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Georgia Tech.

The 13 ACC losses certainly don't reflect how close Notre Dame really was in almost every league game. Case in point, Notre Dame recorded an early ACC stretch in which

they had been in eight straight tight battles, with the average margin of defeat at 7.5: Pitt, Virginia, BC x2, Miami, FSU, Duke and NC State. To sum it up, Notre Dame played in 18 games in which the margin of victory was 10 points or less and went 8-10 in those instances. Diving deeper, the Irish were 4-5 in games decided by five points or less.

There were two moments during the season which could have broken the Irish, but instead they learned from it and grew. The first instance was a 20-point loss to Citadel. The Irish then rebounded with an emphatic 76-54 win over Virginia. What Shrews' crew accomplished had never been done by an Irish team against Virginia .. ever. It was the largest margin of victory against the Cavaliers in the all-time series. In addition, the 76 points were the most scored by an Irish squad against the Cavaliers in regulation in program history. Furthermore, right after the Virginia contest, the Irish almost pulled off the upset to two teams who made the Elite Eight in NC State and Duke.

The second instance was the seven-game losing streak. They rallied together and won five of their next six, which included the final four at home:

- W, 74-66, vs. Virginia Tech
- W, 58-55, vs. Georgia Tech
- W, 72-50, at Louisville
- L, 85-88, at Syracuse
- W, 70-65, vs. Wake Forest
- W, 69-62, vs. Clemson

From Feb. 1 to March 1, Notre Dame was the biggest mover in kenpom AdjEM across the Power-Five conferences. Another fun stat: when the first NET rankings came on Dec. 4, the Irish were 238. On March 10, the Irish were up to 126.

THE NEW ADDITIONS

So we've talked about how this young core grew at the end of the season and return a huge chunk of its scoring. Now let's talk about the new pieces starting with the incoming freshman class.

ESPN's final recruiting class rankings had the incoming Irish trio at 19th in the country and 1st in the state of Indiana.

Cole Certa

(6-5, Guard, from Le Roy, IL)

Certa was ranked 89th overall in the country by ESPN. He transferred to IMG Academy in Florida for his senior year, where he

averaged 8.3 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.5 assists. He helped IMG achieve a 20-9 overall record.

Sir Mohammed

(6-6, Guard, from Charlotte, NC)

Mohammed is Coach Shrewsberry's highest rated recruit, coming in at No. 43 nationally by 247 Sports and 57th by ESPN. Mohammed led Myers Park to a 27-3 overall record on his way to a Second-Team All-State honor. He averaged 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.3 steals in 20.5 minutes over 24 games as a senior.

Garrett Sundra

(6-11, Forward, from Ashburn, VA)

Sundra ranked 131st nationally and 29th in his position. He was a key contributor on a loaded Paul VI Catholic squad who achieved a 35-3 overall record and a No. 1 ranking by MaxPreps. Sundra averaged 8.3 points, 6.8 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.0 steals per game as a senior.

VETERAN ADDITIONS

From the youth movement to the veteran leadership and experience added with three grad transfers.

Matt Allocco

(6-4, Guard, from Princeton)

A two-time All-Ivy League honoree, Allocco has inserted himself as a vocal leader on this team. He brings NCAA Tournament experience, helping Princeton not only reach the Big Dance in 2023, but also earn two wins, knocking off two-seed Arizona and seven-seed Missouri. Last season, Allocco was the only player in the nation to shoot at least 50% from the field, 40% from three and 90% from the free throw line while appearing in at least 25 games, averaging at least 10 points-per-game and playing at least 25 minutes-per-game. In addition, he ranked 29th in the nation in true shooting percentage (64.6).

Nikita Konstantynovskiy

(6-10, F, from Monmouth)

Konstantynovskiy spent last season at Monmouth where he averaged 9.3 points and 8.1 rebounds per game. He notched six double-doubles and ranked fourth in the CAA in rebounds per game, as well as second in offensive boards (2.9). His top game was an impressive 22-point, 20-rebound performance against Stony Brook.

Burke Chebuhar

(6-8, F, from Lehigh)

Chebuhar arrives from Lehigh where he saved his best season for last. He averaged 7.5 points and 5.0 rebounds. He played in all 32 games with 22 starts. Chebuhar shot 46.2 percent from the floor and produced four double-doubles.

DEFENSE / NEVER GIVE UP

The year one Coach Shrewsberry stamp on the program was the squad's defensive intensity and never give up attitude. 20 ACC games and 14 different ACC opponents - all but three (Virginia Tech on March 9, UNC on March 5 & Syracuse on Feb. 24) were held under their season average, with Miami, Duke and Louisville each held to season low point totals.

Of the 20 ACC matchups only 6 opponents reached the 70-point park against the Irish defense.

