OPENING KICK

- #24 / #24 Navy (6-0) and #12 / #11 Notre Dame (6-1) meet for the 97th time on the gridiron when the two square off on Saturday afternoon (12 noon) at MetLife Stadium (82,500) in East Rutherford, N.J. Saturday's contest is being televised by ABC and is presented by Navy Federal Credit Union and Navy Mutual.
- Navy is looking for its first 7-0 start to a season since 1978 and just its fifth in program history (1926 when Navy won the National Championship, 1934, 1960 and 1978).
- Notre Dame enters Saturday having won 5-straight games which is tied for the 13th-longest streak in the country. Navy has won 6-consecutive games which is tied for the 7th-longest streak in the country.
- Navy is 2-0 all-time at MetLife Stadium, upsetting Notre Dame 35-17 in 2010 and beating Army 17-13 in 2021.
- Notre Dame leads the all-time series against Navy 82-13-1 and has won 6 in a row against the Mids. Navy last defeated Notre Dame in 2016, 28-27, in Jacksonville, Fla.
- Navy and Notre Dame are two of the winningest college football programs in history. Notre Dame's 954 all-time wins are tied with Texas for the 4th most among schools on the FBS level, while Navy's 744 wins are tied with Arkansas for 24th.
- Navy is 1 of just 10 FBS teams who enters this weekend undefeated. With its 6 wins, the Mids are bowl eligible for the first time since 2019.
- Navy is 1 of just 3 teams (Army, Indiana) in the FBS to have won every game this season by double figures.
- Saturday marks the first time that both teams enter the game ranked in the Associated Press top 25 since 2019 when #21 Navy lost to #16 Notre Dame 52-20 in South Bend. Navy last beat a ranked Notre Dame team in 2009 when the Mids stunned #19 Notre Dame 23-21 in South Bend.
- Navy has beaten a ranked Notre Dame team just 4 times in the history of the series (2009, 1957, 1944 and 1936).
- Navy already owns a win over a ranked team this year (defeated #22 Memphis, in the coaches poll, 56-44). The last time Navy beat two ranked opponents in the same year was 1958, when the Mids beat #8 Rice 20-7 and #14 Michigan 20-14.
- This week is just the 26th time in the last 50 years Navy has been ranked in the Associated Press poll. The Mids were ranked 6 times in both 2015 and 2019. Navy went from 1980 to 2003 without being ranked and again from 2005 to 2014.
- Navy, picked 11th in the 14-team AAC preseason poll, is currently in second place with a 4-0 record and owns a win over preseason favorite Memphis. The Mids play 3 of the top-4 teams in the preseason poll (Memphis, Tulane, South Florida).
- Navy's 269 points in the first-6 games of the year are 57 more than it scored in all 12 games last year (212).
- Navy has scored a touchdown on the 1st play of a drive 5 times this fall, which is the 3rd most in the FBS.
- Navy is averaging 274.8 rushing yards per game this fall, the 4th-best average in the FBS and the program's best since 2019 when it averaged a school-record 360.5 rushing yards per game.
- Navy is 23-23 in the red zone this year with 22 of those scores resulting in touchdowns (Navy's first 20 red zone trips resulted in touchdowns before settling for a field goal last week against Charlotte). Last year, the Mids were tied for 130th in the country in red zone offense, scoring just 14 touchdowns on 29 attempts. Navy is 1 of 5 teams that are perfect in the red zone this year.
- Navy is coming off a 51-17 win over a Charlotte in a game that saw Navy take a 38-0 lead with 10:24 left in the second quarter. It's the 2nd time this year the Mids have scored 50 points in a game (56 vs. Memphis). It's the 1st time since 2019 Navy has scored 50 or more points in multiple games in the same season.
- **Eli Heidenreich** (Jr. / Snipe) or **Alex Tecza** (Jr. / FB), who grew up in Pittsburgh and have known each other since the 1st grade, have scored a touchdown for Navy in 13 of the last 16 games dating back to the 2023 season. Tecza scored on the first-3 drives of the game last Saturday against Charlotte.
- The Navy defense forced 5 turnovers against Charlotte, the most since forcing 5 against Houston in 2019. Navy's 4 interceptions were the most since that same Houston game.
- **Lane III** made his 36th-consecutive start at safety for the Mids against Charlotte, which is the longest active streak for a safety in the FBS and second longest by a player in the secondary. Lane III also has 3 forced fumbles this year, tied for the 4th most in the FBS. Last week, Sporting News named him to the Midseason All-America Team.

• **DaShaun Peele** (Sr. / CB) became the 1st player in school history to return 2 interceptions for a touchdown in the same game last week against Charlotte. It's the 3rd time this year Navy has returned an interception for a touchdown as **Rayuan Lane III** (Sr. / S) had an 86-yard interception return for a touchdown with 23 seconds left in the game against Memphis that clinched the victory for the Mids.

• **Blake Horvath** (Jr. / QB) threw 3 touchdown passes in Navy's win over Charlotte last Saturday. He is the 1st Navy quarterback to throw 3 touchdown passes in a game since Keenan Reynolds did it in his first-career start on Oct. 11, 2012 at Central Michigan. His 10 passing touchdowns this year are the 6th most in Navy history for a single season, just 3 behind record holder Ricky Dobbs (13 in 2010).

• Horvath has thrown for at least 100 yards in the first-6 games of the year. It's the longest streak by a Navy quarterback since Jim Kubiak did it in 22-straight games over the 1993-94 seasons.

• Horvath and Alabama's Jalen Milroe are the only 2 quarterbacks in the FBS that have reached double figures in both rushing and passing touchdowns this fall.

• Horvath is the No. 1-rated quarterback and the No. 2 overall runner, Heidenreich is the No. 2 overall receiver and Lane III is the No. 7-rated safety in the FBS according to Pro Football Focus. Additionally, **Connor McMahon** (Sr. / OT) is tied for 3rd as a pass blocker.

• Saturday's fly-over will feature 4 F/A-18E Super Hornets from the "Gunslingers" VFA-105 and the "Rampagers" from VFA-83 based out of Naval Air Station Oceana, Virginia Beach, Va. Piloting the lead aircraft of the four-ship will be former Navy football player Lt. Cmdr. Travis "Sunshine" Keating USNA Class of 2013. The wing aircraft will be piloted by Lt. Cmdr. Robert "Fat Goose" Nelson, Class of 2012, Lt. Cmdr. Britton "Beavis" Girard and Lt. Matthew "Pool Boy" Baugh, Class of 2018. Providing ground control and support will be Cmdr. Travis "Sweet T" Amerine from the Class of 2005.

• The "Gunslingers" and "Rampagers" returned home in July from a 9-month combat deployment in the Central Command Area of Responsibility (AOR) attached to Carrier Air Wing Three (CVW-3) onboard the USS Eisenhower.

• **1st/2nd Quarter Break** - The Navy women's golf team will be honored. The Mids earned the program's 2nd NCAA Regionals berth by shooting a tournament-best 9-over par 289 over the final 18 holes to capture the 2024 Patriot League Women's Golf Championship title. Claiming the league title for the first time since 2021, the 882 marked the lowest 54-hole Patriot League Championship score by total strokes for the Mids in program history. Carding a 2-over par 72 on the final day, senior Stephanie Lee posted an 8-over par 218 (73-73-72) to earn individual medalist honors and become the first golfer in program history to finish at the top of the Patriot League Championship leader board. Lee also became the third player in program history to earn All-Patriot League honors 3 times in a career.

• **Halftime** - The Naval Academy Drum and Bugle Corps will perform.

• **3rd/4th Quarter Break** - The pilots from the pregame flyover will be recognized.

• **Postgame** - Navy's alma mater, Navy Blue & Gold, will be played as the team stands at attention in front of the Brigade of Midshipmen. It is one of the best traditions in all of sports.

• Following the contest, Medhurst, Miller, Mills and Wykoff will recap the day's events in a 30-minute postgame show.

WHY WE PLAY

• Without Navy, Notre Dame may not still exist. Notre Dame fell on hard times in World War II. The school's population dwindled to a depression era number of 2,623 students in 1943 and a 20 percent reduction in 5 years led to stark financial problems for the school. Then the Navy came to Notre Dame's rescue.

• According to then Notre Dame president Hugh O'Donnell, the school "offered all of the facilities of this institution to the government. In April of 1943, the V-7 Indoctrination School was created and the first group of 900 men, all college graduates enlisted for one month as apprentice seamen."

• The late Notre Dame Vice President Father Edmund Joyce also shared the same sentiments of Navy's importance to the school. "All I can say is without the Navy during the war, this institution would have gotten down to a few hundred students. Instead of that, we were almost twice our normal size during the war, and we were able to contribute something to the Navy."

• The Navy signed a contract with the South Bend-based school at the time, guaranteeing \$487,711 for its infrastructure needs and administrative expenses.

• Notre Dame has never forgotten Navy's kindness and support in its time of dire need. In fact, in the 1950s and 60s when colleges across the country en masse were ending their ROTC programs, Notre Dame stood by Navy and allowed its University to serve as a base for college naval recruits.

AND THEN THERE WERE 10

• Heading into the week, Navy (6-0) is 1 of just 10 teams in the FBS that has not lost a game this year.

• The other teams include Army (7-0), BYU (7-0), Indiana (7-0), Iowa State (7-0), Miami (7-0), Oregon (6-0), Penn State (6-0), Pitt (6-0) and Liberty (5-0).

BETTER GET USED TO THE ROAD

• After opening the season with 3-consecutive home games, the Mids will play 7 of their final-9 games away from home (5 road, 2 neutral site).

• Navy is the only FBS team in the country that has just 2 true home games in the final 9 contests.

PROTECTING THE LEAD AT HOME

• Navy has won 72-consecutive games at home when leading after 3 quarters, the nation's longest streak.

• The last time Navy lost at home when leading after 3 quarters was Oct. 23, 1999, when the Mids led Akron 29-13 and lost 35-29.

HORVATH OFF TO A BLISTERING START

- **Blake Horvath** (Jr.) won the starting quarterback job in the spring over **Braxton Woodson** (So. / QB) in a close contest.
- Horvath made his first-career start last October against North Texas and ran for 88 yards on 18 carries in the first half before leaving with a season-ending thumb injury late in the 2nd quarter.
- He finished his sophomore campaign completing 6 of his 12 passes (50.0) for 84 yards and 2 touchdowns, while carrying the ball 37 times for 183 yards (4.9 yds/carry, 45.8 yds/gm).
- Horvath had some bright moments last year in his limited playing time, completing 4 of his 6 pass attempts for a career-high 83 yards and 2 touchdowns and rushing for 52 yards on 10 carries against USF. He entered the Memphis game with 10:47 remaining in the contest and rushed for 49 yards on 7 carries.
- Horvath made his second-career start in the 2024 opener against Bucknell where he completed 7 of his 12 passes for 108 yards with 2 touchdowns and an interception. He also rushed for 33 yards on 7 carries. He left in the third quarter due to cramps.
- Horvath was sensational against Temple, rushing for a career-high 122 yards and 3 touchdowns on 15 carries, while completing 5 of his 9 pass attempts for a career-high 112 yards and a touchdown. For his performance he earned an ESPN helmet sticker.
- According to ESPN Stats and Information, Horvath is the first Navy player to throw 3 touchdown passes in the first 2 games of the season.
- He received multiple national awards for his performance against nationally-ranked Memphis - the Maxwell Award National Player of the Week, Davey O'Brien National Co-Quarterback of the Week, DC Touchdown Club Player of the Week, Manning Stars of the Week, Davey O'Brien Great 8 and AAC Offensive Player of the Week. He also received a helmet sticker from ESPN for a second-consecutive game. He rushed for a career-high 211 yards and 4 touchdowns on just 12 carries, while throwing for a then-career-high 192 yards and 2 TDs on 9 of 12 passing. Additionally, he caught his first-career pass for 13 yards.
- His 6-combined touchdowns against the Tigers are the most by a Navy player since Malcolm Perry had 6 (4 rush / 2 pass) against East Carolina in 2019.
- His 416 yards of total offense were just 12 yards off the school record of 428 set by Will Worth in 2016.
- He is the first Navy quarterback to throw for over 200 yards and rush for over 100 yards since Zach Abey did it against Florida Atlantic in 2017.
- He is the first Navy quarterback to rush for more than 100 yards and throw for more than 100 yards in consecutive games since Zach Abey did it 3 times at the end of the 2016 season and beginning of the 2017 season.
- His 211 rushing yards against Memphis are the most by a Navy player since Malcolm Perry ran for 213 yards in Navy's Liberty Bowl victory over Kansas State in 2019.
- His 90-yard touchdown run against Memphis is tied for the fifth-longest run in school history and the second longest in the FBS this year.
- Horvath was sensational once again when the Mids traveled to UAB for their first road trip of the season. He completed 9 of his 11 passes for a career-high 225 yards and 2 touchdowns, while rushing for 84 yards and 1 TD on 13 carries in Navy's 41-18 rout of the Blazers. Horvath had touchdown passes of 77 (**Nathan Kent** / Jr. / WR) and 74 yards (**Eli Heidenreich** / Jr. Snipe).
- Horvath is the first player in the FBS this year to throw 2 touchdown passes of 70 yards or more in the same game and is the first QB in Navy history to achieve that feat as well.
- In Navy's 34-7 rout over Air Force, Horvath rushed for 115 yards and 2 touchdowns, while completing 9 of his 15 pass attempts for 134 yards. It was Navy's largest margin of victory over Air Force in Colorado Springs since 1978 and it was the second-most points the Mids have ever scored at Air Force.
- Horvath and Heidenreich (100) both rushed for over 100 yards against Air Force and became Navy's first 100-yard rushing tandem since Nov. 30, 2019, when Jamale Carothers

