UW VISITS NOTRE DAME FOR FIRST CONFERENCE ROAD SERIES

- Wisconsin men's hockey (1-5-0, 0-2-0 Big Ten - 1 point) visits Notre Dame (4-2-0, 0-0-0 Big Ten) for its first Big Ten road series of the season. The teams meet on Friday at 6 p.m. CT and Saturday at 5 p.m.
- Friday's game airs on 1310 WIBA, with Saturday on 1070 The Game. Both games stream on Peacock.
- The games against Notre Dame wrap up UW's only consecutive road series of the season. The Badgers do play six consecutive games away from the Kohl Center between Dec. 13 and Jan. 4, but that includes a weekend off and three neutral site contests.
- The Badgers dropped a pair of road games at No. 1 and defending NCAA champion Denver last weekend, falling 4-2 and 6-1 to the Pioneers. The Badgers led 1-0 and 2-1 in the first game and started the third period tied at 2-2 before allowing a goal and an empty-net goal to DU. UW scored first again on Saturday, on the power play, but the Pioneers scored six unanswered markers for the sweep. The Pioneers extended their win streak to 15 games dating back to last season.
- Notre Dame split a pair of home games with LIU, winning 4-1 before losing 5-2 to the Sharks.
- The Badgers swept the season series with the Fighting Irish last season including 2-1 and 7-4 victories in South Bend, Indiana. UW also won 4-2 and 3-2 at the Kohl Center.
- Following this weekend's trip to Notre Dame, the Badgers return home for their annual Border Battle series at the Kohl Center. UW welcomes Minnesota on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 8-9 and 7 p.m. and 6 p.m., respectively.
- Saturday's game against Minnesota is a 'White Out,' with fans encouraged to wear white to the game.



Sophomore forward Quinn Finley leads UW's roster with five goals and seven points in six games played. He currently boasts a five-game point streak.

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- Despite getting outscored 20-10 on the season, UW is outshooting its opponents 207-134, with an average of 34.50-22.33 shots per game.
- Sophomore Quinn Finley leads the Badgers with five goals and he and freshman Gavin Morrissey share the team lead with seven points.
- Grad transfer Ryland Mosley had his five-game point streak snapped last Saturday at No. 1 Denver. He had two goals, four assists and six points in his first five games as a Badger.
- Morrissey has points in five of his six career games for UW and owns a pair of goals and five assists for seven points.
- Wisconsin's only other goal scorer is senior defenseman Daniel Laatsch, who tallied the overtime game-winning tally in a 3-2 win against Lindenwood.
- UW took the lead in both games at No. 1 Denver last weekend against a team that had not trailed at all during its first four games.
- The Badgers have scored first in three of six games this season, but have dropped all three.
- This weekend's matchup against Notre Dame features the No. 2 team in the country in faceoffs in the Fighting Irish (60.8 percent) against the eighth-ranked Badgers (56.6 percent).

- Sophomore forward Owen Mehlenbacher and sixth-year forward Owen Lindmark currently own the top two faceoff marks in the Big Ten for those with at least 10 chances. Mehlenbacher leads with a 17-7 mark and 70.8 win percentage, while Lindmark at 57-25 owns a 69.5 win percentage.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Wisconsin sits at .812 on the penalty kill, killing 13-of-16 penalties through six games.
- The Badgers' power play has goals in four of six games and has succeeded on four of 25 chances for a 16.0 percent success rate.

COMEBACKS

- On Oct. 12, the Badgers' recorded their second two-goal comeback of the year after first completing the feat in their exhibition game at Omaha on Saturday, Oct. 5.
- Down 2-0 with a minute left in the second period, sophomore forward Quinn Finley scored a power-play goal to cut the Lions' lead in half. Finley tallied his second goal of the evening 14:29 into the third period by batting the puck out of the air to send the game to overtime. Senior defenseman Daniel Laatsch notched the game-winning goal with 18 seconds left in the extra time to give the Badgers a series split over Lindendwood.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

- Wisconsin split its goaltending duties in its first six games with senior RIT transfer Tommy Scarfone, the 2024 Atlantic Hockey Goaltender of the Year, playing on Fridays and sophomore William Gramme playing on Saturdays.
- After going three consecutive games allowing two goals, the Badgers allowed 10 total goals last weekend at No. 1 Denver. The Pioneers scored four goals last Friday with Scarfone in net, though the fourth goal was scored into an empty net.
- The six goals allowed last Saturday at No. 1 Denver marked the most allowed by UW in the 46 games under head coach Mike Hastings.

