CHRISTINE HALFPENNY WOMEN'S LACROSSE HEAD COACH

14th Season at Notre Dame 18th as a Head Coach at the DI Level

Christine Halfpenny enters her 14th season as head coach of the Notre Dame women's lacrosse program in 2025 after leading the Irish to the NCAA tournament in nine of the previous 10 completed seasons.

The 2024 season saw unprecedented success for the Irish as Halfpenny led the team to break numerous program records, including most points in a game, most draw controls in a game, most goals in a season, most assists in a season, and most points in a season. The 2024 season featured two IWLCA All-Americans in Jackie Wolak and Kasey Choma, a record six IWLCA All-Region honorees, and the first Tewaaraton Finalist (Wolak) since 2016. Last season also included the program's first-ever victory over a top-ranked team when they defeated regional rival Northwestern, 14-10, at home. Other notable wins in 2024 include the program's first win at Boston College since 2003 and their first program win in Chapel Hill when they beat UNC in a defensive 7-5 battle in early March.

In 2023, Halfpenny guided the team to its sixth Elite Eight in program history and second in three years, following road wins over the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament, becoming the only unseeded team to advance to the Elite Eight round. The 2023 season saw the program's largest road win in team history and most goals scored in an NCAA Tournament game by the Irish. Other notable victories in 2023 include snapping UNC's ACC win-streak with a 16-12 victory over the then-No. 3 Tar Heels in Indiana, and a 15-13 win over Virginia in the ACC Quarterfinals. The 2023 season saw six Irish honored as All-Americans, including Madison Ahern, Kasey Choma, Lilly Callahan, Kelly Denes, Hannah Dorney, and Jackie Wolak.

The 2022 season saw the team earn a berth in the NCAA Tournament following a 9-9 record through the ACC Tournament. The Irish, led by Halfpenny, advanced to the ACC Semifinals where they lost. heartbreaker to top seeded North Carolina, 14-13.

Halfpenny helped guide the Irish to the Elite Eight for the fifth time in program history in 2021 and sixth ranked wins, including a trio of top-lo victories against Duke (2x) and Virginia. Bridget Deehan was named a First Team IWLCA All-American while Kasey Choma earned Second Team IWLCA All-American honors. En route to the NCAA Quarterfinals, the Irish won two home NCAA Tournament contests for the first time in program history and notched the first-ever shutout in the history of the NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Tournament with a 16-0 triumph over Robert Morris in the opening round.

In a 2020 season that was shortened due to CoVID-19, Halfpenny led the Irish to a 7-0 record and a #2 national ranking, which tied the 2004 squad for the highest ranking in program history. Four Irish earned Inside Lacrosse All-American honors in the abbreviated season, including Andie Aldave (First Team), Kasey Choma (Third Team), Bridget Deehan (First Team) and Madison Ahern (Second Team). Ahern was also named IL's Freshman of the Year and Deehan was named Goaltender of the Year.

The Irish returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2019 after going a program-best 5-2 in ACC play. Notre Dame finished the 2019 campaign with a 14-5 mark, and the 14 victories tied the 2016 Irish squad for the third-most in a single season in program history. Notre Dame's season included a 9-7 triumph over North Carolina, marking Notre Dame's first-ever win over the Tar Heels. The Irish landed three IWLCA All-Americans, including Andie Aldave (First Team), Samantha Giacolone (Third Team) and Maddie Howe (Honorable Mention). Aldave, Giacolone and Howe joined Hannah Proctor as First Team All-ACC selections, while Savannah Buchanan earned Second Team All-ACC accolades. The four First-Team All-ACC selections are the most the Irish have earned since joining the conference in 2014, and the five total honorees tie the 2016 Irish squad for the most recognitions since becoming an ACC member.

Notre Dame made its sixth consecutive trip to the NCAA Championships in 2017. The Irish ultimately finished the season 11-8 with a 4-3 record in ACC play, matching the program's best record since joining the conference in 2013-14. Notre Dame, which finished third overall in the ACC, led the conference in ground balls and caused turnovers per game. Notre Dame's season was highlighted by a 16-7 victory over then-No. 4 Syracuse in which the Irish seniors tallied 13 points. The Irish landed three All-ACC selections, including Casey Pearsall (first team), Cortney Fortunato (first team) and Alex Dalton (second team). Both Casey Pearsall and Cortney Fortunato were named to the Tewaaraton Watch List, and both players received All-America honors.