(188) and Malcolm Perry (146) did it against Houston. It's the first time Navy has had 2 100-yard rushers against Air Force since 2017 when Zach Abey (214) and Perry (100) did it

- Against Charlotte, Horvath completed 7 of his 13 pass attempts for 117 yards and 3 touchdowns in Navy's 51-17 victory. He also rushed for 56 yards on 13 carries. He is the 1st Navy quarterback to throw 3 touchdown passes in a game since Keenan Reynolds did it in his first-career start on Oct. 11, 2012 at Central Michigan. His 10 passing touchdowns this year are the 6th most in Navy history for a single season and just 3 behind record holder Ricky Dobbs (13 in 2010).
- Horvath has thrown for at least 100 yards in all 6 games this season. It's the longest streak by a Navy QB since Jim Kubiak did it in 22-straight games over the 1993-94 seasons.
- On the year, Horvath has rushed for 621 yards (103.5 yds/gm, 16th in FBS) and 10 touchdowns (10th in FBS) on just 79 carries (7.9 yds/carry, 3rd in FBS) and has completed 46 of his 72 pass attempts for 888 yards with 10 TDs and an interception.
- He has been responsible for 20.7 points per game, which ranks 7th nationally, and is averaging 10.0 points per game, which is 13th nationally.
- Horvath is the first Navy quarterback since Keenan Reynolds to throw a touchdown pass in 4-consecutive games (streak ended at Air Force, had a touchdown pass called back due to a penalty).
- As a team, Navy is ranked 2nd in the FBS in yards per completion (19.3), 1st in red zone offense (1.000), 2nd in team passing efficiency (201.8), 4th in rushing offense (274.8), tied for 4th in fourth down efficiency (.857) and 4th in scoring offense (44.8).
- Horvath ranks 3rd in the FBS in ESPN's QBR Rating (90.6).
- Horvath is ranked as the No. 1 overall quarterback in the FBS by Pro Football Focus with a grade of 92.7 and the No. 2 overall runner of all players with a grade of 93.0.
- Horvath is also a candidate for Academic All-America honors as he carries a 3.53 grade-point average in operations research.

FIVE MIDS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS IN 2023

- The Navy football program had 5 players named Academic All-District by the College Sports Communicators last fall. Navy was the only Service Academy to have at least one player recognized.
- To be eligible for the award, the student-athlete must be at least a sophomore and have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale. Additionally, the student-athlete must have played in 90 percent of the institution's games or started at least 66 percent of the games.
- The 5 Navy players who earned All-District honors were 2024 graduates safety **Eavan Gibbons** (Ocean Engineering major, 3.56 GPA) and wide receiver **Jayden Umbarger** (Political Science, 3.65), along with fullback **Daba Fofana** (Applied Physics, 3.69), offensive tackle **Connor McMahon** (Operations Research, 3.51) and punter **Riley Riethman** (Aerospace Engineering, 3.96).

NAVAL ACADEMY MISSION STATEMENT

"To develop midshipmen morally, mentally and physically and to imbue them with the highest ideals of duty, honor and loyalty in order to graduate leaders who are dedicated to a career of naval service and have potential for future development in mind and character to assume the highest responsibilities of command, citizenship and government."

ACADEMIC MAJORS | SELECTED SPRING OF PLEBE YEAR

Students at the Naval Academy can select one of 26 different majors grouped into six different divisions: Division of Engineering and Weapons, Division of Mathematics and Science, Division of Humanities and Social Sciences, Division of Professional Development, Division of Leadership Education and Development, and the Division of Character Development and Training. In addition to graduating with a Bachelor's of Science, students can attain a minor in one of seven different languages: French, German, Spanish, Russian, Japanese, Arabic and Chinese.

GRADUATION / COMMISSIONING

Navy's Class of 2025 will graduate on May 23 and will be commissioned Ensigns in the Navy or Second Lieutenants in the Marine Corps. Graduates serve a minimum of 5 years in the Navy or Marine Corps, while pilots serve 8 years upon earning their wings.

SERVICE ASSIGNMENTS

Midshipmen submit their service assignment preferences (up to 6) in late August of their senior year and typically receive their service assignments in November of their senior year.

NAVY AMONG THE TOP RUSHING TEAMS IN THE COUNTRY

- In 2003, Navy led the nation averaging a then school-record 323.2 yds/gm.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the 2nd time in 3 years, averaging 318.7 yds/gm.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids rushed for a then school-record 348.8 yds/gm in 2007, becoming the 1st team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing 3-consecutive years.
- In 2008, Navy led the country in rushing for a 4th-straight year, averaging 292.4 yds/gm.
- The Mids finished 2nd in the country in 2013, averaging 325.4 yds/gm.
- Navy was 2nd in the country in 2014, rushing for 338.1 yds/gm. It was the Mids' best rushing effort since 2007 when they set the school record.
- In 2015, Navy again finished 2nd in the country, averaging 326.7 yds/gm.
- Navy averaged a then school-record 351.4 yds/gm in 2017, which was the 2nd most in the country.
- In 2019, Navy once again led the nation in rushing with its school-record 360.5 yds/gm. The Mids outrushed 2nd-place Air Force by 62 yds/gm.
- Navy is averaging 274.8 rushing yards per game this fall, the 4th-best average in the FBS and the program's best since 2019 when it averaged a school-record 360.5 rushing yards per game.
- Navy's 23 rushing touchdowns this season are tied for the 6th most in the country, but rank 2nd among teams that have played 6 games this year.

RAMOS, FOFANA NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

- Seniors **Colin Ramos** (LB) and **Daba Fofana** (FB) have been voted team captains for the 2024 season by their teammates. It is the greatest honor a Navy student-athlete can receive.
- Ramos has seen action in 32 games during his career, including 24 starts, and has earned 3 varsity letters. He has recorded 198 tackles, 18.5 tackles for loss, 6 sacks, 5 forced fumbles, 2 fumble recoveries and an interception.
- A 2023 First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and All-East selection, Ramos led Navy in tackles last fall with 110, the most by a Navy player since Cody Peterson recorded 142 in 2013. Additionally, he spearheaded a defense that recorded a nation's-best 3 shutouts, which were the most by a Navy team since 1978.
- Fofana has played in 24-career games, starting 13, while earning 2 varsity letters. He has rushed for 1,052 yards and 9 touchdowns over the past two seasons, which includes 3 100-yard rushing days.
- A physics major who carries a 3.57 grade-point average, Fofana has been named to the College Sports Communicators Academic All-District Team twice.

THE DYNAMIC DUO FROM THE STEEL CITY

- Eli Heidenreich** (Jr. / Snipe) and **Alex Tecza** (Jr. / FB) were high school teammates at Mt. Lebanon High School in Pittsburgh and have known each other since the first grade, so it only made sense for them to make their first-career starts together last year at Memphis.
- Tecza ran for 163 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries, while Heidenreich caught 2 passes out of the backfield for 19 yards in Navy's 28-24 loss at Memphis last fall.
- The 163 yards by Tecza were the most by a Navy fullback since Jamale Carothers ran for 188 yards on Nov. 30, 2019, in a rout of Houston.
- 75 of the 163 yards came on his first carry, as he took a pitch and outran the Memphis secondary for a 75-yard touchdown. It was the longest run by a Navy fullback since Anton Hall Jr. took one 77 yards to the house in the 2022 Army-Navy game.
- Against USF, Tecza led the Mids in rushing (13 carries for 82 yds), while Heidenreich led Navy in receiving (1 catch for 68 yds and a touchdown).
- Tecza had another big game against North Texas, rushing for 137 yards and 2 touchdowns on 17 carries.
- The two came up big yet again at Charlotte as Heidenreich caught a 69-yard touchdown pass from **Braxton Woodson** and Tecza scored on a 62-yard run to provide for Navy's only points in a 14-0 win.
- Heidenreich caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from Tai Lavatai against Air Force.
- Heidenreich had his 4th touchdown reception in 5 games when he caught a 24-yard strike from Xavier Arline at Temple.
- In Navy's win over ECU, Tecza was the leading rusher (24 carries, 94 yards, 1 touchdown), while Heidenreich was the leading receiver (2 catches, 53 yards).
- Tecza, who was named Honorable Mention All-American Athletic Conference and First-Team All-East last fall, finished the 2023 campaign as Navy's leading rusher with 758 yards and 5 touchdowns on 126 carries, while catching 16 passes for 97 yards. Heidenreich tied for Navy's receiving lead with 19 catches for 382 yards and 4 touchdowns, while carrying the ball 27 times for 214 yards and 1 touchdown.
- In the 2024 opener against Bucknell, it was Heidenreich's turn to shine. He caught 4 passes for a career-high 74 yards and a career-high 2 touchdown receptions. He also caught a two-point conversion. Heidenreich made his debut returning punts with 2 punts for 32 yards. Tecza ran for 40 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries, while catching a 10-yard pass.
- Against Temple, Tecza rushed for 92 yards and a touchdown on 9 carries, while Heidenreich caught 4 passes for 98 yards and a touchdown. Tecza's touchdown run went for 65 yards, while Heidenreich's touchdown catch was a 31-yard strike from **Blake Horvath** (Jr. / QB).
- Against Memphis, Heidenreich had 4 catches for 68 yards and a touchdown, while carrying the ball 6 times for 41 yards. Tecza carried the ball 10 times for 58 yards.
- Against UAB they both scored touchdowns. Tecza carried the ball 4 times for 22 yards and a touchdown, while catching 1 pass for 23 yards. Heidenreich had 4 carries for 24 yards and caught 3 passes for 108 yards and a touchdown, a screen pass that he took 74 yards to the house.
- The duo was critical in Navy's 34-7 thrashing of Air Force as Heidenreich rushed for 100 yards on just 6 carries and caught 5 passes for 101 yards, while Tecza carried the ball 6 times for 26 yards and 2 touchdowns. Heidenreich is believed to be the first player in Navy history to rush for 100 yards and have 100 yards receiving in the same game.
- It was Tecza's time to shine against Charlotte, as he scored 3 touchdowns in the first nine minutes of the game and Navy blew out the 49ers 51-17. Tecza scored on a 46-yard touchdown pass from Horvath before scoring on runs of 12 and 2 yards out after the Navy defense forced a turnover. Tecza finished the day with 68 yards and 2 touchdowns on 8 carries, while catching the 1 pass for 46 yards and a touchdown.
- Heidenreich has 5 touchdown catches this season and 9 in his career. The school record for touchdown receptions in a season is 6, while the career record is 13.
- Heidenreich had a touchdown catch in 4-straight games and looked like it would be 5-straight as he caught a touchdown

pass against Air Force that ended up getting called back. He is the first Navy player to have a touchdown catch in 4-straight games since Jamir Tillman in 2015.

