### COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

<b>1K</b>	In the final regular season series of 2023-24, Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson coached his 1,000th career game as a Division I head coach. The Irish rolled to a convincing 6-1 victory over Minnesota in the contest to celebrate the historic career of their leader, which spans 25 seasons over two programs; Lake Superior State University and the University of Notre Dame.
<b>594</b>	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach <b>Jeff Jackson</b> has 594 career wins, which leads active NCAA Division I head coaches, spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and now 20 seasons at Notre Dame. Jackson's win total ranks 10th all-time for most wins at the NCAA Division I level.
<b>20</b>	The Irish coaching staff of Jeff Jackson, Paul Pooley and Andy Slaggert enter year 20 coaching together in 2024-25. The trio of coaches started together in 2005 and have gone on to record great success with the program, including multiple Frozen Fours and two national championship games.
<b>18</b>	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach <b>Jeff Jackson</b> has guided his teams at Lake Superior State and Notre Dame to 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, including winning NCAA Championships with the Lakers in 1992 and 1994, while guiding the Irish to their only four Frozen Four appearances in program history: 2008, 2011, 2017 and 2018.
<b>17</b>	Seventeen sets of brothers have now suited up for the Irish. Current Irish siblings include <b>Henry</b> and <b>Danny Nelson</b> while <b>Justin Janicke</b> (brother Trevor graduated in 2024) and <b>Carter Slaggert</b> (brothers Graham '22 and Landon '24) both have brothers who previously suited up for the Irish.
<b>10</b>	Veteran leadership: Notre Dame's roster features 10 seniors and graduate students in 2024-25. Current graduates Grant Silianoff and Zach Plucinski have spent all five seasons at Notre Dame and earned their undergraduate degrees in May 2024.
<b>9</b>	With Cal Burke's debut with the Vegas Golden Knights in mid-November, the Irish have nine alumni currently competing in the NHL.
<b>8</b>	The Irish saw eight alumni represented on NHL opening night rosters when the 2024-25 season commenced in mid-October. Notre Dame alumni include Andrew Peeke (BOS), Dennis Gilbert (BUF), Jake Evans (MTL), Spencer Stastney (NSH), Anders Lee (NYI), Kyle Palmieri (NYI), Bryan Rust (PIT), and Ian Cole (UHC).
<b>8</b>	With the most recent being the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history - each under <b>Jeff Jackson</b> (three regular-season).
<b>6</b>	The Irish have six draft picks on their roster in 2024-25 and have had at least one individual selected in each of the past 22 NHL Entry Level Drafts.
<b>4</b>	The Irish announced ahead of the season opener that four seniors and graduate students will serve as team leaders this year.

## NOTES

### QUICK HITS

- Notre Dame is headed overseas for the first time in program history as they are set to take part in the 2024 Friendship Four alongside Boston University, Harvard, and Merrimack.
- The team has spent the past week outside of North America, exploring Dublin and Belfast, learning the history of both cities, and enjoying some time as a team bonding over the experience.
- Notre Dame unveiled a speciality jersey to be worn for both games, paying homage to the land they've traveled to and the history of both Ireland and Northern Ireland. The navy jersey with gold detailing reflects the University's colors while the numbers and letters took inspiration from the centuries old Book of Kells.
- A unique celtic knot adorns both shoulders of the sweater. Celebrating the location of the game, "Notre Dame in Belfast" sits atop the knot. The knot is twisted into the shape of hockey sticks and faceoff circles, representing the face-off of two opponents.
- The historically Hockey East/ECAC tournament will feature its first Big Ten Conference team when Notre Dame competes.
- ND is set to face Harvard on night one of the tournament with puck drop set for 7pm with the winner advancing to play the winner of BU/Merrimack the following night. The loser of both games will face off in a matinee consolation game Saturday afternoon.
- In just eight all-time meetings between Notre Dame and Harvard, the Irish own two wins. The two teams are set for just their second meeting of this millennia, with the other coming at home during the 2015-16 season. Friday's game will mark their third meeting at a neutral site.
- The Irish and Terriers have met 18 times in program history prior to this tournament, including a split a season ago. All-time, Notre Dame leads 9-7-2. If the teams were to meet on day two of the tournament, it would mark the third meeting at a neutral site venue.
- Notre Dame and Merrimack have met 14 times in program history, with their most recent meeting coming in a two-game series in North Andover, Massachusetts, where they split 1-1. Notre Dame won game one of that series, 2-1, and are 8-5-1 all-time against the Warriors.
- In their most recent outing, Blake Biondi recorded a goal and two assists for his career-best point total in an Irish sweater. The graduate forward now owns seven points on the season off three goals and four assists. The three points from the Hermantown, Minnesota native tied his previous best set twice at UMD.
- Jack Larrigan recorded an assist Friday night at Michigan State to notch his first collegiate point.
- Henry Nelson scored his second collegiate goal to open the scoring in game one against