The 2016 Irish earned a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the first time since 2009. Notre Dame finished 14-7 overall and 4-3 in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Halfpenny's team played a schedule that featured five regular-season, top-10 opponents and 12 teams eventually selected to play in the NCAA Championship. She coached her team to an 8-2 record on their home turf, including two top-10 wins at Arlotta Stadium. Her squad included three IWLCA All-Americans: Cortney Fortunato (first team), Barbara Sullivan (first team) and Casey Pearsall (third team). Three Irish players, including Alex Dalton, Cortney Fortunato and Barbara Sullivan, landed on the Tewaaraton Watch List. Halfpenny's roster received five All-ACC accolades, the most all-conference picks by an Irish team since 2004 (six Big East selections).

The 2015 Irish continued striding towards Halfpenny's lofty goals for the program as the Irish beat three top-seven teams on the road en route to an ACC semifinal berth and another trip to the NCAAs. The squad saw four of its members pick up All-America honors in Cortney Fortunato (first-team), Barbara Sullivan (first-team), Alex Dalton (second-team) and Casey Pearsall (third-team). Sullivan also became the school's first-ever defensive finalist for

the Tewaaraton Trophy and just its second finalist overall. Meanwhile, Katherine McManus earned the Yeardley Reynolds Love Unsung Hero Award for her well-rounded contributions to the community and Caitlin Gargan became the latest in a succession of IWLCA Academic Honor Roll recipients.

That success built off of a 2014 season which saw Notre Dame earn a top-eight NCAA Championship seed and play host to its NCAA regional for the first time since 2009. Margaret Smith picked up first-team All-America honors while Cortney Fortunato claimed a second-team award along with WomensLax. com Rookie of the Year award. Smith was a Tewaaraton Trophy nominee and the co-Defensive Player of the Year nationally. Senior Molly Shawhan earned her second consecutive Yeardley Reynolds Love Unsung Hero finalist spot for her tireless work off of the field as well.

The Irish suffered no sophomore slump under Halfpenny in 2013 as the team went 12-5 and again secured a berth to the NCAA Tournament. Notre Dame beat three ranked foes in 2013 and opened the season on a 10-game winning streak, matching the 2004 school record. Barbara Sullivan was named a first-team All-American after the season, leading a defense that ranked amongst the top five teams nationally in both caused turnovers and ground balls. Overall, the 2013 Irish featured five All-BIG EAST players, five IWLCA West/Midwest all-region picks and 18 BIG EAST Academic All-Stars.

The Irish turned in quite a year in Halfpenny's first campaign at the helm of the program as they finished 13-5 in 2012 and earned bids to



both the BIG EAST and NCAA Tournaments. The 13 regular season wins was tied for first in school history, while the 13 wins overall was tied for third in school annals. Notre Dame knocked off five ranked teams during the year as it raced out to an 8-0 start, which was the second-best start in school history and the best since 2004. Halfpenny became the first coach in BIG EAST history to start out 8-0 in their opening year at the helm of their program.

Halfpenny helped tutor five All-BIG EAST and IWLCA West/Midwest all-region performers and two All-Americans. Earning All-BIG EAST and All-Region honors were Maggie Tamasitis, Margaret Smith, Barbara Sullivan, Megan Sullivan and Lindsay Powell. Tamasitis went on to earn second team All-America honors, while Smith was a third teamer.

In the classroom, the 2012 squad was an IWLCA Academic Squad team (combined GPA of 3.0 or higher), while three student-athletes made the IWLCA Academic Honor Roll (Kelly Driscoll, McKenzie Brown and Adelle Bruggeman).

Halfpenny came to Notre Dame from William & Mary, where her teams achieved four straight 10-win seasons and a pair of regular-season conference titles over her final four seasons with the program.

Halfpenny's Tribe squads captured Colonial Athletic Association regular-season titles in both 2008 and 2009 – and she merited CAA coach-of-the-year honors in 2008. Her teams combined for a 20-8 record in league play (including four straight conference tournament bids) – as William & Mary reached double digits in victories each of the last four seasons (10-7 in 2011 and 2009, 10-8 in 2010, 10-9 in 2008). Those four consecutive 10-win seasons matched the best previous stretch in program history.

"Chris brings to Notre Dame the experiences of having been involved with multiple programs and teams that have been to the NCAA final four, won conference titles and produced All-Americans," said Notre Dame vice president and athletics director Jack Swarbrick at the time of her hire. "From a coaching, recruiting and academic standpoint, she understands exactly what the expectations are here at Notre Dame and what it will take for our program to take the next set of steps forward."

Notre Dame's newest head coach tutored two All-Americans at William & Mary, to go along with 26 all-conference selections and 10 all-region honorees. Her 2011 squad became the first in CAA history to receive awards for player of the year, defensive player of the year and rookie of the year in the same season.

Her five seasons with the Tribe produced

single-season records for points (347 in 2009), goals (244 in 2009), draw controls (269 in 2009), caused turnovers (third nationally in 2010 at 12.61 per game) and saves (211 in 2008).

In the classroom Halfpenny's players earned 59 combined CAA Commissioner's Academic Awards from 2007-2010, as well as five William & Mary Provost Awards.