- Heidenreich is Navy's first receiver with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Jamir Tillman had 162 yards at Houston and 102 yards against Army in 2015.
- At least one of the two have scored a touchdown for Navy in 13 of the last 16 games (they have scored in the same game 4 times). Heidenreich has 10 touchdowns in his career (1 rush, 9 rec.), while Tecza has 13 (12 rush, 1 rec.).
- Heidenreich is averaging 20.6 yards per catch in his career (42 catches / 867 yds) which is the 4th-best average in school history. He is averaging 21.1 yards per catch this year, which ranks 11th in the nation.
- Heidenreich is ranked as the No. 2 wide receiver in the country by Pro Football Focus.

- Heidenreich is the first player in school history to have 100-yards rushing and receiving in the same game.

- Since his arrival in 2019, **Brian Newberry** has challenged the defense to "Get 6" in every game.
- What does Get 6 mean? It's a combined total of 6 three-and-outs, fourth down stops and turnovers. A missed field goal counts as a fourth down stop.
- If that turnover is returned for a score, it counts as an extra point towards the goal of 6.
- Newberry believes that if the defense can accomplish the challenge, the Mids will have a great chance to win.
- In Newberry's 6 years at Navy, the Mids are 23-5 (.821) when they "Get 6" (8-0 in 2019 / 2-0 in 2020 / 2-2 in 2021 / 2-1 in 2022 / 5-2 in 2023 / 4-0 in 2024) and 10-27 (.250) when they don't (2-0 this year).
- In 2023, Navy's defense achieved a "Get 6" on 54 percent of its drives, the best percentage during Newberry's tenure.
- Through six games this year, the Navy defense has gotten a "Get 6" on 61 percent of its drives.

KENT IMPRESSES AT OLYMPIC TRIALS

- Nathan Kent** (Jr. / WR) does more than catch footballs. He's also one of the fastest 400-meter runners in the United States.
- This past June, Kent competed at the United States Olympic Trials in the 400 meters as one of the top-35 400-meter runners in the country.
- He ran a then school-record 45.42 in his heat, advancing to the semifinals where he would break that mark with a 45.32. He finished 12th out of 27 runners in the semifinals.
- Kent was a Second-Team All-American in outdoor track this past spring and competed at the NCAA Championship in Eugene, Ore.
- He was the Patriot League Indoor Track & Field Athlete of the Meet and the IC4A Outdoor Athlete of the Meet.
- Navy track & field has won both the men's and women's titles at the last 9 Patriot League Championships between the indoor and outdoor meets.
- Kent entered the season with 6 career catches for 118 yards and a touchdown and 4 carries for 76 yards and 1 TD. He had a 70-yard touchdown run off a reverse as a freshman against Tulsa in his first-collegiate touch and second career play.
- He was targeted 4 times and came away with just 1 catch for 13 yards against Bucknell in the 2024 opener.
- He caught a 77-yard touchdown pass from **Blake Horvath** (Jr. / QB) with 31 seconds left in the first half of Navy's 41-18 victory over UAB. The touchdown gave Navy a 21-3 lead.
- Kent scored a touchdown in consecutive weeks as he took a reverse on 4th-and-2 and ran 34 yards untouched in Navy's 34-7 win over Air Force.

A TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE

- Navy dominates the NCAA record book when it comes to single-season rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Keenan Reynolds ran for 31 touchdowns in 2013, which is the most by a quarterback in FBS history.
- Reynolds is also the NCAA record holder for career rushing touchdowns (by any player) with 88.
- Ricky Dobbs ran for 27 touchdowns in 2009, which is tied with Collin Klein of Kansas State for the 2nd most in FBS history among quarterbacks.
- Will Worth ran for 25 touchdowns in 2016, which is the 4th-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 24 touchdowns in 2015, which is the 5th-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 23 touchdowns in 2014, which is tied as the 6th most by a quarterback.
- Malcolm Perry's 21 rushing touchdowns in 2019 are the 11th-most single-season TDs by a QB in FBS history.

DABA DABA DO!

- **Daba Fofana** (Sr. / FB), who entered the 2022 Tulsa game with 116-career yards rushing and 0 touchdowns, ran for a 159 yards on 21 carries and scored 3 touchdowns.
- Fofana was the first Navy player to rush for over 100 yards since slot back Carlinos Acie rushed for 155 yards in 2021 against East Carolina (Lavatai rushed for 120 yards the next week against SMU).
- He was the first Navy fullback to rush for over 100 yards since Jamale Carothers ran for 188 yards against Houston in 2019.
- Fofana was the first Navy player to score 3 touchdowns in a game since Carothers scored 5 in that same Houston game.
- Fofana rushed for 61 yards on 21 carries against SMU and had 89 yards on 20 carries against Houston. He carried the ball 24 times for 63 yards and a touchdown against Temple.
- Fofana hit the century mark for a second time in 2022, rushing for 133 yards and a TD on 15 carries against Notre Dame.
- He followed up the Notre Dame game with another 100-yard day, rushing for 114 yards on 20 carries against UCF.
- Fofana was the team's leading rusher in 2022 with 769 yards and 6 touchdowns on 186 carries.
- He was the first fullback in the triple-option era to have 20 or more carries in four-consecutive games (21 vs. Tulsa, 21 vs. SMU, 20 vs. Houston, 24 vs. Temple).
- Fofana was Navy's leading rusher in the 2023 opener against Notre Dame where he had 56 yards on 15 carries.
- Fofana was Navy's 2nd-leading rusher against Memphis, carrying the ball 9 times for 53 yards and catching 2 passes for 24 yards. The 2 catches were the first two of his career.
- He was Navy's 2nd-leading rusher once again against USF, running for 53 yards on 9 carries.
- Fofana finished the 2023 season with 283 yards rushing and 3 touchdowns on 72 carries and 5 catches for 46 yards.
- Fofana had a big game in the 2024 opener against Bucknell, rushing for 82 yards and a touchdown on 8 carries (10.2 yds/carry), including a first quarter 49-yard touchdown run for the Mids' first points. It was the longest touchdown run of his career and second-longest run of his career (had a 50-yard run against Notre Dame in 2022).
- Fofana rushed for 42 yards and a touchdown on 8 carries against UAB.
- Fofana carries a 3.59 grade-point average as a physics major and plays the cello.

ROBINSON NAMED TO BRUCE FELDMAN'S FREAKS LIST FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT YEAR

- **Landon Robinson** (Jr. / NG) was named to the *Athletic's* Bruce Feldman's Freaks List for the second-consecutive year. Robinson was ranked 48th this year after making his debut last ranked 92nd.
- Feldman wrote: The only nose guard in the FBS to play on the kickoff team last year. The 6-0, 286-pounder who arrived at the Naval Academy at 240 pounds, has improved his bench 30 pounds up to 450 and his squat 50 pounds up to 650. Robinson (28 tackles last year) vertical-jumped 33 inches and clocked 20.13 mph on the GPS.
- As a sophomore, Robinson played in all 12 games for the Mids and was the only nose guard in the FBS on the kickoff team. He recorded 28 tackles, 4.5 tackles for a loss and 4 sacks in limited time at nose guard.
- Making his 1st-career start in the 2024 opener, Robinson had 6 tackles, a sack, 1.5 tackles for loss, 2 QB hurries and blocked a field goal in Navy's 49-21 win against Bucknell.
- Robinson had 5 tackles and a QB hurry in Navy's rout of Temple and followed up with 3 tackles and 2 QB hurries in Navy's win over No. 23 Memphis.
- Robinson had 4 tackles, including a sack, in Navy's win at UAB and recorded 5 stops against Air Force.
- Robinson had 6 tackles in the win over Charlotte.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

- Navy is forcing 1.7 fumbles per game, which is the 3rd-most in the country.
- Navy's 10 interceptions this year are the 9th most in the FBS, while its 3 interception returns for a touchdown are the 3rd most in the FBS.
- Navy's opponents have fumbled 15 times this year, tied for the 7th most in the FBS, yet the Mids have been very unlucky in recovering just 4 (T45th in FBS).
- Navy is 2nd nationally in turnover margin at +2.0 per game.
- Navy is 1 of 4 teams that has yet to lose a fumble this year and the Mids' 2 total turnovers are tied for the 2nd fewest in the country. Navy's 2 interceptions thrown stand tied for 8th.
- Navy's defense came up with 2 turnovers in the 2024 opener against Bucknell, both on forced fumbles, and then forced 3 turnovers against Temple (1 FR, 2 INTs). Navy got 1 turnover against Memphis (INT), 2 against UAB (2 INTs), 1 against Air Force (INT) and 5 against Charlotte (1 FR, 4 INTs).
- The 14 turnovers Navy's defense has come up with this year are the 14th most in the FBS.

RAMOS IS A TACKLING MACHINE

- A 2023 First-Team All-AAC selection and First-Team All-East, **Colin Ramos** (Sr. / LB) had a big day against Air Force last year, recording 11 tackles, 1 sack and 1 tackle for loss. For his play, he was selected to the Pro Football Focus (PFF) Defensive Team of the Week.
- He came back with a then season-high 12 tackles, a tackle for loss, a forced fumble and a quarterback hurry against Temple.
- He earned AAC Defensive Player of the Week honors after equalling his season high with 12 tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup against UAB.
- He earned AAC Defensive Player of the Week honors for a second-consecutive week after posting his fourth-straight double-digit tackle game, coming up with 10 stops and 1.5 tackles for loss against ECU.
- He registered a career-high 16 tackles and a tackle for a loss against Army.
- Ramos led Navy in tackles with 110, while recording 9 tackles for loss, 4 pass breakups, 2 sacks, 2 forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. He was twice named AAC Defensive Player of the Week for his performances against UAB (12 tackles, a sack, a TFL and a pass breakup) and ECU (10 tackles, 1.5 TFL).
- He also spearheaded a defense that recorded 3 shutouts, which tied for the most in the country with Penn State and tied for the most in school history.
- His 110 tackles were the most by a Navy player since Cody Peterson recorded 142 in 2013.
- Ramos recorded a team-high tying 10 tackles in Navy's 49-21 victory over Bucknell in the 2024 season opener and followed up with 15 tackles in Navy's 38-11 win over Temple.
- He received Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week, the Bronko Nagurski Trophy National Player of the Week, the Lott Impact Trophy Player of the Week and AAC Defensive Player of the Week accolades after posting a career-high 20 tackles, Navy's only sack, Navy's only 2 tackles for loss and broke up a pass in the end zone that kept Memphis off the scoreboard in the Mids' 56-44 victory over No. 23 Memphis. The 20 tackles are the most by any player in the FBS this year.
- Ramos had 6 tackles and 2 tackles for a loss at UAB, while posting 12 tackles and a tackle for loss against Charlotte.
- Ramos, a quarterfinalist for the Lott IMPACT Award, is averaging 11.3 tackles per game, which is tied for the 5th most in the country.

