<b>6</b>	Is Notre Dame's highest preseason ranking since 2018-19 (post-2018 national title)
<b>160</b>	Hidalgo's 160 steals last season is a single-season program record (previous was 114 and held by Skylar Diggins)
<b>58</b>	Notre Dame has been ranked in the AP Top 25 for 58 consecutive weeks, the third-longest active streak
<b>2020</b>	King is the first Irish player since 2020 to start the season with back-to-back double-doubles
<b>881</b>	Westbeld's 881 career rebounds rank eighth in ND history
<b>790</b>	Total points last year for Hidalgo, the ACC freshman record
<b>556</b>	Total career starts made by those on the roster this year
<b>196</b>	Made 3s last year, the third-most in a season in program history
<b>11</b>	ND has had multiple 100-point games in a season just 11 times in program history, including this year
<b>73.5</b>	King is shooting 73.5 percent from the floor this year, which leads the ACC
<b>79.1</b>	The Irish return 79.1% of last year's scoring (doesn't include Miles)
<b>78.6</b>	ND's 78.6 ppg last season were the most the Irish have averaged under Ivey
<b>26</b>	Hidalgo had 26 games with at least 20 points last year, four more than anyone else in the ACC
<b>20-5-5</b>	Hidalgo was one of two major conference players who averaged 20 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists per game last year (Iowa's Catilin Clark)
<b>15</b>	Koval's 15 blocks this year lead the ACC and rank third nationally
<b>8</b>	Notre Dame faces eight teams in the preseason AP Top 25 this year
<b>7</b>	McDonald's All-Americans on the roster for the 24-25 season (Bransford, Citron, Hidalgo, Koval, Risch, Watson, Westbeld)
<b>6.8</b>	Miles is the NCAA's active career leader in apg with 6.8
<b>6</b>	Players on the 24-25 roster who have earned all-conference first team honors in their career
<b>5</b>	Koval was the No. 5 recruit in the 2024 ESPN HoopGurlz Recruiting Rankings
<b>4.6</b>	Hidalgo led the nation last season with 4.6 steals per game
<b>4</b>	Miles has four career triple-doubles, which ranks second in ACC history
<b>4</b>	Players on the Wooden Award Watch List (Citron, Hidalgo, Miles and Westbeld), more than any other school
<b>3</b>	Players ranked in ESPN's top NCAA WBB players – Hidalgo (3), Miles (13), Citron (14)
<b>1</b>	Miles is the only NBA, WNBA or college basketball player (men's or women's) in the last 25 years to miss a full season with an injury and post a 20-point triple-double in their first game back

## Heading Home

Sunday's Lafayette game may just seem like a non-conference tilt for the Irish, but it means a lot more to one of the Notre Dame guards.

Olivia Miles hails from Phillipsburg, N.J., a mere 2 miles from the Lafayette campus. This game was originally scheduled for 2022 before health and safety protocols interfered.

In addition to Miles, several of her teammates are from within a couple of hours of Easton — Hannah Hidalgo (Merchantville, N.J.), Kylee Watson (Linwood, N.J.) and Sonia Citron (Eastchester, N.Y.). While she's from Ukraine, Kate Koval went to high school at Long Island Lutheran.

## Back By Popular Demand And Already Making History

She's back.

All-American point guard Olivia Miles has returned to the court for Notre Dame nearly two years after tearing her ACL in February

2023. Miles picked up right where she left off against Mercyhurst. The graduate guard put on a show in first game back, posting a 20-10-10 triple-double. With four triple-doubles in her career, she now ranks second in ACC history and is the first player to post one in three different seasons. Miles also became the first player in the history of the NBA, WNBA and college basketball to sit out for a year with an injury and post a 20-point triple-double in their first game back on the court.

Miles stuffed the stat sheet once again on Sunday at Purdue, posting 17 points, 5 rebounds and 2 assists.

As a result of her performances, she earned multiple weekly awards: ACC Player of the Week (for the third time in her career) and was one of five players across the country named to the USBWA National Players of the Week list. Miles was also the runner-up for AP Player of the Week.

