	COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP
lK	In the final regular season series of 2023-24, Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson coached his 1,000th career game as a Division I head coach. The Irish rolled to a convincing 6-1 victory over Minnesota in the contest to celebrate the historic career of their leader, which spans 25 seasons over two programs; Lake Superior State University and the University of Notre Dame.
599	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson has 599 career wins, which leads active NCAA Division I head coaches, spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and now 20 seasons at Notre Dame. Jackson's win total ranks ninth all-time for most wins at the NCAA Division I level.
50	The Irish coaching staff of Jeff Jackson, Paul Pooley and Andy Slaggert are in year 20 coaching together in 2024–25. The trio of coaches started together in 2005 and have gone on to record great success with the program, including multiple Frozen Fours and two national championship games.
18	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson has guided his teams at Lake Superior State and Notre Dame to 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, including winning NCAA Championships with the Lakers in 1992 and 1994, while guiding the Irish to their only four Frozen Four appearances in program history: 2008, 2011, 2017 and 2018.
17	Seventeen sets of brothers have now suited up for the Irish. Current Irish siblings include Henry and Danny Nelson while Justin Janicke (brother Trevor graduated in 2024) and Carter Slaggert (brothers Graham '22 and Landon '24) both have brothers who previously suited up for the Irish.
13	With Nate Clurman's NHL debut in late December, the Irish have 13 alumni currently competing in the NHL. The 2021 Notre Dame grad joins fellow Irish alumni Andrew Peeke (BOS), Dennis Gilbert (BUF), TJ Tynan (COL), Jake Evans (MTL), Spencer Stastney (NSH), Anders Lee (NYI), Kyle Palmieri (NYI), Bryan Rust (PIT), Alex Steeves (TOR), Cal Burke (VGK) and Ian Cole (UHC) in the show this season. Landon Slaggert is the most recent Irish alum to lace up in the NHL this season after being recalled by the Chicago Blackhawks on Jan. 26.
11	Prior to puck drop Friday night, the team will honor 11 individuals for their dedication to the program as part of its senior night celebration
10	Veteran leadership: Notre Dame's roster features 10 seniors and graduate students in 2024-25. Current graduates Grant Silianoff and Zach Plucinski have spent all five seasons at Notre Dame and earned their undergraduate degrees in May 2024.
8	With the most recent being the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history – each under Jeff Jackson (three regular-season).
7	The Irish have seven draft picks on their roster in 2024-25 and have had at least one individual selected in each of the past 22 NHL Entry Level Drafts.
4	The Irish announced ahead of the season opener that four seniors and graduate students will serve as team leaders this year.

QUICK HITS

- The Irish are set to face off against the third-ranked Michigan State Spartans this weekend in the regular season finale.
- The two teams previously met in East Lansing, Michigan, earlier this season with the Spartans skating away with a one-goal victory in their last tilt.
- Prior to Friday night's puck drop, the team will honor its senior class with an on-ice ceremony set to begin at 6:45 p.m.
- Eleven seniors and grad students are set to be recognized Friday as part of senior night.
- Friday's contest will also serve as the annual Irish Wear Green game.
- Following Saturday's contest, fans are encouraged to stick around for a short ceremony honoring Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson in his final home game.
- The Irish roster currently boasts four individuals with 20+ points, including Knuble
 who leads the team with 34 points (11-23-34). His 23 assists is the most for an Irish
 skater since Bobby Nardella in 2018-19, and most by a forward since Jake Evans in
 2017-18.
- Senior Justin Janicke holds a career-best 31 points on the season thus far off 13 goals
 and 18 assists. With his totals, the forward has posted career-bests in goals, assists and
 points this season.
- Janicke also leads the team in goals with 13 alongside Danny Nelson. The pair picked
 up four points last weekend at Wisconsin to sit tied in first on the team for goals.
 Nelson's 24 total points (13–11–24) ranks fourth on the team and is one shy of Blake
 Biondi's 25 (12–13–25).
- Prior to their tilts at Minnesota, Justin Janicke was appointed captain by his teammates, as announced by Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach on Jan. 18.
- The Irish team returned 19 student-athletes from the 2023-24 roster, including 11 forwards, six defensemen and two goaltenders. The forwards include graduate senior Grant Silianoff and seniors Justin Janicke, Hunter Strand and Tyler Carpenter. Returning defensemen include four who appeared in the final series of the 2023-24 season in Michael Mastrodomenico, Paul Fischer, Zach Plucinski and Henry Nelson.
- Notre Dame returned two 20+ point scorers from a season ago as Danny Nelson (9-14-23) and Cole Knuble (9-11-20) are now in their sophomore seasons with the Irish.
- In total, eight returners posted double-digit points last season. In addition to Nelson
 and Knuble, Hunter Strand (4-15-19), Justin Janicke (4-12-16), Paul Fischer (2-14-16),
 Brennan Ali (3-10-13), Maddox Fleming (3-9-12) and Grant Silianoff (4-7-11) look to
 improve upon their double-digit performances a season ago.
- At the last line of defense, the Irish return Jack Williams in goal and added two new netminders to the mix in Nicholas Kempf (USNTDP) and Owen Say (Mercyhurst).
- The Irish added 10 new faces to the squad in 2024–25, including five freshmen and

