No.12/11 Notre Dame (5-1) 31, Georgia Tech (5-2) 13

TEAM NOTES

- SGeorgia Tech won the toss and deferred its choice to the second half. Notre Dame received the opening kick off and started the game defending the south end zone.
- Attendance
- Notre Dame improves to 31–6–1 in the all-time series against Georgia Tech and 14–2–1 in road games against the Yellow Jackets.
- Notre Dame improves to 218-84-3 against teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference and 90-4-3 in road games against ACC teams.
- Notre Dame improves to 322–164–23 on the road all–time and 3–0 in 2024.
- Notre Dame leads all FBS teams in games played in NFL Stadiums since 2016, today's first appearance in Mercedes-Benz Stadium is the 13th different NFL stadium for the Irish since '16.
- Notre Dame held Georgia Tech's rushing attack to a season-low 64 rushing yards (previous low was 93 vs. Louisville). Notre Dame's Jadarian Price, with 69 yards rushing, out-rushed the entire Georgia Tech offense.
- With two interceptions in the game today, Notre Dame posted its third multiple interception game of the season.

NOTABLE

- Riley Leonard's two rushing touchdowns in the second quarter were the ninth and 10th of the season, moving him into a tie for second on the Notre Dame season-season list with DeShone Kizer (10 in 2015). Brandon Wimbush (14 in 2017) is the Notre Dame single-season leader for quarterback rushing touchdowns.
- Leonard's two rushing touchdowns were the 28th and 29th of his career, putting him one behind Oregon's Dillion Gabriel (30) for the lead in career rushing touchdowns by an active quarterback.
- Beaux Collins logged his fifth game at Notre Dame with four-or-more catches today. He finished the game with five receptions for a team-high 51 yards.
- Xavier Watts intercepted his 10th career pass early in the fourth quarter (setting up Notre Dame's 42-yard field goal.) He is the 19th Notre Dame player to intercept 10 or more passes in a career and is tied for 12th (with six other players) on the all-time list for career interceptions in program history.

FIRSTS

- Career field goal junior kicker Zac Yoakam a 42-yard successful attempt in the fourth quarter to put the Irish up 24–7.
- Career touchdown freshman linebacker Adon Shuler on his 36-yard interception return for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter.
- Rush of the season junior wide receiver Tyler Buchner on a fake field goal in the fourth quarter.

CAREER HIGHS

- Sacks two senior defensive lineman Rylie Mills
- Tackles career-high nine sophomore linebacker Drayk Bowen.
- Tackles career–high matching seven freshman Leonard Moore. Moore has two starts this season with 14 total tackles in those two games.
