TEAM NOTES

- Notre Dame won the toss and deferred to the second half. Notre Dame kicked off and defended the south end zone.
- Attendance - 77,622 which marks the 15th consecutive sell out and 20 of the 22 home games coached by Marcus Freeman at Notre Dame.
- There was a weather delay due to lightning in the area with 1:31 left in the second quarter. The delay started at 5:06 p.m. ET and the game resumed at 7:00 p.m. ET.
- Notre Dame improves to 61-26-2 all-time against Purdue and 31-11-0 in Notre Dame Stadium.
- Notre Dame improves to 318-170-22 against Big Ten teams and 165-64-7 against the conference at home
- Notre Dame improves to 531-131-13 in Notre Dame Stadium.
- The teams play for the Shillelagh Trophy, a tradition which began in 1957. The Irish improved to 42-19 since the inception of the trophy, including 23-6 at Notre Dame Stadium.
- The 56 points scored today against Purdue, coupled with the 66 points scored against the Boilermaker last year marks the first time since 1993-94 that Notre Dame has scored 56 or more points in back-to-back meetings against an opponent. In '93-'94, the Irish scored 58 points in consecutive meetings against Navy.
- Since 1966, today's game marked the first game in which Notre Dame had two rushing touchdowns over 20 yards and two touchdown receptions over 40 yards in the same game.
- Notre Dame's completion percentage in today's game at 85.0 (17-20), is the best mark for the team since 2022 at Southern Cal when the team posted an 88.5 completion percentage (23-26).

NOTABLE

- WR Malachi Fields had a reception for the 30th consecutive game. He entered the weekend with the ninth-best streak of FBS players with consecutive games with at least one catch.
 - His 66-yard touchdown catch on the first play of scrimmage for Notre Dame was a career-long and his first touchdown in a Notre Dame uniform
 - With the catch, Fields has crossed the 2,000-career receiving yard threshold
- DL Jordan Botelho made his 53rd-career appearance in a Notre Dame uniform this afternoon tying him with Michael Vinson (2019-23) for 12th in program history.
- Today marked the 20th-consecutive start at running back for RB Jeremiyah Love, fifth all-time in program history for a running back.

- RB Jeremiyah Love set a career-high in rushing yards with 157 yards on 19 carries (8.3 yards per carry).
- RB Jeremiyah Love scored his 20th-career rushing touchdown in the first quarter on a 1-yard scoring run.
- It's the eighth time that both RB Jeremiyah Love and RB Jadarian Price have scored a rushing touchdown in the same game and the second time that both have rushed for multiple touchdowns in the same game (Nov. 23, 2024 vs. Army).
- RB Jadarian Price returned a kick late in the second quarter 100 yards for a touchdown, his second kick return of his career (Oct. 14, 2023, 99 yards vs. Southern Cal.). It's the fourth kick return for a touchdown of 100 yards in Notre Dame history, and first since Julius Jones against Nebraska on September 9, 2000.
- Price's four touchdowns (three rushing, one on a kick return) are the most for a Notre Dame player since Audric Estimé rushed for four touchdowns at Stanford in 2023.

FIRSTS

 - First time since 1972 that three Notre Dame defensive players made first career start together
