SOUTH BEND, Ind. (November 8, 2011) - The University of Notre Dame shot nearly 60-percent from the field on its way to a 92-70 victory over Stonehill College in a men's basketball preseason exhibition in front of 6,567 at Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center. Junior guard Brian Hamor (Schenectady, N.Y.) led Stonehill as he finished with 13 points, eight assists and five rebounds on the night. Sophomore Mitch Amelio (Carlsbad, Calif.) scored a team-high 16 points off the bench as he hit 6-of-8 shots from the field, including 4-for-6 from beyond the arc.

THE GAME

Stonehill travels to Notre Dame for a first-ever meeting between the Skyhawks and Fighting Irish as Division I opponents. Stonehill traveled to South Bend back in 2011, falling to Notre Dame in an exhibition game, 92-70. Stonehill looks to build off an 81-62 win over Division III Framingham State Monday night, aiming to win its first two regular season games for the first time since 2016-17. The Skyhawks are 7-24 in non-conference games since making the jump to Division I in 2022 with another challenging slate scheduled for this upcoming season, beginning with Wednesday night's matchup in South Bend. Notre Dame comes off a 13-20 season under the guise of first-year head coach Micah Shrewsberry. Shrewsberry and the Fighting Irish look to start off 1-0 for the second season in a row after defeating Niagara, 70-63, in last year's opener.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Wednesday night's game will be broadcasted digitally on ACC Network X and ESPN+. Fans can also listen to the game live on the Notre Dame Radio Network, broadcasted digitally through Audacy. Tyler Riedy will be on the call on Wednesday night's broadcast as the play-by-play while Bill Fenlon joins him as analyst.

SCOUTING THE FIGHTING IRISH

Coming off its 13-20 campaign a season ago, Notre Dame returns four of its five key starters and bring in a transfer in Matt Allocco from Princeton to fill the fifth spot. The Fighting Irish are led by Markus Burton, the sophomore guard who won ACC Rookie of the Year in 2024. He also earned ACC All-Conference Third Team honors after averaging 17.5 points, 4.8 assists, and 2.2 steals per game. Prior to this season, he was named to two watch lists and the Preseason All-ACC First Team. Notre Dame also returns sophomore Braeden Shrewsberry, the son of its head coach, who played in 33 games last year, starting in 15. Shrewsberry scored in double figures 17 times last season, averaging 10.2 ppg.

AGAINST NOTRE DAME

Wednesday's matchup marks the first meeting in a regular season matchup between Stonehill and Notre Dame. Prior to Stonehill's transition to the Division I level, which started in 2022, the Skyhawks and Fighting Irish played an exhibition game at Purcell Pavilion on November 7, 2011. Stonehill lost 92-70.

LAST TIME OUT

EASTON, Mass. (November 4, 2024) - The Stonehill College men's basketball team opened its 2024-25 season at Merkert Gymnasium Monday night, defeating Framingham State University, 81-62 as graduate student Josh Morgan (Brampton, Ontario) scored 25 points in his Skyhawk debut. Morgan led all scorers in Monday night's season opener with 25 points on 5-13 shooting from the field, going 5-10 from deep, and hitting all 10 of his free throw attempts. Morgan also tallied four rebounds, three assists, and three steals, and was a +29 while on the court in his first game as a Skyhawk, transferring to Stonehill after four seasons at Incarnate Word. Sophomore Todd Brogna (Southborough, Mass.) led the Skyhawks on the glass, corralling eight rebounds while adding a career-high 20 points.

RETURNING CAST

Stonehill's 2024-25 roster returns eight of its 16 student-athletes from last season, including one starter, sophomore Todd Brogna. Sophomore Louie Semona started 14 games and was the only Skyhawk to suit up in all 31 games last season. Junior Chas Stinson appeared in 23 games, starting in 10, but missed a portion of the season due to injury. Junior Ethan Meuser played in just six games, senior Christopher Melis redshirted the entire season, and walk-on's Neal Marquardt, Nathan McGill, and Charlie Diamantis saw limited action.

NEW FACES, NEW PLACES

Five transfers and three freshmen make up the new crop of Stonehill players. Grad transfers Josh Morgan and Amir Nesbitt bring veteran leadership to an otherwise young and inexperienced Skyhawk team while sophomore Alex Bates IV came over from Iona. Morgan played in 104 games, starting in 40 at Incarnate Word while Nesbitt appeared in 55 and started 10. Transfers Eino Montin and Jake TenBerge both come from the junior college level where they both excelled. Montin was an All-Conference Honorable Mention while TenBerge averaged 15.9 points per game.