THE LANE TRAIN

- If you ask the Navy coaches to point out the best player on the field for the Mids, more often than not they would point to **Rayuan Lane III (Sr. / S)**.
- As a freshman, Lane III finished with 37 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, 4 pass breakups, an interception and forced a fumble.
- As a sophomore, he finished third on the team in tackles (71) and pass breakups (4). He also forced 2 fumbles, recovered 2 fumbles, recorded 2.5 tackles for loss and had a sack.
- Last fall, Lane III garnered Third-Team All-AAC accolades and was named All-East after posting 66 tackles (3rd on the team), 3 tackles for loss, 1/2 sack, accounted for 4 of Navy's 10 interceptions (entered 2023 with 1 career INT), had a team-best 8 pass breakups (entered 2023 with 8-career PBUs), a fumble recovery and 2 forced fumbles. He returned an interception against UAB 97-yards for a touchdown, which was the longest interception return in Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium history, the 2nd longest in Navy history, the 2nd longest in AAC history and tied for the 6th longest play in school history.
- In the 2023 season opener against Notre Dame, Lane III made 5 tackles, breaking up 2 passes and causing a fumble.
- Against Wagner, he recorded 4 tackles, broke up 2 passes, picked off a pass and assisted on a tackle for loss.
- At Memphis, Lane III had 6 tackles, an interception that gave Navy a chance to win the game and broke up 2 passes.
- Against USF he had 6 tackles and a forced fumble.
- Against North Texas, he had 6 tackles and a half sack.
- At Charlotte, he had 4 tackles, a tackle for loss, an interception and a pass breakup.
- Against Air Force, he had 7 tackles, 0.5 tackles for loss and forced a fumble that was recovered by **Dashaun Peele (Jr. / CB)**. It was his 5th-career forced fumble.
- Against UAB, Lane III had 5 tackles and a 97-yard interception return for a touchdown.
- He had 7 tackles and 0.5 tackles for loss in Navy's shutout of ECU.
- His 4 interceptions in 2023 tied with Peele for the team lead.
- He had his first interception of 2024 against Memphis. Lane III stepped in front of a Seth Henigan pass with 45 seconds remaining and Navy up 5 points and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown in Navy's 56-44 upset over preseason favorite and the No. 23 Tigers. It was Lane's second-career interception returned for a touchdown which is tied for the second most in school history. It was also the fifth-longest interception return in school history.
- Against UAB, Lane III recorded a career-high 12 tackles, had half a tackle for loss, broke up a pass and had 2 forced fumbles in Navy's 41-18 win.
- Lane III recorded 9 tackles, forced a fumble and picked off a pass in Navy's 51-17 victory over Charlotte.
- He is tied for 3rd in the country in fumbles forced per game (0.5) and 4th in interceptions returned for a touchdown (1).
- He has started 36-consecutive games at safety, the longest active streak in the FBS for a safety and the 2nd longest by any player in the secondary.
- Lane III is rated as the 7th-best safety in the FBS by Pro Football Focus.
- He was named a Midseason All-American by The Sporting News along with Xavier Watts of Notre Dame.

CAMPBELL BECOMING A PLAYMAKER

- **Jaxson Campbell (Jr. / Striker)** has been impressive this fall in his first stint as a starter (QB in high school, recruited as a WR, moved to safety before finally finding a home at striker).
- Against Bucknell, in his first-career start, he tied for the team lead in tackles with a career-high 10, while also recording 1.5 tackles for loss, a 1/2 sack and a pass breakup.
- Against Temple, Campbell had 5 tackles, his first-career interception, broke up another pass and had a QB hurry.
- Campbell equalled his career high in tackles against Memphis with 10.
- Campbell was named the American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his performance against Air Force as he had 7 tackles, 2 sacks and broke up a pass in Navy's 34-7 win over Air Force.

PIRRIS THE PLAYMAKER

- **Luke Pirris (Jr. / Raider)** earned his first real playing time in 2023 against USF after **Jordan Sanders (Sr.)** left with an injury. Once he got his chance, he made numerous big-time plays.
- Against USF, Pirris made 6 tackles, had a sack, recorded 2.5 tackles for loss, recovered a fumble and broke up 2 passes.
- He made his first-career start in the win over North Texas and garnered AAC Defensive Player of the Week recognition after finishing with a career-high 9 tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery that set up Navy's game-winning score.
- Against Charlotte, he made 8 tackles, recorded a sack and broke up a pass in Navy's win over the 49ers.
- He had 4 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss against Air Force, while against Temple he had 5 tackles and a fumble recovery.
- He had 7 tackles, 1.5 TFL and 0.5 sacks against UAB.
- He had 6 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss, in Navy's shutout of East Carolina.
- Pirris had 9 tackles, a sack and a tackle for loss against Army.
- Pirris and teammate **Justin Reed (Sr. / DE)** tied for 6th in the nation in fumble recoveries with 3.
- Despite not playing much until the USF game, Pirris led the team in tackles for loss (10) and tied for the team lead in sacks (4.5).
- Pirris picked right up where he left off from last year in the season opener, recording 8 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in Navy's 49-21 win over Bucknell.
- Pirris had 7 tackles and 3 quarterback hurries in Navy's upset win over Memphis.
- He had 6 tackles and a tackle for loss against Charlotte.

NAVY'S OWN NIGERIAN NIGHTMARE

- The most famous football player of Nigerian descent is undoubtedly Christian Okoye, dubbed the Nigerian Nightmare for his punishing running style. His six-season NFL career produced an NFL rushing champion title in 1989, First-Team All-Pro honors in 1989, Second-Team All-Pro honors in 1991, 2 Pro Bowl appearances (1989, 1991) and 3 playoff appearances.
- Navy has its own Nigerian Nightmare in sophomore corner **Ira** (full first name is Irabonise) **Oniha** who burst onto the scene against Temple in what was his second-career start.
- Oniha was all over the place against the Owls, recording 6 tackles, a tackle for loss, a forced fumble and a pass breakup. His forced fumble caused Temple to lose a first down on a 3rd down pass play, while his pass breakup was in the end zone, saving a touchdown.
- Oniha was born in Baltimore to Nigerian parents (Ogbeide and Gloria) and attended elementary school and a year of middle school in the U.S. His family returned to Nigeria where he attended 2 years of middle school before returning to Maryland for his high school education.
- Oniha is the second born of quadruplets. His brothers Osezonoria (oldest) and Oseiokuemen (youngest) and sister Obehiaghe attend UMBC in Baltimore.
- Oniha was injured in practice the week of the Memphis game and missed 3 games, however he was back for the Charlotte game.

DON'T FORGET ABOUT DASHAUN

- **Dashaun Peele** (Sr. / CB) has shown a nose for the ball over his career, picking off 8 passes in 22 games, including 4 in 2023, which tied **Rayuan Lane III** (Sr. / S) for the most on the team.
- An Honorable Mention All-AAC selection, Peele intercepted a pass in 4 of Navy's last 7 games of the 2023 season (Charlotte, Temple, UAB and ECU). He also had 4 pass breakups and a fumble recovery.
- Peele had 8 tackles and broke up 2 passes in Navy's win over AAC preseason favorite Memphis this fall.
- He had a tackle for a loss and his 1st interceptoin of the year in Navy's 34-7 win over Air Force.
- Peele garnered AAC Defensive Player of the Week honors after picking off his 2nd and 3rd passes of the year in Navy's 51-17 rout of Charlotte. He became the first player in school history and second in AAC history to return 2 interceptions for a touchdown in the same game. He returned his 1st interception 61 yards for a touchdown and returned his 2nd interception 84 yards for a touchdown.
- The 2 interception returns for a touchdown are also tied for the most in school history for a single season and tied for the 2nd most in a career. His 145 return yards also broke a school record.
- Peele is 9th in the country in interceptions per game (0.5 / 3 INTs in 6 gms). His 2 interception returns for a touchdown are tied for the most in the FBS.

ROBINSON NAMED 2024 ADMIRAL MACK AWARD WINNER

- **Landon Robinson** (Jr. / NG) was named the 2024 Admiral Mack Award winner as the most improved player during spring drills as voted on by the coaching staff.
- This is the 2nd-consecutive year a defensive lineman has won the award, as **Justin Reed** (Sr. / DE) earned the award last year. Robinson is the first true nose guard to win the Admiral Mack Award since Bernie Sarra in 2013 and just the 3rd ever.
- The Vice Admiral William P. Mack Award was established in 1976 and is named in honor of Vice Admiral Mack, the Naval Academy Superintendent from 1972-75, who was a strong supporter of the school's intercollegiate athletic program.
- Robinson had a standout sophomore campaign backing up Donald Berniard Jr. at nose where he finished with 28 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 4 sacks. His 4 sacks were the 3rd most on the team behind Reed and **Luke Pirris**, (Jr. / Raider) who recorded 4.5 sacks apiece.
- Robinson was also 1 of just 13 defensive linemen and the only nose guard in the Football Bowl Subdivision to play on the kickoff team last fall.

MCMAHON TO WEAR NO. 68 IN MEMORY OF DAVID FORNEY

- **Connor McMahon** (Sr. / OT) has the honor of wearing jersey No. 68 this season in memory of former Navy offensive lineman David Forney.
- Forney, who was a senior offensive lineman on the 2019 team, died on Feb. 20, 2020, after being found unresponsive in Bancroft Hall. He was 22 years old. Forney was a 3-year varsity letter winner for the Mids and played in 39-consecutive games over his final 3 seasons.
- In 2019, Forney started all 13 games at guard and was the anchor of an offensive line that set a school record and led the nation in rushing, averaging 360.5 yards per game. Forney was extremely proud of being part of a senior class that authored the second-greatest turnaround in the history of FBS football as the Mids won a school-record tying 11 games, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, shared the American Athletic Conference West Division title and won the Liberty Bowl. Forney was named First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and First-Team All-East.
- In 2020, Navy honored Forney by wearing a sticker on the back of its helmets that pictured him running out of the tunnel at the 2019 Army-Navy game carrying the American flag with the word Brotherhood underneath. Additionally, Navy did not issue jersey No. 68 until the Army-Navy game when starting offensive lineman Billy Honaker wore it to honor his friend.
- At the start of the 2021 season it was determined that a senior offensive lineman would be assigned No. 68 each year to remember Forney. Pierce Banbury (C / OG) was the first to be tabbed with the honor, followed by Kip Frankland (OT) in 2022 and Lirion Murtezi (C) in 2023.

- McMahon is a returning starter for the Mids at offensive tackle and has started 23-straight contests despite battling injuries. His success also carries over to the classroom where he earned College Sports Communicators Academic All-District honors last year.
- A native of Walkersville, Md. and a 2015 graduate of Georgetown Prep, Forney is survived by his parents, Rick and Erika Forney, younger brothers, Chris and Erik, and sister, Rebekah.
- Forney, who was a member of the ninth company at the Naval Academy and a political science major, would have graduated on May 22, 2020. He was due to serve as a cryptologic warfare officer.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Navy ranks 22nd in the nation in kickoff returns, averaging 24.4 yards per return.
- **Isaiah Bryant** (So. / Snipe) ranks 19th in the country in kickoff returns, averaging 24.6 yards per return.

RIETHMAN ON PACE TO SET SCHOOL PUNTING RECORD

- **Riley Riethman's** (Sr. / P) 43.9 career punting average (194 punts, 8,513 yards) is the best in school history (min. 50 attempts).
- He owns 3 of the 5-best single-game performances in Navy history (min. of 5 punts), averaging 50.8 yards per punt against SMU in 2023 and 50.6 yards per punt against Notre Dame in 2021 and against Air Force in 2024.
- Riethman averaged 42.7 yards per punt as a freshman.
- He followed that up by averaging 43.8 yards per punt as a sophomore, which is tied for the third-best average in school history.
- Riethman, a 2023 First-Team All-AAC and All-East selection, averaged 44.8 yards per punt last season, which tied John Skaggs for Navy single-season record.
- His 68-yard punt against Air Force last year was a career long.
- Riethman was named to the Ray Guy Award Great 8 weekly honor roll 3 times in 2023 (Wagner, Memphis, Air Force) and once so far in 2024 (Air Force).
- Riethman is averaging 43.3 yards per punt in 2024, with 11 of his 25 punts being downed inside the 20.

GOLD MEDAL IN THE FAMILY

- The sister of Navy's **Chreign LaFond** (Jr. / DE) won the gold medal in the triple jump at the 2024 Paris Summer Olympics.
- Thea LaFond-Gadson, competing in her 3rd Olympics for the country of Dominica, won the gold with a leap of 15.01 meters. It was the first Olympic medal of any kind won by the small country in the Eastern Caribbean Sea.
- LaFond entered the fall second on the depth chart at defensive end after appearing in 7 games as a sophomore, making 2 tackles.