TARGET PRACTICE

- The Badgers are outshooting opponents 34.5-22.33 per game on average.
- UW has outshoot its opponent in five of six games.
- The Badgers are scoring on 4.8 percent of their shots, while opponents are successful on 14.9 percent of attempts.

ATTENDANCE

- Through its season-opening four-game homestand, Wisconsin has an average attendance of 9,377, welcoming 37,508 fans to the Kohl Center so far. UW currently ranks second in average attendance behind North Dakota (11,712)

- UW's four-game season-series sweep over Notre Dame last year included goals from Badger returning skaters Scholl, Owen Lindmark, Zach Schulz, Simon Tassy, Ben Dexheimer and Christian Fitzgerald.
- Four Badgers have goals through six games this season. The 10 returning Badgers without a goal this year who scored last year combined for 55 goals in 2023-24.
- Freshman defenseman Logan Hensler was named an A-rated prospect by NHL Central Scouting Service for the 2025 NHL Draft. That means he's a first-round prospect for the draft.

OLD STUFF

- Freshman forward Gavin Morrissey scored the Badgers' first goal of the season on Oct. 11 in the first period on the power play. Graduate student forward and Michigan Tech transfer Ryland Mosley also scored his first goal in a Wisconsin sweater in the Badgers' season-opening game.
- Morrissey had points in his first three college games (1g, 3a), before going pointless in UW's most recent game last Saturday.
- Morrissey also had a three-point weekend against Lindenwood, tallying a goal and an assist on Friday and an assist on Laatsch's game-winner on Saturday.
- Sophomore forward Quinn Finley owns points in each of the last three games after going without a point in the season opener. Finley has a team-best three goals and five points for the season.
- Quinn Finley recorded a three-point night on Oct. 12, scoring two goals in regulation and adding an assist on Laatsch's overtime winner.
- Finley's three-point night versus the Lions marked his fourth-career multi-point game, tying him with sophomore defenseman Joe Palodichuk for fifth on the roster.
- Finley owns one previous three-point game (3g vs. Lindenwood, Jan. 12, 2024) and a four-point game (1g, 3a at Michigan, Jan. 27, 2024).
- Three-time national coach of the year Mike Hastings is in his second season behind the Wisconsin bench. Hastings posted his 26th winning season in as many years as a head coach, leading UW to a 26-12-2 mark and an NCAA tournament appearance.
- The 2023-24 Hastings-led Badgers improved 13 victories from the prior season to finish 26-12-2 and with their highest win total since the 2009-10 team finished as NCAA runners-up.
- Now in his 13th season as a collegiate head coach, Hastings owns a 326-126-27 all time record as an NCAA head coach. His .709 win percentage ranks fourth all-time and is tops among active head coaches.
- Two Badgers picked up individual preseason All-Big Ten honors. Junior defenseman Ben Dexheimer was named to the Preseason All-Big Ten First Team, while senior goaltender Tommy Scarfone was named Preseason All-Big Ten Second Team.
- Junior forward Simon Tassy and junior defenseman Ben Dexheimer return as UW's top scorers with both collecting 28 points last season.
- Three incoming Badger transfers boast at least one double-digit goal-scoring season in college led by graduate forward Ryland

Mosley, who had 18 goals last season and 12 goals the prior season for Michigan Tech. Junior forward Kyle Kukkonen scored 18 goals as a freshman at Michigan Tech during the 2022-23 campaign and graduate transfer forward Cody Laskosky scored 14 goals and 13 goals the past two seasons, respectively, at RIT.