Halfpenny went to Williamsburg in the summer of 2006 after three years (2004-2006) as the top women's lacrosse assistant coach at Duke University.

The Blue Devils won the 2005 Atlantic Coast Conference postseason tournament title, won or shared three straight ACC regular-season crowns and made three straight NCAA Championships appearances, advancing to the national semifinals in both 2005 and 2006.

Halfpenny worked specifically with goaltenders at Duke, assisting Megan Huether in 2005 in earning first-team All-America honors. She played a key role in producing three recruiting classes at Duke that ranked among the top four in the nation (including the number-one-rated class in 2005 by Inside Lacrosse). The 2004 Duke team produced the top women's lacrosse grade-point average in the country (3.46).

Halfpenny also spent a season as an assistant women's lacrosse coach at her alma mater, Virginia Tech, in 2003, directing recruiting and serving as offensive coordinator. She began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Brown University in 2001 and 2002.

Off the field Halfpenny has worked with several national committees including the IWLCA All-American committee, NCAA regional advisory committee, the Tewaaraton Award committee and the IWLCA North-South Game selections.

Before joining the college coaching ranks she spent one year as boys' and girls' swimming coach and assistant varsity tennis coach (winning the Virginia Boys AAA state swimming title) at Cave Spring High School in Roanoke, Va.

A four-year letter-winner in women's lacrosse at Virginia Tech, Halfpenny started on the 1999 Hokie team that won the Atlantic 10 Conference championship, finished 11-6 and achieved a program-first top-20 ranking. She received the coaches award that year and was a two-time member of the athletic director's honor roll (1998, 1999). She graduated in 1999 with a degree in health and physical education. Þ

OPENING WEEKEND FOR THE IRISH

It's that time of year again as the Notre Dame women's lacrosse team is set for their opening weekend.

No. 13 Notre Dame will open up their 2025 season on the road as they travel to Evanston, Ill. to take on No. 2 Northwestern on Friday, Feb. 7 at 8 p.m. ET (7 p.m. CT). The Irish will then open up at home on Sunday, Feb. 9 as they host Central Michigan at 1 p.m. at Loftus Sports Center.

The Irish are no stranger to the tall-task of taking on a top Wildcat program – Notre Dame did it in record-setting fashion just last year.

For the first time in program history, the No. 8 Fighting Irish women's lacrosse team knocked off the No. 1 team in the country, defeating top-ranked Northwestern by a score of 14-10 in Loftus Sports Center on February 16, 2024. The Irish snapped Northwestern's 22-game winning streak.

While the Irish were led by three 2024 graduates of Jackie Wolak, Madison Ahern, and Abby Maichin in the big win, Notre Dame will have a young group of talent coming into this year's matchup hungry to start the season.

The Irish will lean on key leaders **Grace** Weigand (D), Meghan O'Hare (M), Kathryn Morrissey (M), Franny O'Brien (M), and Abigail Lyons (D) as returning starters.

Other returners who will be seen this season feature Wynter Jock (A), Kristen Shanahan (M), and Isabel Pithie and Malie Follet in goal. After Friday's opening day on the road, Notre Dame will host the Chippewas in Loftus on Sunday. The Irish are a perfect 4-0 against Central Michigan with their last match up being last season as Notre Dame won in dominating fashion 22-3.

A LOOK AHEAD

The 2025 season features 15 regular season games with eight at home and seven on the road. Nine conference games are set for this upcoming spring season after the additions of Cal and Stanford to the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2024.

"This year's schedule has us entering a new era of ACC lacrosse with an expanded conference and new scheduling model," said Notre Dame Women's Lacrosse Head Coach Christine Halfpenny.

"The ACC will again be one of the strongest conferences in the country. We're excited to attack the games in front of us this year both in and out of conference beginning with a great season opening regional rivalry with Northwestern."

Her father, Todd, was an All-American lacrosse player at Notre Dame ('98), while her grandfather and great-grandfather were both All-American football players for the Irish.





WATCH OUT FOR WEIGAND

Senior defender **Weigand** was recently named to 2025 Tewaaraton Watch list and also received USA Lacrosse Magazine Women's Preseason All-American Honorable Mention honors.

She finished the 2024 season playing in 20 games and recorded 24 ground balls and forced 17 turnovers.



TWO NEW ADDITIONS TO THE COACHING STAFF

Head Coach Christ Halfpenny introduced two new additions to the staff in August 2024 as she welcomed **Caroline Curnal** and **Ellie Masera** to the Irish.

Curnal, a 2023 Villanova graduate, started 47 of the 54 games she played in and totaled 94 points and 17 assists for 111 points. In addition to her record 382 draws, she had 34 ground balls and 14 caused turnovers.