Miles' name peppered the ACC rankings two years ago, as she led the conference with 6.9 assists. She was the only ACC player who ranked in the top 10 in points (9), rebounds (7) and assists (1) in 2022-23. And she is the

NCAA's active leader in assists/game with 6.8.

## Not In Kate's House

Notre Dame is often called "Guard U" in the basketball world, but the Irish have a rookie forward this season that has already begun to bolster the team's reputation down low.

Freshman Kate Koval joins the Irish from Long Island Lutheran (N.Y.) and was the No. 5 overall recruit in the 2024-25 class according to ESPN (No. 1 post). Her 6-5 height suggests she's a back-to-the-basket post, but her skillset extends well beyond that. Koval can dish the ball outside, take a shot from the elbow, and even shoot the occasionally trey. Her teammates rave about her basketball IQ, specifically citing her passing abilities as something that makes her underrated.

She had 18 points and 5 blocks in the opener, making the first time since 2007 an ND player had 5 blocks to start a season. Koval showed off the aforementioned versatility against Purdue on Sunday, leading the Irish with 4 assists and adding 10 boards.

But it was Wednesday's performance against JMU that started turning some heads. Koval had a 14/16 double-double and added 6 blocks.

Through three games, Koval has totaled 40 points, 33 rebounds, 8 assists and 15 blocks. According to OptaSTATS, the last D1 freshman (male or female) to reach those numbers in any three-game span is Anthony Davis (Kentucky).

Koval leads the ACC and ranks third in the country in both total blocks and blocks/game.

"I think I have a good feel for the ball and know the right time to go up to block it," Koval said after the JMU game. "I try to stay calm. I don't think I get mad or angry easily, I just try to stay locked in on the game and not get too crazy."

### King Of The Castle

Liatu King comes to South Bend after a breakout senior year. She was named to the 2023-24 All-ACC First Team and earned Most Improved Player honors after averaging a double-double (18.7/10.3) last year at Pitt..

A 6-0 forward that plays much bigger than that, King wasted no time in her Irish debut. She led the team in scoring (24) and rebounds (11) against Merchyurst, and



had a 15-rebound game at Purdue. In doing so, King became the first Irish player since November 2020 to post a double-double in back-to-back games.

King's name is all over the current ACC and national rankings — FG% (73.5 — 1 ACC/15 NATL), rebounds/game (9.7 — 5/61) and points/game (17.7 — 7/102) top the list.

### Citron Shows Out

After missing the season opener with a foot issue, Citron made her season debut on the road at Purdue on Sunday. A model of consistency, she had 14 points, 6 rebounds, 3 assists and a steal while going 4-7 from the floor and 4-4 at the charity stripe.

"I think that's a credit to my preparation and the coaching staff," Citron said after the game when asked about her seemingly flawless transition back to the court. "Just preparing [is key]. I get my shots up to put myself at ease when I'm playing."

### 'Every Wing's Dream'

Citron put it perfectly when asked what it's like to play with the lethal combination everyone couldn't wait to see this year — Hidalgo and Miles on the court together.

"It's every wing's dream," Citron said on Sunday. "Those are two of the most talented point guards in the country, and I get to play with them. I just consider myself extremely lucky."

Through three games on the floor together, Hidalgo and Miles have combined for a total of 124 points, 43 rebounds, 25 assists and 20 steals. Miles is shooting 55.9 percent from the floor, while Hidalgo sits at 47.2.

### It Starts On Defense

Ivey preached from Day 1 that the Irish should be a defense-first team. While the offense was clicking down the stretch last season, Notre Dame's defense stepped up

and became suffocating.

Over the final 11 games of the year (the 10-game win streak + ORST loss), Notre Dame surrendered just 58.6 points per game and won by an average of 14 points. Eight of those 11 games were against NCAA Tournament teams.

Looking at the bigger picture, Notre Dame did not surrender more than 70 points to any team in a regulation-length game after Dec. 31. That streak remains alive as of Nov. 10 after holding both Mercyhurst and Purdue under that mark as well.