- UW will boast a new starting goaltender after All-American and Mike Richter Award-winner Kyle McClellan moved on to the professional ranks. The Badgers brought in senior goaltender Tommy Scarfone from RIT as a transfer. Scarfone was a 2024 Mike Richter Award semifinalist, the 2024 Atlantic Hockey Goaltender of the Year and backstopped the Tigers to Atlantic Hockey regular season and tournament titles and an NCAA tournament berth. He won 25 games and posted a 2.26 goals-against average, .925 save percentage and four shutouts.
- Scarfone begins the 2024-25 season as the NCAA current career leader with 55 victories and 2,494 saves. He also ranks second with nine shutouts and 90 games played, third with a .921 save percentage and sixth with a 2.36 goals-against average.
- Returning for his sophomore season at UW in goal is William Gramme, who was exceptional in limited action as a freshman.
- Gramme went 2-0-1 with a 1.13 goals-against average, .959 save percentage and one shut-out in four appearances during the 2023-24 season.
- UW enjoys the addition of 12 newcomers for the second consecutive year. This year's group is made up of eight freshman and four transfers. Among the college rookies are freshman defenseman Logan Hensler, who arrives in Madison from the U.S. National Team Development Program's Under-18 Team. Early mock drafts list Hensler among the top 10 for the 2025 NHL Draft.
- Among UW's other freshman, forward Gavin Morrissey and goaltender Anton Castro won the 2024 Clark Cup with the Fargo Force, Youngstown forward Ryan Botterill shared 12th in the USHL last season with 29 goals, while his teammate Adam Pietila shared 25th with 24 goals and defenseman Jack Phelan is a 2023 fifth-round draft pick of the Detroit Red Wings. Also, forward Luke Buss is the son of former Badger Matt Buss (1990-94) and defenseman Weston Knox captained the NAHL's Minot Minotauros before becoming a Badger.
- The Kohl Center ice is now of NHL-sized dimensions at 200-by-85 feet. The rink was shrunk over the summer. The ice sheet was 200-by-97 since the Badgers started playing in it for the 1998-99 season.

HEAD COACH MIKE HASTINGS

Mike Hastings became the sixth Wisconsin men's hockey coach of the modern era (since 1962) on March 30, 2023.

In his first season behind the Badgers' bench and 26th overall as a head coach, Hastings continued his remarkable level of consistent excellence, directing his teams to their 26th consecutive winning season.

In the 2023-24 season at Wisconsin, Hastings engineered a 13-win improvement for the Badgers, as well as an NCAA tournament berth. He also had the Badgers in position for a possible Big Ten regular-season title until the last weekend.

Hastings helped coach Kyle McClellan to UW's first Mike Richter Award as national goaltender of the year. McClellan also became Hastings' first All-American at UW.

His winning record includes his last 11 seasons at Minnesota State, where he directed the Mavericks to eight NCAA tournament appearances (2013, 2014, 2015, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2022, 2023), a pair of Frozen Fours (2021, 2022) and the NCAA title game (2022). The COVID-19 pandemic prevented a ninth NCAA appearance in 2020. The winning also spans 14 seasons as head coach of the USHL's Omaha Lancers.

A three-time Spencer Penrose Award winner as NCAA coach of the year, his Mavericks captured eight conference regular-season championships during his 11 seasons behind the bench to help him earn league coach of the year five times at MSU.

His MSU run includes regular-season titles in each of the last six seasons, winning the CCHA in 2022 and 2023, while conquering the WCHA four times from 2018-21. Minnesota State twice won the Mason Cup as CCHA tourney champions (2022, 2023) and a pair of Broadmoor Trophies as the WCHA tournament winners (2014, 2015) under Hastings direction.

Minnesota State won 20 games in a season twice during its first 16 years of NCAA Division I play, but surpassed the mark in all 11 seasons of Hastings' tenure. MSU set its school mark with 38 victories during its run to the 2022 NCAA

Championship game, its third 30-win season in a four-year stretch.

The Mavericks went 299-109-25 during his 11 years leading the program for a .719 win percentage.

While at Minnesota State, seven players under Hastings skated to All-America seasons including Dryden McKay, the 2022 Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner as the nation's top player. McKay was also a three-time top-three finalist for the Mike Richter Award given to the nation's top goaltender. In addition, nine of his MSU players have skated in the NHL thus far.

On the international stage, Hastings directed Team USA to a silver medal at the 2019 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship and served as an assistant coach for the 2022 U.S. Olympic Team in Beijing and the 2022 U.S. National Team at the world championship. He also served as an assistant coach for Team USA's National Junior Team at World Juniors in 2005 and 2003.

His collegiate coaching career began in 2008 with one year as an assistant at Minnesota, before he moved on for three seasons as associate head coach at Omaha (2009-12).

His success began in the USHL when he served as head coach and general manager of the Omaha Lancers for 14 seasons (1994-2008). His teams won three Anderson Cups as regular-season champions (2002, 2005, 2008) and three Clark Cups as playoff winners (1998, 2001, 2008).