THE FEW, THE PROUD

- Navy has 3 former Navy football players on its staff, including 2 on the coaching staff. All 3 either served in the Marine Corps or are currently serving in the Marine Corps.
- Cornerbacks coach **Robert Green** is a 1998 graduate of the Naval Academy and was a 4-year letter winner at cornerback. He served 20 years in the Marine Corps and retired as a Lt. Col. He's in his 12th season with the program.
- Wide receivers coach **Mick Yokitis** is a 2006 grad and was a three-year letterwinner as a wide receiver for the Mids. Yokitis served in the Marine Corps before being medically discharged. He is in his 14th year with the program.
- Director of Player Development **Capt. Brandon Jones** is a 2018 graduate of the Naval Academy and is an active duty Marine. Jones played inside and outside linebacker at Navy and earned four varsity letters. He is in his 1st year with the program.

GLADCHUK A MEMBER OF THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF COMMITTEE

- The College Football Playoff (CFP) Management Committee appointed Navy athletic director Chet Gladchuk to the CFP Selection Committee in 2022.
- Gladchuk is in his 24th year as Director of Athletics at the Naval Academy. He arrived in Annapolis in 2001 from Houston, where he had been the Director of Athletics for four years. He is the current longest tenured athletic director in the FBS.
- Before Houston, Gladchuk led his alma mater, Boston College, as its the Director of Athletics, Intramurals and Recreation for 7 years. Prior to rejoining Boston College, he served as Director of Athletics at Tulane from 1987-90 after a 1985-87 stint as an Associate AD at Syracuse.
- Gladchuk lettered in football at Boston College and after graduating went on to earn a master's degree from Massachusetts-Amherst, where he began his career in intercollegiate athletics. He also had served as Director of Athletics and head football coach for the New Hampton (Prep) School in New Hampshire prior to leaving for UMass.

CRONIC NAMED OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

- Head football coach Brian Newberry announced on Jan. 10 that Drew Cronic has joined the staff as offensive coordinator. Cronic came to Navy from Mercer where he put together a 28-17 (.622) record over the last four years, including a 22-10 (.688) mark in the rugged Southern Conference.
- A native of Sharpsburg, Ga., Cronic is considered one of the more innovative offensive minds across all levels of college football. Driven by the motto "Raise the Bar," he has been a head coach for a combined 8 years at 3 different schools and has compiled a career record of 75-23 (.765) while also handling offensive coordinator duties that featured variations of the option offense.
- Cronic led Mercer to an historic 9-4 record in 2023, including a 6-2 mark in the Southern Conference. The 9 wins are the most against Div. I opponents in the 50-year history of the program, while the team earned an FCS playoff berth for the first time in school history. The 6-2 conference mark tied Cronic's 2021 team for the most Southern Conference wins in school history.
- The Bears defeated Gardner-Webb 17-7 in the first round of the FCS playoffs before falling to eventual National Champion South Dakota State in the second round. Mercer finished the year ranked No. 20 in the AFCA Coaches Poll, one of three Southern Conference teams that were ranked in the final poll.
- In 2022, Mercer (7-4, 5-3 SoCon) reached its highest AFCA FCS Coaches Poll ranking in school history at No. 11 thanks to its most explosive and potent offense in program history, as the Bears averaged 38.2 points per game.
- In 2021, Mercer finished 7-3 and 6-2 in the conference, losing to East Tennessee State 38-35 in the final regular-season game of the year that determined the Southern Conference champion. Mercer finished the season ranked No. 21 in the STATS Perform Poll while averaging 31.7 points per game.
- Cronic's first season at Mercer was supposed to be in the fall of 2020, but was pushed to the spring of 2021 due to COVID. Cronic led the Bears to their best Southern Conference season since joining the conference with five league wins, including three over ranked foes. Cronic's squad defeated No. 9 Chattanooga (35-28), No. 17 Furman (26-14) and No. 20 East Tennessee State (21-13) over three-consecutive weeks.
- Cronic engineered one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football at Lenoir-Rhyne, taking a team that went 3-8 the year before he got there to a 25-3 record over his two seasons at the helm (12-2 in 2018 and 13-1 in 2019).
- Cronic was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year in 2018, as he led the Bears to the sixth-best turnaround in Division II history and past the first round of the Div. II playoffs for just the second time in school history.
- Cronic was the offensive coordinator at Furman in 2017, as his offense led the Paladins to the second round of the FCS playoffs, averaging 34 points per game.
- Before his stint at Furman, Cronic coached at Reinhardt from 2012-16 and was instrumental in the startup of the program. For the first-three seasons, he served as assistant head coach, offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator before being named the head coach prior to the 2015 campaign.
- Cronic directed Reinhardt to a nine-win season in 2015 before a record-breaking year in 2016, as the Eagles went 13-1, won the Mid-South Conference Championship and advanced to the NAIA National Quarterfinals. Reinhardt averaged 51.1 points per contest and totaled 550.6 yards of offense per game, ranking first in the nation in both categories.
 - The Eagles led the nation in rushing offense (360.0 ypg) and rushing touchdowns (71), while having the nation's second-highest passing efficiency (178.0) to go along with 25 touchdown passes.
- Cronic was twice named the Mid-South Conference West Division Coach of the Year and the AFCA NAIA Region I Coach of the Year.
- Cronic's first stint at Furman lasted 9 years (2002-10) as he served in several coaching roles including wide receivers, running backs, tight ends and recruiting coordinator. During his time there, the Paladins won a Southern Conference title in 2004 and put together an 11-3 season in 2005, which

ended with a trip to the national semifinals.

- In 1999, Cronic began his coaching career after graduate school at James Madison where he served three seasons as receivers coach and assistant recruiting coordinator. The Dukes won the Atlantic 10 Championship in his first year and earned a bid to the FCS Playoffs.
- Cronic played quarterback for his father, Danny Cronic, at East Coweta High School before playing collegiately at Georgia. As a Bulldog, Cronic played wide receiver and was a member of the special teams, lettering twice and participating in the 1995 Peach Bowl and 1997 Outback Bowl.

NAVY RETIRES JERSEYS OF RON BEAGLE AND BOB REIFSNYDER

- Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk retired the jerseys of wide receiver Ron Beagle ('56) and tackle Bob Reifsnnyder ('59) at halftime of the Bucknell game. Beagle and Reifsnnyder represent two of the best from the 1950s, a highly-successful era of football excellence that saw Navy post winning records in 8 of the 10 years, win the Sugar Bowl and Cotton Bowl and post a dominant record against Army.
- Beagle was named a First-Team All-American in 1954 and 1955 (unanimous) and led Navy to a combined 18-7-3 record in his three seasons (1953-55).
- As a junior in 1954, he led Navy to an 8-2 record as the Mids defeated a favored Army team that had four All-Americans (27-20) and shut out SEC Champion Ole Miss (21-0) in the Sugar Bowl. It was Navy's first bowl game in 31 years as the Mids, dubbed the Team Named Desire, finished No. 5 in the country in the Associated Press poll.
- At the conclusion of the 1954 season, Beagle was named Navy's first winner of the Maxwell Award, which is awarded to the outstanding college football player in the nation as presented by the Maxwell Football Club of Philadelphia.
- As a senior, Beagle, who wore No. 80, helped lead Navy to a final ranking of No. 18 in the Associated Press poll. In addition to being selected a unanimous All-American, he finished seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting.
- In 1986, Beagle, who ironically played at the same high school as Navy's 1963 Heisman Trophy and Maxwell Award winner Roger Staubach (Cincinnati Purcell Marian), was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame by the National Football Foundation.
- Reifsnnyder, a 1959 graduate of the Naval Academy, led the Mids to a 15-2-3 record in his two seasons of play as Navy finished 6-1-2 in 1956 and 9-1-1 in 1957.
- In 1957, Navy won the Lambert Trophy as the best team in the East, knocking off No. 5 Notre Dame (20-6), No. 10 Army (14-0) and handling the Southwest Conference champion, No. 8 Rice, 20-7 in the Cotton Bowl. The Mids finished No. 5 in the country in the Associated Press poll.
- Reifsnnyder, who wore No. 58, was named a First-Team All-American after the 1957 season at both center and tackle and was named the College Lineman of the Year by the Philadelphia Sportswriters Association. He was also recognized as the nation's best player by the Maxwell Football Club, joining Beagle, Staubach and 1960 Heisman Trophy winner Joe Bellino as the only four Maxwell Award winners from Navy. Reifsnnyder was the first guard or tackle to win the Maxwell Award and one of only four interior linemen to be recognized for this prestigious award.
- The 1956 Navy team, led by Reifsnnyder who started at both offensive tackle and defensive tackle, finished with a 6-1-2 record which included a 33-7 win over Notre Dame and a final national ranking of No. 16 by the Associated Press.
- Reifsnnyder was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1997 by the National Football Foundation.
- Although the jerseys of both Beagle and Reifsnnyder will be retired, Navy will keep their numbers in circulation.
- Co-Captains **Daba Fofana** and **Colin Ramos** will wear patches on their jerseys in recognition of these two Navy football legends.

NAVY SETS STADIUM ATTENDANCE MARK LAST YEAR AGAINST AIR FORCE

- Last fall, Navy drew a Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium-record crowd of 38,803 for the Air Force game.
- The previous record was 38,792 against Air Force in 2017.

FIVE MIDS EARN ALL-EAST RECOGNITION IN 2023

- Navy had 5 football players named to the 2023 FBS All-East Team by the East Coast Athletic Conference. Four of the 5 selections will return for the 2024 season.
- Players from the following FBS schools are eligible for All-East honors - Army, Boston College, UConn, James Madison, UMass, Navy, Rutgers, Penn State, Syracuse and Temple.
- Navy's 5 selections tied James Madison and Penn State for the most.
- The Mids had 3 players on defense - Will Harbour (Sr. / LB), **Colin Ramos** (Jr. / LB) and **Rayuan Lane III** (Jr. / S), 1 on offense - **Alex Tecza** (So. / FB) and 1 on special teams - **Riley Riethman** (Jr. / P).

RAMOS, RIETHMAN NAMED FIRST-TEAM ALL-AAC IN 2023

- **Colin Ramos** (Jr. / LB) and **Riley Riethman** (Jr. / P) were named First-Team All-American Athletic Conference by the league's coaches, while **Rayuan Lane III** (Jr. / S) was named to the 3rd team and **Alex Tecza** (So. / FB), **Dashaun Peele** (Jr / CB) and Will Harbour (Sr. / LB) were named honorable mention.
- Ramos led Navy in tackles with 110, while recording 9 tackles for loss, 4 pass breakups, 2 sacks, 2 forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. He was twice named AAC Defensive Player of the Week for his performances against UAB (12 tackles, a sack, a TFL and a pass breakup) and ECU (10 tackles, 1.5 TFL). Ramos spearheaded a defense that recorded a nation's best (tied) 3 shutouts. His 110 tackles are the most by a Navy player since Cody Peterson recorded 142 in 2013.
- Riethman was a tremendous weapon for the Mids, averaging a school-record tying 44.8 yards per punt on his 80 punts. He had a career-long 68-yard punt against Air Force and his 50.8 yard average against SMU was the second-best single-game average in school history. He was named to the Ray Guy Award Great 8 weekly honor roll 3 times in 2023.
- Lane III consistently made big plays at safety for the Mids, coming up with 66 tackles, 3 tackles for a loss, 0.5 sacks, 4 interceptions, 8 pass break-ups, a fumble recovery and 2 forced fumbles. His 4 interceptions tied with Peele for the team lead and were the 17th most in the country. His 97-yard interception return for a touchdown against UAB was the longest in stadium history, the second-longest in school history and the sixth-longest play in school history.
- Tecza had a sensational sophomore campaign, leading the Mids in rushing with 758 yards and 5 touchdowns on 126 carries. He had a career-high 163 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries against Memphis in the AAC opener, including a career-long 75 yard run.
- Harbour teamed up with Ramos to lead the Navy defense. He finished 2nd on the team in tackles with 84, tied for 3rd in tackles for loss (7.5) and tied for 4th in sacks (3). He had a career-high 11 tackles against USF and Charlotte.
- Peele showed a nose for the ball on defense, picking off 4 passes in the last 7 games to go along with 5 pass breakups and a fumble recovery. He has 5 interceptions in 16-career games and his 4 interceptions in 2023 were tied with Lane III for the 17th most in the country.

