# **TEAM NOTES**

- Notre Dame won the toss and deferred its choice to the second half. Army received the opening kick off and started the game defending the east end zone.
- Attendance was a capacity crowd of 47,342 the Yankee Stadium seating configuration for football games has changed over the years. The 47,342 number is the current capacity number.
- Notre Dame improves to 40-8-4 all-time vs. Army, 25-5-3 at Yankee Stadium and 16-5-3 against Army in Yankee Stadium.
- Notre Dame improves to 18-7-3 all-time at Yankee Stadium and have won the last four appearances (1969, 2010, 2018 and 2024).
- Notre Dame improves to 139–23–5 all–time vs. the ACC.
- Notre Dame improves to 13-4 all-time on November 23 and have won the last five games in a row on the date.
- Notre Dame is now 13-0 all-time in Shamrock Series games.

# **NOTABLE**

- Jack Kiser extended his school-record games played record to 65 games this evening.
- Jeremiah Love's six-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter is his second touchdown reception of the year and third of his career.
- Love's 14-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter matches Wayne Bullock's school-record for consecutive games with a rushing touchdown with 11. Bullock did it over a two-year span from 1973–74. The 11 consecutive games to start a season is a new program record, besting Autry Denson's season-opening run of 10 in 1998.
- Love, highlighted by a 68-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, posted his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season and his career, finishing with 130 yards. It also marks the first time that Love has rushed for 100 yards in back-to-back games and the first Irish running back to do so since Audric Estimé against Wake Forest and Stanford in 2023.
- Notre Dame's defense held Army to just two yards passing in the first half and 26 total in the game, the least amount a Notre Dame opponent has posted since Navy had 22 passing yards on October 10, 2015.
- Notre Dame's defense held Army to 233 total yards, marking the sixth time the Irish have held an opponent under 250 total yards this season, the most since the 1983 team also held six opponents to under 250 total yards.
- With the 35-point victory tonight, Notre Dame moved into the FBS lead with a +301 point differential this season.