Notre Dame augmented its defensive presence in the offseason with the addition of Miles back into the lineup plus adding the three transfer forwards. Miles has 20 defensive rebounds this season, which is sixth in the ACC and second among guards.

Karlen, King and Koval had a combined 9 blocks in the exhibition, and Koval now leads the ACC with 15 blocks of her own.

### IR-ish

Notre Dame was one of the more beaten up teams in the ACC last season, and 2024-25 began the same way. Four Irish players remain sidelined. Their status is as follows —

- Maddy Westbeld: expected back around start of ACC play (foot)
- Liza Karlen: week-to-week (foot)
- Kylee Watson: out indefinitely (ACL)
- KK Bransford: out for the season (lower leg)

Additionally, Citron missed the opener with a foot injury.

### Taking 'Next Level Pros' to the Next Level

Notre Dame already had plenty of American professional basketball experience on its staff. Ivey and Allen played in the WNBA, and Ivey spent a year as an assistant coach for the Memphis Grizzlies.

But the Irish took it up a notch last season, adding Carlos Knox as the new player development program director.

"He came in, and he has put me outside of my comfort zone," Westbeld told the "They've Got Now" podcast last November. "When I think I'm talking as much as I can, he's like 'OK, what else can you say?' He's never satisfied, and I'm so thankful for it and for everything he's done since he stepped on campus."

Westbeld credits Knox as a big reason why she chose to return to Notre Dame for a fifth year.

Knox spent nearly a decade working with the Indiana Fever as an interim head coach, assistant coach and player development coach. During his tenure in Indianapolis, Knox helped lead the team to eight consecutive WNBA playoff appearances and was a 2012 WNBA player appearances and was a 2012 WNBA champion. He wore many hats for the team throughout his time, helping with everything from scouting to rehabilitation training to practice preparation. He has worked with many notable players, including former Irish guard and Olympic gold medalist Skylar Diggins-Smith, four-time Olympic gold medalist Tamika Catchings and five-time WNBA All-Star Katie Douglas.

Knox has also had stints as an assistant coach at Cincinnati (2020-21), North Texas (2017-20) and San Diego State (2010-11). Finally, Knox spent time from 2015-16 as the director of training at the Jonathan Byrd Grant Park Fieldhouse, Indiana's state-of-the-art basketball facility.

One of the finest point guards ever to wear the Notre Dame uniform, Niele Ivey (first name pronounced knee-elle) was announced as the fourth Karen & Kevin Keyes Family Head Women's Basketball Coach on April 22, 2020, just mere minutes after Muffet McGraw stepped down from her post after a Hall of Fame career.

Her list of accolades since Year 1 is lengthy, including winning the 2024 ACC Tournament, winning 2023 ACC Coach of the Year, and leading her team to the ACC regular season title. Ivey has posted three-consecutive Sweet 16 appearances despite losing multiple starters during both seasons to injury. Notre Dame was the only ACC team to have four women earn individual ACC honors at the end of the 2023 season, and the only school with three athletes on the All-ACC Team in 2024. Ivey was also the only coach in the country to sign three five-star recruits in the 2023 cycle — Cassandre Prosper, Hannah Hidalgo and Emma Risch.

In her first year at the helm, Ivey not only had to balance settling into her new role with a young roster but also navigating the waters of a national pandemic. In a shortened season due to Covid-19, Ivey's squad went 10-10 (8-7). In her first week on the job, Coach Ivey received verbals from now-juniors Sonia Citron and Olivia Miles, who made up a top-five nationally ranked recruiting class.

As an assistant, the Irish went 386-55 (.875) during Ivey's time patrolling the sidelines. Notre Dame's recent decade of dominance (2010-19) had Ivey's handprints all over it — no other program had produced more trips to the national title game (six), and the Irish posted the third-most wins in that span as well (339).

Ivey is the common link to all nine of the program's Final Four appearances, two as a player and seven as an assistant coach, logging a combined 21 years on Notre Dame's campus (16 as a coach and five as a player).