NAVY FANS TUNING IN IN 2023

- For the second year in a row, Navy was one of the top 30 watched schools when it comes to average viewers per game on television and the only team in the Top 30 that is not in an autonomy 5 conference.

NAVY NAMED ONE OF THE TOP 11 SPORTS INFORMATION OFFICES IN THE COUNTRY

- The Navy Sports Information Office was named one of the Top 11 Sports Information Offices in the country by the Football Writers Association of America for the 2023 season it was announced by the FWAA. It's the 7th time Navy has been honored, including the 5th time in the last 6 years. Only Clemson (11) and Colorado (10) have been honored more than Navy.
- Two first-time winners and 9 previous ones comprised the 15th Super 11 Awards, presented annually by the FWAA to the best performing College Sports Communications departments in the Football Bowl Subdivision.
- In addition to the departmental awards, the FWAA presented a Super 11 Coach of the Year Award to Mike Norvell of Florida State. Norvell has granted outstanding access to his programs over the years. He is the 6th head coach to win this award and it comes in a season in which he won the ACC title in an undefeated regular season.
- The Super 11 Award is a record 11th for Clemson and its staff led by Ross Taylor, Assistant Athletic Director for Football Communications. Nebraska and its staff led by Keith Mann, Associate Athletic Director for Communications, earned its 10th. Other awards with their CSC directors and their staffs went to Navy (Scott Strasemeier) for the 7th time, Kansas State (Ryan Lackey) and Pitt (E.J. Borghetti) each a 6th time, Kentucky (Susan Lax) and Oklahoma (Mike Houck) a 3rd time and BYU (Brett Pyne) and Cal (Kyle McRae) a 2nd time. The first-time recipients were Illinois (Brett Moore) and LSU (Michael Bonnette).
- The 2023 winners were deemed to have had excellent accessibility during the week of their games and after the game with a program's players, coaches and coordinators/assistant coaches. Other criteria include beat reporter access, interview requests and decorum and protocols in the press box and locker room.
- "We once again honor some programs who have provided

great assistance to writers for many years and have demonstrated a culture of excellence in what they do in their press box in terms of accessibility to players and coaches," said FWAA Executive Director Steve Richardson. "We applaud those programs as well as the two newcomer programs."

- "I want to thank these departments for fostering a welcoming environment and providing terrific access, allowing us to tell the stories that are informative and insightful," said 2024 FWAA President Andrea Adelson of ESPN.com. "Rather than limit our access, they understand providing more than just a fleeting glimpse into their programs is a service not only to their players and coaches but to their respective fan bases as well."
- FWAA members provided input during the season when press boxes were judged on how well they were run and maintained in terms of neutrality, pool reporters, noise level and accessibility to the press box that could affect a media person's ability to do his or her job.
- In January of 2009, the FWAA released the first Super 11 Awards – a concept supported by the College Sports Communicators (formerly CoSIDA).
- Founded in 1941, the Football Writers Association of America consists of journalists, broadcasters, publicists, photographers and key executives in all areas of college football. The FWAA works to govern media access and game-day operations while presenting awards and honors, including an annual FWAA All-America Team.

SCOUTING NOTRE DAME

6-1 Overall
Head Coach: Marcus Freeman

- Notre Dame enters Saturday's game on a 5-game winning streak and ranked 12th in the country in the Associated Press poll.
- Notre Dame has just 15 transfers on its roster, the fewest of any team on Navy's schedule outside of Air Force and Army.
- The Notre Dame rushing attack is led by sophomore running back Jeremiah Love (77 carries, 462 yds, 7 TDs) and senior quarterback and Duke transfer Riley Leonard (75 carries, 456 yds, 10 TDs). Notre Dame is ranked 18th in the country in rushing, averaging 209.6 yards per game. Leonard's 10 rushing touchdowns are tied with Navy's Blake Horvath for the 10th most in the country.
- Leonard has completed 118 of his 177 passes for 1,182 yards and 6 touchdowns with just 3 interceptions. The 3 interceptions are the 14th fewest in the FBS as a team. Leonard's .667 completion percentage is 23rd best in the FBS.
- Graduate student and Clemson transfer Beaux Collins is Leonard's favorite target with 26 catches for 317 yards and a touchdown, while sophomore wide receiver Jaden Greathouse has 17 catches for 202 yards and a touchdown.
- The Notre Dame defense is led by sophomore linebacker Drayk Bowen (38 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, 1 sack, 1 forced fumble) and graduate student linebacker Jack Kiser (34 tackles). Graduate student safety Xavier Watts is one of the best safeties in the country. His 1.3 passes defended per game rank 8th in the country, while his 3 interceptions are tied with Navy's Dashaun Peele for the 9th most in the country.
- The Notre Dame defense is giving up just 11.9 points per game, ranked 5th best in the country, and allowing just 279

yards per game, which stands 10th. Notre Dame also ranks 11th in the country in third down defense (.292), 12th in first downs allowed (107) and its 9 interceptions rank 10th. Notre Dame's red zone defense is 17th nationally (.733), while its team pass efficiency defense is sixth best (96.77). The Irish are giving up just 165.9 passing yards per game, which ranks 12th in the country.

- The Irish are dangerous on special teams, ranking 5th in the nation with 3 blocked kicks and 21st in kickoff return defense (16.2). Freshman defensive lineman Bryce Young has 2 of the 3 blocks.

NAVY HEAD COACH BRIAN NEWBERRY

6TH SEASON AT NAVY | 2ND SEASON AS HEAD COACH



• Brian Newberry is in his 6th year at the Naval Academy and his 2nd as the head coach.
• In his 1st year as head coach, he led Navy to a 5-7 record, including a 4-4 mark in the American Athletic Conference. Navy, picked 9th in the preseason poll by the league's coaches, finished tied for 5th in the AAC.

- The five wins were the most by a Navy team since 2019, while five of Navy's seven losses came at the hands of a team that played in a bowl game including two teams that finished in the Top 25 (Notre Dame at #14 and SMU at #22).
- The Mids had 6 players named to All-American Athletic Conference teams, including first-team selections Colin Ramos (Jr. / LB) and Riley Riethman (Jr. / P).
- The 2023 season was highlighted by a defense that was one of only two in the FBS to record three shutouts (Penn State was the other).
- Navy's defense also finished second in the nation in fumbles recovered (14), third in the country in red zone defense (allowed opponents to score just 72% of the time), fourth in the country in turnover margin (+0.92) and 19th in the country in stop rate (71.3%).
- Newberry was named head coach on Dec. 19, 2022, by Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk. Newberry had served as the Mids' defensive coordinator the previous four seasons.
- As a defensive coordinator, Newberry directed some of the top defensive units in school history.
- Navy finished third in the nation against the run in 2022 (88.9 yards per game), which is even more impressive when you consider it was the only defense ranked in the top 25 that faced three of the top-10 rushing offenses in the country (#1 Air Force, #2 Army and #9 UCF). Navy also finished third nationally in fewest first downs allowed (187), 23rd in sacks (2.8 per game), 22nd in fumbles recovered (11) and 32nd in total defense (339.0 yards per game).
- Senior striker John Marshall finished tied for third in the nation in sacks (0.9 per game) and tackles for a loss per game (1.6), while setting school records for sacks in a season (11) and game (4). Marshall was the only unanimous First-Team All-American Athletic Conference selection in 2022 and he was also named the ECAC Defensive Player of the Year.
- In 2021, the Navy defense acquitted itself well by finishing 32nd in the nation in rushing defense, 34th in total defense and 34th in red zone defense. Linebacker Diego Fagot was distinguished with All-American honors, First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and was named All-East. Fagot was also named MVP of the East-West Shrine All-Star Game.
- In 2020, after a slow start due to COVID, the defense finished the year with a flurry, holding Memphis, Tulsa and Army to under 300 yards of total offense. It was the first time a Navy defense had achieved that feat since 1997.
- In 2019, Newberry's first year on the job, Navy made massive improvements on the defensive side of the football. Navy ranked 20th in third down defense (121st in 2018), 10th in rushing defense (90th in 2018), 39th in passing defense (75th in 2018), 16th in total defense (86th in 2018) and 34th in scoring defense (103rd in 2018).
- Newberry, a semifinalist for the Broyles Award, presented annually to the best assistant coach in college football, and his defensive staff installed a "Get 6" culture within the Navy defense that took off. Newberry told the defensive players if they got a combination of six three-and-outs, fourth down stops, turnovers and defensive touchdowns in a game, the Mids would win. In 2019, Navy was 8-0 when it managed to "Get 6."

- The Mids finished 10th in the nation against the run despite facing the #2, #3 and #11 rushing offenses in the country. Navy forced the opposing offense off the field in three plays or less in 36 percent of its drives, which was the 10th-best average in the country. The Navy defense gave up just 15.2 first downs per game, which was tied for third best in the country. Safeties Evan Fochtman and Kevin Brennan were named First-Team All-East.
- Prior to his arrival in Annapolis, Newberry served as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kennesaw State from 2015-18, leading the Owls to the FCS quarterfinals in each of his last two seasons.
- Newberry joined the Kennesaw State coaching staff after spending the 2012 season as defensive coordinator at Northern Michigan.
- Prior to his one season at Northern Michigan, Newberry served as defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at the University of the South in Seawee, Tenn., in 2011 where the Tigers improved their scoring defense by 16 points per game and total defense by 85 yards a contest.
- Newberry's coaching experience also includes four seasons (2007-10) as defensive backs coach at Elon and five years (2004-06, 2001 and 2002) as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach at Washington & Lee. He also served as a graduate assistant/defensive line coach at Rice during the spring of 2004, spent one season as an assistant defensive backs coach at Lehigh in 2003 and began his coaching career at Southern Arkansas where he was a graduate assistant coaching the defensive backs and wide receivers in 1999 and 2000.
- In 2004, Newberry's Washington & Lee defense produced a school-record 43 sacks and ranked among the Division III leaders in rushing defense. The Generals' defense led the Old Dominion Athletic Conference in pass defense, rush defense and scoring defense in 2005 and in 2006, Washington & Lee forced 30 turnovers and ranked among the nation's leaders in pass defense.
- Newberry played collegiately at Baylor and graduated in 1998 with a Bachelor of Science in education. He helped lead the Bears to the Southwest Conference Co-Championship and an appearance in the 1994 Alamo Bowl, as well as a No. 5 national ranking in total defense in 1995.