Wisconsin. His younger brother Danny notched the primary assist on the play, marking the first time brothers contributed to each other's goals since Justin Janicke had the second assist on his older brother Trevor's goal on February 2, 2024 vs. Michigan State.

- The last time one brother posted the primary assist on their brother's goal was November 5, 2023 when Justin fed his brother Trevor a pass at Penn State in a 2-2 tie.
- The Irish team returned 19 student-athletes from the 2023-24 roster, including 11 forwards, six defensemen and two goaltenders. The forwards include graduate senior Grant Silianoff and seniors Justin Janicke, Hunter Strand and Tyler Carpenter. Returning defensemen include four who appeared in the final series of the 2023-24 season in Michael Mastrodomenico, Paul Fischer, Zach Plucinski and Henry Nelson.
- Notre Dame returned two 20+ point scorers from a season ago as Danny Nelson (9-14-23) and Cole Knuble (9-11-20) are now in their sophomore seasons with the Irish.
- In total, eight returners posted double-digit points last season. In addition to Nelson and Knuble, Hunter Strand (4-15-19), Justin Janicke (4-12-16), Paul Fischer (2-14-16), Brennan Ali (3-10-13), Maddox Fleming (3-9-12) and Grant Silianoff (4-7-11) look to improve upon their double-digit performances a season ago.
- At the last line of defense, the Irish return Jack Williams in goal and added two new netminders to the mix in Nicholas Kempf (USNTDP) and Owen Say (Mercyhurst).
- The Irish added 10 new faces to the squad in 2024-25, including five freshmen and five transfers. The 10 newcomers consist of five forwards, three defensemen and two goaltenders.
- Notre Dame swept its opening weekend in the North Country, Oct. 11-12, picking up wins over St. Lawrence and Clarkson in the program's first ever trip to Northern New York.
- The season opener at St. Lawrence saw Blake Biondi score the team's first goal of the 2024-25 season, notching his first goal for the Blue and Gold at 6:45 of the opening period. A pair of sophomores in Cole Knuble and Danny Nelson stepped into their bigger roles this season almost immediately, combining for three goals against the Saints to cap off Notre Dame's opening night with the 4-1 final.
- The team unofficially opened its season against the USNTDP for an exhibition contest Oct. 4. Graduate senior Biondi made his Irish presence known immediately with a first period goal against the USNTDP in the team's exhibition game last Friday night. The Hermantown, Minnesota native had two unofficial goals on the night, both scored on the powerplay. His second of the night sparked a third-period comeback for the Irish which included four unanswered goals to end the game and give the Irish the 5-2 win.
- Senior Justin Janicke posted four assists on the night against the U18 team, all of which came in the final frame.
- Grant Silianoff and Maddox Fleming also posted multi-point nights while Ian Murphy got hit twine for the first time in an Irish sweater as he closed out the scoring Friday with an empty net tally.

**NOTRE DAME VS. HARVARD**

- The two teams have met eight times since the inception of Notre Dame hockey. The first-ever meeting between Harvard and Notre Dame came in 1926-27 at Boston Arena (now Matthews Arena), the oldest arena still in use for ice hockey, and the original home of the National Hockey League's Boston Bruins.
- Notre Dame and Harvard last met in 2015-16 for their lone game inside Compton Family Ice Arena.
- Friday's meeting will mark just the second between the two squads in the 2000's.
- In series history, the Irish average 4.50 goals per game.

**TEAM LEADERS**

- With six goals in 11 games played this season, Cole Knuble leads the team in the category and set a career best for both points (4) and assists (3) in the team's night one win over Long Island. The sophomore now boasts 14 points on the season and was the first Irish skater to hit double-digits.