That decade also consisted of 14 conference championships (eight regular-season plus six tournament titles split between the BIG EAST and ACC), seven Final Fours and a 2018 national championship.

Ivey expanded her basketball prowess when she stepped away from Notre Dame to accept an assistant coaching position with the Memphis Grizzlies for the 2019-20 season. Ivey proved to be a true trailblazer, becoming the ninth active female coach in the NBA.

Over that year, Ivey helped develop a young team, with a new coaching staff, into a playoff contender. Ivey worked with several different position groups with the Grizzlies, but primarily with standout guards Jarlen Jackson and Ja Morant, as the latter won 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year honors.

Ivey originally joined the Fighting Irish women's basketball coaching staff in May 2007 (she added the title of recruiting coordinator in 2012 and was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015). Ivey went on to spend 12 seasons under Coach McGraw before departing for the Memphis Grizzlies.

Over her last eight years as an assistant, Notre Dame ranked in the top-12 in field goal percentage (led the country in 2013-14 season), scoring offense and assists. In fact, Notre Dame's offense over its back-to-back title game runs in 2018 and 2019 was one for the record books. The 2018 championship squad ranked in the top five in all the aforementioned categories. Meanwhile, the 2019 Irish took home the statistical championship for top-scoring offense in the country, averaging a program-record 88.6 points per game. In addition, they broke the program record for assists (804) while finishing second in shooting percentage (50.8 percent). The stat that is the icing on the cake to all of this — the 2019 starting five of Ogunbowale, Mabrey, Shepard, Turner and Young went down as the most prolific scoring fivesome in the history of NCAA Division I basketball (men's or women's), amassing an astonishing 10,230 combined career points.

In addition to her achievements in player development, Ivey emerged as a rising star on the recruiting trail, with a sharp eye for young up-and-coming talent. In fact, she helped Notre Dame attract top-12 incoming classes in nine of her last 10 years. In her last class, Coach Ivey nabbed No. 6 Samantha Brunelle and No. 18 Anaya Peoples.

What's more, Ivey displayed brilliant prowess when it came to scouting and in-game strategy. In her last six years as an assistant, she was directly responsible for creating the game plans that led to victories over Duke (12 times), Tennessee (8 times), Florida State (7 times), Connecticut (5 times), Maryland (three times), Louisville (8 times), Syracuse (7 times), UCLA (three times), Baylor (twice), Texas A&M (3 times) and South Carolina, among many others.

In fact, Notre Dame is 5-3 all-time against UConn in the NCAA Tournament, which more than doubles the next best team's win total. Overall, over her last 12 years, the Irish knocked off the Huskies nine times, while all other Division I teams combined for 10 wins.

Most notable players under Ivey's tutelage: Arike Ogunbowale, Jewell Loyd and Skylar Diggins-Smith. Ogunbowale was a two-time All-American, two-time Ann Meyers Drysdale Award finalist and the 2018 Final Four MVP after her famous Ice Twice. Ogunbowale graduated as the program's all-time leading scorer.

Ivey helped mold Loyd into one of the country's top players from 2012-15. Loyd finished with 1,909 points and a 17.0 career points-per-game average. Loyd's best performances came against Top 25 teams, in which she averaged 22.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game, including a school record-tying 41 at DePaul.

Then there's Skylar Diggins-Smith. Under Ivey's guidance, Diggins-Smith made a seamless transition from shooting guard to point guard during her final three seasons, emerging as one of the nation's elite players to become one of just three two-time recipients of the Lieberman Award and a two-time consensus first-team All-America and BIG EAST Player of the Year selection. Diggins-Smith graduated in 2013 as the holder (or co-holder) of no fewer than 32 game, season or career records at Notre Dame, and ranks among the top five on an astounding 105 of the program's game, season or career charts.