five transfers. The 10 newcomers consist of five forwards, three defensemen and two qoaltenders.

THANK YOU SENIORS

- The Irish are set to honor its veteran group Friday evening with senior night. Prior to
 puck drop, the team will recognize the 11 members of its graduating class with an
 on-ice ceremony.
- Those being recognized include seniors Hunter Weiss, Justin Janicke, Hunter Strand, Ryan Helliwell, Tyler Carpenter and Jimmy Mooney, in addition to its graduate students Grant Silianoff, Ian Murphy, Zach Plucinski, Blake Biondi and Luke Robinson.
- The group has combined to play in 856 games for the Gold and Blue, and owns 266 points off 100 goals and 166 assists.
- The graduating class has been a part of great success at Notre Dame and left their impact on the program, including two NCAA tournament appearances, numerous conference honors and 83 Irish victories.

NOTRE DAME VS. MICHIGAN STATE

- The Irish close out the regular season with a two-game series against Michigan State.
- The two teams met earlier this year in which the Irish dropped a close game two to the Spartans, 4-3.
- In their last meeting, Blake Biondi set a career-high in points with the Irish, registering
 a goal and two assists as the Irish fell to the Spartans in game two of the weekend
 series.
- Three individuals, including Biondi, registered three points on the weekend as Danny Nelson's two goals in game one was followed up by an assist on Saturday night. Paul Fischer led the team with three assists on the weekend.
- With an assist in game one of the series, freshman Jack Larrigan registered his first collegiate point.
- The last time these two teams clashed inside Compton Family Ice Arena, the Irish earned a weekend split with the Spartans to open February 2024.
- Cole Knuble and Justin Janicke each posted two points in the game one win over the Spartans as the Irish earned the 4-1 victory.

TEAM LEADERS

- A pair of two-point games at Wisconsin give the team's leader in points, Cole Knuble, 34 on the year. In 28 games played for the Irish as a sophomore, Knuble is averaging 1.21 points per game and boasts the most points by an Irish forward since Jake Evans during the 2017–18 campaign. He's currently tied for the most points by an Irish skater since Bobby Nardella in 2018–19.
- For the first time since that 2018-19 campaign, the Irish boast multiple 30+-point
 scorers in a single season after Justin Janicke's four point weekend at Wisconsin. The
 senior joins Knuble in the 30-point club and currently ranks tied for the team-best in
 goals with 13.
- Danny Nelson's two goals on the road at Wisconsin give him 13 on the year which is tied with Janicke for a team-best.
- After recording assists on both Irish goals in game two at Penn State, Cole Knuble became the first to 30 points. The sophomore center now boasts 11 goals and 23 assists and was recently named a nominee for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award.
- Averaging just under an assist per game, Knuble's 0.82 average through 28 games played ranks sixth nationally and leads all conference foes. Nationally, his 23 assists ranks 12th overall while it leads the conference.
- Justin Janicke scored the team's first shorthanded goal of the season in the win over
 Michigan en route to his three-goal and five-point night, both career bests for the
 senior. Janicke net his second career shorthanded tally at Penn State and boasts the
 team's only two on the penalty kill this season.