She helped guide the program to a 15-5 season, where they advanced all the way to the NCAA quarterfinal round in 2024. Penn ranked as high as fifth during the course of the regular season, boasted one of the strongest defensive units in the country, and saw Niki Miles break program records for draw controls in a game and a season.

Miles was one of four first-team All-Ivy and three All-Americans on the roster, and another of those All-America picks (Izzy Rohr) was the Ivy League Defender of the Year for the second straight season. She capped off her Wildcat career as the team captain and draw specialist, breaking the program's career draw record with 382 and the single-single season mark with 155.

She finished with 41 goals and eight assists, scoring in 14 of the 17 games, and earned a spot on the All-BIG EAST first team. That was her second appearance on the first team, as she also garnered the honor in 2022 when she also was first-team IWLCA All-Region.

Masera, a recent 2024 graduate from Stony Brook, joins the Notre Dame program as an assistant coach after an outstanding fouryear career with the Seawolves and a rookie season in the professional league with Athletes Unlimited.

Masera was a decorated midfielder in her four year career at Stony Brook.

She was a 2024 Tewaaraton finalist, the second player in program history, alongside former Notre Dame attacker and all-time Irish points leader, Jackie Wolak (2020-2024).

The two-time IWLCA, USA Lacrosse Magazine, and ILWomen All-American was the third pick in the AU Pro Lax Draft in April. Masera was also named the 2023 and 2024 CAA Midfielder of the Year and the 2022 America East Midfielder of the Year.

She finished her senior season as the fifth-best goal scorer in Division I (77) and finished second in points (117), also leading the nation as a senior in shots on goal and shots on goal per game. Masera finished her college career with 232 goals, 317 points, and a program record of 388 draw controls.



THE BIG THREE

The Irish graduated 17 seniors and graduate students a season ago, including three individuals in **Madison Ahern, Kasey Choma and Jackie Wolak**, who spent five years with the program, shattering numerous records during their tenure.

The trio combined for 964 career points over their five years together, the most of any teammates in program history.

Since their arrival to campus in 2020, Choma, Ahern and Wolak sat atop the team leaderboard in nearly every offensive category. Ahern's 60 goals in 2024 led the team while Choma had posted the team's top mark the four years prior.

During her career, Wolak never surrendered her title of assists leader and posted a teambest 100+ points in both 2023 and 2024. Ahern led the team in points during 2020 and 2022 while Wolak took the top spot in 2021.

All three rank among the program's single season goal leaders with Choma holding two spots at three and eight, Ahern holds the sixth and seventh all time spots and Wolak's 2024 total holds the 10th place.

Wolak also holds three of the top-10 spots for single season assists while the trio combine for four of the top-10 spots in total points for a given year.

Career leaders include Choma holding the top spot for games played (85) while Ahern and Wolak sit tied for second with 84. Choma and Ahern sit second and third respectively in all-time goals while Wolak holds the top-spot for assists (153). Ahern's 89 career assists ranks her fourth all-time.

All three rank in the top-10 for career points: Wolak (1st; 341), Ahern (3rd; 317), Choma (5th; 306). The trio was also the first set of teammates to surpass 300 career points and are three of only five individuals in program history to hit 300+ points.

The three combine for 10 Inside Lacrosse/ ILWomen All-American honors, 10 IWLCA All-Region/All-American honors, eight USA Lacrosse Magazine honors, and eight Tewaraaton watchlist candidiasis.

A 2024 Tewaaraton finalist, Wolak set the program record for career points (341) and assists (153). Her 110 points last season was also



third-best in program history and set her apart from the rest as the only individual to record multiple 100+ point seasons at Notre Dame. Her 110 points finished atop the ACC last season and ranked fourth in the country.

In two NCAA Tournament games a season ago, Wolak's 18 points ranked among the best in the nation.

With six points in the first quarter of the team's NCAA First Round game vs. Coastal Carolina was a program best while her nine assists through three quarters played that day also set a program best.

The trio of Ahern, Wolak, and Choma scored in nearly every contest during their five years with Wolak's 78-game streak to end her career being a program record.


Wolak became the program's first-ever ACC Attacker of the Year honoree when she was named the conference's top attacker in 2024 As a freshman, Ahern earned National Rookie of the Year honors from Inside Lacrosse. Ahern was the 2023 ACC Postgraduate scholarship award recipient.

IRISH IN THE PROS

With the start of the WLL in 2025, it didn't take long for the Irish to get picked up.

Five Notre Dame Women's Lacrosse alums were all selected to the Boston Guard: Madison Ahern ('24), Kasey Choma ('24), Jackie Wolak ('24), Hannah Dorney ('23), and Andie Aldave ('21).

The Boston Guards will open up their season on Feb. 12 in Springfield, VA as they take on the California Palms.