SIGNIFICANT MOMENTS IN NAVY-MARINE CORPS MEMORIAL STADIUM HISTORY

- Sept. 26, 1959** – Navy defeats William & Mary 29-2 in the first game played at the stadium.
- Sept. 24, 1960** – President Eisenhower watches as the Midshipmen defeat Villanova 41-7.
- Nov. 12, 1960** – Heisman Trophy winner Joe Bellino of Navy sets a school record by scoring four touchdowns in a 41-6 win over Virginia.
- Oct. 26, 1963** – Heisman Trophy winner Roger Staubach leads the Mids to a 24-12 win over unbeaten Pittsburgh by completing 14-of-19 passes, seven to Jim Campbell.
- Sept. 23, 1967** – Navy receiver Rob Taylor sets school records for most catches (10) and most yards receiving (140) in a game, as Navy beats Penn State 23-22 when Taylor catches a 16-yard TD pass with 57 seconds left.
- Nov. 12, 1977** – Navy beats Georgia Tech 20-12 as Naval Academy alumnus President Jimmy Carter watches.
- Sept. 12, 1981** – Navy defeats The Citadel for its 500th all-time win.
- Nov. 7, 1981** – Eddie Meyers sets a Navy record for most rushing yardage in a game with 298 yards and four touchdowns in the Mids' 35-23 win over Syracuse.
- Nov. 17, 1984** – Navy defeats second-ranked South Carolina 38-21 in one of the biggest upsets ever for the Mids. It marks only the third time Navy has beaten an opponent ranked this high.
- Sept. 22, 1990** – Alton Grizzard becomes Navy's all-time career total offense leader in a 23-21 win over Villanova.
- Oct. 5, 1996** – The Mids explode for 64 points to top Duke 64-27 on Homecoming.
- Nov. 9, 1996** – Navy clinches its first winning season since 1982 with a 30-14 victory over Delaware.
- Sept. 13, 1997** – Chris McCoy ties an NCAA record by rushing for three touchdowns on consecutive carries, as Navy defeated Rutgers 36-7.
- Nov. 22, 1997** – Pat McGrew had a 91-yard touchdown run, second longest in school history and longest in stadium history, as Navy rolls over Kent State 62-29.
- Nov. 22, 2003** – Quarterback Craig Candeto directed touchdown drives on all eight possessions he played as Navy destroyed Central Michigan 63-34 in front of a Senior Day crowd of 29,527. The win made Navy bowl eligible for the first time since 1996.
- Nov. 20, 2004** – Seniors Kyle Eckel, Aaron Polanco and Eric Roberts rushed for two touchdowns apiece as Navy routed Rutgers 54-21, in front of a Senior Day crowd of 33,615. Navy, which scored 47-consecutive points in the game, rushed for 476 yards and had 613 yards of total offense. The victory gave the Mids an undefeated record at home for the first time since 1996.
- Oct. 8, 2005** – On a day that was already special because of the rededication of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium, sophomore Joey Bullen made it even more memorable by drilling a 46-yard field goal with four-tenths of a second remaining to give Navy a thrilling 27-24 comeback victory over Air Force.
- Aug. 30, 2008** – Shun White rushed for a school-record 348 yards and three touchdowns on just 19 carries to lead Navy to a season-opening 41-13 victory over Towson.
- Nov. 1, 2008** – Linebacker Clint Sovie's 42-yard fumble return for a touchdown with 37 seconds left in regulation capped a 20-point rally in the final 9:16 to send the game into overtime and quarterback Ricky Dobbbs' one-yard run in the extra session gave Navy a miraculous 33-27 overtime victory over Temple.
- Sept. 26, 2009** – Navy celebrated the 50th anniversary of the first game played at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium by wearing replica 1959 jerseys against Western Kentucky. Quarterback Ricky Dobbbs rushed for 143 yards and four touchdowns in the 38-22 victory.
- Oct. 3, 2009** – The Navy defense completely shut down the nation's top rushing offense, while junior kicker Joe Buckley drilled three field goals, including a 38-yarder in overtime, to lead Navy to a 16-13 victory over Air Force in front of a sellout crowd of 37,820.
- Nov. 14, 2009** – Ricky Dobbbs rushed for a then Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium-record five touchdowns on 26 carries to help lead Navy to a 35-18 victory over Delaware.
- Oct. 20, 2012** – Navy scored 10 points in the final 5:30 to come from behind and shock Indiana 31-30 in front of 33,441 fans on Homecoming. Keenan Reynolds hit Matt Aiken with a touchdown pass with 2:02 remaining to give Navy the lead and a Parish Gaines interception clinched the Mids' first win over a BIG TEN opponent at home since 1926.
- Oct. 26, 2013** – One week after missing an extra-point in the second overtime that cost his team a chance to defeat Toledo, Nick Sloan redeemed himself against Pittsburgh booting a 30-yard field goal as time expired to give Navy a thrilling 24-21 come-from-behind victory.
- Oct. 25, 2014** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for 251 yards and three touchdowns on 39 carries to give Navy a 49-39 Homecoming victory over San Jose State. Reynolds' first touchdown of the

day set the school record for career rushing touchdowns with 50.

- Nov. 15, 2014** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for a career-high 277 yards and a stadium-record six touchdowns to lead Navy to a 52-19 victory over Georgia Southern.
- Sept. 19, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds ran for five touchdowns and 142 yards as the Midshipmen dominated East Carolina in their American Athletic Conference debut 45-21.
- Oct. 3, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for 183 yards to lead Navy to a 33-11 rout of Air Force. It was Navy's largest margin of victory in the series since 1978.
- Oct. 31, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds scored twice in the fourth quarter to tie the collegiate mark for career rushing touchdowns and Navy set a school record with three 100-yard rushers in a 29-17 victory over USF. Reynolds finished with 117 yards rushing, while Chris Swain rushed for a game-high 131 yards and Dishan Romine had 117 yards. It marked the first time in program history that three players each rushed for 100 or more yards in a game.
- Nov. 14, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds shattered the FBS career rushing touchdown record, scoring four rushing touchdowns against SMU in Navy's 55-14 rout of the Mustangs. The four rushing touchdowns gave Reynolds 81 in his career, surpassing Montee Ball's record of 77.
- Dec. 28, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds wrapped up his record-setting career in spectacular fashion, rushing for three scores and passing for another to lead Navy to a 44-28 victory over Pittsburgh in the Military Bowl. Reynolds' final touchdown, with 4:19 remaining, clinched the win and gave him 88 total touchdowns for his career, breaking the tie with Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon for most touchdowns in FBS history. The win was the 11th on the year for Navy, which is a school record.
- Oct. 22, 2016** – Will Worth rushed for 115 yards and threw two touchdown passes to help lead Navy to a 46-40 victory over #6 Houston. It was Navy's first win over a team ranked in the Top 10 since 1984. Navy entered the game as a 17-point underdog, but shredded the No. 1-ranked rushing defense in the country for 306 yards on the ground. Josiah Powell's 34-yard interception return for a touchdown was the big play of the game.
- Oct. 7, 2017** – Zach Abey threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Carmona with 15 seconds left to lead Navy to a 48-45 victory over Air Force in front of a stadium-record crowd of 38,792.
- Nov. 11, 2017** – Malcolm Perry rushed for 282 yards and four touchdowns in his first career start at quarterback and backup kicker JR Osborn hit an 18-yard game-winning field goal as time expired to give Navy a 43-40 victory over SMU. Perry's 282 yards rushing are the third most in school history.
- Dec. 28, 2017** – Zach Abey came off the bench to rush for five touchdowns, and starting quarterback Malcolm Perry ran for 114 yards and two touchdowns as Navy rolled to an easy 49-7 victory over Virginia in the Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman.
- Oct. 5, 2019** – Malcolm Perry scored on a 4-yard touchdown run with 23 seconds remaining to give Navy a stunning 34-25, victory over Air Force. The Falcons had scored 16 consecutive points in the final quarter and took the lead on a 1-yard run by Taven Birdow with 3:15 left in the game. However, Perry led an 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive to claim the victory in the first leg of the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy. Navy linebacker Tony Brown returned a fumble 7 yards in the closing seconds to round out the scoring.
- Oct. 26, 2019** – Bijan Nichols kicked a 48-yard field goal as time expired and Navy edged Tulane 41-38. Nichols' kick - a yard shy of a career long - capped a seven-play drive in the final 61 seconds to secure bowl eligibility for the Midshipmen for the 15th time in 17 years. Sophomore fullback Jamale Carothers rushed for a career-high 154 yards and accounted for four touchdowns and quarterback Malcolm Perry rushed for 142 yards and threw for a touchdown for the Midshipmen.
- Nov. 11, 2023** – Junior safety Rayuan Lane III returned an interception 97 yards for a touchdown to cap off a dominant defensive performance in Navy's 31-6 win over UAB. It was the longest interception return in Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium history and the second longest in school history.
- Sept. 21, 2024** – Junior quarterback Blake Horvath rushed for 211 yards and 4 touchdowns while throwing for 192 yards and 2 touchdowns as Navy beat No. 23 Memphis for the first time in 5 years, 56-44. Navy clinched the game on an 86-yard interception return by Rayuan Lane III with 25 seconds remaining and Memphis driving for the game-winning score.
- Oct. 19, 2024** – Senior corner Dashaun Peele set a school record by returning two interceptions for a touchdown in Navy's 51-17 rout of Charlotte. Peele had interception returns of 61 and 84 yards in the game.

• In August of 2019, Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk announced that Joe Bellino's #27 would be placed on the turf at the 27-yard line at both ends of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium facing Navy's sideline as a tribute and in memory of the 1960 Heisman Trophy winner, who passed away on March 27, 2019.

• He was the first Navy player to win the Heisman Trophy and the first to have his number retired.

• Bellino, a native of Winchester, Mass., was known as the player who was never caught from behind. In just three seasons, he scored 31 touchdowns, rushed for 1,664 yards on 330 carries, returned 37 kicks for 833 yards and set 15 school records.

• Bellino was a unanimous All-America selection at halfback in 1960 and was also the winner of the Maxwell Award. His end zone interception preserved Navy's 17-12 win over Army that season. The Midshipmen were ranked as high as fourth in the country and went on to play in the Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1961.

• Bellino capped off his senior year (1960-61) by winning the school's top two athletic awards, the Thompson Trophy and the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword. It marked the first time in 41 years that one midshipman received both of these awards.

• Bellino's #27 football jersey was retired after the 1960 season. He had a three-year stint with the Boston Patriots after he had completed his four-year service obligation. He stayed in the Navy Reserves for 24 more years and reached the rank of Captain.

• He was a 1977 inductee into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. In 2009, he was named to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial All-Stadium Team. During its annual season-ending football banquet, Navy presents the Joe Bellino Award to the varsity football player whose inspiring on-field performance made a significant impact on the team and contributed to its overall success during the season.

• In October of 2023, Gladchuk announced that Roger Staubach's #12 would be placed on the turf at the 12-yard line, opposite of Bellino's #27.

• Known as "Roger the Dodger," Staubach has scrambled his way to success as a college athlete, an All-Pro NFL quarterback and as a successful businessman.

• In 1963, Staubach became the second Naval Academy football player in four years to win the Heisman Trophy. It was his junior season with the Midshipmen, and all he did was lead Navy to a ranking of second in the country and a berth in the Cotton Bowl, where he set Bowl records for pass completions (21 of 31) and yards passing (228). The Midshipmen posted wins over West Virginia, Michigan, Notre Dame and Maryland that season. He completed 106 passes in 161 attempts for 1,474 yards, while earning consensus All-America honors, as well as the Maxwell Trophy and Walter Camp Memorial Trophy.

• At one time, Staubach, who was hampered by injuries in his senior season of 1964, had set 28 Naval Academy records in football.

• Staubach was the recipient of the Naval Academy's Thompson Trophy Cup for three-consecutive years and was the 1965 winner of the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword. He was the first sophomore to win the Thompson Trophy Cup and is its only three-time winner. He was only the fourth midshipman since 1900 to win both the Thompson Trophy Cup and NAAA Sword.

• After four years in the United States Navy, including a tour in Vietnam, Staubach joined the Dallas Cowboys and led that team to unprecedented heights. Again, displaying the daring play he had shown at Navy, Staubach directed the Cowboys to 23 fourth-quarter comeback wins, including 14 in the final two minutes of a game or in overtime. He played 11 seasons with the Cowboys and led them to the Super Bowl four times, including world championships in 1972 and 1978. Cowboys were 90-31 with Staubach as

• Among his awards were the NFL Players Association Most Valuable Player and The Sporting News NFL Player of the Year in 1971, Most Valuable Player of Super Bowl VI (1972), Washington Touchdown Club NFC Player of the Year in 1976 and 1978, NFC Pro Bowl selection five times, the Vince Lombardi Sportsman of the Year Award in 1975, NFL Players' Association NFC Offensive Player of the Year (1978), and the Byron "Whizzer" White Humanitarian Award in 1979.

• Staubach was named the Walter Camp Foundation Man of the Year in 1985, selected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1985, his first year of eligibility, and inducted into the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame in 1981.

• The football locker room in Ricketts Hall was named in his honor in 1996, and in 2008, Staubach received the National Football Foundation's Gold Medal, the highest honor one can receive from that organization. Staubach has also been honored as a "Distinguished Graduate" of the United States Naval Academy.

