A Look Back

The Lakers are coming off a strong season in 2023-24, going 18-10 overall and 14-8 in conference play. Brooklyn Kohlheim's group brings a strong sense of veteran leadership to the floor, with a compliment of skilled underclassman. Last season marked one of the best of Kohlheim's career, leading the Lakers to the PSAC Post Season for the first time in 6 years.

Familiar Faces

Bailey Kuhns and Jenna Van Schaik are two key returners for the Lakers, and both will be relied on heavily to put the ball in the basket. Other key players for the Lakers include Ava Waid, Allyson Ross, Grace Clary, Maria McConnell and Singo Lekeuneu.

Scouting Notre Dame

Notre dame will be the Lakers toughest opponent of the season. The Fighting Irish are led by Hannah Hidalgo and Sonia Citron who both average over 17 points per game. As a team, the Fighting Irish average 78.6 points per game and shoot over 45% from the field. Notre Dame is coming off an impressive 2023-24 season going 28-7 overall and making a NCAA sweet-sixteen appearance where they lost to Oregon State by 5 points.

ABOUT THE NEC

As the Northeast Conference (NEC) enters its 44th year as an NCAA Division I athletic entity, the league's NEC mission has remained remarkably consistent: to provide opportunities for student-athletes to achieve their fullest potential in the classroom, in athletic competition and in the community.

Focusing on the areas of student-athlete achievement, academic excellence, integrity, sportsmanship, diversity, equity and inclusion, innovation, community partnership and national engagement, the NEC continues to make great strides under the leadership of Commissioner Noreen Morris, now in the 15th year of her tenure. With the NEC's Strategic Plan providing a blueprint for the future, there is no shortage of excitement headed into the 2024-25 season as the nine-strong NEC looks to stand out among its peers, while fostering a sense of #NECPride amongst its student-athletes, coaches, administrators and fans.

When the Northeast Conference (NEC) was first established as the ECAC-Metro Conference back in 1981, the league's founders had one goal in mind: to create a competitive NCAA Division I men's basketball conference for unaffiliated schools on the Eastern seaboard. A single-sport entity at its inception, the NEC has grown far beyond expectations over the past four decades, having transformed itself into a 24-sport conference.

63799The remarkable success story of the Conference began to unfold in 1985, when the league began sponsoring additional sports. Three years later, a change of name was in order and the Northeast Conference as we know it today was born. With membership and sport sponsorship continuing to grow over the years, the NEC enjoys qualification or play-in access to 16 different NCAA Championships (baseball, men's and women's basketball, women's bowling, field hockey, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball).

Though the NEC has featured various incarnations since its inception, charter members FDU, LIU, Saint Francis U and Wagner remain part of the current nine-school alignment. They are joined by Central Connecticut (1997), Sacred Heart (1999), Merrimack (2019). Stonehill (2022) and Le Moyne (2023), along with Chicago State (2024) and Mercyhurst (2024), the league's newest members.

COACH BROOKLYN KOHLHEIM



Brooklyn Kohlheim will enter her 6th season as the leader of the Lakers. Kohlheim arrived in Erie after a brief stint as the head coach at Lake Erie College. She has more than 14 years of playing and coaching experience throughout the NCAA Division I and Division II levels.

The 2023-24 season proved to be Kohlheim's best season, leading the Lakers to an overall record of 18-11 and a conference record of 14-8. Mercyhurst also tied a program record, rattling off 11 wins in a row. As a team, the Lakers shot 42% from the field. It was also the first time in 6 years the Lakers made the PSAC post season.

The 2021-22 season saw Kohlheim lead the Lakers to a 9-19 mark, with a 7-15 record inside of PSAC play. The team bounced back from a rough start, winning four of five games throughout December and early January, picking up wins over East Stroudsburg, Mansfield, and Clarion. Mercyhurst's highlight win was an 89-60 blowout victory over Seton Hill, who was receiving national votes at the time. Junior Jayde Boyd, and redshirt freshman Grace Centrulla, were both named Second Team All-PSAC West.

The 2021 campaign saw Mercyhurst post an II-6 overall record. 2021 consisted of a complete non-conference schedule due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Mercyhurst got out to a strong start going 5-0 to match the best start in program history since the 2016-17 season. The Lakers were competitive all season and earned an impressive 64-55 road win at No. 24 American International College. They ended the season going 4-2 over their final six contests.

In 2020 she led the Lakers to an 8-20 mark and an 8-14 record in PSAC action. Her first victory as a Laker came on November 23rd when the squad knocked off Millersville University in the conference home opener. Senior Amber Renz notched 1,000 points for her career against Gannon and was named First Team All-PSAC West. Kohlheim's team was focused both on and off the floor as well, with all 14 players being named a PSAC Scholar Athlete.

Prior to her arrival at Lake Erie. Kohlheim was an assistant coach at Michigan Tech. in Houghton, Mich. As an assistant, she spent the 2017-18 season with the Huskies and helped lead them to a 23-6 overall record. The Huskies climbed as high as 13 in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Poll.

After a great regular season, Michigan Tech was crowned the GLIAC North Champions and received an at-large bid into the 2018 Division II NCAA Tournament. The team also finished the season with the highest team GPA in Division II.

Prior to coaching at MTU, Kohlheim was an assistant at Nova Southeastern, in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. She helped lead the Sharks to back-to-back Sunshine State Conference Tournament titles (2013-14 and 2014-15). She also played a key role in solidifying two regular season conference titles (2012-13 and 2014-15). During that time, NSU made two Elite Eight appearances — in 2013-14 and 2014-15. They also reached the Final Four in 2013-14.

At Nova Southeastern, Kohlheim helped build the program into one of the premier programs in NCAA Division II. She helped lead the team to three consecutive years of being ranked in the Top 25, including a No. I overall ranking.

Kohlheim began her collegiate coaching career spending two seasons at the University of Indianapolis, where she assisted the team and helped them to an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2009-10.

As a student-athlete, Kohlheim played basketball at Florida Southern College, an NCAA Division II school where she was a four-year starter. She earned SSC All-Freshman Team honors in 2002 and led the Mocs to an SSC tournament title and NCAA appearance in 2003. She is the program's all-time leader in free throw percentage and 3-pointers made.