Ivey sat out most of her freshman season at Notre Dame (1996-97 Final Four campaign) after suffering a season-ending knee injury five games in. However, she was awarded a fifth year of eligibility in 2000-01 and made the most of it, earning third-team AP All-America honors, the first Fighting Irish point guard to be so recognized. She also was the recipient of the 2001 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award (nation's top senior player standing 5-foot-8 or under) and was a finalist for the 2001 Lieberman Award. In addition, Ivey made the 2001 NCAA Women's Final Four All-Tournament Team after averaging 16.5 points and 5.5 steals per game as the Fighting Irish defeated Connecticut and Purdue to win their first national title.

All told, Notre Dame went 109-22 (.832) during Ivey's last four seasons, reaching the NCAA Sweet 16 three times (1998, 2000, 2001) and rolling up a (then) school-record 34 wins in 2000-01. The Fighting Irish also won a share of their first BIG EAST regular-season championship in 2000-01 and were ranked in the top 10 of either or both the Associated Press and WBCA/USA Today polls for all but two weeks during her final three campaigns. While at Notre Dame, Ivey was a three-time all-BIG EAST selection (1999-2001), collecting first-team honors in 2001, and was tapped as the BIG EAST Player of the Week five times. She also led the Fighting Irish in steals in each of her final four seasons (1997-98 to 2000-01) and was the team's assist leader in her last three years, setting school records with 95 steals in 1999-2000 (since topped by Diggins) and 247 assists in 2000-01, along with a school-standard 2.67 assist/turnover ratio the latter season.

Ivey went on to play five seasons in the WNBA, beginning with her selection by the Indiana Fever in the second round (17th overall pick) of the 2001 WNBA Draft. She spent four seasons with the Fever, helping them to the first playoff berth in franchise history in 2002. Ivey signed with the Detroit Shock as a restricted free agent in 2005, and subsequently was acquired by the Phoenix Mercury later that season.

A native of St. Louis, Ivey graduated from Notre Dame's College of Arts and Letters in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in history.

25th Year at Notre Dame**

One of the nation's premier post coaches, Carol Owens just finished her 24th year at Notre Dame and her 15th as associate head coach for the Fighting Irish, having originally been elevated to that position by Muffet McGraw prior to the 2002-03 season (holding that role

through the 2004-05 campaign), and then again in the summer of 2012.

Throughout her tenure at Notre Dame, Owens has focused on working with the Irish post players, while also assisting with the program's nationally-ranked recruiting efforts. She has been a part of two national championship teams while in South Bend.

Owens was named the 2019 WBCA Division I Assistant Coach of the Year along with being inducted into the inaugural STEP UP Assistant Coach Hall of Fame. In 2014, she was chosen as the inaugural recipient of the A Step Up Assistant Coach of the Year Award. In 2001, she was named one of the top five assistant coaches in the country by Women's Basketball Journal, and in 2011, CollegelInsider.com named her as one of the top 15 active assistants in the nation.

Owens has had the magic touch when it comes to developing elite post players over the years, with no fewer than seven of her pupils (Natalie Achonwa, Jacqueline Batteast, Katryna Gaither, Ruth Riley, Devereaux Peters, Jessica Shepard and Brianna Turner) earning a combined 34 All-America honors during their college careers.

Between her coaching runs at Notre Dame, Owens spent five seasons (2005-10) as head coach at her alma mater, Northern Illinois University. Owens originally came to Notre Dame in 1995 following two seasons as an assistant at Michigan, where she began her coaching

career after enjoying a three-year professional playing stint in Japan, Spain and Italy.

As a standout player at Northern Illinois from 1985-90, Owens compiled a very impressive resume. A two-time Kodak (now WBCA) Coaches' All-District IV Team selection (1989 and 1990), Owens scored 2,102 points and averaged 18.0 points per game over four campaigns, covering 117 games. She also captained the Huskies for four seasons and, in her final collegiate campaign (1989-90), she guided NIU to the best record in school history (26-5), as the Huskies went undefeated in North Star Conference play (12-0) and earned the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament bid.

Owens finished her NIU career with 13 school records, most notably standing as Northern Illinois' all-time leader in scoring, blocked shots, free throws made, free throw attempts and field-goal percentage scoring games. In addition, she was the first player (male or female) in school history to score 2,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds.