- Grant Silianoff joins him as the only other Irish skater with a shorthanded tally this season after his goal Saturday at Wisconsin during a six-on-four chance.
- Cole Knuble's game-winning goal in overtime against Wisconsin in November was his third of the season which leads the team.
- With 45 blocks on the season thus far, Zach Plucinski leads the team and is just six shy
 of 200 career blocked shots.
- Sitting at a plus-eight on-ice rating, Knuble leads the team.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Prior to the start of Big Ten Conference play, Owen Say was named Co-Goalie of the Month by the HCA for the month of October. In the opening month of competition, the junior netminder went 3-0-0 in the crease and led the nation in both save percentage (.969) and goals against average (1.00).
- Ahead of the weekend series at Minnesota, Say was named to the Mike Richter Award Watch List. The Richter Award is presented annually to the top NCAA Division I men's ice hockey netminder.
- Cole Knuble was named a Hobey Baker Memorial Award nominee in late January with
 fan voting open now through March 9th. His 18 assists is top-10 nationally while his 27
 points leads the team and ranks 14th in the country.

NHL NOTES

- The Irish had 25 alumni invited to NHL training camps in September, including six individuals from the 2023-24 roster.
- The program was represented at over half of the NHL camps to take place, including three with the Boston Bruins - Andrew Peeke, Drew Bavaro and Ryan Bischel.
- Seventeen teams hosted Notre Dame alums during their respective training camps and seven featured multiple individuals with Irish ties.
- Landon Slaggert, who made his NHL debut in March 2024 following the conclusion of his senior season with the Irish, joined fellow Irish alum and classmate Ryder Rolston in Chicago at the Blackhawks' camp.
- lan Cole and Robbie Russo became the program's first ever representatives within the
 Utah Hockey Club, competing in a handful of preseason games for the newest NHL
 franchise this fall. Cole became an unrestricted free agent in July 2024 and signed a
 one-year deal with Utah to become the first Irish alum in the organization's history.
- The Islanders training camp featured a pair of NHL veterans and Irish alums in Anders
 Lee and Kyle Palmieri. Lee has spent the entirety of his career with the Islanders
 organization and was the last Irish player to make his NHL debut in the same season as
 his collegiate career before Landon Slaggert did so in March 2024.
- Lee became the 15th captain of the Islanders in 2018–19 and this season will mark his seventh as captain.
- Nate Clurman and Bryan Rust joined each other at the Pittsburgh Penguins training camp while Vinnie Hinstroza and Spencer Stastney were together in Nashville. Dennis Gilbert and Graham Slaggert were both present at the Buffalo Sabres' camp.
- TJ Tynan (Colorado Avalnche), Jake Evans (Montreal Canadiens), Nick Leivermann (Washington Capitals), Trevor Janicke (Calgary Flames), Cal Petersen (Philadelphia Flyers), Cal Burke (Vegas Golden Knights), Patrick Moynihan (Los Angeles Kings), Alex Steeves (Toronto Maple Leafs), Ryan Siedem (New York Rangers) and Tory Dello (Detroit Red Wings) all spent time at various NHL training camps as well this fall.