That all helped him win two USHL Coach of the Year honors (1997, 2002) and five USHL General Manager of the Year accolades (1997, 2002, 2005, 2007, 2008).

He left for the college ranks in 2008 as the USHL's all-time winningest coach at 529-210-56 at the time.

A 1993 St. Cloud State graduate, he skated two seasons with the Huskies (1986-88) before injury cut his playing career short.

Hastings and his wife, Jean Ann, are the parents of two grown children.

KOHL CENTER

- The Kohl Center, which opened in 1998, is the second largest on-campus rink in the nation (15,000+). The only on-campus facility with a larger capacity is Value City Arena (17,500) in Columbus, Ohio
- Wisconsin has won at least 11 games in a season at the Kohl Center on 11 occasions.
- The Kohl Center played host to NCAA regional action for the first time in 2008 when the NCAA Midwest Regional took place on March 29-30. The building had previously played host to the 1998 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championships, a 2002 NCAA Men's Basketball Regional and a 2007 NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Quarterfinal contest.
- The Kohl Center cost \$76.4 million to construct and is named after late U.S. Senator Herb Kohl, a 1956 UW graduate who donated \$25 million towards the project.
- The Kohl Center ice sheet is 200 feet long by 85 feet wide (NHL size.) The rink shrank from 200 feet long by 97 feet wide this past summer.
- Some of the names of players from opposing teams who have played in the building include Patrick Kane, Jonathan Toews, David Backes, Duncan Keith, Ryan Miller, Dylan Larkin, T.J. Oshie, Paul Stastny, Matt Carle, Kyle Okposo, Jack Eichel and Auston Matthews, among others.

- Wisconsin has had seven first-round NHL draft picks in the last seven years. There were 10 first-rounders at Wisconsin in the previous 36 years.

BADGERS AND THE NHL

- UW boasts eight NHL draft picks, including freshman forward Jack Phelan, who went to the Detroit Red Wings in the fifth round of the 2023 draft with the 137th pick.
- UW boasts 183 NHL draft picks all-time, including three in the supplemental draft, and have had at least one player drafted in each draft since 1970 except for 1983 and 1997.
- Eight Badgers selected in 1982 are the most for one year.
- Wisconsin law school graduate and former men's hockey graduate assistant Bill Zito won the 2024 Stanley Cup as the Florida Panthers' president of hockey operations and general manager. He became the 18th former Badger player, coach or staff member to win the Stanley Cup.
- Former Wisconsin captain Ryan McDonagh became the 15th Badger to get his name engraved on the Stanley Cup as a player when he helped the Tampa Bay Lightning to the 2020 Stanley Cup. That is the most among NCAA schools. He won again in 2021.
- All time, a Badger is on the Cup 22 times as a player, also the most of any NCAA school.
- Ryan McDonagh's Tampa Bay Lightning defeated Joe Pavelski's Dallas Stars to win the Stanley Cup in 2020, then defeated Cole Caufield's Montreal Canadiens in 2021. That made him the fourth Badger to win consecutive Cups (Justin Schultz, Paul Stanton, Brian Engblom).
- McDonagh played for the Nashville Predators from 2022-24 before re-signing with the Tampa Bay Lightning prior to the 2024-25 season where he'll act as an alternate captain.
- Following the 2023-24 season, Joe Pavelski officially retired from professional hockey after an 18-year NHL career. UW's all time leading NHL scorer, Pavelski finished his career with 476 goals and 1,068 points in 1,332 career regular season games.
- Pavelski became Wisconsin's all-time NHL leading scorer on Dec. 1, 2022, with his 949th career point in the NHL regular season, surpassing Chris Chelios for the honor.
- Pavelski became the first Badger to reach 1,000 career NHL points on April 10, 2023. He began the 2023-24 season with 1,001 points.
- Pavelski played his 1,300th career game on Feb. 6, becoming the seventh American in NHL history. Others include Badgers Chris Chelios and Ryan Suter. He's also the third player in NHL history to do it drafted in the seventh round or later (Doug Gilmour, Luc Robataille).
- The 2023-24 season ended a 33-year streak with at least one UW goaltender playing in the NHL. Brian Elliott played the 2022-23 season with the Tampa Bay Lightning.
- Prior to the 2024-25 season, Elliott accepted a new role in the St. Louis Blues' front office as a goaltending scout and development coach.
- Over the offseason, multiple Badgers signed new contracts and switched teams.