A native of Chicago, Owens received her bachelor of arts degree in communications in 1990. She was selected by the faculty of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences to serve as Commencement Marshal of her graduating class and was named Northern Illinois' Outstanding Woman. In addition, Owens was the recipient of the Student Leadership Award.

**Alma Mater: Notre Dame '16  
Sixth Year at Notre Dame**

On August 26, 2019, Michaela Mabrey came home, joining then-Muffet McGraw's staff as an assistant coach. Now under Karen & Kevin Keyes Family Head Coach Niele Ivey, Michaela just

completed her fifth season in 2023-24. She also added the title of recruiting coordinator in 2022.

Years three through five have been extremely successful for Mabrey after bringing in Olivia Miles and Sonia Citron and serving as their position coach. Last season, Citron helped lead the Irish to a third consecutive Sweet 16 and an ACC Tournament title despite missing nine games with a knee sprain. In 2022-23, Mabrey and the Irish won the regular season ACC title. Miles was the ACC Player of the Year runner-up, and Citron made the All-ACC First Team.

In 2021-22, Notre Dame was the only program with two freshmen on ESPN's top-10 freshman list (Miles No. 2 / Citron No. 6). Additionally, the Irish were just one of two programs in all of Division I who had two freshmen both average double-digit points.

As a freshman, Miles ranked 2nd in the entire nation in assists per game (7.4), led the team in scoring (13.7 ppg), posted nine double-doubles, including two triple-doubles, and was a Nancy Lieberman Award Top 5 Finalist. Not to mention, she was First-Team All-ACC. Citron was the 2022 ACC Freshman of the Year after averaging 11.8 points, 6.6 rebounds. In fact, she was one of two freshmen in the entire country who averaged at least 11 points, 6 rebounds, 2 assists and 1.5 steals.

In her first year with the Irish, Mabrey was instantly recognized by the WBCA, landing on their Thirty Under 30 honoree list. Each honoree has exemplified their involvement in community service, mentorship and impact on others, professional manner, and attitude and professional association involvement.

Part of the winningest class in Notre Dame women's basketball history (2012-16), Mabrey's squads advanced to three Final Fours, including two title game appearances (2014 & 2015). The Irish also swept regular season and conference tournament titles all four years in which Mabrey was on campus (one Big East + three ACC). In addition, Mabrey served as a team captain in her final two seasons.

Over her time at Notre Dame, Mabrey emerged as one of the elite three-point shooters in the country. The New Jersey native finished her career with 228 made three-pointers (fifth all-time), a 39.6 three-point shooting percentage (sixth all-time) and played in 142 total games (ninth all-time). Michaela and her sister Marina were the only two Fighting Irish players to make at least 60 three-pointers in three seasons.

After graduation, Mabrey became the coordinator of program and player development at the University of Miami for the 2016-17 season, aiding the staff in preparing scouting material and conducting on-campus recruiting visits. The following year, Mabrey moved to Miami (Ohio) as an assistant, where the Redhawks went on to produce a 21-11 record and recorded the biggest turn-around that year in NCAA Division I by a first-year coaching staff.

For the 2018-19 season, Mabrey accepted a Director of Recruiting position at LSU. There she coordinated the daily recruiting operational and logistical processes for the women's basketball program.

Third Year at Notre Dame

This past year was Allen's second season as an assistant coach at Notre Dame. She was critical in developing ACC Rookie and Defensive Player of the Year Hannah Hidalgo, serving as her position coach and helping lead her to breaking nearly every

freshman program record on the books. Hidalgo led the nation with 4.6 steals per game and was the country's No. 2 scoring freshman with 22.6 points per contest. Both of those marks are also Notre Dame single-season program records across all classes.

During her inaugural year back on campus, the former Irish guard helped lead Notre Dame to a regular season ACC title using elite guard play. Along with Mabrey, Allen helped coach All-American Olivia Miles and All-ACC shooter Sonia Citron, leading Notre Dame to a second straight Sweet 16 berth.