 alumni named, including Andrew Peeke (BOS), Dennis Gilbert (BUF), Jake Evans (MTL),
 Spencer Stastney (NSH), Anders Lee (NYI), Kyle Palmieri (NYI), Bryan Rust (PIT), and Ian
 Cole (UHC).
- After a successful early start with the Colorado Eagles of the AHL, TJ Tynan was called
 up for eight games with the Colorado Avalanche. Tallying an assist against Nashville, it
 was his second career NHL point and first since the 2019-20 season.
- Cal Burke made his debut with the Vegas Golden Knights on Wednesday, Nov. 21,
 marking the ninth Irish alum to lace up his skates in the NHL this season. The 2020
 graduate scored his first NHL goal in his second game with the Golden Knights (Nov. 23
 vs. Montreal).
- On Sunday, Dec. 29, Nate Clurman made his NHL debut for the Pittsburgh Penguins, becoming the 43rd player in program history to reach the Show and 29th Irish alum during Coach Jackson's tenure.
- Vinnie Hinostroza made his debut with the Nashville Predators on December 30, 2024
 and has since played four games with the Tennessee organization. After leading the
 AHL in points through the first half to earn the call-up, Hinostroza marked the 12th
 Irish alum to lace up his skates in the NHL this year.
- Landon Slaggert became the most recent to make his NHL season debut as he made his first appearance of 2024-25 for the Chicago Blackhawks on Tuesday, Jan. 28, marking 13 Irish alumni in the Show this season.
- Slaggert set a Chicago Blackhawks record for fastest goal after earning his first NHL start on Feb. 1. His goal came just seven seconds into the contest against the reigning Stanley Cup champions and marked the fastest NHL goal since Mitch Marner (TOR) in 2019

THE LAST DANCE

- After 20 seasons behind the Irish bench, this weekend's games against Michigan State will
 be Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson's final regular season games at Notre
 Dame
- Jackson joined the Irish in 2005 and has elevated the program to new heights during his tenure, including 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and four Frozen Fours.
- In just his second year with the Irish, Jackson returned the program to the national stage
 as he led the team to the 2007 NCAA regional final. The following year, Jackson and his
 squad returned to the NCAA Tournament, this time earning a berth to the Frozen Four for
 the first time in program history.
- Returning the program to national prominence was just one of many accomplishments for Jackson behind the Irish bench.
- In 20 seasons at Notre Dame, Jackson saw 29 alumni go on to play in the National Hockey League, most recently when Nate Clurman ('21) made his debut for the Pittsburgh Penquins on December 29, 2024.
- Last season he reached multiple career milestones, including his 1,000th NCAA Division I
 game coached and his 400th win at Notre Dame. Already the all-time winningest coach
 in program history at 417 victories behind the Irish bench, Jackson ranks ninth all-time
 among all NCAA DI hockey coaches and is the winningest active coach at 599 career wins.
- He coached five Academic All-Americans at Notre Dame and saw three student-athletes get drafted in the first round of the NHL Entry Level Draft.
- In 26 years coaching at the Division I level, Jackson has twice been named the Spencer Penrose Award winner, presented annually to the top collegiate hockey coach, and is a three-time CCHA Coach of the Year honoree.
- He has led his teams to 18 NCAA Tournaments, seven Frozen Fours, five national championship games, and won two National Championships (at Lake Superior State).
- In addition to his collegiate coaching career, he was also a founder of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program and served as an assistant coach at the 1998 Winter Olympics in Nagano, Japan.
- Jackson will lead his Irish in a clash against his alma mater, Michigan State, this weekend
 in his final regular season series.

CATALINO FAMILY HEAD HOCKEY COACH JEFF JACKSON



- The 2024-25 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson's 20 season behind the Irish bench. During his first 19 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success, including four trips to the Frozen Four and eight conference championships.
- Jackson has over 30 years of coaching experience and led Notre Dame to back-to-back Big Ten tournament championship seasons in 2018 and 2019 while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 15 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is one of only two coaches to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 20 seasons.
- Jackson's Notre Dame teams have made 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 20-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation's top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006-07 and 2008–09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team's first season in the Big Ten (2017–18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018-19).
- Jackson's success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson's arrival, the Irish have had 48 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft, including three first round selections.
- In that same span, 52 players from USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program have matriculated to Notre Dame.
- During Jackson's tenure, the Irish have had nine players garner All-

- In addition, 28 of Jackson's Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2024-25 season with a 25-year collegiate record of 589–318–98 for a .645 winning percentage, the third-highest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2024-25).
- Entering the 2024–25 season, Jackson's 589 career wins rank 10th alltime in Division I and leads all active NCAA Division I coaches.
- With the team's overtime win over No. 3/3 Minnesota on Jan. 18, 2025, Jackson moved into ninth all-time among coaches with his 597th career win.