- Knuble's game-winning goal in overtime against Wisconsin was his third of the season which ranks third in the country.
- After three-point weekends against Minnesota, including Axel Kumlin's career-best goal and two assists Saturday against the Golden Gophers, he (3-7-10) and Blake Biondi (4-6-10) join Knuble and Justin Janicke (3-8-11) in double digit points.
- Danny Nelson's three goals on the powerplay leads the team while his six goals total is tied with Knuble for a team-best.
- With eight assists, Janicke and Paul Fischer are tied for most on the team.

**NATIONAL RECOGNITION**

- The Irish were ranked 19th nationally in both the USCHO.com and USA Hockey/The Rink Live preseason polls.
- Prior to the start of Big Ten Conference play, Owen Say was named Co-Goalie of the Month by the HCA for the month of October. In the opening month of competition, the junior netminder went 3-0-0 in the crease and led the nation in both save percentage (.969) and goals against average (1.00).

**NHL NOTES**

- The Irish had 25 alumni invited to NHL training camps in September, including six individuals from the 2023-24 roster.
- The program was represented at over half of the NHL camps to take place, including three with the Boston Bruins - Andrew Peeke, Drew Bavaro and Ryan Bischel.
- Seventeen teams hosted Notre Dame alums during their respective training camps and seven featured multiple individuals with Irish ties.
- Landon Slaggert, who made his NHL debut in March 2024 following the conclusion of his senior season with the Irish, joined fellow Irish alum and classmate Ryder Rolston in Chicago at the Blackhawks' camp.
- Ian Cole and Robbie Russo became the program's first ever representatives within the Utah Hockey Club, competing in a handful of preseason games for the newest NHL franchise this fall. Cole became an unrestricted free agent in July 2024 and signed a one-year deal with Utah to become the first Irish alum in the organization's history.
- The Islanders training camp featured a pair of NHL veterans and Irish alums in Anders Lee and Kyle Palmieri. Lee has spent the entirety of his career with the Islanders organization and was the last Irish player to make his NHL debut in the same season as his collegiate career before Landon Slaggert did so in March 2024.
- Lee became the 15th captain of the Islanders in 2018-19 and this season will mark his seventh as captain.
- Nate Clurman and Bryan Rust joined each other at the Pittsburgh Penguins training camp while Vinnie Hinostroza and Spencer Stastney were together in Nashville. Dennis Gilbert and Graham Slaggert were both present at the Buffalo Sabres' camp.

- Cal Burke made his debut with the Vegas Golden Knights on Wednesday, Nov. 21, marking the ninth Irish alum to lace up his skates in the NHL this season. The 2020 graduate scored his first NHL goal in his second game with the Golden Knights (Nov. 23 vs. Montreal).

**FAMILY TIES**

- The 2024-25 Notre Dame roster features quite a few family connections to the program and hockey world. One set of brothers is currently on the roster, in Henry and Danny Nelson, while two other current players have had brothers suit up for the Irish in the past. Senior Justin Janicke's brother Trevor spent five years with the Irish and recently signed with the Calgary Wranglers while sophomore Carter Slaggert's two older brothers Graham and Landon played their collegiate careers with the Irish and both now compete at the professional level.
- With the addition of the Nelsons last season, the Irish have had 17 sets of brothers lace up their skates together for the Irish.
- Carter Slaggert also joined the Irish in 2023-24, becoming the third Slaggert brother to appear in a game for the Irish. Oldest brother Graham currently plays in the Buffalo Sabres organization and skated two years alongside middle brother Landon before graduating. Landon was a 2024 graduate of Notre Dame and made his NHL debut for the Chicago Blackhawks in March 2024.
- Janicke and Slaggert's fathers both also attended Notre Dame, two of six families to ever have fathers and sons lace up for the Irish.
- The Slaggerts are part of the fifth set of father-son combinations to suit up for the Irish, joining their father and Ralph M. DiVietro Memorial Associate Hockey Coach Andy Slaggert.
- Justin and Trevor Janicke are the sons of Curtis Janicke, who played for the Irish from 1989-93, appearing in 125 games while scoring 46 goals and adding 98 assists for 144 points. Justin, Trevor and Curtis represent the sixth father-son duo to play for the Irish.
- Sophomore Paul Fischer is the nephew of Mike Gearan, a member of the first varsity hockey team at Notre Dame. Fischer honors his uncle by wearing his number during his career with the Irish, No. 16.
- Sophomore forward Cole Knuble is the son of former NHLer Mike Knuble, who spent 16 seasons in the NHL, including stints with Detroit, New York Rangers, Boston, Philadelphia and Washington. Cole was recently drafted by the Flyers' organization where his father played during his early childhood. He wears No. 22 with the Irish to honor his father.
- Three current Irish skaters have siblings playing at the collegiate level, away from South Bend, Indiana.
- Knuble's brother is completing his fifth season of hockey at Western Michigan this year.
- Jayden Davis' brother Matthew is a senior on the Denver Pioneers' hockey team and helped backstop the Pioneers to the 2023-24 national championship.
- Maddox Fleming's sister Delaney is a sophomore on the Cornell University women's hockey team.