- Navy took its first lead when **Alex Tecza** (Jr / FB) scored on a 3-year run with 14:56 left in the second quarter. The touchdown was set up by **Luke Pirris** (Jr / Raider), who punched the ball out of the hands of Bucknell running back Paul Neel and recovered it at the Bison 23.
- Navy made it 20-7 with 5:29 left in the half when **Blake Horvath** (Jr / QB) threw a beautiful 9-yard touchdown pass to **Eli Heidenreich** (Jr / Snipe), who reached high in the air to bring the ball down for a touchdown.
- Heidenreich set up Navy's final touchdown of the half with a 23-yard punt return down to the Bucknell 42 with 27 seconds left and then on the first play, Horvath threw a screw pass to **Brandon Chatman** (Jr / Snipe), who broke multiple tackles to go 42 yards for a touchdown. Horvath hit Heidenreich again for the 2-point conversion and the Mids led 28-7 at the half.
- Heidenreich made the score 35-7 with 11:12 left in the third quarter on a 20-yard catch-and-run off a pass from **Braxton Woodson** (So / QB) and the Mids would not be threatened the rest of the way.

- Blake Horvath** (Jr / QB) rushed for 122 yards and 3 touchdowns on 15 carries, while throwing for 112 yards and a touchdown on 5 of 9 passing to lead Navy to a 38-11 victory over Temple at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. With the win, Navy improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2019.
- The Navy defense set the tone early, as Temple struggled to get back to the line of scrimmage in the first quarter. The Owls ran 10 first-quarter plays and gained a total of 5 yards, while the Mids' defense scored the first points of the game when **Justin Reed** (Jr / DE) knocked Temple quarterback Forrest Brock out of the back of the end zone for a safety after Brock fumbled a shotgun snap.
- The Navy offense then got things going on the ensuing free kick, moving 58 yards on 11 plays with Horvath scoring from two yards out to make the score 9-0.
- After **Jaxson Campbell** (Jr / Striker) picked off his first-career pass on Temple's next possession, the millennial Wing-T showed its big-play capability as Horvath kept the ball on an option and went 62 yards for a touchdown.
- On Navy's next possession, **Alex Tecza** (Jr / FB) broke a tackle at the line of scrimmage and went 65 yards for a touchdown. The Tecza touchdown marked the fourth time this year Navy has scored on the first play of the drive.
- Temple finally was able to get on the board at the end of the first half on a 36-yard field goal by Maddux Trujillo. Navy, however, opened the second half with a 9-play, 81-yard drive capped off by a 31-yard touchdown pass from Horvath to a wide open **Eli Heidenreich** (Jr / Snipe) to make the score 29-3 and then Horvath hit **Brandon Chatman** (Jr / Snipe) with a 2-point conversion to make it 31-3 and effectively ended any hope that Temple had.
- The Horvath-led offense piled up 409 yards of total offense, including 297 yards on the ground.
- Colin Ramos** (Sr / LB) paced a Navy defense that held Temple to just 35 yards rushing on 20 carries with 15 tackles, while **Kyle Jacob** (Sr / LB) added 7 and **Ira Ohiha** (So / S) had 6 with a tackle for loss, a forced fumble and a pass breakup.

NAVY 56, (RV/#23) MEMPHIS 44

SEPT. 21, 2024 • ANNAPOLIS, MD. • NMC MEMORIAL STADIUM • 31,268

- Navy piled up 566 yards and 56 points on just 53 plays as the Mids shocked No. 23 Memphis 56-44 in front of 31,268 fans at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. It is the first time that Navy has started 3-0 since 2017.
- The Tigers, who gave up just 12 points last week at Florida State, had no answer for Navy's millennial Wing-T as **Blake Horvath** (Jr / QB) rushed for 211 yards and 4 touchdowns on 12 carries, while completing 9 of his 12 pass attempts for 192 yards and 2 TDs. Horvath had touchdown runs of 5, 3, 7 and 90 yards and touchdown passes of 39 yards to **Eli Heidenreich** and 46 yards to **Brandon Chatman**.
- Horvath's 6 combined touchdowns are the most by a Navy player since Malcolm Perry combined for 6 in 2019 against East Carolina, while his 416 yards of total offense is the third most in school history. Horvath's 90-yard touchdown run to put Navy up 49-30 with 8:22 left is tied for the fifth-longest run in school history.
- Memphis led just twice in the game as it took first-quarter leads of 7-0 and 14-7 on a 7-yard touchdown run by Mario Anderson Jr. and a 57-yard run by Brandon Thomas.
- Navy battled back to take a 21-14 lead on Horvath's 39-yard touchdown pass to Heidenreich and Chatman's 12-yard touchdown run with 9:37 left in the second quarter. Chatman's touchdown run marked the first time all year that Memphis had trailed.
- You can argue that Navy won the game on the next 3 possessions. Memphis put together a 15-play drive down to the Navy 12, but the Mids were able to hold the Tigers to a field goal when Seth Henigan's third down pass to Roc Taylor fell incomplete.
- Navy got the ball back with 2:14 left in the half and moved 75 yards on 9 plays with Horvath scoring from the 3 to give the Mids a 28-17 lead at the half.
- Navy got the ball to start the second half and promptly went 75 yards on 5 plays with Chatman catching a short pass from Horvath and rumbling 46 yards to give Navy a 35-17 lead.
- Memphis battled back to cut the Navy lead to 5 at 35-30 on a 37-yard touchdown pass from Henigan to Taylor and a 5-yard touchdown run by Anderson Jr., but the Mids would answer right back with a Horvath 7-yard touchdown run and then, after the Navy defense stopped Memphis on fourth down from its 10-yard line, Horvath was off to the races on a 90-yard touchdown run on the very next play to give Navy what looked like an insurmountable 49-30 lead with 8:22 left. It was the fifth time this year that Navy scored a touchdown on the first play of a drive, the most in the FBS.
- Memphis answered quickly, as it went 80 yards in 1:25 with Henigan hitting Marcello Bussey with a 36-yard touchdown pass and then, after a Navy punt, Memphis went 80 yards in 13 plays, taking just 3:03 off the clock to score on an Anderson Jr. 1-yard touchdown run to make the score 49-44. Memphis went for 2, but Koby Drake could not hold on to Henigan's pass in the back of the end zone and the Mids led by an important 5 points instead of 3.
- Memphis squibbed an onside kick on the ensuing play that Navy's **Rayuan Lane III** initially recovered, but then lost and Memphis kicker Caden Costa fell on it at the Memphis 46.
- The Tigers moved down to the Navy 26, but on 2nd down Lane III stepped in front of a Henigan pass and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown, setting off a wild celebration in Annapolis.
- The two teams combined for 100 points and 1,225 yards of total offense. Navy's 143 points in the first 3 games of the year are the most by a Navy team since 1918 when the Mids ran up 150 points in the first 3 games.

- **Blake Horvath** (Jr. / QB) completed 9 of his 11 pass attempts for a career-high 225 yards and 2 touchdowns, while rushing for 84 yards and a touchdown to lead Navy to a 41-18 rout of UAB at Protective Stadium in Birmingham. It was the first game of the series played in Birmingham.
- Navy jumped out to a 7-0 lead as the Mids scored on the opening drive for the first time this year. Horvath directed a 7-play, 61-yard drive with Horvath capping it off by faking a pitch and taking it to the end zone from 20 yards out.
- After the defense forced a punt on UAB's next possession, the Mids went on their longest drive of the year time wise, milking 7:56 off the clock on a 14-play, 84-yard drive capped off by a 6-yard touchdown run by **Alex Tecza** (Jr. / FB) to make it 14-0 Navy.
- UAB then went on a long drive of its own, taking 7:45 off the clock on a 15-play, 57-yard drive. However, Navy's defense held in the red zone and forced a 35-yard field goal by Jonah Delange to make the score 14-3.
- Navy got the ball back with 1:11 left in the first half and it looked like it would run out the clock as the Mids ran an option pitch to **Brandon Chatman** (Jr. / Snipe) for a 2-yard loss on first down. However, on the next play, Horvath threw a perfect strike to **Nathan Kent** (Jr. / WR) for a 77-yard touchdown pass and the Mids would take a 21-3 lead into the locker room.
- Navy made it 28-3 on the first drive of the second half when Horvath tossed a screen pass to **Eli Heidenreich** (Jr. / Snipe), who took it 74 yards for a touchdown. Heidenreich was sprung by a devastating block by **Ben Purvis** (Jr. / OG) 2 yards down the field and Heidenreich did the rest, outrunning the Blazers secondary.
- It is believed to be the first time in school history Navy has thrown 2 touchdown passes of more than 70 yards in the same game.
- The Mids finished off the Blazers thanks to a pair of **Nathan Kirkwood** (Jr. / K) field goals, the first tying his career high of 45 yards and the second setting a new high from 46 yards, and a 16-yard touchdown run by **Daba Fofana** (Sr. / FB) that finished off an 8-play, 94-yard drive.
- **Rayuan Lane III** (Sr. / S) led Navy with a career-high 12 tackles and 2 forced fumbles, while **Justin Reed** (Sr. / DE) recorded 7 tackles, a career-high 3 tackles for loss and a career-high 2 sacks to go along with a caused fumble. **Mbiti Williams Jr.** (Sr. / CB) and **Justin Ross** (Fr. / CB) both had interceptions, including the first-career pick for Ross.

- **Blake Horvath** (Jr. / QB) rushed for 115 yards and 2 touchdowns while throwing for 134 yards, while **Eli Heidenreich** (Jr. / Snipe) rushed for 100 yards on 6 carries and caught 5 passes for 101 yards as Navy dominated Air Force from start to finish in a 34-7 win in front of a sellout crowd at Falcon Stadium in Colorado Springs.
- The 7 points allowed by the Navy defense were the fewest Navy has allowed in Colorado Springs, while the 34 points scored were the second most.
- Navy took command on the 2nd possession of the game, as the Mids moved 87 yards on 10 plays capped off by a 1-yard touchdown run by Horvath. The Mids had 4 plays on the drive go for 10 yards or more, the big one being a beautiful throw and catch from Horvath to **Brandon Chatman** (Jr. / Snipe) that took the ball down to the 1. Horvath scored 2 plays later.
- On the following Air Force drive, Navy's **Dashaun Peele** (Sr. / CB) intercepted Falcons quarterback John Busha and returned it 21 yards to the Air Force 41.
- Facing 4th-and-3 from the Air Force 34, Navy went for it and as Horvath ran left, the entire Air Force defense followed him. Horvath then pitched the ball to **Nathan Kent** (Jr. / WR) for the reverse as Kent waltzed 34 yards into the end zone for a 14-0 Navy lead.
- Air Force went on to cut the Navy lead to 7 (14-7) as backup quarterback Quentin Hayes came off the bench to lead a scoring drive that was capped off by a 45-yard touchdown pass to Tre Roberson.
- The Mids, however, came right back as Horvath led an 8-play, 79-yard scoring drive that he capped it off with a 2-yard touchdown run. The play of the drive was a 25-yard pass from Horvath to Heidenreich down to the Air Force 4 as Heidenreich made an incredible catch and toe tap for the completion.
- Air Force got the ball to start the 2nd half, but the Navy defense promptly forced a punt and the offense took the heart out of the Falcons with a 14 play, 76-yard drive that took 6:20. **Alex Tecza** (Jr. / FB) finished the drive off with a 7-yard TD run to make the score 27-7.
- Tecza sealed the victory with a 12-yard touchdown run to give Navy the 34-7 win.
- Navy piled up 463 yards of total offense, while holding the Falcons to 273. Navy had 329 yards rushing and 134 yards passing.
- It was the first time since 2003 that Navy had two 100-yard rushers and a 100-yard receiver, while Heidenreich is believed to be the first player in school history to rush for 100 yards and have 100 yards receiving in the same game.
- **Kyle Jacob** (Sr. / LB) led the Navy defense with 10 tackles, while **Jaxson Campbell** (Jr. / Striker) added 7 stops and 2 sacks. **Justin Reed** (Sr. / DE) added on 7 tackles.

- Max Brown threw a pair of touchdown passes for Charlotte, a 20-yard strike to O'Mega Blake, and a 13-yarder to Duane Thomas Jr.