NORTH OF THE BORDER

Head Coach Chris Kraus (Toronto, Ontario) went north of the border this season, recruiting two newcomers from his home country of Canada. Graduate student Josh Morgan (Brampton, Ontario) and freshman Hermann Koffi (Quebec City, Quebec) grew up in Canada, just like their new head coach. Both will be key rotational pieces for a Skyhawk team that was picked eighth in the Northeast Conference Preseason Poll.

HERRION'S RETURN

After a year away from the collegiate coaching ranks, the Skyhawks newest assistant coach, Bill Herrion, makes his return to the bench on coach Kraus's staff. Herrion most recently coached at the University of New Hampshire up until 2023, but his contract was never renewed and he was replaced for the 2023-24 season after 18 years at the helm of the Wildcats program. Herrion began an 18-year run as the head coach of New Hampshire in 2005 after a short stint as the associate head coach at the University of Arkansas. In his time at UNH, he accumulated a 227-303 (.428) record, the winningest coach in Wildcat history. His 394 wins between his time as head coach at UNH and as the head coach at Drexel still stands as the all-time mark in America East history.

CZECH MATE

Stonehill's newest assistant coach, Jared Czech, joins the Skyhawks after spending the past four seasons as an assistant coach with the United States Air Force Academy men's basketball program. Prior to his experience at the USAFA, Czech was an assistant coach at Columbia University under head coach Jim Engles, primarily responsible for the Lions' recruiting and player development for four seasons. Czech was also the Director of Basketball Operations for Engles' staff at NJIT in 2014-15. Along with his coaching experience, Czech was named Director of Hoop Group Elite Camp, the world's largest basketball instructional organization in 2015.

250 FOR COACH KRAUS

Stonehill's win at LIU on January 20, 2023 marked the 250th game in charge for head coach **CHRIS KRAUS '06**. In his eleventh year at the helm of his alma mater, Kraus has posted a 149-143 (.516) career record and participated in his 450th game associated with the College (student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach) against Wagner on January 5, 2023. Kraus' now 292 games as a head coach at Stonehill ranks second all-time in program history behind only Ray Pepin (312) after passing David McLaughlin (288).

FOREVER A SKYHAWK!

Stonehill's game against Wagner on January 5, 2023 marked the 450th game Stonehill head coach **CHRIS KRAUS '06** had a role with the program including his time as a student-athlete (114) from 2002-06, assistant coach (90) between 2010-13, and head coach (292) since 2013. Kraus has now had a role with his alma mater in 25.3-percent of the men's basketball games in the program's 75-year history. Stonehill has posted a 269-227 (.545) record over his combined 18-years at the College.

TBT COACH

Stonehill men's basketball assistant coach, **JASON KARYS** and alum, **ISAIAH BURNETT '23** participated in The Basketball Tournament (TBT) over the summer. Karys was head coach of "The CRU", a team that featured Burnett as a team member, comprised of former Valparaiso University men's basketball alumni including, Eron Gordon, the brother of Philadelphia 76ers shooting guard, Eric Gordon. Last year's appearance in the tournament marked the second for The CRU who were an eight seed. They fell in the first round, 89-78, to the number one seeded Assembly Ball, a group of former Indiana men's basketball players.

TENTH SEASON - 149-143 (.513)



Chris Kraus, Stonehill College Class of 2006 and a native of Toronto, Ontario, was named the 14th head coach of

the Stonehill men's basketball program in July, 2013. He is the first alumnus to direct the Skyhawks and is the first Canadian-born coach to take the helm of an NCAA men's basketball program.

Kraus, who will be one of two Canadian-born head coaches at the NCAA Division I level as Stonehill begins its third year in transition as a member of the Northeast Conference, has maintained Stonehill's winning tradition over his tenure, leading his alma mater to a 149-143 (.513) record through his tenth season at the helm. In his now eleventh season, Kraus brings in a new group of student-athletes to improve on last season's 4-27 Skyhawk team. In the Skyhawks first season in the NEC, Stonehill finished 10-6, coming in a tie for second place in the regular season standings. Kraus was named the NEC's Jim Phelan Coach of the Year Award by the Conference's nine head coaches in the teams first year as a member.

In eight years as a member of the the highly competitive Northeast-10 Conference, Kraus recorded an 87-77 (.531) clip with three NCAA Division II Tournament bids. The Skyhawks captured their third NCAA East Regional Championship in program history in 2016, advancing to the Elite Eight for the third time in the last ten years.