- The selection in the 2024 NHL Entry Level Draft marked 22 consecutive years in which an Irish player has been picked dating back to 2004.
- With the fourth round selection, Kempf became the 98th player in program history to have his name called at the Draft and is the fourth ever Irish selection by the Washington Capitals.
- The sophomore class features four NHL draft picks in Danny Nelson (NYI '23; 2nd Rd., 49 overall), Cole Knuble (PHI '23; 4th Rd., 103 overall) and Paul Fischer (STL '23; 5th Rd., 138 overall) and Brennan Ali (DET '22; 7th Rd., 212th overall)
- Under Jackson, the Irish have had 52 NHL draftees, including three first round picks.

## IRISH HEADED HOME

- The University of Notre Dame, in conjunction with The Odyssey Trust, announced the Irish would participate in the 2024 rendition of the Friendship Four men's college ice hockey tournament.
- The annual tournament is set to be played in Belfast, Ireland, next week with the Irish joining Harvard, Merrimack and Boston University as participants competing for the coveted Belpot Trophy.
- The tournament was last played in 2022 with Quinnipiac reigning victorious that fall before winning the national championship at the conclusion of the 2022-23 season.
- The tournament first began in 2015 and is designed to promote education, social welfare, and community interaction.
- Over the course of six previous tournaments, 24 games have been played dating back to the inaugural games in 2015.
- Northern Ireland remains the only destination outside of the United States to host consequential NCAA Division I ice hockey games.

## NEARING 600

- With an overall coaching record of 592-319-98, Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson is just single digit wins away from 600 career victories in Division I men's ice hockey.
- His 592 wins at the DI level ranks first among all active coaches and is currently 10th all-time.

## A POSITION ENDOWED

- On Wednesday, October 25, 2023 it was announced that the head coaching position at Notre Dame would be named the Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach.
- Jim '83 and Mary Catalino of Lansdale, Pennsylvania, made the gift to the University of Notre Dame to endow the hockey head coach position.

- The 2024–25 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson’s 20 season behind the Irish bench. During his first 19 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success, including four trips to the Frozen Four and eight conference championships.
- Jackson has over 30 years of coaching experience and led Notre Dame to back-to-back Big Ten tournament championship seasons in 2018 and 2019 while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 15 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is one of only two coaches to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 20 seasons.
- Jackson’s Notre Dame teams have made 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 20-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation’s top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006–07 and 2008–09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team’s first season in the Big Ten (2017–18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018–19).
- Jackson’s success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson’s arrival, the Irish have had 48 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft, including three first round selections.
- In that same span, 52 players from USA Hockey’s National Team Developmental Program have matriculated to Notre Dame.

- During Jackson’s tenure, the Irish have had nine players garner All-America honors — Ryan Bischel in 2023, Bobby Nardella in 2019, Cale Morris in 2018, Anders Bjork in 2017, Robbie Russo in 2015, Anders Lee in 2013, Ian Cole and Erik Condra in 2009 and David Brown in 2007.
- In addition, 28 of Jackson’s Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2024–25 season with a 25-year collegiate record of 589–318–98 for a .645 winning percentage, the third-highest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2024–25).
- Entering the 2024–25 season, Jackson’s 589 career wins rank 10th all-time in Division I and leads all active NCAA Division I coaches.