Notre Dame's scoring defense of 67.2 finished with a national ranking of 49th, plus 3rd in the ACC. According to KenPom, Notre Dame's defensive efficiency ranked 39th.

In ACC play, Notre Dame ranked 2nd in scoring defense (66.4) and 2nd in field goal percentage defense (.417).

RETURNEE BREAKDOWN

Tae Davis

(6-9, Junior, Forward)

- Played in 32 games with 31 starts
- 15 games in double-figures, plus 3 double-doubles
- Led the team in shooting percentage (.484)
- Finished the season on the best stretch of his career: 7 straight double-digit scoring performances. He averaged 13.3 points on 52.5 percent shooting, plus 5.1 rebounds as well.
- Averaged 9.2 points (3rd most on team) & 5.2 rebounds (2nd most) in ACC play.
- Notable game: Davis scored all 18 of his points in the 2nd half in the win over Clemson on March 2.

Kebba Njie

(6-10, Junior, Forward)

- Played in 29 games with 27 starts
- Led team in rebounding (5.4) and offensive boards (2.0).
- Averaged 4.5 points & 5.5 rebounds in ACC play.
- Notable game: season high 11 points, plus

9 boards, in ACC Tournament win over Georgia Tech.

J.R. Konieczny

(6-7, Senior, Guard)

- Played in 32 games with 19 starts
- Shot 40.6 percent from three in ACC play
- Averaged 7.4 points and 4.0 rebounds in league play
- Led the team with 4 double-doubles
- Most notable game: 574 Day vs. Virginia - started 4-for-4 from three and 6-for-6 from the field, scoring all 17 of his points in the first half.

Logan Imes

(6-4, Sophomore, Guard)

- Played in 31 games with 3 starts
- Averaged less than a turnover per game with a 1.1 A/TO ratio
- Scored all 8 of his season-high points in the 2nd half in the win vs. Virginia Tech on Feb. 10. Went 3-for-4 from the line (final 1:14 of the game) and hit a pivotal three-pointer with 7:23 left.

Julian Roper II

(6-4, Senior, Guard)

- Played in 31 games with 12 starts
- 11 points at Virginia Tech in ACC regular-season finale.
- Finished 33.7 percent from three, which ranked as the 2nd highest on the team
- Career high 14 points against Western Michigan, going 6-for-8 from the field.

IN-STATE TALENT

The Irish boast 5 players from the state of Indiana on the 2024-25 roster. That marks the most in-state talent since the 2015-16 Notre Dame squad, who also had five.

The Indiana ties go even further. Coach Shrewsberry grew up right outside of Indianapolis and has coaches all over the state. Kebba Njie played high school ball in Indiana at La Lumiere. Juilan Roper II played in AAU ball in Indy. Brady Stevens spent some time here as a kid when his dad coached at Butler. Plus, Development & Recruiting Coordinator Grady Eifert played at Purdue.

2024-25 SCHEDULE NOTES

The biggest highlight of Notre Dame's schedule will be its Thanksgiving week tournament in Las Vegas. The Fighting Irish were invited to compete in the Players Era Festival, specifically the Impact Tournament alongside Alabama, Houston and Rutgers.

In ESPN's Way Too Early Top-25 rankings, Alabama is No. 2, Houston is No. 4 and Rutgers is No. 25.

The 2024 Players Era Festival introduces an entirely new structure for early season competition, coinciding with the opportunity for athletes on each participating team to engage in more than \$1 million in NIL opportunities outside of competition.

In the SEC/ACC Challenge, Notre Dame will have to hit the road yet again, this time traveling to Athens on December 3 to take on the Georgia Bulldogs. It'll mark Notre Dame's first appearance inside Stegeman Coliseum. Notre Dame and Georgia have squared off four times, with the series tied at 2-2. All four matchups have gone down on neutral floors. The Irish will look to claim their first SEC/ACC Challenge victory after coming up short at South Carolina a year ago.

The Fighting Irish will get to tip off ACC play at home on Dec. 7 when they host Syracuse. The bulk of Notre Dame's league schedule will start on New Year's Eve.

For Notre Dame, its home/away repeaters are Syracuse, Boston College and Georgia Tech. The full breakdown is below.

Home/Away: Syracuse, Boston College, Georgia Tech

Home: North Carolina, Virginia Tech, Louisville, SMU, Pitt, Stanford, Cal

Away: NC State, Duke, Virginia, Florida State, Miami, Clemson, Wake Forest

In terms of the T.V. breakdown of the 20-game ACC slate, the Irish will play seven on the ESPN network channels, four on the CW, plus eight on the ACC Network. Notre Dame vs. North Carolina inside Purcell Pavilion on Jan. 4 has been picked up by CBS with a Noon ET tip time.