Karen & Kevin Keyes Family Notre Dame women's basketball head coach Niele Ivey announced Charel Allen as the new assistant coach on July 20, 2022. Allen graduated from Notre Dame in 2008, becoming one of three current Irish coaches to have graduated from the school.

Allen was a two-time All-American, two-time First Team All-Big East selection and served as team captain over her final two seasons at Notre Dame. Allen averaged team bests 17.0 points and 6.2 rebounds as a junior then led the Irish to a Sweet 16 berth during her senior year, scoring a career-high 35 points in a second-round overtime win over Oklahoma – which still stands as the second-best Irish scoring performance in the NCAA Tournament.

She was the first player in school history to amass

1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 200 steals in her career. In fact, she still ranks 15th on the all-time scoring list with 1,566 career points.

Allen was selected in the third round of the 2008 WNBA Draft by the then Sacramento Monarchs, helping the team advance to the '08 WNBA Playoffs.

In 2009, Allen made the leap overseas and played professionally in Bulgaria for eight seasons. Allen was a five-time Bulgarian League champion in addition to being named a four-time All-Bulgarian League First Team selection, with Player of the Year honors in 2014.

In the summer of 2017, Allen made the shift to the coaching ranks and joined the staff at Cal State Fullerton. She was then promoted to associate head coach in May of 2021.

At Fullerton, Allen helped with recruiting along with coaching the wings for the Titans. In her first year, Allen saw her shooting guard Hannah Thompson average 12.4 points per game and convert 72 three-pointers – fifth most for a single season. A year later, freshman Amiee Book went on to win the Big West Sixth Player of the Year award and now ranks third in program history for three-point shooting percentage. Ranks all-time among ND sophomores: sixth in points (484), eighth in scoring average (14.7), tied for 6th in total 3s (48), sixth in 3FG% (.400), tied for sixth in total FTM (94) and second in minutes/game (33.5).

Second Year at Notre Dame

Knox joined the Irish as the new player development program director on June 12, 2023 and had an immensely successful first season in South Bend. Individually, he primarily worked with Irish forward Maddy Westbeld, who posted her best all-around

season on the court to date. Westbeld finished the season averaging 14.4 points and 8.7 rebounds per game, and she was named to the All-ACC Second Team. With 297 total rebounds, Westbeld's season on the boards now ranks eighth in program history. Knox's role in Westbeld's life was arguably even bigger off the court, as he augmented her work ethic and leadership skills helping her find her voice.

Prior to coming to Notre Dame, Knox spent nearly a decade working with the Indiana Fever as an interim head coach, assistant coach and player development coach. During his tenure in Indianapolis, Knox helped lead the team to eight consecutive WNBA playoff appearances and was a 2012 WNBA champion. He wore many hats for the program throughout his time, helping with everything from scouting to rehabilitation training to practice preparation. He has worked with many notable players, including Olympic gold medalist and former Irish guard Skylar Diggins, four-time Olympic gold medalist Tamika Catchings and five-time WNBA All-Star Katie Douglas.

"I'm super excited to add Carlos Knox to our coaching staff," Ivey said after his hire. "He has been instrumental in the development of some of the best players in both the WNBA and NBA, and he brings a wealth of knowledge and expertise to our team. My vision for our program is to continue developing NEXT LEVEL pros, and I believe Carlos will help continue and elevate that mission!"

Knox has also had stints as an assistant coach at the University of Cincinnati (2020-21), University of North Texas (2017-20) and San Diego State University (2010-11). Finally, Knox spent time from 2015-16 as the director of training at the Jonathan Byrd Grand Park Fieldhouse, Indiana's state-of-the-art basketball facility.

The former point guard had a lengthy and decorated career as a collegiate player after attending high school outside of Dayton, Ohio. While earning a degree in communications from IUPUI from 1994-98, he was a two-time NCAA scoring champion, NCAA All-American and NCAA Player of the Year. His jersey has been retired at IUPUI, and the team became a Division I program just after his graduation due in part to Knox's contributions. He was inducted into the IUPUI Hall of Fame in 2004.