Kraus has played a part in each of the three Elite Eight appearances in Stonehill history, guiding the Skyhawks as a senior point guard in 2006, as an assistant coach under current Dartmouth College mentor David McLaughlin in 2012 and then full circle as a head coach in 2016. He is the only coach in NCAA Division II East Region history to guide a program to a regional title as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

Kraus' student-athletes earned 13 All-Northeast-10 Conference honors, including Will Moreton, '20, a three-time All-NE10 selection, who was named the NE10 Player of the Year following the 2019-20 season. Ryan Logan '17, the 2013-14 NE10 Rookie of the Year and is the first student-athlete under Kraus to collect NABC All-District honors with second team honors as junior and senior.

Moreton collected CoSIDA Academic All-District I first team honors, joining Pierce Cumpstone, '16 and Monty Urmilevicius, '21 in earning the recognition under Kraus' leadership. The group also earned NE10 Academic All-Conference honors during his tenure.

Kraus has regularly seen his graduates go on to enjoy professional careers overseas, with Logan now playing in Sweden and Moreton in Spain, the most notable.

Stonehill posted a 19-10 overall record in 2014-15, finishing tied for second in the NE10 Northeast Division standings with a 14-7 mark in Conference play. While the Skyhawks fell to eventual NE10 Tournament champions American International College in the quarterfinal round, Kraus guided the program to its 13th NCAA Tournament appearance, and first since reaching the National Semifinals in 2012.

That season spurred Stonehill entering the 2015-16 campaign that would see the Skyhawks post a 24-9 record overall, including 15-6 in the highly competitive NE10 Northeast Division that would send four teams to the NCAA Tournament. It was the NCAA East Regional in Philadelphia, where the Skyhawks hit their stride, led by senior point guard and future assistant coach Carter Smith, '16 who earned Regional Most Outstanding Player honors. Stonehill won its third regional championship in program history, and a spot in the NCAA II Elite Eight in Frisco, Texas, with a pair of thrilling overtime wins as the Skyhawks knocked off three NE10 divisional rivals on their way to the regional title.

Stonehill has enjoyed a winning season in six of the eight seasons Kraus has been in charge. The Skyhawks posted an 18-11 mark, including 13-6 in the NE10 to finish second in the division, reaching the semifinal round of the NE10 Tournament. Stonehill was again poised for a strong NCAA East Regional run, before the Skyhawks' 15th NCAA Tournament bid was halted before the regional started by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Kraus earned his first career win with a 75-58 triumph over Georgian Court University in his debut as head coach and picked up his first NE10 victory with a 61-56 decision over Assumption College on December 4, 2013. He reached the 100-win plateau with the Skyhawks 78-70 win over Saint Michael's College on November 23, 2019.

Kraus took over the helm at Stonehill after serving as former head coach David McLaughlin's top assistant coach for three seasons. Stonehill averaged 20 wins over those three years, reaching the NCAA Tournament twice, including the 2011-12 season when the Skyhawks posted 25 wins and captured both the NE10 Tournament and NCAA Division II East Regional crown on its way to the national semifinal round at the Elite Eight.

As a student-athlete within the program from 2002-2006, Kraus was a member of the 2005-06 squad that won a program-record 27 games and earned the program's first regional championship and trip to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight in Springfield, Massachusetts. Along with the team's national semifinal round run during his senior season, Kraus earned All-Northeast-10 Conference honors, was named to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team and with his play was amongst the nation's leaders in a number of statistical categories. He trained with the Canadian Senior Men's National Team from 2002-2005, and won a silver medal playing for Canada at the World Junior Championships in France in 1999.

After graduating from Stonehill in 2006, Kraus played professionally in England for London United before returning home to begin his coaching career. He was an assistant at Acadia University in Nova Scotia, Canada, where he assisted the team in capturing the AUS Conference championship and a berth in the national tournament. He then spent two seasons as the top assistant at Brandon University in Manitoba, Canada, helping the team earn back-to-back GPAC conference titles.

In addition to his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from Stonehill, Kraus was admitted to the Faculty of Education program at Brandon University and earned his Master's Degree in athletic administration from Endicott College in 2012.

Kraus and his wife, Ashley, also a 2006 Stonehill graduate and former women's tennis student-athlete, reside in West Bridgewater, Massachusetts, with son, Tanner, and daughter, Josephine.
